## Ownershin







DiBella, currently serves as President \& Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond. Over the past two years, that has included the creation of the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, CT. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President \& Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and the Norwich Navigators that preceded them. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues presently between the Flying Squirrels and their parent-club, the 2010 World Champion San Francisco Giants.

Although he led baseball's return to Richmond, DiBella's name continues to be synonymous with world championship boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding II-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Pay Per View flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr., and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing. DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers; and establish a legacy of matchmaking excellence, both in an effort to improve the health of the boxing industry.

Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titlist Paulie Malignaggi and WBC Welterweight champion Andre Berto.

In January 2005, DBE launched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in Rocky Balboa. In 2008, added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film Love Ranch, starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In the past year, he is credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film The Fighter, starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo Gatti, while a fighter with DBE.

DiBella was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, and attended Manhattan's prestigious Regis High School. He was a summa cum laude graduate of Tufts University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. A 1985 graduate of Harvard Law School, DiBella spent four years as an attorney with the prestigious law firm Sullivan \& Cromwell. A tireless advocate of boxing reform, DiBella has been a leader in the movement for federal regulation, uniform health and safety standards and a national boxing commission. He has lectured extensively on these subjects and has testified before Congress and numerous state and local bodies. In 1999, DiBella received the Thurman Munson Corporate Hero Award from the Association for the Help of Retarded Children for both his achievements at HBO and his charitable activities. Numerous civic organizations and retired boxer's associations have honored him, including Ring 8, Ring 34 and Latinos in Sports. DiBella resides in Huntington Bay, New York

A 28 -year veteran of the baseball business, Chuck Domino is currently the Chief Executive Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. He holds the same title with the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Triple-A, International League). He served as President of both the IronPigs and the Reading Phillies (Double-A, Eastern League) from 2006-2009. Domino's efforts have been greatly recognized with his recent induction into the Reading Baseball Hall of Fame. Following the 2010 season, Domino was also honored as the Eastern League's Executive of the Year, an award he had previously won four times while with the R-Phils. He also guided the Flying Squirrels to the overall and average attendance crowns during their inaugural season, marking the eighth consecutive a franchise he had led had garnered the distinction (Reading - 200309).

2010: Was named Eastern League Executive of the Year ... Led Richmond to overall and average attendance crown in EL ... Was inducted into the Reading (PA) Baseball Hall of Fame. 2008: Was inducted into the Berks County Business Hall of Fame by Junior Achievement in March ... R-Phils led the Eastern League in overall and average attendance $(436,789 / 6,423)$. Oversaw the inaugural season for the IronPigs ...Lehigh Valley finished 5th in the International League in overall and average attendance ( $602,033 / 8,479$ ). 2007: R-Phils led the Eastern League in overall and average attendance $(466,385 / 6,663)$... FirstEnergy Stadium became the first ballpark that has never been home to a Triple-A franchise to welcome it's 10 millionth fan all-time ...The R-Phils became the first E.L. team to draw better than 450,000 fans in eight consecutive seasons ... Presented "Champion of Youth Award" by the Olivet Boys and Girls Club ... R-Phils were nominated for the Larry MacPhail Award given to the top promoter in the Minors. 2006: Named Eastern League Executive of the Year for the 4th time ... Led E.L. in overall and average attendance $(460,216 / 6,669)$...The R-Phils became the first E.L. team to draw better than 450,000 fans in seven consecutive seasons ... Honored with the Extra Innings Award, presented at the Minor League Baseball Promotional Seminar to the team that demonstrates excellence in community service, for the opening of Gordon Hoodak Stadium at Lauer's Park... Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. In that role, he oversees all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations in Richmond.

With his guidance, the franchise completed a 1.5 million dollar renovation of The Diamond, where they opened Eastern League play in 2010 . During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while smashing corporate and ticket sales expectations. With "Parney" at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance, welcoming $463,842(6,626)$ fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded Logo of the Year for 2010 by Ballpark Digest.

Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond Business of the Year by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). "Parney" also currently serves the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Board of Trustees, as well as the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors. Due to his flamboyant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, "Parney" has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region.

Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond, "Parney" served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes (Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). "Parney" held the title of President for both franchises. 2011 will mark Parnell's 22nd season in minor league baseball. In addition to his roles with both the State College and Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve, a position he relinquished in December, 2008, after the sale of the franchise from Curve Baseball LP to the family of Robert F. Lozinak.

During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and added the highest honor bestowed annually upon a Minor League Baseball club, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, in 2006. Altoona became only the I I th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less than three years.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 200I. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

The 44-year old graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He has two daughters, Lindsay (16) and Samantha (I3).


## ORHDWhatil



Bill enters his 14th season in professional baseball and serves as the General Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. His leadership helped the Flying Squirrels build the franchise in little more than seven months, culminating in minor leauge merchandising records, an Eastern League attendance title and multiple community impact awards. He came to Richmond from the Daytona Cubs (Chicago Cubs - Florida State League) where he spent six seasons as their General Manager.

Bill was tabbed as the "Executive of the Year" by the Florida State League following the 2009 season, his final campaign before joining the Flying Squirrels. Under his watchful eye, the Daytona Cubs franchise was recognized for a ground-breaking 2006 season and continued contribution to Minor League Baseball by being named the winner of Baseball America's 2006 Bob Freitas "Organization of the Year" Award for the Single-A level.


Over his six seasons
with the Daytona Cubs, Papierniak helped the Cubs set attendance records at Jackie Robinson Park in five consecutive seasons. The team also shattered sponsorship and corporate sales records, becoming an award-winner and one of the most respected in Minor League Baseball.

Prior to joining the Cubs, the Northern Virginia native was a member of the Hagerstown Suns in the South Atlantic League for two seasons, ascending to the role of Assistant General Manager. During his tenure, the Suns were tabbed by ESPN in 2002 and 2003 with a "Veeckie" for top promotions in Minor League Baseball. For his efforts, Papierniak was named the 2002 South Atlantic League "Sales Executive of the Year."

Bill spent the first four seasons of his minor league baseball career with the Carolina League's Lynchburg Hillcats as the club's Director of Group Sales and Promotions.

Papierniak graduated from James Madison University with a B.B.A in management. He and his wife Michelle live in Midlothian along with their son Trae (7) and two daughters Ainsley (4) and Adalyn, who he and Michelle welcomed during the Flying Squirrels' inaugural season.


