QUICK HITS

✗ The Baltimore Ravens (1-0) host the Miami Dolphins (1-0) in a 2022 Charm City opener from M&T Bank Stadium this Sunday (1 p.m. kickoff). The Ravens have won six straight home openers and are 13-1 in such contests during the **John Harbaugh Era** (since 2008). In the month of September with Harbaugh at the helm, Baltimore is 20-4 at M&T Bank Stadium, producing the NFL's best such home winning percentage (.833) during this time.

✗ Kicking off Week 1 with a 24-9 victory at the NY Jets, **QB Lamar Jackson** threw 3 TDs, including a 55-yard strike to **WR Rashod Bateman** and 2 scores (25 & 17 yards) to **WR Devin Duvernay**. Jackson was 17-of-30 for 213 yards, earning his 38th regular season win, tying (Tom Brady & Danny White) for the third most in the first 50 starts of an NFL QB's career. Baltimore's defense was stout against New York, limiting the Jets to 2-of-14 on third down, notching 3 sacks and 11 QB hits of QB Joe Flacco, and forcing 2 turnovers (INT by **S Marcus Williams** & FR by **CB Marlon Humphrey**).

✗ Baltimore leads the all-time regular season series vs. Miami, 8-7, including a 7-2 mark under Coach Harbaugh. The Ravens are 4-1 vs. the Dolphins in Charm City, winning four straight matchups.

✗ For the first time in franchise history, Baltimore opens the season playing its first four games vs. one division – the AFC East. Following last Sunday's win at NYJ and this week's tilt vs. Miami, the Ravens travel to New England (Week 3) and then host Buffalo (Week 4).

✗ Coach Harbaugh, who is in his 15th season in Baltimore, is the NFL's third-longest tenured head coach, behind only Bill Belichick (23 seasons) and Mike Tomlin (16). Harbaugh has led the Ravens to 149 total wins since his 2008 arrival, ranking as the league's fifth most. (He has compiled an impressive 149-96 overall record.)

COACH HARBS SAYS

ON TEAM LEADERSHIP AND NAMING WEEKLY GAME CAPTAINS:

"We feel like we have leadership throughout the roster, especially with our veteran players, and we feel like we want to honor that and recognize that, that we're a team, and that we have a team of leaders. Every person out there on that field is a captain in their own right. Certainly, there are levels to that. You have veteran guys who are our veteran leaders, but we also have some younger leaders who have an opportunity to walk out there and to lead the team into a game, which is a really big deal."

INJURY UPDATE

Standout **RB J.K. Dobbins** (knee), rookie **DT Travis Jones** (knee) and All-Pros **CB Marcus Peters** (knee) and **LT Ronnie Stanley** (ankle) were inactive in Week 1 at NYJ. **CB Kyle Fuller** (knee) and **LT Ja'Wuan James** (Achilles) were injured vs. the Jets and will miss the remainder of the season. ... Starter **OLB Tyus Bowser** (Achilles) and standout **RB Gus Edwards** (knee) are on the Reserve/PUP list. ... Rookie second-rounder **OLB David Ojabo** (Reserve/NFL) continues to rehab an Achilles injury sustained during his March Pro Day.

✗ Lamar Jackson has posted a 38-12 record through his first 50 regular season starts, tying Tom Brady and Danny White for the third-most wins by a NFL QB in his first 50 starts all time.

✗ Jackson has produced 106 TDs (86 passing & 20 rushing) in his 50 career starts, ranking as the sixth most by a QB in the first 50 starts of a career (since 1970 merger).



NUMBERS TO NOTE

1 – 100-yard rushing game needed by **QB Lamar Jackson** to set the NFL's all-time regular season record by a QB, which he currently shares with Michael Vick (10).

10 – Consecutive games **TE Mark Andrews** has posted at least 50 receiving yards, marking the NFL's longest active streak among TEs. Since the 1970 merger, he is the sixth TE with at least 50 yards in 10 straight games, joining Rob Gronkowski, Travis Kelce, George Kittle, Greg Olsen and Delanie Walker.

11 – QB hits by the Ravens' defense in the Week 1 win at NYJ. Baltimore also allowed just 9 points and held the Jets to 2-of-14 on third down in **Mike Macdonald's** "D" coordinator debut.

58 – Consecutive FGs made in the fourth quarter/OT by **K Justin Tucker**, marking the NFL's longest active streak. Tucker (91.1%) is the most accurate kicker in NFL history.

