2022 CAMP PREVIEW

Houston Texans Training Camp presented by Xfinity will begin on Friday, July 29, as the Texans take the field in preparation for the 2022 Season. Eight training camp practices will be free and open to fans: Friday, July 29; Saturday, July 30; Tuesday, August 2; Wednesday, August 3; Friday, August 5; Saturday, August 6; Tuesday, August 9 and Wednesday, August 10. All practices will begin at approximately 8 a.m. CT.

Following the 2021 season, the Texans named **Lovie Smith** as the fifth head coach in franchise history. Smith enters his second season with the Texans after serving as the team's associate head coach/defensive coordinator during the 2021 season.

After the hiring of Smith, GM Nick Caserio and the Texans front office focused on the 2022 NFL Draft and selected nine players, four of which were in the top two rounds, DB **Derek Stingley Jr.**, OL **Kenyon Green**, DB **Jalen Pitre** and WR **John Metchie III**. With the choice of Green in the first round (15th overall), the team made him the fourth player drafted from Texas A&M in franchise history. Pitre is from Stafford, Texas, and went to Baylor while sixth-round pick OL **Austin Deculus** attended Cy-Fair High School in Cypress, Texas.

The offense is highlighted by second-year QB **Davis Mills**. Last season, Mills made 11 starts and finished the year with 2,664 passing yards, a Texans rookie record, after completing 263-of-394 attempts (66.8 pct.) for 16 touchdowns, 10 interceptions and a 88.8 passer rating. Veteran WR **Brandin Cooks**, who signed an extension in the offseason, recorded a career-high 90 receptions for 1,037 yards (11.5 avg.) and six touchdowns. He posted his sixth career season with 1,000-plus receiving yards, tied for second-most in the NFL since entering the league in 2014, becoming the third player in Texans history to reach the mark in consecutive seasons. The Texans have three offensive linemen who have started 70+ games in their careers: **Justin Britt** (97), **A.J. Cann** (94) and **Laremy Tunsil** (77) to go along with Tytus Howard (37).

On the defensive side of the ball, Houston added veterans DL **Rasheem Green** and DL **Jerry Hughes** to their defensive line to compliment third-year DL **Jonathan Greenard**, posted a team-high 8.0 sacks. LB **Kamu-Grugier Hill** led the team with 106 tackles, including a career-high 13 tackles for loss which ranked second in the NFL among inside linebackers in 2021. The Texans also added DB **Steven Nelson** to the secondary, who started 62 games and posted eight interceptions over the last four seasons while playing for the Chiefs, Steelers and Eagles.

TRAINING CAMP MEDIA POLICY

In accordance with the NFL guidelines for media access to training camp, the Houston Texans have implemented the below rules and regulations to accommodate media access. The Texans PR staff will communicate the schedule for practices and media availabilities via email. If you have any questions about the policy outlined below, please contact **Omar Majzoub** at omar.majzoub@houstontexans.com.

INTERVIEWS / AVAILABILITY:

- Head Coach Lovie Smith and Texans players will be made available at the podium following each practice.
- The Texans Communications Staff will work with the media to determine which players will be made available following each practice and send each day's availability schedule via email.
- All interview requests for Houston Texans, executives, coaches and players should go through the Texans communications department. Members of the Texans organization, including players, should not be contacted directly for interview requests.
- Please contact **Evert Geerlings** at evert.geerlings@houstontexans.com at least 24 hours prior to practice for any 1-on-1 interview requests. Players who did not participate in practice will not be available for interviews.

ACCESS TO NRG PARK:

- The Texans Communications Staff will notify approved media of scheduled practice days and times.
- Media will park in the Teal Lot on Murworth Dr. There is no parking pass required. Approved media will be on a security list.
- Media are required to wear a wristband during practice. Please check in with the Texans Communications staff every morning to receive your wristband.
- After practice, media will have access to the Press Box at NRG Stadium with available bathrooms and WiFi internet. Bathrooms will also be available during practice.

REPORTING / SOCIAL MEDIA:

- Media are permitted to shoot video and still photography of practice during designated shooting portions, which will be announced by a member of the Texans communications staff.
- Tweeting is also permitted during the designated shooting portions of practice but all media must follow the reporting / social media rules set forth by the team, which are outlined below.
- Broadcasting live, including social media (Facebook Live, Instagram Live, etc.), is not permitted during practice.
- Media members may only report on what is being viewed on the designated practice fields.
- A member of the Texans communications staff will be in the designated media areas to help answer questions.

POOL SERVICES:

- The Texans will provide pool video and press conference footage within a reasonable timeframe.
- Contact **Tim Wiemann** at tim.wiemann@houstontexans.com to be added to the FTP/Dropbox distribution list. Requests for specific videos or photos should be made by 5 p.m. on the evening prior to the day of the request.

