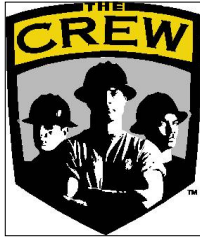

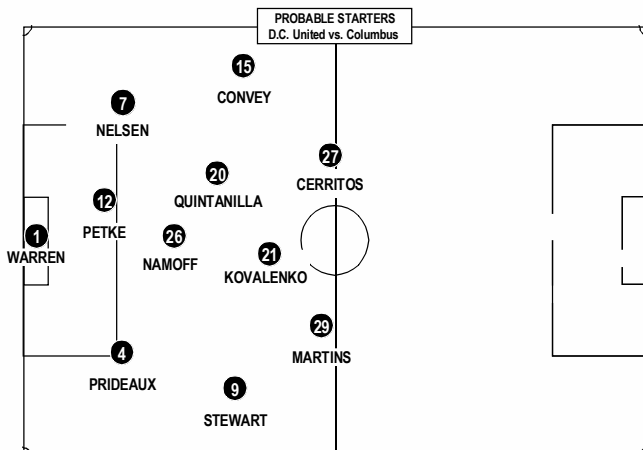

Last Meeting: United Gains Critical Road Draw

COLUMBUS, OH (October 4, 2003) - D.C. United recorded a 1-1 draw with the Columbus Crew Saturday night at Crew Stadium in a critical intra-conference showdown. Marco Etcheverry's penalty kick conversion gave United the road point, answering an early goal by Ross Paule for the home side.

"This was a huge point for us," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "No one gave us the lickings of a dog coming into the match, but we've come up with a spirit-lifting performance."

The Crew dominated most of the first half of play, controlling the ball and pressuring the United players along the length of the field. Columbus drew first blood in the 19th minute, when midfielder Kyle Martino split a trio of United defenders with a short, crisp pass into the penalty area to the feet of an unmarked Ross Paule. Paule, planted squarely in front of the net, notched his fourth goal of the season with a point-blank shot that left goalkeeper Clint Baumstark no chance to react.

D.C. United evened the score in the 59th minute on a penalty kick goal by Marco Etcheverry. Etcheverry earned the trip to the penalty spot in the 57th minute, when his run through the penalty area ended as he was brought down by Crew defender Frankie Hejduk. Stepping to the penalty spot, Etcheverry coerced Crew keeper Jon Busch to dive to his left with a deceptive run up to the ball. At the last moment, however, Etcheverry slipped the ball to the opposite side of the net, knotting the score at 1-1.

Thiago Martins, recently acquired by United from the A-League's Pittsburgh Riverhounds, created a chance for United with a deft touch of the ball in the 37th minute of play. Crew defender Mike Clark had gained good defensive position on Martins, funneling him toward the end line near the post. Martins reversed the situation with a quick touch to the inside, opening up space for a sharp-angled shot. Martins got his left foot on the ball, but hit the near side netting.

The Crew attempted to thwart the re-energized United by pressing numbers forward. In the 57th minute, Columbus had a goal waved off after the Crew pounced on a misplayed ball by D.C.'s Bryan Namoff. Forward Brian McBride appeared to score amidst the confusion inside the penalty area, but Columbus danger man Edson Buddle was ruled offside, nullifying the apparent go-ahead goal.

Namoff made a potentially game-saving defensive play early in the first overtime period, denying Buddle a favorable shot on goal in the 92nd minute when Jeff Cunningham sent a chested ball into the path of Buddle's overlapping run. Lined up with a good angle on net, Buddle's shot was disrupted by a well-timed challenge by Namoff that prevented Buddle from making any meaningful contact. Baumstark came up with the easy save from the deflected shot, sealing the road point for the visiting United.

The match was the MLS debut of Baumstark, a late call-up by United to replace Doug Warren, who returned home to attend to family matters. Baumstark will join the United States U-20 National Team, led by former D.C. Head Coach Thomas Rongen, in Los Angeles tomorrow in preparation for a friendly match against Japan.

