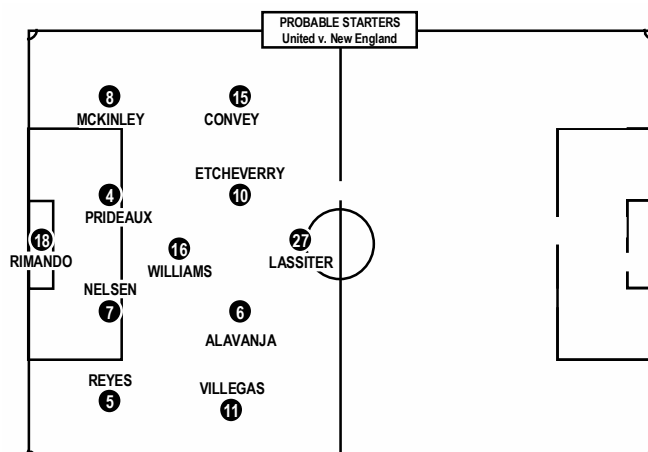

Next Match: July 27 vs. New England Revolution**Last Meeting: Short-Handed United Lose 2-0**

FOXBORO, MA (July 6, 2002) - Neither revving car engines from a local car show nor any of the six false fire alarms at the team hotel could awaken D.C. United from its road slumber. Brian Kamler tallied for the New England Revolution three minutes in and the hosts never looked back, sending the crowd of 9,747 at CMGI field home happy after a 2-0 victory. D.C. United drops to 6-8-1 on the year, 0-7 on the road. The team has now dropped 12 consecutive MLS decisions away from the Nation's Capital. D.C. United returns to RFK for a date with the Columbus Crew next Saturday, July 13th at 7:30 p.m.

"What a shame," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "Without Jaime Moreno, Santino Quaranta and Eddie Pope, we aren't the same product. We just aren't."

Playing the second time in three nights, United Head Coach Ray Hudson was forced to use a makeshift line-up. Having left the match in Kansas City in the 21st minute, Moreno sat out tonight's game with a strained left groin. Quaranta remained in Washington to nurse a troublesome hip flexor and Pope was scratched from the line-up just before kick-off, a result of a knock suffered against the Wizards. Deployed in a 4-5-1 formation, the Black-and-Red would be forced to dig deep to aptly represent the badge on their shirts.

Sensing United's lack of confidence, New England pushed forward immediately from the opening kick-off. Early on, Steve Ralston provided the hosts dangerous runs along the right flank and Ian Fuller a target for his swerving crosses. Three minutes in, Kamler intercepted Orlando Perez's poor back pass 40 yards from goal. The former United midfielder out-paced Brandon Prideaux and slid the ball to the right of a hard-charging Nick Rimando. Despite attempts by the Black-and-Red to go forward, the game continued to be played in their end of the field the better part of the first 15 minutes of the game.

New England continued to play through, around and over their travel-weary opponents. The Revolution created another sparkling opportunity on a re-start 40 yards out along the left flank. Joey Franchino sent a bending ball towards the far post. First-year standout Taylor Twellman leaped above United's back line and directed a header towards the upper corner, but a diving Rimando kept his club in striking distance.

D.C. United earned a first scoring opportunity after springing Jose Alegria behind the Revolution defense. Jay Heaps stopped the play, but drew a caution, after pulling the Peruvian midfielder down from behind. Marco Etcheverry's resulting free kick, from 20 yards out, failed to test Adin Brown, missing high and wide of frame. United would build upon the momentum. After drawing a corner kick, Etcheverry's service was nodded on goal by a forward-thinking Ivan McKinley. Brown's sprawling save kept the ball out of the net, but not out of harms way. In a mad scramble for the ball just before the right-hand post, Richie Williams pushed the ball just wide of target. In extra time, Ali Curtis found space 25 yards from glory, but Brown was again equal to his left-footed bid. The Black-and-Red had finished the first half showing effort, but no result. The team retreated to the halftime to re-group, down by a goal.

Two spectacular plays by Rimando kept New England from adding an insurance goal early in the second half. The goalkeeper first snatched the ball from the fleet feet of Twellman before skying to snare a Wolde Harris header minutes later. Rimando then parried a 20-yard blast by Harris out of danger in the 55th minute.

D.C. United responded with its most creative effort of the evening. Curtis collected the ball just to the right of the Revolution net before finding McKinley in support. His cross to Petter Villegas was deftly handled and left for a charging Alegria, whose 20-yard right-footed attempt was tipped over the goal by a sprawling Brown. Looking to build upon the newfound offensive energy, Hudson summoned Roy Lassiter and Lazo Alavanja from his bench. The move nearly paid dividends in the 70th minute when Alavanja freed himself along the right sideline. After leading Curtis with a pass towards goal, the speedy forward was able to get a shot off, only to be deflected over the endline. Etcheverry's resulting corner found Perez, but the dipping ball proved too difficult for the defender to deflect on net. Three minutes later, the Black-and-Red sustained their heavy pressure when Lassiter sprinted through an opening. Once again, the Revs 6-5 goalkeeper was unbeatable.

