CRUCIAL CATCH

The New York Jets and Atlantic Health System are continuing their fight against pediatric cancer as part of the NFL and American Cancer Society's "Crucial Catch: Intercept Cancer" campaign. Prior to kickoff at 8:20 p.m. for our game on October 1, four children who are undergoing or have completed treatment at the Valerie Center at Goryeb Children's Hospital, part of Atlantic Health System, will be recognized as virtual honorary captains. Jets defensive back and captain, Matthias Farley, surprised Andrew Carasquillo, Eli Diringer, Sammy Kyzer and Aidan O'Neil with this honor during a virtual visit on September 25. Next season the Jets will also host Andrew, Eli, Sammy and Aidan in person as honorary captains for a game at MetLife Stadium. The NFL's Crucial Catch mission is to fight cancer through early detection and risk reduction. The league, its clubs, players, the NFL Player Association, and the American Cancer Society are committed to providing individuals with the tools they need to help them better understand early detection and ways to reduce their cancer risk. Each year, every NFL team raises awareness during their Crucial Catch game, which features on-field and in-stadium Crucial Catch elements. Crucial Catch games also present a special opportunity to honor cancer survivors and those currently battling cancer.

Since its establishment in 2009, the NFL's Crucial Catch campaign has raised over \$22 million for the American Cancer Society. Money raised supports the American Cancer Society's Community Health Advocates implementing Nationwide Grants for Empowerment and Equity (CHANGE) program. CHANGE promotes health equity and addresses early detection disparities through community-based prevention programs that increase access to cancer screenings. Today, healthcare centers in all 32 NFL club markets receive CHANGE grants to provide outreach and education, and increased access to cancer screenings and to potentially life-saving resources.

BRAXTON BERRIOS: Over the last two weeks, wide receiver **Braxton Berrios**, a waiver claim at the start of the 2019 season, has produced 10 receptions for 123 yards and two touchdowns, surpassing his previous career totals. For **Berrios**, he leads the team in all three categories and ranks ties for fifth among all NFL receivers for receiving touchdowns in the last two weeks.

TARELL BASHAM: Last season (2019), linebacker **Tarell Basham** tied for third on the team in passes defensed (according to Radar360), the first passes defensed of his three-year career. **Basham** joined just four other Jets linebackers that finished the season in the top three on the team in passes defensed since 2000.

BRAXTON BERRIOS: Wide receiver/punt returner **Braxton Berrios**, a waiver claim at final cutdowns by the Jets last season (2019), appeared in his first 16 career games after missing his rookie year with injury. **Berrios** finished with an 11.4 punt return average, the second best among all qualified punt returners, marking the second consecutive season a Jet has finished in the top two in punt return average after Andre Roberts did so in his 2018 Pro Bowl season.

JAMISON CROWDER: Last season (2019), his first with the Jets, wide receiver **Jamison Crowder** finished sixth among all AFC wide receivers with a single-season best 78 receptions, and was one of just 17 wide receivers with 75+ catches this season. **Crowder** added 833 yards (14 shy of his season high) and a team-leading six touchdowns (one shy of his season high).

After recording 7.0 in 2018, **Jenkins** became one of just eight players in franchise history with 7.0+ sacks in consecutive years, and the first since Calvin Pace did so in 2008-09.





BY THE NUMBERS

Since entering the league in 2017, safety **Marcus Maye** has registered three interceptions in the red zone, tied for the most in the NFL, while his seven passes defensed in the red zone are tied for the fourth most in the league.

Since the start of 2019, the Jets defense has held running backs to 3.3 yards per carry, the lowest average in the league.

Tight end **Ryan Griffin** recorded five touchdown catches in 2019, one of just eight tight ends in franchise history to record at least five receiving touchdowns in a season.

The Jets have allowed only six sacks through the first three weeks of the 2020 season, a seven sack improvement from the 13 sacks allowed in the first three weeks of the 2019 season.

Jets defensive backs have combined for seven tackles for loss through the first two weeks of the season, the most among defensive back units in the NFL (according to Radar360).

The Jets defense, led by Defensive Coordinator **Gregg Williams**, finished the 2019 season seventh in total defense •
Williams' defenses have finished in the top 10 eight times in his 21 seasons as a head coach or defensive coordinator.

With 3.0 sacks by defensive backs in Week One at BUF [9/13] [2.0 by **Marcus Maye** and 1.0 by **Brian Poole**], the Jets lead the NFL with 9.5 sacks by defensive backs since the start of the 2019 season.

The Jets defense registered 11 quarterback hits in Week Two vs. SF (9/20), only the 15th time since 2006 that the team registered 11+ QBHs in a game.

Wide receiver **Braxton Berrios** finished with an 11.4 punt return average in 2019, the second-best average among all qualified punt returners, and the second consecutive season a Jet has finished in the top two in punt return average.

