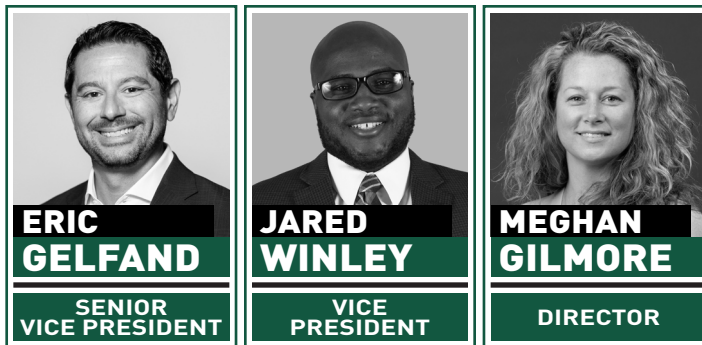

JETS TACKLE BULLYING

On October 31, 2021, The Jets, STOMP Out Bullying and Bethpage Federal Credit Union will host the sixth annual Anti-Bullying Awareness Day at MetLife Stadium, when they take on the Cincinnati Bengals. This event is designed to tackle bullying by increasing awareness of all forms of bullying, promoting STOMP Out Bullying’s mission of reducing and preventing bullying and, most importantly, providing resources to those who need assistance.

Anti-Bullying Awareness Day will feature the Jets 50/50 Raffle benefiting STOMP Out Bullying. At the beginning of the fourth quarter, Bethpage Federal Credit Union VP of Brand Strategy, Cania Infante, will present the proceeds from the raffle during an on-field presentation to STOMP Out Bullying. Additionally, several 2021 Jets Upstanders of the Month will serve as honorary captains for the coin toss, featured on the video board. Finally, the Jets distributed 1,500 tickets for the game to students, families and teachers from schools that participated in the Jets Tackle Bullying Symposium, as well as the Jets Upstander of the Month and School Recognition programs.



The New York Jets, STOMP Out Bullying and Bethpage Federal Credit Union have named fifth grader, Andre M. of Perry L. Drew School the Jets Upstander of the Month for October.

From September through December during the NFL season, the Jets will ask schools to post a photo of a student that is an Upstander on Twitter using the hashtag #JetsTackleBullying. The Jets will highlight one Upstander a month across their social media platforms and on the video boards during select home games.

“In his classes, Andre is always willing to help other students and always has a positive attitude,” said Technology Teacher Suzanne Swinarski. “In Physical Education class, when other students who are not as athletic as Andre do not have a partner, he always volunteers to work with them.”

Through the organization’s collaboration with STOMP Out Bullying, along with support from Bethpage Federal Credit Union, the Jets have provided STOMP Out Bullying co-branded educator prevention toolkits to over 1,750 schools in the Tri-State area at no cost, conducted an annual Jets Tackle Bullying Symposium with STOMP Out Bullying, created awareness through a robust PSA campaign and annually host an anti-bullying awareness day at MetLife Stadium on gameday. Zoran Milich of Montgomery High School in Skillman, NJ, has been named this week's recipient of the New York Jets High School Coach of the Week. Milich will receive a monetary award of \$1000 to benefit the school's football program. Along with this award, Montgomery High School will receive an automatic bid to compete in the 2022 New York Jets 11-ON Tournament. In addition, Coach Milich will be invited to attend the New York Jets vs. New Orleans Saints game on Sunday, December 12th. He will receive luxury suite tickets and



be recognized on-field at MetLife Stadium. Montgomery High School will receive 100 tickets to the Jets Play Football 2022 preseason home game.

In its 26th year, the Coach of the Week award is given to a coach in the Tri-State area who serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to their community, their school and their student athletes.



Coach Milich attended Somerville High School in Somerville, NJ, where he played tight end before graduating in 1986. Milich attended Rutgers University, where he played football for two years before a chronic back injury ended his career. After graduating with a degree in economics, Milich went on to receive his M.A.T. degree in social studies from Fairleigh Dickinson University. In 1992, Milich began his coaching career and returned to Somerville High School as the assistant football coach. In 2000, Milich started Montgomery High School's first ever football program and has been the head coach ever since. At Montgomery, Milich teaches social studies and has also been the head coach of the baseball and boys track and field programs. Milich currently serves as the president of the New Jersey Football Coaches Association.

Each week during the high school football season, the Jets and Gatorade will recognize a player of the week. The player will receive a \$1,000 donation from the Jets and Gatorade in their name to support their high school football program. This award will be announced on the Jets High School Football Hour with Mike Quick and Matt Simms fueled by Gatorade on 98.7 ESPN.

This week's recipient is Kyle Messina, freshman running back and quarterback from Sayville High School in West Sayville, NY. The freshman dominated, tallying 252 yards and four touchdowns, in a thrilling 51-44 win over East Islip. In addition to his game on the ground, Messina added a 34-yard touchdown pass to his outstanding performance.

Defensive lineman **BRYCE HUFF**, an undrafted free agent last season (2020), ranks fifth in the league among players with at least 100 pass rush snaps in average get-off (time it takes for the player to pass the line of scrimmage) with a time of 0.79 seconds

- Among the top 10 times in the league this season, six are first round picks and only two are undrafted free agents.

2

Linebacker **QUINCY WILLIAMS**, claimed by the Jets at the start of the 2021 season, became one of two players through the first five weeks with 30+ tackles and five+ tackles for loss.

2.0

Cornerback **BRYCE HALL** has averaged 2.0 passes defended over his last three games, tied for the second most in the league among all players with at least three games played since Week Four.

3

Defensive lineman **JOHN FRANKLIN-MYERS** joins Aaron Donald and Chris Jones as the only three defensive linemen in the league to record 10+ quarterback pressures rushing from an edge position and also rank in the top 10 in QB pressure when rushing from an interior position.

