Kraft Grupo Deportivo empresario inversionista del equipo New England Revolution de la MLS y del New England Patriots de la NFL como también del estadio Foxboro, adquirieron los derechos del San José Clash el 4 de enero de 1999.

La familia Kraft, dirigida por Robert K. Kraft, quién con su liderazgo y visión ha llevado a los Patriots, Revolution y el estadio Foxboro, a una de las tres noticias con más éxito en la historia de Nueva Inglaterra, en lo que se refiere a deportes y entretenimiento familiar. Seguido por Jonathan A. Kraft, quién es responsable de sobrellevar las negociaciones diarias de la empresa.

Robert K. Kraft

Uno de los personajes con más prestigio en el mundo del deporte profesional, Robert Kraft, se esforzó para conseguir que Boston/Foxboro haya sido unas de las nueve cedas para la Copa del Mundo de 1994, llevó al deporte a una nueva era que culminó a New England con la llegada del equipo de la primera división de fútbol profesional, el New England Revolution.

Kraft, quién siguió lealmente a los Patriotas de Nueva Inglaterra como aficionado cuando llegó al estadio de Foxboro en 1971, en 1994 adquirió el equipo siendo luego los campeones de la conferencia AFC y del Super Tazón XXXI jugado en New Orleans en enero de 1997. Más allá del éxito conseguido por los Patriotas, bajo la dirección de Kraft, el equipo sin precedentes a disfrutado de un respaldo absoluto en la comunidad de Nueva Inglaterra.

Kraft, se ha comprometido en edificar fuertes vínculos con los aficionados del equipo Revolution de Nueva Inglaterra. Revolution, terminó en una de las tres mejores asistencias con un promedio de 21,423 aficionados por juego en 1997.

Kraft Group Sports, investor-operator of the New England Revolution of Major League Soccer and owner of the New England Patriots of the National Football League and Foxboro Stadium, purchased investor-operator rights to the San Jose Clash, effective Jan. 4, 1999.

The Kraft Family is headed by Robert K. Kraft, whose leadership and vision have made the Patriots, Revolution and Foxboro Stadium three of the great success stories in New England sports and entertainment history, and by Jonathan A. Kraft, who is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day business operations of these properties.

Robert K. Kraft

One of the most influential people in professional sports, Robert Kraft led the effort to secure Boston/Foxboro as one of nine venues for the 1994 World Cup, leading to a new era in New England sports that culminated with the arrival of a top-flight American professional soccer team, the New England Revolution.

Kraft, who followed the New England Patriots loyally as a season-ticket holder from the team's arrival at Foxboro Stadium in 1971, bought the team in 1994 and molded the Patriots into AFC Champions and participants in Super Bowl XXXI in New Orleans in January 1997. Beyond the Patriots' success on the field, under Kraft's guidance the team has enjoyed unparalleled support from the New England community.

Kraft's commitment to building strong ties with New England fans has become a trademark of the soccer team as well. The Revolution led Major League Soccer in attendance in 1997 with an average of 21,423 fans per game.

A native of Brookline, Mass., Kraft attended local public schools before entering Columbia University on an academic scholarship. While attending Columbia, he also played football. Upon graduation, he received a fellowship to attend the Harvard School of Business, where he earned a masters degree in business administration.

Kraft began his business career with the Rand-Whitney Group, Inc., of Worcester, Mass., a company he later acquired. In 1972, he founded International Forest Products, a trader of paper commodities doing business in more than 80 countries around the world. Together, Rand-Whitney and International Forest Products comprise one of the largest privately-owned paper and packaging enterprises in the United States.

In addition to owning the Patriots and the Revolution,

Kraft also owns the facility in which they play -- Foxboro Stadium. The stadium is New England's premier family entertainment venue and has been the host of many major musical acts over the past several years, including the Rolling Stones, Aerosmith, Elton John, and U2. Foxboro Stadium also played host to two World Cup Qualifiers for the United States National Team in 1997.

