MLS ALL-STARS v ESTRELLAS de la LIGA MX

The 2021 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target will be an historic matchup in the annals of world soccer, as the MLS All-Stars take on the all-stars from Mexico's LIGA MX.

AGAINST MEXICAN OPPOSITION: A team from Liga MX has appeared once in the MLS All-Star Game – in 2003, when CD Guadalajara (Chivas) faced the MLS All-Stars.

- The game was the first to feature the MLS All-Star team against foreign opposition, won 3-1 by the MLS All-Stars.
- The game was played at the then Home Depot Center (now Dignity Health Sports Park), the only previous occasion the Los Angeles metropolitan area has played host to the MLS All-Star Game.

TWO LEAGUES COMING TOGETHER: The 2021 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target is the latest piece of the partnership between MLS and LIGA MX, which also includes major events on the soccer calendar such as Leagues Cup and Campeones Cup.

- "Fans have been looking forward to this historic matchup for more than a year, and we have no doubt the 2021 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target will prove to be worth the wait," said MLS Commissioner Don Garber. "A game of this magnitude in Los Angeles, played in front of incredible fans in one of the greatest soccer stadiums in global soccer, is unlike anything our sport has seen. This event is a perfect expression of the groundbreaking partnership that continues to build between MLS and LIGA MX."
- "LIGA MX is proud to be part of the 2021 MLS All-Star Game," said LIGA MX Executive President Mikel Arriola. "This is going to be an intense match in a fantastic setting and world-class stadium in Los Angeles, a city that has a deep connection to our country, league, players and fans. The 2021 All-Star Game is another step in the partnership we have established between two of the best leagues in the world, and it will only intensify the rivalry between MLS and LIGA MX, and is an important part of the internationalization project of our League to reach more audiences beyond Mexico. We are looking forward to playing for the supporters of LIGA MX and giving soccer fans around the world a match they will never forget."

THE PARTNERSHIP GROWS: The 2021 MLS All-Star Game is just another part of a larger partnership between the two most important soccer leagues in North America, MLS and LIGA MX, launched in 2018. The partnership is rooted not only in the on-field rivalry, designed to strengthen the sport in the region, but by a true spirit of collaboration off it, with a focus on sharing best practices and on being a force for positive change in the local communities of both leagues.

LEAGUES CUP: The second edition of the tournament kicked off earlier this season, with the semifinals set for Sept. 14, matching Seattle Sounders FC and Club Santos Laguna on one side of the bracket, and Pumas UNAM and Club Leon on the other side. Beyond the rivalry, Leagues Cup has taken on an increased focus for both MLS and LIGA MX clubs. Concacaf recently announced that Leagues Cup will have a qualifying slot to the Concacaf Champions League, starting with the new format in 2023, positioning Leagues Cup as an important part of the North American soccer landscape.

CAMPEONES CUP: In its third edition, Campeones Cup 2021 will feature Columbus Crew SC, the reigning MLS Cup champion, against CD Cruz Azul, the winner of LIGA MX's Campeón de Campeones. Campeones Cup is scheduled for September 29 and will be played at Lower.com Field in Columbus, a city that has hosted some of the most iconic and important USA-Mexico matches in the history of the rivalry.

The two previous editions of Campeones Cup have been split, with MLS and LIGA MX claiming one title each, after Tigres UANL conquered Toronto FC in the inaugural 2018 edition, and Atlanta United defeated Club América 3-2 in the exciting 2019 match, played in front of over 40,000 fans at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

2021 MLS ALL-STAR GAME



THE FORMAT: This is the 17th time the MLS All-Stars have taken on international competition in the All-Star Game. The MLS teams hold an 8-5-3 record; the foreign clubs own a 28-27 advantage in goals scored. y have outscored their opponents 27-25.

