Media Information

Credentials: All media representatives covering Rowdies soccer on a seasonal basis should obtain a photo I.D. credential for the 1984 season. Such credentials can be obtained by contacting the Rowdies PR office. Any member of the working media not in possession of a season pass can obtain a single game credential by 1) reserving the pass with the Rowdies PR office two days in advance of the game and 2) presenting appropriate media identification at the game. Reserved credentials will be left at the Tampa Stadium press gate (south-west end of the stadium).

Photographers: All photographers are asked to abide by the marked field lines — restricting all movement on the west sidelines and allowing only passage directly behind the goals. Photographers are restricted from lockerroom access unless cleared by the Rowdies PR office. Any assignments requiring either proximity to the team benches or lockerroom access should be registered with the Rowdies PR office before the game.

Press Box: The Rowdies use the first level (PB 1) of the Tampa Stadium press box for all members of the working press, except live broadcasts, which are located on PB 2. Three courtesy phones are located on PB 1. Refreshments are served on PB 2. All media members except photographers are asked to stay in the press box until the last 15 minutes of the game. Family members or friends are not permitted in the press box.

Copy Transmission: The Rowdies make available for media use a Xerox telecopier at every game. Representatives from Am-Fax will also be present upon request.

Lockerrooms: Admission to lockerrooms after the game is governed by issued credentials. Members of the working press will be admitted ten minutes after end of game. There is no admission to lockerrooms before the game.

The Board of Directors

For the first time in the club's nine year history, the Tampa Bay Rowdies are operating under local ownership. The sale, finalized November 1, transferred majority ownership from nine year owner George Strawbridge, Jr. and minority partners Lamar Hunt and Bill McNutt to Tampa residents Bob Blanchard, Dick Corbett and Stella Thayer. All three made investments in the Rowdies last season but current ownership gives them full control of the NASL franchise.

Stella Thayer

Although all three owners boast strong community ties, Stella Thayer was born and raised in Tampa. Educated at Holland College and Columbia Law School, she is the managing partner of McFarlane, Ferguson, Allison and Kelley. She clerked for the Federal District Judge upon graduation and was the first female law clerk in Federal District Court in Florida.



Today Mrs. Thayer serves on the Board of Directors of the Greater Tampa Chamber of Commerce, is the Vice Chairman of the Hillsborough County Hospital Authority and serves as treasurer for the University of South Florida Foundation.

Bob Blanchard

Bob Blanchard was born in Alicia, Arkansas and educated at Arkansas State University. He is the chairman of the Board of WRB Enterprises, Inc., Rozier Machinery Company in Tampa and Blanchard Machinery in South Carolina.



He is the incoming First Vice President of the Greater Tampa Chamber of Commerce, a past trustee on the board of the University of Tampa, a member of the Florida State Fair Authority, Foreign Trade Zone Management Board, Tampa Museum Federation Advisory Board and a member of the board of directors of the Tampa YMCA and Goodwill Industries - Suncoast.

Dick Corbett

A New York native, Dick Corbett moved to Tampa five years ago. An honors graduate of Notre Dame University, he continued with his MBA at Harvard. His friendship with league President Howard Samuels dates back to the early 60's when both were involved in national politics. Corbett worked on John F. Kennedy's congressional relations staff and served as finance controller for Robert F. Kennedy's 1968 campaign.



He is the owner of the Hall of Fame Inn Golf and Tennis Facility where the Rowdies' headquarters are located. He also has other real estate investments in New York City and Florida, including the International Plaza, a future complex of hotels, offices, retail and recreational amenities for the Tampa International Airport. He is a member of the Tampa Chamber of Commerce and Committee of 100.

Rowdies History

1975

- July 19, 1974, George Strawbridge was awarded the NASL's 16th franchise in Tampa.
- Eddie Firmani was named head coach five days later.
- In October Alex Pringle was the first player signed.
- The team became the "Rowdies" after a "name the team" contest in November.