4

Since entering the league in 2017, safety **MARCUS MAYE** is one of just 10 active players with four+ takeaways in the red area, including one of 10 with 3+ interceptions.

5

Appearing in his first game last week at NE (10/24), third-year quarterback **MIKE WHITE** threw a touchdown on his first career pass attempt, just the fifth QB since 2008 to do so.

6.33 1.67

Cornerback **MICHAEL CARTER II** has allowed 6.33 yards per catch this season, the fifth best among all rookie DBs, while his 1.67 tackles per game on run plays leads all rookie DBs.

6.8

The Jets defense has recorded 6.8 quarterback hits per game this season, the seventh-best average in the league.

8

This season, the Jets are the only team in the league with eight different rookies to play at least 100 snaps, including **ALIJAH VERA-TUCKER** (368), **ZACH WILSON** (313), **MICHAEL CARTER II** (337), **BRANDIN ECHOLS** (284), **JAMIEN SHERWOOD** (207), **ELIJAH MOORE** (192), **MICHAEL CARTER** (180) and **HAMSAH NASIRILDEEN** (116).

After missing all but two games the last two seasons, linebacker **C.J. MOSLEY** is tied for 11th in the league with an average of nine tackles per game and currently leads the team with his 45 tackles

10

Defensive lineman **SHELDON RANKINS** has 10 pressures in his first year with the team, one of four Jets with at least 10 this season.

13.62

Among players with at least 20 receptions, wide receiver **COREY DAVIS** ranks seventh in air yards per target (13.62), according to TruMedia.

19t

Rookie wide receiver **ELIJAH MOORE** scored the first touchdown of his career on a 19-yard run, the first Jets rookie receiver with a rushing touchdown since 1970.

20

Since the start of the 2020 season, defensive linemen **FOLORUNSO FATUKASI** and **QUINNEN WILLIAMS** have each produced 20 run stuffs, the second most of any defensive lineman in the league over that span.

25.3

Among teams with at least 10 kickoff returns this season, the Jets rank 4th with a 25.3 kickoff return average.

25.7%

Since Week Four, the Jets offensive line has allowed just six sacks, tied for the ninth fewest in the league while decreasing their pressures allowed percentage from 37.9% to 25.7%.

40+

After only forcing one 40-yard penalty in the previous five seasons, the Jets have now drawn 40+ yard flags in each of their last three games, with three different receivers, **COREY DAVIS**, **ELIJAH MOORE** and **KEELAN COLE**, each drawing one.

92.4

With a grade of 92.4, rookie offensive lineman **ALIJAH VERA-TUCKER** earned Pro Football Focus' highest grade in Week Five among all NFL offensive linemen • He had a run-block grade of 90.6 and a pass-block grade of 88.9 • His PFF season grade this season is also the fifth highest among rookies.

98%

Over the last four seasons, offensive lineman **CONNOR MCGOVERN** has played at least 98% of his team's snaps every season, while his 48 consecutive starts are the fourth-longest active streak by a center.