- In 2019, Atlético de Madrid of Spain's La Liga claimed a 3-0 victory in the last MLS All-Star Game, played at Exploria Stadium in Orlando. Marcos Llorente was named All-Star Game MVP after scoring the opening goal late in the first half; João Félix and Diego Costa put the game away with late goals.
- In 2018, Juventus FC of Italy defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta. Andrea Favilli gave Juventus the lead on 21 minutes, but All-Star Game MVP Josef Martínez (of host club Atlanta United) leveled terms just five minutes later. All four Juventus players then scored in winning the shootout 5-3.
- In 2017, Real Madrid of Spain defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Soldier Field in Chicago. All-Star Game MVP Borja Mayoral gave the visitors the lead just before the hour, but Dom Dwyer netted the leveler three minutes from full time. All four Real players then scored in winning the shootout 4-2.
- In 2016, Arsenal FC of England defeated the MLS All-Stars 2-1 at Avaya Stadium in San Jose, Calif. Joel Campbell converted a penalty kick to give Arsenal the lead after 11 minutes, but Didier Drogba equalized for the MLS side in first-half stoppage time. With three minutes to play, substitute Chuba Akpom scored the match-winner for Arsenal, earning his All-Star Game MVP honors.
- In 2015, the MLS All-Stars defeated Tottenham Hotspur of England 2-1 at Dick's Sporting Goods Park in Commerce City, Colo. Kaká converted a penalty kick in the 20th minute to send the MLS side on their way, and David Villa doubled the lead just three minutes later. Harry Kane pulled a goal back for Spurs in the 37th minute, but the MLS side held out for the win. Kaká was named the All-Star Game MVP.
- In 2014, the MLS All-Stars defeated FC Bayern München of Germany 2-1 at Providence Park in Portland, Ore. Robert Lewandowski gave Bayern the lead after just eight minutes, but Bradley Wright-Phillips leveled the score six minutes after the halftime break. Then in the 70th minute, Landon Donovan – making his record 12th All-Star Game appearance in his final season – netted the match-winner. Donovan was named the All-Star Game MVP.
- In 2013, AS Roma defeated the MLS All-Stars 3-1 at Sporting Park in Kansas City, Kan., the fourth victory by the foreign opposition in five MLS All-Star Games.
- The 2012 event was a rematch, as the MLS All-Stars defeating Chelsea FC of the English Premier League 3-2 at PPL Park in Chester, Pa. It was a rematch of the 2006 game, won 1-0 by the MLS All-Stars at Toyota Park in Bridgeview, Ill.
- Manchester United FC provided the opposition each of the two previous years. United won 4-0 in 2011 at Red Bull Arena in Harrison, N.J., after winning 5-2 in 2010 at Reliant Stadium in Houston.
- In 2009, English Premier League side Everton FC ended the five-game winning streak by the MLS All-Stars in a penalty kick shootout after a 1-1 draw over 90 minutes. Everton FC goalkeeper Tim Howard received the game's Most Valuable Player award after making three saves in the penalty decider.
- In 2008, the MLS All-Stars defeated English Premier League side West Ham United 3-2 in Toronto, the first All-Star Game played outside the USA. In 2007, the MLS All-Stars defeated Scottish Premier League power Celtic FC 2-0, while in 2005, the MLS All-Stars defeat English Premier League club Fulham FC 4-1 at Columbus Crew Stadium. In 2003, the MLS All-Stars downed Mexican club CD Guadalajara 3-1 at The Home Depot Center.
- The 2003 contest was the second consecutive year a single team of MLS All-Stars was selected for the midseason classic, as the year before the MLS All-Stars took on a U.S. national team selection following the USA's historic quarterfinal performance at FIFA World Cup 2002 Korea/Japan. All 18 of the players selected by Bruce Arena for the match plied their trade in MLS. In 1998, an international theme was also used in the MLS All-Star Game as a team of U.S. MLS stars took on a squad comprised of international MLS stars. Each of the other seven All-Star Games has featured an East vs. West format.

LIGA MX: A HISTORY: Mexico's professional national league was established in 1943. The announcement from the Federación Mexicana de Fútbol Asociación (F.M.F.) of the nation's first professional league brought interest from many clubs to join. The F.M.F. announced that 10 clubs would form the Liga Mayor (Major League). The league was founded by six clubs from the Primera Fuerza of Mexico City [América, Asturias, Atlante, Veracruz, Necaxa, and Marte], two clubs from the Liga Occidental [Atlas and Guadalajara], and two from the Liga Veracruzana [ADO and Moctezuma].

- Since those founding days, of the 56 teams to have competed in the league, América has won the title 13 times, followed by Guadalajara (12), Toluca (10), Cruz Azul (9), León (8), UANL and UNAM (7). The current league champions are Cruz Azul, winners of the Guard1anes 2021 tournament.
- Prior to the start of the 2012–13 season, the organization Liga MX / Ascenso MX was created to replace the Mexican Football Federation as the organizing body of the competition. The league also announced a rebranding, with the introduction of a new logo.