Over the past 20 years, Kraft and his wife, Myra, have been very active in charitable and civic affairs. He serves on the Executive Committee of the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and the Board of Overseers of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. He also is a trustee of Columbia University and serves on the Board of Directors for the Harvard Business School. He is the recipient of honorary degrees from Boston University, Bryant College, Curry College, and Suffolk University.

Luego en su trascendencia de negocios, fundó la empresa Internacional Forest Products (Productos Internacionales de Bosques), una compañía de mercancías de papel con negocios en más de 80 países alrededor del mundo. Juntos, Rand-Whitney e Internacional Forest Products componen una de las entidades privadas de empaque y papel más grande en los Estados Unidos.

Como dueño absoluto de los equipos Patriots, Revolution, como también de la cancha donde juegan el estadio Foxboro, conocido como un lugar de entretenimiento familiar, a patrocinado varios conciertos incluyendo: The Rolling Stones, Aerosmith, Elton John y U2, y también reconocido como el estadio anfitrión de dos partidos de calificación de la Selección Nacional de los Estados Unidos en 1997.

Durante las dos últimas décadas, Robert y su esposa, Myra, han demostrado su devoción a la comunidad de Nueva Inglaterra en variedades asuntos caritativos y cívicos. Kraft, es miembro administrativo del comité del Dana-Farber Cancer Institute (Instituto de Cancer), de la Orquesta Sinfónica de la ciudad de Boston y es fideicomisario de la Universidad de Harvard. El ha recibido varios honorables títulos en las universidades, tales como: Boston, Bryant, Curry y por último en la Universidad de Suffolk.



Jonathan A. Kraft is Chief Operating Officer of the Kraft Group, comprised of companies in the paper and packaging industries and sports and entertainment, including the San Jose Clash and the New England Revolution of Major League Soccer, the New England Patriots of the National Football League, and Foxboro Stadium.

It was Kraft's initiative that helped secure an MLS franchise for the Boston area before the MLS inaugural season in 1996, and he facilitated the purchase of investor-operator rights to the Clash from MLS in 1999.

Kraft serves as chairperson of the MLS Broadcast and Marketing Committee, overseeing the television sponsorship and marketing strategy of the league. He was responsible for bringing MLS's inaugural championship match to Foxboro Stadium, where the game again will be played in 1999.

In addition to his roles with the Kraft Group's sports and entertainment businesses, he spends a significant amount of time directing the group's manufacturing business and the family's other investment activities.

A 1986 graduate of Williams College, Kraft received his MBA from the Harvard Business School in 1990. He is on the Board of Directors for several organizations, including the New England Israeli Chamber of Commerce and the Genesis Fund. He also serves on the Board of Trustees for the Belmont Hill School.

Jonathan Kraft was born on March 4, 1964, in Brookline, Mass. He and his wife, Patti, live in Boston with their son, Harry, and daughter, Sadie.

Lynne Meterparel is the General Manager of the San Jose Clash. Appointed to the position on Feb. 17, 1999, Meterparel has been a pioneer in the development of soccer in the United States and brings a wealth of experience, creativity and ideas to the Clash.

For the past three seasons, Meterparel served as Director for Crowd Building for the New England Revolution. Her effective integration of grassroots marketing, publicity, community relations and ticketing helped the Revolution reach extraordinary heights in attendance. Under her supervision, the Revolution finished third, first and second in each of Major League Soccer's first three years of existence, with a three-year average of more than 20,000 fans per game. In 1997, she received Major League Soccer's inaugural Commissioner's Award in recognition for her achievements.

Meterparel also has designed and implemented marketing plans for numerous large-scale events, including World Cup qualifiers, MLS Cup and international exhibition matches. Using innovative techniques aimed at increasing awareness and constructing a positive image for the game and its players, Meterparel plans to bring the same approach to soccer in the Bay Area and to establish the Clash as Northern California's hometown team.

Prior to joining Major League Soccer, Meterparel served as a National Director of the Legacy Tour, the grassroots campaign that introduced international soccer to major cities across the United States and launched the hugely successful 1994 World Cup USA.

