





goals from Andy Williams and Ante Razov giving them a 2-0 away victory against D.C. United and sending the home side to their first-ever playoff defeat at RFK Stadium.

Williams scored with a stunning long-range strike to give the Fire the lead after just four minutes, then Razov scored deep into second-half stoppage time to give Chicago a two-goal advantage into the return leg of the home-and-home series, set for Sun., Nov 9 at Soldier Field (1 p.m. ET, ESPN2). United need to win by three goals to advance, or at least lead by two at the end of 90 minutes to force extra-time.

Playing in the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 1999, United was also carrying a 12-game playoff winning streak at RFK Stadium, including the final of MLS Cup 1997, the second of their three MLS Cup victories. Chicago came into the match not having won in their last eight playoff matches on the road, since a 1-0 win away to Los Angeles Galaxy on Oct. 10, 1998.

United coach Ray Hudson gave a start to 37-year-old Hristo Stoitchkov in attack, pairing him with Ronald Cerritos and putting Earnie Stewart into a driving central role behind Marco Etcheverry in United's five-man midfield.

Dave Sarachan again ran out the Fire in a 4-4-2 with DaMarcus Beasley and Andy Williams in the wide midfield roles and Carlos Bocanegra and Jim Curtin as central defenders between fullbacks Orlando Perez and Evan Whitfield.

The Fire struck quickly, taking a vital lead with a dream start in the away leg. United sweeper Ryan Nelsen sent a loose headed clearance on a cross from the left, the ball falling to Williams 25 yards from goal with all the time in the world. He hammered a bending shot with the outside of his right boot, hooking inside Doug Warren's right-hand post and past his despairing dive.

Williams was somewhat of a forgotten man for the Fire, making just four starts over the final half of the campaign. The Jamaican international hit for just two goals in the regular season, the last on August 30 in a 5-1 loss to New England, the worst loss in club history.

After the goal, United were put under pressure for long periods as the Fire could have taken a second. Ante Razov played a neat 1-2 with Curtin in the 10th minute, his angled shot in the area saved well by Warren, then on the resulting corner Jesse Marsch had the ball fall to him in the six and he tried to backheel home, but put in right into the 'keeper's arms.

The home side thought they had equalized in the 14th minute when Ronald Cerritos headed home a freekick flighted in from

the right flank, but assistant referee George Gansner immediately flagged for offside and the goal was ruled out.

Chicago again just missed out when Damani Ralph finally broke free of the suffocating marking he saw all night on the half-hour, only to send his clear flashing header just wide of the post. Beasley then nearly took advantage of another poor clearance to go in alone on Warren, but the United 'keeper came quickly off his line to parry the 12-yard blast.

Hudson radically changed his tactics in the second half, putting Nelsen into a holding midfield role alongside Convey, moving Stewart and Kovalenko to the flanks, and giving Namoff manmarking duties. But it was the Fire that had the best chance, Ralph getting on the end on a Williams cross as they quickly countered, but putting his header just over the bar.

On the hour United went close as Ronald Cerritos screwed his shot into the side netting on a rare occasion that had the Fire rearguard scrambling, then Fire 'keeper Zach Thornton was called upon to make his biggest contribution to the match in the 80th minute, Kovalenko's snap shot off a freekick sent over from the right bringing out a quick diving stop.

Then four minutes into a scheduled five minutes of stoppage time, substitute Nate Jaqua flicked on a long Thornton clearance where Razov fought off a defender before looping it over Warren from just inside the box as the United 'keeper came off his line, and gave United an even bigger mountain to climb in the return leg in a week's time.

7-6-3 Regular Season; 0-2-0 Postseason

D.C. United has a winning record against the Chicago Fire in the regular season, but the Black-and-Red have lost in their only two playoff meetings: the 1998 MLS Cup Final and last Saturday's Eastern Conference Semifinal Game 1. The Black-and-Red have an all-time regular season home record of 5-2-1 against the Fire and a 2-4-2 mark in Chicago.