THE REFEREES: Armando Villarreal will be the referee for the 2021 MLS All-Star Game. In his 11th season as a Major League Soccer referee, this is Villarreal's first appearance in the MLS All-Star Game.

- The assistant referees are Ian Anderson and Cory Richardson. Anderson was an assistant referee for the 2012 MLS All-Star Game involving Chelsea FC, while Richardson is in his first All-Star Game. The fourth official is Victor Rivas, while Jose Da Silva will serve as the reserve assistant referee.
- The video assistant referee for the MLS All-Star Game will be Jon Freemon, and the assistant video assistant referee will be Michael Kampmeinert.

RULES OF COMPETITION: All players in the squad for both teams are eligible to play. Each team will be allowed to make up to 10 substitutions. At the end of 90 minutes, if the teams are tied, no extra time will be played and the game will be decided by kicks from the penalty mark.

TEAM SELECTION: The 2021 MLS All-Star team was selected through a combination of a vote of MLS players, fans, and media, selection by MLS All-Star head coach Bob Bradley (Los Angeles Football Club) and by MLS Commissioner Don Garber. A total of 28 players were named MLS All-Stars.

For the first time ever, players were selected in seven specific positions: goalkeeper, right back, center back, left back, defensive midfielder, attacking midfielder, and forward/winger. MLS reviewed performance metrics from the current 2021 season to categorize players in the positions where they are most utilized.

The breakdown of the MLS All-Stars selected was:

- 13 were determined by a vote of MLS players, fans, and media. Each of the three voting groups will represent one-third of the combined vote.
- 13 were selected by MLS All-Star head coach Bob Bradley of host team Los Angeles Football Club.
- 2 were selected by MLS Commissioner Don Garber.

Players, fans and reporters cast their votes for 11 players: one goalkeeper, one right back, two center backs, one left back, one defensive midfielder, two attacking midfielders, three forwards/wingers. The top players in each position from the combined vote were named All-Stars.

The 12th player honored will be the one with the next-highest amount of votes overall.

To qualify for the ballot, players must have appeared in at least 50 percent of matches this season at the time the ballot was created on July 10. Players who did not qualify for the ballot were eligible for selection by Bradley or Commissioner Garber.

Fan Voting was done through the MLS app and at MLSsoccer.com. Every player in MLS was provided a special link to vote for the peers they believe are most deserving of All-Star recognition this season. Approximately 350 members of the media who regularly cover MLS also made their picks for the league's top players.

THE REPLACEMENTS: Three players were added to the MLS All-Star squad after the initial selection process: goalkeeper Andre Blake (Philadelphia Union), defender George Bello (Atlanta United) and midfielder Rodolfo Pizarro (Inter Miami CF).

- The replacements were made for Carles Gil (New England Revolution), Carlos Vela (Los Angeles Galaxy) and Javier Hernández (LA Galaxy), all of whom miss the match through injury, as well as Tajon Buchanan (New England Revolution), who is also unavailable to participate.

HEAD COACH: The MLS All-Stars will be coached by Los Angeles Football Club head coach Bob Bradley, joined by his technical staff as assistant coaches.

- Bradley is the only head coach in LAFC club history, and was named Sigi Schmid MLS Coach of the Year in 2019, his third time winning the honor, when the club captured the MLS Supporters' Shield, after LAFC reached the Audi 2018 MLS Cup Playoffs in just its first season. He previously earned MLS coaching honors after leading the Chicago Fire to an MLS Cup-winning season and a U.S. Open Cup title during their inaugural campaign in 1998. He went on to win a second coach of the year award after guiding second-year club Chivas USA to the MLS Cup Playoffs during their 2006 season.
- A New Jersey native, Bradley is one of the all-time great winners in U.S. Soccer history, owning a 43-12-25 record as the head coach of the U.S. national team from 2006-2011. Bradley led the U.S. to the 2007 CONCACAF Gold Cup title and a berth in the 2010 World Cup in South Africa, where they won their group. His 43 wins ranks third all-time among U.S. Soccer head coaches.
- Bradley became the first American to coach in the English Premier League in 2016 when he took over at Swansea City. Prior to his time in England, Bradley coached Stabaek Football in Norway (2014) and Le Havre AC in the French Second Division (2015). Bradley also served as the head coach for the Egyptian national team from 2011–2013.
- As the first head coach in Chicago Fire history, Bradley led the expansion team to the 1998 MLS Cup championship and U.S. Open Cup title and won his first MLS Coach of the Year award. He also guided the Fire to runner-up finishes in the 2000 and 2003 MLS Cup and the 2003 Supporters' Shield. Bradley served as the head coach for the MetroStars from 2003-2005 and Chivas USA in 2006 where he was named the MLS Coach of the Year for elevating the second-year team into the playoffs for the first time.
- This is the third time Bradley has been an All-Star Game head coach. He served as head coach in 2003, in the first game vs. international opposition and the only previous game held in the LA area, vs. Chivas de Guadalajara of LIGA MX held at the then Home Depot Center (now Dignity Health Sports Park) in Carson. He was also the head coach of the Western Conference All-Stars in the 2001 game in San Jose.

