


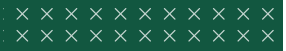

HEADLINES

MAKING HIS MARK: Since being named General Manager in June 2019, Joe Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout the year, and made steady in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Since his appointment just over two seasons ago, almost 97% of the roster was acquired or extended by him, with over 73% coming in the last two years.

PREMIUM PICKS: Over the last three drafts, Douglas has positioned the team to pick eight times in the first 36 selections, including five first-round picks. All of these selections from the 2020-21 Drafts have had an immediate impact on the team and named starters.

FREE AGENT ACQUISITIONS: Beyond the team's draft assets, Douglas has remained active in free agency, viewing it as another opportunity to add character and depth to the roster. This offseason (2022), the Jets added multiple veterans with Super Bowl experience as cornerback D.J. Reed, Pro Bowl guard Laken Tomlinson, tight end C.J. Uzomah, and safety Jordan Whitehead have all played in one of the last three Super Bowls.



On the acquisition of Safety Jordan Whitehead...

It helps a lot, he has seen a lot of success, he's seen the blueprint for it, the work effort, the study habits off the field, so he can provide to the young players that same energy, that same mindset, and to our whole organization. When you get players from other teams that comes from winning organizations and that have been around that success and have been around that blueprint, they can help spread that to what we have here.

Among the priorities for Douglas has been remaking the offensive line and in addition to adding first-round picks in his first two drafts – Becton and Vera-Tucker – has signed three free agents, tackle George Fant and center Connor McGovern, who both graded as top 10 players at their position last season (2021) according to Pro Football Focus, and Tomlinson, who made the Pro Bowl in 2021. Additionally, Douglas re-signed both 2019 waiver claims, wide receiver/return specialist Braxton Berrios, a 2021 first-team All-Pro selection, and defensive lineman John Franklin-Myers, the team leader in pressures, hits and co-leader in sacks (2021).

EARLY IMPACT: Last season, Saleh and his staff oversaw the league's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13. Rookie and second-year players played a total of 8,094 snaps for the Jets in 2021. Additionally, rookies started a league-high 76 games. They became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards.

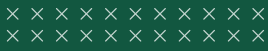

Over the last two seasons, rookie cornerback **SAUCE GARDNER**, a two-time All-American was among the best in his draft class leading all corners in yards per target allowed (4.45) and the only without a touchdown allowed.

.796

Defensive lineman **BRYCE HUFF** ranked fifth in the league last season among players with at least 100 pass rush snaps in average get-off (time it takes for the player to pass the line of scrimmage) with a time of 0.796 seconds • Among the top 10 times in the league last season, **HUFF** is the only player not drafted in the first four rounds.

1st

The Jets special teams ranked first in the league last season with a kick return average of 27.4 • While the Jets also ranked second in the league with a punt return average of 12.1, they were the only team ranked in the top five in both.

1st

During Week 16 vs. JAX (12/26) last season, quarterback **ZACH WILSON** finished with 91 rushing yards and a TD, becoming the first NFL QB to rush for 90+ and a TD on four carries or less • His 52-yard touchdown run established a franchise mark for the longest TD run by a QB.

With both a rushing and receiving touchdown in Week 16 vs. JAX (12/26) last season, wide receiver **BRAXTON BERRIOS**, a 2021 All-Pro selection, became the only Jets wide receiver in franchise history with a rushing and receiving TD in the same regular season game.

Cornerback **MICHAEL CARTER II** was one of three rookies in the league last season with at least four tackles for loss and four passes defended • He is one of only four Jets rookies to do so since 2000.

2+

Safety **ASHTYN DAVIS** was one of nine safeties in the league last season with two+ forced fumbles and two+ interceptions • He is one of five Jets safeties with 2+ INTs and 2+ FFs in a season since 2000.

3rd

Second-year cornerback **BRANDIN ECHOLS** finished tied for third among all rookies last season in interceptions • He is the only Jets rookie drafted in the sixth round or later (since 2000) to have two INTs in a season.

5th

Running back **TY JOHNSON** is tied for the fifth-most games (5) by a Jets running back since 1970 to record 40 or more receiving yards in a game.

6.0

Defensive lineman **JOHN FRANKLIN-MYERS** became the first defensive lineman on the Jets last season to have 6.0 sacks and an interception in a single season since Muhammad Wilkerson in 2013 • At HST (11/28/21), **FRANKLIN-MYERS** became one of just three Jets players to have 2.0 sacks and an interception in a single-season game in franchise history.