United was without a considerable portion of their starting roster for this contest, missing both goalkeeper Nick Rimando and midfielder Ben Olsen with knee injuries. In addition, defender Mike Petke and midfielder Dema Kovalenko were serving disciplinary suspensions, forcing United Head Coach Ray Hudson to adopt a three-man back line.

D.C.'s personnel woes will continue next week, as team captain Ryan Nelsen – along with the Crew's Duncan Oughton – will be on National Team duty with the New Zealand All-Whites.

United (10-9-8, 38 points) faces another playoff-hungry Eastern Conference team next Saturday, October 11th, when they travel to face the New England Revolution. The Revolution, last year's Conference champion, are in fourth place in the East.

Columbus (8-11-8, 32 points) currently resides in fifth place in the East, and stand in danger of missing the MLS Cup Playoffs. The Crew will take on Conference leading Chicago on Friday, October 10th, when the Fire make their return to Soldier Field. Though Columbus trails the East, the remaining schedule for the Eastern teams is heavily skewed towards intra-conference matches, making each remaining match critical for the tightly packed contenders.

Last Match: OT PK Clinches Playoffs for Revolution

FOXBORO, MA (October 11, 2003) - Midfielder Steve Ralston converted an overtime penalty kick as the New England Revolution (10-9-9, 39pts) clinched a berth in the MLS Cup Playoffs with a 1-0 victory over D.C. United (10-10-8, 38pts) at Gillette Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The third goal of the season by Ralston, who donned the captain's armband, allowed New England to overtake United for third place in the Eastern Conference with two games remaining in the season. D.C. United, which has not won an overtime game this season, remains one point away from clinching its first playoff spot since the 1999 season.

“It was a very unfortunate result for us tonight,” said United head Coach Ray Hudson.

“We’ve had a lot of these types of games this season that have been disheartening at the end. But overall I was very proud of the effort the boys put in tonight. We just have to regroup this week in practice and prepare for the game against Columbus next week, which will be a huge match for us in front of our fans.”

New England (39pts) is now just two points behind the second-place MetroStars (41pts), who play later Saturday night against the Dallas Burn. The Revolution and MetroStars close out the season with a home-and-home series beginning next Saturday at Giants Stadium.

On only one other occasion had a match ended on a penalty kick in sudden death overtime. Los Angeles Galaxy forward Carlos Ruiz netted that goal on March 23, 2002 also against D.C. United.

The penalty kick was awarded to the Revolution just 30 seconds into the overtime period as New England forward Chris Bagley was judged to have been brought down in the box by D.C. defender Brandon Prideaux. Bagley, a native of Weymouth,

Massachusetts, entered the match in the second half in place of rookie Pat Noonan, and in the process made his MLS debut after signing with the club on Friday.

The Revolution registered the best scoring opportunities of the first half, only to be denied by rookie goalkeeper Doug Warren, who was decisive coming off his line throughout the match. Warren, who has replaced injured Nick Rimando (left ACL tear) as United's starting 'keeper, made his second start of the season after missing last weekend's game in Columbus due to personal reasons. The Clemson University product tied a career high with six saves, stopping shots by Ralston (11th min), midfielder Shalrie Joseph (19th min), right back Jay Heaps (28th min) and forward Dario Fabbro (47th min).

Despite New England's efforts at goal, United had the best opportunity to open the scoring in the 37th minute as a scramble near the Revolution goal line was cleared away by Joseph in front of a muddle of players. Just two minutes later Warren was saved by the base of the right post as Revolution midfielder Brian Kamler nodded an accurate ball from the center of the box against the woodwork.

Except for a flurry of Warren saves in the first 15 minutes after the break, including another two against Ralston, the second half offered little in the way of scoring opportunities as neither team was incisive in attack. The Revolution attack was depleted with the absence of veteran forward Joe-Max Moore (left knee sprain) and the season-ending losses of striker and leading scorer Taylor Twellman (left foot stress fracture) and late season acquisition Chris Brown (broken left foot). The team also watched playmaker Jose Cancela limp off the field before the end of regulation.