Wide Receiver **Chris Hogan** led the team with 75 receiving yards on six catches (12.5 avg.) vs. SF [9/20]. His 12.5 yards per catch was his highest average since Week Two of 2017 (min. five receptions).

Linebacker **Frankie Luvu** led the team with a career high 14 special teams tackles (according to coaches' stats) in 2019.

The Jets defense has posted 15 tackles for loss through Week Three, the sixth most in the league.

Since 2018, wide receiver **Breshad Perriman** has averaged 17.8 yards per catch, tied for the third best average in the league among all receivers with at least 50 receptions.

Linebacker **Jordan Jenkins** notched his first sack of the season against SF (9/20). He now owns 21.5 sacks since entering the league in 2016, the eighth most among AFC linebackers over that span.

Safety **Marcus Maye** has led or tied the team lead in tackles in two of three games this season, totaling 25 tackles on the season, which is third among defensive backs in the NFL.

In Week One at BUF (9/13), the defense didn't allow a single play of 30 yards or more, one of just eight teams on Kickoff Weekend to do so.

Kicker **Sam Ficken** has converted on all three of his field goal attempts this season, including a 41-yarder in Week Two vs. SF [9/20]. **Ficken** has made 11 field goals of 40+ yards since joining the Jets in 2019, tied for the 11th most in the NFL over that span.

Safety **Bradley McDougald** has now recorded 41 passes defensed since 2014, the fifth most among active NFL safeties over that span.

Rookie punter **Braden Mann** logged a 58-yard punt on the first play of his NFL career, which is the ninth-longest punt in league history among players in their first career game and the longest punt by a Jet in their first career game since 2000 (according to Radar 360).

Wide receiver **Jamison Crowder** registered a 69-yard touchdown reception Week One at BUF (9/13), his longest touchdown reception as a Jet and the second longest of his career.

Wide receiver **Braxton Berrios** leads the team in receptions (10), receiving yards (123) and receiving touchdowns (two), scoring touchdowns in consecutive weeks vs. SF (9/20) and at IND (9/27).

Running back **Frank Gore** has now appeared in the 229 career games since entering the league in 2005, the third most in NFL history among running backs, behind a pair of fullbacks and former Jets, Lorenzo Neal [239] and Tony Richardson [234].

Cornerback **Brian Poole** has registered 270 tackles since entering the league in 2016, the second most in the NFL among cornerbacks (according to Radar360).

Through his first 20 career games, tight end **Chris Herndon** has totaled 572 receiving yards, the second most in Jets history among tight ends through their first 20 games.

CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, an owner of the New York Jets since 2000, enters his fourth season as chairman & CEO. A fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, he has overseen pivotal changes within the organization, key additions both on and off the field, and an update to the club's brand and uniform for the first time in 20 years.

Last season, Johnson oversaw the hiring of Head Coach Adam Gase and General Manager Joe Douglas as well as the appointment of Hymie Elhai as team president. With the three in place, Johnson established a foundation based on his vision of a winning culture throughout the franchise, showing his commitment to building a durable, successful and united organization.

Before a 6-2 finish to the 2019 season, the unity of the team throughout their tough start resonated with Johnson. "The thing that's so encouraging is that there has never been a moment when somebody casts blame on somebody else," Johnson said in November of 2019. "I think that speaks very highly of the character of this team."

Since Week 10 of 2019, Gase has overseen on-field improvements on both sides of the ball as the Jets improved in almost every major offensive and defensive category. Douglas, hired in June of 2019, added 10 new players prior to the start of last season and has begun to overhaul a roster that currently has over 55 new players from the one he inherited.

Throughout his tenure as chairman & CEO, Johnson has developed a strong bond with his players, working closely with them to advance programs and initiatives important to them. Following the death of George Floyd, Johnson joined the team's virtual team meeting, addressing the group and discussing how they all – Johnson, coaches, executives and players – could use their powerful platform to impact positive change. A message that resonated with players like C.J. Mosley.

"That meant a lot to me and I'm sure to everybody else for him to talk to us," said Mosley of Johnson addressing the team. "He pretty much let us know that anything we needed, he was there to help. He gave out his personal information and he said any guy who wants to call, get together to work something out, he would help."

In a statement, Johnson's Jets expressed, "We will not waste this opportunity to create programs and partnerships of which we, along with the community, can look back on years from now and be proud."

In December of 2018, Johnson donated to five non-profit social justice organizations that aim to combat social inequality and reduce barriers to opportunity. Additionally, he matched donations by Jets players and coaches for charities focused on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality and workforce development.

In 2017, Johnson regularly met with the team's leadership council to discuss social justice matters and serve as a resource. Moreover, he accompanied players to the Bronx public defender's office to learn about challenges facing the criminal justice system. In February 2018, he joined the players in sending a letter to New York Governor Andrew Cuomo advocating for bail reform.