Denlinger joined the Flying Squirrels in the role of Assistant General Manager in September of 2009. He was part of the initial team on the ground in Richmond that began the franchise from a single conference table at The Diamond. He was integral in the start-up of the franchise, overseeing all aspects of corporate sales, ticket programs and group sales. With his help, the Flying Squirrels shattered initial expectations for both corporate and ticket sales, leading the Eastern League in attendance during their inaugural season. His work also led the Flying Squirrels to become quickly ingrained througout Richmond's corporate culture.

20II will mark Denlinger's 9th season in Minor League baseball, having previously spent time with the Daytona Cubs (Advanced-A - Florida State League) and the Delmarva Shorebirds (A - South Atlantic League).

The 31-year old graduated from Messiah College in 2003 with a degree in Sports Management. Following his graduation, he got his start in minor league baseball with the Reading Phillies (Double-A - Eastern League), then under the direction of current Flying Squirrels' Chief Executive Manager Chuck Domino. During his lone season with Reading, he played a role in the R-Phils leading the league in attendance and establishing records for attendance and sales.

After his experience in Reading, Tom went to work for the Shorebirds. During his three seasons in Delmarva, he ascended through the groups and sponsorship departments while establishing new sales records in each. He then joined Flying Squirrels' General Manager Bill Papierniak in Daytona, rising to the role of Assistant General Manager, a position he held through the 2009 season. During his tenure in Daytona, the Cubs established new community initiatives, while shattering attendance and sponsorship records.

During his first season in Richmond, Denlinger became active in the Richmond business community, frequently speaking
 to business leaders and groups. His work in that area helped the Flying Squirrels become the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year for 2010.

Denlinger is a native of Paradise, PA, and an avid sports fan. He currently lives in Richmond and is involved with his church. Although he is currently rehabbing his knee, he plans to return to the many community athletic leagues that he participates in.

## Flying Suluirels on the Air

The 2011 season of Flying Squirrels baseball can be heard locally on the radio on the flagship station for Flying Squirrels Baseball, Sports Radio 910 AM. Broadcasts will begin one half-hour before scheduled first pitch with the Flying Squirrels pregame show hosted by Anthony Oppermann. Game broadcasts will also include a half-hour post-game show hosted by Oppermann. Flying Squirrels game broadcasts will also be heard world-wide online at SportsRadio910. com.


Jon Laaser, 31, returns for a second season behind the microphone for all 142 Flying Squirrels games in 2011. He came to Richmond following a one-season stint as the lead broadcaster for the Montgomery Biscuits (Double-A - Tampa Bay Rays). He has been reunited in Richmond with Flying Squirrels' Vice President \& COO Todd "Parney" Parnell, whom he worked with while calling games for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (Advanced-A - Atlanta Braves) in 2008 and the Altoona Curve (Double-A - Pittsburgh Pirates) in 2007. A native of Minneapolis, MN, he has also provided play-by-play for the Yakima Bears (A - Arizona Diamondbacks), St. Paul Saints (Independent) and St. Cloud River Bats (Summer Collegiate). During the offseason, the versatile broadcaster was also heard calling the action for Virginia Commonwealth University Women's Basketball, and as a fill-in sports talk radio host on Sports Radio 910. Laaser has also served as the lead announcer for Charleston Southern University football and men's basketball, the Minnesota State High School Football/Basketball Championships and Hamline (MN) University football. His broadcasting career began in sports talk radio, with Clear Channel's KFAN in his native Minneapolis.


Anthony Oppermann, 28, also returns for a second season in the Flying Squirrels' radio booth in 2011. He will continue to provide play-by-play during Flying Squirrels' home games and select road games, as well as serving as host of the Flying Squirrels' pre and post-game shows. Prior to joing the Flying Squirrels, the experienced broadcaster most recently occupied the role of "Voice of the R-Phils," as the lead broadcaster for the Reading Phillies (Double-A - Philadelphia Phillies) in 2009. A native of La Grange,TX, Oppermann spent two seasons (2007, '08) as the lead broadcaster for the Potomac Nationals (Advanced-A - Washington Nationals), based in Woodbridge,VA. His baseball resume also includes time spent with the Daytona Cubs (Advanced-A - Chicago Cubs) and Round Rock Express (Double-A - Houston Astros). Upon coming to Richmond in the Fall of 2009, he rejoined Flying Squirrels' CEM Chuck Domino, whom he worked with in Reading, as well as Flying Squirrels' General Manager Bill Papierniak, whom he worked with in Daytona.

Making a grand entrance in Richmond, the face of the Flying Squirrels franchise memorably arrived on February I Ith, 2010 at a birthday party held at the historic Byrd Theatre. With confetti flying and the unrivaled cinematic score from the 1984 masterpiece "Karate Kid" announcing his presence, the masked avenger emerged from behind a slowly-raising curtain and silently announced his intention to protect The Diamond from stolen bases and those not deemed to be having enough Funn.

Nutzy quickly became one of the most recognizable figures in the Richmond community, making hundreds of appearances throughout the city during his first year. Highlights among them include: repelling off the Sun Trust Building in Downtown Richmond, opening the city's skating rink and appearing at the GRCC awards banquet, where the Flying Squirrels were presented with the award as Richmond's "Business of the Year."

His presence was a fixture at The Diamond during the Flying Squirrels' inaugural season, and merchandise bearing his likeness helped the Flying Squirrels smash minor league baseball merchandising records.


Following their inaugural season in 2010, the Flying Squirrels introduced new animated depictions of Nutzy as part as their effort to enhance the Nutzy character.
The two new depictions, including the Fight or Flight (Above), and Power Stance (Right), were created by Eastwood Media, and will be used in conjunction with a comic theme for the 2011 season.

## 2011 Fiving sulurpis



Machemer returns to the Double-A level for his 7th season in the Giants organization, the 4th he will spend at the helm of San Francisco's Double-A entrant. He spent each of the last two seasons as the skipper of the Augusta Greenjackets (A - South Atlantic). In 2010, he led the Jackets to the best overall record in the SAL Southern Division, and second best overrall mark in the league. However, his team failed to reach the postseason, having not claimed either the first or second half. In his first season in Augusta, he led the Jackets to the best overall record in the SAL (76-43), but also missed the playoffs due to not winning either half. Prior to Augusta, the veteran minor league manager spent one season leading the Arizona Rookie League Giants, posting a $36-20$ record. He spent the previous three seasons (2005-07) guiding the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, in Connecticut. Known as the Norwich Navigators during his first season in 2005, and Connecticut Defenders in '06 and'07.

