VS. SPORTING KANSAS CITY

Saturday's match marks the 58th all-time meeting between the Chicago Fire and Sporting KC. Chicago leads the series with a 26-19-12 all-time regular season record against the Western Conference side. Chicago is 18-5-3 at home against Kansas City, but Sporting enters Saturday unbeaten in its last six games against the Fire dating back to July 29, 2017 (5-0-1). The Fire have only hosted Sporting KC twice during that stretch, falling 4-3 at SeatGeek Stadium on March 10, 2018 and drawing 2-2 at Soldier Field on Oct. 17, 2020.

SQUEAKY CLEAN

The Fire haven't conceded a goal since the 58th minute of Decision Day of 2021 which puts their shutout streak at 302 minutes. The 2-0 win over D.C. United marked the first time in Club history that the Fire have opened a season with three straight clean sheets. Another clean sheet against Kansas City would mark the first time the Club has posted four straight clean sheets since July 2009.

The Fire are the only team in the league that hasn't allowed a goal through the first three games, and have opened a season unbeaten through the first three matches since 2009, when Chicago didn't lose until its 12th match.

SO FRESH AND SO CLEAN (SHEET)

While playing with Kansas City, Chicago Fire FC TV analyst Tony Meola set the league record for shutouts in a single season (16) in the 2000 MLS campaign.

So far in 2022, Gaga is 3/3 on shutouts and has recorded seven shutouts in his first 14 professional games. Since making his first pro start on Aug. 4, 2021, Gaga has recorded the highest clean sheet per-game ratio of any keeper in the league at 50 percent (7 clean sheets in 14 starts).

With a fourth consecutive shutout possible against Sporting Kansas City on Saturday, Gaga could become the first player in league history to accomplish the feat in his team's first four games of the season.

Overall, Gaga has posted the third-most clean sheets (7) in the league since Aug. 4. Additionally, Slonina has played 4-10 games fewer than the goalkeepers who have recorded more clean sheets during that stretch.

Slonina's record is also attributed to a solid defense, as the Fire have faced the third least amount of shots on target in the league (8) and also rank eighth in the league in shots blocked (14).

THE A TEAM (OF THE WEEK)

Wyatt Omsberg and goalkeeper Gaga Slonina were included in the MLS Team of the Week following their performances in Week 3.

Omsberg - who was named to the team's first XI - started and played 90 minutes on Saturday for the third-straight match in central defense alongside captain Rafael Czichos. Against D.C., Omsberg accounted for 21 defensive actions (clearance, blocks, interceptions, and recoveries) according to Opta, and helped push the team's current run without conceding a goal to 334 minutes.

Slonina was named to the Team of the Week bench for the second time in three games, following his inclusion in the Week 1 TOTW after the Fire's opening day 0-0 draw at Inter Miami CF.

PLAYING WITH FIRE

Designated Player Xherdan Shaqiri is tied for the third-most chances created (11) in the league, behind Luciano Acosta (13) and Lucas Zelarayan (13). Of those 11 chances created, eight came from open play with three coming from set pieces.

As a team, the Fire have created 29 chances through its first three games, which means Shaqiri has been responsible for 38 percent of the team's chance creation.

On the other side of the ball, Designated Player Gastón Giménez ranks second in the league for recoveries (35). Only New York Red Bulls midfielder Dru Yearwood has tallied more recoveries (36). Giménez has led the team in recoveries in each of its first three games this season, averaging just under 12 recoveries per game.

Gimenez is also tied with Wyatt Omsberg and Fabian Herbers for the team lead in tackles won, with six each. Defensively, Omsberg and Rafael Czichos are tied for the team-lead in blocks with 4 each while Omsberg ranks first on the team in clearances (22); Czichos ranks second (21).



CALL ME

Chicago Fire FC goalkeeper Chris Brady and forward Brian Gutiérrez were named to the U.S. Under-20 Men's Youth National Team roster for a training camp in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from March 21-30.

The U.S. U-20 Men's Youth National Team will face Argentina on Saturday, March 26, and Argentine Primera Division club River Plate on Tuesday, March 29. Players born on or after Jan. 1, 2003 are age-eligible for the 2022-23 U-20 MYNT cycle. The roster features 13 players born in 2003, six born in 2004 and one born in 2005.

It will be the first call up for Brady under head coach Mike Varas, who has called 20 players into training camp as the U.S. continues preparations for this summer's Concacaf U-20 Championship in Honduras. The tournament will serve as qualification to the 2023 FIFA U-20 World Cup and the 2024 Summer Olympics.

Gutiérrez joins the U-20 MYNT for the third time this cycle, after competing in a January Training Camp earlier this year, and the Revelations Cup in Celaya, Mexico in November 2021.