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson, his family, and the Jets donated \$3 million to support those in need in the New York and New Jersey areas. In March of 2020, they pledged \$1 million to support the United Way of New York City's COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey's ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island's United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19. A month later, they donated \$2 million to organizations focused primarily on food insecurity, first responders and regional relief.

"No region in the country has been affected by COVID-19 more than ours and because of that, our resolve has only grown," Johnson said of the donations. "We would like to extend our support to these organizations who battle daily against an unprecedented challenge. At no time has being a good teammate ever mattered more."


In April of 2019, the organization unveiled three new uniforms, along with a refreshed logo, the first changes to both in over 20 years. "Our goal was to create a modern and innovative look for the future of our franchise," said Johnson. "We believe these uniforms will appeal to fans of all ages and the design is one that both fans and players would be extremely proud to wear. I am extremely excited to usher in the next generation of the New York Jets." In addition to the uniforms and logo, the team also added noticeable changes to the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center to reflect the re-brand and modified fan elements at MetLife Stadium for the 2019 season.

While engaged in all aspects of the organization, Johnson places an emphasis on the team's year-round commitment to the community, primarily through the New York Jets Foundation. The Foundation funds programs that look to

positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area through the promotion of fitness, youth football support and the prevention of bullying, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the charities supported by the Foundation is the club's trail-blazing anti-bullying program, Jets Tackle Bullying. The program aims to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and preventing bullying for kids and teens.

A dedicated proponent of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. The center, named for his mother, the late Betty Wold Johnson, aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.





JOE DOUGLAS begins his second season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 21st season working in the league, Douglas continues to build a roster that includes over 55 new players from the one he inherited.

"A general manager must be more than just a talent evaluator. He must be able to build and sustain a winning culture," Chairman & CEO Christopher Johnson said after announcing Douglas' hire. "That includes a commitment to collaboration and earning the trust of his collogues."

After engaging with the entire organization, Douglas set expectations for his personnel staff, but has also joined with President Hymie Elhai and Head Coach Adam Gase to build the foundation Johnson envisioned in hiring the three.

"You better know what you're looking for and know what you're looking at."

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor Ozzie Newsome and he knew what he was looking for from the beginning, making his priorities known the day he was hired.

"This is a game of wills and we are going to try to build a team that can impose their will on other teams and to do that you have to be strong up front," Douglas said when introduced as the team's GM, a point he echoed at the end of the 2019 season. "The line of scrimmage is always going to be a priority here and so it's definitely going to be something that we're going to look to improve every year."

Since becoming GM, Douglas has added over 14 offensive linemen, including free agents George Fant, Connor McGovern and Greg Van Roten, as well as Alex Lewis, a trade acquisition during 2019 training camp and 2020 draft picks Mekhi Becton (first round) and Cameron Clark (fourth round).

The offensive line overhaul was just an element of his first free agency for the Jets. Douglas took a strategic and disciplined approach to filling the team's holes, adding to the depth with players that could not only come in and contribute immediately, but would also fit the team's culture. In addition to the offensive linemen acquired, he brought a

pair of veterans with a combined 27 years of NFL experience, reaching into his past with Super Bowl XLVII MVP Joe Flacco, while also adding the NFL's third all-time leading rusher, Frank Gore.

Douglas also signed cornerback Pierre Desir, linebacker Patrick Onwuasor and wide receiver Breshad Perriman, while retaining key contributors on every level of the defense: linebacker Jordan Jenkins, cornerback Brian Poole and team captain and leader, defensive lineman Steve McLendon, who was extended during the 2019 season.

"It was important for us to bring in those quality players that have the right level of toughness, intelligence, versatility," Douglas said in his recap of the team's free agency decisions. "And then, bring them in on fair market deals."

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager was also the NFL's first ever virtual draft as a result of COVID-19 global pandemic, Douglas showed no signs of being a rookie, while drafting from his home. He turned his seven draft picks in 2020, Leonard Williams' expiring contract and a sixth-round pick the team previously acquired into 13 players, including 12 currently on the 2020 roster.

As a result of Douglas' movement in the draft, nine draft picks joined the Jets in 2020 – Becton, wide receiver Denzel Mims, safety Ashtyn Davis, defensive lineman Jabari Zuniga, running back La'Mical Perine, quarterback James Morgan, Clark, cornerback Bryce Hall and punter Braden Mann. Of the nine, five were team captains in college, yet another illustration of Douglas' commitment to character and culture.

Additionally, Douglas added four veteran players with his draft capital, including Lewis, cornerback Nate Hairston and wide receiver Demaryius Thomas during 2019 and defensive back Quincy Wilson during the draft.

