LOU DIBELLA | PRESIDENT & MANAGING GENERAL PARTNER



Lou DiBella currently serves as President & Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond over the past 13 years, including creating the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, Conn. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and, previously, the Norwich Navigators. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues today between the Flying Squirrels franchise and the San Francisco Giants.

While he led baseball's return to Richmond, DiBella's name continues to be synonymous with World Championship Boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding 11-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Boxing flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest

prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr. and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing, and DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers and establishes a legacy of matchmaking excellence to elevate the sport of boxing. Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titleist Paulie Malignaggi, and WBC Welterweight champion Andre Berto.

In January 2005, DBE launched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in "Rocky Balboa." In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film "Love Ranch," starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate



Producer of the critically acclaimed film "The Fighter," starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo Gatti, while a fighter with DBE. In 2019, DiBella was named to the International Boxing Hall of Fame.

DiBella was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, and attended Manhattan's prestigious Regis High School. He was a summa cum laude graduate of Tufts University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. A 1985 graduate of Harvard Law School, DiBella spent four years as an attorney with the prestigious law firm Sullivan & Cromwell. A tireless advocate of boxing reform, DiBella has been a leader in the movement for federal regulation, uniform health and safety standards and a national boxing commission. He has lectured extensively on these subjects and has testified before Congress and numerous state and local bodies. In 1999, DiBella received the Thurman Munson Corporate Hero Award from the AHRC for both his achievements at HBO and his charitable activities. Numerous civic organizations and retired boxer's associations have honored him, including Ring 8, Ring 34 and Latinos in Sports. Di-Bella resides in Huntington Bay, N.Y.



Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Chief Executive Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations in Richmond, Va. Additionally, Parney is the President of the Montgomery Biscuits, Double-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays. In his leadership roles, Parney oversees the operation of both the Richmond and Montgomery franchises.

Thanks to his continued passion and dedication to the Richmond area, the Flying Squirrels brand has become synonymous with community involvement. Under his guidance, the Flying Squirrels have consistently been among the top of the Eastern League in both average and overall attendance during all ten years of existence, including leading the Eastern League in average attendance in 2010, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018 and 2019 and in overall attendance in 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2015.

The Squirrels' sustained success has been repeatedly acknowledged by the industry, recently by being nominated for Minor League Base-ball's prestigious John H. Johnson President's Award in 2017 and 2019. The Squirrels were also nominated for the 2016 John Henry Moss Community Service Award, and received Baseball America's annual Bob Freitas Award - presented to the best organization at every classification of Minor League Baseball - in 2015.

Parney is one of the most recognizable names and faces in Minor League Baseball. He is a three-time Eastern League Executive of the Year, earning the honor with Richmond in 2013 and 2019, and previously in 2004 while serving as the General Manager of the Altoona

Curve. His recognition in 2013 marked the second Eastern League Executive of the Year award for the Squirrels' front office since the team's inception in 2010 (Chuck Domino - 2010).

TODD "PARNEY" PARNELL I CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

After leading the Flying Squirrels to the 2010 Eastern League overall attendance title, Parney and the Squirrels saw an increase in average attendance during the 2011 regular season and were easily the top-draw during the 2011 Eastern League Postseason. For his efforts, and due to the team's success on and off the field, Parney was honored following the season with Baseball America's "Minor League Executive of the Year" award. He became the second member of the Flying Squirrels front office to earn the recognition, following Chuck Domino, who won the award in 2003 while with the Reading Phillies.

Parney followed his award-winning season in 2011 by guiding the franchise to its second Eastern League title in overall attendance in 2012, the organization's second overall attendance title in three years. With his leadership, the franchise completed a \$1.5-million renovation of The Diamond, the home of the Flying Squirrels since their inception in 2010. During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while surpassing corporate and ticket sales expectations.

With Parney at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance in 2010, welcom-

ing 463,842 (6,626 per game) fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded the "Logo of the Year" award by Ballpark Digest. Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond "Business of the Year" by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). Parney also currently serves on the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Board of Trustees and on the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors.

Due to his exuberant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, Parney has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region. Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond, Parney served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes



(Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). Parney has previously been the president of both franchises.

In addition to his roles with both the State College and Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve. During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Bob Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and received the John H. Johnson President's Trophy - the highest honor annually bestowed on a Minor League organization - in 2006. Altoona became only the 11th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less than three years.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 2001. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set either overall or average attendance records in each of his first four seasons. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League "General Manager of the Year."

Parney graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He has two daughters, Lindsay and Samantha.

