THE 1967-68 OUTLOOK

Bowling Green State University moves into the 1967-68 basketball season with a total of six letter-men back from the 1966-67 club that compiled an 11-13 mark and finished in fourth place in the Mid-American Conference.

Out of the six veterans, four were starters with last year's squad while the other two were part-time starters and top-flight reserves so Coach Bill Fitch will step into his first year at Bowling Green with an experienced crew.

Discussing the 1967-68 team, Fitch stated, "the early non-conference schedule is rugged but if we mature and 'jell' during these games, we could have a good club in January and February."

"The spirit has been excellent on this team since we are a senior dominated club and they want one winning season before joining the alumni ranks."

This season's returning letter winners are forwards Walt Piatkowski, Joe Henderson and Carl Assenheimer along with center Al Dixon. Two experienced back court players, Al Hairston and Dick Rudgers, are also back with the Falcons.

Bowling Green's veteran crew for the 1967-68 season was cut from seven to six when letter winning guard Rich Hendrix was forced out of action with a knee injury that failed to respond to treatment.

Hendrix was Bowling Green's third leading scorer last season as he averaged 12.0 points a game and also served as the Falcons captain. As a sophomore, Hendrix averaged 10.5. He was a starter for two years.

Piatkowski figures to supply much of the 1967-68 fire power for the Falcons. For the past two campaigns, he has led the Bowling Green five in the scoring column and as he moves into his senior season, he is now the ninth leading all-time scorer at BGSU.

As a sophomore, Piatkowski drilled through 442 points for an 18.4 average before coming up with 534 points and a 22.3 mark as a junior. So, he has now accounted for 976 points in two seasons. If he has another fine year, he could move as high as fourth place in the all-time list and therefore rank behind only Howard Komives, Jim Darrow and Charles Share.

Piatkowski won the Mid-American Conference's scoring title in 1965-66 and was also named to the first string All-MAC unit. This past campaign, he was second in loop scoring and earned a second team All-Conference berth.

While Piatkowski has always been a consistent

scorer at Bowling Green, he figures to get plenty of help this season from the other five letter winners plus a good sprinkling of sophomores and non-letter winning juniors.

Hairston finished in double figures last year with a mark of 15.4 while Dixon was just out of double figures with a 9.9 average. Henderson, Rudgers and Assenheimer averaged 7.0, 5.3 and 5.6 points a game respectively.

In 1966-67, Bowling Green averaged 78.8 points a game and as the Falcons move into the 1967-68 campaign, nearly 70 of those points are still incorporated into BGSU's attack.

So, the Falcons figure to have adequate fire power in the lineup. With Dixon, who stands 6-9, Piatkowski, who comes in at 6-8, Henderson, 6-5, Assenheimer, 6-4, and John Heft, who measures out at 6-7, Bowling Green also figures to be able to compete with most squads in the rebounding department.

Heft, Mark Hoffman, who stands 6-4, and John Compton all saw limited action with Bowling Green's 1966-67 team and could figure into the Falcons 1967-68 plans along with five sophomores, Mark Hennessey, Dennis Cavanaugh, Zip Zuber, Wayne Kroll and Sid Rodeheffer.

Zuber paced last year's freshman team in the scoring column as he compiled a 14.3 average while Kroll was just a notch behind at 14.2. Hennessey and Cavanaugh also showed they know how to put the ball through the hoop as they finished at 11.9 and 9.5 respectively.

BOWLING GREEN'S STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES THIS YEAR:

Size: As a starting unit, Bowling Green should match up pretty well with most teams on the Falcons' 1967-68 schedule. However, the reserves drop off sharply in the height department.

Speed: The 1967-68 Falcons find themselves just a little below average in this department for the type of schedule they play. The offensive speed is fine but the defensive speed is below par.

Shooting: Bowling Green finds itself adequate in the shooting department with players like Walt Piatkowski and Al Hairston figuring to take the majority of BGSU's attempts from the field.

Depth: In this department, the Falcons are questionable as the season gets underway. The front court figures to be more of a problem than the back court for Bowling Green.

Assenheimer is a better than average shooter who could develop into a good scorer if he improves his offensive moves . . . his experience and capabilities of playing more than one position add to his value as far as the 1967-68 squad is concerned . . . needs to improve his defensive work . . . Assenheimer has earned two letters with the Falcons while seeing

plenty of action in the last two campaigns . . . as a sophomore, Assenheimer drilled home 91 points in 20 games for a 4.6 average . . . as a sophomore, he came up with the best production of his career by scoring 19 points at Notre Dame . . . last year, Assenheimer finished as the Falcons' seventh leading scorer as he found the range on 112 points in 20 games for a 5.6 mark . . . averaged .420 from the field and .545 from the charity line . . . he had his best 1966-67 game against Northern Illinois as he scored 18 . . . in two seasons, Assenheimer has now scored 203 points with the Falcons . . . At Tiffin Columbian High School, Assenheimer earned All-League and honorable mention All-State honors . . . he lettered for three years while playing all three positions . . . size . . . lettered with the Falcons in 1966-67 as he stepped right into a starting berth after coming to Bowling Green from Allan Hancock Junior College in Santa Maria, California . . . finished as Bowling Green's fifth leading scorer last year as he connected for 153 points in 22 games for a 7.0 average . . . from the field, he hit on .436 of his shots while making .773 from the foul line . . . also owned BGSU's third highest rebounding mark as he averaged 7.8 . . . his finest game in 1966-67 came against Marshall as he scored 15 points and collected 11 rebounds . . . in the scoring department, he was in double figures eight times while he also collected 10 or more rebounds in eight games . . . Henderson played his high school basketball at Detroit Northeastern under Bowling Green's varsity assistant coach Bob Conibear . . . with the Northeastern Falcons, Henderson lettered for two years as a forward.