While Douglas' first season with the Jets did not end with the desired result, the roster showed resiliency as several players took on unexpected roles for a team that saw just two players start 16 games. The 2019 Jets were forced to use 73 players, including 15 different offensive starting lineups and 14 different defensive starting lineup combinations. Despite the injuries, Douglas buoyed a roster that finished 6-2 over the final eight weeks by acquiring players, in every available avenue possible, throughout the year.

In adding three 10+ game starters after June, Douglas was true to his word that the search for players never stops. He added tight end Ryan Griffin as a free agent signing the day before training camp, Lewis in a 2019 training camp trade and Thomas in a Week Two trade with New England, the first such trade between the two franchises in over 25 years.

Lewis, who was re-signed in the 2020 offseason, went on to start 12 games in his first season with the Jets, as part of an offensive line that allowed the 10th fewest sacks in the league over the last eight games. Griffin, who earned a contract extension during the 2019 season, stabilized the tight end position after expected starter Chris Herndon was limited to just one game. Griffin caught five touchdown passes, tied for third in the conference and one of just eight tight ends in franchise history with at least five TD catches. Thomas became the team's third receiver, catching 36 passes for 433 yards while also providing valuable veteran leadership.

Douglas also brought in a number of other key contributors for the 2019 Jets, claiming wide receiver/punt returner Braxton Berrios – who saw action in all 16 games and ranked second in the league in punt return average – following roster reductions. He added Vyncint Smith from the Texans practice squad as the second-year wide receiver would make contributions receiving, running and returning in 13 games as a Jets. Safety Matthias Farley, a free agent signing prior to the start of the season, was a key contributor on special teams, while Hairston, a trade prior to the first game, started six games at cornerback.

Perhaps Douglas' biggest move during his first season with the Jets was the trade of Leonard Williams. Moved to the Giants at the trade deadline, the Jets received a third-round pick in the 2020 NFL Draft and ultimately a fifth-round choice in 2021.

Throughout his time in the league, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl championship rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015), first working with Gase, the then offensive coordinator for the Bears.

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Lee-Davis (VA) HS, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

HYMIE ELHAI begins his second season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment by Chairman & CEO Christopher Johnson in 2019. Now in his 21st year with the organization, Elhai has ascended to his role as a result of hard work, dedication and a commitment to the New York Jets.

Overseeing all team business operations, Elhai brings his balance and perspective to those various departments, including Communications, Community Relations, Corporate & Premium Partnerships, Events & Game Operations, Facilities, Finance, Information Technology, Legal & Human Resources, Marketing, Security and Ticketing. "For over 20 years Hymie has developed a deep level of respect from both sides of the building," said Johnson. Specifically, I witnessed first-hand, his leadership, communication and organizational acumen."

To that end, a key element of Elhai's role is working closely with General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Adam Gase to integrate football and business operations, providing support and guidance to help both navigate their responsibilities. The relationship between the three form the foundation of Johnson's vision for a unified franchise, one positioning itself for long term success.

During the COVID-19 outbreak, Elhai and his staff have worked closely with New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy's office and the NFL to develop the proper protocols for the Jets. His communication with staff helped manage the unprecedented uncertainty of a global pandemic.

Beginning his Jets career in 2000 as an intern, Elhai previously served as the club's senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters. Additionally, Elhai provided counsel and guidance to football administration on all planning initiatives prior to his current role.

Born in Queens, NY, Elhai grew up a Jets fan, attending games at Shea Stadium. Those roots run deep in Elhai who is driven to bring success to the Jets, not just for the organization, but for the fans.

"I have a deep appreciation and respect for this franchise and for what it means to our fans," Elhai stated after his appointment.

A Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 honoree, Elhai is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and The Johns Hopkins University, where he played football and baseball. Elhai resides in Hoboken, NJ.



ADAM GASE begins his second season as the head coach of the New York Jets after posting a 6-2 record over the final eight games, tied for the third most wins in the league over that span. Overall, he led the team to a 7-9 record, a three-win improvement from 2018.

Under Gase, starting quarterbacks have registered a 100+ passer rating 41 times, a number that would tie him for 10th among all NFL franchises since 2013. Additionally, six different quarterbacks (Sam Darnold, Peyton Manning, Jay Cutler, Ryan Tannehill, Matt Moore and Brock Osweiler) have produced a 100+ passer rating performance.

Beginning with his first season in Denver (2009), Gase has coached 17 different players to the Pro Bowl – a list includes 12 offensive players, with multiple players at offensive line, wide receiver and running back.

In his first season as the Jets head coach, Gase led a roster that used the third-most players in the league as a result of injury. Despite the consistent roster change, he oversaw improvements in almost every major category – offensively and defensively – over the season's final eight weeks. In that span (Weeks Nine-17), the offense increased their third-down efficiency by a league-best 15%, allowing just 15 sacks (ninth best), a 22-sack improvement from the first eight weeks. Additionally, the Jets committed just eight turnovers in the last eight games, the 10th fewest in the league.