He has recorded 1,424 victories in a managerial career that began in 1985. 2011 will mark his 38th campaign in professional baseball, and 21 st as a manager. Prior to joining the Giants organization, he spent the previous three seasons in the Montreal Expos' chain, as skipper at Double-A Harrisburg (2003-04), and Clinton (A - Midwest) in 2002. He was also a minor league manager or coordinator with the Milwaukee Brewers (1985-91), Expos (1992-95) and Baltimore Orioles (1996-2002). Other managerial stops include Double-A Bowie (200I), Single-A Frederick (2000), Triple-A Rochester (1999), Single-A Delmarva (1998), Double-A EI Paso (1996-97), Triple-A Denver (1989-90), Single-A Stockton (1987-88) and Rookie-level Beloit (I985). An infielder during his playing days, he appeared in 29 Major League games between the 1978 and 1979 seasons. He currently resides in Stevensville, MI.



Grimsley marks his 13th season in the Giants organization and second in Richmond in 2011. Grimsley also served as Flying Squirrels' Pitching Coach during their inaugural season in 2010. His staff finished fourth in the Eastern League in ERA (3.71) and runs allowed (586). In 2009, he served as the pitching coach for the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, the Connecticut Defenders (Double-A - Eastern League), guiding the staff to the third lowest ERA in the league (3.53). He spent the four previous years (2005-08) as the pitching coach for the Augusta Greenjackets (A - South Atlantic League). In 2008, his staff posted the lowest ERA (2.95) in the Giants' chain, while staff-ace Madison Bumgarner was named the Most Outstanding Pitcher in minor league baseball. His hurlers boasted 18 staff shutouts in both 2006 and 2007. He spent one season (2004) as the pitching coach at Fresno (Triple-A - Pacific Coast League), and two (2002-03) with the Giants' Double-A affiliate in Norwich, CT. He spent one season (2001) as a roving organizational pitching instructor after beginning his association with the Giants in 1999 and spending two seasons as the pitching coach for Double-A Shreveport. Before joining the Giants, he also served as a coach in the Seattle Mariners, Atlanta Braves, Baltimore Orioles and Philadelphia Phillies organizations.

As a left-handed pitcher, he spent II Major League seasons with the Cincinnati Reds (1971-73), Baltimore Orioles (1974-77, '82), Montreal Expos (1978-80) and Cleveland Indians (1980). After being named to the Baseball Digest I97I All-Star Rookie Team, he went on to pitch in three (3) League Championship Series (1972, 1973 and 1974), as well as the World Series in 1972 and All-Star Game in 1978. He tossed a two-hitter in game four of the 1972 NLCS (vs. Pittsburgh Pirates) and went on to claim a pair of victories in that season's World Series (vs. Oakland Athletics). After signing with the Expos as a free agent in 1978, he became the first 20-game winner in franchise history (1978) and was named the Expos' Player of the Year in the same season. He recorded double-digit win totals in eight of his II seasons, and finished his career with a record of I24-99 and an ERA of 3.81 in 345 appearances. He currently resides in Owings Mill, MD.


Enters his second season with the Giants' organization, having spent his first in 2010 as the hitting coach for the Triple-A Fresno Grizzlies. The Grizzlies finished 4th in the Pacific Coast League with a collective .283 team batting average. Joyce also oversaw the final development of Buster Posey, who hit . 347 in 47 games, before he ascended to the Major Leagues and claimed National League Rookie of the Year honors. Prior to joining the Giants, he spent eight seasons (2002-09) with the Toronto Blue Jays. He spent 2009 as the Hitting Coach with the Blue Jays' Triple-A entrant, the Las Vegas 5I's. He will be returning to the Eastern League, having filled the same role with the New Hampshire Fisher Cats for two seasons in 2007-08. He was also a manager in the Blue Jays' system at the Single-A level from 2004-06. Before his stint with Toronto, Joyce worked for both the Adirondack Lumberjackets (2001) and the Catskill Cougars (2000) of the independent Northern League. From 1994 to 1999, he served in a variety of roles for the Florida Marlins; Bullpen Coach (Portland - AA - 1994-95), Hitting Coach (Portland - AA - 1996), Hitting Coach (Utica - SS-A - 1997), and Manager (Utica - SS-A - 1998-99). As a pitcher, he saw action over five different seasons with Toronto (I991), Oakland (1992-94), and Minnesota (1995).

Joyce attended the University of Southern Maine, earning a BA in History and Education. He played in the 1985 NAIA College World Series before spending four seasons as an assistant coach at University of Southern Maine as well as coaching in the 1989 NCAA NAIA Division III World Series. He was elected to the University of Southern Maine Hall of Fame in 1998, and was elected into State of Maine Baseball Hall of Fame in 200I. He currently resides in Portland, ME with wife Janet, son, Tommy and daughter, Jill.

Adrianza is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive infielder in the San Francisco system, which is saying something, particularly when it is noted that he plays the same position as 2010 Squirrel Brandon Crawford, who is lauded as having Gold Glove potential as well. A solid season at the plate, combined with an awe-inspiring campaign in the field with San Jose in 2010 has propelled him from the \#8 prospect in the Giants' system prior to the 2010 season, to \#5 on the list heading into 2011. 21 until August, he was added to the 40 -man roster in the fall of 2010 . He was invited by the Giants to big league camp for the second consecutive spring training prior to the 2011 season. He remains a level behind Crawford in his ascension to San Francisco and projects to open the season as the Squirrels' everyday shortstop. Drafted in 2005 out of Long Beach State, Anderson was on the fast-track to a bullpen job in San Francisco after a record-setting season with San Jose (A+) in 2006 and a strong follow-up campaign with the Connecticut Defenders (AA) in 2007. However, an elbow strain in his right elbow discovered during spring training of 2008 would keep him off the mound for two full seasons following Tommy John surgery. Finally healthy in 2010 , he returned to the hill in San Jose, turning in a solid comeback season with 33 appearances in relief. Once a top-20 prospect (2007) in the Giants' chain, Anderson's comeback trail will likely lead him to a bullpen spot with the Flying Squirrels to open the season. Although Jason Stoffel will likely serve as the opening day closer, Anderson's experience at the back end of the bullpen could make him an ideal fit for the setup role.

