On his strengths and the position he expects to play:

“After talking to Miguel, some of the assistant coaches, and even Zoran, a lot of it is my ability to read plays on the ball and with the ball and being close to goal. To score goals and get assists and things like that. So, I think you guys can expect me to play a little higher up the field than I did in Colorado.

“That’s what I wanted to do and what I came here for. That’s one of the reasons I decided to come to Charlotte, was because the coaching staff, not just Miguel, they all believe that I can score goals and that’s what I believe I can do as well.”

On playing against Charlotte FC as a member of the Rapids two weeks ago:

“It’s actually funny, because I was talking to Miguel [Ramírez] about it, he asked me what do you think about how we play and things like that. I just love the way they play, I think they caused a lot of problems for us with their positions and where they were getting the ball. And to be fair they probably should have won the game.

“For me I like the attacking football style they play, the press, really putting teams on the back foot. I was really impressed by the first trainings I’ve already had. It’s really intense and I think, in the long term, it will be very successful.”

MIGUEL ÁNGEL RAMÍREZ



On acquiring Shinyashiki and the state of the roster for formational flexibility:

“We were assessing domestic options since last year, so before starting the competition. And Andre was one of the targets we could get knowing the rules, our budget, and possibilities.

“We believe he’s a good potential, and already he performed in MLS, and showed his qualities. And also the possibility to play on the wing, the striker, to play as second striker gives us more depth that we needed, even more with injuries we are getting.

“Now in terms of depth, we are more compensated. We are also able to change the formation in one moment, having more wingers. We were playing a 442 because of the lack of wingers. Now we are able to have more players per position. Flexibility and depth.”

On what it means to return to play at Bank of America Stadium:

“Imagine. We are super excited to be at home. The confidence and the support that we have here at home, of course, we don’t have away. And playing in front of our people and feel the support and love from out people, is amazing for us

“And, it also scares the opponent. Now they know, opponents know how difficult it is to beat us here and how powerful is the atmosphere and energy in this stadium.”

