# SEASON OUTLOOK

While Aamir Simms was not named the ACC Player of the Year when he led Clemson to the NCAA Tournament during the pandemic riddled season of 2020-21, he might be the biggest loss for an ACC team when comparing the rosters of the league teams from last year to this season.

For the second time in his stellar four-year career, Simms led Clemson in scoring, rebounding and assists. He is the first player in ACC history to lead a team in all three of those categories in consecutive years.

Additionally, the 6-8 frontcourt player shot a team best 53.2 percent from the field, 40.0 percent on three-point attempts, (second on the team), and made 82.5 percent of his free throws, best on the team among players who attempted at least one per game. He was a big reason Clemson shot a school record 76.9 percent from the line.

The native of Palmyra, Va. was a big reason Clemson had among its most successful seasons in recent years. The list of victories included eight triumphs over teams that made it to the NCAA Tournament, tied for the most in Clemson history with Rick Barnes' Sweet 16 team of 1996-97 that finished eighth in the final Coaches Poll, the highest final ranking in school history.

Clemson had as many marquee non-conference wins as anyone in the nation, including victories over Purdue, Maryland and Alabama.

The Tigers also recorded wins over ACC Champion Georgia Tech, and strong ACC teams North Carolina, Syracuse and Louisville.

To duplicate that level of success head coach Brad Brownell realizes someone is going to have to fill the roles that Simms provided over his career. Although it would be nice, he probably isn't looking for just one player to fill all the columns on the stat sheet like Simms did.

"As you look at our roster, I believe we have depth, especially in the backcourt where we have experienced players," said Brownell. "I don't know that we have a difference maker on our roster like Aamir was. He did some extraordinary things in so many areas. We are probably going to look to multiple players to fill those roles."

Clemson had good balance between the frontcourt and the backcourt a year ago when the Tigers finished 16-8 overall and 10-6 in the ACC to go with a strong 6-2 non-conference record.

At least at the beginning of the season, the backcourt might have to provide a big percentage of the offense. Clemson returns two of its top three scorers and three of the top six, and all are backcourt players.

"I am excited about the backcourt," continued Brownell. "They need to play well and take another step forward. We have guys in the backcourt who have all made clutch shots in conference games. They have a strong level of experience, but they all need to improve their consistency."

Al-Amir Dawes is the top returning scorer from last year off of his 9.0 points per game scoring average. He shot a much improved 39.4 percent from beyond the arc and added a 74.2 free throw percentage. He had a positive assist to turnover ratio in averaging 25.5 minutes per game.

"We had to throw Al-Amir into the fire his freshman year and he made some turnovers early, but he really improved in that area as a sophomore and had just 39 for the year. He also improved as an outside shooter and is a player who can break down the opponent off the dribble."

Nick Honor started 10 of the 24 games, but averaged 23 minutes per game. He made the clutch shot of the season at the buzzer in a 74-72 win over Georgia Tech in February. He was third on the team in scoring last year with an 8.1 average and led the team in steals with 32. His 53-24 assist to turnover ratio was the best on the team and his one turnover for every 23.3 minutes was among the best for guards in the ACC.

"We hope to extend our defense again this year and Nick is a big key to that. He is capable of being an explosive shooter, as he showed in a number of games last year. His game winner against Georgia Tech was certainly a highlight last year."

Alex Hemenway is a third veteran backcourt player on

the Clemson roster. The native of Indiana is a 42.3 percent three-point shooter and 90.0 percent free throw shooter for his career. He averaged 4.7 points a game last year and he started 11 games. He is capable of changing the momentum of a game with his three-point shooting.

"Alex is 'steady Eddie' in everything he does and I mean that as a compliment," said Brownell. "He is a hard worker with a positive attitude, a real team guy. He has worked hard on his defense in the offseason and will be an important player for us this year."

Chase Hunter is another returning letterman who will play on the wing. He played in all 24 games a year ago, four as a starter, and has outstanding athletic ability. "Chase has had his best offseason because he has finally been healthy. He is much stronger, and it has led to him being a better shooter. He gives us athleticism on the perimeter defensively as well."

David Collins and Josh Beadle are two newcomers to the program who look to give the Tigers a boost in the backcourt and on the wing.

Collins is a graduate transfer from South Florida who led USF in scoring last year with a 12.5 average. He made 37 percent of his three-point shots as well. A four-year player at USF, he scored 1,516 points, seventh in Bulls history. He had 587 points in 2018-19 when South Florida won 24 games. He was also 20th in the nation in steals that year.

Beadle comes to Clemson from Columbia, S.C. and Cardinal Newman High School. He helped that program to back-to-back state championships and was a three-time all-state selection. The combo guard shot 50 percent from the floor and 40 percent on threes his senior year.

Devin Foster, formally a Clemson manager who was an outstanding high school player in Massachusetts, moves on to the team as a walk-on guard. Jack Nauseef, a native of Dayton, Ohio, is another walk-on guard who looks to help the Tigers this year.

Clemson's frontcourt will be led by senior Hunter Tyson. The native of Monroe, N.C. has made a strong progression over his career and has an all-around game that will fill

some of the void lost by Simms. Tyson was fourth on the team in scoring last year with a 7.5 average and was third in rebounding at 4.2 per game. He played just 19 games, as he suffered an injury early in the season.

“Hunter was among our best players at the end of last season. He really played well for us down the stretch. He is a threat as an outside shooter and will really mix it up under the boards. He is another player who has improved his strength over the year. He took a nice step forward last year and we think he will do that again as a senior. He is a competitive kid and we need that from him.”

Over his last nine games of 2020-21, Tyson shot 49 percent from the field, 50 percent on three-point shots, 83 percent from the foul line, and averaged 10 points and 4.5 rebounds per game.

PJ Hall is another veteran frontcourt player who looks to see much more action this year than his freshman season. The native of nearby Spartanburg, S.C. played in 21 games off the bench and shot 49.2 percent from the field, second to Simms's 53.2 percent. He averaged 3.5 points per game in 10 minutes a game.

“PJ has rearranged 15-20 pounds and has had a productive offseason. He couldn't go 25 minutes in a game last year, but he is ready for that this year. He will be a key to our rebounding efforts, inside scoring and defense.”

Naz Bohannon is a second graduate transfer on this year's Clemson team. Like Collins, a native of Ohio, Bohannon is an experienced player from Youngstown State. He led Penguins in scoring last year with a 16.5 average and also pulled in 8.5 rebounds per game. He had 1,236 career points and 990 rebounds in 117 starts in his four years at Youngstown State, and nearly became the first 1000-point, 1000-rebound player in school history.

Ian Schieffelin and Ben Middlebrooks are two freshmen who look to contribute in the frontcourt this year. Schieffelin is a 6-8 player from Grayson High School in Loganville, Ga. who averaged a double-double with 3.0 blocks per game last year. He played at a program that ranked in the top 10 in the nation much of the year.

Middlebrooks stands 6-10 and comes to Clemson from Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. He averaged 20.5 points and 13.6 rebounds a game last year, and 20.0 and 13.0 in 2019-20.

Parker Fox is a 6-7 walk-on who was awarded a scholarship for his senior year and looks to provide valuable backup strength.