EXPERIENCE: Five players named as MLS All-Stars this year have previously been selected as All-Stars.

- Andre Blake of the Philadelphia Union has been selected as an MLS All-Star for a third occasion, previously playing in the 2016 and 2019 events.
- Carlos Vela of the Los Angeles Football Club was the only player originally selected with more than one previous selection to an MLS All-Star Game. Vela was named a starter for both the 2018 and 2019 MLS All-Star Games.
- Three players in all have been selected an MLS All-Star Game on one previous occasion: Nani (Orlando City SC), Diego Rossi (Los Angeles Football Club) and Walker Zimmerman (Nashville SC).

DEBUTANTS: Twenty-three players have been selected as an MLS All-Star for the first time. It is the most debutants for any single MLS team in the current format, surpassing the total of 18, for the 2015 contest.

- Seattle Sounders FC midfielder and MLS All-Star captain Cristian Roldan has the most experience in the league before making his MLS All-Star debut, playing in his ninth MLS campaign.
- Daniel Sallói (Sporting Kansas City), James Sands (NYCFC) and Nouhou Tolo (Seattle Sounders FC) have all received their first MLS All-Star nomination in their fifth season in the league.
- Every player selected for the MLS All-Star team is in at least their second season in the league, with eight All-Stars in just their second year of experience.
- The most debutants for any single MLS team in the current format was 18, in 2015.

An additional eight players have represented their countries at age-group levels: George Bello, Cade Cowell, Ricardo Pepi (both USA); Eduard Atuesta (Colombia), Damir Kreilach (Croatia), Daniel Salloi (Hungary), Carles Gil+ (Spain), Diego Rossi (Uruguay)

In all, the MLS All-Star team is comprised of players born in 14 different countries, the third-most diverse MLS All-Star team ever, after the record of 17 different countries in 2018, then 15 different countries represented in 2019. The last three editions have eclipsed the previous record of 13 in the 2016 and 2017 MLS All-Star Games.

CRISTIAN ROLDAN NAMED ALL-STAR CAPTAIN: Seattle Sounders FC midfielder Cristian Roldan was named the MLS All-Star captain following a Twitter fan vote.

- From August 12-17, fans used hashtags to pick between Roldan, LAFC forward Carlos Vela, LA Galaxy forward Javier Hernandez and Nashville SC defender Walker Zimmerman as captain. Roldan received the greatest volume of hashtag usage in that period (both original tweets and retweets counted toward a player's total).

A BROTHER ACT: A pair of brothers have been named to the MLS All-Star team for the first time, with Cristian and Alex Roldan of Seattle Sounders FC both selected All-Stars for the first time in their careers.

- Only one set of brothers has previously played in an MLS All-Star Game, the dos Santos brothers: Giovanni (selected for the 2016 and 2017 games), and Jonathan (selected in 2018 and 2019).

HOMEGROWNS: Four Homegrown Players have been named MLS All-Stars this year – Cade Cowell (SJ), Ricardo Pepi (DAL), Daniel Sallói (KC), James Sands (NYC) – the most ever for an MLS All-Star team.

- The first Homegrown Player in MLS history to be named to the MLS All-Star team was Juan Agudelo, when he was selected in 2011 while playing for the New York Red Bulls. DeAndre Yedlin became the second Homegrown Player to be selected for the All-Star team when he played in the 2013 match vs. AS Roma. In 2015, Yedlin and D.C. United goalkeeper Bill Hamid, another Homegrown Player, were selected for the MLS All-Star team.
- In both 2016 and 2017, FC Dallas midfielder Kellyn Acosta was named an All-Star, while in 2018, Alphonso Davies of Vancouver Whitecaps FC was named an All-Star. In 2019, Paxton Pomykal of FC Dallas was named to the MLS All-Star team.

