On adapting to Ramirez's game model:

"I think the team has been adapting really well [to the game model], you can see on the pitch just how much we have improved in many different areas. The team has been able to cope in matches, which is what we needed to keep growing and get to that MLS level.

"That feeling of controlling the games wasn't really all there in those first matches of ours compared to how it's been in our more recent matches. I feel like that has been the key for us these past few games."

On the match against the Union and the fans' support:

"It's a really important game for us this weekend, we've won two straight but we want to make it three. We are now going away from home, and we need to show that we are prepared to play those matches.

"But I just want to thank the fans, because, without them, we wouldn't feel that energy we have in our games. When I first arrived here I was told that there was a lot of interest in the team, so I had been waiting to get close to the fans and for those matches that we've had with them recently. Hopefully, we can keep the results coming for them."



MIGUEL ÁNGEL RAMÍREZ

On the the team's improvement, as well as his own improvement as a coach:

"I think the thing that pleased me the most from this game was our offensive transitions. We were smarter and more patient in our transitions, instead of rushing as we did sometimes before."

"You could see throughout the match that whenever we won the ball and started our offensive transitions, the player with the ball would always look up to see if he had enough teammates around him to continue the push the ball forward. That's what really stood out to me this game from us."

"And I feel like I'm improving as a coach, and I think that all these matches have only helped me grow. This is a long journey, this is only my third stint as a head coach. I'm practically still in diapers when it comes to a coaching career. My players have also taught me a lot, they've been important in my growth as a coach."

On the fans' support:

"I just want to say thank you to fans who have been with us from the very start. I don't know if they really realize, but on the pitch, we can really feel them. When we are running out of gas or struggling on the pitch, it's the fans who give us life."

"Whether we win or lose, I hope that fans feel represented by us. That they see a team that represents them well. That it represents the Carolinas, Latinos, and Americans."





World Cup in Brazil and the 2019 Concacaf U-17 Championship. The 18-year-old played a total of 19 games with the team.

ADRIAN ZENDEJAS @MRZ3ND

General: Charlotte FC signed Adrian Zendejas as a free agent. Zendejas made 54 total appearances for Swope Park Rangers,

Sporting KC's USL Championship affiliate after joining the club in 2016. He made his SKC debut in the 2018 U.S. Open Cup, starting in victories over Real Salt Lake and FC Dallas and went on to make five total appearances.

Zendejas has also spent time on MLS rosters at Nashville SC and Minnesota United FC. The latter loaned the California native to El Paso Locomotive FC of the USL Championship in 2021, where he immediately started three games and kept three clean sheets.

ALAN FRANCO @ALAN_FRANCO21

General:Charlotte FC acquired Alan Franco on Ioan from Atlético Mineiro with an option to purchase. Franco reunites with head coach Miguel

Ángel Ramírez in Charlotte. The midfielder was an instrumental part of Ramírez's Independiente del Valle squad that triumphed in the 2019 Copa Sudamericana, starting all 11 matches and adding two goals in the tournament.

Franco has 18 caps and one goal for the Ecuadorian

National Team, including appearances in nine out of 14 games during the current CONMEBOL World Cup Qualification cycle. Ecuador currently sit in third place and an automatic qualification spot with four games remaining.

The Ecuadorian debuted for his boyhood club, Independiente del Valle, as a 17-year-old in 2016, going on to make 75 appearances with five goals and six assists.

After his success at Independiente, Franco moved to Atlético Mineiro in Brazil's first division in 2020. Across two seasons he accumulated 47 appearances while scoring three goals.

ANTON WALKES @ANTONWALKES

General: Charlotte FC acquired Walkes from Atlanta United in the 2021 MLS Expansion Draft. In 2021, Walkes had a career year with Atlanta United,

starting 32 games with two goals and two assists. The versatile defender came through the Tottenham Hotspur academy, originally going on loan to Atlanta in 2017 before joining Portsmouth in 2018. In 2020, Atlanta acquired the center back permanently and in three total seasons with the club, he compiled 71 appearances with 65 starts, four goals, and three assists.