8+

The Jets finished tied for third in the NFL last season with three games of at least eight TFLs and one of three Jets defenses since 2000 with three games of at least eight TFLs.

9

Linebacker **QUINCY WILLIAMS** led the team last season with nine tackles for loss, while his 107 total tackles were a single-season high • He is one of five LBs from his draft class (2019) with a 100-plus tackle season.

10

After connecting on all seven of his field goal attempts since joining the team in Week 14 last season, kicker **EDDY PIÑEIRO** currently holds the longest active streak (10 games) of connecting on all FG attempts.

DL **QUINNEN WILLIAMS**, the team's **WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR** nominee last season, ranked in the top 10 among all interior defensive linemen with 500+ snaps in sacks (2nd), stuffs (7th) and stop percentage (4th) last season according to Next Gen Stats.

12

Registering a team-high 12 special teams tackles last season, cornerback **JUSTIN HARDEE** is one of 13 Jets with 10+ special teams tackles in the past 10 seasons.

13

After registering 13 tackles vs. BUF (1/9) last season, linebacker **C.J. MOSLEY** finished 11 games with 10+ tackles, the most 10+ tackle games in season by a Jet since 2005.

15+

Last season, cornerback **BRYCE HALL** ranked fifth among all players in the league with 16 passes defended • He is one of eight Jets players since 2000 to register at least 15 passes defended in a single season and one of only two to be drafted in the 5th round or later.

+89

2022 free-agent acquisition C.J. Uzomah gained +89 YAC over expected last season, the fifth-most among all tight ends, according to Next Gen Stats.

150+ & 1

For the first time since the 2015 season, the Jets offense rushed for 150+ yards and held opponents to one or fewer sacks in two consecutive games last season 12/26 vs. JAX & 1/2 vs. TB.

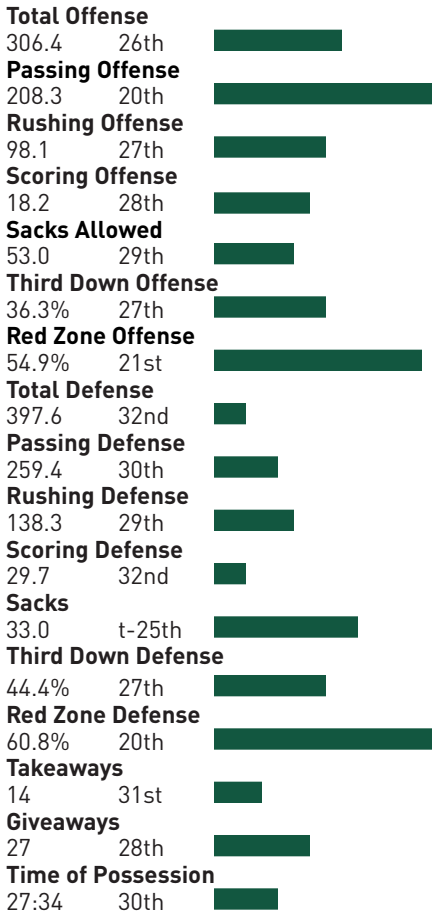

Last season, the Jets were the only team in the league with six different rookies to play at least 400 snaps on offense or defense, including **ALIYAH VERA-TUCKER** (975), **MICHAEL CARTER II** (743), **BRANDIN ECHOLS** (737), **ZACH WILSON** (709), **ELIJAH MOORE** (447) and **MICHAEL CARTER** (427).