Although United welcomed the return of defender Mike Petke and midfielder Dema Kovalenko from caution point suspension, the visitors played without defender and captain Ryan Nelsen, who joined the New Zealand National Team for a friendly against Iran. New England's regular left back and captain, Joey Franchino, sat out the match with a calf strain as Marshall Leonard took his place at left back.

D.C. United plays its final two matches of the regular season at RFK Stadium beginning with a contest against the Columbus Crew on Sunday, October 19 (4:00 p.m. ET - ESPN2). The New England Revolution play a home-and-home series against the MetroStars in their final two matches beginning with a match next Saturday, Oct. 18 at Giants Stadium (7:30 p.m. ET).

Series History: United Leads 14-10-3

D.C. United has a winning record against Columbus thanks in large part to dominating the Crew at RFK Stadium. The Black-and-Red have an impressive 10-2-1 mark at home against Columbus, but are only 4-8-2 in Ohio. However, one of those draws came two weeks ago when these sides last met on October 4th.

In the first two United-Crew matchups, each side came away with one 3-0 win and one 3-0 loss. On June 14th United throttled the Crew, with the team in gold returning the favor at Crew Stadium on October 4th.

The danger man for the Crew over the years has been Brian McBride. The U.S. National Team veteran has accumulated 23 points against D.C. on nine goals and five assists.

The Magic Number

United's magic number to reach the playoffs is one. The Black-and-Red need either a single point earned on their own or dropped by the Crew to guarantee a playoff spot. Therefore, the Black-and-Red can be assured of postseason action with only a draw against Columbus. However, if the Black-and-Red are beaten at home by the Crew, they will then need a point against Kansas City (or a Chicago win or tie against Columbus) in the last weekend of the regular season to be assured a spot in the playoffs. Simply put, the only way Columbus can make the playoffs instead of D.C. is if United loses both of their final two matches and Columbus wins both of theirs.

Nelsen Back From Middle East, U-23's Return

United captain and defender Ryan Nelsen returns to the side after missing last weekend's match to play for New Zealand in their match against Iran. Nelsen captained his national team, which was defeated by the Iranians by a 3-0 score. Three United players (Alecko Eskandarian, Brian Carroll, and David Stokes) saw action as starters for the U.S. U-23 team in a friendly against Haiti Wednesday night in Florida, which the U.S. won by a 1-0 score. All three players will be available for selection on Sunday afternoon.

Suspensions and Warnings

Midfielder and leading scorer Marco Etcheverry will not be available for action Sunday against Columbus. The Bolivian veteran is suspended due to caution point accumulation. He received a yellow card for dissent in the New England game for arguing with the referee following the awarding of a penalty kick that sank United in overtime. Defenders Galin Ivanov, Ryan Nelsen, and midfielder Dema Kovalenko are all currently under disciplinary warning, meaning that yellow cards to any of the three would most likely result in a suspension for the last regular season match of the year, next weekend at home against Kansas City.

Olsen, Kovalenko Sign Contract Extensions

D.C. United announced on Thursday that midfielders Ben Olsen and Dema Kovalenko have each signed contract extensions that will keep them with the club. Specific terms of the deal were not disclosed. Olsen has been with United since 1998, while Kovalenko is completing his first season with the Black-and-Red after four years with the Chicago Fire.

Olsen Suffers Injury Blow

Midfield workhorse Ben Olsen went down with a sprained MCL in his left knee just minutes into a 1-1 draw with the MetroStars on September 28th. Surgery will not be necessary, but the veteran winger is expected to miss six to eight weeks. Olsen is second on the team in scoring with four goals and seven assists for 15 points. All of his tallies went in as game-winners and the club is 14-0-0 lifetime in games that Olsen scores in. He started in more games than any other player on the club this season, all 26 of the campaign up until the injury forced him out of the lineup in Columbus on October 4th.