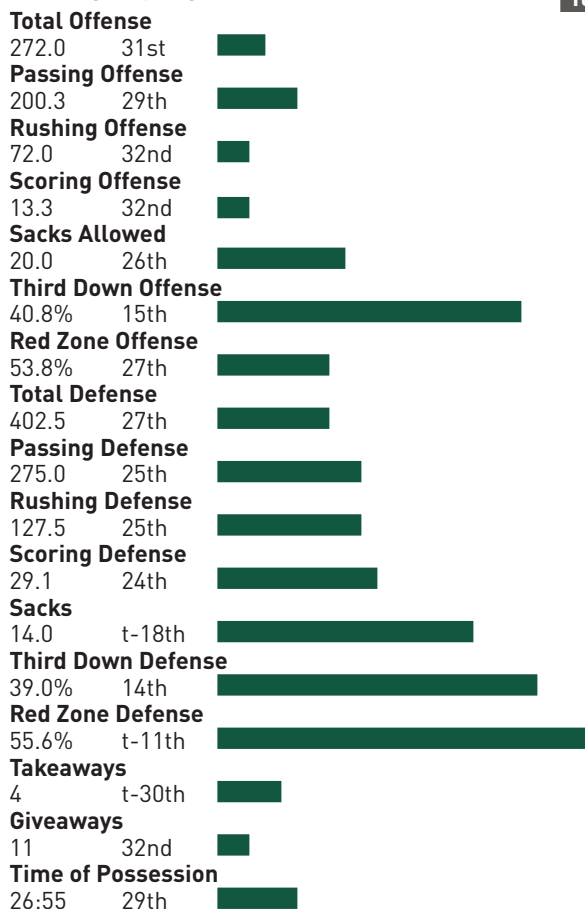

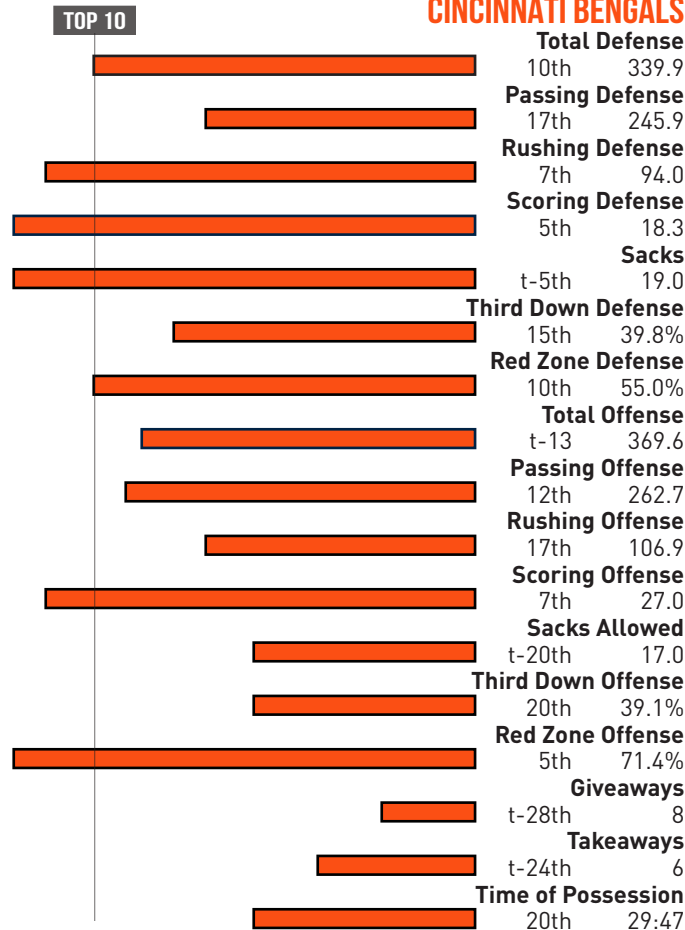

HEAD COACH ROBERT SALEH

"You see the energy every day, you see the passion. What people probably don't see day-to-day is just the thoughtful nature of how he approaches everything. You see someone that really, how him and his staff create accountability and ownership. These team meetings are phenomenal. Robert does such a great job of having his finger on the pulse of every aspect of our team from the locker room, from offense, defense, special teams. All of that, you see in his team meetings and how he communicates with the team. I think his ability to really have his finger on the pulse of everything, along with his passion, his people skills, his communication skills and this staff of great teachers that he brought in, it's been special to watch."

"His insight and his help and his assistance is invaluable. "He's smart. He's got great vision. He finds ways, when you think it's blocked for two, he finds ways to get it to five, because he just finds those lanes and he has great vision. Again, I think part of it is, it's kind of cheesy, but the kid just has an unbelievable attitude and when you literally, absolutely love what you do and you come out with a great attitude every single day, a lot of times good stuff is going to happen to you if you are talented in this league. I think he has kind of that combination of everything."

"He's wise beyond his years. He's very, very smart, and he's only getting better. He's got great command of the defense, he's a great communicator already. So, couldn't be happier with him, he's been fantastic."

"He is a very strong man, in terms of just character and when you talk to him and have a conversation, you know you're talking to an absolute adult. He is the model of efficiency in terms of knowing everything he's supposed to do, getting off the line of scrimmage, being perfect with his break points, putting his body between the receiver and the quarterbacks so the ball can only get to his hands. He does such a nice job executing in every facet of football, whether it's run game or pass game, that it doesn't pop but it's very, very efficient and very successful."

"From a coach's standpoint, when you draw up a player, you can't draw it up better for him with his mindset, the way he prepares every day, the way he goes about his business, the way he talks to his teammates, the way he takes care of himself. Then you go on the field, he's on his job, every single detail. He's deliberate in everything that he does. And then on top of it, he's pretty damn good at what he does too. He's been everything we expected as a free agent pickup, he's been awesome."

"I thought Corey was a perfect pick to be a captain. He's not a vocal leader, but I don't think you need him to be. I think you see his leadership day in and day out and just the way that he approaches the game and the way that he just does everything right. Guys see that and everyone is just like, "Geez, look at Corey," this guy's always doing the right thing. And I think that he's bringing guys along with him. And what makes him the number one receiver is literally just that. I think he's, obviously, physically blessed and he's got good size on him too, and he catches the ball well, knows how to run routes. But I think it's just his demeanor and the way he approaches the game."

FOLORUNSO FATUKASI

"When you talk about Foley, he's got that, I don't want to call it old-man-farmer strength, but he's got tremendous balance. You can't knock him off his block. When teams bump, he doesn't get displaced out of his gap. He's got tremendous leverage and just raw power. And because of it, he just plays on the other side of the line of scrimmage. He's able to create tremendous knock back and he has the instincts to get off those blocks and make those explosive looking plays. He's a talented individual."

"JFM is a stud. When we first got here, we studied all our players and the one of the guys that stood out to us was JFM. We didn't know anything about JFM and man, he can really take off. He's been a tremendous leader and then you see his play on the football field. He's absolutely dominant at times."

"He's one of those guys that there's been times in his career where he majored as an outside rusher, there's times in his career where he was primarily an inside rusher. I think the best way to utilize his skill set is a little bit of both, and that's what we're trying to feature with him. When he has an opportunity to do a little bit of both, he's very dynamic in that way, because he's got maybe a little bit more power than a traditional edge guy, so he can overwhelm a tackle in some ways. But then he's got more speed and quickness, change of direction than some of the insiders, so he can be a miss match for guards too. So, I think the more we can utilize and the more we can take advantage of his versatility, the better. I would anticipate him having a really good year for a us, a career year for himself."

JAVELIN GUIDRY

"You think about Javelin Guidry, I'm going to pump him up for a second, because I don't think he gets enough credit, and go back to Joe (Douglas) finding an undrafted free agent who's come in here, and you think about what he played, he played corner, nickel, and dime in one game last week, which is not easy. He's been an absolute stud, and we're very fortunate to have him. So, he makes a lot of that possible, because of his willingness to do extra and so he's been fantastic."

"He's a tremendous leader, vocally and on the field with demonstration. Whether it's special teams, defense, show team, he's going 110 miles an hour every single play and encouraging his teammates to go 110 miles an hour every single play. "You guys know me, with my infatuation for the man, I think he's phenomenal. So, I'll give you guys one. He did something we've never had a linebacker do in our system. It was a sack, and if you listen to the TV copy and you guys see him, he demonstrative and it looks like he's making a play call, like he's changing the defense, which he is, which we don't do. Once a call goes in, we're rolling. He saw something that he didn't like, he got us into another defense, and the entire sideline, all of us coaches were like, "What is he doing?" Just yelling at the linebacker coach. And he got us into the perfect play call, and we got a sack, because the quarterback hitched. And I was like, 'Well, that's why he's an All-Pro.' So, good job, C.J. He was pumped and proud of that moment, and deservedly so. He studies a lot of tape and he knew exactly what we needed to be in, he fixed the call, and we got off the field on the third down."