BEN BENDER

General: Charlotte FC drafted Bender 1st overall in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Bender finished his sophomore season with seven goals and five assists in 18 appearances, leading

his team to a 12-4-2 overall record. The midfielder was named a United Soccer Coaches First Team All-American and the Big Ten Midfielder of the Year. He was one of eight elite collegiate underclassmen signed to a Generation adidas contract.



13 BRANDT BRONICO @BRONIBRO13

General: Charlotte FC acquired Bronico from the Chicago Fire in exchange for swapping fourth-round picks in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Bronico joined Charlotte FC after four seasons (2017-20) with the Chicago Fire. A fan favorite in Chicago, Bronico made 66 appearances, including 40 starts, notching two goals and eight assists in his four seasons with the Fire. Bronico joined Chicago as a third-round choice (47th overall) in the2017 SuperDraft.

Bronico played collegiately for the Charlotte 49ers from 2013-16, scoring 25 goals and adding 23assists. As a senior in 2016, Bronico was named the Conference USA Player of the Year and secondteam All-America after scoring nine goals, including four game-winners.

A native of High Point, N.C., Bronico played on youth teams for NC Fusion and Carolina Dynamo.



General:Charlotte FC acquired Hegardt and his Homegrown Priority from the Seattle Sounders for \$50,000 in GAM. Hegardt played 31 games for

Georgetown across two seasons where he scored three goals and added six assists. The Hoyas won the 2021 BIG EAST Conference Tournament and earned the number three overall seed in the 2021 NCAA Tournament before falling in the Final Four.

Prior to his time at Georgetown, the San Diego native was part of the Seattle Sounders' academy where he won the 2019 Generation adidas Cup. Hegardt made his professional debut with the Sounders' USL affiliate, Tacoma Defiance, in 2019 and went on to play 17 games overall.

CHRISTIAN FUCHS @FUCHS_OFFICIAL

General: Charlotte FC acquired Fuchs from Premier League side Leicester City. The former Austrian national team

captain won the 2015-16 Premier League title and the 2020-21 English FA Cup. Fuchs played for Bundesliga's Bochum, Mainz and Schalke before joining Leicester City in 2015. Throughout his six years at City, the 35-year-old made 152 appearances and excelled in the UEFA Champions League as the team reached the last-eight during their campaign at Europe's highest level.

CHRISTIAN MAKOUN @CHRISTIANMAKOUN

General: Charlotte FC acquired Makoun from Inter Miami in exchange for the No. 1 Allocation Ranking spot. As a teenager,

Makoun signed as Miami's third-ever player ahead of their debut 2020 season. He then had a breakout season in 2021, playing in 26 games with 23 starts and two goals.

The center back has begun to break through with the Venezuelan national team and has been called up to the senior squad for multiple World Cup Qualifiers this cycle. Makoun has been named as a substitute in Venezuela's last five CONMEBOL World Cup Qualifiers but has yet to make his senior debut.

As a 17-year-old, he played for the Venezuela U-20s with two appearances at the 2017 U-20 World Cup. Two years later, he captained the side for all nine games at the 2019 U-20 South American Championship.

Makoun's youth development began in the Zamora FC academy in his native Venezuela. He made 34 total senior appearances for his boyhood club on either side of a 2018 loan to Italian giant Juventus, where he amassed experience across their youth teams. George Marks – Charlotte FC drafted Marks in the third round of the 2022 MLS SuperDraft

General: - Charlotte FC drafted Marks in the third round of the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Marks was a three-year full-time starter for at Clemson

University, leading them to the 2021 NCAA National Championship in his senior year. He recorded 47 wins, 21 shutouts, and 6,031 minutes for the Tigers, all good for 3rd all-time in program history. The Raleigh, North Carolina native attended two U-20 U.S. National Team Camps and was a member for the North Carolina FC Youth Academy.