A native of Weston, Mass., Meterparel studied film, photography and history at Northwestern University. She has won awards for her work on environmental issues, volunteered on Native American reservations throughout the United States, photographed humpback whales in the Pacific and led field research studies in Palau, Micronesia.

She has worked with many charitable organizations, including the International Special Olympics as a coordinator for the Opening Ceremonies. She has coached at numerous levels in soccer, softball, lacrosse, field hockey and basketball.

A dedicated runner and cyclist, Meterparel is single and lives in Los Gatos.

Lynne Meterparel, fue nombrada como Gerente General del San José Clash el 17 de febrero de 1999, pionera en el desenvolvimiento del fútbol en los Estados Unidos, nos trae una extraordinaria experiencia, creatividad y buenas ideas.

En las tres temporadas pasadas a trabajado de una forma especial para atraer a los aficionados del equipo de Nueva Inglaterra en las áreas de publicidad, relaciones públicas y en el departamento de boletos. A hecho que el equipo de Boston halla ganado un alto nivel de asistencia. Bajo su supervisión, el equipo terminó en tercer lugar y en las otras tres temporadas en primer y segundo lugar de la MLS, con un promedio de 20,000 aficionados por juego, tal fue así, que en 1997 recibió el premio inaugural Commissioners Award, un reconocimiento de la liga por sus logros.

Meterparel, también diseñó e implementó plan de mercadeo para un número alto de eventos, incluyendo la clasificaciones para la Copa del Mundo de 1994, Copa de la MLS y encuentros Internacionales. Usando la misma técnica de novedad y sus conocimientos, aspira construir una imagen positiva tanto en los juegos como con los jugadores. Renato Capobianco, a veteran of the United States national team administrative staff and a respected assistant coach with three organizations, is responsible for all on-field operations for the San Jose Clash, as Director of Soccer. He joined the Clash on Jan. 4, 1999.

Capobianco joined the Clash after serving as an assistant coach with both the New England Revolution and the Tampa Bay Mutiny. He previously served as an assistant coach of the United States Under-17 national team.

Capobianco's experience also includes a three-year stint as team administrator for the U.S. national team, including more than 80 international matches, as well as the 1994 World Cup. Following national-team duty, he went on to serve as Deputy Competition Manager of the Orange Bowl soccer venue for the 1996 Olympic Games.

Fluent in Spanish, Capobianco earned a masters degree in Coaching & Teaching Effectiveness (Exercise Physiology Emphasis) at San Diego State University. He was a four-year member of the Aztecs soccer program.

Capobianco, 35, is married to former U.S. women's national team star Mary Harvey, goalkeeper on the 1991 World Cup championship team.

Director Técnico

Brian Quinn, reconocido como uno de los técnicos más listos del país, empezó su segunda temporada como director técnico del San José Clash, a la edad de 38 años y ex jugador del equipo Nacional de los Estados Unidos, siendo él uno de los más jóvenes técnicos de la Liga Major de Fútbol (MLS).

"Mi meta será la misma que cuando llege al Clash hace temporada y media y es de ganar el campeonato de la MLS, y pienso que es una meta muy realista. Empezamos a reconstruir un proyecto en San José y estoy satisfecho del resultado que hemos hecho hasta hoy", dijo Quinn, quien el 17 de diciembre de 1998 reconfirmó su nuevo contrato con el equipo.

Su carrera profesional consiste de 64-59-3, en año y medio con el Clash es de 26-32-3, incluyendo un récord con la MLS de 20-29, en otros juegos es de 6-3-3, sin dejar atrás el récord de las dos temporadas con los San Diego Sockers de 38-27, equipo de fútbol de salón.

Después de haber sido nombrado Director Técnico del Clash el 25 de junio de 1997, y al transcurso de tres días, debutó guiando el equipo a una victoria de 3-1 sobre el Dallas Burn, en el estadio Spartan. Su récord en conjunto en su primera temporada fue de 9-11-1, incluyendo una marca de juego en la MLS de 7-10.

