4 THINGS TO KNOW

- **1**. SD Loyal (4W-2L-2D, 14 points) begins a new month of competition that includes three road matches and one home match.
- **2.** SD Loyal suffered its first home loss of 2023 last week against El Paso Locomotive FC (2-1). The club returns to Torero Stadium on May 13 to face Rio Grande Valley FC.
- **3.** Saturday will be the 11th meeting between SD Loyal and Orange County. SD Loyal leads the all-time series 4W-3-L-3D.
- **4.** Orange County is 1-3 in its last four matches, including losing its last two against Birmingham Legion FC and New Mexico United.

MATCH PREVIEW

It's the beginning of a new month for SD Loyal and its first match in May is on the road against Orange County SC. SD Loyal travels north on Interstate 5 to face one of its Western Conference rivals in the first meeting between clubs this season. SD Loyal is coming off a 2-1 home loss against El Paso Locomotive FC to finish a very busy month of April that had Head Coach Nate Miller's squad playing seven matches. Three of those came in the last week of the month. Saturday's match at Orange County also marks the first of three road matches for SD Loyal in May. Miller's squad comes in as the third best team in the conference as it vies to get back to its winning ways against an Orange County team that sits near the bottom of the standings. Orange County is 1-3 in its last four matches, including consecutive losses to Birmingham Legion FC and New Mexico United.

KOKE VEGAS

Goalkeeper

Vegas enters his second season with SD Loyal. He cemented himself as the starter in 2022. Vegas is a goal-keeper that has quality in his touch, helping the team begin attacking from the back. Vegas came to SD Loyal from Levante UD of La Liga. He played at RCD Mallorca of the Spanish second division in 2021 where he appeared in one match after being sent there on loan. He has played for a handful of teams in that division but has had La Liga experience with Levante since 2017. Vegas has become a fan favorite as he stands under goal in front of the official supporter groups at Torero Stadium.

MORGAN HACKWORTH

Midfielder

Hackworth joined SD Loyal in February 2020 after spending the 2019 season playing for Memphis 1901 FC. He played in 16 games with seven starts for Memphis in 2019 totaling 661 minutes. Before that, he played in USL League Two. Hackworth began his college soccer career at Syracuse University (2015-2017) where he played in eight games. He went on to play at Akron University (2017-2018) where he was named an Academic All-MAC selection, CoSIDA Academic All-America nominee and an Academic All-Ohio honoree. He was a member of the U-16 and U-18 Philadelphia Union Academy teams and helped his team to fifthplace finish at 2014 Generation Adidas Cup.

ELIJAH MARTIN

Defender

Martin started in SD Loyal's inaugural season home opener in 2020, working the left side of the defensive backline. He is an experienced defender at the USL Championship level, playing 31 games for the now defunct Fresno FC in 2019. Martin spent the previous seasons with the Fresno FC U-23s and Fresno Fuego at the USL League Two level. Martin made his way to The USL Championship after two seasons with LA Galaxy II, playing in 14 matches between 2014 and 2015. Martin has also represented the United States at the youth level, having played for the U.S. Under-17 National Team during the 2013 CONCACAF U-17 Championships.

GRANT STONEMAN

Defender

Stoneman made his USL Championship debut when he started for SD Loyal in the team's inagural match against Las Vegas Lights FC on March 7, 2020. He earned his spot as the starting defender on the right side of the defensive line. Stoneman can also play in the middle of the defense. He played in USL League One and USL League Two before joining SD Loyal. His first team out of college was Lansing United of the National Premier Soccer League in 2016. Stoneman played college soccer at Wisconsin and later transferred to Loyola University in Chicago where he earned Second Team United Soccer Coaches All-America honors in 2016.



CHARLIE ADAMS

Midfielder

Adams returns as the team captain in 2023. He was a key component in 2022 and helped keep the squad working towards each match objective in 2021 despite the ups and downs of both winning and losing streaks. The Englishman has been the heart of the midfield since his arrival before the inagural 2020 season. He played in 33 matches while starting 29 in 2021. Adams showed his quality as a ball distributor with an 87-percent pass accuracy and 29 accurate crosses. He had four assists while also displaying defensive capability with 64 interceptions and 58-percent of his challenges won during the 2021 season.

BLAKE BODILY

Midfielder

Bodily joined SD Loyal in Jan. 2023 after spending the last three years with Portland Timbers of Major League Soccer. Bodily signed a homegrown contract with Portland in Jan. 2020 following three standout seasons with the University of Washington. Prior to Washington, Bodily spent time with Portland Timbers Academy and Portland Timbers 2 from 2014-2017. Bodily first began playing with Portland Timbers 2 in 2015 where he appeared in 35 matches, scoring four goals. Bodily was acquired on loan by SD Loyal in October of 2021, playing in three matches with the club that month and then was recalled a few weeks later by Portland.