It goes back, he got to taste a little bit of what coaching is. He made a check, it worked, you're a genius. If it wouldn't have worked, we wouldn't be talking about this, I wouldn't tell you guys about it, it would've been one of those, 'Hey dude, you can't do that.' But it worked. It shows that he is like a cheat code, his mind plays at a different level, he's playing a different game. And he knew exactly what we needed to get into, and he made the right call."

And he's showing it. You could already see, last year, that he was getting back to what he was when he was drafted and then his second year when he was so productive. Then injuries obviously set him back, but when you talk to people around the league, especially in that building, he is an unbelievable leader, he's got tremendous work ethic, the way he takes care of his body, he's meticulous in everything he does, and I'm just really excited for him and the success he's been having so far."

From the first time we kind of did an 11-on-11 here, I knew he was going to be a good player. He's really starting to settle in and play some really, really, good football."

He's very much a guy who can just have those conversations about what needs to be done and you know, it's not always all energy, all passion, all the time. He's a guy who's able to do a little bit of everything. I think that's what makes him a great coach."

"Everybody believes in him. When you see kind of the throws he makes and the plays he is able to make, you know that he has the makings to be a really special quarterback. The coolest thing I think about Zach is he doesn't let anything affect his confidence. He is a very confident individual and nothing is going to break that confidence. Good play, bad play, whatever it is, Zach is extremely confident, he knows he can go out and make the plays that are required to win the football game. I think the Jets organization and fan base can every week expect bigger and better things from Zach and a guy that's going to be around for a long time making spectacular plays."

"So, we say this thing about boring football and we're not looking for "Charlie Checkdown," that's for sure, right? We still want him to be aggressive like we said, but we also want him to be smart with the ball and what gets lost in the excitement of the explosive plays that he generated was at 14, I think it was 14 of his 18 completions were [thrown] for seven yards or less. He didn't get hit, there were balls getting in and out of his hands [and] I know he was very efficient, and he can play that style of ball. And there was even more to be had in those situations, there are opportunities for even more, which he'll get better at. But at the same time, everyone saw the creativity and the off-schedule stuff that is getting all the attention, but that represented four of his completions. He's in really good head space, his mindsets in the right spot in terms of he knows he can be even better and those are things he'll continue to grow on."

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family's proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning arena that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the 'Special Relationship' between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies. While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy's historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state of the art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States' interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the 'Special Relationship.'

Following his diplomatic service, Ambassador Johnson returned to one of his passions—football—and resumed his role as chairman of the Jets. (During his service abroad, Johnson's brother, Christopher, filled the role of chairman.) With Christopher

Johnson now vice chairman, he will continue to build on recent leadership additions including General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh. With President Hymie Elhai, these three comprise the organization's unified approach to build the Jets into a sustained, winning franchise.

Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson's philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the Foundation's programs is the launch of the first Girls High School Flag Football League in New Jersey. In addition to its commitment to youth programs, the Foundation also supports the Lupus Research Alliance to raise awareness and medical research funds for this autoimmune disease.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson's healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$214 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of two new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation's largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans.



CHRISTOPHER W. JOHNSON

VICE CHAIRMAN

CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, a fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has overseen pivotal changes within the organization, appointing the team's football and business management, while updating the club's brand and uniform for the first time in 20 years. A key part of the New York Jets leadership since 2000, Johnson begins his first season as vice chairman, working alongside his brother, Chairman Woody Johnson.

In his new role, Johnson will provide continuity after overseeing the promotion of team President Hymie Elhai, and the hiring of General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh in his time as chairman & CEO. In these three, Johnson is confident he found collaborative leaders who will unify the Jets in their shared goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

Previously serving as the Jets chairman & CEO (2017-21), Johnson has spent the past four years developing a strong bond with the players, working closely with them to advance the programs and initiatives they deem important. In 2020, Johnson addressed the team and discussed how they all—Johnson, coaches, executives, and players—could use their powerful platform to influence positive change.

To support this goal, Johnson and the Jets donated \$1 million to four partner organizations in December of 2020, with each organization—All Stars Project, Innocence Project, New York Urban League and Year Up—receiving \$250,000. These organizations mirror the Jets' and Johnson's focus on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality, and workforce development. The players, coaches and staff will continue to work to reduce barriers and create opportunities for individuals in need on various upcoming volunteer projects championed by the organization.

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson, his family, and the Jets donated \$3 million to support those in need in the New York and New Jersey areas. In March of 2020, they pledged \$1 million to support the United Way of New York City's COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey's ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island's United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19. A month later, they donated \$2 million to organizations focused primarily on food insecurity, first responders and regional relief.

In April of 2019, the organization unveiled three new uniforms, and a refreshed logo—the first changes to both in more than 20 years. In addition to the uniforms and logo, the team also implemented significant alterations to the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center to reflect the re-brand and modified fan elements at MetLife Stadium for the 2019 season.

A dedicated advocate of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. Named for his mother, the late Betty Wold Johnson, the Center aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.



HYMIE ELHAI

HYMIE ELHAI (*pronounced HI-me EL-hi*) begins his third season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment by Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson in 2019. Now in his 22nd year with the team, Elhai's commitment to the Jets is evident as he has helped to define the culture of the organization, while also garnering respect from across the league throughout his tenure.

"For over 20 years, Hymie has developed a deep level of respect from both sides of the building," said Christopher W. Johnson. "Specifically, I witnessed first-hand, his leadership, communication and organizational acumen."