En 1998, Quinn, guió al Clash al campeonato de la MLS (Torneo primaveral de la liga). Pero al empezar la temporada de 1999, no tuvo la misma suerte, ya que en sus primeros tres partidos los perdió en penales (shootout), llevandolo a un récord de 13-19 y 12-2.

"Tuvimos un progreso en 1998, y aunque los resultados no lo demuestren así, si lo tuvimos", dijo Quinn. El Clash ganó tres de sus últimos cuatro partidos, sin permitir ningún gol en 341 minutos en 1998.

Brian Quinn, widely recognized as one of the brightest young coaching prospects in the country, begins his second full season as head coach of the San Jose Clash. At age 38, the former United States national team midfielder remains the youngest coach in MLS.

"My goal remains the same as it was when I came to San Jose - to win an MLS championship - and I think that it's a realistic goal," said Quinn, who agreed to a new contract Dec. 17, 1998. "We've started a rebuilding project here, and I'm grateful to see it through."

Quinn has a career coaching record of 64-59-3. He is 26-32-3 in 1 1/2 seasons with the Clash, including a 20-29 record in MLS games and a 6-3-3 mark in other matches. His career record also includes two seasons indoors with the San Diego Sockers, where he was 38-27.

After being named head coach of the Clash on June 25, 1997, Quinn made his MLS debut three days later, guiding his new team to a 3-1 victory over Dallas at Spartan Stadium. His overall record during his first season was 9-11-1, including a 7-10 mark in MLS games.

In 1998, Quinn guided the Clash to the championship of the MLS Spring Training Tournament in Florida. But the Clash got off to an unlucky start in the regular season, losing each of the first three games in a shootout, and went on to post a 13-19 record. The Clash was 17-21-2 overall.

"We made some progress in 1998," Quinn said. "The record doesn't necessarily show it, but we moved ahead."

The Clash won three of its final four games and finished the season with a streak of 341 minutes without allowing a goal.

Born May 24, 1960, in Belfast, Northern Ireland, Quinn played professionally with Larne in the Irish League and Everton in the English Premiership before coming to the U.S. in 1981. In four years in the old North American Soccer League, the midfielder played 96 games with Los Angeles, Montreal and San Diego, scoring 11 goals and recording 35 assists. He established an early reputation as a clutch player by scoring six goals in 13 playoff games.

Quinn joined the U.S. national team shortly after he became a U.S. citizen in 1991 and made 48 international appearances from 1991 to 1994, recording a goal and two assists. He played a key role in the U.S. team's surprising victory in the CONCACAF Gold Cup in 1991, playing every minute of the tournament and scoring a brilliant goal on a 30-yard half-volley in a 3-0 victory over Guatemala.

Quinn played nine years indoors with San Diego, helping the Sockers win eight league championships. An

eight-time all-star, he was the fourth-leading scorer in club history, with 131 goals and 204 assists (335 points) in 303 regular season games. In 96 playoff games, he had 56 goals and 74 assists (130 points). He was twice named most valuable player in the league championship series.

Quinn replaced the legendary Ron Newman as head coach of the Sockers in 1995 and went 17-11 in each of his two seasons at the helm. The Sockers went 1-2 in the 1995 playoffs and 3-3 in 1996.

Quinn and his wife, Sharon, also a native of Belfast, live in Poway, Calif., with their six children: Nicola, Damien, Danielle, Caitlin, Sinead and Aodhan.

en el equipo de Larne de la liga irlandés y con el Everton de la liga English Premiership, antes de inmigrar a los Estados Unidos en 1981, y cuatro años en la liga North American Soccer, este mediocampista jugó 96 juegos en los equipos de: Los Angeles, Montreal y San Diego, con un récord personal de 11 goles y 35 pases de gol, estableciendo así, una temprana reputación como el jugador clave del equipo anotando 6 goles en 13 partidos de desempate (playoff).