82-31 – The Ravens' record at home under **John Harbaugh** (since his 2008 arrival), ranking as the NFL's third-best winning percentage (.726). Baltimore is an NFL-best 20-4 in September home games under "Harbs."

94.5 – Career sacks for **DE Calais Campbell**, including 1 in Week 1's win at NYJ. In his 15th season, Campbell (214) is the NFL's only active defender who's played in at least 200 games.

181-78 – How Baltimore has outscored opponents in the last six home openers at M&T Bank Stadium, all of which have yielded Ravens' victories.

250 – Total victories (regular season + postseason) for the Ravens franchise, making it one of seven teams in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 450 games played (445).

John Harbaugh

• Harbaugh (149 total victories) is one win shy of reaching 150 total victories (including playoffs) in his career.

TE Mark Andrews

• Andrews (29) needs 1 receiving TD to pass WR Derrick Mason (29) for third most in team history. With 2 receiving TDs, he will pass WR Torrey Smith (30) for second most.

• Andrews is 1 receiving TD shy of 30 for his career. With 30, he would join Mike Ditka (32), Antonio Gates (43), Tony Gonzalez (30), Jimmy Graham (51), Rob Gronkowski (54) and Kellen Winslow Sr. (35) as one of seven TEs in NFL history to reach that mark in the first five seasons of a career.

• Andrews needs 74 receiving yards to reach 3,592 for his career and surpass WR Torrey Smith (3,591) for third place on the Ravens' all-time career chart.

• Andrews needs at least 50 receiving yards in Week 2 to surpass WR Mike Wallace (10, W5-W16 of 2016) for the most consecutive games reaching that threshold in Ravens franchise history.

WR Rashod Bateman

• Bateman (48) needs 2 catches in Week 2 to become the fastest player in Ravens history to reach 50 career receptions (14 games).

QB Lamar Jackson

• Jackson needs one more outing with 100 rushing yards to set the NFL regular season record for most 100-yard rushing performances by a QB (currently tied w/ Mike Vick – 10).

TWO-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in nine (2008-12, 2014 & 2018-20) of his 14 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. In 2019, Coach Harbaugh became the first Ravens coach ever to win Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year Award.

Here are several more Harbaugh quick hits:

- ✗ Harbaugh owns the most road playoff wins (eight) by a HC in NFL history. Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) are second with seven each.
- ✗ Under Harbaugh, Baltimore is one of six teams (NE, GB, KC, Pit. & Sea.) to earn a playoff berth in at least nine of the past 14 full seasons. Baltimore is also one of 10 teams (KC, Buf., GB, LAR, NE, NO, Phi. Sea. & Ten.) to make the playoffs in at least three of the past four seasons (2018-21).
- ✗ In 2019, the Ravens posted a franchise-best 14-2 record. Baltimore won a team-record 12 straight games to close out the regular season, earning its first-ever No. 1 playoff seed.
- ✗ Coach Harbaugh has led the Ravens to four AFC North Division titles (2011-12, 2018-19).
- ✗ The Ravens' 11 playoff wins since 2008 tie (GB) for the second most in the NFL (New England - 16).
- ✗ Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 & 2012).
- ✗ "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- ✗ John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- ✗ Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- ✗ In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

- Macdonald's unit produced the nation's eighth-ranked scoring defense (17.4 ppg), also finishing 20th in yards allowed per game (330.9) and 11th in red zone touchdown efficiency (45.7%).
- Macdonald played an instrumental role in the 2021 standout performance of Wolverines' DE Aidan Hutchinson, who earned first-team All-American honors and was a Heisman Trophy finalist after producing a career-high and single-season school record 14 sacks.
- Additionally, Macdonald guided Ravens' 2022 second-round draft pick OLB David Ojabo, whose 11 sacks tied for fourth most in single-season school history, while his 5 FFs set a single-season Michigan record.

From 2018-20, Macdonald led a Ravens' linebackers corps that helped Baltimore produce the NFL's No. 1 overall defense (307.8 ypg) during that span, while also permitting the league's fewest points per game (18.2).

A RICH HISTORY OF SPECIAL TEAMS

Following the retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the special teams coach in 2019. Horton, who served as Rosburg's assistant for three seasons (2016-18), leads the standout special teams battery.