Piatkowski worked hard during the off-season in an effort to make his senior year a great one . . . an excellent shooter who with a little more work could easily become an excellent passer . . . needs work on rebounding and defensive play . . . these are two areas he could become very good at with the proper self discipline . . . if his rebounding and defensive work con-

tinue to improve, he could be a fine pro prospect . . . Piatkowski has paced the Falcons in the scoring department for the past two seasons . . . last year, he connected for 534 points in 24 outings for a 22.3 average . . . hit on .465 of his shots from the field and .741 from the line . . . he was also the Falcons second leading rebounder with a 9.1 average . . . his best scoring efforts came against Michigan and Toledo in 1966-67 as he fired in 33 points in both contests . . . took off 15 rebounds against Western Michigan . . . averaged 18.4 points a game as a sophomore . . . in his first season, he finished with a high production of 32 points against Syracuse . . . All Mid-American Conference first team selection as a sophomore and a second team pick as a junior . . . led the conference in scoring in 1965-66 with an 18.9 mark then came in second last year with an average of 23.0 . . . he has now scored 976 points in his first two years to rank as Bowling Green's ninth highest all-time career scorer . . . great scorer with all the shots . . . with the Toledo Woodward High School Polar Bears, Piatkowski was an All-City, All-State and honorable mention All-American . . . lettered for three years at Woodward.

THE COACHES

HEAD COACH WILLIAM FITCH



William Fitch, a highly successful head coach at the University of North Dakota for the past five years, was named as Bowling Green State University's new head basketball coach before the 1967-68 campaign got underway.

Discussing Fitch's appointment, Bowling Green's Athletic Director, Doyt L. Perry, said, "In Fitch, we feel we have one of the outstanding young coaches in America. We feel fortunate that he has accepted this position."

Fitch, who is one of the youngest coaches in the major college ranks at 34 years old, is Bowling Green State University's ninth head coach in the Falcons 52-year basketball history.

During the past five seasons at North Dakota University, Fitch led the Sioux to a 94-45 record and won three straight North Central Conference championships. During the past three seasons, the Sioux have recorded a 68-15 mark.

Fitch came to North Dakota in 1962-63 and promptly gave the University its first winning team in 10 years as the Sioux finished with a 14-13 record.

North Dakota came up with a 10-16 record in 1963-64 before finishing with 26-5, 24-5, and 18-5 marks in the next three seasons. In 1964-65, the Sioux won the North Central Conference crown and became only the second squad in the league's history to compile an undefeated year.

During the 1965-66 year, North Dakota again captured the conference title and finished fourth in the NCAA's College Division national tournament. That season, the Sioux were ranked second in the final United Press International poll and third in the final Associated Press poll.

This past year, North Dakota clinched its third consecutive conference crown as the Sioux brought their three-year record in the league up a fine 37-3 total. This season, the Sioux marked up one of their victories by scoring a 93-92 win over Loyola of Chicago.

Before coming to North Dakota, Fitch was the head basketball and baseball coach at Coe College. In four years at the Cedar Rapids, Iowa school, Fitch led the Kohawks to a 48-39 record.

Fitch received his BA degree in physical education from Coe in 1954. While at Coe, Fitch lettered for three years in both basketball and baseball and captained the conference championship squads in both sports during the 1953-54 year.

In 1959, Fitch then received his Masters Degree in education from Creighton University.

Fitch is married and has three daughters, Tammy, Lisa, and Marcy Ann.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES

ROBERT CONIBEAR

After leading Bowling Green State University's freshman teams to a 22-13 record in two seasons, Conibear stepped up to the varsity squad last year as an assistant coach.

This season, under new coach Bill Fitch, he will continue in the same capacity.

For seven years, Conibear served as head basketball coach at Detroit's Northeastern High School where he won three league and two metropolitan championships. In seven years of coaching, his record was 99-19 before coming to BG.

Conibear, who received both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Wayne State University, earned four varsity letters in basketball and two in track during his collegiate career.

After graduation, he played for an AAU basketball team, composed of outstanding players from Wayne State, University of Detroit and the University of Michigan. This team twice won the state championship and progressed to the finals for the regional title.

Conibear, after graduating from Southeastern High School, was drafted into the Armed Services and spent one and one-half years in the United States Army Mountain and Ski Infantry. While working in Detroit's elementary schools, Conibear received his Master's degree in Health and Physical Education.

At Northeastern High, Conibear also was track, cross country and swimming coach. During the summer months, he served as assistant camp director at Al-gon-quian, Michigan's finest and largest boys' camp.

Conibear is married and has a daughter, Connie, and a son, Michael.



JIM LESSIG

Jim Lessig, the newest addition to Bowling Green State University's basketball staff, will serve as the Falcons' freshman coach during the 1967-68 season.

In his first year as Bowling Green's freshman coach, Lessig posted a 9-7 record in 1966-67.

Lessig, who also is the university's Director of Athletic Promotions, moved into the college coaching field with six years of experience in the high school and military service ranks.

He served as an assistant high school coach at Glenwood High School for three years and was head coach at Marlington High School for one season. During this stretch, Lessig's squads posted a 74-27 mark.