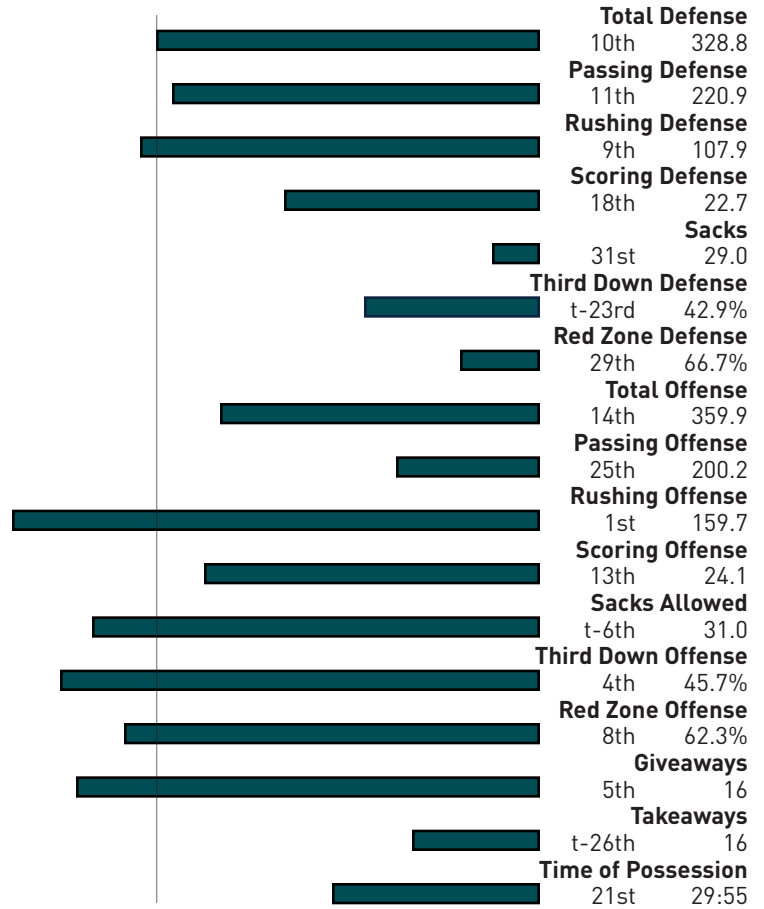

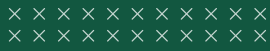

PROBABLE STARTERS

OFFENSE

WR 84 **COREY DAVIS** **6th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2021) • Selected as team captain by his teammates prior to the start of the 2021 season • Started all nine games played, missing the final five weeks on injured reserve • Averaged 14.5 yards per reception, the most by a Jet with at least 30 catches in 2021 and the second-best average of his career.

LT 76 **GEORGE FANT** **7th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2020) • Started 15 games last season, 14 at LT • Named the 2022 starter at left tackle • He finished 2021 with a pass blocking efficiency of 97.9, the third best among all tackles with at least 400 pass block snaps and the best among left tackles (according to Pro Football Focus). • Part of an offensive line that protected as the team threw for 250+ net yards in four-straight games (Weeks 8-11), the second longest streak by the Jets since 1970 • Fant allowed pressures on just 3.21% of snaps (18 total) in 2021, the best among all Jets tackles with 400 pass block snaps in a season since 2006.

LG 78 **LAKEN TOMLINSON** **8th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2022) • Has started 80 consecutive games at left guard, the second-longest active streak among all guards • Selected to the Pro Bowl last season after blocking for an offense that ranked seventh in rushing yards (2,166) and tied for fifth in rushing touchdowns (22) • Has appeared in 112 out of 113 possible games throughout his career.

C 67 **CONNOR MCGOVERN** **5th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2020) • Started all 15 games he appeared in at center last season • Graded by Pro Football Focus as the ninth overall center in 2021 with an overall grade of 75.9 (minimum 500 snaps).

RG 75 **ALIJAH VERA-TUCKER** **2nd Season**

First-round draft pick (2021) • Started in all 16 games he appeared in last season • Tied for the second fewest sacks allowed (2), among the 16 rookie offensive linemen in the league with at least 500 snaps (according to Pro Football Focus) • Part of an offensive line that gained 157 yards rushing vs. HST (11/28), with three different RBs gaining over 4.0 yards per carry.

RT 77 **MEKHI BECTON** **3rd Season**

First-round draft pick (2020) • Started on kickoff weekend, but missed the rest of the season with an injury suffered in the game • Started 13-of-14 games as a rookie, the first Jets rookie offensive lineman to start on Kickoff Weekend since D. Ferguson/N. Mangold (2006).

TE 87 **C.J. UZOMAH** **8th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2022) • Started all 16 games he played last season and totaled career-bests in all receiving categories, including yards (493), touchdowns (five) and receptions (49) • Hauled in 15 receptions in the 2021 postseason, tied for the eighth most in a single postseason in the last decade by a tight end, as the team advanced to Super Bowl LVI.

WR 8 **ELIJAH MOORE** **2nd Season**

Second-round draft pick (2021) • Led the team in receiving yards (538), the first rookie to do so since 1995 (Wayne Chrebet), and receiving touchdowns (five) • Over his final six games (Weeks Eight through 13), averaged 76.5 yards on 5.7 receptions and scored five touchdowns, all top 11 rankings in the league in that span

QB 2 **ZACH WILSON** **2nd Season**

Selected second overall (2021) • Named team captain by his teammates at the start of the 2021 regular season • Over his final seven games after he returned from injury, scored nine total touchdowns and just three turnovers, ranking in the top two in both categories among rookie QBs • Closed the season without an interception in 156 passes, the longest streak by any Jets quarterback since 2000, the longest ever by a Jets rookie and the second-longest active streak in the League • 1st NFL QB to rush for 90+ yards and a TD on four carries or less in a game.

