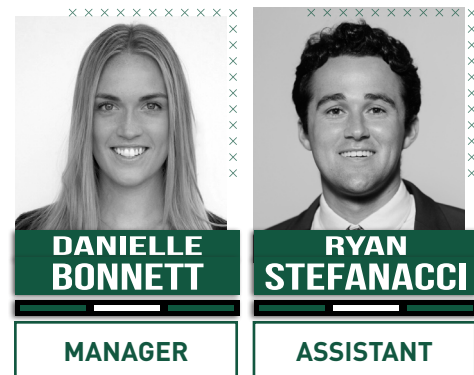
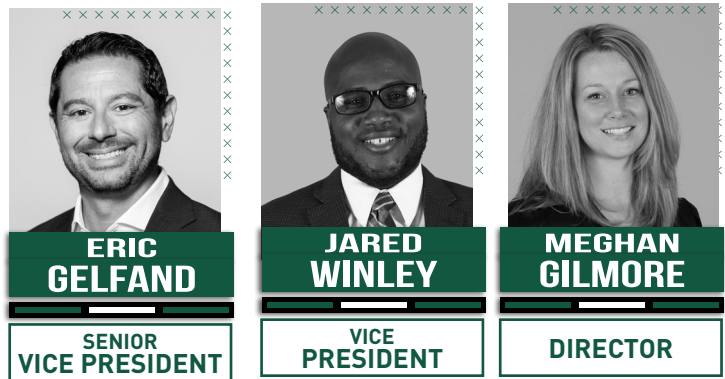

GAME NOTES



HEADLINES

CORNERBACK DUO: Cornerbacks **D.J. Reed** and rookie **Sauce Gardner** have both been **among the best** in the NFL in coverage this season. According to PFF, **Gardner** has recorded the **third-best** coverage grade this season (87.8), while **Reed** has recorded the **10th-best** (80.0).

Among players with a minimum of 350 coverage snaps this season, **Gardner** has allowed the **second-best** reception percentage (43.5%), while **Reed** has allowed the fourth-best (52.2%). Additionally, **Gardner's** 189 yards allowed are the **third-best**, while **Reed's** 244 yards allowed are the **sixth-best**.

Additionally, **Reed** and **Gardner** are the **only cornerback duo** in the NFL this season to each record at least 40 tackles, a tackle for loss, an interception and seven passes defensed.

IT STARTS UPFRONT: Entering training camp, the Jets projected offensive line was comprised of one new player (Laken Tomlinson) and four holdovers (George Fant, Connor McGovern, Alijah Vera-Tucker, and Mekhi Becton). The current line features four players who were acquired by the Jets in 2022 - Duane Brown, Tomlinson, Nate Herbig and Cedric Ogbuehi.

The success of the offensive line this season is a testament to the **depth at the position** and the investment the team has made in the group.

Despite the instability, the line has consistently produced at a high-level, allowing **minimal pressures** in games this season.

During the Week Nine victory vs. BUF (11/6), the Jets offensive line **did not allow a single pressure** on 29 pass plays against a top three pass-rushing defensive line. Additionally, according to TruMedia, the group **did not allow in a single pressure** in the first half, and **only one sack** in the third quarter and one in the fourth quarter.

Since Week Four, beginning when **Herbig** entered the starting lineup, **Herbig** and **Tomlinson** have combined to **allow zero sacks** and 13 quarterback pressures, according to Pro Football Focus. Of the 17 guard tandems where both players have played at least 300 snaps since Week Four, the 13 pressures allowed are the **fourth fewest**, while **only two other tandems** (BUF & DET) have allowed zero sacks.

STAND-OUT PERFORMER: With 92 receiving yards Week Nine vs. BUF (11/6), rookie wide receiver **Garrett Wilson** recorded the third 90+ yard receiving performance of his career. **Wilson leads all rookies** this season with those three games. Additionally, **Wilson is tied for sixth among all rookies since 2000** over their first nine games.

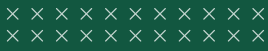

Of the 14 players to accomplish this, nine have made a Pro Bowl in their career, while five were selected to the Pro Bowl as rookies.

