CHICAGO FIRE FC YOUNGSTER GABRIEL SLONINA MAKES HISTORY BETWEEN THE POSTS

With two veterans ahead of him injured, Chicago Fire FC goalkeeper Gabriel Slonina was given a chance to create history – and he took full advantage of the opportunity.

Aged just 17 years, 81 days, Slonina started the Fire's match against New York City FC at Soldier Field on Wednesday evening – and in doing so, became the youngest goalkeeper ever to start a game in MLS history.

Slonina surpassed David Monsalve, who was 18 years, 220 days when he started for Toronto FC in 2007. The youngest player still to actually wear the gloves in an MLS match is Eddie Gaven, who was 16 years, 253 days when he came on as a substitute in goal for the MetroStars vs. D.C. United on July 5, 2003.

Slonina added to the legacy being left by young goalkeepers this season, as three of the seven youngest goalkeepers in league history have come this season. Hunter Sulte of the Portland Timbers is now the third-youngest goalkeeper in MLS history to start a game, just six days after his 19th birthday when he made his league debut vs. FC Dallas on May 1, and John Pulskamp, aged 19 years, 363 days when he started for Sporting Kansas City on April 17, is the seventh-youngest in league annals. A fourth in that group within the last two seasons came last year when David Ochoa (19 years, 297 days) started for Real Salt Lake.

Slonina was already a part of MLS history when he became a professional. A product of the Fire's academy system, Slonina originally signed a first-team contract with the club on March 8, 2019, aged 14 years, 297 days, becoming the youngest Homegrown Player and second-youngest player signing in MLS history at the time.

In Wednesday's match, Slonina then stopped all four shots on target he saw, also becoming the youngest to record a shutout in league history – passing the mark set by D.C. United Homegrown goalkeeper Bill Hamid, who was 19 years, 270 days when he kept his first clean sheet in the 2010 season.

NYCFC GOALSCORING STREAK COMES TO END APPROACHING ONE OF LONGEST EVER

New York City FC saw their streak of scoring in every game this season come to an end at midweek, when 17-year-old Gabriel Slonina and Chicago Fire FC held them in a scoreless draw at Soldier Field.

NYCFC had a streak of 25 consecutive league games with a goal, dating back to last Sept. 26 – which equaled the fourth-longest such streak in MLS history when it was snapped. The all-time mark is still the 52 games where D.C. United netted a goal from 1997-1999.

 netted his first in 2021 in league play.
- Atlanta United put an end to a two-game losing slide, coming back for a 2-2 draw with CF Montréal at Stade Saputo on Wednesday evening. Josef Martínez scored for a second consecutive game, his fourth of the season, but was then sent off; Marcelino Moreno also scored in a second game in a row, now with five for the year.
- The teams are meeting for the second time this season. **Jonathan Mensah** scored the game's only goal as the Crew took the victory at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on July 24.

- The teams are meeting for the second time this season. Tesho Akindele scored after just 31 seconds and Nani doubled the lead in the 19th minute, sending Orlando City on their way to a 3-0 win at Exploria Stadium on May 1.
- They had last met in FC Cincinnati's inaugural season in 2019. **Nani** and **Tesho Akindele** each scored two goals as Orlando City SC cruised to a 5-1 win on May 19 at Exploria Stadium, the first meeting ever between the clubs; the teams reached a 1-1 draw Sept. 29 at Nippert Stadium.