SEVEN PRO BOWL SPECIALISTS

• Seven Ravens have earned 14 combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Devin Duvernay (2021), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013, 2016 & 2019-21), LS Morgan Cox (2015, 2016 & 2019-20) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Five-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (327) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 91.1% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (327-of-359 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, now-retired P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross avg. ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net avg. was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' RETURN MEN SOAR

• Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: WR Michael Campanaro, WR Kaelin Clay, WR Tandon Doss, CB Cyrus Jones, WR Jacoby Jones and DB Lardarius Webb.

DUVERNAY CONTINUES ROOKIE KOR-TD TREND

• In Week 3 of 2020 vs. KC, then-rookie WR Devin Duvernay produced a 93-yard KOR-TD. It marked the NFL's first KOR-TD of 2020 and was the Ravens' sixth KOR-TD since 2011, tied with KC for the NFL's second most. Only the Vikings (9) have produced more KOR-TDs dating back to 2011. Duvernay became the fifth rookie in Ravens history to return a kickoff for a TD, joining Patrick Johnson (1998), Yamon Figurs (2007), Lardarius Webb (2009) and David Reed (2010).



Baltimore has drafted three players (Ogden, Lewis & Reed) who were selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. For Ogden & Lewis, it was the first time ever two players were drafted in the same round (1st in 1996) by a team and reached the HOF in their initial year of eligibility.

Eric DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019. Prior to being named EVP/GM – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 50, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore, which has always aligned perfectly with what he envisioned to be his dream job.

- ✖ Baltimore is 38-12 with Jackson as its regular season starter. Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), his 38 wins tie (Josh Allen) for the fourth most among all NFL QBs. Jackson is also the first QB in NFL history to reach 35 regular season wins before the age of 25.
- ✖ Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to record multiple career games with at least 3 TD passes and 100 rushing yards (Week 9 of 2021 vs. Min. & at Cle. in 2019).
- ✖ In 2021, Jackson recorded at least 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards in seven games, tying Randall Cunningham (1990) and his own 2019 campaign for the most such performances in NFL single-season history.
- ✖ In 2020, Jackson (1,005) became the first QB in NFL history to surpass the 1,000-yard rushing milestone in multiple seasons, also doing so in 2019 (1,206).

2019 UNANIMOUS MVP

✖ In 2019, Jackson became the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season. (He had 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing.)

✖ Jackson was responsible for an NFL-best 43 total TDs (36 passing & 7 rushing) in 2019. His 36 TD passes led the NFL and are the most in franchise single-season history.

✖ Jackson rushed for 1,206 yards in 2019, marking the most by a quarterback in NFL single-season history.

✖ Jackson produced the NFL single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (5 in 2019) by a quarterback.

✖ Jackson (36/7) also became the third QB in NFL history with at least 35 passing TDs & 7 rushing TDs. Steve Young (1994), Cam Newton (2015) and Josh Allen (2020) have also accomplished this feat.

✖ In his final eight games of 2019 (he sat out Week 17), Jackson threw 25 TDs and 1 INT, completing 69.4% of his passes for 1,477 yards and a 130.3 rating. He tallied 630 rushing yards & 4 rush TDs.

✖ Jackson threw at least 4 TDs in an NFL-best four games in 2019. He also threw at least 3 TDs in an NFL-best eight games.

✖ In 2019's Week 15 win vs. NYJ, Jackson rushed for at least 85 yards while throwing for 5 TDs for the second time in his career. (He also did this on 11/25/19 at LAR.) Cam Newton is the only other player in NFL history to accomplish the 85 rushing yards/5 passing TDs feat in a game, doing so in 2015.

✖ Jackson posted two perfect passer ratings in 2019 (at Cin. & Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the 158.3 mark twice in a season.

✖ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou.) and 12 (at LAR) of 2019, Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 rush yards in back-to-back games.

✖ In 2019's Week 6 victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)

✖ In the 2019 Divisional Playoff vs. Tennessee, Jackson became the first player in NFL history with at least 350 passing yards (365) and 100 rushing yards (143) in any game.



ANDREWS' MONSTER 2021 SEASON

En route to his second-career Pro Bowl nod, in 2021, Andrews:

- Played in all 17 games (nine starts), totaling single-season franchise records in both receptions (107) and receiving yards (1,361), while also producing 9 TDs.
- Led NFL tight ends in all major receiving categories, including yards (1,361), receptions (107), TDs (9 – tied), first downs (75), 20-plus-yard catches (20) and contested catches (18).