UNDEFEATED ON THE ROAD: The Jets are **one of two teams in the NFL** this season who remain **undefeated on the road** through Week 10, joining the Eagles who are also 4-0 on the road this year.

This marks the fifth time since 1970 the Jets have won at least four road games through the first 10 weeks and the first time since 2010.



BY THE NUMBERS

1

The Jets Week Nine matchup vs. BUF (11/6) marked the first time this season and only the sixth time in Josh Allen's career which he threw for zero touchdowns and two or more interceptions.

7

The Jets are one of seven teams in the NFL to have at least six different players record an interception this season (Michael Carter II, Ashtyn Davis, Sauce Gardner, Lamarcus Joyner, D.J. Reed, and Jordan Whitehead).

2

With safety **ASHTYN DAVIS'** interception on Cleveland's final offensive play in Week Two and safety **LAMARCUS JOYNER'S** interception on Pittsburgh's final offensive play in Week Four, the Jets account for two of five game-sealing interceptions this season.

7

Rookie cornerback **SAUCE GARDNER** is the only rookie since 2000 to produce at least one pass defended in each of his first seven games. His 13 PDs on the year are a League high.

3

Safety **LAMARCUS JOYNER** is tied for eighth in the NFL in interceptions this season with three. Additionally, Joyner is one of 13 players in the League to record at least two interceptions in the same game, after doing so Week Four at PIT (10/2).

9

Team captain and cornerback **JUSTIN HARDEE** has recorded a team-high nine special teams tackles this season, tied for the fifth-most in the NFL.

3.59

Since quarterback **ZACH WILSON'S** return in Week Four, the Jets rank second in the NFL in points per drive in the fourth quarter, averaging 3.59.

11

The Jets four-interception win at PIT during Week Five was only the second game with four interceptions in the League this season and the first without a passing touchdown allowed. The team's 11 interceptions on the season are tied for the third-most in the NFL.

4

Kicker **GREG ZUERLEIN** is one of two kickers in the League this season to convert 4/4 field goals from 40+ yards in a game, after doing so in Week Three vs. CIN (9/25) - 40, 43, 50, 53.

14

The Jets have recorded 14 takeaways this season, the most of a Jets team over the first nine weeks since 2018 (15) and tied for the eighth-most in the NFL this season.

4

The Jets are one of four teams in the NFL since 2000 to record a blocked punt for a touchdown and a blocked field goal within the same game, after doing so Week Six at GB (10/16).

16

Defensive lineman **CARL LAWSON** is tied for sixth in the NFL this season in quarterback hits (16). Lawson is one of five players in the NFL to record at least 4.0 sacks, 16 quarterback hits and 33 QB pressures this season.

5

Cornerback **DJ REED** is one of five players in the NFL this season to record at least 40 tackles, one tackle for loss, an interception, seven passes defended and a forced fumble.

48

In Week Nine, DL **BRYCE HUFF** registered a strip sack on Josh Allen, leading to third-and-21 on the final Buffalo drive. Huff has registered 1.5 sacks from Weeks Seven to Nine on 48 defensive snaps, one of only four players this season to accomplish this feat.

Rookie edge rusher **JERMAINE JOHNSON** has recorded the best sack rate (5.1%) on his rushes among all rookie edge rushers this season (min. 40 pass rush snaps).

83.1

Rookie defensive lineman **MICHEAL CLEMONS** has recorded the fourth-highest run defense grade among all edge rushers in the NFL this season (83.1), according to PFF.

6

From Weeks Two through Six, wide receiver **COREY DAVIS** recorded a reception of 20+ yards in five straight games, one of 12 players in the NFL to do so this year.

84.8

Defensive Lineman **QUINNEN WILLIAMS** has recorded the highest pass rush grade (according to PFF) on the team this season (84.8), among rushers with a minimum 50 snaps and currently leads the team in sacks (7.0). Additionally, his 17 quarterback hits are tied for the fourth-most in the NFL.

6th

This season, the Jets are tied for the sixth-best winning percentage in one-score games (+/- 8 points), earning victories in four of five such contests.