The well-traveled story goes that the Giants drafted Bond by mistake when they took him out of the University of Missouri in the 24 th round of the 2007 draft, intending to select Casey Bond (unrelated) instead. They certainly wouldn't swap the pair now. Bond has hit at every level he has ascended to, including winning the Eastern League batting title (.333) with Connecticut in 2009. That season forced Baseball America to take notice, as they finally moved him into the organization's top- 30 prospects. It also prompted the Giants to promote him to Fresno (AAA) to begin the 2010 season. The versatile 27-year old made the expected jump to Fresno (AAA) to open the 2010 season, but as has been the case at each of the last three levels, he came back to Double-A and the Flying Squirrels in early July and finished the season in the Eastern League. He had landed on the disabled list in Fresno on two occasions, and continued to be hampered by a sore forearm upon his arrival in Richmond. The rail-thin Nicaraguan-born right-hander emerged on the prospect radar with a spectacular first-half of his first fullseason in 2010. Baseball America now touts the 21 -year old as the \#21 prospect in the Giants' chain. He posted a 2.21 ERA over 19 appearances (18 starts) with the Augusta Greenjackets (Low-A) before he was promoted to Advanced-A San Jose to finish the season. However, he had already logged II4 innings, over 30 more than his previous career-high for a season, at the time of his promotion. Therefore, fatigue has been cited as a potential reason why he struggled $(2-2,4.87)$ upon his arrival in the California League. The hitter-friendly nature of the league as a whole also figures to be a part of the lackluster showing. Regardless, the Giants and scouts around the game love his stuff (sinker/slider), and project an extremely high ceiling if he can withstand the rigors of a full season. He will more than likely return to San Jose for additional seasoning at the beginning of the year, but if he dominates the way he did at the beginning of 2010, he could join the Richmond rotation sooner rather than later.

Crawford is ranked as the \#6 prospect in the Giants' system by Baseball America, and is touted for having Gold Glove caliber defensive abilities. The Giants had hoped that the former UCLA Bruin would be ready to assume the everyday shortstop job in San Francisco in 2011, after the contract of World Series MVP Edgar Renteria expired. Unfortunately, an errant line-drive that struck and broke his right hand during a July batting practice session in Harrisburg set back his development, and he will more than likely open the season with Triple-A Fresno. In the meantime, the Giants signed veteran Miguel Tejada to a one-year contract, hoping to give Crawford time for his bat to catch up to his glove. A fan favorite in Richmond in 2010, he appears in this publication on the off chance that he struggles mightily at the Triple-A level at the beginning of the season. However, it would be a better bet that he will make his Major League debut before the season is out.

A supplemental first round pick in 2007, Culberson had advanced through the Giants' system slowly over his first three seasons, including repeating low-A with Augusta in 2009. However, 2010 was the breakout season that San Francisco had hoped for, as the 21 -year old posted career highs across the offensive board. He followed up his strong season with San Jose with a star-turn in the prestigious Arizona Fall League, and is currently ranked as the \#8 prospect in the San Francisco system by Baseball America. Originally drafted as a shortstop, Culberson has made two position swaps, moving to third base in 2009 and shifting to second base last year. Invited to big league spring training prior to the season, the Georgian will almost certainly open the season playing everyday in Richmond. The question that remains is how the playing time will be divided between Culberson and Nick Noonan, a fellow 2007 supplemental selection and second baseman, who is also expected in the Flying Squirrels' opening day infield.

The Giants thought enough of his year to extend him a non-roster invitation to big league spring training, and he should progress along with Peguero to Richmond. At least in the short-term, the game plan would seem to be the same with the pair platooning between right and center field.

## 2010:W REMEW



Following a whirlwind offseason in which the Connecticut Defenders left Norwich, Conn. and relocated to Richmond, the newly-minted Flying Squirrels took to the field for the first time on April 8,2010 against the Bowie Baysox at Prince George's Stadium in Bowie, Md.The Flying Squirrels baseball history officially began at 7:07 PM as Richmond centerfielder Darren Ford took a ball from Bowie left-hander Zach Britton. While the club began its first-ever season on April 8th, it had to wait until the next day to conclude its inaugural game as the contest was suspended due to rain in the top of the fifth inning with Richmond trailing Bowie I-0. Despite scoring a pair of runs after the game resumed, the Flying Squirrels lost their inaugural contest 6-4. The club wouldn't have to wait long to secure its first win as following the completion of the suspended opener, left-hander Clayton Tanner allowed just two hits over $5 \mathrm{I} / 3$ scoreless innings and Richmond shutout Bowie $2-0$ in a shortened seven-inning affair.

The Flying Squirrels victory in game two of the Bowie series would be the team's only win on its seven-game, season-opening road trip. Richmond returned to The Diamond in the early hours of the morning on April 15th with a I-6 record after being swept by the Altoona Curve in a three-game series at Blair County Ballpark.

The club got a huge lift in its first-ever home game as a capacity crowd of 9,560 fans packed The Diamond to celebrate the return of minor league baseball to Richmond. Right-hander Daryl Maday also provided a boost, firing $52 / 3$ scoreless innings. He combined with three Richmond relievers on a four-hit shutout as the Flying Squirrels topped the Reading Phillies 3-0. Second baseman Nick Noonan stroked a two-out, RBI double in the bottom of the second inning and catcher Jackson Williams and third baseman Conor Gillaspie each smacked solo homeruns to supply the Flying Squirrels' offense.

Maday paced a Flying Squirrels pitching staff that dominated opposing hitters in April. Richmond pitchers posted a 2.39 ERA in 21 April contests and held the opposition to a . 217 average against - both tops in the Eastern League. Maday finished the month 3-0 with a I.II ERA in four starts and four of Richmond's five starting pitchers (Maday, Tanner, Mike MacDonald, and David Mixon) posted ERAs under 3.00. While the club hit just .244 as a group in April, veteran outfielder Clay Timpner roared out of the gates, batting . 405 (I5 $\times 37$ ) in 17 April contests. Williams also had an impressive start to the season, opening the year with an II-game hitting streak while batting 419 ( $14 \times 34$ ).

The Flying Squirrels carried the momentum from their home-opening win through the remainder of April and into May.After the I-6 start, Richmond would go 2I-7 over its next 28 games to reach a season-best mark of $22-13$, nine games over .500 , on May 14th with a 7 -I win over Altoona. At that point, the Flying Squirrels owned a I $1 / 2$ game lead in the Western Division and appeared destined to contend for a playoff spot. However, after going 10-4 through the first 14 games in May, Richmond went just 5-1I over the final 16 games to finish the season's second month 15-15 and 27-24 overall. Timpner, who was in the midst of a 13 -game hitting streak, landed on the Disabled List for a week with a groin strain. Following the injury, the 27 -year-old hit just 245 ( $93 \times 380$ ) the remainder of the season. Injuries began to become a theme for the Flying Squirrels in May as MacDonald and Tanner as well as Noonan, first basemen Andy D'Alessio and Michael Ambort, and super utility man Skyler Stromsmoe all ended up on the Disabled List during the month. Even though the staff ERA ballooned to 3.93 in May, Maday continued to pitch effectively, winning seven of his first nine starts before dropping his first decision May 28th against Bowie.