RB 32 **MICHAEL CARTER** **2nd Season**

Fourth-round draft pick (2021) • Second youngest Jet to run for 100 yards after gaining 118 Week 16 vs. JAX • One of just 10 rookies with 600+ rushing yards and 300+ receiving yards in a season.

FB 48 **NICK BAWDEN** **4th Season**

Signed to the practice squad during the season (2021) • Appeared in nine games last season • Finished the season in the top 10 among all NFL fullbacks in run blocking (74.9, ranked third), pass blocking (73.6, ranked 10th), and total offensive grade (73.2, ranked fourth) according to Pro Football Focus.

KEY RESERVES

WR 10 **BRAXTON BERRIOS** **5th Season**

Re-signed as an unrestricted free agent (2022) • Became the only Jets WR in franchise history with a rushing and receiving TD in the same regular season game and one of three WRs in the league last season with 2 rushing and 2 receiving TDs • Totaled single-season bests with 431 yards receiving, 46 receptions, 40 yards rushing, and two rushing touchdowns on seven carries.

QB 19 **JOE FLACCO** **15th Season**

Re-signed as an unrestricted free agent (2022) • Since entering the league (2008), ranks in the top 10 among all active players in wins, winning percentage, attempts, completions, passing yards, touchdown passes, 300-yard passing games, and 100+ QB rating games • Ranks in the top seven among all active QBs in passing yards and touchdowns for his career • Super Bowl XLVII MVP.

TE 83 **TYLER CONKLIN** **5th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2022) • Appeared in all 17 games last season, making 15 starts • Among all tight ends last season (2021), finished tied for the ninth most receptions (61), gaining 593 yards • Over his last 21 games (Week 14 of 2020 through 2021 season), has produced over 80% of his career receptions (76), receiving yards (761) and explosive receptions (15), while also scoring all of his touchdowns.

WR 17 **GARRETT WILSON** **Rookie**

Selected 10th overall (2022) • Finished his career at Ohio State in the top 10 in school history in receptions (143), receiving yards (2,213) and touchdown catches (23), while also ranking in the top five in receptions per game (4.3) and 100-yard games (10) • Earned first-team All-American honors in his final season by the Football Writers Association and The Athletic after he caught 70 passes for 1,054 yards and 12 touchdowns.

RB 20 **BREECE HALL** **Rookie**

Second-round draft pick (2022) • Two-time first-team All-American and two-time Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year at Iowa State • Finished his three-year career as the school's second-leading rusher and first with 56 scrimmage touchdowns, one of 11 Cyclone records he finished with • Set FBS record with a touchdown in 24 straight games.

WR 11 **DENZEL MIMS** **3rd Season**

Second-round draft pick (2020) • Appeared in 11 games (three starts), missing Weeks 10-12 on reserve/COVID • Totaled 133 yards on eight receptions (16.6 average) • Of those eight catches, five produced a first down and four were explosive receptions (16+ yards).

QB 5 **MIKE WHITE** **4th Season**

Restricted free agent signing (2022) • Started three games at quarterback last season • Named **AFC Offensive Player of the Week** in Week Eight (2021) after he became the first player in NFL history with 300+ passing yards and a 75% comp. pct. in his first start, after throwing for 405 yards, the first Jet with 400+ yards since 2000.

SPECIALISTS

K 15 **EDDY PIÑEIRO** **4th Season**

In-season free agent signing (2021) • Connected on all eight field goal attempts, one of seven kickers to close last season with at least eight consecutive made attempts • Holds the second-longest active streak among all players in the NFL with 19 consecutive field goals (dating back to 2019).

LS 42 **THOMAS HENNESSY** **6th Season**

Preseason trade (2017) from IND • The longest tenured Jet, he has appeared in every game for the Jets since entering the league (2017), and leads all NFL long snappers in special teams tackles (18) in that span.

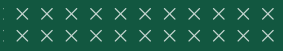
P 7 **BRADEN MANN** **3rd Season**

Sixth-round draft pick (2020) • Appeared in 10 games last season, missing eight weeks on injured reserve • Over the final four weeks of the 2021 season, ranked fourth among all players with at least five punts in net punting average (43.0) and second on punts inside the 20-yard line (nine).