MEXICAN STARS IN MLS: Eleven Mexican-born players have been appeared in the MLS All-Star Game to this point. Of the 11, only Jorge Campos had been named an All-Star on three occasions, before Carlos Vela matched that total this year.

THE YOUNGEST ALL-STAR: The ranks of the youngest players ever to appear in an MLS All-Star Game look to be swelled this year.

- Aged 17 years, 315 days on gameday, Cade Cowell of the San Jose Earthquakes will be the fifth-youngest to appear for the MLS All-Stars. In addition, Ricardo Pepi, aged 18 years, 228 days, will be the sixth-youngest.
- The youngest to appear in the MLS All-Star Game was Freddy Adu, who was aged 15 years, 59 days when he played in the 2004 MLS All-Star Game. Adu was also the youngest to face an international opponent, at 17 years, 64 days with the MLS All-Stars vs. Chelsea FC in 2006.
- The second-youngest to appear in an MLS All-Star Game was Santino Quaranta, aged 16 years, 287 days when he played in the 2001 MLS All-Star Game.
- Vancouver Whitecaps FC midfielder Alphonso Davies was the fourth-youngest MLS player to appear in the midsummer match – and the second-youngest in the “MLS vs. The World” format – when he played in 2018. Davies is the only player born in the 2000s before this year. Three players named to the MLS team – James Sands [2000]; Julián Araujo [2001] and George Bello [2002] are all part of the MLS team this year.

ALL-STARS IN LOS ANGELES: This is the second time the MLS All-Star Game will be played in the Los Angeles metropolitan area. The first was the first match where the MLS All-Stars took on foreign opposition, when they played CD Guadalajara (Chivas) of Mexico in 2003 at the-then Home Depot Center (now Dignity Health Sports Park) in Carson.

- Following a scoreless first half, Ante Razov gave the MLS stars a 57th-minute lead. Jair García leveled the score for Chivas nine minutes later, but Carlos Ruiz handed the advantage back to the MLS side just two minutes after, then DaMarcus Beasley sealed the 3-1 win with an 83rd-minute goal.

Los Angeles has been a regular stop for the All-Star games from the other major North American sports leagues – including some nearly on the exact spot of the location of Banc of California Stadium (as well as neighboring Exposition Park):

- **MLB ALL-STAR GAMES:** Major League Baseball's All-Star Game first came to Los Angeles in the first year of West Coast expansion, the 1959 game played at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. One other have been played at Dodger Stadium, in 1980 – the 2022 edition is also scheduled for Chavez Ravine (after being postponed last year).
- **NBA ALL-STAR GAMES:** The NBA All-Star Game has come to Los Angeles on six occasions. The first time was played at literally the current site of Banc of California Stadium – the 1963 classic, held at the Los Angeles Sports Arena. The next two games were played at The Fabulous Forum in Inglewood, in 1972 and 1983. The game has since come to Staples Center downtown on three occasions – 2004, 2011, 2018.
- **NFL PRO BOWL:** The NFL Pro Bowl – the annual all-star game in the league – was played from its inception for the first 22 editions at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, following the 1950 season through the 1971 season. The game then returned one more time following the 1978 season; the final three editions were the only ones played after the NFL-AFL merger and matched the NFC and AFC.
- **NHL ALL-STAR GAMES:** The NHL All-Star Game has come to Los Angeles on three occasions. The first was in 1981, when the Campbell Conference played the Prince of Wales Conferences at The Forum in Inglewood. It's since been played twice at Staples Center – in 2002 (North America vs. World), and 2017 (the four-conference 3-on-3 version).

MLS ALL-STAR JERSEY UNVEILED: The MLS All-Star Game jersey celebrates Los Angeles as one of the premier sports cities in the U.S. and magnifies the culture of soccer and impact of the city on the global game.