June would prove to be the Flying Squirrels worst month as a previously steady pitching staff began to struggle. Richmond allowed 10 -plus runs three times in 28 games in June after giving up 10 or more games just twice through its first 51 games. The club's staff ERA rose to 4.23 for the month as the Flying Squirrels endured a pair of five-game losing streaks en route to a $10-18$ record in June. Right-hander Rafael Cova remained a bright spot out of the Richmond bullpen, however. The 28 -year-old finished the first three months of the season converting 14 out of 15 saves, including 10 straight to begin the year, while posting a 1.23 ERA in 26 games.

While the pitching suffered through a difficult month, Richmond's offense began to heat up, hitting a season-high 20 homeruns in June. Neal led the surge at the plate, hitting a season-best . 347 ( $34 \times 98$ ) in June. The 23 -year-old

2010 Season in Review [cont.] capped his month by blasting three homeruns in a 6-3, II-inning, win over the Erie SeaWolves on June 26th at Jerry Uht Park.After hitting $259(52 \times 201)$ through the first two months of the season, Neal would go on to hit $.312(101 \times 324)$ the remainder of the year.


In need of a spark, the Flying Squirrels welcomed one of the stories of the season into fold July 2nd. First baseman Brandon Belt, who was selected by the San Francisco in the fifth round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Texas, was dominating Advanced-A San Jose in his first season playing professional baseball.A California League All-Star, Belt hit . 383 with 10 homeruns and 62 RBls in 77 games with the Giants. At the time of his promotion to Richmond, he led all of minor league baseball in batting average and on-base percentage (.492). After going 0 -for- 3 in his first contest with the Flying Squirrels against Erie on July 3rd, Belt erupted. In front of a capacity Fourth of July crowd, the 22 -year-old went 4 -for- 5 with a homerun, RBI and two runs scored. It was the start of a I3-game hit streak for Belt over which he hit $.442(23 \times 52)$ with five homeruns and nine RBls. Gillaspie also had an exceptional month offensively, batting a season-best . 410 (34x83) in 27 games during the month. Combined with Neal, who hit .292, the Flying Squirrels offense batted a season-high .263 in July.

Staff ace Daryl Maday was promoted to Triple-A Fresno on July 3rd, and the club was in need of someone to fill the void after the right-hander went $8-5$ with a 2.34 ERA in 16 starts. An unlikely candidate stepped up and assumed the role.Veteran right-hander Felix Romero, who turned 30 in June, had spent the majority of his pro career pitching almost exclusively in relief. Originally a product of the Toronto Blue Jays farm system, Romero had made only five starts in 331 appearances over nine seasons with the Blue Jays, Boston Red Sox, and Baltimore Orioles organizations. After moving to the rotation at the end of June, the Dominican hit his stride in July going 2-0 with a 2.23 ERA in five starts. He held opposing hitters to a .217 batting average while striking out 24 batters and walking only two in 32 I/3 innings. Left-hander Jake Stevens and right-hander Ronnie Ray were each stellar in relief. Stevens went I-I with a I.38 ERA in 10 appearances while Ray was I-0 with a 0.6 I ERA in 13 outings.

Maday, Cova, Neal, and shortstop Brandon Crawford were selected as Eastern League All-Stars; however, Maday was unable to participate due to his promotion and Crawford had to sit out the game due to injury. Tanner was selected in Maday's place, but was held out of the game by the Giants. He was replaced by Stevens, who appeared in the game in Harrisburg along with Neal as the Western Division All-Stars topped the Eastern Division 10-3.

After falling to a then season-worst mark of eight games under . 500 at 42-50 after a loss to Bowie on July 16th, the Flying Squirrels began to make a run. Following the defeat, Richmond went 10-5 over their final 15 games in July to finish the month 16-13.The club started August going 7-5 and reached the .500 mark at 60-60 on August 15th following a 5-4 come-from-behind win over the Portland Sea Dogs at The Diamond. Down 4-0 going into the bottom of the ninth, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs in the inning matching their largest comeback victory of the season. While both the team and fans were enthusiastic about the club's playoff chances following the win, Richmond's postseason dreams faded the remainder of the month. The Flying Squirrels began a six-game road trip by getting swept in New Britain by a Rock Cats' club that lost 98 games in 2010. It was the start of a $4-11$ stretch for the team to finish August II-16 and 64-7I overall. In the middle of the swoon, Belt was promoted to Fresno on August 25th and the Flying Squirrels were officially eliminated from playoff contention following a loss at Erie on August 30th.

Darren Ford made history on September Ist as he became the first Flying Squirrel to be called up to the Major Leagues.After hitting .25 I with 37 stolen bases in II3 games with Richmond, the 25 -year-old speedster entered as a pinch runner that same day, and he scored the game-winning run in the bottom of the eighth inning in a 2-I Giants win over the Colorado Rockies. Meanwhile, Ford's former teammates played the role of spoiler to close out the 2010 campaign. Needing just one win to force a playoff with the Harrisburg Senators, the Bowie Baysox dropped the final three games of the season in Richmond, all one-run losses. Fittingly, Cova, the Eastern League saves leader, closed out the regular season finale on September 6th by working a perfect ninth inning for his 23rd save, eliminating Bowie. The Flying Squirrels finished the season $68-73$ and in 5 th place in the Western Division, $131 / 2$ games behind the Altoona Curve. Even with a losing record overall, the club fed off of the energy at The Diamond, going 37-33 at home as the Flying Squirrels led the league in total $(463,842)$ and average $(6,626)$ attendance.

Although the Altoona Curve (Pittsburgh Pirates) bested the Trenton Thunder (New York Yankees) in the ELCS for the EL title, Trenton had a one-game edge during the regular season and boasted the best overall record (83-59).

## 2010 EL Playoff Results

In the Eastern Division, the Trenton Thunder and New Hampshire Fisher Cats salted away spots in the postseason with ease, as the Portland Sea Dogs faded to a distant 3rd place finish. The only question near the end of the season was who would be division champion, an honor that went to the Thunder.