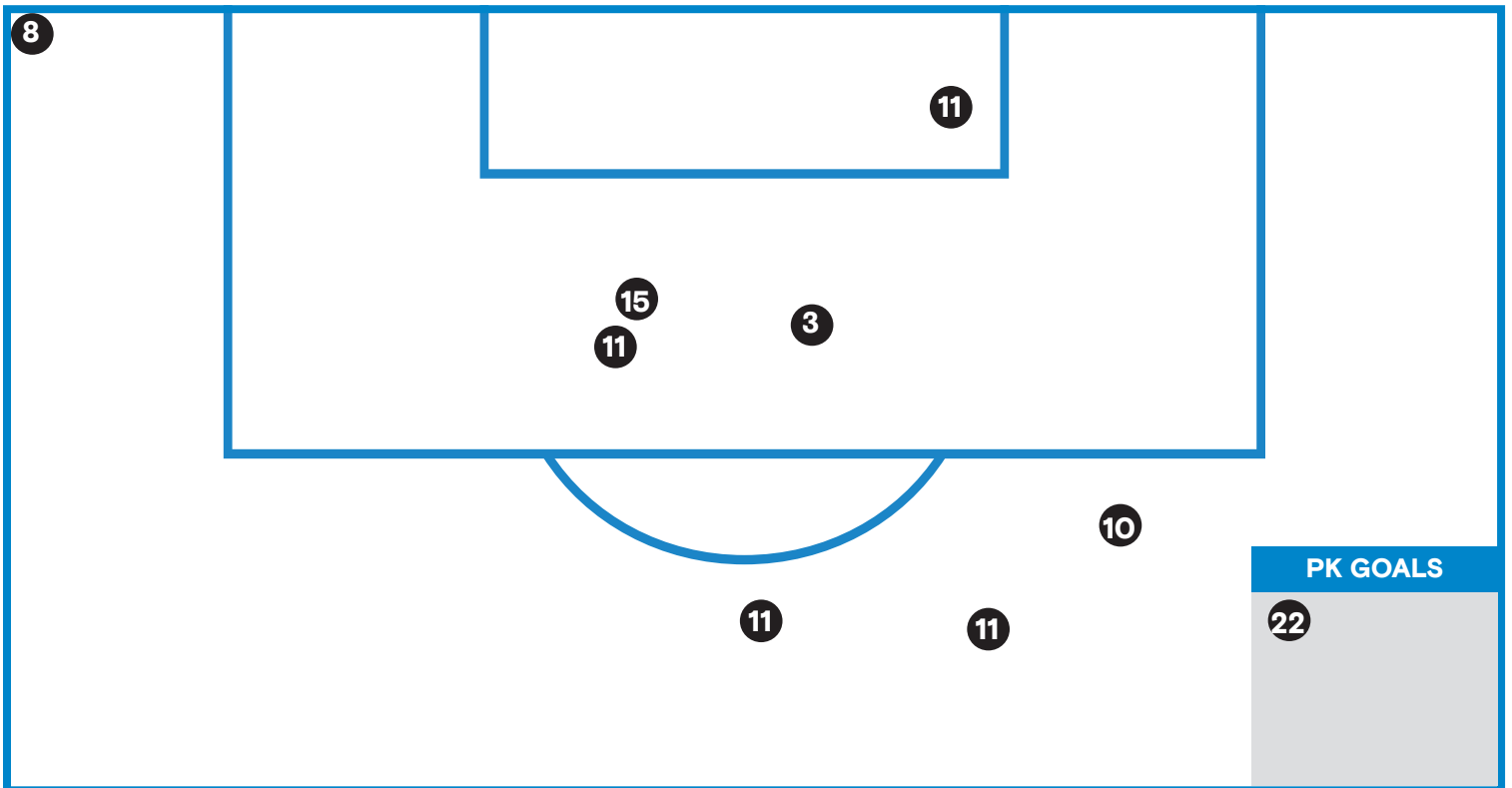

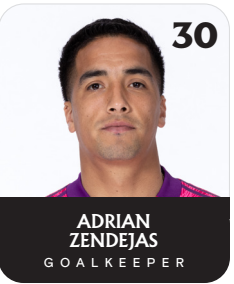

General: Charlotte FC acquired Kahlina from Bulgarian champions Ludogorets Razgrad. The 29-year-old goalkeeper

made 36 appearances across all competitions keeping 13 clean sheets over his year-and-a-half spell with Ludogorets. He joined at the end of the 2020-2021 season, starting the club's final five league matches and helped wrap up Ludogorets' tenth consecutive Bulgarian title.

Prior to his move to Charlotte, the Croatian started 10 league matches this season and featured in Champions League qualifying rounds and the Europa League group stage.



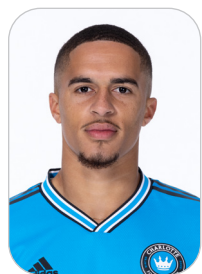

General: Charlotte FC acquired Sobocinski from LKS Lodz in his native Poland. Sobociński, a left-footed central defender,

represented his country in the 2019 U-20 World Cup. Sobociński joined the youth ranks at Łódź in 2015, and was loaned to Polish third-division side Gryf Wejherowo for first-team experience in 2017-18. Upon returning to Łódź the following season, he became a first-team regular. Sobociński has recorded a total of 165 professional appearances with 12 goals. He has represented Poland at youth level 16 times, most recently in the U21 team.

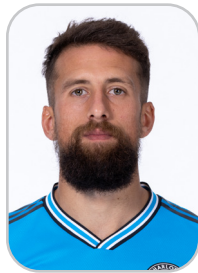
ADAM ARMOUR

General: Charlotte FC acquired Armour in June 2021. The Cary native played with the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team roster for the 2019 FIFA U-17

World Cup in Brazil and the 2019 Concacaf U-17 Championship. The 18-year-old played a total of 19 games with the team.

Born to parents from Dominica and Jamaica, the U.S. youth international signed with the German second division FC Nürnberg in the fall of 2020 before returning to his home state with CLTFC.

over 100 matches for Nacional since debuting as a professional for the Uruguayan club in 2017.

A two-time champion of Uruguay's Primera División in 2019 and 2020, Corujo featured 22 times for Nacional in the Copa Libertadores, the top continental club competition in South America.