The 2021 MLS All-Star Authentic player jersey will light up the night, symbolic to the city of Los Angeles. The Black jersey features unique reflective trims to shine on a backdrop of black and gold and the glitz and glamour of Hollywood. Inspired by Art Deco architecture in Los Angeles, the jersey is designed from adidas Aeroready performance fabric made up of stars and maple leaves that represent the U.S. and Canadian clubs of MLS. The right sleeve has the LA21 All-Star Game patch and the back-neck features LA staples and inspired icons of stars, ocean waves and freeways as well as the No. 25 to signify the 25th MLS All-Star Game. The All-Star jerseys are available for purchase now at [MLStore.com](https://mlsstore.com) and adidas.com and will be available at select retail stores in the Los Angeles area in the coming weeks and in-stadium on gameday.

- Bello signed as a Homegrown Player with Atlanta United for the 2018 season. He earned his first start Sept. 22, 2018 against Real Salt Lake and scored his first career goal against the New England Revolution on Oct. 6, 2018, at the time becoming the sixth-youngest goal scorer in league history.

- Currently leading in the race for the MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi with 14 goals, Ruidíaz was signed by Seattle as a Designated Player in the 2018 summer transfer window.
- Ruidíaz has been the league's most prolific goal-scorer in his 3-1/2 seasons in MLS. His 56 MLS goals (including MLS Cup Playoffs) are the most in the league since making his debut in July of 2018, in addition to ranking third in club history in goals across all competitions behind Fredy Montero and Clint Dempsey. His nine postseason goals rank first in club history, helping lead the club to two MLS Cup Final appearances and the 2019 title.
- He burst onto the scene in 2018 with 10 goals in just 14 regular season appearances before coming to life in the postseason with three goals in two games. The Peruvian international helped guide his national team to the 2019 Copa America Final before finishing the 2019 MLS regular season with a team-leading 11 goals. - Zelarayan joined Columbus Crew as a Designated Player on December 19, 2019 for a club-record transfer fee from Tigres UANL of Liga MX. In 2020, he made 16 regular-season appearances (12 starts as a center attacking midfielder), scoring six goals and adding four assists, and was named the 2020 MLS Newcomer of the Year.
- Zelarayan then won 2020 MLS Cup MVP honors, scoring two goals and assisted on the third in Columbus Crew's 3-0 win over Seattle. He was just the third player to score two goals in MLS Cup, along with Landon Donovan (SJ, 2003) and Alecko Eskandarian (DC, 2004), and just the second player in MLS Cup history to be involved in three goals in a single final. The first: Guillermo Barros Schelotto, who recorded assists on all three goals for the Columbus Crew in MLS Cup 2008.
- From 2016-2019, Zelarayan made 139 appearances, scored 23 goals and provided 14 assists across all competitions for Tigres UANL. he moved to Mexico from Club Atletico Belgrano in his native Argentina , where he made 77 appearances across all competitions while scoring 10 goals and providing six assists from 2013-2015. A product of the Belgrano Academy, the midfielder made his professional debut for Belgrano's first team on March 2, 2013.

THIS SEASON

- Zelarayan has six goals and three assists in 20 appearances (17 as a starter) for the Crew. He has 12 goals and seven assists in 36 career MLS league appearances.
- On May 22 vs. New York City FC, Zelarayan became the sixth player in Major League Soccer history to score twice from direct free kicks in the same game (since records are available beginning with the 2003 season). He became the second Columbus Crew player to do it, after Federico Higuaín (now with Inter Miami CF) netted a pair in a 2012 game. The goal in the fourth minute of added time marked the sixth time in league annals a game-winning goal came from a direct free kick in stoppage time, the first time since the 2016 season.
- Then on July 17, Zelarayan scored again from a free kick, again against NYCF. It was his fourth goal directly from a free kick this season – tied for the fourth-most in a single season in MLS history – and the third against NYCF, the first player ever to score three against the same team in a season. Zelarayan has now scored five goals directly from free kicks in his MLS career – the first coming last July 11 vs. FC Cincinnati at the MLS is Back Tournament, a strike which was a finalist for goal of the tournament honors.