K 14 **GREG ZUERLEIN** **11th Season**

Unrestricted free-agent signing (2022) • Third-fastest kicker in NFL History to reach 250 field goals made • Since entering the league in 2012, his 264 field goals made rank second among all active kickers.

DL 95 **QUINNEN WILLIAMS** **4th Season**

Selected third overall (2019) • Selected as the team's Walter Payton Man of the Year nominee, Marty Lyons Community Service Award winner and Kyle Clifton "Good Guy" Award winner last season • Finished the season as the team co-leader in sacks (6.0) and ranked second in quarterback hits (12).

DL 19 **SOLOMON THOMAS** **6th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2022) • Appeared in all 17 games last season and registered 34 tackles, as well as single-season bests in sacks (3.5), quarterback hits (12), passes defended (two), and forced fumbles (two).

EDGE 58 **CARL LAWSON** **6th Season**

Unrestricted FA signing (2021) • Missed the 2021 season after being placed on IR during training camp • Despite missing the entire 2021 season, is one of just five players in the league with multiple games of 5+ quarterback hits since 2020.

EDGE 91 **JOHN FRANKLIN-MYERS** **5th Season**

Roster cutdown waiver claim (2019) from LAR • Signed a contract extension Week Five last season • Started all 16 games played last season • Led the team in quarterback hits (14) and QB pressures (43), while tied for the lead in sacks (6.0), posting a single-season best in all three.

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN



ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family’s proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning arena that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world and most recently recognized by Billboard as stadium of the decade. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the ‘Special Relationship’ between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies. While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy’s historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state of the art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States’ interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the ‘Special Relationship.’

Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson’s philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities.

Among the Foundation’s programs is the launch of the first Girls High School Flag Football League in New Jersey.

In 2022, the Jets announced a \$1 million donation to help aid the people of Ukraine, with the money distributed among various organizations, each receiving \$100,000, over the course of a year. For Johnson, the events in Ukraine are personal; his wife, Suzanne, grew up in a Ukrainian neighborhood in New York. Her mother, Marie, was born to Ukrainian immigrant parents while Suzanne’s father, Stefan Ircha, was originally from Ternopil, a town outside of Kyiv, and immigrated to the United States after WWII. The Johnson family recently traveled to Poland to meet with Ukrainian refugees and understand firsthand how the unprovoked invasion has impacted their lives.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson’s healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$214 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of two new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation’s largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans. Currently, the Ambassador is an active member of the NFL’s Investment Committee and Stadium Committee.

CHRISTOPHER W. JOHNSON

VICE CHAIRMAN



CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, a fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has overseen pivotal changes within the organization, appointing the team’s football and business management. A key part of the New York Jets leadership since 2000, Johnson begins his second season as vice chairman, working alongside his brother, Chairman Robert Wood Johnson.

In his new role, Johnson will provide continuity after overseeing the promotion of team President Hymie Elhai, and the hiring of General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh in his time as chairman & CEO. In these three, Johnson is confident he found collaborative leaders who will unify the Jets in their shared goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

Previously serving as the Jets chairman & CEO (2017-21), Johnson has spent the past four years developing a strong bond with the players, working closely with them to advance the programs and initiatives they deem important. In 2020, Johnson addressed the team and discussed how they all—Johnson, coaches, executives, and players—could use their powerful platform to influence positive change.

To support this goal, Johnson and the Jets donated \$1 million to four partner organizations in December of 2020, with each organization—All Stars Project, Innocence Project, New York Urban League and Year Up—receiving \$250,000. These organizations mirror the Jets’ and Johnson’s focus on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality, and workforce development. The players, coaches and staff will continue to work to reduce barriers and create opportunities for individuals in need on various upcoming volunteer projects championed by the organization.

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson, his family, and the Jets donated \$3 million to support those in need in the New York and New Jersey areas. In March of 2020, they pledged \$1 million to support the United Way of New York City’s COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey’s ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island’s United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19. A month later, they donated \$2 million to organizations focused primarily on food insecurity, first responders and regional relief.

Johnson currently serves as an active member of the NFL’s Media Owned and Operated committee.

A dedicated advocate of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. Named for his mother, the late Betty Wold Johnson, the Center aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.