BEN ROTHROCK | VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER



A charter member of the Flying Squirrels front office, Ben Rothrock is in his sixth full season as the team's General Manager and his 22nd overall in Minor League Baseball

Upon joining Richmond in 2010, Rothrock oversaw the Squirrels Nest Team Store and helped build the Flying Squirrels into one of the top-selling brands in all of Minor League Baseball. In 2011, Rothrock took over the reins of the Food & Beverage operation while overseeing the Merchandise Department. Then, after serving as Assistant General Manager of Operations for three seasons and guiding the Flying Squirrels through various ballpark renovations and enhancements, he earned the role of General Manager during the 2017 season. Rothrock became the Flying Squirrels 'Vice President in 2020. His career in baseball began as an intern with the Altoona Curve, where he later worked as the Director of Merchandise. He also previously worked as the Director of Merchandise for the State College Spikes and Myrtle Beach Pelicans prior to joining the staff in RVA.

The Lewistown, Pa., native is a graduate of Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va., where he received a B.S. in Sport Management and a minor in Business Management while playing linebacker on the Flames' football team.

Donations: Flying Squirrels Charities has raised money for other non-profit partners, including The Holli Fund, Community Foundation, The Robins Foundation in collaboration with RVA Strong, Richmond Education Foundation, Nourish Henrico, Chesterfield Food Bank, VCU Health Rainbow Fund and various Little League Associations around the metro Richmond area.

Dennis Pelfrey joins the Flying Squirrels as the club's new manager for the 2022 season, his first year managing at the Double-A level. He spent the 2021 season as the manager for the Eugene Emeralds, champions of the High-A West.

Pelfrey was born in Arlington, Texas. He graduated from Bowie High School in Arlington, where he played baseball and football and was teammates for former Major Leaguer Vernon Wells. He attended Northwood University's Cedar Hill, Texas campus for his collegiate career. Pelfrey played six professional seasons in independent leagues from 1999-2004. He was a manager and coach in independent leagues beginning in 2011 prior to joining the Giants organization in 2020.

PLAYING CAREER

Pelfrey played collegiate baseball as a shortstop for the Northwood University Knights, which was an NAIA program in Cedar Hill, Texas.

He began his professional playing career as a shortstop in 1999 with the Rio Grande Valley WhiteWings of the independent Texas-Louisiana League at the age of 21, hitting .225 with three homers and 16 RBIs in 53 games.

The following season, Pelfrey signed with the Dubois County Dragons in Huntingsburg, Ind., for the team's second season in the independent Frontier League. That year, he moved over to primarily playing second base.



Pelfrey returned to Dubois County for the 2001 season under new manager Greg Tagert, who was hired in 2022 to manage one of the Giants' Arizona Complex League teams, and played most of his games at hird base while also spending time at second base and shortstop. He hit .290 with six homers as the Dragons won the western division title and reached the Frontier League playoffs for the first time.

In 2002, Pelfrey spent a third season with Dubois County under new hitting coach Andy Haines, brother of current Giants Director of Player Development Kyle Haines and now the hitting coach for the Milwaukee Brewers. That season, Pelfrey had the best offensive year of his career, hitting .297 with five homers and 55 RBIs. The Dragons repeated as champions of the Frontier League's western division that year.

Following the 2002 season, the Dragons moved to Wisconsin and became the Kenosha Mammoths. Heading into the 2003 season, Pelfrey transitioned to a new defensive position as a catcher. He won the starting catcher job to begin the year, but he missed part of the season with a broken collarbone after a collision at home plate. He was selected as

a Frontier League All-Star that season.

Pelfrey returned to his home state of Texas in 2004, signing with the Fort Worth Cats of the independent Central League. He played 52 games before rejoining Tagert with the Springfield/Ozark Ducks, which had moved to Missouri from Wisconsin that year, to finish the season and his playing career.

Over six professional seasons, Pelfrey played 412 games and hit .256 with 26 homers and 182 RBIs.


MANAGERIAL/COACHING CAREER

In 2006, Pelfrey began his coaching career at South Grand Prairie High School in Texas, where he also taught a business computer class. He held that position for eight years through 2015.

He continued that role as he moved into his professional coaching career in 2011. That year, Pelfrey joined Greg Tagert, his former manager for most of his playing career, with the Gary SouthShore RailCats in Indiana as the club's hitting coach. Current Giants' Director of Player Development Kyle Haines was an infielder for Gary in 2011 and 2012. He spent four seasons with the RailCats, including the team's American Association championship run in 2013, when they defeated the Wichita Wingnuts in the title series.

