Last Meeting: Eskandarian Goal Shakes the 'Quakes

WASHINGTON, D.C. (April 3, 2004) – On a day that saw 14-year-old prodigy Freddy Adu make his professional debut, D.C. United received a vintage performance from forward Jaime Moreno that gave the home side a 2-1 victory over the defending MLS Cup champion San Jose Earthquakes on opening day in the official kickoff to the 2004 Major League Soccer season on Saturday afternoon.

The sellout crowd of 24,603 at R.F.K. Stadium witnessed MLS history in the 61st minute as Adu entered the match, while Moreno brought back memories of the glory days for United with a goal and an assist as Peter Nowak celebrated victory in his first match as D.C. head coach.

After a cautious start to the game by both sides, United broke open the scoring in the 12th minute through Moreno, who officially signed with the club on Friday and made his return to United after a one-year stint with the MetroStars. After drawing a foul on the left attacking flank, it was Moreno himself who nodded home a header that bounced inside the right post off a service from Earnie Stewart. It was Moreno's first goal in a United uniform since June 19, 2002, (a 2-0 home victory vs. Colorado) and his all-time team-leading 70th career goal for the club.

United's lead was short-lived, however, as the visitors grabbed the equalizer in the 19th minute on a penalty kick scored by central midfielder Ronnie Ekelund. Midfielder Richard Mulrooney sent the ball down the heart of the United defense into the path of a cutting Brian Mullan. United goalkeeper Nick Rimando came off his line to anticipate Mullan, but collided with the player instead. Ekelund stepped up to drill the spot kick into the upper left corner of the goal, tying the score at 1-1.

It was Moreno's vision which helped restore United's lead in the 39th minute. Moreno, who continuously sought the ball and made his characteristic penetrating dribbling runs, sliced a pass into a seam in the middle of the San Jose back line which found Alecko Eskandarian. The No. 1 selection of the 2003 SuperDraft beat his defender to the ball and lofted a left-footed shot inside the far right post for his fourth career goal.

While the Earthquakes presented its long-established 4-4-2 lineup, United's first-year head coach unveiled a new lineup with Bryan Namoff, Ryan Nelsen and Mike Petke forming the team's three-man defense. Second-year player Brian Carroll, who was making his MLS debut after playing in U.S. Open Cup and exhibition matches in 2003, played directly in front of the back line behind a fluid midfield comprised of Bobby Convey, Ben Olsen, Dema Kovalenko and Stewart from left to right, who all continuously swapped positions. While Eskandarian was the target man in attack, Moreno was left free to roam the entire field and proved the creative spark behind United's attacks.

United missed several clear-cut scoring opportunities in the opening 10 minutes of the second half. Five minutes after the break, Convey ran onto a pinpoint long-distance pass from Stewart, rounding San Jose goalkeeper Pat Onstad on his

first touch. But his shot from 10 yards out hit the left side netting. In the 53rd minute, Petke sent a weak header from just five yards out into the hands of Onstad, who botched the outlet pass seconds later leading to another shot by Stewart that finished high of an open goal. Two minutes later Eskandarian found another seam in the Earthquakes back line but his left-footed shot on goal was saved by Onstad.

Chanting "Freddy, Freddy" from the start of the second half, the fans finally got what they wanted when Adu came on for Eskandarian just after the hour as cameras flashed in the stands. The No. 1 pick in this year's SuperDraft replaced last year's No. 1 overall pick in United's attack and became the youngest player in league history, surpassing the mark set by D.C. teammate Santino Quaranta, who made his debut at the age of 16 years and 207 days on May 9, 2001.

The best chance at a second-half equalizer for the Earthquakes came on a 65th minute attempt by Donovan, who cracked a searing shot from the top of the box which United goalkeeper Nick Rimando bounced to his right to parry away.

Two red cards left their mark on the end of the match as Earthquakes defender Craig Waibel was shown a red card for a foul on Moreno in the 76th minute. Four minutes later United was also reduced to 10 men after a Kovalenko was sent off for clipping Mullan from behind.

Neither team was particularly threatening in attack for the remainder of the match as United comfortably held on for a 2-1 opening day win in a match which marked the first career win as a head coach for Nowak, while San Jose head coach Dominic Kinnear saw his debut end in a loss.

Last Match: Ring Shines in Fire's First Victory of 2004

WASHINGTON, D.C. (April 24, 2004) – The Chicago Fire scored their first goal of the season Saturday and also got into the win column for the first time in 2004, as they defeated D.C. United 1-0 at RFK Stadium. A Damani Ralph goal in the 57th minute – off an impressive individual effort – provided the Fire with their first league goal of the year after 327 minutes of play.