One of his main charges, quarterback Sam Darnold, improved in every category, as the second-year pro posted highs in completion percentage, yards per attempt, touchdown percentage, while decreasing his interception percentage and recording the league's 10th best passer rating in compiling a 6-2 record to close the second half.

On opening drives, the Jets offense was one of the most proficient in the league, as Gase's script helped the team score 40 points in 2019, tied for ninth in the league, with all 40 points

coming over the season's final 10 weeks. On opening drives, Darnold finished top five in the league in completion percentage, yards per game, touchdowns, sacks taken and passer rating, while wide receiver Jamison Crowder tied for the league lead in receptions on opening drives.

Prior to his appointment as Jets head coach, Gase brought 16 seasons of experience as a coach in the NFL, the last six calling plays for three different franchises, including record-setting offensive output as the offensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos (2013), his first season calling plays in the NFL. In his last position, Gase spent three seasons (2016-18) as the head coach for the Miami Dolphins, where he compiled a 23-25 record and led the franchise to a postseason berth in his first season.

In his first season under Gase's leadership (2016), quarterback Ryan Tannehill completed 67.1% of his passes for a 7.7 yards per attempt average and a 93.5 passer rating, all then career highs, while also leading the league with a red zone passer rating of 119.7 as the Dolphins broke an eight-year playoff drought. Before his time in South Florida, Gase spent a season as the offensive coordinator with the Chicago Bears (2015), improving the team's rushing yardage ranking from No. 27 the season before to No. 11. Under his tutelage, quarterback Jay Cutler finished the season with the highest passer rating (92.3) of his career, threw seven fewer interceptions than the previous season, and posted a single-season-best 2.3 percent interception rate.

Prior to Chicago, Gase served on the Broncos staff in a variety of roles, including offensive coordinator (2013-14), quarter-backs coach (2011-12) and wide receivers coach (2009-10) as Denver won four AFC West titles, three playoff games and an AFC Championship.

In two seasons as the offensive coordinator, Gase oversaw a record-setting offense that produced over 430 yards per game, including 315.8 yards per game passing and 34 points per game, all the best in the league over that span. In 2013, they

set NFL single-season records for most points scored (606) and most passing yards (5,444), while five different players (three wide receivers, a tight end and a running back) all scored 10+ touchdowns.

Additionally, Manning established single-season NFL records in passing yards (5,477) and passing touchdowns (55), earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors for his efforts. In three seasons under Gase (2012-14), Manning posted a 131-to-35 touchdown to interception ratio, completing 67.7% of his passes for a passer rating of 107.8.

In his first season as the team's quarterbacks coach (2011), Gase oversaw quarterbacks Kyle Orton and Tim Tebow, as the latter helped guide the team to a division title and a postseason berth. Under Gase, Tebow ran for 660 yards and six touchdowns, at the time, the ninth-highest rushing total by a quarterback since the merger.

He initially served on Denver's staff as the team's wide receivers coach (2009-10). In those years, he coached a pair of Pro Bowlers, first wide receiver Brandon Marshall (2009), who produced 101 receptions for 1,120 yards and 10 touchdowns, and then wide receiver Brandon Lloyd (2010), who led the league with 1,448 yards on 77 receptions (18.8 average).

Before joining the Broncos staff, Gase spent one season with San Francisco as an offensive assistant under Offensive Coordinator Mike Martz, assisting an offense that saw running back Frank Gore produce over 1,000 yards rushing.

Gase entered the NFL ranks with the Detroit Lions in 2003, serving as scouting/coaching assistant for three seasons under Steve Mariucci before becoming an offensive quality control coach in 2006 and the quarterback's coach in 2007 under Rod Marinelli. In his season as quarterbacks coach, Jon Kitna posted 4,068 passing yards, the second-highest total of his 14-year career, finishing sixth in the league in passing yards.

Gase began his coaching career as a defensive graduate assistant at LSU in 2000. He spent the following two seasons on the recruiting staff for Head Coach Nick Saban, winning a Southeastern Conference championship in 2001 and helping recruit a group of players that won the BCS National Championship in 2003.

Gase attended Michigan State University from 1996-99 earning a bachelor's degree. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a daughter, McKenzie, and two sons, A.J. and Wyatt.



FRANK BUSH

Assistant Head Coach Defense/Inside Linebackers

- In his second season with the New York Jets, he returns as the team's assistant head coach defense/linebackers. This season marks his 29th season coaching in the NFL, continuing a career that began as a player in 1985.
- In his first season with the Jets, his group saw just two games combined from presumptive starters C.J. Mosley and Avery Williamson due to injuries. As a result, the unit saw five different starters in 2019, receiving the biggest contributions from James Burgess and Neville Hewitt.
- Hewitt, in his second season with the Jets, started all 12 games that he played and finished third on the team with 78 tackles and as one of just seven players with two+ interceptions and two+ sacks last season after posting career highs in both.