Pelfrey earned his first managerial job in 2015 when he was hired to lead the Florence Freedom in Kentucky

of the independent Frontier League, a role he held for five seasons through 2019. Under his direction, the Freedom posted a .500-or-better record in four seasons.



In his first season in 2015, the Freedom edged the Evansville Otters for a spot in the postseason, but fell late in a one-game playoff to the River City Rascals.

The following year in 2016, Florence posted the lone losing record of Pelfrey's managerial career to date, going 46-49.

In 2017, the Freedom posted a league-best 61-34 record in the regular season. After beating the Washington WildThings in the opening round of the playoffs, Florence fell to the Schaumburg Bombers, managed by Pelfrey's former teammate Jamie Bennett, in the championship series.

Florence narrowly missed the playoffs in 2018, going 49-47 in the regular season.

Pelfrey led Florence back to the postseason in his final Frontier League season in 2019, tying the top record in the league at 57-39. The Freedom swept the Lake Erie Crushers in the first round of the Frontier League playoffs, but dropped a decisive fifth game in the finals to the River City Rascals.

Entering the 2020 season, Pelfrey was hired by the San Francisco Giants to manage the organization's High-A affiliate in San Jose. The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the season and delayed his affiliated baseball managerial debut.

Pelfrey pivoted back to Kentucky for the summer. Like the Minor League Baseball season, the pandemic canceled Frontier League play in 2020. Teams in Florence and Lexington created a four-team league dubbed the "Battle of the Bourbon Trail," which included the Florence Freedom, Florence Y'alls, Lexington Legends and Lexington Layendas. Pelfrey managed the Freedom. The league included Giants minor leaguers Logan Wyatt, Tyler Fitzgerald and Simon Whiteman.

Minor League Baseball went under a significant realignment entering the 2021 season, and the Giants picked up a new High-A team with the Eugene Emeralds in Oregon. After initially being hired to manage San Jose in the canceled 2020 season, Pelfrey was named the manager of the Emeralds for 2021.

The Emeralds went 69-50 in the inaugural High-A West regular season, finishing in first place, a half-game ahead of the Spokane Indians. Eugene cruised by Spokane in the High-A West Championship Series, three-games-to-one, closing out the title with a 5-0 shutout in Game 4.

On March 3, 2022, Pelfrey was officially announced as the Flying Squirrels' manager.

Pelfrey, 44, resides in Grand Prairie, Texas.




RICHMOND 34

On February 22, 1960, 34 Virginia Union University students were arrested following a peaceful sit-in protest at the whites-only lunch counter of Thalhimers Department Store in downtown Richmond. The "Richmond 34" sit-in ultimately led to the integration of Thalhimers and influenced legislation in the Civil Rights Act of 1964. In 2021, the Flying Squirrels launched a series of initiatives to celebrate the legacy of the Richmond 34.

The Flying Squirrels permanently retired the No. 34 on February 24, 2021. It became the second number retired by the team, joining Jackie Robinson's No. 42, which was retired by Major League Baseball in 1997. The No. 34 is retired from on-field use to honor the legacy of the Richmond 34, and it is recognized in the ballpark prominently alongside Robinson's No. 42.

DIRECTIONS TO THE DIAMOND

From the North/South: I-95, traveling north or south, Exit 78 (Arthur Ashe Boulevard-161 Exit). The Diamond is two blocks south after exiting.

From the East/West: I-64, traveling east or west, will merge with I-95. Use Exit 78 (Arthur Ashe Boulevard-161 Exit) off I-95. The Diamond is two blocks south after exiting.

From Powhite Parkway: Travel Powhite Parkway to I-195 north, take the Broad Street exit and turn left onto Roseneath Road, take the second right (Moore Street) and follow it the Boulevard (161), turn left onto the Boulevard which will take you past The Diamond.

Take a Lyft: Easy in and easy out with Lyft. Fans can be dropped off and picked up in the designated Ride Share lot next to the Arthur Ashe Center.

Take the Pulse: Enjoy Richmond's Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) along Broad Street. Pulse buses run usually every 15 minutes. A full schedule can be found here

By Pulse Only: Exit at either the Science Museum or Scott's Addition Pulse stations and travel north to The Diamond (approximately 1 mile walking distance).

By Pulse + Route 20: Exit the Pulse at either the Science Museum or Scott's Addition Pulse stations and connect with the Route 20 Orbital Northbound (bus stops are within about a block of the Pulse station on the sidewalk - the sign will display Route 20).

