

Duration of the Game

Indoor Soccer as played by the North American Soccer League will present games of four 15-minute periods. Teams will change ends following each quarter. In the event of games ending in a tie, teams will play consecutive 15-minute suddendeath overtime periods until one team scores. An interval of three minutes will take place at the end of the first and third quarters and any overtime periods, while a 15-minute intermission occurs at the ends of the second quarter.

Figuring the Standings

NASL Indoor Soccer Standings will be computed solely on the basis of won-loss percentage. Standing points, normal to the outdoor game, will not be used. In the event of a tie in the standings, the following five-step procedure will be applied to resolve the deadlock:

- a) Goal difference (goals for minus goals against)
- b) Goals For
- c) Wins Away From Home
- d) Goal Difference in Away Games
- e) Goals Scored in Away Games

Playoff Format

Four teams, the regular season champion plus the next three teams with the best winning percentage will qualify.

The semi-finals will be a best-of-three series, with the regular season champion and the next highest ranking team having the first and third games at its home stadium.

The finals will be a best-of-five series, with the team with the best regular season winning percentage having the first, second and fifth games at its home stadium.

Roster Size

Roster size for the indoor season will be determined according to NASL policy. For indoor games 14 players may be suited up.



1983-84 INDOOR COACHING STAFF

JOHN GILES

Head Coach

Although this will be John Giles' first season of coaching the Whitecaps indoor team, he is actually entering his fourth season as Whitecaps' head coach. In three outdoor seasons, including playoffs, Giles has comprised a 67-35 win-loss record. His .666 winning percentage ranks third on the league's all-time list. Giles was long-regarded one of the finest midfielders in England with Manchester United, Leeds United and West Bromwich Albion. He represented his native Ireland a record 60 times and served as a special technical director of Brazil's 1974 World Cup team. John, his wife Anne and six children now make their home in suburban Coquitlam.

GEORGE WRIGHT

Assistant Coach/Physiotherapist

A Whitecap since 1980, this will be George Wright's third season as an indoor assistant coach. A respected figure in English soccer, Wright has held similar posts with Middlesborough, Arsenal and West Bromwich Albion. He has been a lecturer on the British F.A. circuit and is considered an expert in the diagnosis and treatment of injury.

NOBBY STILES

Youth Coach/ Youth Development Director

Responsible for the Whitecaps' youth team and the development of the young Canadian player, Stiles joined the Whitecaps in 1982. Stiles spent 11 seasons as a player with Manchester United Middlesborough and Preston. His most memorable season was in 1966 when he helped England to their only World Cup championship. Stiles was capped at every level for England, including 28 full "A" caps.

1983 proved to be a banner season for Tino Lettieri. The Torito Bari, Italy native led the NASL goalkeepers for the second consecutive year with a club record 0.86 goals-against average and a club record 11 shutouts. Lettieri was tops in 1982 with a 1.23 average. Lettieri now ranks second among all-time goalkeepers with a career average of 1.26 and rates ninth in career shutouts with 32 — 15 of those as a Whitecap. This will be Lettieri's fourth NASL Indoor season and second as a Whitecap. He led the NASL in 1980-81 with a 3.62 goals-against average while with Minnesota Kicks. In his first campaign for Vancouver in 1981-82 Lettieri posted a 5.67 average and scored a goal on a penalty kick against San Jose.


This will be Lowther's first participation in Indoor Soccer. In Vancouver's two previous seasons (1980-81 and 1981-82) Lowther was playing at the University of Dublin, Ireland as part of the Whitecaps' overseas youth development program. This past outdoor season Lowther got into 11 games, playing 839 minutes filling in after injuries to Mark Nickeas, Pierce O'Leary and Mike Sweeney. Lowther has now played in 31 career games for Vancouver over three seasons. He was born in North Shields, England but grew up in Edmonton and became a Canadian citizen in 1982. He was drafted by the Whitecaps' in the second round of the 1980 high school/college amateur draft.

The past outdoor season was a frustrating one for Nickeas. He started the season as a centreback and alternated in the early goings between that position and midfield. However once Dave Watson arrived from England, he and Watson formed the Whitecaps' central defence. However, on June 22 Nickeas suffered torn ligaments and did not return to the lineup until August 28 - missing a total of 14 games. He scored his first NASL outdoor goal opening day April 24 in a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale. Nickeas saw the door to the outdoor Whitecaps actually open up to him following his stalwart play in the inaugural indoor campaign in 1980-81. That year he finished as the top scoring defender with five goals and nine assists for 19 points. A native of Southport, England, he became a U.S. citizen in 1982. He was among the players invited to Team America's training camp but was unable to attend due to a groin injury.

Bob Lenarduzzi proved in 1983 that he improves with age. Enjoying an outstanding season, Bobby made NASL history on May 22 in San Jose, California when he started against the Quakes — his 242nd career game — breaking the league record of 241 held by former Quake Paul Child. He also ranks second on the club's all-time scoring list with 31 goals and 53 assists for 115 points. He is also the club career leader in fouls (278); assists (53) and playoff games played (24). He has played every position during his 11-year career including goal. Ths past season saw him fill in as a forward in an emergency. Lenarduzzi is no stranger to the Indoor game, having played the 1979-80 season on loan to the Los Angeles Aztecs along with Buzz Parsons and Bob Bolitho. He finished fifth among club indoor scorers in 1980-81 and sixth in 1981-82.




Long-regarded as one of the hardest-working midfielders in the NASL, O'Brien fit right into the Whitecaps in 1983, joining the club from Montreal Manic in a cash deal in March. O'Brien finished playing 26 games and scoring four goals and seven assists for 15 points, bringing his all-time six-year NASL career totals to 25 goals and 46 assists for 96 points. This past season he was named to the Professional Soccer Reporters Association Second All-Star team and was a Sporting News/NASL Honorable Mention All-Star. He began his NASL career with the Philadelphia Fury in 1978 and made the franchise move with the team to Montreal in 1981. Fran has limited experience in indoor soccer, having played eight games in 1981-82 and five games in the Grand Prix Indoor tournament last year. An ankle injury sidelined him from the bulk of indoor play in 1981-82.



The NASL's Most Valuable Player in 1982, Ward led the Sounders in scoring in both the 1982 and 1983 outdoor seasons. He was purchased by the Whitecaps in a threecornered deal prior to the dispersal draft of Sounders players on September 28. The deal involved Whitecaps sending Frans Thijssen to Nottingham Forest for the winter with Forest waiving a portion of the liability owed them by the Sounders in exchange for Ward. The native of Derby scored 18 goals and 12 assists for 48 points in 1982 winning the MVP award; earning a spot on the NASL first all-star team and being honored as PSRA "Three-Star of the Year". Ward also tied for the playoff scoring lead with 10 points as the Sounders earned a berth into the final. 