SHAWN JEFFERSON

Assistant Head Coach Offense/Wide Receivers

- In his second season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant head coach/wide receivers. 2020 marks his 16th season as a coach in the league, following a 13-year playing career.
- In his first season with the Jets, oversaw a group led by Robby Anderson and Jamison Crowder, as the pair was one of just seven duos league-wide to each post 50+ receptions, 700+ yards and five+ touchdowns. Anderson averaged 15.0 yards per catch, one of just 20 receivers in the league to do so, while Crowder posted a new single season best in reception (78), leading the team with six touchdown receptions. Additionally, Vyncint Smith, added by the Jets from the HST practice squad in-season, became one of just nine wide receivers in the league with at least three receptions of 20+ yards and at least two runs of 10+ yards.



BRANT BOYER

Special Teams Coordinator

- In his fifth season as the special teams coordinator of the New York Jets. In his four seasons guiding the Jets special teams, he has transformed a unit considered by multiple metrics as one of the bottom third in the league to a top five unit in each of the last two seasons, according to FootballOutsiders.com, which compiles the numbers in five key elements of special teams.
- The Jets have had a different primary player at kick returner, punt returner and kicker, as well as a different leading special teams tackler in each of his four seasons as coordinator. Despite the change, his unit has committed just 61 penalties, tied for the fourth fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (five), blocked punts (two), forced fumbles (three), kickoff return average (22.9) and kickoff return average against (21.3). His group is also one of just two in the league with an interception.
- Last season (2019), his group finished fourth in the league in special teams DVOA according to FootballOutsiders.com, their second consecutive season in the top five, despite new primary players at kicker (Sam Ficken), punt returner (Braxton Berrios) and kick returner (Ty Montgomery & Vyncint Smith). Overall, the group ranked in the top five in coverage touchdowns (two), punt return average (11.4), kickoff return average against (19.3) and fumble recoveries (two).



DOWELL LOGGAINS

Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach, his 15th season as an NFL coach, serving as either an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach since 2010.
- Last season (2019), quarterback Sam Darnold improved his numbers from his rookie season, increasing his win total, completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating, while lowering his interceptions. Darnold finished the final eight games with a 93.3 passer rating, the 10th best in the league among qualified passers in that span. Over the same period, Darnold posted the 11th-highest touchdown percentage and the 10th-lowest interception percentage.
- Additionally, the offense was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league.
- In compiling a 6-2 record over the final eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).





GREGG WILLIAMS

Defensive Coordinator

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets, leading the defense as the team's defensive coordinator. Now in his 30th season coaching in the league, he has served as a head coach for three years and a defensive coordinator for 18.
- His defenses have finished in the top 10 in total defense eight times in his 21 seasons as a head coach or defensive coordinator, including finishing seventh overall in his first season leading the Jets defense (2019). His defenses have twice made the Super Bowl, winning Super Bowl XLIV with the Saints, after holding a Colts team that finished seventh in the league in scoring to just 17 points. He also oversaw a defense that held a Rams offense that led the league in scoring and was the third-highest scoring offense in league history at the time to 10 points less than their season average in Super Bowl XXXIV. Additionally, he has helped 16 different defensive players earn trips to the Pro Bowl, 11 of whom made their first trips under him, including Myles Garrett, Aaron Donald and Sean Taylor.
- In addition to the seventh overall finish in total defense in his first season as Jets defensive coordinator (2019), the defense finished second in the league in rushing defense, allowing just 3.34 yards per carry, a franchise record for a 16-game season. The defense held opponents to zero or negative yards an NFL-high 117 times in 2019. He received contributions from every level on defense as 11 different players registered interceptions, the most in the league and the second most in franchise history. Additionally, 16 different players registered at least a half-sack in 2019, the third most in a season in franchise history. Lastly, 10 different defensive players recorded at least five tackles for loss in 2019 (according to Radar360), the most in the league. Of those 10 players with at least five tackles for loss in 2019, seven registered singleseason highs under him, while undrafted rookie free agent Kyle Phillips, the team's leader in tackles for loss (according to coaches' stats), finished in the top 10 among all rookies.
- Contributing to the franchise single-season best 43 non-offensive points scored by the Jets, his defense scored via interception return (C.J. Mosley, Jamal Adams & Brian Poole), fumble recovery return (Adams) and safety (Poole & James Burgess). Those defensive scores were nothing new, as over his last 10 seasons as a defensive coordinator (2008-11, 14-19), his defenses have provided 35 defensive scores, tied for the seventh most of any team in the league.
- As the team compiled a 6-2 record over their last eight games, the defense ranked in the top six league-wide in scoring defense (18.5), total defense (294.0), third-down defense (33.0%) and red zone touchdown defense (40.9%). The defense also increased their sack total over the final eight weeks.



