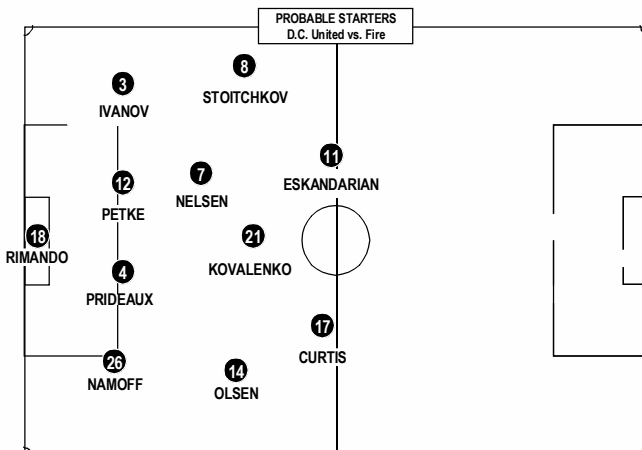

Last Meeting: United Douses Fire 2-0

WASHINGTON, DC (June 7, 2003) – It took nearly two months, but D.C. United finally broke into the win column Saturday, shutting down Chicago Fire while using a two-goal burst in an eight-minute span late in the first half for a 2-0 victory at RFK Stadium.

Marco Etcheverry finally scored in a match between the two teams when his 37th-minute penalty kick put United (1-3-4, 7 pts.) ahead, then Dema Kovalenko scored just before the break while the United defense was rarely threatened by the attack of the Fire (3-2-3, 12 pts.), which had scored four goals in each of their last two games.

"This is what Heaven feels like; this is what Heaven looks like," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "It is truly a great feeling. It's a win that is absolutely, unequivocally deserved."

From the outset United was the better side, constructing cohesive attacks and pinning Chicago into their own end with a fluent passing game, despite a newly-laid RFK Stadium field left in poor condition by heavy rains in the Washington area.

In the 19th minute, Eliseo Quintanilla was put in alone on Zach Thornton, but the Fire 'keeper made a fine save coming off his line. Thornton then again robbed Quintanilla, cutting out a low cross at the last second a few minutes later.

As has so often been the case for United this season, the goal seemed certain to come, and finally it did in the 36th minute when the Black-and-Red won a penalty. A corner swung in from the right was met with an overhead kick from Kovalenko, and Orlando Perez was ruled to have used his arm in turning away the effort on the line. Etcheverry narrowly slipped the resulting spot kick past Thornton inside the right post.

The goal snapped a 367-minute scoreless streak in matches between the two teams, and was the first in 469 minutes scored by United against Thornton, an MLS record. But it would take another eight minutes for a goal to come from the run of play - halting a streak of 379 minutes.

Ben Olsen - who won the battle with DaMarcus Beasley on United's right flank on the night - whipped in a high cross to the far post. Kovalenko brought it down with his chest and lashed a drive inside Thornton's left-hand post to double United's lead.

Thornton made an incredible save to keep United from scoring a third after the break, Kovalenko's powerful header on a Brandon Prideaux cross just turned around the post at full stretch by the U.S. international. But United was rarely troubled at the other end, and eventually ran out comfortable winners for the first time this season.

United faces a busy week, traveling to Colorado for a midweek match against the Rapids (7:30 p.m. MT Wednesday) before

returning to RFK Stadium to face Columbus Crew next Saturday night (7:30 p.m. ET). Chicago hit the road again next weekend, playing MetroStars at the Meadowlands, the match to be televised on ESPN2 (4 p.m. ET).

Last Match: OT Strike Stuns United

WASHINGTON, DC (July 5, 2003) – A 10-man MetroStars survived a man disadvantage for 64 minutes before substitute Eddie Gaven - who had come on as a substitute goalkeeper to start extra-time - scored a golden goal for a dramatic 3-2 victory against D.C. United on Saturday afternoon at RFK Stadium.

"Awful loss, awful," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "From the first minute right up until they got the winner.

Especially down a man; we couldn't take them in the central field, which is where I thought we'd hurt them."