HYMIE ELHAI

PRESIDENT



HYMIE ELHAI (pronounced *HI-me EL-hi*) begins his fourth season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment in 2019. Now in his 23rd year with the team, Elhai’s impact has been felt throughout the organization and been defined by his unwavering commitment, a passionate goal to redefine the culture of the organization, and a steady hand of leadership and strategic planning.

Under Elhai, who has garnered league and industry respect by his peers during his tenure, the Jets have solidified their business staff’s senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations, bringing his balance and perspective to those various departments, including: Communications, Community Relations, Content, Corporate & Premium Partnerships, Events & Game Operations, Facilities, Finance, Information Technology, Legal & Human Resources, Marketing, Security and Ticketing.

Playing a key role in hiring of the football leadership, Elhai worked with Christopher W. Johnson to hire General Manager Joe Douglas in 2019, and with both Johnson and Douglas to hire Head Coach Robert Saleh in 2021.

The collaboration among Elhai, Douglas and Saleh forms the foundation that has moved the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning, and innovative franchise on and off the field. Throughout his time as president, he has worked closely with the football staff, providing counsel and support for various organizational-encompassing objectives. Additionally, in his previous role as general counsel, he helped football administration on all planning initiatives.

Among the important initiatives under Elhai was the formation of the Social Justice, Diversity and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) and the expansion of the Jets Women’s Organization (JWO).

The SJDIT helps steer the Jets as it relates to the process and execution of the team’s Social Justice efforts as well as internal diversity and inclusion practices. The JWO now encompasses the many women affiliated with the organization, including staff members, wives and significant others of coaches, players, and football personnel, serving as a unique outlet to positively impact the workplace, industry, and community.

During the COVID-19 outbreak, Elhai and his staff worked closely with New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy’s office and the NFL, as the team developed their protocols. Prioritizing employee safety, his communication and direction helped manage the unprecedented uncertainty of a global pandemic, keeping the business staff optimized despite working remotely.

Elhai, who was born in Queens, NY and grew up a Jets fan often frequenting games at Shea Stadium, began his Jets career in 2000 as an intern. He previously served as the club’s senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel, where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters.

Elhai currently serves as a member of the NFL’s CBA player benefits plan committee.

In October 2021, Elhai received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Rutgers School of Law at their 2021 Alumni Recognition Gala.

A Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 honoree, Elhai is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and The Johns Hopkins University, where he played football and baseball. Elhai resides in Hoboken, NJ.

JOE DOUGLAS

GENERAL MANAGER

MECHANICSVILLE, VA RICHMOND

JOE DOUGLAS begins his fourth season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 23rd season in the National Football League, Douglas, a three-time Super Bowl winning executive, continues to put his stamp on the organization.

The organization's vision for Douglas was not just about the ability to construct a roster. "A general manager must be more than just a talent evaluator. He must be able to build and sustain a winning culture," Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson said after announcing Douglas' hire. "That includes a commitment to collaboration and earning the trust of his colleagues."

Johnson's confidence in Douglas was on display as they, along with team president, Hymie Elhai, led the search for the team's new head coach. In hiring Robert Saleh, Johnson is confident that the first-year head coach will join with Douglas and Elhai to form the cohesive foundation that brings the Jets to their goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor, former Ravens General Manager Ozzie Newsome, and he has stayed true to his core principle that successful teams are built by people with the right level of commitment, character and competence, as Douglas looks to develop and sustain to what he characterizes as, "the best culture in sports."

Since taking the position, Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout

the year, and made steadying in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Since his appointment just over two seasons ago, almost 97% of the roster was acquired or extended by him, with over 73% coming in the last two years.

For Douglas, roster construction isn't a quick fix. "Ultimately, I think when you look at successful organizations, no matter what the sport, you don't see a lot of teams that build long-term success by buying their way out of it," he said in 2020. "You see the teams, the organizations that have long-term success, they draft well, and they develop their players."

Since his hire, Douglas has improved the team's financial flexibility and added a number of draft assets, both by trading players with expiring contracts and draft-day deals. Through those deals, most notably the acquisition of two first-round picks and a third-round pick for safety Jamal Adams, as well as a second-round pick, fourth-round pick and sixth-round pick for quarterback Sam Darnold, the Jets have picked in the first two rounds of the 2021 and 2022 drafts seven times, including five first-round selections.