RONALDO DAMUS

Forward

Damus joined SD Loyal for the 2023 USL Championship season. The 23-year-old came from Swedish side GIF Sundsvall of the Superettan, the second division in Sweden. The Haitian striker played in 25 matches for GIF Sundsvall in 2022, scoring five goals and recording two assists. Damus was permanently transferred to GIF Sundsvall after playing with Orange County SC in 2021 and part of 2022. During his time with GIF Sundsvall, Damus played alongside his now SD Loyal teammate Joe Corona for the 2022 Allsvenskan, Sweden's top flight division. The speedy and versatile forward was a key piece in helping Orange County win the 2021 USL Championship Final and was awarded the MVP for his performance in the final.

EVAN CONWAY

Forward

Conway joined SD Loyal after playing with Union Omaha of USL League One in 2021, where he played in 18 matches, starting in 15. He scored 13 goals and recorded one assist while logging 1,258 minutes played. Conway is a dynamic forward who can play multiple positions. The Wisconsin native also played with Ventura County Fusion of USL League 2 in 2019. Conway became an important piece of the SD Loyal attack 2022, helping produce multiple late game-winning goals. He is a forward that can attack from either side outside the penalty box but he can also play up front, a role he will take on this season.



ALEJANDRO GUIDO

Midfielder

Guido was signed to the SD Loyal squad on Sept. 1, 2020 on loan from Los Angeles FC. The midfielder became an impact player immediately, helping spark an offense with his presence at midfield. Guido helped set up an assist in his first match with SD Loyal and went on to score two goals in a win against Orange County SC, just a few days after signing. The midfielder grew up playing in local youth soccer leagues in the South Bay of San Diego County and in Tijuana, just across the border. Guido went on trial with Vitesse Arnhem in Holland before signing with Club Tijuana of Liga MX in March 2012. He played at different levels with the Xolos but eventually made his way onto the first team roster.

TUMI MOSHOBANE

Forward

Moshobane is a versatile striker who adds a diverse attack for SD Loyal. He was part of the team's first ever win, a 2-1 victory at Tacoma Defiance on March 11, 2020. Moshobane came to the United States in 2015 and began to play soccer at the collegiate level at Kankakee Community College in Illinois. He transferred to Olivet Nazarene University from 2016 to 2018 where his uncle, Vincent Mkhwanazi, is one of the most decorated players to come out of Olivet Nazarene University's soccer program and is from Moshobane's hometown of Soweto, South Africa. Moshobane sat out the 2016 season then shined in 2017 and 2018, scoring 17 goals and seven assists in 40 appearances.

CAMDEN RILEY

Defender

Riley, a defender, came to San Diego from Rio Grande Valley FC. Riley played in 26 games for SD Loyal in 2022. Before signing with SD Loyal, he played in 16 matches and started in 10 during the 2021 USL Championship season wth RGVFC. The defender played 871 minutes helping his former team's back line. The Dallas, Texas native also played for Sporting Kansas City in 2020 and 2019. He played there after being selected in the second round of the 2019 MLS SuperDraft by Sporting Kansas City and was subsequently signed by its USL Championship affiliate.

ADRIEN PEREZ

Forward

SD Loyal acquired Adrien Perez on Feb. 28, 2023 ahead of the 2023 USL Championship season. The 27-year old joined SD Loyal after spending his previous two seasons with Major League Soccer side D.C. United. The striker played the first three matches of 2022 for D.C. United before suffering a foot injury that kept him out the rest of the season. Perez joined D.C. United in January of 2021 after being selected in the 2020 MLS re-entry draft. The Ontario, Calif. native made 17 appearances (10 starts), recording two assists in 869 minutes played across two seasons.



JOE CORONA

Midfielder

Corona, a Sweetwater High School graduate, joined SD Loyal on January 18, 2023 after spending the 2022 season in Sweden playing for GIF Sundsvall of the Allsvenskan, the country's first division league. The midfielder played in 25 matches for GIF Sundsvall, logging 1,832 minutes. He was there on loan from Major League Soccer side Houston Dynamo, where he played in 30 matches and logged 1,732 minutes during the 2021 season. The 2008 San Diego Union-Tribune Player of the Year and first-team All-CIF selection, Corona played one season at San Diego State University after capturing the 2007-2008 San Diego Section Championship with Sweetwater.

JACKSON SIMBA

Defender

SD Loyal signed defender Jackson Simba on August 12, 2022. The Tanzanian international joined SD Loyal after playing with AFC Ann Arbor of USL League Two for the 2022 season. The defender played in eight matches for AFC Ann Arbor, starting in seven, helping his team to a 4W-2L-2D record during that span. Simba recorded 640 total minutes and two shot attempts for the season. Originally from Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, the defender signed his first professional contract with SD Loyal.

MARTIN

Midfielder

Martin is an experienced midfielder who was named to the SD Loyal starting line up in the team's second-ever match on March 11, 2020. He led the midfield in the center of that five-man line against Tacoma Defiance, helping his team to a 2-1 win. Martin set up SD Loyal's first goal in that game, sending an assist via a free kick to Francis Atuahene, who charged the ball at the Defiance goal line. Martin signed with SD Loyal after spending the 2019 season with Hartford Athletic on loan from Major League Soccer side Minnesota United. Martin's experience in MLS began with D.C United. He was signed to a professional contract as a homegrown player in 2013.