Goals from Jaime Moreno and Ricardo Clark had answered a Marco Etcheverry penalty after just eight minutes, but when Kenny Arena was sent off in the 35th minute - in his first game at a stadium where he had spent many nights in the stands watching United - the match turned.

Dema Kovalenko pulled United (3-4-7, 16 pts.) level again just before the halftime break, but neither team could hit home in the second half or extra time until Gaven's stunning match-winner for MetroStars (6-4-4, 22 pts.), just a week after they had lost in overtime to Chicago Fire and playing their third extra-time match in succession.

Building off their 3-1 victory at Dallas on Tuesday night, United came out the aggressor, and nearly went ahead twice in first five minutes, first Ryan Nelsen, then Marco Etcheverry going just wide from close range.

The pace of Curtis was a threat from the outset, and it brought United the lead in the eighth minute. Etcheverry nicked the ball from Mark Lisi in the United end, and found Stoitchkov, who immediately played the ball over the top where Curtis had raced past the Metro back four.

Edgar Bartolomeu tried in vain to catch him over 40 yards, finally left with little option but to trip Curtis up from behind in the area, referee Kevin Terry making no hesitation in pointing to the spot. Etcheverry sent Tim Howard the wrong way in converting from the spot.

MetroStars nearly drew level when a first-time Richie Williams shot from 25 yards beat Rimando, only to come back off the face of the post. Then on 20 minutes, then did equalize, Jaime Moreno taking a pass from Lisi and allowed to run into the area, beating Rimando cleanly with an angled shot from the right.

Six minutes later MetroStars stunningly took the lead. A loose header from Mike Petke landed at Clark's feet, and he dribbled forward before letting fly from some 30 yards from goal. Rimando dove but could only parry the shot, unable to scramble back and keep it out before it bounded over the line.

Curtis's pace left MetroStars a man down just after the half-hour. Kenny Arena - making his first MLS appearance in the stadium where his father Bruce had coached D.C. United for four seasons - was sent off for two bookable offenses in five minutes, the second one pulling down Curtis just outside the area after he again raced past the Metro back line with the ball on his foot.

United then pulled level on a lightning-quick break out of the back. Stoitchkov set Olsen free down the right flank, and the livewire United winger pulled a low cross back from the edge of the byeline. Kovalenko took a quick touch to elude a defender before hammering a drive high past Howard's dive from 15 yards.

The match lost its way after the break, MetroStars dropping eight men behind the ball in trying to protect against the man disadvantage. United nearly broke then deadlock when Ryan Nelsen broke through in the area on the right and hitting an angled shot that beat Howard and might have snuck inside the post, but Juan Forchetti came sliding in the goal area to turn it away.

United then came close before the end of regulation time, both from the creative genius of Etcheverry. In the 88th minute he played a high ball over the top where substitute Santino Quaranta ran onto it and looped a little volley over Howard from outside the area, the Metro 'keeper able to just reach it and tip over the bar from almost at the goal line. Etcheverry then found Alecko Eskandarian screaming down the center of the box with a cross from the left, but the rookie United striker put his clear header over the bar from the top of the six.

United almost scored first in extra-time, again a Metro defender coming to save the day. Forchetti slipped in the box, allowing Quaranta to punch a bouncing ball past Howard, but Chris Leitch was able to hook it off the line.

Having come on in a switch of goalkeepers, Gaven coming in at the beginning of extra-time for Mark Lisi after he had moved between the posts and Tim Howard into the field during the changeover, the move paid tremendous dividends for Bradley. He ran onto to a ball from Amado Guevara in the inside-left channel and held off Nelsen before hooking a shot past Rimando inside the far corner.

Both teams hit the road next weekend for vital matches against Eastern Conference opposition. United heads to Chicago to face the Fire (7:30 p.m. CT), while MetroStars take on New England Revolution in Foxboro (7:30 p.m. ET).

Series History

D.C. United has a winning record overall against the Chicago Fire, but the club has struggled to pick up points against this conference rival in games away from RFK Stadium.

United is 5-2-1 at home and only 1-3-2 away. That lone win came the very first time these two teams met in 1998 when United came out 3-1 victors.