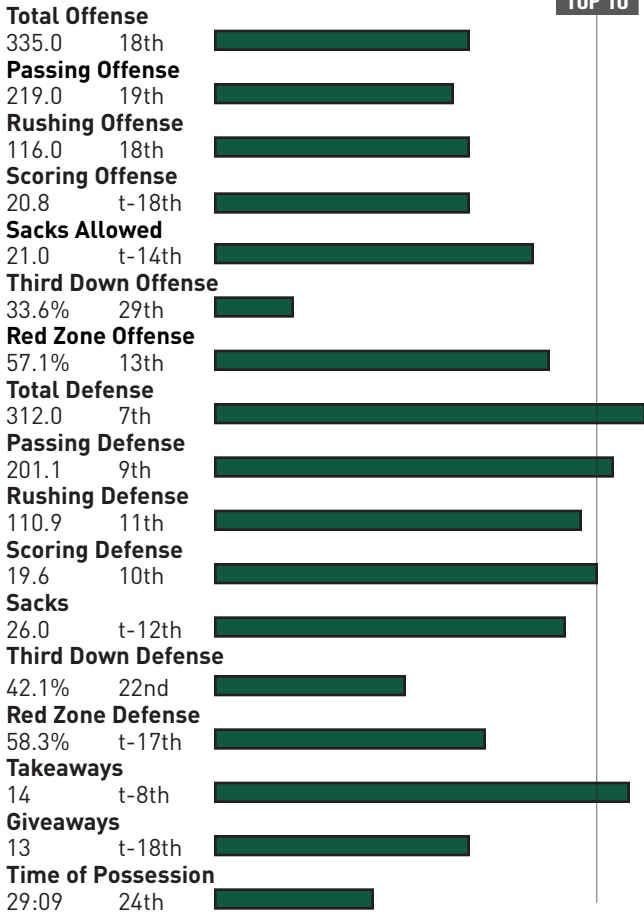

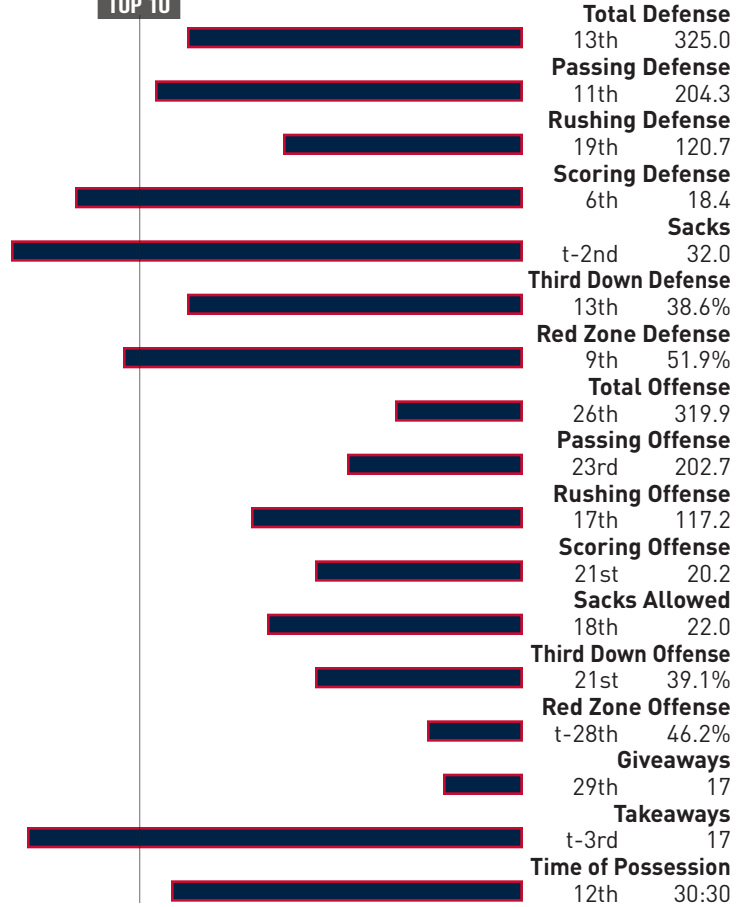

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN



ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family’s proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning arena that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world and most recently recognized by Billboard as stadium of the decade. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the ‘Special Relationship’ between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies. While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy’s historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state of the art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States’ interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the ‘Special Relationship.’

Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson’s philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities.

Among the Foundation’s programs is the launch of the first Girls High School Flag Football League in New Jersey.

In 2022, the Jets announced a \$1 million donation to help aid the people of Ukraine, with the money distributed among various organizations, each receiving \$100,000, over the course of a year. For Johnson, the events in Ukraine are personal; his wife, Suzanne, grew up in a Ukrainian neighborhood in New York. Her mother, Marie, was born to Ukrainian immigrant parents while Suzanne’s father, Stefan Ircha, was originally from Ternopil, a town outside of Kyiv, and immigrated to the United States after WWII. The Johnson family recently traveled to Poland to meet with Ukrainian refugees and understand firsthand how the unprovoked invasion has impacted their lives.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson’s healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$214 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of two new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation’s largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans. Currently, the Ambassador is an active member of the NFL’s Investment Committee and Stadium Committee.

CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, a fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has overseen pivotal changes within the organization, appointing the team’s football and business management. A key part of the New York Jets leadership since 2000, Johnson begins his second season as vice chairman, working alongside his brother, Chairman Robert Wood Johnson.

In his new role, Johnson will provide continuity after overseeing the promotion of team President Hymie Elhai, and the hiring of General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh in his time as chairman & CEO. In these three, Johnson is confident he found collaborative leaders who will unify the Jets in their shared goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

Previously serving as the Jets chairman & CEO (2017-21), Johnson has spent the past four years developing a strong bond with the players, working closely with them to advance the programs and initiatives they deem important. In 2020, Johnson addressed the team and discussed how they all—Johnson, coaches, executives, and players—could use their powerful platform to influence positive change.

To support this goal, Johnson and the Jets donated \$1 million to four partner organizations in December of 2020, with each organization—All Stars Project, Innocence Project, New York Urban League and Year Up—receiving \$250,000. These organizations mirror the Jets’ and Johnson’s focus on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality, and workforce development. The players, coaches and staff will continue to work to reduce barriers and create opportunities for individuals in need on various upcoming volunteer projects championed by the organization.

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson, his family, and the Jets donated \$3 million to support those in need in the New York and New Jersey areas. In March of 2020, they pledged \$1 million to support the United Way of New York City’s COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey’s ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island’s United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19. A month later, they donated \$2 million to organizations focused primarily on food insecurity, first responders and regional relief.

Johnson currently serves as an active member of the NFL’s Media Owned and Operated committee.

A dedicated advocate of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. Named for his mother, the late Betty Wold Johnson, the Center aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.

HYMIE ELHAI

PRESIDENT



HYMIE ELHAI (pronounced *HI-me EL-hi*) begins his fourth season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment in 2019. Now in his 23rd year with the team, Elhai’s impact has been felt throughout the organization and been defined by his unwavering commitment, a passionate goal to redefine the culture of the organization, and a steady hand of leadership and strategic planning.

Under Elhai, who has garnered league and industry respect by his peers during his tenure, the Jets have solidified their business staff’s senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations, bringing his balance and perspective to those various departments, including: Communications, Community Relations, Content, Corporate & Premium Partnerships, Events & Game Operations, Facilities, Finance, Information Technology, Legal & Human Resources, Marketing, Security and Ticketing.

Playing a key role in hiring of the football leadership, Elhai worked with Christopher W. Johnson to hire General Manager Joe Douglas in 2019, and with both Johnson and Douglas to hire Head Coach Robert Saleh in 2021.

The collaboration among Elhai, Douglas and Saleh forms the foundation that has moved the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning, and innovative franchise on and off the field. Throughout his time as president, he has worked closely with the football staff, providing counsel and support for various organizational-encompassing objectives. Additionally, in his previous role as general counsel, he helped football administration on all planning initiatives.

Among the important initiatives under Elhai was the formation of the Social Justice, Diversity and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) and the expansion of the Jets Women’s Organization (JWO).

