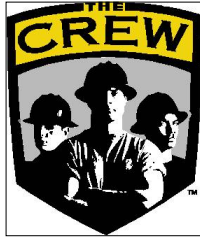

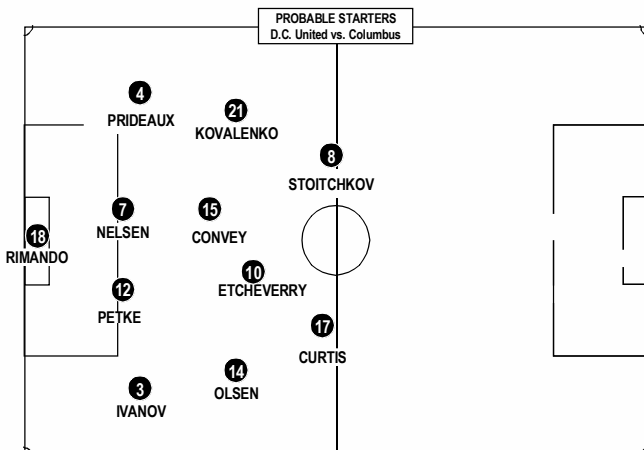

Last Meeting: United Takes Big Leap, Downs Crew 3-0

WASHINGTON, DC (June 14, 2003) – Rookie forward and No. 1 SuperDraft selection Alecko Eskandarian scored his first two career MLS goals as D.C. United (2-3-5, 11pts) netted a season high three goals in a 3-0 blanking of the Columbus Crew (4-4-3, 15pts) on Saturday night at RFK Stadium. United are now undefeated in three consecutive matches as goalkeeper Nick Rimando registered his League-leading fifth shutout of the season and third in succession.

"If last week was heaven, I don't know what this is," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "It's heroic. We knew they were going to throw massive obstacles and we wore them down. Opposing teams need to start looking at the character on our team, not the wins and losses. The performance of our warriors tonight was outstanding. Class is the word for tonight."

For the first time this season United started the match with an unprecedented forward pair of Ali Curtis matching up with veteran Hristo Stoitchkov. Curtis tirelessly chased balls across the entire attacking front and his energy set the tone for United. Stoitchkov, making his first start of the season, was instrumental for his team in changing the point of attack with pinpoint long-distance passes.

In an evenly played first half in which neither goalkeeper was overly busy, D.C. United had a goal disallowed in the 30th minute. Curtis headed home a Stoitchkov cross from close range but the play was called back.

But after Crew forward Brian McBride missed on two favorable opportunities (35th minute header and 38th minute shot) United would head into the break up 1-0 when defender Mike Petke registered a 43rd minute goal. A free kick by D.C. captain Marco Etcheverry from the right side found Petke wide open behind two defenders at the far left post. The defender's header beat Crew goalkeeper Tom Presthus inside the left post for his second tally of the campaign.

The second half also proved evenly contested with few clear cut scoring chances. In the 78th minute Crew Head Coach Greg Andrulis called upon forward Edson Buddle, who was making his first appearance since April 19, in an effort to add some punch to the attack. But one minute later it was a United second half substitute who hit the back of the net.

Eskandarian, who substituted Stoitchkov in the 69th minute, scored his first career goal in the 79th minute when he collected a cross by Etcheverry from the left side which was deflected just outside the six-yard box by teammate Ben Olsen. Eskandarian spun quickly to send the ball past Presthus from less than 10 yards out.

In the 85th minute Eskandarian netted his second of the match when he ran unmarked onto a Santino Quaranta back heel pass. He met the ball in stride and sent a low left-footed shot for his

second career goal.

The Crew were playing without Duncan Oughton (New Zealand), Kyle Martino (USA), Frankie Hejduk (USA) and Jeff Cunningham (USA) who are all in France to compete in the FIFA Confederations Cup. Brian West partnered up top with McBride, who only joined the team in D.C. on Saturday after missing practice all week due to the flu. Rookie Trevor Perea, a developmental player, made his first career appearance for Columbus when he came on as a second half substitute. United were also missing players due to the Confederations Cup: Bobby Convey (USA), Earnie Stewart (USA) and Ryan Nelsen (New Zealand).