Indoor

- The Rowdies made their Bay Area Debut on Valentines Day by beating Washington 7-2
- Defeated Baltimore 8-6 to win Eastern Regional, but lost 8-5 to San Jose, in the final, held at San Francisco's Cow Palace.
- Rowdie Doug Wark honored with championship All-Star status.

Outdoor

- Final record 16-6 to win their division.
- Became NASL champs by defeating Portland 2-0 in the first Soccer Bowl.
- Stewart Scullion chosen as team's Most Valuable Player and Farrukh Quraishi was Most Popular.
- Quraishi made first team NASL All-Stars while Stewart Scullion, Stewart Jump and John Boyle made second team and John Sissons, Clyde Best, and Derek Smethurst received honorable mentions.
- 12,064 was the average home attendance.

1976

Indoor

- Tampa Bay won the NASL indoor title by beating Rochester 6-4.
- Stewart Scullion and Clyde Best were honored as regional and championship MVP's.
- Arsene Auguste, Clyde Best, Rodney Marsh, Stewart Scullion and Derek Smethurst made the All-Stars.

Outdoor

- 18-6 final record to win Eastern Division Title.
- Derek Smethurst named MVP and Farrukh Quraishi named Most Popular.
- Arnie Mausser, Tommy Smith and Rodney Marsh selected first team All-Stars while Stewart Jump, Derek Smethurst, and Stewart Scullion were voted to second team.
- The average home attendance was 16,452.

1977

Indoor

- NASL didn't sponsor indoor competition, but the Rowdies defeated Ft. Lauderdale in Florida Cup exhibition and set the record for their largest indoor home attendance to date, 6,554 — sellout, against Zenit of Leningrad.

Outdoor

- Eddie Firmani resigned his position of head coach in mid-season.
- John Boyle replaced temporary Player/Coach Lenny Glover as head coach a week later.
- 14-12 final record to make the playoffs but lost in first round to New York, who went on to win Soccer Bowl.
- Rodney Marsh voted Most Valuable and Most Popular Player.
- Derek Smethurst made first team All-Stars while Arsene Auguste, Rodney Marsh, and Steve Wegerle were honored with second team All-Star status.
- 20,280 average home attendance.

1978

- Gordon Jago was named head coach December 5, 1977.

Indoor

- Finished indoor exhibition schedule 6-2.

Outdoor

- Finished with 18-12 record and played in their second Soccer Bowl but fell 3-1 to Cosmos in New York.
- Rodney Marsh named Most Valuable and Most Popular Player for second consecutive year.
- Rodney Marsh made first team All-Stars while Arsene Auguste and Steve Wegerle were named to the second team.
- Average home attendance was 18,123.

1979

Indoor

- Rowdies split 1-1 in home and home series with MISL Houston Hurricane and placed second in the Budweiser Invitational without losing a game. (Dallas took the title on goal differential.)
- An indoor — outdoor tournament with Moscow Dynamo ended the '79 indoor season. They tied outdoors and the Russians won 8-1 indoors.

Outdoor

- Finished 19-11 to claim division title. Took American Conference crown to playoffs and played in their third Soccer Bowl, losing 2-1 to Vancouver.
- Oscar Fabbiani voted MVP, won "Goal of the Year", and led the league in scoring with 25 goals and 8 assists.
- Rodney Marsh was voted Most Popular Player for the third consecutive year.
- Mike Connell made first team All-Stars, John Gorman made the second team and Steve Wegerle and Rodney Marsh received honorable mentions.
- Rodney Marsh was honored with an unprecedented testimonial game marking his retirement.
- Average home attendance was 28,546, second best in the league.

1980

Indoor

- Finished 9-3 in NASL's inaugural indoor season and beat Memphis for the first NASL indoor title in a best of three series.