The SJDIT helps steer the Jets as it relates to the process and execution of the team’s Social Justice efforts as well as internal diversity and inclusion practices. The JWO now encompasses the many women affiliated with the organization, including staff members, wives and significant others of coaches, players, and football personnel, serving as a unique outlet to positively impact the workplace, industry, and community.

During the COVID-19 outbreak, Elhai and his staff worked closely with New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy’s office and the NFL, as the team developed their protocols. Prioritizing employee safety, his communication and direction helped manage the unprecedented uncertainty of a global pandemic, keeping the business staff optimized despite working remotely.

Elhai, who was born in Queens, NY and grew up a Jets fan often frequenting games at Shea Stadium, began his Jets career in 2000 as an intern. He previously served as the club’s senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel, where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters.

Elhai currently serves as a member of the NFL’s CBA player benefits plan committee.

In October 2021, Elhai received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Rutgers School of Law at their 2021 Alumni Recognition Gala.

A Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 honoree, Elhai is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and The Johns Hopkins University, where he played football and baseball. Elhai resides in Hoboken, NJ.

JOE DOUGLAS

GENERAL MANAGER

JOE DOUGLAS begins his fourth season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 23rd season in the National Football League, Douglas, a three-time Super Bowl winning executive, continues to put his stamp on the organization.

The organization's vision for Douglas was not just about the ability to construct a roster. "A general manager must be more than just a talent evaluator. He must be able to build and sustain a winning culture," Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson said after announcing Douglas' hire. "That includes a commitment to collaboration and earning the trust of his colleagues."

Johnson's confidence in Douglas was on display as they, along with team president, Hymie Elhai, led the search for the team's new head coach. In hiring Robert Saleh, Johnson is confident that the first-year head coach will join with Douglas and Elhai to form the cohesive foundation that brings the Jets to their goal of a sustained, winning franchise.

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor, former Ravens General Manager Ozzie Newsome, and he has stayed true to his core principle that successful teams are built by people with the right level of commitment, character and competence, as Douglas looks to develop and sustain to what he characterizes as, "the best culture in sports."

Since taking the position, Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout

the year, and made steady in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Since his appointment just over two seasons ago, almost 97% of the roster was acquired or extended by him, with over 73% coming in the last two years.

For Douglas, roster construction isn't a quick fix. "Ultimately, I think when you look at successful organizations, no matter what the sport, you don't see a lot of teams that build long-term success by buying their way out of it," he said in 2020. "You see the teams, the organizations that have long-term success, they draft well, and they develop their players."

Since his hire, Douglas has improved the team's financial flexibility and added a number of draft assets, both by trading players with expiring contracts and draft-day deals. Through those deals, most notably the acquisition of two first-round picks and a third-round pick for safety Jamal Adams, as well as a second-round pick, fourth-round pick and sixth-round pick for quarterback Sam Darnold, the Jets have picked in the first two rounds of the 2021 and 2022 drafts seven times, including five first-round selections.

Entering any draft, the mission for Douglas is always the same – add difference makers that fit within the culture and scheme. Over his three drafts as the general manager (2020-22), he has done just that, using top 40 picks on both sides of the ball, selecting cornerback Sauce Gardner (No. 4, 2022), wide receiver Garrett Wilson (No. 10, 2022), edge Jermaine Johnson (No. 26, 2022), running back Breece Hall (No. 36, 2022), quarterback Zach Wilson (No. 2, 2021), Alijah Vera-Tucker (No. 14, 2021), wide receiver Elijah Moore (No. 34, 2021) and tackle Mekhi Becton (No. 11, 2020), while showing mobility in both drafts to target key players via moving up, first with Alijah Vera-Tucker and again this year with Jermaine Johnson.

Beyond the first and second rounds, Douglas has added starters and depth throughout the draft, notably the



team’s leading rusher last year (2021) in fourth-round rookie running back Michael Carter as well as cornerback Bryce Hall, the first ever 17-game regular season starter for the Jets who finished sixth in the league in passes defended in his second year (2021).