The Black-and-Red won the 2003 season series against Chicago with a 2-1-1 record. D.C. beat the Fire at home on June 7th by a 2-0 score and at Cardinal Stadium on July 12th by a 2-1 score. The latter result stands out as the only home loss of the season for the Fire. The two teams also tied once this year, 0-0 at RFK in United's home opener on April 19th.

The first playoff meeting between Chicago and D.C. came in the 1998 MLS Cup Final. United fell 2-0 to the expansion Fire before over 51,000 spectators at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California. Jerzy Podbrozny and Diego Gutierrez scored for the Fire, dethroning the reigning champions and forcing United to wait until the following season to capture a third MLS Cup trophy.

Marco Etcheverry is United's all-time points (14) and assists (6) leader for D.C. against Chicago. Surprisingly, Chicago's scoring leader against D.C. is Jesse Marsch. He has accumulated 10 points against the Black-and-Red on four goals and two assists. Two of his four goals were scored during meetings this season.

United Calls Up Baumstark, Waives Geddes

D.C. United announced last Saturday that U.S. U-20 goalkeeper Clint Baumstark has been called up for the remainder of the season. To make room for him on the roster, developmental

'keeper Jorge Geddes was waived. This is Baumstark's fourth call-up this season though he only played one match for the Black-and-Red this year, a 1-1 draw on the road against Columbus on October 4th. Baumstark, a native of Colorado, is a regular on the U.S. U-20 team and is expected to participate in the FIFA World Youth Championships following the MLS season. Geddes, originally from the African nation of Malawi, was picked up by United in June.

MLS Cup Rematch

United's only playoff meeting with the Chicago Fire prior to this home-and-home series came in the 1998 MLS Cup Final. In that match, United dropped a 2-0 decision to the expansion Fire, ending the Black-and-Red's consecutive championship streak at two. However, D.C. returned to the final the following year, defeating the Los Angeles Galaxy to win a third MLS Cup trophy.

Home Loss Ends Playoff Streak

United's 2-0 loss last Saturday at RFK Stadium ended a 12-game home postseason winning streak for the Black-and-Red. However, it also marked the first time the club even hosted a playoff match in four years. If D.C. defeats Chicago in the Eastern Conference Semifinals, the squad will have to play on the road in the Conference Final against either the MetroStars or the Revolution.

Quaranta Finally Healthy

Teenage All-Star Santino Quaranta appears to have finally recovered from a knee injury that again sidelined him for much of the season. He saw action for the Black-and-Red in the club's last two matches, the regular season finale and last Saturday's playoff opener. That marked the first time Quaranta has played in back-to-back games since late July.

Chicago Roots

Goalkeeper Doug Warren and defender/midfielder Bryan Namoff return to their hometown of Chicago for Sunday's game. Warren grew up in Palatine, while Namoff resided in nearby Rockford. Striker Hristo Stoitchkov and midfielder Dema Kovalenko also have strong ties in Chicago, as each played several season for the Fire before joining United this year.

Head Coach Ray Hudson

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamosa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.

Galin Ivanov is a very talented defender who spent the past six years with CSKA Sofia in his native land. One of the game's most astute defenders, the Bulgarian international's presence in the D.C. United back line will be a key element in the team's success in 2003.

Brandon Prideaux returns for his second season at D.C. United after playing three seasons with the Kansas City Wizards. Prideaux is a strong defender who will be called upon to mark some of the toughest opposition that MLS has to offer.

Milton Reyes proved himself to be one of United's best defenders in the 2002 season, using his speed and strength to patrol the entire right side of the field. Reyes has been a staple on the Honduran National Team since 1999. Reyes suffered a torn ACL and meniscus in a preseason match against the Richmond Kickers and will miss the entire season after being placed on the injured reserve list.

A strong, aggressive defensive minded player, Ryan Nelsen was initially penciled in as a defensive midfielder in 2001, yet has made the transition to a defender. 8 Hristo Stoitchkov F Ht: 5'9" Wt: 181 Dob: 2.8.66

Hristo Stoitchkov comes to D.C. United after spending three years with the Chicago Fire. A legend in the world of soccer, Stoitchkov was one of the top players in the world in the mid 1990s. He captured the Golden Boot at the 1994 World Cup when he led the Bulgarian team to a fourth place finish in the tournament.