From the Scott's Addition Pulse station, go north on Altamont Ave, right on Marshall St. and catch the Route 20 Northbound at Bus Stop # 3681. Exit at The Diamond (Bus Stop # 291). From the Science Museum Pulse station, go south on Robinson St. and catch the Route 20 Northbound at Bus Stop # 2113. Exit at The Diamond (Bus Stop #291).

PARKING AT THE DIAMOND

The Diamond provides a variety of easy, inand-out parking areas for fans entering off Arthur Ashe Boulevard, Hermitage Road and Robin Hood Road. Bike racks are also available at the Squirrelly Gates for fans who choose to cycle to the stadium. Additionally, those arriving via ride-share can be dropped off and picked up in the Lyft Red Lot.

Parking at The Diamond is \$5 per car. Cash Only, Please allow extra time when arriving.

Blue Lot: Entrance off Arthur Ashe Boulevard, under the Funnville arch. Season Memberships/Season Ticket Holders Only.

Red Lot: Entrance off Arthur Ashe Boulevard adjacent to Arthur Ashe Center. Designated for media, accessible parking and ride-sharing pickup and drop off.

Yellow Lot: Entrance off Arthur Ashe Boulevard, under Funnville arch. General parking.

Green Lot: Entrances off Hermitage Rd. and Robin Hood Rd. General parking.

FLYING SQUIRRELS MEDIA INFORMATION & GUIDELINES

CREDENTIALS: Anyone requesting credentials during the 2022 season will be required to read and sign Major League Baseball's 2022 Credential Agreement before applications will be reviewed or approved. All credentialed media must adhere to the standards and protocols set by Major League Baseball.

FULL-SEASON CREDENTIALS: Full-season credentials will only be issued to members of the media and legitimate newsgathering organizations who cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. Full-season credentials will be available for pick-up at the Flying Squirrels offices prior to Opening Day. Other members of the media and organizations can apply for single-game or daily credentials, which will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily or single-game credentials will be issued to individuals or organizations who do not qualify for full-season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly or monthly publications, based on availability. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre- or post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra covering, based on availability. Credential applications should be received by the Flying Squirrels Communications Department no less than 24 hours prior to the requested game. Requests can be made online through the Flying Squirrels media credential application form at SquirrelsBaseball.com/Pressbox. Once approved, daily credentials can be picked up at the Flying Squirrels Will Call booth located at the main entrance of the ballpark on Arthur Ashe Boulevard or by arranging pick-up from the Flying Squirrels office with a representative of the Communications Department.

OTHER CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, Major League Baseball and the Baseball Writers Association of America based on availability. Any media member who intends to attend a game using these credentials should reach out to the Flying Squirrels Communications Department no less than 24 hours in advance of that game.

VIDEO PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers from television stations will be able to shoot games from the platform on the main concourse behind home plate. Spacing is limited to three video photographers per game, and priority will be given to those with full-season credentials who cover the team on a daily basis.

STILL PHOTOGRAPHERS: Still photographers will be able to shoot from predetermined areas arranged with the Flying Squirrels Communications Department prior to each game. Use of the photo wells at the ends of the dugouts must be arranged with the Communications Department in advance.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park in the media parking area in the Red Lot at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admission to the lot.

ENTERING THE BALLPARK: For the 2022 season, we ask that members of the media enter the stadium through the "Staff & Media" entrance, located at the ballpark's main gates and identified by a blue sign. All approved media members will be subject to club discretion and its standards and policies that will govern entry, which are described in Minor League Baseball's 2022 Operations Manual. Clubs may begin to allow media into the ballpark no more than four hours prior to first pitch. Media must leave the ballpark no later than 90 minutes following the conclusion of postgame interviews.

PLAYER AND COACH INTERVIEWS: All manager, player and field staff personnel interviews must be arranged with the Flying Squirrels Communications Department at least 24 hours in advance. Interviews can be conducted via Zoom or other video or audio platforms and in-person within the parameters of Major League Baseball's protocols, which are subject to change throughout the season. Off-site interviews will not be permitted. Interview requests do not guarantee availability. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to the organizations that cover the team most frequently. If your media organization needs special accommodations, please contact the Flying Squirrels Communications Department at least 24 hours prior to the game or event.

IN-GAME TRANSMISSION: Per Major League Baseball, while events are in progress, credentialed media shall not transmit or display video, audio, pictures, photographs or other non-text accounts or descriptions of events in any media and other event information may not be transmitted more than once every half-inning of play.

PARKING: Media members holding season and daily credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond, located in the Red Lot. Credentials will also serve as the parking pass to gain admission to the lot. Media is not permitted to park in the ballpark tunnel under The Diamond at any time.