Marco Etcheverry is the All-Time series leader in points with 14, and he will look to add to that total on Saturday.

This will be the third meeting between these two sides this season, but the first away from RFK Stadium. Chicago came to D.C. for the 2003 home opener, which ended in a 0-0 draw. A rematch on June 7th saw United capture all three points for the first time this season in a 2-0 win on goals from Etcheverry and Dema Kovalenko.

The final match-up between Chicago and D.C. will be August 16th at Cardinal Stadium.

Tying the Record for Ties

United has already registered 6 ties this season, equaling a team high set in 2000 and matched in 2002. With 16 league matches still to go this season, including this game against Chicago, United has a high probability of establishing a new record in ties for a season this year.

Stingy Defense

D.C. United has had one of the strongest defenses in the league this season. Through 14 games, United has only allowed 17 goals, tied with 3 other teams for tops in MLS. United's goals

against average is 1.15. Chicago, San Jose, and Los Angeles have also only allowed 17 goals, though Chicago has only played 13 games and L.A. has played 15.

Corner Kick Curse Nearing Century Mark

D.C. United's corner kick curse continues, as the team is approaching the 100 mark for the season. So far, the team has taken 92 corners, more than any other team in MLS, and is yet to find the net on one of them. San Jose and Los Angeles are the closest competitors when it comes to corners taken, both sides having attempted 85. Kansas City has taken the fewest with only 48.

Line-up Changes...Again

United has started with the same line-up in two consecutive games only once so far this season (6-14 and 6-21). With the return of defender Brandon Prideaux from suspension, it is likely that Saturday's line-up against Chicago will be different from the line-up that took the field against the MetroStars last weekend.

Trial Updates

English forward Jamie Cureton, who recently had a week-long trial with the club, has signed a contract to play in South Korea next year. Uruguayan Silvio Fernandez and Columbian Diego Serna also tried out, though no decision has been made on either of them. Should Serna attempt to return to MLS, the New England Revolution would have the first opportunity to sign him. A Romanian, Petrus Manta also tried out for the club this week and discussions have also been held with Roger Suarez of Bolivian club Oriente Petrolero.

Road Warriors

D.C. United has been struggling on the road again this season, though their last away game was arguably their best performance of the year so far. United exploded offensively to sink Dallas 3-1 on July 2nd, notching a win away from home for the first time this season.

D.C. Scoring Trends

D.C. United has a record of 0-1-6 when the score is tied at halftime. That lone loss came Saturday when the MetroStars finished United off in the last minute of overtime. Saturday's loss was also the first time United has lost after scoring the first goal of the game. D.C. is 3-1-1 when scoring first. On the other hand, D.C. is winless when allowing their opponent to score first with a record of 0-4-2.

Olsen Racks Up Starts, Minutes

Ben Olsen and Nick Rimando are the only players for D.C. United to start every game this season. Rimando has played all 1331 minutes so far, while Olsen has played 1289.

New Sheriff In Town

The captain's armband for D.C. United has been passed to New Zealand international midfielder/defender Ryan Nelsen. Marco Etcheverry had been United's captain for the past five seasons, but Nelsen's improved play and impressive consistency have earned him the right to be the new leader the Black-and-Red.

Rimando is On Fire

Nick Rimando has registered four consecutive shutouts against the Chicago Fire. The final two meetings between the two sides in 2002 ended in scoreless draws, as did the first meeting of 2003. D.C. United won the last meeting 2-0. Rimando has not allowed a goal to the Fire in 420 minutes. The last time Chicago scored against United was on May 4, 2002. The Fire won that meeting by a 3-0 score.

Repeat Performance

When Dema Kovalenko scored against the MetroStars last Saturday, he became the first D.C. United player to score a goal in back-to-back games this year. Kovalenko notched a goal on July 2nd against Dallas and got D.C.'s second score against the MetroStars.

New Look for United

D.C. United will wear an unfamiliar uniform of white shirts, black shorts, and white socks for the next two matches, first away at Chicago and back home against San Jose on July 19th. This new "third strip" will be a departure from United's conventional solid uniforms of home black and away white.

Head Coach Ray Hudson

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamasa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.