THE EZRA ERA

In November 2022, Chicago Fire FC named Ezra Hendrickson the 10th full-time head coach in team history. With more than 25 years of domestic experience, Hendrickson joins the Fire with a proven track record of success in MLS, winning 15 major trophies as a coach and a player. A native of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Hendrickson, 49, comes to Chicago after spending the past 13 seasons coaching domestically and internationally. Most recently, Hendrickson was the lead assistant coach for the reigning MLS champions Columbus Crew (2019-2021), where he helped the team capture the 2020 MLS Cup and the 2021 Campeones Cup.

Hendrickson originally began his coaching career with Seattle Sounders FC, serving as an assistant coach for Sigi Schmid, whose 240 regular season wins are tied for the most in league history, from 2009-2014. During this stretch, Hendrickson helped lead the Sounders to four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles (2009, 2010, 2011, 2014) and an MLS Supporters' Shield (2014), before becoming head coach of Seattle Sounders FC 2 in the USL Championship from 2015-17. Additionally, while working with the Sounders, Hendrickson served as an assistant coach for Saint Vincent and the Grenadines during 2018 FIFA World Cup qualifying (2015-18). Following his time in Seattle, he reunited with Schmid in Los Angeles in 2018, spending one season as an assistant coach for the LA Galaxy, before joining the Crew on July 3, 2019.

As a player, Hendrickson won eight trophies during 12 MLS seasons (1997-2008). The former defender was an MLS champion with three different teams (2002, 2004, 2008) and won three MLS Supporters' Shield trophies (1998, 2002, 2008), the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup (2001) and the Concacaf Champions' Cup (2000).

Overall, Hendrickson made 266 MLS regular season appearances (225 starts) for the New York MetroStars (1997), LA Galaxy (1997-2003), Dallas Burn (2003), D.C. United (2004), Chivas USA (2005-06) and Columbus Crew (2006-08). Prior to joining MLS, Hendrickson spent time with the Des Moines Menace (1994) and the New Orleans Riverboat Gamblers (1995-1996).

BENCH NOTES

Hendrickson has brought together a coaching staff brimming with soccer acumen. Chicago Fire FC legend Frank Klopas and goalkeeper coach Adin Brown return to the sideline, joined by assistant coaches Junior González and Ring of Fire member C.J. Brown.

González brings more than 20 years of coaching experience to the Fire and previously worked alongside Hendrickson at the LA Galaxy and Seattle Sounders FC 2.

González joins the Fire after spending the last two-and-a-half seasons as head coach of LA Galaxy II in the USL Championship. González originally joined the LA Galaxy first team as an assistant coach in 2018, where he worked alongside Hendrickson, before being appointed to LA Galaxy II as interim head coach on July 19, 2019.

Klopas, a Chicago soccer icon, has been involved with the Fire and Major League Soccer in a variety of roles since 1998. Since joining his hometown Club in 1998, Klopas has served as a player, head coach, technical director, team ambassador and broadcaster for the Fire over the course of 22 years. His honors with the Club include an MLS Cup title and a U.S. Open Cup championship in the same season (1998). Additionally, Klopas was inducted into the Club's Ring of Fire in 2004 and the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

Adin Brown joined the Fire in 2020 from Portland Timbers 2, where he spent two seasons. Before his stint in USL, Brown led the goalkeeping duties for the Timbers First Team from 2015-17 and helped guide the club to its first MLS Cup title.

The Club leader in appearances (372), starts (364) and minutes played (32,538), C.J. Brown returns to the Fire with 25 years of experience as a coach and player at the professional level. C.J. spent the 2021 season as the technical director and head coach of Chicago House AC in the National Independent Soccer Association (NISA). Prior to his time with Chicago House, the California Bay Area native spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach in MLS, working with Real Salt Lake (2011-13), the Fire (2014), New York City FC (2015), Orlando City SC (2016-18) and the New York Red Bulls (2018-20). Additionally, earlier this year Brown served as an assistant coach for the U-23 U.S. Men's National Team in the 2020 Concacaf Men's Olympic Qualifying Championship.

HOMEGROWN AND READY

Since January 2020, the Fire have signed nine Homegrowns (a player that has graduated from the Fire's Academy program) and currently have 11 Homegrown Players under contract through the 2022 season. Anchoring the Fire's backline is 17-year-old phenom and Addison native Gabriel Slonina, who was recently ranked as the most valuable goalkeeper in the world for his age. Slonina is joined by fellow 17-year-old goalkeeper and Naperville native Chris Brady, who comes into the season ranked as the 10th most valuable goalkeeper born in 2004, making the Fire the only Club in the world with two top-10 17-year-old goalkeepers.