Ralph's goal halted Chicago's scoreless streak a half-hour shy of the MLS record for the longest goalless streak to start a season. Fire midfielder Andy Williams found Ralph in the middle of the field 35 yards from goal. Ralph then turned toward the net and simply outran defenders Ryan Nelsen and Ben Olsen before slotting the ball home from 12 yards out.

The defending Eastern Conference champions won their first game of the year, helped in no small part by a third shutout of the season for goalkeeper Henry Ring, who recorded eight saves, while United lost for the second consecutive week after opening the season with a win and a draw.

United – for the second straight week – dominated the first half but fell short in the second. They clearly had the edge in an opening frame marred by tight marking in a muddled midfield and a lack of flow.

Straight off the opening kick, United looked to push the tempo with Jaime Moreno heavily involved. In the fifth minute, Moreno freed Bobby Convey on the left flank. Convey's low cross was redirected just off the bar by Earnie Stewart, who was streaking toward the near post.

In the 26th minute, United again assaulted the Fire back line, as Dema Kovalenko made a perfectly timed run to overlap Olsen. Olsen played Kovalenko into the space on the right side of the penalty area, and Ring did well to save Kovalenko's low, hard shot.

At the other end, the Fire could find no room to move. On several occasions, Ralph found himself with the ball on the edge of the box, but surrounded by black shirts and unable to do anything. Though Ralph used his strength well to maintain possession, he was given few options.

When they weren't blanketing the Fire's attacking players, United's midfielders were advancing on the Fire net.

In the 38th minute, Olsen had loads of space in the middle of the park and, after carrying the ball toward the box, fired a shot from 20 yards out, which Ring just pushed over the bar.

The Fire's best chance of the half was produced by DaMarcus Beasley, streaking down the center of the field. Beasley found midfielder Justin Mapp on the right side of area. He had a free shot, but mis-hit it and the ball cleared the bar by several yards.

In the opening minutes of the second half, the teams traded chances and both goalkeepers showed their worth. In the 46th minute, Alecko Eskandarian launched a shot from 12 yards out, and Ring had to dive to the left to punch it wide. Three minutes later, Williams ran onto a through ball on the left and carried the ball almost to the end line. After cutting the ball back, he put a high, hard shot on net, but United keeper Nick Rimando knocked the ball in the air and United was forced to clear their lines.

Then just before the hour, Ralph showed his strength and speed in netting the game's only goal. The second-year player, who signed a long-term contract with MLS and the Fire on Thursday, also let his hair down and was the key to the Fire attack all afternoon.

Not long after the Ralph goal, the Fire could have doubled their lead. Ralph played a ball for strike partner Nate Jaqua in the area, and Jaqua nearly slid the ball inside the far post from a tough angle.

Late in the game, the play slowed down as the Fire clogged their defensive third looking to maintain their lead. Referee Ricardo Valenzuela issued three yellow cards in a seven-minute span, and even 14-year-old rookie Freddy Adu got in the act, receiving a yellow card in the 76th minute for pushing Williams.

United made two final efforts came close to leveling the score, first when Kovalenko had a chance from point-blank range in the 81st minute after having beaten the offside trap, only to shoot straight at Ring. A few minutes later, it was Olsen's turn to try to even things. Adu laid the ball off to Olsen at the top of the box, but again the shot was directly at Ring.

United has not experienced much success of late against San Jose, having defeated the 'Quakes only three times since 1998. All three victories have come in the friendly confines of RFK Stadium. The Black-and-Red own a 6-5-0 record on East Capitol Street against the West Coast visitors. Spartan Stadium has been a decidedly hostile environment for D.C., as United (2-4-2) has been shutout three times, with a -2 goal differential.

As Olsen Goes...

D.C. United's loss to the MetroStars marks the first time United has lost when Ben Olsen scores. Olsen has 20 career goals for the Black-and-Red, and the team is an amazing 14-1-0 in regular season play, 18-1-0 overall.

Youth Movement

With his goal against the MetroStars, Freddy Adu became the youngest player to score in Major League Soccer, and the sixth to notch his first professional goal before his 18th birthday. At the tender age of 14 years, 320 days, he surpassed teammate Santino Quaranta (16 years, 217 days) by nearly two years. Of the six players who scored their first goal before being able to vote, United has three. M Bobby Convey is also on the list, having scored his goal at the ripe old age of 17 years, 316 days.

