INTER MIAMI CF TO FACE THE NEW YORK RED BULLS ON THE ROAD ON SATURDAY

Inter Miami CF (10W-10L-6D, 36 points) is set to take off on another road trip this week in which the team will aim to continue with its fine form when it visits the New York Red Bulls (11W, 8L, 8D, 41 points) on Saturday, Aug. 27. Kickoff at Red Bull Arena is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET.

Inter Miami will face the New York Red Bulls at Red Bull Arena on Saturday amidst a five-match unbeaten run, which includes a 0-1 road win against the San Jose Earthquakes on Aug.3 and a 2-2 draw in the team's visit to CF Montréal on Aug. 6. This weekend, Inter Miami will have its sights set on equalling the club-record six-match unbeaten run that was set in 2021 from Aug. 18 to Sept. 14. The team's current five-match unbeaten run is tied for the second longest in the league only behind CF Montréal's six-match run.

Inter Miami will enter the weekend's fixture after earning a crucial 2-1 home win for its playoff push over Toronto FC on Saturday, Aug. 20. Inter Miami currently is above the playoff line, sitting in sixth place in the Eastern Conference with 36 points.

With the win against Toronto, the team extended its positive run at DRV PNK Stadium, having fallen only once in its last 12 outings in South Florida. Overall, Inter Miami has recorded eight wins at DRV PNK Stadium in the 2022 regular season, placing the team tied atop the Eastern Conference in home wins, and tied for second in MLS.

Week 1: Damion Lowe

Damion Lowe 2 was been named to the bench of the MLS Team of the Week, following his strong debut in Inter Miami's season opener against Chicago Fire FC on Saturday, Feb. 26. The Jamaican international started and played the entire 90 minutes, recording his first clean sheet in front of an electric home crowd at DRV PNK Stadium.

Week 6: Leonardo Campana

Leonardo Campana was been named to the MLS Team of the Week following his hat trick-scoring performance in the 3-2 victory against 2021 Supporters' Shield winners the New England Revolution on Saturday, April 9 at DRV PNK Stadium.

Week 7: Aime Mabika

Aime Mabika was named to the MLS Team of the Week following his outstanding performance in the team's 1-0 win over the Seattle Sounders on Saturday, April 16. He started and played the entire 90 minutes, helping man a stalwart defense that maintained a clean sheet against a surging Seattle offense.

Week 8: Leonrdo Campana

Leonardo Campana has been named after recording a goal and the game-winning assist in the 2-1 win over Atlanta United on Sunday, April 24 at DRV PNK Stadium. The victory extended the team's winning streak to four across all competitions. He was named Heineken Man of the Match for the third time in the past four matches, has been involved in each of the team's last seven goals across all competitions - a club record - scoring five and assisting two.

Week 12: Damion Lowe, Drake Callender

Lowe earned his spot in the MLS Team of the Week after anchoring the defense and denying Philadelphia with two blocks, two key interceptions and a heroic goal line clearance. The Jamaican international also recorded his first goal for the club last week against D.C. United.

Callender, meanwhile, made his first appearance in the MLS Team of the Week bench, following his Heineken Man of the Match performance against the Philadelphia Union. During the draw on the road against Philadelphia, Callender made an outstanding eight saves, six of which were from close range inside the box, earning him his first MLS clean sheet in confident fashion. Callender's save in the fifth minute of the match received recognition in SportsCenter Top 10 plays coming in No. 4 on the list.

Week 13: Phil Neville, Drake Callender

Head coach Phil Neville and goalkeeper Drake Callender were named to the Team of the Week for week 13 of the 2022 MLS regular season. The pair earned the honors after the team defeated the New York Red Bulls 2-0 on Sunday, May 22 at DRV PNK Stadium. The team's win earned the club three points and snapped the Red Bulls' seven road-match unbeaten streak.

Week 14: Robert Taylor

Robert Taylor was named to the MLS Team following his key contributions off the bench to secure the team's 2-1 win over the Portland Timbers on Saturday night at DRV PNK Stadium. The Finnish international entered the match at halftime and provided an attacking boost to the squad by scoring his second goal in back-to-back MLS games, both resulting in consecutive victories for the team and helping extend the team's home undefeated run to six at DRV PNK Stadium across all competitions.

Week 16: Indiana Vassilev, Bryce Duke

Attacker Indiana Vassilev and midfielder Bryce Duke were named to Team of the Week after their stellar performances in Inter Miami's 2-1 victory over Minnesota United FC. Vassilev became the first player in MLS history to score both a game-tying and game-winning goal after entering the game in the 80th minute or later. Duke was named to the bench after notching an assist in the 87th minute on a perfectly weighted pass to Vassilev, to tie the game at 1-1. In addition to the assist, the midfielder contributed five key passes, five ball recoveries, nine duels won, and won both of his tackles.

