- Christian Makoun netted the game's only goal, converting a penalty kick five minutes into second-half stoppage time, matching the latest goal scored in Inter Miami club history (also: Indiana Vassilev, Aug. 8 vs. Nashville SC).
- The Red Bulls dropped a 2-1 decision to the Columbus Crew at Lower.com Field on Tuesday evening.
 Patryk Klimala scored his fifth goal of the season, his second in the last five games; he has a goal and an assist in the last two games.
- The teams met twice in Inter Miami's inaugural season, each winning on the other's home ground. The Red Bulls got goals from four different players in cruising to a 4-1 win Sept. 23 at DRV PNK Stadium; Matías Pellegrini and Gonzalo Higuaín scored second-half goals as Inter Miami came from behind for a 2-1 win Oct. 7 at Red Bull Arena.

<u>INTER MIAMI:</u> Nick Marsman was credited with four saves in recording his fourth consecutive shutout, his first four in 12 MLS starts. Marsman is the first goalkeeper in club history to record clean sheets in four consecutive games, his shutout streak now at an IMCF-record 388 minutes, the second-longest shutout streak in MLS this season.

RED BULLS: Dru Yearwood was credited with his second assist in MLS, his first coming July 3; he has a goal and an assist in the last two games.

- Atlanta United won their second game in a row and for a sixth time in the last seven outings, defeating FC Cincinnati at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Wednesday evening.
- Josef Martínez scored a pair of goals his seventh and eighth of the season. The goals were the 84th
 and 85th of Martínez's MLS career, in his 100th league appearance the most goals for any player in
 MLS history through their first 100 matches.
- D.C. United extended their undefeated run to three games, defeating Chicago Fire FC 3-0 at Audi Field on Wednesday evening.
- Ola Kamara scored a hat trick, now leading the MLS Golden Boot race with 16 goals. Kamara has five
 goals in his last three games; it was the second hat trick of his MLS career, the first coming in 2016 with
 Columbus. Kamara also became the eighth player in MLS history to score two goals in a single game
 from a penalty kick.
- The teams are meeting for the second time this season. **Josef Martínez** scored in the first half then set up **Marcelino Moreno's** late winner as ATLUTD took a 2-1 win Aug. 21 at Audi Field.
- The visiting team has won each of the last three meetings in the series, including both encounters a year ago. **Jon Gallagher** scored a pair of goals and **Brooks Lennon** hit for another and added two assists as Atlanta United rolled to a 4-0 win Oct. 3 at Audi Field; **Russell Canouse** and **Gelmin Rivas** scored in the final quarter-hour as D.C. took a 2-1 win Oct. 24 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium
- Home form had ruled in the previous two seasons, each winning 2-0 on their home ground in 2019, and winning by 3-1 scorelines on their own ground in 2018 in three meetings overall (two in Atlanta). D.C. United took all three meetings in ATLUTD's expansion season, winning 3-1 at Bobby Dodd Stadium on April 30 before taking the next two at RFK Stadium.

<u>ATLUTD:</u> Ezequiel Barco scored his sixth goal of the season, his second in as many games. It was his first goal directly from a free kick in MLS play, his 16th career league goal. ... Luiz Araujo scored his first MLS goal and added his first MLS assist, making his fifth league appearance. ... Alan Franco had three assists, the first ATLUTD player to record three assists in a game. They are his first assists in MLS, in 16 appearances. ... Brad Guzan was credited with three saves in recording a second consecutive shutout, his seventh of the season, now tied for fourth in MLS.

<u>D.C. UNITED:</u> Bill Hamid was credited with one save in recording his sixth shutout of the season, the 76th of his MLS league career, now tied for sixth-most in league history. ... **Julian Gressel** recorded his seventh assist of the season, his first since gaining assists on both D.C. goals Aug. 15 at Nashville SC.

- The Crew won a second game in the last four matches, coming from behind for a 2-1 win against the New York Red Bulls at Lower.com Field on Tuesday evening. **Miguel Berry** hit for the game-winner in the 88th minute his fourth goal in the last four games.
- The teams are meeting for the third time this season. **Adam Buksa** netted the game's only goal in the 86th minute, giving the Revolution the victory May 16 at Gillette Stadium; the teams also reached a 2-2 draw July 3 at Lower.com Field.
- The win in the first meeting was the first for the Revs in the series since May 21, 2017, a 2-1 victory in Foxborough. Columbus SC have won six of the previous nine meetings between the teams (with one draw).

 single-season career high in his 11th MLS campaign.
- The teams are meeting for the third time this season. **Luke Haakenson** scored a pair of late goals, the 83rd-minute equalizer and the stoppage-time game-winner, leading Nashville SC to the 3-2 win June 23 at Nissan Stadium, then on Aug. 1 at BMO Field, **Omar Gonzalez** scored early for TFC, but **Robert Castellanos** equalized before the interval, leaving the teams in a 1-1 draw.
- The first meeting this season was the first ever in league play, but they did meet in Round One of the MLS Cup Playoffs a year ago. **Daniel Ríos** netted the game's only goal and **Joe Willis** made three saves in extending his shutout streak to 197 minutes in the postseason as Nashville SC took the victory Nov. 24 at Rentschler Field.

<u>TFC:</u> Longtime campaigner **Justin Morrow** announced his retirement following the conclusion of the season. Morrow is in his 12th MLS campaign, having made 271 appearances with 19 goals and 23 assists, playing the last eight years with TFC.