Quinn, después de poco tiempo de naturalizarse en los Estados Unidos en 1991, ingresó al equipo nacional de este país e hizo 48 presentaciones internacionales desde 1991 hasta 1994 con un récord de un gol y dos pases de gol. Tuvo un papel muy importante con el equipo jugando cada minuto del partido, que sorprendió con un tremendo gol de 30 metros, dándole la victoria de 3-0 sobre Guatemala, CONCACAF, Copa de Oro que se jugó en 1991.

Quinn jugó 9 años fútbol de salón en San Diego, ayudando a los Sockers, que ganaron ocho campeonatos de liga, siendo él ocho veces estrella de todos los tiempos y cuatro veces líder de goleo en la historia del club, con un récord personal de 131 goles, 204 pases de gol y con un puntaje de 335 en 303 juegos de temporada regular, en los partidos de 1996 tuvo 56 goles, 74 pases de gol y 130 puntos, en dos ocasiones fue nombrado como el jugador más valioso (MVP) de la liga en series de campeonato.

En 1995 reemplazo al legendario Ron Newman, como director técnico de los Sockers, con un récord de 17-11 en las dos temporadas al timón, 1-2 en los partidos de desempate del mismo año, y 3-3 en 1996.


Espinoza, 45, joined the Clash after two seasons as coach of the Indiana Twisters of the Continental Indoor Soccer League. He led the Twisters to a 17-11 record in 1997.

A native of Santiago, Chile, Espinoza began his professional career in 1972 with the famous Colo Colo club in his hometown. He helped Colo Colo reach the finals of the Libertadores Cup in 1972 and played for Chile in the Pan-American Games.

In 1979, Espinoza moved to the United States to play with the Chicago Sting in the North American Soccer League. He later played indoors with Chicago, Memphis, Wichita, Kansas City and Dallas in the Major Indoor Soccer League and with Illinois and Milwaukee in the National Professional Soccer League.

Espinoza made his coaching debut at the college level, spending three seasons at Rosary College and another season at Triton College, both in Illinois, before taking over the Rockford (Ill.) Raptors of the United States Interregional Soccer League in 1994. He returned to the MISL as coach of the Mexico Toros in 1995 and guided the expansion team to a 17-11 record. He then moved to the CISL's Twisters, where his team went 10-18 in 1996.

Espinoza and his wife, Monica, live in Santa Clara. They have two sons: Jorge, 20, and Christopher, 17.



Morgan, who is single, lives in San Jose.



THE SINGLE-ENTITY CONCEPT

MLS features a unique ownership and operating structure. Unlike other professional sports leagues which are a confederation of individual franchise owners, MLS is structured as a single limited liability company (single-entity). In a single-entity endeavor, each team operator owns a financial stake in the league, not just their individual team. In addition, player contracts are owned by the league rather than by individual teams.

The single-entity concept allows teams to operate autonomously in their markets, but with the incentive to see that all teams are financially successful. MLS believes this single-entity structure enables it to avoid many of the pitfalls that have plagued other professional sports leagues. The single-entity design provides MLS and its member teams with the ability to:

- Limit the financial disparities between large and small markets
- Offer commercial affiliates an integrated sponsorship and licensing program
- Decrease the opportunity for sponsor ambush
- Gain economies of scale in purchasing power and cost control
- Make decisions in the best interest of the entire league rather than just one team





