DUICK HITS

- The Baltimore Ravens kick off their 26th season when they open the 2021 NFL campaign by hosting the New Orleans Saints at M&T Bank Stadium (7 p.m.) in the first week of preseason play.
- In 2020, the Ravens earned their third-straight playoff berth and ninth overall under head coach John Harbaugh – with an 11-5 regular season record. Baltimore advanced to the Divisional Round of the playoffs for the eighth time during Coach Harbaugh's 13 years at the helm.
- In 2020, Baltimore won six-straight games including a 20-13 Wild Card battle at No. 4 Tennessee before falling, 17-3, in the Divisional Round at No. 2 Buffalo to close out the season.
- ✗ The Ravens' 2020 rushing attack finished No. 1 in the NFL (191.9 ypg) and produced the third-most yards (3,071) in a 16-game NFL season. (In 2019, Baltimore set the record with 3,296 rushing yards.) Baltimore had three players − QB Lamar Jackson (1,005), RB J.K. Dobbins (805) & RB Gus Edwards (723) − rush for over 700 yards each, while Jackson became the first QB in NFL history to surpass the 1,000-yard rushing milestone in multiple seasons.
- The Ravens scored the NFL's seventh-most points (29.3) in 2020, with Jackson completing 64.4% of his passes for 2,757 yards, 26 TDs and 9 INTs (99.3 rating), also adding 7 rushing TDs.
- ✗ Baltimore allowed the NFL's second-fewest points (18.9) and seventh-fewest yards (329.8) in 2020. The Ravens produced a league-high 25 FFs, and CB Marlon Humphrey led the NFL with a Ravens' single-season record 8 FFs, also posting a team-high 11 PD.

- X Entering 2021, the Ravens have not dropped a preseason game since 2015, posting an impressive 17-0 record over the past four seasons that were played (2016-19).
- Under head coach John Harbaugh (2008-20), Baltimore has compiled a 37-12 record in the preseason.
- X The Ravens are 64-32 all time in preseason play.
- X The Ravens are 33-15 all time in preseason home games, producing wins in 19 of their last 22 contests in Baltimore.
- X The Ravens are 31-17 all time in preseason road games, winning 15 of their last 20 such contests.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS

RAVENS RUSHING ATTACK

- The Ravens finished 2020 with the NFL's No. 1 rushing attack (191.9 ypg) for the second-straight season. Baltimore's 3,071 rushing yards stand as the third most in a 16-game NFL season. (The Ravens own two of the Top 3 marks.)
- Baltimore has rushed for 100+ yards in 39-straight games, marking the second-longest streak in pro football history.
- In 2020, Baltimore also registered an NFL-best six games with at least 200 rushing yards, including a franchiserecord 404-yard output in Week 17's victory at Cincinnati.
- The Ravens' 24 rushing TDs ranked third in the NFL and set a new single-season franchise record.
- For the second-straight year, Baltimore had three players - QB Lamar Jackson (1,005), RB J.K. Dobbins (805) & RB Gus Edwards (723) – rush for over 700 yards each. The 2020 Ravens joined the 2019 Ravens and 2011 Panthers as the only teams ever with three 700-yard rushers in a season.
- Since QB Lamar Jackson's rookie season (2018), the Ravens have rushed for an NFL-high 8,808 yards (183.5 ypg).

ACTION JACKSON

- ✗ QB Lamar Jackson tallied 26 TD passes and 7 rushing TDs in 2020, joining Deshaun Watson (2018-19) as the only QBs with at least 25 TD passes and 5 rushing TDs in consecutive seasons in NFL history.
- Jackson eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the secondstraight season, becoming the first NFL QB ever with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.
- ✗ Jackson is 30-7 as a regular season starter, becoming the first QB in NFL history to reach 30 wins in his first 37 starts.

ROOKIE DOBBINS RUMBLES

Among NFL rookies, **RB J.K Dobbins** ranked No. 3 in both rushing yards (805) and rushing TDs (9). He led *all* NFL RBs in yards-per-carry average (6.01), while his 9 total TDs set a new Ravens' rookie record. Dobbins recorded a rushing TD in sixconsecutive games to close out 2020.

- **701** Receiving yards on 58 catches by **TE Mark Andrews**, who added 7 receiving TDs, in 2020. Andrews became the first TE in Ravens history to produce multiple seasons (also 2019) with at least 700 receiving yards and at least 7 receiving TDs.
- X Baltimore and New Orleans were the only teams in 2020 to rank in the Top 7 in both scoring offense and scoring defense. The Ravens allowed the league's second-fewest points (18.9) and scored the seventh most (29.3), while the Saints ranked fifth in both categories (21.1 & 30.1).

X Baltimore is the NFL's only team to rank in the Top 7 in both scoring offense and scoring defense the past two seasons (2019-20).



TWO-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in nine (2008-12, 2014 & 2018-20) of his 13 seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. In 2019, Coach Harbaugh became the first Ravens coach ever to win Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year Award.