TOPICS TO AVOID:

- Potential severity of an injury until it's addressed by Head Coach Lovie Smith.
- Game strategy – formations, plays, substitution packages, game plan, etc.
- Which players are practicing with individual units (first-team, second-team, goal line, nickel, etc.).
- Conversations that take place on field between players, coaches and/or staff.
- Players who line up in positions different from the one listed on the current roster.





2022 DRAFT CLASS

The Texans entered the 2022 NFL Draft in Las Vegas with two first-round picks and 11 overall picks. This was only the second time in franchise history that the team had two picks in the first round (2004). DB **Derek Stingley Jr.** was chosen with the No. 3 pick in the draft after recording 73 tackles, seven tackles for loss and six interceptions in just three seasons at LSU. After trading the 13th overall pick to the Philadelphia Eagles for the 15th overall pick, the Texans acquired OL **Kenyon Green** from Texas A&M.



DB Derek Stingley, Jr. (Round 1, Pick 3 - LSU)

Started all 25 games he appeared in at LSU, registering six interceptions his true freshman season during the team's 2019 College Football Playoff Championship run. Teammates with OL Austin Deculus at LSU.

OL Kenyon Green (Round 1, Pick 15 - Texas A&M)

Started 35 consecutive games over the course of three seasons (2019-21) at Texas A&M, playing snaps at all five offensive line spots. Selected as the Texas A&M's Offensive MVP of the 2021 season.

DB Jalen Pitre (Round 2, Pick 37 - Baylor)

Named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year in 2022 after grabbing two interceptions and posting a career-high in tackles (76), passes defended (9) and forced fumbles (3).

WR John Metchie III (Round 2, Pick 44 - Alabama)

Totaled 96 receptions with 1,142 yards and eight touchdowns prior to suffering a season-ending knee injury in the SEC Championship Game vs. Georgia. Teammates with LB Christian Harris at Alabama.

LB Christian Harris (Round 3, Pick 75 - Alabama)

In addition to being named a Butkus and Lombardi semifinalist during his final year at Alabama, Harris appeared in 41 career games, totaling 221 tackles (126 solo), 27 tackles for loss, 10.0 sacks and three forced fumbles. Teammates with WR John Metchie III at Alabama.

RB Dameon Pierce (Round 4, Pick 107 - Florida)

Played in 50 games at Florida, rushing the ball 329 times for 1,806 yards (5.5 avg.) and 23 touchdowns, 16 of which came during his senior season. Ran for a touchdown in the 2020 SEC Championship vs. Alabama.



DL Thomas Booker IV (Round 5, Pick 150 - Stanford)

During his career at Stanford, Booker was named a finalist for the 2021 William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes the best football scholar-athlete in the nation, started 27 games, recorded 158 tackles, 20.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 sacks.

TE Teagan Qutoriano (Round 5, Pick 170 - Oregon State)

Teagan (Kwi-tore-ee-on-o) played four seasons at Oregon State, hauling in 40 receptions for 512 yards and six touchdowns. Was named an All-Pac-12 honorable mention as a senior in 2021.

OL Austin Deculus (Round 6, Pick 250 - LSU)

Started 13 games on LSU's national championship team in 2019, playing with DB Derek Stingley, Jr. Was a four-year starter at right tackles for LSU with 61 appearances (46 starts), ranking first in program history.

OL Myron Cunningham (Arkansas)

Started in 10-plus games his last three seasons at Arkansas and returned for a final season in 2021, starting all 13 games at left tackle and serving as a team captain for the Razorbacks.

DL Damion Daniels (Nebraska)

Played in 43 games at Nebraska, starting the team's first 11 games during the 2021 season, posting a career-high 33 tackles and two tackles for loss. Daniels earned an All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media last year.

WR Drew Estrada (Baylor)

Prior to playing at Baylor during the 2021 college football season, Estrada spent four years at Dartmouth, leaving the school ranked 14th in all-purpose yards with 2,392. Started five of this 12 games played at Baylor, finishing third on the team in receiving yards (367) and fourth in catches (30).

DB Jacobi Francis (Memphis)

Played in a total of 61 games at Memphis and was one of six Tigers to start all 12 games during the 2021 season. Francis posted a total of 129 tackles, six interceptions and 35 passes defended while at Memphis.

TE Seth Green (Houston)

Appeared in 12 games at Houston during the 2021 season, setting new career-highs with 13 receptions and 157 receiving yards. Prior to playing at Houston, Green played three seasons at Minnesota and was utilized as a wildcat quarterback and receiver.

DL Troy Hairston (Central Michigan)

Led Central Michigan in tackles for loss (17) and sacks (9.0) during the 2021 season. His tackles for loss ranked 13th nationally. Hairston was named the Co-MAC Defensive Player of the Year for his efforts during the 2020 season.