ELLIOT COLLIER

Forward

Collier joined SD Loyal on Dec. 27, 2022. Collier joined SD Loyal after spending his previous season with USL Championship side San Antonio FC where he played in 23 games, scoring four goals. The forward brings Major League Soccer experience after spending four seasons with Chicago Fire FC where he played in 54 matches, including 14 starts, logging 1,750 minutes. Before that, he spent time on loan with Memphis 901 FC of The USL Championship in 2019. Collier also has international experience with the New Zealand National Team. He earned his first call up in 2019 where he appeared in two friendlies against Ireland and Lithuania.



NICK MOON

Forward

A Waukesha, Wisconsin native, Moon came to San Diego before the start of the 2022 season from USL Championship side Indy Eleven. He played in 29 matches for Indy in 2021, starting in 19. Moon scored two goals and recored four assists in 2022. The forward gives SD Loyal versatility as he can play at different areas of the pitch. Moon not only has experience at the USL Championship level but has also played in League One where he appeared in 29 matches for Lansing Ignite FC in 2019. The 2023 season marks Moon's second season with SD Loyal. He quickly became an explosive attacking player in 2022 before suffering an season-ending injury, missing the final six matches of the season.

EBY ACKON

Defender

Ebenezer "Eby" Ackon came to San Diego after most recently playing with San Antonio FC. He was a standout during his college career at Bowling Green State University and was originally drafted by MLS side Chicago Fire FC during the 2019 MLS SuperDraft. Unfortunately, Ackon could not be registered because the club had exceeded their quota for international players. Prior to coming to the United States, Ackon had a short stint at Cape Coast Ebusua Dwarfs of the Ghana Premier League.

KYLE ADAMS

Defender

Adams came to San Diego before the start of the 2022 season from USL Championship side Real Monarchs. The Auckland, New Zealand native is an experienced defender with excellent passing skills. He played in 29 matches, starting in 27 with Real Monarchs in 2021. He had 42 interceptions and scored a goal in the 2,477 minutes he played. Adams also spent two seasons with fellow USL Championship side Rio Grande Valley FC from 2018-2019, where he typically wore the captain's armband in his 52 matches. Adams played three years at San Diego State University, where he was a three-time United Soccer Coaches All-Far West Region selection.

DURAN FERREE

Goalkeeper

On Sept. 14, 2022 Ferree made history as the first local product to move through the SD Loyal development pathway, from the Loyal Select program to a professional contract with the first team. Ferree appeared in two matches in 2022, including one start. Catching the eyes of U.S. Soccer, Ferree made his national team debut and started in four matches for the U.S. Under-17 Men's National Team during the 2023 CONCACAF Under-17 Championship. Ferree kept a pair of clean sheets and recorded three saves as the U.S. blanked Barbados 5-0 and Canada 1-0. In the most critical match, Ferree led the U.S. squad to a 5-3 victory over hosts Guatemala to secure a spot in the 2023 FIFA U-17 World Cup in Peru.

TECHNICAL STAFF



LANDON DONAVAN

Executive Vice President, Soccer Operations

Regarded as one of the greatest U.S. soccer players in history, Landon Donovan brings his extensive knowledge of the game to San Diego Loyal's technical staff. During his 19-year professional career, Donovan's accomplishments span both his time domestically and internationally. In total, he played for five professional teams covering three leagues: Bayer 04 Leverkusen and Bayern Munich (Bundesliga); Everton (Premier League); San Jose Earthquakes and LA Galaxy (Major League Soccer). He played in six MLS Cups, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and won two MLS Supporters' Shields. Individually, he was named to an MLS record 14-consecutive MLS All-Star games from 2001-2014, was honored with the Landon Donovan MVP Award in 2009 and won the Golden Boot in 2008, as well as being one of just two players to be named MLS Cup MVP twice. He continues to lead the MLS record books with assists (136), playoff goals (25) and co-leads playoff assists (14). He is second to Chris Wondolowski with most regular-season goals at 145.



NATE MILLER

Head Coach

Nate Miller is in his first season as the SD Loyal Head Coach after serving as the assistant head coach in the previous three seasons under Landon Donovan. Miller brings extensive experience to the club and is a figure that enjoys the camaraderie with his players. Miller's coaching journey started in 2010 when he walked away from a career in finance to follow his coaching passion. His first head coaching role was with Spring Arbor University where in six years at the helm, he helped lead the Cougars to three league championships and the program's highest-ever national ranking (#10). Following three seasons with Lansing United (USL League Two), Miller became the head coach at Lansing Ignite (USL League One). Miller led Lansing United to a second-place finish that included a three-month undefeated run. In Jan. 2020, Miller joined Landon Donovan as the Associate Head Coach of San Diego Loyal. Miller was part of the sixth graduating class to complete the U.S. Soccer Federation (USSF) Pro License, finishing a 12-month journey that began in December 2021. Joining an elite group of fewer than 75 coaches to have completed the highest-level coaching license in the Confederation of North, Central America and Caribbean Association Football (CONCACAF), Miller becomes the first San Diego area coach to earn the prestigious accreditation.