GUZMAN CORUJO @CORUJOGUZMAN

General: Charlotte FC acquired Corujo from his hometown club Nacional in Uruguay. The 25-yearold center back has played

over 100 matches for Nacional since debuting as a professional for the Uruguayan club in 2017.

A two-time champion of Uruguay's Primera Divisiónin 2019 and 2020, Corujo featured 22 times forNacional in the Copa Libertadores, the top continental club competition in South America.

HARRISON AFFUL @KINGHARRISON25

General: Charlotte FC acquired longtime Columbus Crew defender Afful as a free agent. The 35-year-old right back was

a stalwart for the Columbus Crew for seven years, starting at least 20 matches in each of the last six seasons. Afful has played in 164 regular season matches and contributed six goals with 18 assists. In addition, the Ghanaian has 17 playoff appearances including an MLS Cup title with Columbus in 2020 where he played all 90 minutes in a 3-0 win over the Seattle Sounders.

Afful has earned 83 caps for his country and started two of Ghana's three group stage games at the 2014 World Cup, registering an assist against Germany. The right back has featured in three World Cup Qualifying cycles and five Africa Cup of Nations tournaments. Prior to playing in Major League Soccer, Afful came through the academy at Ghanaian club Fetteh Feyenoord. He spent two years with the Feyenoord senior team before going on loan for a further two years to another Ghanaian club, Asante Kotoko.

After four years of professional soccer in Ghana, Afful left his home country to join Esperance Tunis of the Tunisian first division. He spent six seasons with Tunis and racked up almost 180 appearances and won four league titles. While in Tunisia, he played 52 times in the CAF Champions League and led ES Tunis to the 2011 title which earned the Club a berth in the 2012 FIFA Club World Cup

represented his country in the 2019 U-20 World Cup. Upon returning to Łódź the following season, he became a first-team regular. Sobociński has recorded a total of 165 professional appearances with 12 goals. He has represented Poland at youth level 16 times, most recently in the U21 team.

In 2017, defender was named to the CONCACAF U-17 Championship Best XI as the U.S. qualified for the 2017 FIFA U-17 World Cup. There, Lindsey started and played 90 minutes in all three group stages games before an injury ruled him out of the knockout rounds as the U.S. eventually fell in the Quarterfinals.

Before joining the Sporting Kansas City academy in 2015, Lindsey played for local youth club Charlotte Soccer Academy.

With the second-place finish, Świderski and Poland will enter the UEFA World Cup Qualifying Playoffs in March to try and book their spot in the 2022 World Cup.

Świderski played in all three matches for Poland during last summer's EURO 2020 which included starting in tandem with 2021 Ballon d'Or Striker of the Year, Robert Lewandowski, during a 1-1 draw against Spain.

The striker began his career in his native Poland when he signed his first professional contract with Jagiellonia Biallystok. He would score 25 goals in 128 appearances for Jagiellonia before being bought by PAOK.





Prior to Internacional, Ramírez led the Ecuadorian club, Independiente del Valle for two seasons (2019-2020), capturing a Copa Sudamericana title just months into his first head coaching job in 2019.

Considered the second-most prestigious international competition in all of South America pitting many of the top clubs on the continent, the Copa Sudamericana tournament win was the first international title in Independiente's history, a significant accomplishment for a manager in his first true head coaching opportunity.

Ramírez' talent for player development was ingrained in all of that 2019 season's success in Ecuador. He had coached the club's youth team in 2018 and 2019, instilling the winning attitude that eventually led to the international win.

A native of Las Palmas, Spain, Ramírez began to train as a coach in the lower categories of the Union Deportiva Las Palmas and Deportivo Alaves, in Spain. He moved to Greece in 2011 with AEK FC, Panathinaikos and Olympiacos. Ramirez also spent six years at the Aspire Academy in Doha, Qatar, where he coached the Under-12, Under-13, Under-16 and Under-17 sides.