Outdoor

- Finished 19-13 to win Eastern Division Title and make the playoffs for the sixth consecutive year.
- Refik Kozic was named MVP and Mike Connell voted Most Popular.
- Mike Connell made the NASL All-Star first team, Steve Wegerle made the second and John Gorman made honorable mention.
- Average home attendance was 28,532, second best in the league.
- Largest home attendance to date, 56,389 on July 4, 1980.

1981

Indoor

- Finished 9-9 and failed to make playoffs for first time in their history.
- Steve Wegerle made first team All-Stars.

Outdoor

- Finished 15-17, but still made the playoffs.
- Tampa Bay was eliminated in the first round by New York.
- John Gorman voted MVP and Mike Connell named the Most Popular Rowdie.
- John Gorman was named to the first team All-Stars.
- Average home attendance was 22,531.

1982

- The Rowdies were strengthened in 1982 by an ownership merger with Dallas Tornado, involving Lamar Hunt and Bill McNutt.

Indoor

- Finished 11-7 with only one loss at home and charged through playoff action to the indoor finals. But fell to San Diego in the best of three series.
- Jurgen Stars, Mike Connell, and Tatu made the first team All-Stars while John Gorman was voted to second team.

Outdoor

- Gordon Jago stepped down as head coach in mid-season and was replaced by Al Miller.
- Finished 12-20 and failed to make the playoffs for the first time in Rowdies outdoor history.
- Luis Fernando was selected team MVP and Tatu was voted the Most Popular Rowdie.
- Pedro DeBrito was picked as the NASL's Rookie of the Year.
- Peter Nogly was honored with first team All-Star selection and Mike Connell received an honorable mention.
- Average home attendance was 18,507.

1983

Indoor

- Won the Grand Prix of Indoor Soccer with a 6-2 record by defeating Le Manic 5-4 in Montreal in the final.
- Played a perfect 4-0 non-tournament schedule.

Outdoor

- Finished 7-23 and failed to make the playoffs for the second consecutive year.
- Gregg Thompson was voted NASL Rookie of the Year. He was Tampa Bay's Most Valuable and Most Popular Rowdie. Picture perfect inaugural season included honorable mention All-Star status, too.
- Average home attendance was 11,173.

1984

Indoor

- A trio of local investors bought the club from original owner George Strawbridge.
- Stella Thayer, Bob Blanchard and Dick Corbett made their first move a memorable one. They hired the most popular player in Rowdies history as their head coach and general manager. Ownership was finalized the first week in November and Rodney Marsh came on board the next.
- Forced to play a hastily thrown together season, the Rowdies struggled to a 9-23 final record, failing to qualify for post season action.

Even before new local ownership was made official, the Board of Directors had decided who would lead their club back to the glory days of old. They picked the biggest and brightest star of the past and on Tuesday, October 18 they introduced the most popular Rowdie in Tampa Bay's history as the club's head coach. The second week in November they also named him General Manager.

Controversial, charismatic and colorful, Marsh played 15 years of first division English soccer before conquering the New World. He started his career at Fullham at the age of 17 and moved to Queen's Park Rangers five years later. Tagged the "Clown Prince of Soccer" for his entertaining style and roughish manner, Marsh made his name at QPR. His transfer to Manchester City six years later was one of the highest transfer fees ever paid the London club. He played at City for four years during the height of the Manchester City - United derby, acting as the rival draw to United's George Best.

Six months back at Fullham immediately preceded Marsh's move to North America. He joined the Rowdies in 1976 and started grabbing headlines and honors immediately.

In four years with the Tampa Bay franchise he grabbed more honors than any five players combined. He made the NASL All-Stars all four years, was named the team MVP in 1977 and '78 and the Most Popular Rowdie in 1977, '78 and '79. This past spring he was inducted in the Rowdies Hall of Fame with John Boyle and Farrukh Quraishi as charter members. During the "Rodney years" the Rowdies won one indoor title (1976), made two Soccer Bowl appearances (1978 and '79) and won two division titles (1976 and 1979). When Sir Rodney ended his playing career at the end of the 1979 season the club honored him with a testimonial game. It was the first and only testimonial to date that the club has granted. Even today, five years after his retirement, he ranks as the club's number one all-time leading scorer with 146 points (48 goals - 50 assists).