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager (2020) was also the NFL’s first ever virtual draft as a result of COVID-19 global pandemic, he showed no signs of being a rookie, despite drafting from his home, and turned eight draft picks and Leonard Williams’ expiring contract into 13 players, while also adding key undrafted free agents.

As with the draft picks, matching character and talent has shown to be key when Douglas has used free agency to add to the roster. This offseason (2022), the Jets added multiple veterans with Super Bowl experience as cornerback D.J. Reed, Pro Bowl guard Laken Tomlinson, tight end C.J. Uzomah, and safety Jordan Whitehead have all played in one of the last three Super Bowls.

Among the priorities for Douglas has been remaking the offensive line and in addition to adding first-round picks in his first two drafts – Becton and Vera-Tucker – has signed three free agents, tackle George Fant and center Connor McGovern, who both graded as top 10 players at their position last season (2021) according to Pro Football Focus, and Tomlinson, who made the Pro Bowl in 2021.

Another key for Douglas in constructing the Jets has been waiver claims, using both at final cuts and the wire throughout the season to provide depth and reinforce the roster. Additionally, among his first claims (2019) were wide receiver/return specialist Braxton Berrios, a 2021 first-team All-Pro selection, and defensive lineman John Franklin-Myers, the team leader in pressures, hits and co-leader in sacks (2021) who signed a long-term extension last season. He has also added players like Quincy Williams (2021), the team’s second-leading tackler in his first season with the Jets (2021) and Ty Johnson (2020) who has averaged over 4.25 yards per carry with 50 receptions since being claimed.

Throughout his time in the league, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl winning rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game’s MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team’s postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl.

A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team’s title run. The Eagles’ leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team’s leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015).

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization’s scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Mechanicsville (VA) HS, formerly Lee-Davis, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

ROBERT SALEH

HEAD COACH

ROBERT SALEH (pronounced: SAH-luh) was named the head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2021. With Saleh and General Manager Joe Douglas, Chairman Robert Wood Johnson envisions a synergy that will bring the franchise to their ultimate goal.

"I think you have a synergy of people," Johnson said earlier this year. "Those two people particularly are on absolutely the same page. That's a positive. Joe knows exactly what Robert needs at every position and they have a long list and criteria that they're looking at."

"He is a collaborative leader," Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson said in a statement after Saleh's hiring. "I know he will develop the players on our roster, hold them accountable, and put them in a position to succeed. Most importantly, I believe they will connect with him."

Connecting with players has been a constant under Saleh. "They need a personal investment made into them so they can develop into being great football players," he said after being hired. "They want to be rewarded for what they've gone through, and so players should expect that from their coaches, and from the organization. It is an absolute joy to see them hit the pinnacle of their career, where they get rewarded for it. To give that and understand that part is just being human to me." "All Gas, No Brake," for Saleh, it is a mindset that goes beyond the team's practice and preparation to everything they do, on and off the field. More than just the players and coaches, it is about the entire organization stepping on the gas and getting better each and every day.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Saleh oversaw the league's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13. Rookies played 5,675 snaps for the Jets and started a league-high 76 games. They became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards. And while the results weren't always there, the scars and the experience gained through them were.

"These are all scars that they are getting," Saleh said during his first season. "They're learning. You have to learn not to lose first. Then, once you learn how not to lose, you figure out how to win. Then, once you learn how to win, you have to learn how to close games."

As the season progressed, the young roster did just that. Seven of the final eight games were within a score in the fourth quarter, compared to four of the first nine games. Playing those close games against six teams that finished with winning records, including three playoff teams, the team also improved their numbers on defense in points per game, yards per play, pass yards per attempt and yards per rush over the final seven weeks. On offense, they averaged 5.19 yards per carry over the final eight weeks, the second best in the league.

"We were at least one or two most rookie snaps in the league," Douglas said speaking after the final day of the 2021 Draft. "That's a hard thing for a coaching staff to do with so many young players, I think we all realize that. No one dipped their toe in the water, they cannonballed in, they attacked it, the entire staff developed these young players and the whole plan for that is to benefit the future. So, now we have a group of young players that have played a lot of snaps, a lot of quality NFL snaps. When they're called on to help us again, they're going to be ready. What Coach and his staff did, I can't say enough positive things about that."