## Baschall is Backt

Following the 2008 International League season, baseball was packed into boxes and moved away from the city of Richmond,VA. After repeated failed attempts to secure a new ballpark in Richmond, the Richmond Braves, who had called the city home for over forty years, headed to new digs in Gwinnett, GA. The Richmond community made last-ditch efforts to save the team, but to no avail. An announcement made before the 2008 season regarding the team's impending move, turned the season into a "lame-duck" experience and a final fan's farewell.

In a baseball-rich community, the absence of the game weighed heavily on hearts during the summer of 2009. However, near the end of that summer, rumors started swirling regarding baseball's return to the River City. A few weeks after the 2009 season concluded, the once dormant Diamond housed a press conference to announce that baseball would indeed be back, beginning in 2010.

As the residents of Richmond prepared for that 2009 season without baseball, the San Francisco Giants' Double-A Franchise, the Connecticut Defenders, were preparing for their 2009 season in Norwich, CT. Prior to the season and unbeknownst to baseball fans in Richmond, the Eastern League had targeted the city for the relocation of an Eastern League franchise. Although not announced, speculation ran rampant that the franchise would be the Defenders. Although the Defenders posted a memorable season on the field, rolling to the Northern Division Championship and a berth in the Eastern League Championship Series, lagging attendance and visibility of the franchise eventually led to their selection as the team that would move to Richmond.

On September 23, 2009, the Eastern League held a press conference to announce that the Defenders were relocating from Norwich, CT to Richmond,VA for the 2010 season. It was also announced that The Diamond would be the home of the new team for the first two seasons, with three option years mutually agreed upon by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority and the newly-minted team operating under the name of Navigators Baseball LP. Lou DiBella, President \& Managing General Partner of Navigators Baseball LP, would head up the ownership team that would bring baseball back. That ownership group vowed wholesale improvements to the condition of The Diamond, beginning with replacing bench-seating in the entire lower bowl, discarding the old aluminum benches and outfitting the ballpark with 3,200 brand-new fold-down seats with cup holders.

The "Baseball is Back" press conference was also used to introduce the management team on the ground in Richmond for the new team. Chuck Domino, a longtime presence in the Eastern League as President of the Reading Phillies, would serve as Chief Executive Manager. Along with building the R-Phils into one of the most successful franchises in minor league baseball, Domino had overseen the creation of the Lehigh Valley Iron Pigs - Triple-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies - in 2008. Joining Domino would be Vice President \& Chief Operating Officer Todd "Parney" Parnell and General Manager Bill Papierniak.

Fans were involved in the process from the very beginning as the team announced an on-line "Name the Team" contest in conjunction with The Richmond Times-Dispatch that would begin in late September. Fans were offered the chance to submit their suggestions for the team's new name. More than 6,000 entries were received before the team's front office narrowed the field to five finalists. It was announced in early October that the finalists would include the Flatheads, the Flying Squirrels, the Hambones, the Rhinos and the Rock Hoppers. Darren Rovell from CNBC got in on the fun and ran an additional contest to add a wild-card entrant from submissions across the country. More than 9,000 submissions flooded CNBC before Hush Puppies was chosen as the sixth finalist. Hambones was eventually dropped from consideration, and the final five remained.

On October 15, 2009, the Flying Squirrels were born at a press conference held at The Richmond TimesDispatch building in downtown Richmond.With confetti flying, "Parney" raised the arm of Kyle Nelson and his wife Donna, representing their son Brad Mead at the press conference. Mead had submitted the name Flying Squirrels, and was awarded season tickets for life by the newly-minted team. Plan B. Branding was on hand at the press conference to outline their plans for logo creation and brand implementation, getting right to work on the identity of the now identified Flying Squirrels.

Meanwhile, renovations going on behind the scenes at The Diamond were substantial. In the lower bowl, seats were being unbolted and removed to make way for 3,200 new seats. The old restaurant along the first baseline was being reinvented as an expansive merchandise store, the suites were being gutted and outfitted with new windows, seats and furniture and the concession stands were being emptied and prepared for new state-of-the-art equipment. A new picnic area was being created along the third baseline, while a kid's zone began to take shape outside of the new store.

In late November, the Squirrels moved another step forward and announced a two-year media partnership with Clear Channel Broadcasting. Sports Radio 910 AM would be Richmond's flagship radio station, carrying all 142 regular season games. It was also announced that the Squirrels' broadcast team would consist of Jon Laaser and Anthony Oppermann.

December I, 2009 was the day everyone had been waiting for. A press conference was held at Holiday Inn I-64 West End to unveil the team's new logo and the official colors of Radiant Red, Squirrels Silver, and traditional Black. The Flying Squirrels' identity continued to come together as four logos were unveiled: a primary logo featuring a flying squirrel in mid-flight, a secondary acorn logo adorned with an "R", a Richmond word mark secondary logo, and a Flying Squirrels word mark secondary logo.

Following the logo unveiling, the Flying Squirrels also celebrated a soft grand opening of the team store at The Diamond, one of Minor League Baseball's largest merchandise stores. At the store, fans could shop amongst a vast array of Flying Squirrels' apparel and memorabilia, as well as have the opportunity to order the merchandise online. Coupled with the excitement surrounding the new team, the holiday shopping rush turned Flying Squirrels' merchandise into a hot-commodity. Minor league records were broken as inventory flew off the shelves, prompting rushed re-stocking and furious efforts from the team's front office to make sure a rapidly-growing fan base got their hands on the new-look merchandise before the holidays. The massive response to merchandise also proved an asset to the community, as the Flying Squirrels partnered with numerous area charities for the first-ever "Season of Giving." Each charitable partner received $10 \%$ of the daily sales for a select day during the holiday shopping season, culminating in a $\$ 15,000$ donation from the team.

The vision of baseball returning to Richmond became clearer on January 5th, 2010, as the Flying Squirrels held a press conference at Home Team Grille to announce the inaugural field staff as assigned by the San Francisco Giants. The first manager, or "head nut" as he cracked upon his introduction, would be Andy Skeels. Ascending to a managerial role at the Double-A level for the first time, Skeels would bring a winning pedigree to Richmond having claimed titles with the San Jose Giants (Advanced-A, California League) in 2009 and the Augusta Greenjackets (A, South Atlantic League) in 2008. He was joined at the podium by pitching coach Ross Grimsley and hitting coach Russ Morman. Eric Ortega, who was not in attendance, was announced as the team's first Athletic Trainer.

The fans were given yet another opportunity to take ownership of the team with a contest running on-line through The Richmond Times Dispatch in late December to name the mascot. Nearly 4,000 submissions were received, and on February I Ith, the new face of the franchise, "Nutzy" was introduced at a press conference at The Byrd Theatre.