Under Elhai, the Jets have solidified their business staff's senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations, bringing his balance and perspective to those various departments, including: Communications, Community Relations, Content, Corporate & Premium Partnerships, Events & Game Operations, Facilities, Finance, Information Technology, Legal & Human Resources, Marketing, Security and Ticketing.

Playing a key role in hiring of the football leadership, Elhai worked with Christopher W. Johnson to hire General Manager Joe Douglas in 2019, and with both Johnson and Douglas to hire Head Coach Robert Saleh in 2021.

The collaboration among Elhai, Douglas and Saleh forms the foundation that will move the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning franchise. Throughout his time as president, he has worked closely with the football staff, providing counsel and support for various organizational-encompassing objectives. Additionally, in his previous role as general counsel, he helped football administration on all planning initiatives

"Seeing the dynamic of Robert, Joe and Hymie, and how they work together in a new and different way that I haven't seen before to this extent, I think it's a great harmony here and I'm really excited about it," said Chairman Robert Wood Johnson IV.

Among the important initiatives under Elhai was the formation of the Social Justice, Diversity and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) and the expansion of the Jets Women's Organization (JWO). The SJDIT helps steer the Jets as it relates to the process and execution of the team's Social Justice efforts as well as internal diversity and inclusion practices. The JWO now encompasses the many women affiliated with the organization, including staff members, wives and significant others of coaches, players, and football personnel, serving as a unique outlet to positively impact the workplace, industry, and community.

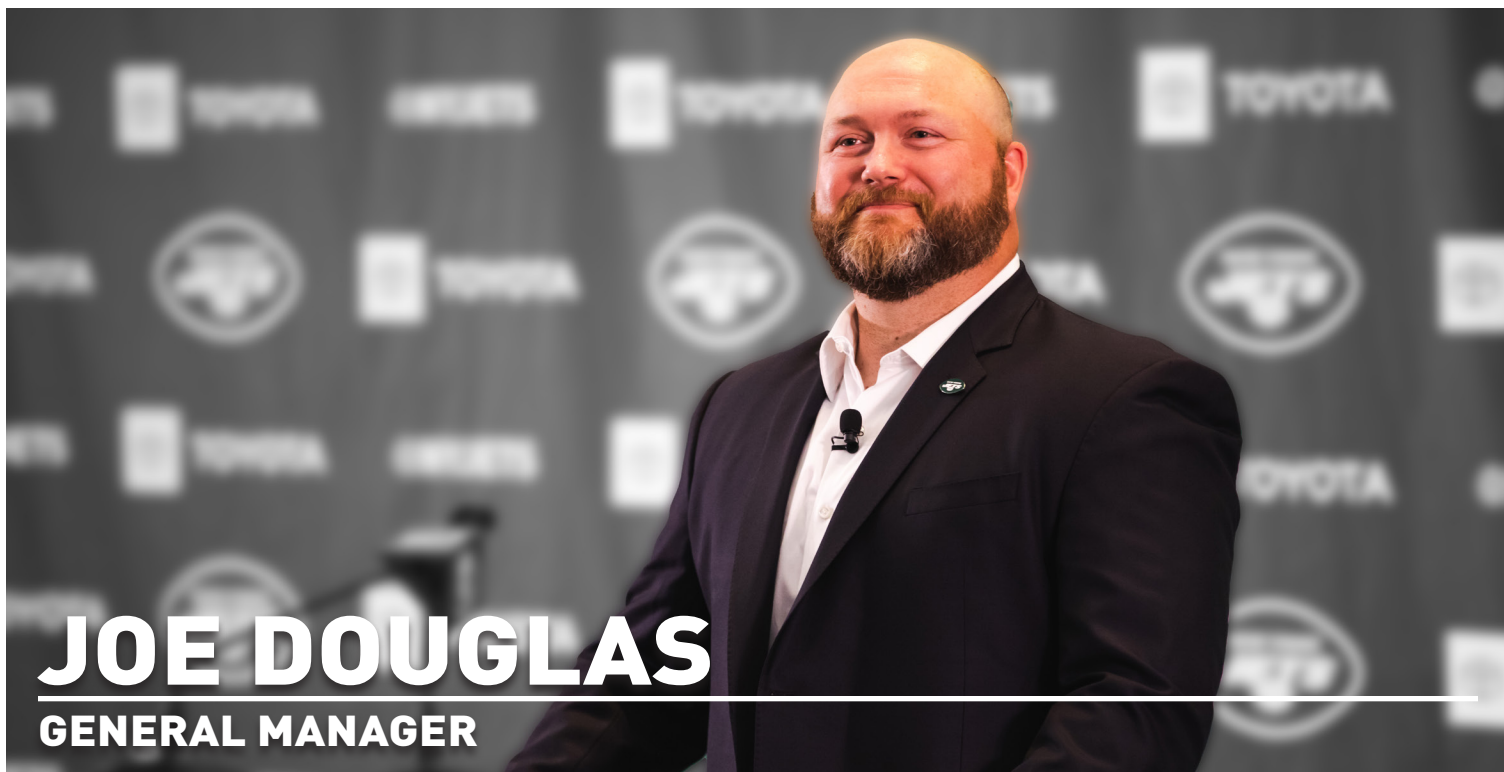
During the COVID-19 outbreak, Elhai and his staff worked closely with New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy's office and the NFL, as the team developed their protocols. Prioritizing employee safety, his communication and direction helped manage the unprecedented uncertainty of a global pandemic, keeping the business staff optimized despite working remotely.

Beginning his Jets career in 2000 as an intern, Elhai previously served as the club's senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel, where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters.

Born in Queens, NY, Elhai grew up a Jets fan, attending games at Shea Stadium. Those roots run deep in Elhai who is driven to bring success to the Jets, not just for the organization, but for the fans.

"I have a deep appreciation and respect for this franchise and for what it means to our fans," Elhai said following his appointment.