With his playing career behind him Rodney entered the world of coaching. A few months of coaching the New York United and Rodney headed south to Charlotte, North Carolina. In three seasons with the Lightnin' Marsh amass-

ed a 43-37-7 record, winning the American Soccer League championship in the inaugural 1981 season.

In that storybook season the Lightnin' posted a 19-10-3 record. In '82 they reached the semi-finals with a 13-14 record and in 1983 it was a 12-13 record and the semi-finals once again.

Marsh carries with him a clear perspective of what made the Rowdies such a success in the late 70's. In his dual role of coach and general manager, he feels capable of moving the Rowdies in the right direction, on the field and off.

The team personnel changes he has made for 1984 are designed to reflect that perspective. "I wanted winners." say Marsh ".....players that think like winners, who feel they can take on anyone and win.....and die trying. It's a state of mind that produces exciting soccer."

Marsh believes in exciting soccer. He produced it as a player and he encourages it as a coach. The 1984 Rowdies appear to be an attack oriented team who play with the break-neck abandon of youth and confidence. They combine the dazzle of the Wegerle brothers with the hard work and hustle of North Americans Perry Van Der Beck and Wes McLeod and the speed of Rookie of the Year Gregg Thompson. Solid at the back, aggressive and daring up front, the '84 Rowdies reflect Rodney Marsh, the rowdiest Rowdie ever.




1983 Season: Tommy shared action with Jurgen Stars, playing nine games for Tampa Bay and registering a 2.62 GAA. Had good games against Team America, Golden Bay, Tulsa, and Ft. Lauderdale, yielding only one goal in each game. Was released at the end of the '83 season, but re-signed by Marsh prior to the start of the '84 outdoor season.

Career: Boric joined the NASL as Calgary's second draft choice in the 1981 draft and spent his inaugural season watching from the Calgary bench. Rehabilitation from shoulder surgery prevented Boric from joining the Rowdies after the '81 Calgary dispersal draft, but he joined them prior to the '82 outdoor season. Made his official NASL debut on April 24, 1982 against Toronto, allowing only one regulation goal, but losing 2-1 in overtime. He played a total of five games in '82 and appeared to be on his way, before tearing the medial collateral ligament of his right knee against Ft. Lauderdale. He spent five months in rehabilitation only to sprain it during an indoor match. Two more months of rehabilitation followed before going the distance in '83. Tommy's pre-NASL career included two years at the amateur level in his native Winnipeg before attending Old Dominion University in Virginia, where he was honored with All-Star selection.

Personal: Single, Tommy enjoys sports of all kinds. He favors new wave and rock music, especially The Police.

Marsh says: "He's done a tremendous job working with me since I've been back. He's everything a Rowdie stands for and this year I'm looking to him for even more leadership. He's a good organizer at the back. Comfortable in possession, he doesn't give the ball away easily. Also comes out of the back well. Is especially good at picking out forward players with passes.

1983 Season: Once again Mike played every minute of every game switching back and forth from defense to mid-field. The Rowdie captain had two goals and twelve assists, making him the team's fourth leading scorer.

Career: Joined the Rowdies from Johannesburg Rangers at 18 to play for the 1975 NASL championship team. He's the sole remainder of that championship squad. Missed '76 season because of a military obligation in South Africa but returned in '77 and is currently taking steps to obtain U.S. citizenship. Was named to the NASL All-Star first team in '79 and '80 and was voted "Most Popular Rowdie" in '80 and '81. Currently ranked fourth in all-time games played, Connell has played 229 games in eight seasons as compared to 10 for the three ahead of him. Has played every minute of every game five different years (1977, '79, '80, '82 and '83). Hasn't missed a regular season game since 1978.