At the same press conference, the Flying Squirrels uniforms were revealed during a "Uniform Fashion Show." Lane Casadonte from CBS-6TV, Chip Tarkenton from ABC-8TV,Wes McElroy from Sports Radio 910 and Greg Burton from ESPN Radio 950 served as celebrity models for the fashion show. With the introduction, the Flying Squirrels image was complete.

The Inaugural version of the Richmond Flying Squirrels hit town on April 5th, 2010, flying from the Giants' Spring Training Complex in Scottsdale, AZ to Norfolk,VA. The team was chartered via bus from Norfolk directly to The Diamond, where they immediately took occupancy of the newly renovated home clubhouse. Their arrival, much like the departure of the team that had formerly inhabited the same clubhouse, happened in the middle of the night under the cover of darkness.

The first Flying Squirrels Media Day took place on April 6th, 20I0, as players and staff took turns fielding questions from the local media, tried on the newly-minted Flying Squirrels uniforms and posed for head shots. That same evening, the team met the community that would support it for the first time, taking part in the "Meet the Team" event at the Richmond Marriott Downtown. Approximately 200 well-wishers were on hand to welcome the team to Richmond, as they were introduced for the first time.

On Thursday, April 8th at 8:30 am, the Flying Squirrels departed via charter bus for the franchise's first game. It took place at Bowie's Prince George's Stadium in Bowie, MD. Ominously, the game was suspended in the fifth inning due to heavy rain showers in the area. Richmond right-hander Mike MacDonald took the ball and made the first start in franchise history. CF Darren Ford looked at the first pitch in a Flying Squirrels' uniform, which was hurled by Bowie left-hander Zach Britton. The Squirrels' inaugural game was completed the following evening, with the Squirrels falling, 6-4. However, their first win followed quickly behind, as Richmond blanked Bowie, 2-0 in the seven-inning contest that followed for their first victory. Left-hander Clayton Tanner earned the first victory for Richmond.

It was the only win the Squirrels would notch on a season-opening seven-game road swing, as they dropped the final two games to the Baysox and were swept in three games by the Altoona Curve. The Squirrels limped home at a mark of I-6.

The slow start did little to diminish the enthusiasm surrounding baseball's return to the River City, and The Diamond was abuzz well before the scheduled 7:05 pm first pitch on Thursday, April I5th. A sellout crowd of 9,560 ushered the game back in, as Squirrels' right-hander Daryl Maday and the Richmond bullpen combined to blank the Reading Phillies. Richmond earned a 3-0 shutout win in their first game at The Diamond. However, the night was marked by the pageantry that surrounded the evening, including Richmond Mayor Dwight Jones and Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell were among the luminaries on hand to throw out ceremonial first pitches.

The sellout crowd was a sign of things to come, as the Flying Squirrels immediately became a local sensation. They welcomed eight more capacity crowds on their way to knocking off longtime Eastern League champ Reading for the league's attendance crown. 463,842 fans made their way to The Diamond during the 2010 season, earning the Squirrels the overall attendance crown in the Eastern League, as well as the highest average attendance $(6,626)$.

On the field, the Squirrels stumbled to a 5th place finish in the newly-formed Western Division, posting a record of 68-73.

Off the field, they smashed minor league merchandise records, introduced an entirely new brand of entertainment to baseball fans in Richmond and earned recognition for their year-long effort to aid causes throughout the community.

Following the season, Domino was named the Eastern League's Executive of the Year. Additionally, the team was honored as the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year and Richmond Magazine's Best Sports Franchise. Ballpark Digest honored the Squirrels new look with their Logo of the Year Award and Style Weekly annointed the Squirrels "Richmonders of the Year."

Despite the accolades, in his post-season synopsis, Parnell stated that " 2010 will be the worst season the Flying Squirrels ever have."

Setting the stage for the next chapter in the Flying Squirrels story:The 2011 Season.

## The Diamond - Stadium Facts

The Diamond serves as the home venue for Flying Squirrels baseball as they represent the San Francisco Giants in the Eastern League of Professional Baseball Clubs. The facility was previously the home of the Richmond Braves (Triple-A - International League) from 1985-2008. Following the 2008 season, the Richmond Braves relocated to Gwinett, GA, becoming the Gwinnett Braves beginning in the 2009 season. Although Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) continued to play their home games at The Diamond during the 2009 season, the ballpark was void of professional baseball for the first time since its construction. The ballpark continues to be operated by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority (RMA). The RMA and Flying Squirrels enjoy a two-year lease agreement (20I0-20II), which includes three club option years. Prior to the 2010 season, The Flying Squirrels committed more than two million dollars to renovate The Diamond. Included in those renovations was the replacement of aluminum-bleachers in the lower bowl of the ballpark with 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats (pictured below). The top II rows of the upper bowl were also eliminated to create room for banner signage that allows the overall look of the park to become more cohesive and lowers capacity to a more intimate 9,560. The Flying Squirrels continued to enhance and refurbish their home park prior to the 2011 season, investing another $\$ 250,000$ into the park. Included in the upgrades were; converting the existing line-scoreboard to an LED display (Time Technologies), construction of a Speed of Pitch display in right centerfield (Daktronics), converting existing clock in right-field to an LED display, creation of party decks behind home plate and the "Cupid Section" down the right-field line, and the refurbishing of the "batter's eye" in center field.


At the center of a more than two-million dollar renovation of The Diamond, was the installation of 3,164 state-of-the-art folddown seats that replaced aluminum-bench style seating in the lower-bowl that had been in place since the ballpark opened in 1985. The project to replace the entire lower-bowl of seats began in November, 2009 and was completed in February, 2010.

The Diamond - 2010 Renovations

Prior to their inaugural season in Richmond, the Flying Squirrels eliminated 2,574 seats from The Diamond by removing the top II rows of the upper level. The shrinking of the stadium's seating capacity was done in the interest of creating a more intimate atmosphere for fans and to affect the overall appearance of the ballpark to avoid the perception of the stadium being top-heavy. Despite the diminished capacity of the ballpark, the Flying Squirrels drew an average of 6,626 fans over their 70 home dates during the 2010 season, welcoming a total of 463,842 spectators to the ballpark. Those totals allowed the franchise to post the highest overall and average attendance figures in the Eastern League, knocking off perennial attendance champion Reading, who had led the circuit in each of the previous seven seasons. Additionally, the Flying Squirrels drew nearly 2,000 more fans per game than their predecessors, the Gwinnett Braves $(4,8 I 8)$, did during the 2010 season. The Flying Squirrels also drew more than I,500 fans on average than the Richmond Braves did in any of their final three seasons at The Diamond, and nearly 2,200 more fans on average than the R-Braves did in their final season at The Diamond in 2008.