Week 18: Damion Lowe

Damion Lowe made his third appearance in the MLS Team of the Week this season following a determined defensive display in Inter Miami's 1-1 draw against FC Dallas on July 4 at Toyota Stadium. Lowe anchored the Herons' defensive line against FC Dallas, with a performance that saw him complete the game with an 84.8% passing rate, win 71.4% of duels, and make three key tackles. The Jamaican National has been a near constant in the defense, playing 1,320 minutes for Inter Miami this season in MLS, with four clean sheets, and a team-leading 33 successful interceptions.

Week 21: Gonzalo Higuaín, Gregore

Gonzalo Higuaín and midfielder Gregore were named to the MLS Team of the Week following the pair's contributions helped rally the Herons to an exhilarating 3-2 comeback win over Charlotte FC, Saturday, July 16, at DRV PNK Stadium. Higuaín was named to the starting XI of the Team of the Week after the decorated striker scored his second goal in as many matches off the bench. Team captain Gregore, meanwhile, was named to the bench of the Team of the Week; the midfielder also assisted on Inter Miami's first goal of the match, logging two assists that evening to take his overall record in 2022 to three.

Week 23: Gonzalo Higuaín

Inter Miami CF forward Gonzalo Higuaín was been named to the MLS Team of the Week The nomination to the starting XI comes after Higuaín's first-half hat trick helped guide the Herons to a 4-4 draw against FC Cincinnati the night of Saturday, July 30, at DRV PNK Stadium.

Week 24: Drake Callender

Callender first played a vital role in securing three points on the road against the San Jose Earthquakes, where he was an academy player from 2013 to 2016, on Aug.3; the shot-stopper made five crucial saves and maintained a clean sheet for the Herons in the first matchup in club history between the sides. The three-time Team of the Week honoree followed with another dynamic performance in a drawn game against CF Montréal at Stade Saputo on Aug. 6; Callender finished the night with three saves, including one of which denied Montréal the opportunity to extend their lead in the second half.

Week 25: Alejandro Pozuelo

The Spaniard recorded his first goals for Inter Miami with a pair of precise finishes, along with a secondary assist for the team's second goal of the night, to propel the Herons to a critical 3-2 victory. Pozuelo finished with an 86% pass rate and two key passes.

Week 26: Damion Lowe

Damion Lowe was chosen to the MLS Team of the Week following a dominating defensive performance, as well as registering an assist, in a crucial win over Toronto FC at DRV PNK Stadium on Saturday night.

2022 MLS Player of the Week Honorees:

Week 6: Leonardo Campana

Campana registered a perfect hat-trick, scoring with his right, left and head, to lead Inter Miami CF past the New England Revolution by 3-2 on Saturday, April 9 at DRV PNK Stadium. Campana's hat-trick, which was the first recorded by an Inter Miami player for the club, also earned him a spot in the MLS Team of the Week. On Saturday, Campana led the response for Inter Miami CF as they trailed the New England Revolution by a goal, equalizing in the 17th minute with a well taken header to the far post off of Ariel Lassiter's cross. Only six minutes later in the 23rd minute, Robbie Robinson squared the ball from the left side of the penalty box to Campana, who would fire the hosts into the lead with a left footed shot into the roof of the net. In the 88th minute, Noah Allen and Bryce Duke played in tandem to produce the opportunity for the game winner. Duke played a ball into the six yard box to Campana, which was initially deflected. Campana stayed with the play and the ball eventually fell to him, allowing him to deftly poke the game winner past New England's Brad Knighton.

Week 23: Gonzalo Higuaín

The recognition comes after the Argentine notched a first-half hat trick Saturday July 30, at DRV PNK Stadium in a 4-4 draw against FC Cincinnati. Higuaín became the first-ever Inter Miami player, and just the third MLS player this season, to score three goals in the first half of a match. Additionally, he joined fellow striker Leonardo Campana (April 9, 2022 vs. New England Revolution) as the only players in club history to score a hat trick. The South Americans are the only pair of MLS teammates to each score a hat trick in the same season since 2019. Higuaín's brilliance began in the 23rd minute when he slotted home a free kick from the edge of the box into the top right corner of the net. A left-footed finish in the 37th minute followed by a penalty kick during first-half stoppage time completed the historic hat trick giving Higuaín seven goals against FC Cincinnati since the start of 2020, the most by an MLS player against a single club during that span. With his performance Saturday night, Higuaín has now scored in three of his last four MLS appearances and is the first player in club history to score 20 MLS regular season goals. Higuaín is Inter Miami's second MLS Player of the Week nominee this season, joining Campana in Week 6, and the only player in club history to earn multiple MLS Player of the Week honors after winning the award in Week 5 of 2021.

