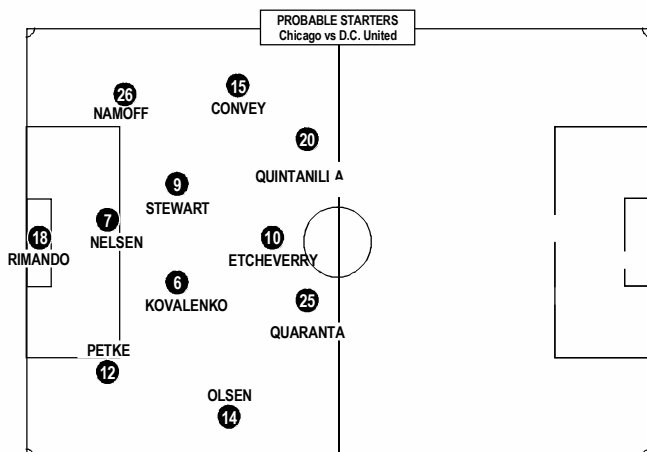

Next Match: April 19 vs. Chicago Fire**Last Meeting: United and Fire Again Play to 0-0 Tie**

NAPERVILLE, IL (July 31, 2002) – D.C. United and the Chicago Fire played to a scoreless draw tonight at Cardinal Stadium in Naperville, Illinois. It was the second time in 11 days both teams failed to produce a goal after also playing to a 0-0 draw on July 20. United remains winless (0-8-2) on the road and currently holds a 431-minute scoreless drought.

"I thought we were the better team and deserved the points tonight," said United head coach Ray Hudson. "I am really pleased with the guys. They showed tremendous attitude and fought like demons and created a lot of chances. I thought in all honesty I had the better side tonight."

The Black-and-Red began the match in a 3-5-2 formation. Ivan McKinley shifted from his traditional left back slot to pair up in defensive midfield with Richie Williams. Eddie Pope, Ryan Nelsen and Brandon Prideaux commanded the back line while Bryan Namoff and Bobby Convey patrolled the flanks. Captain Marco Etcheverry started in his customary playmaking role while Ali Curtis and Eliseo Quintanilla headed the attack.

Bobby Convey forced Fire keeper Zach Thornton to come off his line in the 1st minute on a quality set up from Etcheverry on the left side of the box. Thornton timed his run perfectly and got to the ball first as Convey was lurking on goal. In the 9th minute Chicago created its first chance of the match as Josh Wolff blasted a bending 25-yard shot that just went wide right of the goal. Chicago kept pressuring United's half of the field and two minutes later former United defender Orlando Perez fired a sharp line drive wide off target.

Nick Rimando kept the game scoreless in the 19th minute with a breathtaking save on speedster DaMarcus Beasley. Beasley received a nice pass on the left wing of the box and dribbled on goal. The Korea/Japan World Cup veteran unleashed a wicked 10-yard shot on target but Rimando thwarted his attempt with a point blank save. Quintanilla answered a minute later for the Black-and-Red as he lofted a shot that sailed close over the crossbar.

Rimando displayed his cat-like reflexes again in the 37th minute with a sparkling save on Jim Curtin's header. Curtin soared above United's defense and headed an Ante Razov corner kick from the top of the six-yard box. The shot was directly on target but Rimando dove to his left to snatch the ball in the air just before it crossed the goalmouth. Rimando's two brilliant saves in the first half kept United in the match as both sides went to intermission.

United made two substitutions at halftime as Roy Lassiter replaced Curtis and Lazo Alavanja checked in for Bryan Namoff. In the 51st minute, Etcheverry threaded a through ball to an onrushing Quintanilla down the right flank. The Salvadoran striker cut to the middle of the field and approached the top of the penalty area. He tested Thornton from 20-yards out but the Fire netminder stood firm and blocked his attempt. In the 63rd minute, McKinley blocked Razov's shot on target inside the box and Dema Kovalenko missed a clear opportunity in the 66th minute from short distance.