Rimando Out for Season, Falling Short of Record

Goalkeeper Nick Rimando was forced to leave the September 25th match against the MetroStars with an injury to his left knee. An MRI revealed that he suffered a torn ACL and an operation has already been performed. He will miss the remainder of the season. The United veteran was closing in on the all-time MLS record for consecutive minutes played, held by Peter Vermes (6066 minutes). Rimando fell 50 minutes short of tying the record, ending his impressive streak at 6,016 minutes, dating all the way back to July 4, 2001.

United Sets New Club Record for Ties in a Season

D.C. United's 1-1 tie against the MetroStars on September 28th was the team's seventh draw of the season. That was followed by another 1-1 tie, October 4th in Columbus. United has now set

a new club record for ties in a season (eight), surpassing the old mark of six that was set in 2000 and matched in 2002.

Scoring Numbers

D.C. United has scored 20 first-half goals. That is second most in Major League Soccer behind Kansas City and San Jose (21 each). The Black-and-Red are an impressive 8-1-0 when leading at halftime, including a 5-0-0 mark when taking an advantage into the locker room at RFK Stadium. Also, United has allowed only 11 second half goals, fewer than any other team in the league. However, the Black-and-Red have been the victims of an overtime shocker four times this season, more than any other team in MLS. D.C. United has the second lowest goals against average in the league at 1.10. Only San Jose's 1.07 GAA is better.

Sharing the Glory

D.C. United has 14 players that have registered at least one goal this season, second most in the league. Only Dallas has more with 15. San Jose holds third place with 13, while Los Angeles has the fewest goal-scorers with only nine different players finding the net for the reigning MLS Cup Champions. A club-record 17 players tallied during the course of United's 1997 MLS campaign.

Racking Up the Wins

D.C. United has been one of the strongest teams in the league since turning things around after a slow start to the season. Since June 7th, the date the Black-and-Red finally got into the win column, United has climbed up the Eastern Conference table with 10 wins. That is tied for second most in the league with San Jose and Colorado. Only Chicago has more with 11. Dallas has the fewest wins since early June with only four.

Bring On the Samba

D.C. United announced on September 11th the acquisition of Brazilian forward Thiago Martins. Martins just completed his third year in the A-League and second with the Pittsburgh Riverhounds. He led all scorers in the league with 51 points on 22 goals and seven assists. The Sao Paulo native was recently named the A-League's Most Valuable Player. Martins holds a Green Card and will not count as United's third Senior International, a spot that was vacated when Hristo Stoitchkov received his Green Card earlier this season.

United's Accurate Shooting

In terms of scoring percentage, D.C. United has two of the top three shooters in MLS. Dema Kovalenko has scored six goals on 22 shots for a 27.3% strike rate, highest in MLS. Marco Etcheverry is third on the list with six goals on 26 shots for 23.1%.

Stoitchkov Returns With Healthy Numbers

Forward Hristo Stoitchkov has been one of the most productive players in the league in terms of assists over 90-minute spans. Stoitchkov is tied with Kansas City's Preki for the highest average of assists per 90 minutes in MLS with five helpers in 767 minutes played. That averages to 0.58 assists per 90 minutes. Preki has the same average with 16 assists in 2,488 minutes. Stoitchkov is back at full fitness made his first appearance in several weeks October 4th as a second half substitute against Columbus. He came on again late in last week's match against New England.

Lets Get Physical

United has been one of the most physical teams in the league this season. Through 28 games played, United has committed 492 fouls. That's more than any other team in MLS. The Black-and-Red have also suffered the third most fouls at 489, only one fewer than Chicago (490) and two fewer than the MetroStars (491). D.C. has picked up the most cautions in league play with 61 yellow cards having been shown to the Black-and-Red. Mike Petke has received nine yellow cards, tied with Carlos Llamasa of New England and Oscar Pareja of Dallas for the league lead. Dema Kovalenko has committed the second most fouls in the league with 59. Only Carlos Ruiz of L.A. (72) has more. Kovalenko has also suffered a lot of fouls – 63 to be exact – for seventh most in the league. Ben Olsen has suffered the third most at 80.