MACK BROWN

Defensive Assistant

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as a
 defensive assistant working with Frank Bush and the team's
 inside linebackers. This marks his second season on the
 defensive side of the ball after previously coaching offense in
 college and high school.
- In his first season with the Jets, helped linebackers James Burgess and Neville Hewitt finish second and third on the team in total tackles respectively. Additionally, he was part of a defensive staff that ranked second in the league with just 3.34 yards per rush allowed, the lowest 16-game average in franchise history. Over the season's final eight games, the defense ranked in the top 10 league-wide in scoring defense (18.5 allowed), total defense (294.0), third-down defense (33.0%), red zone defense (40.9%) and sacks (22).



ANDRE CARTER

Defensive Line

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's defensive line coach. A Pro Bowl 13-year veteran as a player, he enters his fourth season as a coach.
- In his first season with the Jets, oversaw a defensive line that was an integral part of the league's number two ranked run defense. The defense, which held opposing ball carriers to just 3.34 yards a carry, forced 117 opposing carries of zero or negative yards, the most in the league.
- Several defensive linemen saw an increase in their production under him, including 10-year veteran Steve McLendon who posted single-season bests in tackles for loss and quarterback hits (according to Radar360), while Folorunso Fatukasi and Nathan Shepherd, both second-year players, saw increased playtime, with Fatukasi finishing third on the team in tackles for loss and Shepherd finishing top five on the team in both tackles for loss and quarterback hits after his return in Week Nine
- Additionally, he helped undrafted rookie Kyle Phillips finish first on the team in tackles for loss, while Phillips finished in the top 10 in tackles for loss among all rookies and sixth among rookie d-linemen in total tackles (stats according to Radar360).





JIM BOB COOTER

Running Backs

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's running backs coach. He has been an offensive coach in the league for the past 11 seasons, including three-anda-half years as an offensive coordinator. He has been part of two staffs that reached the Super Bowl, the Denver Broncos in 2013 and the 2009 Indianapolis Colts.
- In his first season with the Jets, helped free agent signing Le'Veon Bell produce 1,250 yards from scrimmage, one of just six Jets rushers with a 1,200+ scrimmage yards season in the last 20 years. Bell also finished as one of just 10 NFL running backs with 600+ rushing yards and 400+ receiving yards in 2019, while pulling in 66 receptions, one of just seven running backs with 65+ catches in 2019.



JOHN DUNN

Tight Ends

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's tight ends coach, his fourth season in the NFL.
- In his first season with the Jets, was without presumptive starter Chris Herndon for all but one game, while veteran Ryan Griffin, signed by the team prior to training camp, posted 34 receptions for 320 yards and a single-season best five touchdowns. In addition to tying for third in the AFC with those five scores, Griffin also became the eighth tight end in franchise history with a season of at least five touchdowns.



DEREK FRAZIER

Assistant Offensive Line

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant offensive line coach. After a 20-year college coaching career, he begins his second season in the NFL.
- Last season, he and Offensive Line Coach Frank Pollack oversaw a group that was forced to use 11 different starters and nine different line combinations as a result of injury. Despite the consistent change, the offensive line allowed the ninth-fewest sacks in the league over the last eight games, a 22-sack difference from the season's first eight weeks.



JEFF HAMMERSCHMIDT

Assistant Special Teams

- Returns for his fifth season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant special teams coach. Over the last two seasons, he and Special Teams Coordinator Brant Boyer have helped the special teams to a pair of top five rankings according to FootballOutsiders.com, which compiles the numbers in five key elements of special teams.
- Over the last four seasons, the special teams unit has committed just 61 penalties, tied for the fourth fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (five), blocked punts (two), forced fumbles (three), kickoff return average (22.9) and kickoff return average against (21.3). The group is also one of just two in the league with an interception.
- Last season, the special teams finished fourth in the league in special teams DVOA according to FootballOutsiders.com, their second consecutive season in the top five, despite new primary players at kicker (Sam Ficken), punt returner (Braxton Berrios) and kick returner (Ty Montgomery & Vyncint Smith). Overall, the group ranked in the top five in coverage touchdowns (two), punt return average (11.4), kickoff return average against (19.3) and fumble recoveries (two).



BO HARDEGREE

Offensive Assistant

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as an offensive assistant, his seventh season as a coach in the league.
- In his first season with the Jets, he was part of an offensive staff that was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league. Additionally, over the last eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).