Before joining the Jets, Saleh spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. Since 2017, his group ranked third in the league in passing yards allowed (211.4), holding opposing quarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%), while producing Pro Bowl players at linebacker (Fred Warner), cornerback (Richard Sherman) and defensive line (Nick Bosa & DeForest Buckner), while Bosa was also selected as the 2019 Defensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press.

The last two seasons under Saleh, the 49ers defense led the league in passing defense (188.6), ranking in the top 10 in passer rating allowed (85.8), completion percentage allowed (62.4%), tackles for loss (154) and defensive touchdowns (six), while also helping San Francisco advance to Super Bowl LIV.



In his final season with the 49ers (2020), Saleh's unit still finished fifth in the league in total defense and fourth in passing defense, despite an injury-plagued season, getting career years from cornerback Jason Verrett, who started 13 games after playing in just six total the previous four seasons and defensive lineman Kerry Hyder, who started 14 games after logging more than 450 snaps in a season just once in his five previous years in the league. Hyder finished the season as one of just 11 defensive linemen with at least 8.0 sacks, 15 quarterback hits and 40 total tackles.

A key part of the team's Super Bowl LIV run (2019), Saleh's defense finished second in total defense, first in passing defense and third in third-down defense, while producing 48 sacks (tied for the fifth most in the league) and 28 takeaways (the sixth most). The San Francisco defensive line saw four players – Arik Armstead (10.0), Bosa (9.0), Buckner (7.5) and Dee Ford (6.5) – all produce at least 6.5 sacks, the only team in the NFL to have four-or-more players with 6.5-or-more sacks. In the postseason, the defense allowed just over 300 yards per game, holding opponents to just 31.4% on third down and producing seven total takeaways, including two interceptions of league MVP Patrick Mahomes in the Super Bowl, the only game Mahomes had more than one interception that season.

In Saleh's second season with the 49ers (2018), the defense was one of six to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game than they did the previous season. In 2017, his first as a coordinator, San Francisco allowed .62 yards fewer per play, the third best improvement in the league. Over the final eight weeks, they ranked second in the league in rushing yards allowed and fourth in yards per carry.

Coaching linebackers for three seasons in Jacksonville, Saleh oversaw a linebacker group that included Posluszny and Telvin Smith as the pair each finished in the top five in the league in total tackles between 2015-16 (according to Radar360). The team's linebackers were also a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016, and fifth in rushing average allowed in 2015.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach, responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers, while learning an important lesson from Head Coach Pete Carroll:

"The biggest influence I took from Coach Carroll is from a philosophy standpoint," Saleh said in 2017. "Understanding who you are as a person. Understanding what's important to you as a person. And, how to apply it to the message that you're trying to deliver. Understanding that everybody has a style and that every style is the right style provided you apply it in the right way. So, just from a philosophy standpoint, speaking to people, handling people is where I have my greatest growth from Coach Carroll."

In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wagner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth-round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections. A part of the Seahawks Super Bowl XLVIII winning staff, another of the team's linebackers, seventh-round pick Malcolm Smith, earned MVP honors after Smith registered nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a 69-yard interception returned for a touchdown.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), becoming a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10). Linebackers DeMeco Ryans (2006) and Brain Cushing (2009) each earned Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year honors while Saleh was there and were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2009. That season, the tandem finished in the top 10 in the league in total tackles (according to Radar360).

Before his start as an NFL coach, Saleh spent four seasons coaching college football at Georgia (2005), Central Michigan (2004), beginning his coaching career at Michigan State (2002) as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach before becoming a defensive assistant/defensive line the following season.

A native of Dearborn, MI, Saleh attended Northern Michigan University where he started for four years at tight end. He earned his finance degree, beginning a career as a credit analyst before getting into coaching.

Saleh and his wife, Sanaa, have seven children, sons, Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, and Jacob, and daughters, Mila and Ella. Born to Lebanese parents, Sam and Fatin, he is considered one of three Arab-American head coaches in NFL history and believed to be the first Muslim-American head coach.