Quick Out of the Gates

United's four points from four matches is the fastest pace since the 2001 season, where United took six points from their first three matches. United didn't reach the four-point plateau until their sixth match in 2003.

Season Accolades

United's players have been racking up the honors this year. F Jaime Moreno was named MLS Player of the Week following his three-point performance against San Jose on April 3rd. Alecko Eskandarian earned Sierra Mist Goal of the Week honors in that game as well, and Ronald Cerritos's 68th minute strike against the Galaxy was chosen Goal of the Week for week two.

For Club and Country

Bobby Convey played 90 minutes in the United States' 1-0 defeat of CONCACAF rival Mexico at Dallas' Cotton Bowl on Wednesday night. His freekick in stoppage time set up the game-winner from the head of Eddie Pope. The shutout extends Mexico's streak of ineffectiveness against the U.S. to 434 minutes over the last five games.

Ronald Cerritos also made an appearance on international duty. Cerritos stayed closer to home, playing 80 minutes in El Salvador's 2-0 loss to Colombia at RFK Stadium Wednesday night. He would have the best chance on goal for El Salvador, but his 64th minute shot was saved by the Colombian 'keeper. Both players will rejoin United in San Jose, and will be available for selection.

Reversal of Fortune

United D Brian Carroll did not appear in a single minute of League play for the Black-and-Red in the 2003 season. In the 2004 season, Carroll has played every minute of every match. The West Springfield HS product has been a vital part of United's new-look midfield throughout 2004.

On the Mend

Forward Santino Quaranta recently underwent surgery to smooth calcium deposits on his pubic bone that were causing small tears in the adductor tendon. The surgery, performed by Dr. William Meyers at the Hahnmen University Medical Center in Philadelphia, PA, was a success. Quaranta is expected to make a full return to training in four to six weeks.

Mirror Image?

Although the Earthquakes and United have identical 1-2-1 records, San Jose sits bottom of the table in the West, while DC is nipping at second-place in the East.

Chances Are...

With a new brand of attacking soccer, United have created more quality chances on goal. Through four games in 2003, United had registered 46 shots, with 22 of them on target. Through the same number of games in 2004, United has only registered 37 shots, with 20 on frame. United has only needed an average of four on-frame attempts (20 SOG/5 G) to score a goal in 2004, compared to over seven (22 SOG/3 G) in 2003.

Head Coach Peter Nowak

Peter Nowak's reign as United's fourth Head Coach in club history became official with his signed contract on January 7, 2004. Nowak, 39, begins his coaching career with Major League Soccer's most decorated franchise following an illustrious professional playing career of nearly 23 years. After captaining the Chicago Fire for five seasons, he accepted a position in the club's front office for the 2003 campaign. In his role as the Director of International Relations and Soccer and Business Adviser, Nowak worked closely with nearly all of the club's departments, including the coaching staff, youth player development, community relations, broadcasting and marketing.

His five years on the field for the Fire made him a fan favorite not only in Chicago, but around the entire league. During his half-decade playing career in MLS, Nowak accumulated 100 points on 26 goals and 48 assists. He led the expansion Fire to an MLS Cup championship in 1998 and U.S. Open Cup titles in 1998, 2000 and 2001. Three times each, he was an MLS All-Star (1998, 1999, 2000), a member of the MLS Pepsi Best XI (1998, 2000, 2001) and the Fire's MVP (1998, 2000, 2001). Nowak was also selected as the MVP of MLS Cup 1998.

Nowak's success in MLS surprised very few who were familiar with his prior performances in Europe. Before coming to America, the native of Pabianice, Poland, saw action in 116 games in the German Bundesliga. During his five years in Germany, Nowak lent his services to such world-renowned clubs as 1860 Munich (1994-1997), Kaiserslautern (1994) and Dynamo Dresden (1993-1994). He scored a combined 17 goals in Germany's top league.

Prior to his time in Germany, Nowak also was a member of Switzerland's Young Boys Berne (1992-1993) and Turkey's Bakirkoyspor (1990-1992). He began his career with his hometown team in Pabianice in 1979 as a 15-year-old and played with four teams in Poland before moving to Turkey. Nowak's Polish clubs, in addition to Pabianice (1979-1983) included Motor Lublin (1984-1985), Widzew Lodz (1985-1986) and WKS Zawisza Bydgoszcz (1983-1984 and 1986-1990).

Nowak's myriad of successes at the club level led to a distinguished international career as well. He was the captain of the Poland National Team for three years and was named Poland's Player of the Year in 1996. In 24 appearances for his country, Nowak scored three goals.