Brian Gutiérrez, an 18-year-old from West Lawn, can be found in the midfield, creating goal-scoring opportunities for his teammates. In the center of the pitch, you can find 2020 Fire Defender of the Year, Mauricio Pineda, from Bolingbrook. The Club's latest Homegrown signing, Victor Bezerra, can be found scoring goals or walking around his neighborhood, Gold Coast. Head to the other side of the Loop to find Andre Reynolds II, a graduate of South Loop Elementary, and a speedy outside back. Javier Casas Jr., also from Addison, recently was called into the U.S. U-20 MYNT camp. From Downers Grove, Alex Monis was destined to be a Fire player after his dad, Rich, served as the Fire's head athletic trainer from 1998 through 2001. Forward Misael Rodríguez, who earned the Golden Boot at the MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs, represents Chicago Lawn. Last but not least, you have the youngest Homegrown, Sergio Oregel, who at just 16-years-old is a professional soccer player that also hails from West Lawn.



LAKE MICHIGAN MESSI

The Alpine Messi, Switzerland National Team midfielder Xherdan Shaqiri joins Chicago Fire FC as a Designated Player, becoming the most expensive transfer signing in Club history. Since making his professional debut in 2009, he has made 421 appearances across all competitions, winning 17 major trophies during that stretch. Additionally, the attacking midfielder has earned 100 caps for Switzerland's senior national team, featuring in three consecutive FIFA World Cups (2010, 2014, 2018) and back-to-back European Championships (2016, 2020). In his first season in Germany (2012-13), Shaqiri was part of the Bayern team that won the first treble in club history, capturing the UEFA Champions League, German Bundesliga, and German Cup trophies. In total, the Swiss midfielder won eight major trophies in three seasons with Bayern, where he played alongside Fire legend Bastian Schweinsteiger. Following his spell with Bayern, Shaqiri spent time with Inter Milan (2014-15) and Stoke City (2016-18), before signing with Liverpool ahead of the 2018-19 English Premier League campaign.



DURÁN DURÁN

He's not British, or a rock band, but 18-year-old forward Jhon Durán is determined to become a star. His contract with the Fire was signed on Jan. 11, 2021 but formally began on Jan. 1, 2022. Signing at age 17 made the Colombian striker the youngest international player signing in MLS history. His contract includes a three-year deal with Club options for the 2025 and 2026 seasons. Durán spent the 2021 season with Envigado before joining the Fire in 2022.

KACPER, THE FRIENDLY STRIKER

Chicago Fire FC acquired Polish striker Kacper Przybylko from the Philadelphia Union. Przybylko led the Union in scoring each of the last three years, including the shortened 2020 season when Philadelphia captured its first ever Supporters' Shield trophy. He also added five goals for the club in the 2020-21 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League, finishing as the regional tournament's top scorer while helping to lead the Union to the semifinals.

CZICHOS, DEUTSCH DEFENDER

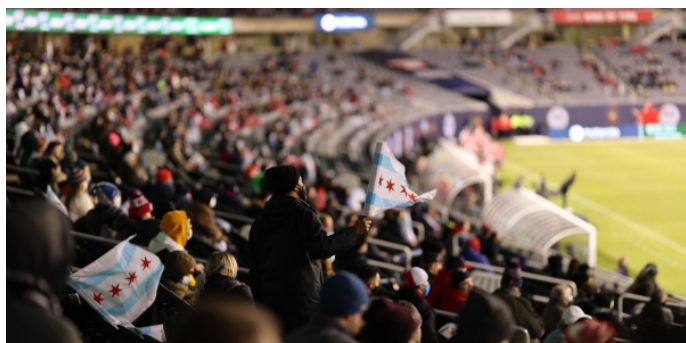
Defender Rafael Czichos spent the last four seasons as a mainstay along the backline for FC Köln, where he played 111 games in all competitions in Germany's 1. and 2. Bundesliga. During the last three campaigns, Czichos has tallied 74 starts in the German Bundesliga, including every match of the current 2021-22 season. Czichos originally signed with Köln prior to the start of the 2018-19 2. Bundesliga campaign. In his debut season, he made 32 appearances (32 starts) as the team captured the league championship and earned promotion to the top division in Germany.

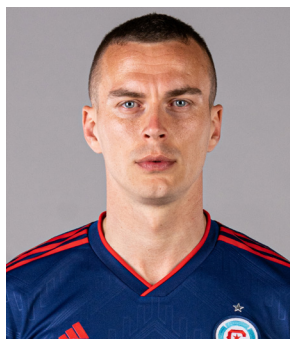

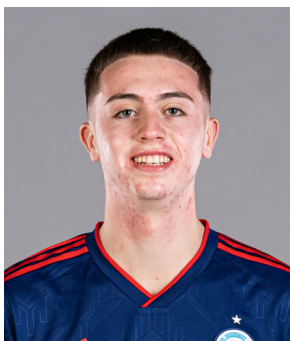

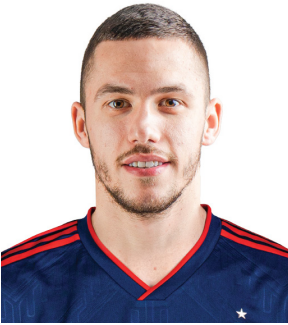