JOE DOUGLAS begins his third season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 22nd season in the National Football League, Douglas, a three-time Super Bowl winning executive, continues to put his stamp on the organization.

Since taking the position, Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout the year, and made steadying in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Since his appointment just over two seasons ago, almost 90% of the roster was acquired or extended by him.

While turning over the roster, Douglas has improved the team's financial flexibility and added a number of draft assets, both by trading players with expiring contracts and draft-day deals. Through those deals, most notably the acquisition of two first-round picks and a third-round pick for safety Jamal Adams, the Jets selected twice in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft and have multiple selections in the first and second rounds of the 2022 NFL Draft.

However, Vice Chairman Christopher Johnson's vision for Douglas was not just about the ability to construct a roster. "A general manager must be more than just a talent evaluator. He must be able to build and sustain a winning culture," Johnson said after announcing Douglas' hire. "That includes a commitment to collaboration and earning the trust of his colleagues."

Johnson's confidence in Douglas was on display as they, along with team President Hymie Elhai, led the search for the team's new coach. In hiring Robert Saleh, Johnson is confident that the first-year head coach will join with Douglas and Elhai to form the cohesive foundation that brings the Jets to their goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

“ You better know what you're looking for and know what you're looking at. ”

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor, former Ravens General Manager Ozzie Newsome, and he has stayed true to his core principal that successful teams are built by people with the right level of commitment, character and competence, as Douglas looks to develop and sustain to what he characterizes as, "the best culture in sports."

For Douglas, roster construction isn't a quick fix. "Ultimately, I think when you look at successful organizations, no matter what the sport, you don't see a lot of teams that build long-term success by buying their way out of it," he said in 2020. "You see the teams, the organizations that have long-term success, they draft well, and they develop their players."

As part of that development and commitment to player health, safety and effectiveness, Douglas, with Coach Saleh, created the Athletic Care and Performance Department, aligning the team's athletic trainers, strength & conditioning staff as well as nutrition, rehab, and sport science staffs to better position players for success. Choosing Dr. Brad DeWeese to head the department, Douglas cited DeWeese's vision, insight, and strategic approach to maximize athletic care and performance, as well as his focus on speed and power.

In the 2021 NFL Draft, Douglas added 10 players to roster, most notably second-overall selection, Zach Wilson, and 14th-overall pick, Alijah Vera-Tucker, in the first round. In drafting Vera-Tucker, Douglas showed his aggressiveness, trading up nine spots in the first round for the "unique opportunity" to acquire what the team deemed a top 10 talent in that draft. Wilson and Vera-Tucker joined wide receiver Elijah Moore (second round) and running back Michael Carter (fourth round), as the team selected offensive

players with their first four draft picks for the first time since 1983. With their remaining six choices, the Jets targeted defensive players at all three levels: Michael Carter II, Jason Pinnock and Brandin Echols in the secondary, Jonathan Marshall up front and two safety-to-linebacker conversions in Jamien Sherwood and Hamsah Nasirildeen, acquiring players that could find success in Coach Saleh and Defensive Coordinator Jeff Ulbrich's new defense.

Before the draft, Douglas set to work bringing in players to add to the team's talent and culture in free agency, using a targeted aggressiveness to bring in players like defensive lineman Carl Lawson, wide receiver Corey Davis and linebacker Jarrad Davis. Douglas and his group stayed active throughout, adding veteran contributors in defensive linemen Sheldon Rankins and Vinny Curry, safety Lamarcus Joyner, tight end Tyler Kroft and cornerback Justin Hardee.

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager (2020) was also the NFL's first ever virtual draft as a result of COVID-19 global pandemic, Douglas showed no signs of being a rookie, despite drafting from his home. He turned his seven draft picks in 2020, Leonard Williams' expiring contract and a sixth-round pick the team previously acquired into 13 players.

As a result of Douglas' movement in the draft, nine draft picks joined the Jets in 2020 – tackle Mekhi Becton, wide receiver Denzel Mims, safety Ashtyn Davis, defensive lineman Jabari Zuniga, running back La'Mical Perine, quarterback James Morgan, offensive lineman Cameron Clark, cornerback Bryce Hall and punter Braden Mann. Of the nine, five were team captains in college, yet another illustration of Douglas' commitment to character and culture. Additionally, he added cornerbacks Lamar Jackson and Javelin Guidry, as well as linebacker Bryce Huff, as undrafted free agents. All three played at least 150 snaps, as the Jets were the only team in 2020 with three such undrafted rookies on defense.

In his first start-of-the-league-year free agency (2020), Douglas took a strategic and disciplined approach to filling the team's roster, adding to the depth with players that could not only come in and contribute immediately, but would also fit the team's culture. Among the players added, were offensive linemen George Fant, Connor McGovern and Greg Van Roten, along with a pair of veterans with a combined 27 years of NFL experience, quarterback Joe Flacco and running back Frank Gore. Gore, a leader on a young team, became just the third player in league history to gain 16,000 yards rushing, while showing the day-in, day-out habits of a future Hall of Famer. Douglas also re-signed key contributors on every level of the defense: linebacker Jordan Jenkins, cornerback Brian Poole and defensive lineman Steve McLendon.

During the season, Douglas made key waiver claims to provide depth and reinforce a roster that saw over 25 different players land on IR. Running back Ty Johnson, an October claim, averaged 4.7 yards per carry, a top 20 average among backs with at least 50 attempts. Offensive lineman Pat Elfein started the final six games at left guard after being claimed, while cornerback Corey Ballentine averaged 26.2 yards per return, a top 11 average among players with at least 10 kickoff returns. Conversely, Douglas continued to add to the club's draft capital by trading McLendon and Avery Williamson.