Ben Olsen entered in the 68th minute for Quintanilla and quickly got involved in the action. He tested Thornton one minute after entering the game but the keeper coolly controlled his attempt. In the 76th minute, Etcheverry created havoc near Chicago's end line. El Diablo made some nifty moves to maneuver around Perez and the Chicago defender appeared to take El Diablo down in the penalty box. However, referee Gus St. Silva ruled that the foul occurred just outside the right edge of the box. On the ensuing free kick, Etcheverry played a ball to Convey. Convey's low shot forced a sprawling save from Thornton. Marsh tested Rimando in the 79th minute on a 35-yard rocket but Rimando dove to his left to clear the ball out of danger and concede a corner kick.

Rimando again came up big in the 83rd minute as he denied Stoitchkov on a short-range blast to the left post. Kovalenko missed the game's last chance in regulation in the 90th minute. He ran on a through ball near the top of the box forcing Rimando to charge off his line. Rimando's presence forced Kovalenko to miss wide right.

In the extra session, Rimando was gigantic as he denied Kovalenko in the 98th minute with another diving save from 15 yards out to earn his fifth clean sheet of the season.

United (6-11-3, 21 points) will resume league action on August 10 when the Kansas City Wizards visit the Nation's Capital. Kickoff is slated for 7:30 p.m.

Last Match: United Loses Heartbreaker

KANSAS CITY, MO (April 12, 2003) – Chris Brown's golden-goal match-winner two minutes into overtime gave the Kansas City Wizards their first overtime victory in club history as they defeated D.C. United 3-2 to open the 2003 MLS season for both teams.

"It's a heartbreaker, but I'm so proud of our team," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "They performed spectacularly well as a depleted side against a good team playing before a great home crowd. I think we'll go on from this. Tonight showed me a lot about this team."

Brown's goal capped a second half comeback for the home side and sent away happy a record Wizards home crowd at Arrowhead Stadium of 22,403, denying a game effort from a United side decimated by injuries and suspension.

Preki gave the Wizards a dream start after just three minutes when he put his team in the lead. Collecting a pass in the midfield, he beat one defender and with more United players giving way, he let fly from some 25 yards with a low shot that seemed to fool United goalkeeper Nick Rimando with a swerve to his right.

But after a dominant opening half-hour for the Wizards where United struggled to create any attack at all, it was the team's back four which gave the visitors a shock equalizer in the 36th minute.

A Marco Etcheverry free kick bypassed the penalty area and was collected by Ben Olsen, who whipped it back in from the right. Central defender Ryan Nelsen's header at the near post forced an awkward save from Kansas City 'keeper Tony Meola, the ball bouncing off his legs only as far as the other D.C. centerback Mike Petke, who pumped a low shot back into the goal.

Then just before the halftime break, United went ahead. Etcheverry collected the ball on the left flank and danced through three defenders to get to the byline. He found a completely unmarked Santino Quaranta at the far post with a pinpoint cross, and the young striker made no mistake powering his header inside the base of the near right post.

In the 61st minute, the Wizards grabbed an equalizer of their own. Francisco Gomez slipped a perfectly measured ball inside defender Bryan Namoff for Chris Klein down the right side of the penalty area. Klein slotted home from the right side of the penalty area between Rimando and the near post.

Both sides went close over the final half-hour. First, Olsen danced into the area before putting his angled shot into the side netting, then Etcheverry nearly scored directly off a corner kick when the post was left unmanned and Meola's last-ditch flap kept the shot out. But Rimando had some last-minute

heroics of his own, saving clear headers from both Brown and Jose Burciaga in added time.

That set the stage for the match-winner from Brown, named MLS Man of the Match. Substitute Josh Wolff swung in a cross from the right corner of the area, Rimando missing the cross as he came off his line. Brown was able to take a touch before hammering the ball off the underside of the bar, bounding down off the turf into the roof of the net.