Columbus will be on the road for its next match on Saturday, June 21 as it travels to San Jose to meet the Earthquakes (10:00PM ET – HDNet). On the same day D.C. United will look to continue their recent positive stretch when they host the New England Revolution (7:30PM ET – FOX Sports World, FOX Sports en Espanol).

Last Match: United Finds Relief in 1-1 Draw

WASHINGTON, DC (June 21, 2003) – D.C. United forward Hristo Stoitchkov netted his first goal of the season to equalize a tally by New England Revolution midfielder Brian Kamler as the two Eastern Conference rivals played to a 1-1 tie at a rainy RFK Stadium. The result stretched D.C. United's (2-3-6, 12pts) undefeated streak to four games while New England (4-3-4, 16pts) is now winless in its last three contests.

"We played our poorest game of the year," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "We missed some of our quality players. It all didn't come together, maybe because of congested schedules, heavy legs. Tonight was a game where we tied...and I felt relief."

In an even first half D.C. United, which fielded the same lineup in back-to-back games for the first time this season, enjoyed more prolonged periods of possession but were met by a compact New England side. However, just moments after United missed a golden scoring opportunity when a close-range Dema Kovalenko shot was saved by Revolution goalkeeper Adin Brown, the visitors scored in the 24th minute when play shifted into the opposite half.

Revolution left back Joey Franchino lofted a precise cross into the right side of the United box where Kamler ably collected the pass. The former D.C. player (1996-1999) moved the ball to his left foot, cut inside and fired a low blast inside the near right post, ending United's shutout streak at 318 minutes (spanning five games). It was Kamler's fifth goal of the campaign, adding to his career high mark (previous high was three goals in 2002). Kamler had been listed as probable for the match after missing New England's game last weekend in Colorado due to a strained left hamstring.

The Revolution, who entered the match with a 4-0-1 record after scoring the first goal in a match, allowed the equalizer only seven minutes after taking the lead. United's Bulgarian left back Galin Ivanov, who attempted several long distance passes during the match in the direction of compatriot Stoitchkov, successfully combined with the D.C. forward in the 31st minute. Ivanov's lateral pass found Stoitchkov unmarked on the left side of the Revolution box and the former World Cup star rifled a left-footed blast from 10 yards out which easily beat the goalkeeper.

After United tied the match at 1-1, the game increased in intensity and players on both sides were involved in tough physical challenges. The first half, which ended under heavy rain, saw both teams combine for a total of 25 fouls and three yellow cards as the game grew chippy before the break.

In the second half both head coaches brought in rookie forwards to replace veterans as the Revolution's Pat Noonan came on for Joe-Max Moore and Alecko Eskandarian entered the game for Stoitchkov. The Revolution's move proved productive as Noonan kicked off a series of opportunities in the 69th minute. He capitalized on a miscommunication between two United players near the top of the D.C. penalty area and pounced on the ball, advancing one-on-one against goalkeeper Nick Rimando. But the reigning Player of the Week and MLS Man of the Match made the save on the close range shot with Revolution midfielder Steve Ralston sending the rebound back across the mouth of the goal and just out of the reach of a sliding teammate.

The Revolution, who had the best scoring chances during the second half, threatened on more than one occasion in the final ten minutes of regulation as D.C. United consistently turned the ball over. A shot by second-half substitute Jason Moore (sliding block by Brandon Prideaux in 83rd minute), a Noonan header (85th minute), a Steve Ralston shot inside the box (87th minute) and a Shalrie Joseph effort from outside the box (89th minute) all came close to hitting the target.

In the best chance of a pulsating overtime session, Noonan again figured prominently in the second minute of the sudden death period. He beat D.C. defender Prideaux to a bouncing ball just outside the United penalty area and headed over a charging Rimando and toward an empty net. But the ball slowly bounced against the left post. The play would continue and Noonan would outjump a defender in the box, sending another header grazing against the top corner of the left post.

Both teams were missing players due to the U.S. National Team's participation in the 2003 FIFA Confederations Cup in France. Bobby Convey (D.C. United), Earnie Stewart (D.C. United) and Taylor Twellman (New England Revolution) all saw action in a narrow 1-0 loss to Brazil earlier on Saturday. Ryan Nelsen (D.C. United) is expected to play in New Zealand's final Confederations Cup match on Sunday against France.