While Douglas' first season (2019) with the Jets did not end with the desired result, the roster showed resiliency as several players took on unexpected roles for a team that saw just two players start 16 games. The Jets were forced to use 15 different offensive starting lineups and 14 different defensive starting lineup combinations. Despite the injuries, Douglas buoyed a roster that finished 6-2 over the final eight weeks by acquiring players, in every available avenue possible, after his hire.

Although he started after free agency and the draft, Douglas also brought in a number of key contributors in his first season as general manager (2019), claiming wide receiver/punt returner Braxton Berrios and defensive lineman John Franklin-Myers. Since joining the Jets, Berrios has averaged 10.5 yards per punt return (fifth in the league among players with at least 30 returns), while also posting single-season bests in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns in 2020. DL John Franklin-Myers, who missed his entire first season with the Jets, returned in 2020 to finish top five on the team in tackles for loss and sacks, while tying for second in quarterback hits.

Douglas also added three 10+ game starters following his hire in tight end Ryan Griffin, a free agent signing the day before training camp, guard Alex Lewis, a training camp trade, and wide receiver Demaryius Thomas, a Week Two trade with New England, the first such trade between the two franchises in over 25 years.

Griffin, signed before training camp, caught five touchdown passes, tied for third in the conference and one of just eight tight ends in franchise history with at least five TD catches, while safety Matthias Farley, a free agent added right before the start of the regular season, was named special teams captain in 2020, leading the Jets in special teams tackles since 2019.

Throughout his time in the league, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl championship rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery - as well as a pair of street free agents - Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith - all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015).

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of

prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Mechanicsville (VA) HS, formerly Lee-Davis, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

ROBERT SALEH (*pronounced: SAH-luh*) was named the head coach of the New York Jets by Vice Chairman Christopher Johnson on January 19, 2021. With Saleh and General Manager Joe Douglas, Johnson envisions a partnership that will, “Foster and develop the winning culture we are striving to establish.”

“It was clear to us that Robert was the right person to help us move forward,” Johnson continued in his statement. “He is a collaborative leader with proven success in the NFL. I know he will develop the players on our roster, hold them accountable, and put them in a position to succeed. Most importantly, I believe they will connect with him.”

Connecting with players has been a constant under Saleh. “They need a personal investment made into them so they can develop into being great football players,” he said after being hired. “They want to get to their second contract and be rewarded for what they’ve gone through, and so players should expect that from their coaches, and from the organization. It is an absolute joy to see them hit the pinnacle of their career, where they get rewarded for it. To give that and understand that part is just being human to me.”

“All Gas, No Brake,” for Saleh, it is a mindset that goes beyond the team’s practice and preparation to everything they do, on and off the field. More than just the players and coaches, it is about the entire organization stepping on the gas and getting better each and every day.

“He has a plan for the identity of this team and a clear plan to achieve it,” Douglas said. “He’s an unbelievable teacher, his teaching methods are outstanding. And then just the stories of him connecting, engaging, and creating buy-in, it was very impressive.”

That buy-in was evident early in his career, as linebacker Paul Posluszny reflected on Saleh, his former position coach in Jacksonville, “You look at him, the command presence, the understanding that he had for not only what the linebackers need to do on the field but the entire defense, the way he was able to communicate things in a crystal-clear manner,” Posluszny said. “He has that type of presence and that type of influence over his players.”

Now in his 17th season coaching in the NFL, Saleh spent the last four seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. Since 2017, his group ranked third in the league in passing yards allowed (211.4), holding opposing quarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%), while producing Pro Bowl players at linebacker (Fred Warner), cornerback (Richard Sherman) and defensive line (Nick Bosa & DeForest Buckner), while Bosa was also selected as the 2019 Defensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press.

The last two seasons under Saleh, the 49ers defense led the league in passing defense (188.6), ranking in the top 10 in passer rating allowed (85.8), completion percentage allowed (62.4%), tackles for loss (154) and defensive touchdowns (six), while also helping San Francisco advance to Super Bowl LIV.

In 2020, despite an injury-plagued season, Saleh’s unit still finished fifth in the league in total defense and fourth in passing defense, getting career seasons from cornerback Jason Verrett, whose started 13 games after playing in just six total the previous four seasons and defensive lineman Kerry Hyder, who started 14 games after logging more than 450 snaps in a season just once in his five previous years in the league as he became one of just 11 defensive linemen with at least 8.0 sacks, 15 quarterback hits and 40 total tackles.



A key part of the team's Super Bowl LIV run in 2019, Saleh's defense finished second in total defense, first in passing defense and third in third-down defense, while producing 48 sacks, tied for the fifth most in the league, and 28 takeaways, the sixth most. The San Francisco defensive line saw four players – Arik Armstead (10.0), Bosa (9.0), Buckner (7.5) and Dee Ford (6.5) – all produce at least 6.5 sacks, the only team in the NFL to have four-or-more players with 6.5-or-more sacks. In the postseason, the defense allowed just over 300 yards per game, holding opponents to just 31.4% on third down and producing seven total takeaways, including two interceptions of league MVP Patrick Mahomes in the Super Bowl, the only game Mahomes had more than one interception that season.

In Saleh's second season with the 49ers (2018), the defense was one of six to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game than they did the previous season. In 2017, his first as a coordinator, San Francisco allowed .62 yards fewer per play, the third best improvement in the league. Over the final eight weeks, they ranked second in the league in rushing yards allowed and fourth in yards per carry.

Coaching linebackers for three seasons in Jacksonville, Saleh oversaw a linebacker group that included Posluszny and Telvin Smith, as the pair each finished in the top five in the league in total tackles between 2015-16 (according to Radar360). The team's linebackers were also a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016, and fifth in rushing average allowed in 2015.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach, responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers, while learning an important lesson from Head Coach Pete Carroll:

"The biggest influence I took from Coach Carroll is from a philosophy standpoint," Saleh said in 2017. "Understanding who you are as a person. Understanding what's important to you as a person. And, how to apply it to the message that you're trying to deliver. Understanding that everybody has a style and that every style is the right style provided you apply it in the right way. So, just from a philosophy standpoint, speaking to people, handling people is where I have my greatest growth from Coach Carroll."

