- FC Cincinnati had their four-game undefeated streak put to an end, falling 4-1 to the New England Revolution at Gillette Stadium on Saturday evening. **Brenner** scored his fifth of the season, his second in the last three games.
- The teams are meeting for the second time this season. Edgar Castillo and Luciano Acosta gave FC Cincinnati a two-goal lead after just 24 minutes, but Lucas Zelarayán scored one goal then set up the equalizer from Miguel Berry to leave the teams in a 2-2 draw July 9 at TQL Stadium.
- The teams met four times a season ago. In the last meeting, FC Cincinnati won for the first time in the Hell is Real Derby, taking a 2-1 win Oct. 14 at Nippert Stadium.