Week 25: Alejandro Pozuelo

Inter Miami CF attacking midfielder Alejandro Pozuelo has been named to the MLS Team of the Week presented by Audi for Week 25 of the 2022 MLS regular season. Pozuelo, who joined the club as a Designated Player this summer, was selected for the Team of the Week following a standout performance over the weekend, scoring a brace against New York City FC at DRV PNK Stadium on Saturday, Aug. 13. The Spaniard recorded his first goals for Inter Miami with a pair of precise finishes, along with a secondary assist for the team's second goal of the night, to propel the Herons to a critical 3-2 victory. Pozuelo, the 2020 Landon Donovan MLS MVP, finished with an 86% pass rate and two key passes. He also converted each of his shots on target, and brought his record against NYCFC to nine goals and five assists in 12 games against the Northeastern outfit. Pozuelo becomes the tenth Inter Miami player to be featured in the Team of the Week this season. The club has now had a representative, either player or coach, in the Team of the Week in 13 different weeks of the 2022 MLS regular season.

2022 MLS All-Stars:

DeAndre Yedlin

Yedlin, who became the second All-Star in club history, was selected for an MLS All-Star for the third time in his career after partaking in the 2013 and 2014 editions when he was a Seattle Sounders FC player. Yedlin came into the match after halftime and played the second 45 minutes as the MLS All-Stars topped the Liga MX All-Stars 2-1 in a thrilling fixture.

2022 MLS Goal of the Week:

Week 8: Leonardo Campana

The end result is a narrow win for Inter Miami CF striker Leo Campana, whose red-hot form helped power a 2-1 win over Atlanta United. The Ecuadorian international earned first place through 27.4% of the vote, a left-footed shot that capped a beautiful over-the-shoulder collection from DeAndre Yedlin's cross.

Week 23: Gonzalo Higuaín

Inter Miami CF star Gonzalo Higuaín has earned AT&T 5G Goal of the Week honors for Week 23 of the MLS season after lasering a free kick into the top corner in last weekend's 4-4 draw with FC Cincinnati.

PREVIOUS MATCH RECAP

INTER MIAMI CF EARNS 2-1 WIN OVER TORONTO FC AT DRV PNK STADIUM

Inter Miami CF earned a 2-1 win over Toronto FC on Saturday night at DRV PNK Stadium. Heineken Man of the Match Jean Mota and winger Ariel Lassiter scored the team's goals tonight for Inter Miami to extend its unbeaten run in MLS play to five and continue its strong form at home, having lost only once in its last 12 outings in South Florida.

Inter Miami took the field on Saturday night with a starting XI featuring two changes from its thrilling 3-2 victory over New York City FC a week ago. Drake Callender started in goal; DeAndre Yedlin, Damion Lowe, Ryan Sailor and Chris McVey formed the team's backline; captain Gregore, Mota and Alejandro Pozuelo lined up in midfield; Robert Taylor and Lassiter flanked striker Gonzalo Higuaín in attack.

Lassiter and Sailor were the two changes, returning to the starting XI in place of Kieran Gibbs and Bryce Duke. Additionally, midfielder Pozuelo faced his former side after playing for Toronto FC for three and a half seasons from 2019 up to this summer when he joined the club.

The first half saw the sides trading blows, starting with the hosts striking first, opening the scoring in the 24th minute. Following a throw-in, Yedlin and Higuaín played a one-two on the right wing, and the Argentine skipped past a defender before laying a pass off for Mota, who struck a powerful shot on target, off the hands of the Toronto goalkeeper and into the back of the net to take the 1-0 lead. The goal was Mota's second in MLS this season and third across all competitions, while the assist was Higuaín's third of the year and Yedlin's secondary assist also took his assist tally up to three on the season.

Toronto equalized just four minutes later when a Federico Bernardeschi cross took a big deflection, and Lorenzo Insigne slid and volleyed the ball outside the box, slotting it inside the far post for the equalizer.


Just before halftime, however, Inter Miami reclaimed its lead with a perfectly worked free kick routine; Mota played it short to Pozuelo, who clipped a ball to Lowe at the far post, and the Jamaican international defender headed it back across to Lassiter in front of the goal where the Costa Rican controlled it and calmly finished to make it 2-1. The goal marked Lassiter's second in as many matches and third this season in MLS, while the assist was Lowe's first, and the secondary assist brought Pozuelo's Inter Miami tally up to four and his MLS season tally up to nine.

After the break, both teams delivered energetic performances, with plenty of threatening opportunities in attack for both sides. Inter Miami defended stoutly to keep the danger away. Notably, Callender and Lowe registered several crucial defensive interventions to deny Toronto's offensive efforts.

Inter Miami held onto its 2-1 throughout the remainder of a thrilling second half to clinch three valuable points at home and climb up to fifth place in the Eastern Conference standings as the team carries on with its playoff push.

Mota was voted Heineken Man of the Match by fans following his long-range strike and controlling midfield performance.

Inter Miami will take to the road for its next match, traveling North to face the New York Red Bulls on Saturday, Aug. 27 at 7 p.m. ET.