New England returns home, after two consecutive road matches, to host the Colorado Rapids next Saturday, April 28 (6:00PM ET, FOX Sports World tape delayed broadcast at 7:30PM). D.C. United are on the road that same day to face Eastern Conference rivals the Columbus Crew in Ohio (7:30PM ET, HDNet).

Series History: United Leads 14-9-2

This series has been dominated by the home team; D.C. has a record of 10-2-1 at home and is 4-7-1 at Columbus, though the last time the Black-and-Red picked up three points in Columbus was during the 1999 season.

These sides met two weeks ago, with United convincingly disposing of the Crew with their best showing of the year in a 3-0 win. D.C. will return to Columbus on October 4th to end this season's series.

Ties Galore

United has already registered 6 ties this season, equaling a team high set in 2000 and matched in 2002. With 19 league matches still to go this season, it is highly likely that United will establish a new record for ties this season.

The Defense Rules

D.C. United has allowed fewer goals than any other team in the league so far this season. Through 11 games, the Black-and-Red have only conceded ten goals (same amount as the MetroStars), averaging less than a goal a game.

Corner Kick Curse Continues

D.C. United's corner kick curse continues, as the team has now failed to score in 70 attempts, the second highest number in the league. Los Angeles has attempted 73, though the Galaxy has played two more games than D.C. Columbus has 67 corners through 12 games.

Consistency...Finally

Last Saturday night's 1-1 draw with New England was the first time this season that United has started the same line-up in two consecutive games. With the return of national team players from the Confederations Cup, the streak is likely to be broken in Columbus.

Welcome Back, Boys

United will welcome back the services of Bobby Convey (USA), Earnie Stewart (USA), and Ryan Nelsen (New Zealand) at Saturday's match in Columbus. The three missed several matches while on national team duty at the Confederations Cup in France. Unfortunately, both teams went three and out at the tournament, with neither side able to pick up a victory.

Trial Update

The week-long trials of English forward Jamie Cureton and Uruguayan striker Silvio Fernandez have come to an end. They have returned home while United considers options for the future. In the meantime, former Miami Fusion star Diego Serna has been invited to a trial. He practiced with the team this week, though the club has not decided if it will sign any of the three strikers.

Late Bloomers

D.C. United is unbeaten in the month of June and have not lost in their last four matches, posting a 2-0-2 record. The Black-and-Red have never had an undefeated month of June, and the last time they had a five-game unbeaten streak was 2000 (7/15-8/5). A win or a draw on Saturday at Columbus would see the club reach both milestones.

Men In Black

Instead of the typical road white, D.C. United will be wearing their black uniforms Saturday as they take on the Crew in Columbus. United is undefeated in black uniforms so far this season, but this will be the first time that the black kit will be worn away from RFK Stadium in 2003.

Tied at Half, Tied at the End

D.C. United has a record of 0-0-6 when the score is tied at halftime. Meanwhile, only four of the team's 12 goals have come after halftime. Seven have been scored in the last fifteen minutes of the first stanza.

Head Coach Ray Hudson

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamasa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.

1 Doug Warren GK Ht: 6'0" Wt: 197 Dob: 3.18.81

A 2003 SuperDraft pick, Doug Warren was a standout goalkeeper at Clemson University where he earned NSCAA All-American first team honors and posted a 1.33 goals against average. He has not yet made an appearance during the 2003 season.

2 David Stokes D Ht: 6'3" Wt: 203 Dob: 5.28.82

A hard-working defender, David Stokes was selected fifth overall in the 2003 MLS SuperDraft. Stokes was one of the top defenders at the University of North Carolina, winners of the College Cup in 2001. He has not yet made an appearance during the 2003 season.

3 Galin Ivanov D Ht: 6'1" Wt: 170 Dob: 6.4.75

Galina Ivanov is a very talented defender who spent the past six years with CSKA Sofia in his native land. One of the game's most astute defenders, the Bulgarian international's presence in the D.C. United back line will be a key element in the team's success in 2003.