- One of the most decorated players of his era, Nani came to MLS and Orlando City SC after signing as a Designated Player in February 2019.
- He began his senior career with Sporting CP in Lisbon, Portugal, in 2005 as a teenager. In three seasons, Nani made 58 appearances, tallying nine goals.
- His start at Sporting CP led to Nani being sold to Manchester United for €25.5 million where he would play alongside fellow countryman, Cristiano Ronaldo. He made his Premier League debut as a substitute for Wayne Rooney on Aug. 12, 2007. Nani scored his first Premier League goal for Manchester United in unforgettable fashion. In the 68th minute against Tottenham Hotspur, Nani launched an attempt from 25 yards out and buried it in the back of the net, proving to be the game-winner for Manchester United.
- Nani finished his tenure with Manchester United in 2014. Overall with the Red Devils, Nani won four Premier League titles, two League Cups and a UEFA Champions League crown in 2008. In total, Nani made 230 appearances for Manchester United across all competitions, recording 41 goals.
- In 2014, Nani returned to Sporting CP on a season-long loan from Manchester United. During the season, Nani appeared in 37 matches across all competitions, scoring 12 goals. Since the start of the 2015 campaign, Nani has appeared for Fenerbahçe, Valencia and Lazio on loan. With those three clubs, Nani appeared in 98 total matches across all competitions, recording 20 goals. Last season, Nani returned to Sporting CP where he played in 28 total matches and finding the back of the net eight times.

THIS SEASON

- Has scored nine goals and added six assists in 16 appearances in his third MLS season, tied for seventh in the standings for the MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi, and tied for eighth in the MLS assist standings. Now has 27 goals and 21 assists in 65 league appearances for Orlando City.
- Scored six goals in seven appearances from April 23-June 25, also with three assists during that span.

- Salloi was signed as the fourth Homegrown Player in club history in early 2016 and made his Sporting KC debut on April 9, 2017 against the Colorado Rapids. Salloi is one of 12 Homegrown Players to come through the SKC Academy on the current roster.
- He scored on his first start for the club – a 4-0 win over Minnesota United in the U.S. Open Cup on June 14, 2017 – and added his first MLS goal vs. Portland on July 1. Salloi scored the winning goal in the 2017 U.S. Open Cup Final.
- Salloi moved to the U.S. in August 2014 as an AFS exchange student and attended Blue Valley Northwest High School in Overland Park, Kansas, joining the SKC Academy U-18s for the 2014-15 season. He returned to his former academy side Ujpest FC in July 2015 to sign an amateur contract for senior team, a 20-time champion in Hungary's first division. He made his professional debut in the top-tier OTP Bank Liga on July 18, the day before his 19th birthday.
- He made 10 appearances for SKC II in 2016, scoring four goals and adding three assists before being loaned to Gyirmot SE in Hungary for the remainder of the season.

- Salloi has scored 12 goals and added six assists in 20 appearances (17 as a starter) in league play this season. The 12 goals are tied for second place in the race for the MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi, level with fellow All-Star Gustavo Bou (NE), and two behind All-Star Raúl Ruidíaz (SEA). Salloi leads MLS with 18 combined goals (12) and assists (6).

- A young and exciting player who has been a champion in his home country of Uruguay, Rossi transferred from Peñarol and signed as a Young Designated Player on Dec. 14, 2017.
- Rossi was named to the MLS Best XI and the league's inaugural Young Player of the Year, the winner of the MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi, scoring 14 goals in the season. During the MLS is Back Tournament, Rossi was involved in five goals (four goals, one assist) in LAFC's 6-2 win vs. archrivals LA Galaxy, becoming the first player in MLS history to have played a part in five goals in two separate games, while also becoming the 13th player in MLS history to score at least four goals in a game. Rossi was named the Young Player of the Tournament in the MLS is Back event, also winning the MLS is Back Golden Boot.
- Rossi has scored 48 goals in his MLS career, with 21 assists, in 103 league appearances (99 as a starter), with double figures in goals in each of his first three years in the league.
- Rossi was a key contributor immediately in LAFC's inaugural season with 12 goals and nine assists in 30 starts. He scored two goals and added three assists March 10 vs. Real Salt Lake, the seventh player in MLS history to be involved in a record five goals in a single game. In 2020 he scored 16 goals and added seven assists, finishing in fourth place in the MLS Golden Boot standings. He and Carlos Vela combined for 50 goals in the season, the most ever for a duo of teammates in a single season in MLS history.
- Rossi entered the Peñarol youth system at 12 years of age and led the U-17 club to the league title. Rossi made his first team regular season debut on April 29, 2016 and scored his first goal five days later. He has made 47 total appearances with the Peñarol first team, scoring 13 goals in all matches, including the Copa Libertadores, South America's premier club competition.

- Has scored six goals and added an assist in 18 appearances this season (17 as a starter). He scored a pair of goals May 22 vs. Colorado, the sixth multiple-goal game of Rossi's MLS career.