Keeping It Close

D.C. United has only lost two games this season by more than one goal. The first loss (3-0) came at the hands of the Columbus Crew at Crew Stadium on June 28th. The second was August 16th when the Fire came from behind to beat the Black-and-Red 3-1. Head Coach Ray Hudson

A South Florida soccer legend for more than 20 years, Ray Hudson was named the head coach of D.C. United on January 8, 2002. Hudson joins United from Fusion F.C., where, in his first full year as head coach of the club, he led them to the best regular season record in MLS and to the semifinals of the 2001 MLS Cup.

Hudson was named head coach of the Fusion on May 8, 2000 and instilled an exciting offensive attack that netted more than two goals per game and narrowly missed the playoffs by two points. The team that had just one win in its first eight games of the season before Hudson's hiring, immediately recorded three straight victories on its way to an 11-12-1 mark the remainder of the year. The team also advanced to the 2000 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final, winning four consecutive contests before falling to the Chicago Fire 2-1 in the Championship game on October 21.

In 2001, Hudson molded Fusion F.C. into a championship contender by bringing in talented players such as Carlos Llamasa, Chris Henderson, Preki, Ian Bishop and Alex Pineda Chacon. The results were new Fusion club records for wins (16), points (53), goals (57), assists (89) and fewest goals allowed (36) in a season that also netted the first division title in club history and the 2001 MLS Supporters Shield.

Known as one of the most quotable personalities in American sports, the colorful Hudson previously served as Fusion F.C.'s television color analyst on Sunshine Network from its inception in 1998 until he took the reigns as head coach. He also worked in the office as the community outreach manager for seven months.

Hudson, 47, brings to United an unparalleled level of passion, grit and determination gained over a long and stellar relationship with the world's most popular sport. As a crafty playmaker, his list of teammates and opponents reads as a "who's who" of soccer history. German World Cup hero Gerd Muller, English goalkeeper Gordon Banks and Peruvian legend "Nene" Cubillas all played with him. The great Brazilian Pele, Dutchman Johan Cruyff and Ireland's George Best battled against the native of Newcastle England.

"Rocky," as he was affectionately known during his playing days, captured the hearts of South Florida sports fans as captain of the Fort Lauderdale Strikers from 1977-84. He was a five-time NASL All-Star midfielder who led the Strikers to the Soccer Bowl in 1980. Former Strikers and Kansas City Wizards head coach Ron Newman said in 1978, "Ray is the finest midfielder in the league. I wouldn't trade him for Franz Beckenbauer or any other midfielder in the NASL."

When the team moved to Minneapolis, Hudson played three years for the club (1984-87) and finished his NASL career with 197 games played, 44 goals and 99 assists (third in NASL history). He then returned to South Florida to play for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the APSL (1988-91).

Hudson began his professional career with Newcastle United of the English Premier League in 1973 at the age of 17. He made over 40 appearances for the first division club from 1973-77 before joining the Strikers.

After retiring from soccer in 1992, Hudson stayed active in the sport as director of coaching for the Hollywood Wildcats youth program (1993-97) and coach at University High School at Nova Southeastern (1998) in Davie.

Hudson returned to Lockhart Stadium in 1998 as the Fusion's color commentator on Sunshine Network. As a television analyst, his enthusiasm and knowledge of the game earned him critical praise. *City Link* magazine named him the area's best color analyst, and a CNN/SI web site poll selected him the best analyst in MLS. As the Fusion's community outreach manager, Hudson entertained an average of 20,000 children a month with energetic soccer assemblies at elementary schools and clinics involving local youth teams.