## Medical Clossary

Abscess: an infection, which produces pus; can be result of blister, callus, penetrating wound or laceration.
Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): a primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint:A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-Inflammatory: any agent, which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Anteriogram: a film demonstrating arteries after injection of dye.
Arthrogram: x -ray technique for joints using air and/ or dye injected into the affected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff.
Arthroscope: an instrument used to visualize the interior of a joint cavity.

Arthroscopy: a surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an Arhroscope. An arthroscopic procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Atrophy: to shrivel or shrink from disuse, as in muscular atrophy.
Baker's Cyst: localized swelling of a bursa sac in the posterior knee as a result of fluid that has escaped from the knee capsule. A Baker's cyst indicates that there is trauma inside the knee joint that leads to excessive fluid production.

Bone Scan: an imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury sight takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Bursa: a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where Bursa: a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where
friction is likely to occur, then minimizes the friction; for example between a tendon and a bone.
Capsule: an enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize that joint.

CAT Scan: use of a computer to produce a cross sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from $x$-ray data.

Cellulitis: inflammation of cellular of connective tissue
Cervical Vertebrae: group of seven vertebrae located in the neck.

Collateral Ligament: on either side of and acting as a radius of movement, a hinge joint, as of the elbow knee and wrist.
Concussion: jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: an injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object

Degenerative Joint Disease: changes in the joint surfaces as a result of repetitive trauma.
Deltoid Ligament: ligament that connects the tibia to bones of the medical aspect of the foot and is primarily responsible for stability of the ankle on the medial side. Is sprained less frequently than other ankle ligaments.

Deltoid Muscle: muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc, Intervertebral: a flat, rounded plate between
each of vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fiber ring, which surrounds a soft-gel like interior: It functions as a cushion and shock absorber for the spinal column.

Dislocation: complete displacement of joint surfaces
Eccymosis: bleeding into the surface tissue below the skin, resulting in a "black and blue" effect.

Effusion: accumulation of fluid in various spaces in the body. Commonly, the knee has an effusion after an injury.

Electromyogram (EMG): test to determine nerve function

Epicondylitis: inflammation in the elbow due to overuse

Fracture: breach in continuity of bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, green-stick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: a mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or confused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

Grade Two Injury: a moderate injury in which musculoskeletal tissue has been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

Grade Three Injury: a severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totatally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function.

Hematoma: tumor-like mass produced by an accumulation of coagulated blood in a cavity.

Inflammation: the body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: an edge, rim or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.
Ligament: band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and meniscus injuries.

Meniscus: crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee, medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.
Metacarpals: five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers.

Metatarsals: five long bones of the foot, running from the ankle to the toes.

Patella Tendinitis: inflammation of the patellar ligament; also know as "jumpers knee."

Patellofemoral Joint: articulation of the kneecap and femur. Inflammation of this joint can occur through: I) acute injury to the patella, 2 ) overuse from excessive running particularly if there is an associated knee weakness, 3) chronic wear and tear of the knee, 4) as a result of poor foot mechanics. Patellofemoral irritation can lead to hondromalancia, which in its most chronic condition, could require surgery.

Plica: fold of tissue in the joint capsule and a common result of knee injury.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): a primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides sig
stability and prevents displacement of the tibia stability and prevents displacement of the tibia
backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this
ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up
to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Reconstruction: surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingment Syndrome: a microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress, and the fou stages are: I) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff; 2 ) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation; 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than one cm and 4) a complete tear of one cm or more.
Scapula: shoulder blade.
Sciatica: irritation of the sciatic nerve resulting in pain or tingling running down the inside of the leg.

Sciatic Nerve: major nerve that carries impulses for muscular action and sensations between the low back and thigh and lower leg; it is the longest nerve in the body.

Shin Splint: a catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor and cannot be defined otherwise.
Spondylolisthesis: forward displacement of one verterbrae over another below it due to a developmental defect in the vertebrae.

Sprain: injury resulting from a stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Strain: injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: a hair-line type break in a bone caused by overuse.

Stress x -ray: a continual x -ray taken when a portion of the body is stressed to its maximum in order to determine joint stability. This is a test utilized in some ankle injuries.

Sublaxation: partial dislocation of a joint. The term usually implies that the joint can return to its normal position without formal reduction.

Tarsals: a group of seven bones of the foot consisting of the calcaneus, talus, cuboid and three cuneiform bones.

Tendinitis: inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: tissue that connects muscle to bone.
Tomograph: a special type of $x$-ray apparatus that demonstrates an organ or tissue at a particular depth.

Transverse Process: small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebra that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Triangular Cartilage: a connective tissue characterzed by its nonvascularity and firm consistency; located on the little finger side of the wrist.

Ulnar Nerve: nerve in the elbow commonly irritated by excessive throwing.

Wrist: the junction between the two forearm bones (radius and ulna) and the eight wrist bones (trapezium, capitate, hamate, pisiform, trequetral, lunate and scaphoid).

## Flying Suuirels' Medila Policies

SEASON CREDENTIALS: Season credentials for the 2011 season will only be issued to legitimate news gathering organizations that cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. The Flying Squirrels will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (804-359-1373) or as an email attachment to Jon Laaser at jon.laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be made via email to Jon Laaser at jon. laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com. Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the media will call window.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP: The Flying Squirrels will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily Credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will also honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writer's Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: During games, photographers must work out of the photography wells adjacent to both dugouts. Special requests should be directed to Jon Laaser, Director of Broadcasting, or Anthony Oppermann, Director of Media, at least 24 hours in advance of game.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES: In accordance with the regulations designated by the San Francisco Giants and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will be open to credentialed media from $3 \mathrm{I} / 2$ hours prior to game time until 45 min utes prior to game time. Following the game, clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department. There will be no clubhouse access during rain delays or between games of a doubleheader.

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines under any circumstance. Media in violation of this policy are subject to credential revocation. Media must leave the field and dugouts areas no later than 45 minutes prior to the game time.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to those organizations that cover the team the most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements, please contact the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to those dates.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admittance to lot. Media is not permitted to park in ballpark tunnel (Under Stadium) at anytime.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Flying Squirrels players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or feature story should contact the Flying Squirrels no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availabity, as the Flying Squirrels respect the players and coaches wishes in all matters. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start. No exceptions.