In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wagner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth-round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections. A part of the Seahawks Super Bowl XLVIII winning staff, another of the team's linebackers, seventh-round pick Malcolm Smith, earned MVP honors after Smith registered nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a 69-yard interception returned for a touchdown.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), becoming a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10). Linebackers DeMeco Ryans (2006) and Brain Cushing (2009) each earned Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year honors while Saleh was there and were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2009. That season, the tandem finished in the top 10 in the league in total tackles (according to Radar360).

Before his start as an NFL coach, Saleh spent four seasons coaching college football at Georgia (2005), Central Michigan (2004), and began his coaching career at Michigan State (2002) as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach, before becoming a defensive assistant/defensive line the following season.

A native of Dearborn, MI, Saleh attended Northern Michigan University where he started for four years at tight end. He earned his finance degree, beginning a career as a credit analyst before getting into coaching.

Saleh and his wife, Sanaa, have seven children, sons, Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, and Jacob, and daughters, Mila and Ella. Born to Lebanese parents, Sam and Fatin, he is considered one of three Arab-American head coaches in NFL history and believed to be the first Muslim-American head coach.

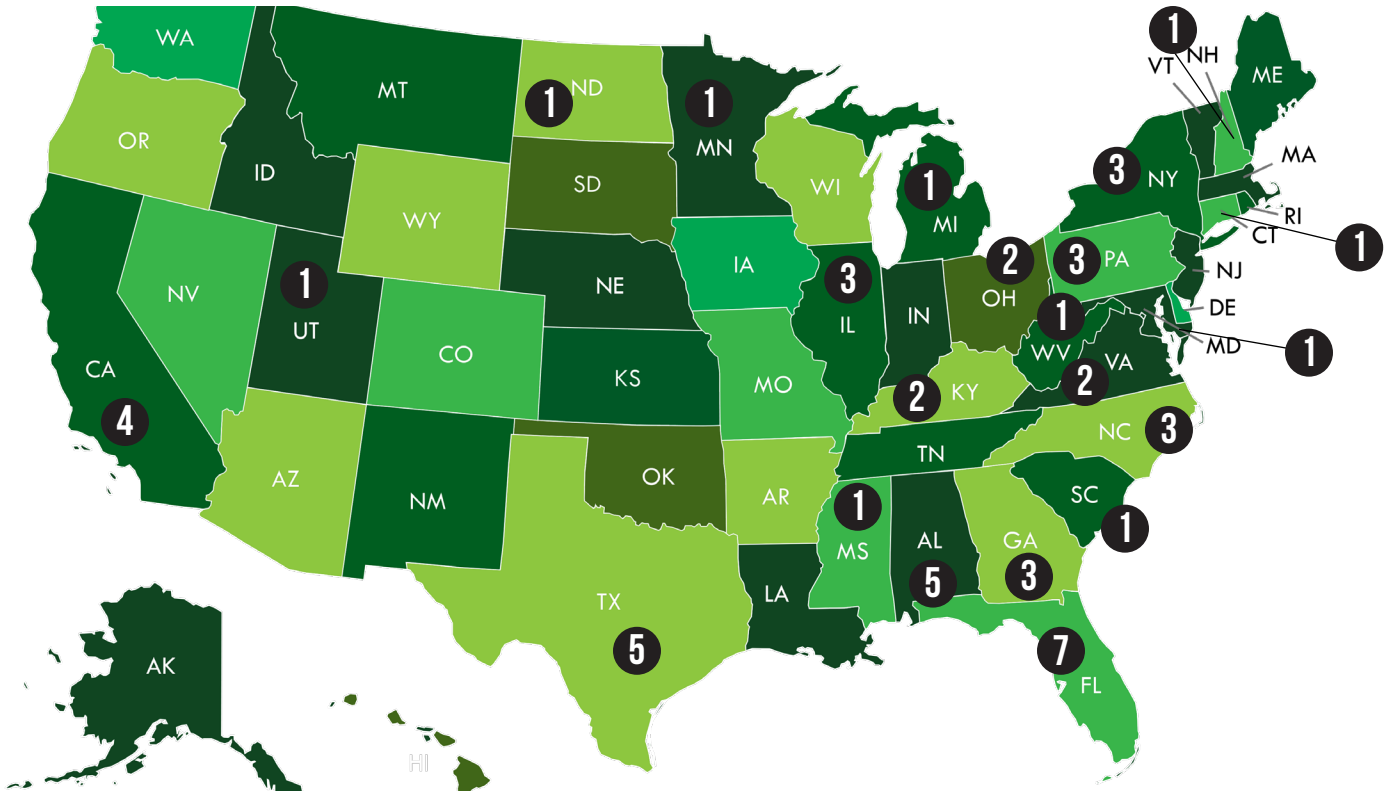

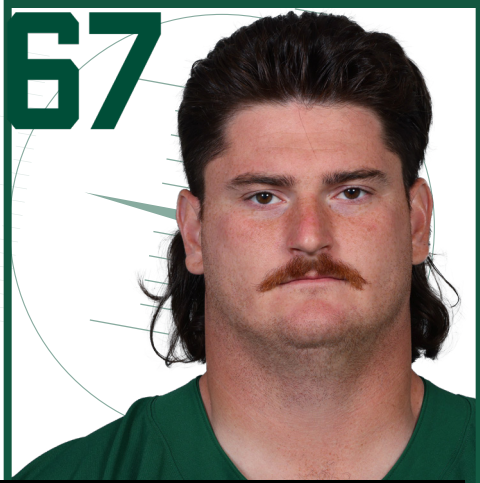