For the fourth time in their seven road losses, D.C. United failed to dent the net. That didn't stop United from pushing everyone into the offensive third as the game wore down. New England, however, took advantage of the forward pressing visitors, with a counter-attack in the 87th minute. On the play, Ralston once again blitz down the right sideline before serving a well-paced crossing ball. Making a near post run, Twellman dove forward heading a spectacular ball past a helpless Rimando and putting the finishing touches on United.

COLUMBUS, OH (July 24, 2002) - D.C. United fell pray to an opportunistic Crew tonight, 1-0, before 17,368 at in Columbus, Ohio. Dante Washington knifed through United's defense early in the second half to provide the game's only tally. Valiant efforts by the short-handed side from Washington yielded no reward, and the Black-and-Red fell to 6-10-2 (20 points) on the season. D.C. United returns to action Saturday night at RFK Stadium minus Jaime Moreno (out with a strained left hamstring) and Santino Quaranta, who will miss the next six-eight weeks with an abdominal hernia.

"We had some chances, but with such a depleted line-up, we just didn't have the players we needed tonight," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "I can't get on the boys for their effort tonight."

Playing before a spirited crowd on "Buck-a-Brat Night," the visitors in Black-and-Red sought to steal three crucial road points despite missing four regulars from Hudson's first 11. In the absence of Marco Etcheverry, Jaime Moreno dropped back into "El Diablo's" attacking midfield position. Out of the gate, D.C. United attacked the Crew midfielders with the ball and countered aggressively. Moreno and Bobby Convey both made brave runs into Columbus' penalty area. In the ninth minute, quick ball movement from Richie Williams and Petter Villegas sprung Lazo Alavanja along the right flank. His cross was earmarked for Roy Lassiter before being cleared from danger by a heady Crew defender.

Through the midway point of the first half, D.C. United maintained the composure and verve it exhibited this past weekend in Chicago. United saw a majority of possession and refused to allow the home side quality scoring opportunities. The Black-and-Red struggled, however, in the final third where lack of creativity in the attack prevented any serious scoring opportunities. A brilliant diving deflection by Jon Busch on a

Williams 20-yard blast in the 27th minute added to the club's frustrations. Columbus nearly took advantage of their first quality chance minutes later when Brian McBride narrowly missed Nick Rimando's goal. Brian Dunseth followed with a missed header.

D.C. United hoped to take advantage of re-start opportunities this evening. In the 35th minute, Alavanja placed a free kick at Moreno's feet in the middle of the Columbus defensive wall. Moreno one-timed a pass to a rushing Convey. His 20-yard rocket was placed directly at Busch. The well-designed play yielded an attractive play, but didn't register on the scoreboard. Rimando snuffed a near post attempt from Dante Washington, Busch ruined a Lassiter chance and the teams settled for a scoreless half and headed to the locker rooms.

Columbus emerged from the half with more concentrated effort than displayed in the first 45 minutes. Washington narrowly missed with a header in the 47th minute before making amends with a right-footed blast five minutes later. Brian West created space along the right flank before finding Washington at the top of the penalty area. The Columbia, MD native split United's back line along the right side of the box and fired a bullet that beat Rimando to his near post. Despite executing the team's game plan without fail for much of the match, United found themselves at a familiar deficit on the road.

D.C. United's hopes faded in the 60th minute, when after a forty-yard run, Moreno pulled up lame and exited the pitch. Three minutes later, Hudson handed the playmaking reigns to Jose Alegria. The Black-and-Red would be forced to call upon sheer determination to claw back into the match. The addition of Ali Curtis for Bryan Namoff allowed the visitors some additional scoring punch. Having fallen back into a shell, Columbus refused to give D.C. United a chance late in the match and held on for a one-goal victory.

Moreno is expected to miss one to two weeks of action with his injury. After visiting with Dr. William Meyers, a Philadelphia, PA-based sports hernia specialist, it was determined that Quaranta would need surgery to repair his hernia. The procedure is scheduled for Tuesday, July 30th and will be performed by Dr. Meyers at Hahnemann University Medical Center in Philadelphia.

Series History: D.C. Leads 18-11-0

United has had the upper hand in this series, especially at home, where D.C. is 10-2-0 against the Revs. The teams have split their two previous matches in 2002, with each team notching impressive wins on their home turf. United rallied to score three unanswered goals to beat New England on June 8th at RFK, while the Revs topped D.C. 2-0 at CMGI on July 6th.

Etcheverry An All-Star

Marco Etcheverry was added as a Commissioner's pick to the reserve selections for the roster of the MLS All-Star Team that will face the U.S. National Team at the 2002 Pepsi MLS All-Star Game in Washington, D.C. on Saturday, August 3 (3:30 p.m. ET - ABC Sports). Etcheverry, United's captain and an RFK Stadium fan-favorite, is the League's No.2 all-time assist leader and led D.C. United to four consecutive appearances in the MLS Cup title game, where the Black-and-Red emerged victorious in 1996, '97 and '99. Known as "El Diablo", Etcheverry's midfield magic also helped the United dynasty to a U.S. Open Cup title in 1996 and the InterAmerican Cup in 1998. Etcheverry will be appearing in his seventh all-star game.