San Jose Clash
History

KEY DATES IN CLASH HISTORY

- June 15, 1994** San Jose becomes a charter member of Major League Soccer, along with Boston, Columbus (Ohio), Los Angeles, New Jersey, New York and Washington D.C. The New Jersey and New York entries later were merged. In November 1994, Chicago and Tampa were added.
- June 6, 1995** The 10-team alignment for MLS' first season is completed, as Denver and Kansas City are added to the league and Dallas replaces Chicago. San Jose is assigned to the Western Conference, along with Dallas, Denver, Kansas City and Los Angeles.
- Aug. 1, 1995** Veteran Bay Area soccer promoter Peter Bridgwater, former owner and general manager of the San Jose Earthquakes and Venue Executive Director for the San Francisco venue of World Cup 1994, is named President and General Manager of the San Jose club.
- Oct. 17, 1995** The San Jose team is nicknamed the "Clash," and the team's logos and uniforms are unveiled.
- Dec. 7, 1995** Laurie Calloway is named Head Coach of the Clash. Francisco Maturano Ruiz is named Assistant Coach and U.S. World Cup veteran John Doyle and Nigerian World Cup veteran Michael Emenalo are introduced as the Clash's first players.
- Jan. 23, 1996** U.S. national team star Eric Wynalda is allocated to the Clash by MLS. The announcement of Wynalda's allocation comes one day after the two-time World Cup veteran becomes the U.S. team's all-time leading scorer by netting his 22nd international goal in a 3-0 victory over Guatemala in the third-place game at the CONCACAF Gold Cup.
- Feb. 6, 1996** Paul Bravo is the Clash's first selection in the inaugural Major League Soccer Draft. The Clash selects seven more players on the first day of the draft and eight more the following day.
- Feb. 17, 1996** The Clash completes the first trade in MLS history, getting Troy Dayak from the MetroStars in exchange for Rhett Hartly and the Clash's first-round selection in the MLS College Draft.
- March 1, 1996** The Clash opens its first training camp, on the South Campus at San Jose State University.
- April 6, 1996** The Clash defeats D.C. United, 1-0, in the MLS Inaugural Game at Spartan Stadium, before a crowd of 31,683, the largest ever to attend a sporting event in San Jose.
- May 12, 1996** The Clash breaks its San Jose attendance record, with crowd of 31,728 for a game against Los Angeles.
- June 12, 1996** The Clash becomes the first MLS team to defeat an international opponent, downing UNAM Pumas of the Mexican First Division, 2-1, at Spartan Stadium.
- Oct. 26, 1996** The Clash becomes the first MLS team to take an international tour, leaving for a 13-day trip through the People's Republic of China during which the club splits a pair of games.
- March 22, 1997** The Clash again plays host to the MLS Opening Game, defeating the MetroStars, 1-0, in a shootout before a crowd of 23,501 at Spartan Stadium. Goalkeeper Dave Salzwedel scores the winning goal in the 11th round.
- June 25, 1997** Brian Quinn is named Head Coach of the Clash, replacing Laurie Calloway, relieved of his duties two days earlier.
- May 3, 1998** The Clash plays its first game on a newly-widened field at Spartan Stadium. The club was forced to play its first three home games of the season at Stanford Stadium, after winter rains delayed construction at Spartan Stadium.
- Nov. 18, 1998** MLS, which has operated the Clash as a league-owned team since the league's inception, announces an agreement to sell investor-operator rights to the Kraft Group Sports, investor-operator of the New England Revolution and owner of the NFL's New England Patriots.
- Jan. 4, 1999** Kraft Sports Group assumes operation of the Clash; Lynne Meterparel is named Owners Representative and Renato Capobianco is named Director of Soccer.
- Feb. 17, 1999** Lynne Meterparel is named General Manager.





Rule 1 - The Field of Play

Major League Soccer fields may have a minimum width of 50 yards and a maximum width of 100 yards, and fields may have a minimum length of 100 yards and a maximum length of 130 yards.

Rule 2 - The Ball

The official Mitre Game ball of Major League Soccer will have a circumference of 27" - 28" and a weight of 14 oz.- 16 oz.

Rule 3 - Number of Players

Each team consists of 11 players, one of whom must be the goalkeeper. A maximum of three substitutes, plus the 'keeper, may be used. If an MLS team substitutes its 'keeper during a match, he shall not count as one of the three allowed field player substitutes.

Rule 4 - Player Equipment

A player's uniform must consist of shirt, shorts, socks, shinguards and shoes. The goalkeeper must wear colors which distinguish him from the other players, the referee and the referee assistants.

Rule 5 - Referees

One referee and two referee's assistants and a fourth official, are appointed for each match. The referee is responsible for control of the game and his/her decisions regarding facts connected with play are final.