FRANK POLLACK

Offensive Line

- Returns for his second season as the offensive line coach with the New York Jets. After playing the position for eight years in the league, he has been guiding NFL offensive lines for the last 14 seasons, helping to produce All-Pros at center, guard and tackle.
- In his first season with the Jets, the offensive was forced to use 11 different starters and nine different offensive line combinations as a result of injury. The 11 different starting linemen were the second most in the league in 2019, while they had eight different linemen play at least 300 offensive snaps, tied for the most in the league. Despite the consistent change throughout the season, the line allowed the ninth fewest sacks over the season's final eight games, a 22-sack improvement from the first eight weeks.



LEIGH TORRENCE

Assistant Defensive Backs

 Begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the assistant defensive backs coach on February 10, 2020. He previously spent four seasons with New Orleans, initially as a Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellow in 2015.



CHIP VAUGHN

Defensive Assistant

 Begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as a defensive assistant on February 16, 2020. This is his first full-time coaching position in the NFL following five years in college football working with defensive backs at Air Force, Fayetteville State and Winston-Salem State.



JOE VITT

Senior Defensive Assistant/Outside Linebackers

- An NFL coaching veteran for over 40 years, he returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's senior defensive assistant/outside linebackers coach. This is the ninth franchise he has worked with in the league after beginning his career in 1979 with the Baltimore Colts.
- In his first season with the Jets, his group saw a career year from both Jordan Jenkins and Tarrell Basham. Jenkins, the fourth-year pro, led the team with a single-season high 8.0 sacks in 2019, becoming one of just eight players in franchise history with consecutive 7.0+ sack seasons. Basham, the third-year pro, saw his most extensive play time in 2019 as he set single-season bests in games played (16), games started (2) and total tackles (36), while registering the first interception, passes defensed (team-leading nine), and fumble recovery of his career. In addition, Basham became one of just the only Jet since 1991 to register a sack, fumble recovery, an interception and blocked punt in the same season, when he accomplished the feat over his final three games.



HINES WARD

Wide Receivers

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets, and his
 first as the team's wide receivers coach after being promoted
 from offensive assistant this season. Initially joining the team
 during 2019 training camp as part of the NFL Bill Walsh
 Diversity Coaching Fellowship program, he was hired before
 the start of last season as an offensive assistant and is now in
 his third season as a coach in the NFL, following a 14-year Pro
 Bowl career as a wide receiver.
- In his first season with the Jets, he was part of an offensive staff that saw improvement in several categories over the last eight games, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game. Additionally, wide receivers Robby Anderson and Jamison Crowder became only the third duo in the AFC to each register 50+ receptions and 700+ receiving yards.





TODD WASHINGTON

Offensive Assistant

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as an
 offensive assistant. For Washington, this season marks his eighth
 season coaching in the NFL, following eight years as a player. As
 a coach, he has spent time in three other professional leagues,
 including this iteration of the XFL (prior to the league's start), the
 AAF and the UFL.
- In his first season with the Jets, he was part of an offensive staff that was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league. Additionally, over the last eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).



BLAKE WILLIAMS

Defensive Assistant

- Returns for his second season with the New York Jets as a
 defensive assistant working with Andre Carter and the team's
 defensive line. 2020 marks his 14th year coaching football,
 including 11 as a coach in the NFL.
- In his first season with the Jets, he helped defensive linemen Kyle Phillips, Steve McLendon and Folorunso Fatukasi each finish in the top three in tackles for loss, as a key part of a defense that forced 117 opposing carries of zero or negative yards, the most in the league. Additionally, the defensive line was a key contributor to a defense that ranked second in the league with just 3.34 yards per rush allowed, the lowest 16game average in franchise history.



DENNARD WILSON

Passing Game Coordinator/Defensive Backs

- Returns for his fourth season with the New York Jets and his second as the team's passing game coordinator/defensive backs.
- Last season, he again oversaw a Pro Bowl season from Jamal Adams as the third-year safety led the team in tackles, quarterback hits, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries and defensive touchdowns. Additionally, safety Marcus Maye returned from injury the previous season and started all 16 games, one of just two defensive players to start every game. Both Adams and Maye finished among the top six in completion percentage allowed among safeties with at least 300 coverage snaps last season (according to Next Gen Stats). Cornerback Brian Poole, signed by the team in the offseason, ranked in the top 20 among all NFL corners with at least 400 coverage in both passer rating and completion percentage allowed, while finishing with the seventh best coverage success rate as the nearest defender (according to Next Gen Stats).
- Additionally, over the last seven weeks of 2019, his group saw increased contributions from cornerbacks Arthur Maulet (six defensive snaps prior to Week 10), Bless Austin (returned from NFI in Week 10) and Maurice Canady (claimed in Week 10). In that stretch, the Jets defense ranked in the top third of the league in completion percentage allowed (59.2%), passing yards per game allowed (227.4) and passer rating allowed (83.1).