Marsh says: "Together with Mooch, has had the best pre-season of anyone on the team. And has shown by scoring goals against the likes of Leeds United, that he is ready to compete in the NASL in his very first year. 1983 Season: Drafted by the Rowdies as the number one pick in the NASL after filing for hardship petition in early December. Led the University of South Florida in scoring for the second consecutive year with 21 goals and 16 assists in 17 games. 1983 honors included All-South and All-American selection, Sun Belt Conference select team and MVP and Florida Player of the Year (all for the second consecutive year). He and Charlie Bradley were also honored as co-winners of the USF Collegiate of the Year. 1984 pre-season exhibition performance could be considered stellar — 9 goals in 8 games.

Career: The Wegerle family includes three NASL Pros — oldest brother Steve, who started with the Rowdies in 1977; Geoff, who started his NASL career in '78 with Oakland and now Roy. Continued with his plans regardless of the absence of sibling support, leading the team in scoring with 19 goals - 13 assists in 19 games. "Soccer America" named him the Top Freshman in the nation.





1984 NASL Standing Points System

Each team will be awarded six points for a win in regulation and overtime toward its NASL season standings. A team winning in the Shootout will receive four points. No points will be given for a loss. Winners and losers will receive one point in the standings for each goal scored during the regulation 90 minutes with a maximum of three such bonus points awarded per team per game. No bonus points will be awarded for goals scored in overtime or the Shootout.

Teams winning in regulation or overtime who score three or more goals in regulation time will receive the maximum nine points in the league standings. Losing teams can get no more than three points (for three or more goals) in the standings.

Four teams will qualify for the playoffs—the two division champions and the next two teams with the most points, regardless of division. The division champions will retain the home-field advantage throughout the playoffs except when they play each other, in which case the division champion with the most points during regular season play will have home field advantage. Both the semi-final and Soccer Bowl Championship Series rounds will be best-of-three. The teams will be seeded in the semi-final round in the following manner:

Formula for Breaking Standing Ties for Playoff Positions

A seven-step procedure is used to determine the order of finish in regular season play if there are any ties that exist in the point totals as described above.

- a. Greatest number of points accrued by results only (i.e., no bonus points)
 - b. The greater goal difference (goals for minus goals against)
 - c. The most outright wins (i.e., no overtime or shootout wins)
 - d. The greater number of goals scored
 - e. Procedures a through c applied to road games only
 - f. Procedures a through c applied to home games only
 - g. Coin toss
-

NASL Tiebreaker Procedure/The Shootout

NASL games which are tied at the end of regulation play will be extended by 15 minutes of "sudden death" overtime (two 7½-minute periods). A flip of the coin will decide which team will kick off. The first team to score a goal wins the game.

If the game remains tied at the end of the second overtime period, the outcome will be decided by The Shootout, which involves players on each team challenging the opposing goalkeeper in a one-on-one competition.

Each team will take five chances in alternate order with the visiting team kicking first. The shooters will start with the ball on the 35-yard line and must take their shot within five seconds. Goalkeepers have no movement restrictions within the five-second period in accordance with normal rules of play. However, he cannot touch the ball with his hands outside the penalty area. Should he do so, a penalty kick will be awarded to the shooter. A penalty kick would also be awarded should the referee determine that he has fouled the shooter.

The team with the most goals at the end of the five kicks or the team that has achieved an insurmountable advantage, such as scoring on its first three kicks while their opponents miss their first three, will be declared the winner.

If the teams remain tied after the prescribed five attempts, they shall continue to take alternate kicks until one has scored more than the other after an equal number of attempts. Only players in the game at the end of the overtime period shall be eligible to take such kicks. Goalkeepers shall not take such kicks. No player may take a second kick until all other eligible members of his team have done so. For the second and any other subsequent rounds, the teams may revise the order of shooters.