Entering any draft, the mission for Douglas is always the same – add difference makers that fit within the culture and scheme. Over his three drafts as the general manager (2020-22), he has done just that, using top 40 picks on both sides of the ball, selecting cornerback Sauce Gardner (No. 4, 2022), wide receiver Garrett Wilson (No. 10, 2022), edge Jermaine Johnson (No. 26, 2022), running back Breece Hall (No. 36, 2022), quarterback Zach Wilson (No. 2, 2021), Alijah Vera-Tucker (No. 14, 2021), wide receiver Elijah Moore (No. 34, 2021) and tackle Mekhi Becton (No. 11, 2020), while showing mobility in both drafts to target key players via moving up, first with Alijah Vera-Tucker and again this year with Jermaine Johnson.

Beyond the first and second rounds, Douglas has added starters and depth throughout the draft, notably the



team's leading rusher last year (2021) in fourth-round rookie running back Michael Carter as well as cornerback Bryce Hall, the first ever 17-game regular season starter for the Jets who finished sixth in the league in passes defended in his second year (2021).

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager (2020) was also the NFL's first ever virtual draft as a result of COVID-19 global pandemic, he showed no signs of being a rookie, despite drafting from his home, and turned eight draft picks and Leonard Williams' expiring contract into 13 players, while also adding key undrafted free agents.

As with the draft picks, matching character and talent has shown to be key when Douglas has used free agency to add to the roster. This offseason (2022), the Jets added multiple veterans with Super Bowl experience as cornerback D.J. Reed, Pro Bowl guard Laken Tomlinson, tight end C.J. Uzomah, and safety Jordan Whitehead have all played in one of the last three Super Bowls.

Among the priorities for Douglas has been remaking the offensive line and in addition to adding first-round picks in his first two drafts – Becton and Vera-Tucker – has signed three free agents, tackle George Fant and center Connor McGovern, who both graded as top 10 players at their position last season (2021) according to Pro Football Focus, and Tomlinson, who made the Pro Bowl in 2021.

Another key for Douglas in constructing the Jets has been waiver claims, using both at final cuts and the wire throughout the season to provide depth and reinforce the roster. Additionally, among his first claims (2019) were wide receiver/return specialist Braxton Berrios, a 2021 first-team All-Pro selection, and defensive lineman John Franklin-Myers, the team leader in pressures, hits and co-leader in sacks (2021) who signed a long-term extension last season. He has also added players like Quincy Williams (2021), the team's second-leading tackler in his first season with the Jets (2021) and Ty Johnson (2020) who has averaged over 4.25 yards per carry with 50 receptions since being claimed.

Throughout his time in the league, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl winning rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl.

A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015).

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Mechanicsville (VA) HS, formerly Lee-Davis, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

ROBERT SALEH

ROBERT SALEH (pronounced: SAH-luh) was named the head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2021. With Saleh and General Manager Joe Douglas, Chairman Robert Wood Johnson envisions a synergy that will bring the franchise to their ultimate goal.

"I think you have a synergy of people," Johnson said earlier this year. "Those two people particularly are on absolutely the same page. That's a positive. Joe knows exactly what Robert needs at every position and they have a long list and criteria that they're looking at."

"He is a collaborative leader," Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson said in a statement after Saleh's hiring. "I know he will develop the players on our roster, hold them accountable, and put them in a position to succeed. Most importantly, I believe they will connect with him."

Connecting with players has been a constant under Saleh. "They need a personal investment made into them so they can develop into being great football players," he said after being hired. "They want to be rewarded for what they've gone through, and so players should expect that from their coaches, and from the organization. It is an absolute joy to see them hit the pinnacle of their career, where they get rewarded for it. To give that and understand that part is just being human to me." "All Gas, No Brake," for Saleh, it is a mindset that goes beyond the team's practice and preparation to everything they do, on and off the field. More than just the players and coaches, it is about the entire organization stepping on the gas and getting better each and every day.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Saleh oversaw the league's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13. Rookies played 5,675 snaps for the Jets and started a league-high 76 games. They became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards. And while the results weren't always there, the scars and the experience gained through them were.

"These are all scars that they are getting," Saleh said during his first season. "They're learning. You have to learn not to lose first. Then, once you learn how not to lose, you figure out how to win. Then, once you learn how to win, you have to learn how to close games."

As the season progressed, the young roster did just that. Seven of the final eight games were within a score in the fourth quarter, compared to four of the first nine games. Playing those close games against six teams that finished with winning records, including three playoff teams, the team also improved their numbers on defense in points per game, yards per play, pass yards per attempt and yards per rush over the final seven weeks. On offense, they averaged 5.19 yards per carry over the final eight weeks, the second best in the league.