LB Jake Hansen (Illinois)

Name a three-time team captain while at Illinois, owning 12 career forced fumbles, which are the second-most in program history and the sixth-most in Big Ten history. He finished his career with 276 tackles, 28.5 tackles for loss, seven forced fumbles and three interceptions.

DL Kurt Hinish (Notre Dame)

Played in 61 games at Notre Dame, earning 35 starts along the defensive line. Hinish finished his career tallying 81 tackles, 20 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks and one force fumble.

WR Johnny Johnson III (Oregon)

Played five seasons at Oregon, finishing with the 10th-most receptions in school history with 139. Also recorded 1,928 receiving yards, which was just 121 yards shy of top 10 in school history.

DB Tristin McCollum (Sam Houston State)

Played in 57 games while at Sam Houston State, picking off three passes and registering 20 passes defended. A 2021 All-WAC Second Team selection, McCollum posted career highs in tackles (52) and passes defended (6).


DL Adedayo Odeleye (NFL International Pathway Program)





NOW WE'RE COOKIN'

WR **Brandin Cooks** finished the 2021 season with a career-high 90 receptions for 1,037 yards (11.5 avg.) and six touchdowns. Cooks reached 1,000 yards receiving for the sixth time since joining the NFL in 2014, tied for the second-most such seasons in the league during that span. He joins **Brandon Marshall** as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four separate teams, doing so with New Orleans, New England, the L.A. Rams and Houston.

Cooks joined **Andre Johnson** (2008-10, 2012-13) and **DeAndre Hopkins** (2014-15, 2017-19) as the only Texans to record consecutive seasons with 1,000 receiving yards.

Cooks has averaged 13.82 yards per reception since entering the league in 2014, fourth-highest in the NFL during that span (min. 500 receptions). He is one of six NFL players to average 10.0 yards per reception in every season since 2014 (min. 40 receptions per season) and ranks fifth in the NFL with 77 receptions of 25-plus yards during that span, including 12 in 2020 and seven in 2021.

KING II

In his first season with the Texans, DB **Desmond King II** recorded 86 total tackles (62 solo), three interceptions, six passes defensed, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble.

Before joining the Texans, King II played a majority of his first four seasons with the Los Angeles Chargers. In his first two seasons there, King II started in 34 consecutive games (including two playoff appearances) and amassed 132 total tackles, four interceptions, two pick-sixes, eight quarterback hits and 4.0 sacks. He became only the ninth player in NFL history to ever post multiple pick-sixes and at least 4.0 sacks over the first two seasons on his career. The only other DB to accomplish this feat was Roy Williams (2002-2003).



DB **Tremont Smith** was named the AFC Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance in the team's 30-16 win over the Jacksonville Jaguars in Week 15 of the 2021 season, marking the first Player of the Week award of his NFL career and the team's first Special Teams award since Week 15 of the 2019 campaign.

Smith finished with 121 kickoff return yards, one touchdown, one special teams tackle and one tackle on defense, while also downing one punt inside the 5-yard line. He took back his first return of the day 98 yards to the end zone to give his club a 14-3 first-quarter lead over the Jaguars. The 98-yard touchdown return marked a new career long and was also the first score of his four-year career. Smith was the only player in Week 15 to return a kick for a touchdown and first Texans player to do so since the 2009 season.

K **Ka'imi Fairbairn** hasn't missed a field goal attempt from inside of 40 yards since 2017, connecting on 60 consecutive kicks from 0-39 yards during that span.

The UCLA product owns 18 career games with three-or-more made field goals, which is the second-most in team history behind only **Kris Brown** (19 games).

Fairbairn ranked fourth in the NFL in total points scored from 2018-20 (368) and third in field goals made (84). He owns 18 games with 10-or-more points scored, which is the third-most in franchise history.

Fairbairn became the first player in Texans history with at least 90 points in four consecutive seasons (2017-20) and joined Brown (2007-09) as the only players in franchise history to record at least 100 points scored in three consecutive seasons (2018-20). He is second in Texans history in career field goals made with 119 and second in points (518).

LONG RANGE LEADER

In Week 14 of 2021, K **Ka'imi Fairbairn** connected on a 61-yard field goal, a career-long and franchise-long. Fairbairn also reached 500 career points, joining **Kris Brown** (767 points) as the only players to score 500-plus points as a Texan and the 49th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to reach 500 points in 74 career games or less.

Fairbairn hit a 53-yard field goal in Week 7 of the 2021 season at Arizona to move past Brown for the most 50-plus yard field goals in Texans history. Fairbairn needed just over half as many games as Brown to set the record.

Since the 2000 season, only five NFL players have kicked more 50-plus yard field goals in their first 77 career games than Fairbairn.