Here are several more Harbaugh quick hits:

- X Harbaugh owns the most road playoff wins (eight) by a HC in NFL history. Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) are second with seven each.
- Vunder Harbaugh, Baltimore is one of four teams (NE, GB & Sea.) to earn a playoff berth in nine of the past 13 seasons. Baltimore is also one of four teams (KC, Sea. & NO) to make the playoffs in each of the past three seasons (2018-2020).
- X In 2019, the Ravens posted a franchise-best 14-2 record. Baltimore won a team-record 12-straight games to close out the regular season, earning its first-ever No. 1 playoff seed.
- X Coach Harbaugh has led the Ravens to four AFC North Division titles (2011-12, 2018-19).
- X The Ravens' 11 playoff wins since 2008 tie (GB) for the second most in the NFL (New England - 16).
- X Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 & 2012).
- X "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- X Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- X With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.



- For three seasons as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale has led the Ravens' defense to incredible success. In 2018, Martindale was recognized by SI/MMQB as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the AP NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award, guiding Baltimore's unit to a No. 1 ranking (292.2 ypg allowed).
- In 2020, Baltimore allowed the NFL's second-fewest points (18.9 ppg) and produced the No. 2 third-down defense (34.0%), while also registering a league-high 22 FFs on defense.

- During the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008) when rushing for at least 125 yards, the Ravens have produced a 77-18 record. Baltimore is 53-11 when rushing for at least 150 yards and 28-3 when tallying at least 200 yards, under Coach Harbaugh.
- Eight of the Ravens' all-time Top 13 rushing outputs have occurred since 2018, when QB Lamar Jackson became the starter: 404 at Cin. in 2020 (1st), 296 at Cle. in 2018 (4th), 294 vs. Dal. in 2020 (5th), 285 at LAR in 2019 (7th), 269 vs. Cin. in 2019 (9th), 267 vs. Cin. in 2018 (10th), 265 vs. Pit. in 2020 (11th) & 265 at Mia. in 2019 (11th).

A RICH HISTORY OF SPECIAL TEAMS

Following the retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the special teams coach in 2019. Horton, who served as Rosburg's assistant for three seasons (2016-18), leads the standout special teams battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned 12 combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013, 2016 & 2019-20), LS Morgan Cox (2015, 2016 & 2019-20) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Four-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (291) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.7% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (291-of-321 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' RETURN MEN SOAR

 Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: WR Michael Campanaro, WR Kaelin Clay, WR Tandon Doss, CB Cyrus Jones, WR Jacoby Jones and DB Lardarius Webb.

DUVERNAY CONTINUES ROOKIE KOR-TO TREND

• In Week 3 of 2020 vs. KC, rookie WR Devin Duvernay produced a 93-yard KOR-TD. It marked the NFL's first KOR-TD of 2020 and was the Ravens' sixth KOR-TD since 2011, tied with KC for the NFL's second most. Only the Vikings (7) have produced more KOR-TDs dating back to 2011. Duvernay became the fifth rookie in Ravens history to return a kickoff for a TD: Patrick Johnson (1998), Yamon Figurs (2007), Lardarius Webb (2009) and David Reed (2010).



Baltimore has drafted three players (Ogden, Lewis & Reed) who were selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. For Ogden & Lewis, it was the first time ever two players were drafted in the same round (1st in 1996) by a team and reached the HOF in their initial year of eligibility.

Eric DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019. Prior to being named EVP/GM - succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome - DeCosta, 50, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore, which has always aligned perfectly with what he envisioned to be his dream job.

CAREER NOTES

- X Baltimore is 30-7 with Jackson as its regular season starter. Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 30 wins are the most among all NFL starting QBs, and he is also the fastest QB in league history to reach 30 regular season victories.
- X In 2020, Jackson (1,005) became the first QB in NFL history to surpass the 1,000-yard rushing milestone in multiple seasons, also doing so in 2019 (1,206).
- X Jackson tallied 26 TD passes and 7 rushing TDs in 2020, joining Deshaun Watson (2018-19) as the only QBs with at least 25 TD passes and 5 rushing TDs in consecutive seasons in NFL history.
- X Jackson is the fastest QB in league history (35 games) to reach 5,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards. He's also the first player in NFL history to reach 5,000 passing yards and 2,500 rushing yards in the first three seasons of a career.

- X Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season (2019). (He had 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing yards in 2019.)
- X In 2019, Jackson (36/7) became the third QB in NFL history with at least 35 passing TDs & 7 rushing TDs. Steve Young (1994), Cam Newton (2015) and Josh Allen (2020) have also done this.

- X Jackson owns the NFL single-season record for most 100yard rushing games (5 in 2019) by a quarterback.
- X In 2019's Week 6 victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- X In the 2019 Divisional Playoff vs. Tennessee, Jackson became the first player in NFL history with at least 350 passing yards (365) and 100 rushing yards (143) in any game.




- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38-of-39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the then-fifth-best pct. (97.4) in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012 & Brandon McManus, 2020) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker (12 have now done it) in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

- In Week 4 of 2020 at Washington, P Sam Koch completed a 15-yard pass to WR Miles Boykin on a fourth-and-9 fake punt. Among players with at least 5 career passes, Koch holds the NFL record with a 100% completion rate, going 7-of-7 for 82 yards and a 115.5 rating.
- In 2020, Koch was the NFL's only punter to place at least 20 punts inside in the 20-yard line (22) and have no more than 1 TB.

P Sam Koch owns a 45.3 career gross average and 39.7 career net, both marks that rank first in Ravens history. In 2014, he posted a career-high and team-record 47.4-vard gross (matched again in 2018) and 43.3-yard net average.

He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a 'boomerang' punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."