General: Charlotte FC acquired Walkes from Atlanta United in the 2021 MLS Expansion Draft. In 2021, Walkes had a career year with Atlanta United,

starting 32 games with two goals and two assists. The versatile defender came through the Tottenham Hotspur academy, originally going on loan to Atlanta in 2017 before joining Portsmouth in 2018. In 2020, Atlanta acquired the center back permanently and in three total seasons with the club, he compiled 71 appearances with 65 starts, four goals, and three assists.

General: Charlotte FC acquired Ruiz as the Club's first-ever signing from Spanish second-division side Racing Santander,

whom he represented as captain. Ruiz represented Racing in the past three seasons, after graduating from its reserve team in 2016. His six goals and seven assists in the 2018-19 campaign helped earn Racing promotion to the Spanish Second Division.

Ruiz spent 2021 on loan with Las Palmas in the Spanish Second Division.

General: Charlotte FC acquired Jozwiak from English Championship side Derby County on a Designated Player contract.

The 23-year-old, who is teammates with Karol Swiderski on the Polish national team, played 61 times for Derby across all competitions. Józwiak started all three matches for Poland in last summer's European Championship and played eight of 10 in this World Cup Qualifying cycle. In total, the winger has 22 caps with three goals for the national team.

Jozwiak began his career in his native Poland with Lech Poznan playing 123 matches after graduating their academy. He scored 17 goals and added 17 assists for Poznan to earn a move to Derby County. Jozwiak also spent a season on loan at GKS Katowice.

General: – Alcívar played 83 times for his boyhood club LDU Quito, scoring five goals and contributing six assists. He started all six matches in LDU's Copa

Libertadores campaign this season and scored a brace during second leg of the club's Round of 16 Copa Sudamericana fixture against Gremio to put his side through on aggregate against the Brazilians. Alcívar was key to Ecuador's youth national team success over the course of the 2019 season. The midfielder made four appearances for the title winning U-20s at the South American Championships which qualified Ecuador to the 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cup later that summer.

A third-place finish was on the cards for Ecuador in that competition, the country's best finish at a U-20 World Cup. Alcívar played six matches and put in a 112 minute shift in the third-place playoff against Italy, a 1-0 win for Ecuador.

In Greece, Świdorski won three trophies including the 2018-19 Super League Greece and two Greek Cups.

The 25-year-old striker made his debut for Poland in March 2021 where he scored off the bench in a 3-0 World Cup Qualifier win against Andorra. Świdorski would go on to make nine total appearances during the qualifying campaign, netting five goals en route to helping Poland to a second-place finish in Group I. With the second-place finish, Świdorski and Poland will enter the UEFA World Cup Qualifying Playoffs in March to try and book their spot in the 2022 World Cup.

Świdorski played in all three matches for Poland during last summer's EURO 2020 which included starting in tandem with 2021 Ballon d'Or Striker of the Year, Robert Lewandowski, during a 1-1 draw against Spain.

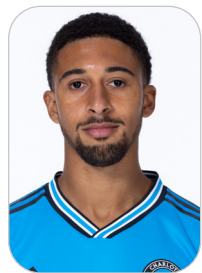

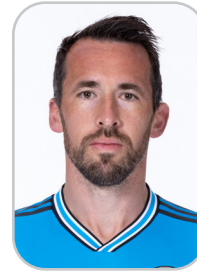

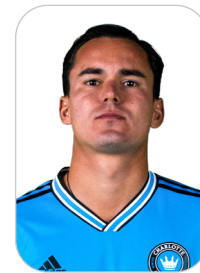

Prior to Internacional, Ramírez led the Ecuadorian club, Independiente del Valle for two seasons (2019-2020), capturing a Copa Sudamericana title just months into his first head coaching job in 2019.

Considered the second-most prestigious international competition in all of South America pitting many of the top clubs on the continent, the Copa Sudamericana tournament win was the first international title in Independiente's history, a significant accomplishment for a manager in his first true head coaching opportunity.

Ramírez' talent for player development was ingrained in all of that 2019 season's success in Ecuador. He had coached the club's youth team in 2018 and 2019, instilling the winning attitude that eventually led to the international win.