"We were at least one or two most rookie snaps in the league," Douglas said speaking after the final day of the 2021 Draft. "That's a hard thing for a coaching staff to do with so many young players, I think we all realize that. No one dipped their toe in the water, they cannonballed in, they attacked it, the entire staff developed these young players and the whole plan for that is to benefit the future. So, now we have a group of young players that have played a lot of snaps, a lot of quality NFL snaps. When they're called on to help us again, they're going to be ready. What Coach and his staff did, I can't say enough positive things about that."

Before joining the Jets, Saleh spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. Since 2017, his group ranked third in the league in passing yards allowed (211.4), holding opposing quarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%), while producing Pro Bowl players at linebacker (Fred Warner), cornerback (Richard Sherman) and defensive line (Nick Bosa & DeForest Buckner), while Bosa was also selected as the 2019 Defensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press.

The last two seasons under Saleh, the 49ers defense led the league in passing defense (188.6), ranking in the top 10 in passer rating allowed (85.8), completion percentage allowed (62.4%), tackles for loss (154) and defensive touchdowns (six), while also helping San Francisco advance to Super Bowl LIV.

ROBERT SALEH



In his final season with the 49ers (2020), Saleh's unit still finished fifth in the league in total defense and fourth in passing defense, despite an injury-plagued season, getting career years from cornerback Jason Verrett, who started 13 games after playing in just six total the previous four seasons and defensive lineman Kerry Hyder, who started 14 games after logging more than 450 snaps in a season just once in his five previous years in the league. Hyder finished the season as one of just 11 defensive linemen with at least 8.0 sacks, 15 quarterback hits and 40 total tackles.

A key part of the team's Super Bowl LIV run (2019), Saleh's defense finished second in total defense, first in passing defense and third in third-down defense, while producing 48 sacks (tied for the fifth most in the league) and 28 takeaways (the sixth most). The San Francisco defensive line saw four players – Arik Armstead (10.0), Bosa (9.0), Buckner (7.5) and Dee Ford (6.5) – all produce at least 6.5 sacks, the only team in the NFL to have four-or-more players with 6.5-or-more sacks. In the postseason, the defense allowed just over 300 yards per game, holding opponents to just 31.4% on third down and producing seven total takeaways, including two interceptions of league MVP Patrick Mahomes in the Super Bowl, the only game Mahomes had more than one interception that season.

In Saleh's second season with the 49ers (2018), the defense was one of six to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game than they did the previous season. In 2017, his first as a coordinator, San Francisco allowed .62 yards fewer per play, the third best improvement in the league. Over the final eight weeks, they ranked second in the league in rushing yards allowed and fourth in yards per carry.

Coaching linebackers for three seasons in Jacksonville, Saleh oversaw a linebacker group that included Posluszny and Telvin Smith as the pair each finished in the top five in the league in total tackles between 2015-16 (according to Radar360). The team's linebackers were also a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016, and fifth in rushing average allowed in 2015.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach, responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers, while learning an important lesson from Head Coach Pete Carroll:

"The biggest influence I took from Coach Carroll is from a philosophy standpoint," Saleh said in 2017. "Understanding who you are as a person. Understanding what's important to you as a person. And, how to apply it to the message that you're trying to deliver. Understanding that everybody has a style and that every style is the right style provided you apply it in the right way. So, just from a philosophy standpoint, speaking to people, handling people is where I have my greatest growth from Coach Carroll."

In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wagner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth-round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections. A part of the Seahawks Super Bowl XLVIII winning staff, another of the team's linebackers, seventh-round pick Malcolm Smith, earned MVP honors after Smith registered nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a 69-yard interception returned for a touchdown.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), becoming a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10). Linebackers DeMeco Ryans (2006) and Brain Cushing (2009) each earned Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year honors while Saleh was there and were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2009. That season, the tandem finished in the top 10 in the league in total tackles (according to Radar360).

Before his start as an NFL coach, Saleh spent four seasons coaching college football at Georgia (2005), Central Michigan (2004), beginning his coaching career at Michigan State (2002) as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach before becoming a defensive assistant/defensive line the following season.

A native of Dearborn, MI, Saleh attended Northern Michigan University where he started for four years at tight end. He earned his finance degree, beginning a career as a credit analyst before getting into coaching.

Saleh and his wife, Sanaa, have seven children, sons, Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, and Jacob, and daughters, Mila and Ella. Born to Lebanese parents, Sam and Fatin, he is considered one of three Arab-American head coaches in NFL history and believed to be the first Muslim-American head coach.