Capital Defense

By recording eight saves in the sweltering heat through 100 minutes of work, Nick Rimando recorded his fourth shutout of the season against Chicago on July 20th. Rimando's 82 saves rank him second in the MLS, and his stellar play earned him MLS Player of the Week Honors last month. Rimando defense has supported a spurratic United offense that currently ranks last in the league in goals, assists, shots and shots on goal.

Lack Of Fire Power

Heading into Saturday's game, D.C. is last in the league in shots (204) and goals scored (19), scoring just one goal in the last four games. By comparison, league-leading New England has found the net 32 times.

Down For The Count

D.C. will be without many of its leaders when it takes the field this Saturday against New England. Keeper Mike Ammann and defender Eddie Pope remain sidelined with elbow and knee injuries, respectively. United will also have to look to new faces for offense, with both Santino Quaranta and Jaime Moreno sidelined with injuries.

Back In Black

After serving one-game suspensions for caution point accumulation, both Marco Etcheverry and Ivan McKinley will return to United's line-up on Saturday. Both players received yellow cards during D.C.'s 0-0 draw against Chicago on July 20th. The Black-and-Red have been hampered by suspensions all season, previously losing Bobby Convey, Milton Reyes, McKinley and Lazo Alavanja to red card ejections.

The Long Awaited Return

One of United's top midfielders, Ben Olsen, is expected to make his season debut during the second half of this Saturday's match. Olsen has been out of action since fracturing his right ankle in March of 2001, while playing on loan with England's Nottingham Forest club team. Since then, he has undergone four ankle surgeries. Olsen was an All-Star for D.C. in 2001, but has not seen action since January 21, 2001 in the CONCACAF Champions Cup. Olsen's last MLS match with D.C. was August 19th, 2000 in a 0-1 loss to San Jose at RFK Stadium.

Double Your Pleasure

The WUSA's Washington Freedom will play a match of their own on the RFK turf before the Black-and-Red take the field on Saturday. The Freedom, who are 7-5-5 this season, kick off against the San Diego Spirit at 4:00 pm.

Pope To Face MLS All-Stars

While Eddie Pope will be in familiar surroundings at RFK Stadium on August 3rd for the MLS All-Star Game, for one game he will put aside the Black-and-Red for the Red, White, and Blue. After starting every match for the U.S. National Team at the 2002 World Cup, Pope has been chosen by coach Bruce Arena for the 18-member National Team to play a squad of MLS All-Stars. "Steady Eddie" will join 10 of his teammates from the World Cup Team, and three that he has formerly played with at United: John Harkes, Jeff Agoos, and Carlos Llamasa.

United Acquires Forward Eliseo Quintanilla

D.C. United announced on July 22nd that the club has acquired 19-year-old El Salvador National Team forward Eliseo Quintanilla as a Discovery player. Quintanilla signed a contract with Major League Soccer, however terms of the pact were not released. Quintanilla has trained with the Black-and-Red since July 11 and will be available for selection upon obtaining a work visa.

Quintanilla will be classified as a Transitional International, thus he does not count as one of United's three Senior Internationals. The left-footed Quintanilla is one of El Salvador's most promising young prospects. He starred for El Salvador's U-17 National Team during CONCACAF qualifying for the 1999 FIFA World Championship in New Zealand, scoring five goals in his country's failed bid to earn a berth to the youth world cup. The United States U-17s led by Bobby Convey, Landon Donovan and DaMarcus Beasley eventually eliminated Quintanilla and El Salvador by a combined 10-1 score in a home-and-away playoff series to capture CONCACAF's last berth to New Zealand '99. Quintanilla tallied El Salvador's lone goal in a 6-1 defeat to the U.S. in the first leg played in San Salvador on May 9, 1999.

Quintanilla has been a mainstay over the past few years, either as a left-sided striker or as a playmaker in the middle of the park for his country and former clubs, C.D. FAS and most recently with C.D. Aguila. Quintanilla made his full international debut with El Salvador on February 9, 2000, in a 5-

1 loss to Honduras in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. He has since earned three senior CAPS for his country.

Quintanilla made his professional debut in El Salvador's First Division at the tender age of 16 with current Salvadoran champion C.D. FAS midway through the 1999 Apertura tournament on September 25. He entered in the second half in FAS's 3-0 victory over Juventud Olimpica Metalio at FAS's home ground, Estadio Oscar Quiteño in Santa Ana, El Salvador. Quintanilla scored his first professional goal against archrival Aguila in a 1-1 draw on November 3, 1999, and finished the year with three tallies.

For his career, he has amassed 24 goals in First Division play. During the 2000 season, Quintanilla accounted for seven goals in both the Clausura and Apertura tournaments. He tallied three goals for FAS in the 2001 Clausura before moving to C.D. Aguila of San Miguel, one of El Salvador's most popular clubs. With Aguila, Quintanilla registered six goals in the 2001 Apertura tournament and most recently finished the 2002 Clausura in May with five goals.

Head Coach Ray Hudson

1st SEASON 2002 RECORD: 6-10-2

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamasa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.