Rule 6 - Referee's Assistant

Two referee assistants will assist the referee by indicating offside, when the ball is out of play, which team is entitled to a corner kick or throw in, or goal kick, substitution request and by indicating other misconduct or any incident that has occurred out of the view of the referee.

Rule 7 - Duration of the Game

The game shall be divided up into two equal periods of 45 minutes each. If a MLS match is tied after 90 minutes, a shootout will be held to determine the winner. See MLS tiebreaker procedure for more details on the shootout.

Rule 8 - The Start of Play

A flip of a coin decides which team will kick off. Each team must stay in its own half of the field and the defending players must be at least 10 yards from the ball when it is kicked. After a goal, the team scored upon will kick off. After halftime, the teams change ends and the kickoff will be taken by the opposite team to that which started the game.

Rule 9 - Ball In and Out of Play

The ball is out of play when (a) it has wholly crossed the goal line or touchline, whether on the ground or in the air, or (b) when the game has been stopped by the referee. The ball is in play at all other times.

Rule 10 - Method of Scoring

A goal is scored when the whole of the ball has passed over the goal line, between the goal posts and under the cross bar, whether on the ground or in the air.

Rule 11 - Offside

A player is in an offside position if he is nearer to his opponent's goal line than both the ball and the second last opponent unless:

- i) he is in his own half of the field of play, or
- ii) he is level with the second last opponent or two last opponents.

A player shall only be declared offside and penalized for being in an offside position, if, at the moment the ball touches, or is played by, one of his teammates, he is, in the opinion of the referee:

- i) interfering with play or with an opponent, or

ii) gaining an advantage by being in that position.

A player shall not be declared offside by the referee

i) merely because of his being in an offside position, or

ii) if he receives the ball direct from a goal-kick, a corner-kick, a throw-in, or when it has been dropped by a referee.

If a player is declared offside, the referee shall award an indirect free kick, which shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred, unless the offense is committed by a player in the opponent's goal area, in which case the free-kick shall be taken from any point within the goal area.

Rule 12 - Fouls and Misconduct

A direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a player commits any of the following 10 offenses in a manner considered by the referee to be careless, reckless or using excessive force: (a) kicks, (b) trips, (c) jumps at, (d) charges violently, (e) strikes, (f) pushes, (g) holds, (h) spits, (i) intentionally handles the ball, or (j) tackles an opponent to gain possession of the ball, making contact with the opponent before touching the ball.

A penalty kick is awarded if any of the above 10 offenses is committed by a player inside his own penalty area, irrespective of the position of the ball, provided it is in play.

An indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a player, in the opinion of the referee, commits any of the following offences: (a) dangerous play, (b) impedes the progress of an opponent, or (c) prevents the goalkeeper from releasing the ball from his hands.

An indirect kick will also be awarded if the goalkeeper: (a) takes more than four steps while controlling the ball with his hands, before releasing it, (b) touches the ball again with his hands after it has been released from his possession and has not touched any player, (c) touches the ball with his hands after it has been deliberately kicked to him by a team-mate, (d) touches the ball with his hands after receiving it directly from a throw-in taken by a teammate, or (e) wastes time.

A player is cautioned and given a yellow card if he commits any of the following offences: (a) unsporting behavior, (b) shows dissent by word or action, (c) persistently infringes the Laws of the Game, (d) delays the restart of the game, (e) fails to stand the required distance for a corner kick or a free kick, (f) enters or re-enters the field without the referee's permission, or (g) deliberately leaves the field of play without the referee's permission.

A player is sent off and shown the red card if he commits the following offences: (a) guilty of serious foul play, (b) guilty of violent conduct, (c) spits on an opponent or any other person, (d) denies an opponent a goal or an obvious goal-scoring opportunity by deliberately handling the ball, (e) denies an obvious goal-scoring opportunity to an opponent moving towards the player's goal by an offence punishable by a free kick or a penalty kick, (f) uses offensive language, or (g) receives a second caution in the same match.