- Pepi became the 26th Homegrown Player in FC Dallas club history, signed on June 21, 2019. He made his MLS debut as a substitute vs. Toronto FC on June 22 of that season, and has made 44 appearances in his three MLS seasons, scoring 11 goals.
- He is the fourth-youngest to have double-digit goals in MLS history behind just Freddy Adu, Diego Fagúndez and Jozy Altidore.
- He became the youngest player to score a hat trick in MLS history this season, netting the three goals in 23 minutes against LA Galaxy on July 24 at Toyota Stadium, aged 18 years, 196 days.

THIS SEASON

- Pepi has scored nine goals with one assist in matches this season, in 20 appearances (15 as a starter). The nine goals are good for a tie for seventh place in the standings for MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi.
- He scored a hat trick on July 24 vs. the LA Galaxy, becoming the youngest player to score three goals in a game in MLS history at age 18 years, 196 days, surpassing the mark of Kekuta Manneh for Vancouver in 2013 (18 years, 283 days). Pepi became just the second player born in 2000 or later to net an MLS hat trick, joining Toronto FC's Ayo Akinola, and the fourth player in MLS history to score a hat trick before his 21st birthday; in all, four hat tricks in MLS history have been scored by players who had yet to reach 21 years of age.
- He scored seven goals in four home matches from June 27 to July 24, scoring at least once in all four matches in that span. The only FC Dallas player in the last 10 years with a longer home scoring streak was Zdenek Ondrasek, who scored in six straight home matches from August 2019 to March 2020.

- Pepi appeared for the U.S. U-17 national team during the 2019 FIFA U-17 World Cup in Brazil, appearing in two group stage matches.

- In the club's inaugural MLS campaign, Zimmerman's stellar performance, both in defense and offensively with three goals including the club's first-ever goal in MLS history, earned him the 2020 MLS Defender of the Year and MLS Best XI honors as well as the club's Most Valuable Player.
- Prior to coming to Nashville, Zimmerman was a 2019 MLS All-Star and Best XI selection for LAFC and a two-time MLS Supporters' Shield winner in 2016 with FC Dallas, 2019 with LAFC and a Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Winner in 2016 with FCD. Overall, Zimmerman has made 174 MLS regular season appearances, 154 as a starter, scoring 15 goals and adding five assists.
- A star defender in his two seasons at Furman University, where he won All-Southern Conference first-team honors in both years and scored 11 goals and 5 assists, he was selected No. 7 overall by FC Dallas in the 2013 SuperDraft.

- Now in his ninth MLS season, Blake was the first goalkeeper ever to be taken with the No. 1 overall pick in the history of the MLS SuperDraft, selected out of the Univ. of Connecticut. He has made his mark in the league over his career, last year winning MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors and to the MLS Best XI both for a second time.
- Blake won MLS Goalkeeper of the Year for a second time in 2020 in leading the Union to the best overall record in the league and the club's first honor in the Supporters' Shield. He allowed 18 goals in his regular season appearances for an 0.88 goals against average and posted a 77.8 save percentage, both league-bests for goalkeepers with 20 or more appearances on the year. The 29-year-old's 13 goalkeeper wins also led MLS.
- He registered 37 shutouts and a 46-10-12 record in three years at UConn, where he was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy as a junior, also earning All-Big East first-team, NSCAA first-team All-American and Soccer America MVP First Team honors.

THIS SEASON

- Blake has made 22 appearances over all competitions this season. In MLS league play, he has recorded eight shutouts in 17 starts, recording eight shutouts, tied for the MLS league lead with Joe Willis (NSH) and William Yarbrough (COL). He is fourth in MLS with an 0.88 goals against average, one of five goalkeepers allowed less than a goal per game.
- Blake recorded three consecutive shutouts from May 15-30, his 333-minute goalless streak including that span the third-longest for a goalkeeper in Philadelphia Union club history (the fourth-longest stretch without allowing a goal in the club's records).
- Blake has also recorded three shutouts in five appearances in the Concacaf Champions League, including clean sheets in both legs of the round-of-16 tie vs. Deportivo Saprissa of Costa Rica.

INTERNATIONAL

- Blake has won 46 caps for the Jamaican national team, making his debut March 2, 2014 vs. Barbados. The regular between the posts for the Reggae Boyz in all official competitions since making his World Cup Qualifying debut against Nicaragua in September 2015, Blake this year appeared in three matches during the Concacaf Gold Cup.