D.C. United next stage their home opener next Saturday, April 19 against the Chicago Fire (7:30 p.m. ET), while the Wizards take the road to meet another team which won its first game. Kansas City travels to San Jose to take on the Earthquakes, who were 2-1 winners in Colorado. The match at Spartan Stadium takes place on April 19 at 10:00 p.m. ET (HDNET).

SERIES HISTORY: Series Even, 5-5-2

The Chicago and D.C. United have been very even throughout their five years of competition. However, United holds a superior record at home, having won 4 of 6 at RFK. This is the first of four meetings between the two sides during the 2003 season. United will host the first two (April 19 & June 7), while Chicago will play host for the second two (June 12 & August 16). Last year D.C. United beat the Fire once and fell to them once. Two other meetings both ended in 0-0 ties.

D.C. United and Chicago: Not on Fire

Both of the last two matches between these two teams have ended in 0-0 draws. Matches on July 20th and July 31st last season in Naperville, IL, ended goalless. However, the last match between the two sides at RFK ended 3-0 to the Fire.

Prideaux's Hard-Knock Life

D.C. United defender Brandon Prideaux was looking to return to action for D.C. United today. He played in United's scrimmage against George Mason University on Tuesday, but was forced to

exit just three minutes after the game began. Prideaux was the victim of an elbow to the forehead that left him with a nasty gash. He received about a dozen stitches and is now listed as "questionable."

Repairing Reyes

Milton Reyes underwent surgery this week to repair his left ACL and meniscus ligaments that were torn in United's final preseason scrimmage against the Richmond Kickers. He is expected to begin rehab immediately, though he will miss most, or all, of the 2003 MLS season.

More New Faces?

D.C. United welcomed Alen Kozic to training this week. Kozic is a graduate of Florida International University who twice earned All-American honors. He ranks eighth on the FIU all-time scoring list with 24 goals, 26 assists, and 74 points. Kozic has seen time in Germany's lower divisions and is hoping to land a job in MLS.

Head Coach Ray Hudson

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamasa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.

1 Doug Warren GK Ht: 6'0" Wt: 197 Dob: 3.18.81

A 2003 SuperDraft pick, Doug Warren was a standout goalkeeper at Clemson University where he earned NSCAA All-American first team honors and posted a 1.33 goals against average. Has not yet made an appearance during the 2003 season.

2 David Stokes D Ht: 6'3" Wt: 203 Dob: 5.28.82

A hard-working defender was selected fifth overall in the 2003 MLS SuperDraft. Stokes was one of the top defenders at the University of North Carolina. He saw action with the U.S. U-23 National Team in 2002. Has not yet made an appearance during the 2003 season.

3 Galin Ivanov D Ht: 6'1" Wt: 170 Dob: 6.4.75

The Bulgarian international is a very talented defender who spent the past six years with CSKA Sofia in his native land. One of the game's most astute defenders, Ivanov's presence in the D.C. United back line will be a key element in the team's success in 2003. Has not yet made an appearance during the 2003 season due to an abdominal injury.

4 Brandon Prideaux D Ht: 6'0" Wt: 170 Dob: 8.18.76

Prideaux returns for his second season at D.C. United after playing three seasons with the Kansas City Wizards. Prideaux is a strong defender who will be called upon to mark some of the toughest opposition that MLS has to offer. Has yet to appear in a match in 2003 because of a hamstring strain.

5 Milton Reyes D Ht: 5'10" Wt: 166 Dob: 5.2.74

This will be the second season at D.C. United for Milton Reyes. He proved himself to be one of United's best defenders in the 2002 season, using his speed and strength to patrol the entire right side of the field. Reyes has been a staple on the Honduran National Team since 1999. Reyes suffered a torn ACL and meniscus in a preseason match against the Richmond Kickers and is expected to miss most of the 2003 season.

6 Dema Kovalenko M Ht: 5'8" Wt: 160 Dob: 8.28.77

Kovalenko joins D.C. United for his first season in the capital after four seasons with the Chicago Fire. The ultra-talented Ukrainian tallied one goal and eight assists in the 2003 season for the Fire. His reliable first touch and good decisions will be a great asset to the D.C. United midfield.