Rule 13 - Free Kick

Free kicks are classified into two categories: "Direct" (from which a goal can be scored directly against the offending side) and "Indirect" (from which a goal cannot be scored unless the ball has been touched by a player other than the kicker before entering the goal).

For all free kicks the offending team must be at least 10 yards from the ball or the goal line until the ball is kicked.

Rule 14 - Penalty Kick

A penalty kick is a direct free kick taken at the penalty mark. All players except the player taking the kick and the goalkeeper must stay outside the penalty area and be at least 10 yards from the ball (hence the arc at the edge of the penalty area).

Rule 15 - Throw In

When the ball has wholly crossed the touchline, it is put back into play by a throw-in from the spot where it went out and by a player from the opposite team to the player who last touched it. A goal cannot be scored directly from a throw-in.

Rule 16 - Goal Kick


When the ball has wholly crossed the goal line after being last touched by a player from the attacking team, it is put back into play by a kick from the goal area by the defending team.

Rule 17 - Corner Kick


When the ball has wholly crossed the goal line after being last touched by a player from the defending team, it is put back into play by a kick by the attacking team from the corner on the side the ball went out.

MLS QUICK FACTS

- Twelve-team summer league with the 1999 season from March 20 through MLS Cup '99 on November 21.
- 32 regular-season league games per team; each team will play the other teams in its conference four times, twice at home and twice on the road; it will play twice against the six teams in the opposing conference.
- MLS Playoffs consist of best-of-three Conference Semifinals, best-of-three Conference Finals and a one-game championship to be broadcast live by ABC television from Foxboro Stadium on November 21, 1999.



Spartan Stadium

Its intimate atmosphere and tremendous sightlines make Spartan Stadium an ideal setting for soccer. Located on the South Campus of San Jose State University, the stadium has been the home of the Clash since the Major League Soccer Inaugural Game in 1996.

A long-awaited project to widen the field was completed in 1998, making the stadium suitable to host international events such as United States national team games – the U.S. played here twice in 1998 -- and the 1999 Women's World Cup. The new field measures 70 yards wide, five yards wider than the old field, thus meeting regulation established by FIFA, the international governing body of soccer. The field also grew a little longer, from 106 to 110 yards.

In an effort to assure the comfort of its fans, the Clash decided in 1997 to establish 26,000 as capacity for Major League Soccer Games at Spartan Stadium. Although the stadium has an "official" capacity of 30,011, the historic MLS Inaugural Game on April 6, 1996 drew an overflow crowd of 31,683, to see the Clash's dramatic 1-0 victory over D.C. United. At the time, it was the largest crowd ever to attend a sports event in San Jose; however, that record was broken later in the season with a crowd of 31,728 for a May 12 game against the Los Angeles Galaxy.

Spartan Stadium was constructed in 1933 and has been expanded twice in recent years. The upper deck was constructed in 1980, and the stadium was most recently renovated in 1985, when mezzanine-level private boxes and additional seats were installed in the upper deck and in the end-zone stands.

The Spartan Stadium playing surface is natural grass.

Spartan Stadium is accessible by Interstate 280. The Seventh Street and 10th /11th Street exits provide direct access to the stadium, which is located on Seventh Street, between Alma and Humboldt.

SAN JOSE CLASH TELEVISION

In a bold move designed to give fans more opportunities to watch the team play on television, the Clash reached agreement with FOX Sports Bay Area to televise 18 games -including nine home games - during the 1999 Major League Soccer season.

Coupled with Clash appearances on MLS national telecasts, the local contract ensures that 26 of the club's 32 regular-season games will be televised, all live. The remaining six games may be televised on another local outlet.

"Our goal is to have all 32 games available to our fans on television, either on FOX Sports Bay Area, another local station or as part of the national package," General Manager Lynne Meterparel said.

"With the Giants, A's, Warriors and Sharks, FOX Sports Bay Area has emerged as the unquestioned leader in Bay Area sports television," Meterparel added. "The Clash is proud to be part of the FOX Sports Bay Area family. It's another sign that Major League Soccer has reached its goal of becoming America's fifth major sport."
