

DIBELLA

Lou DiBella President & Managing General Partner

Lou DiBella currently serves as President & Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond. Over the past three years, that has included the creation of the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group, and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, CT. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and the Norwich Navigators that preceded them. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues presently between the Flying Squirrels and their parent-club, the San Francisco Giants.

Although he led baseball's return to Richmond, DiBella's name continues to be synonymous with world championship boxing.

He enjoyed an outstanding 11-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Pay Per View flourished under his leadership, televising

many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr., and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing. DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers; and establish a legacy of matchmaking excellence, both in an effort to improve the health of the boxing industry.

Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titlist Paulie Malignaggi and WBC Welterweight champion Andre

In January 2005, DBE launched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in Rocky Balboa. In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer

to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film Love Ranch, starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film The Fighter, starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo Gatti, while a fighter with DBE.

DiBella was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, and attended Manhattan's prestigious Regis High School. He was a summa cum laude graduate of Tufts University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. A 1985 graduate of Harvard Law School, DiBella spent four years as an attorney with the prestigious law firm Sullivan & Cromwell. A tireless advocate of boxing reform, DiBella has been a leader in the movement for federal regulation, uniform health and safety standards and a national boxing commission. He has lectured extensively on these subjects and has testified before Congress and numerous state and local bodies. In 1999, DiBella received the Thurman Munson Corporate Hero Award from the Association for the Help of Retarded Children for both his achievements at HBO and his charitable activities. Numerous civic organizations and retired boxer's associations have honored him, including Ring 8, Ring 34 and Latinos in Sports. DiBella resides in Huntington Bay, New York

2012 Flying Squirrels 2011: In Review History & Records Eastern League

Chuck Domino **Chief Executive Manager**

A 29-year veteran of the baseball business, Chuck Domino is currently the Chief Executive Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. He also holds the title of President with the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Triple-A, International League). He served as President of both the IronPigs and the Reading Phillies (Double-A, Eastern League) from 2006-2009. Domino's efforts have been greatly recognized with his 2010 induction into the Reading Baseball Hall of Fame. Following the 2010 season, Domino was also honored as the Eastern League's Executive of the Year, an award he had previously won four times while with the R-Phils. During their inaugural season in 2010, Domino led the Flying Squirrels to the overall and average attendance crowns in the Eastern League. In each of the last two seasons, the IronPigs have claimed the overall Minor League Baseball attendance title.

The R-Phils became the first E.L team to draw better than 450,000 fans in eight consecutive seasons ... Presented "Champion of Youth Award" by the Olivet Boys and Girls Club ... R-Phils were nominated for the Larry MacPhail Award given to the top promoter in the Minors. 2006: Named Eastern League Executive of the Year for the 4th time ... Led E.L. in overall and average attendance (460,216/6,669) ... The R-Phils became the first E.L team to draw better than 450,000 fans in seven consecutive seasons ... Honored with the Extra Innings Award, presented at the Minor League Baseball Promotional Seminar to the team that demonstrates excellence in community service, for the opening of Gordon Hoodak Stadium at Lauer's Park... Todd "Parney" Parnell Vice President/COO

Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. In that role, he oversees all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations in Richmond.

After leading the Flying Squirrels to the 2010 Eastern League attendance title, "Parney" and the Squirrels saw an increase in average attendance during the 2011 regular season and were easily the top-draw during the 2011 EL postseason. For his efforts, and due to the team's success on the field and off, "Parney" was honored by Baseball America following the season with their top minor league award. He was named 2011 Baseball America Minor League Executive of the Year. The Flying Squirrels now boast the distinction of having two recipients of the award in their front office, as Chuck Domino was also recognized with the award in 2003 while with the Reading

With his guidance, the franchise completed a 1.5 million dollar renovation of The Diamond, where they opened Eastern League play in 2010. During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while smashing corporate and ticket sales expectations. With "Parney" at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance, welcoming 463,842 (6,626) fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded Logo of the Year for 2010 by Ballpark Digest.

Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond Business of the Year by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). "Parney" also currently serves the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Board of Trustees, as well as the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors. Due to his flamboyant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, "Parney" has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region.

Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond, "Parney" served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes (Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). "Parney" held the title of President for both franchises.

2012 will mark Parnell's 23rd season in minor league baseball. In addition to his roles with both the State College and Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve, a position he relinquished in December, 2008, after the sale of the franchise from Curve Baseball LP to the family of Robert F. Lozinak.

During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and added the highest honor bestowed annually upon a Minor League Baseball club, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, in 2006. Altoona became only the 11th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less

than three years.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 2001. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

The 45-year old graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He has two daughters, Lindsay (17) and Samantha (14).









Bill enters his 15th season in professional baseball and serves as the General Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. His leadership helped the Flying Squirrels build the franchise in little more than seven months, culminating in minor leauge merchandising records, an Eastern League attendance title and multiple community impact awards. He came to Richmond from the Daytona Cubs (Chicago Cubs - Florida State League) where he spent six seasons as their General Manager.

Bill was tabbed as the "Executive of the Year" by the Florida State League following the 2009 season, his final campaign before joining the Flying Squirrels. Under his watchful eye, the Daytona Cubs franchise was recognized for a ground-breaking 2006 season and continued contribution to Minor League Baseball by being named the winner of Baseball America's 2006 Bob Freitas "Organization of the Year" Award for the Single-A level.

Over his six seasons with the Daytona

tendance records at Jackie Robinson Park in shattered sponsorship and corporate sales and one of the most respected in Minor

Cubs, Papierniak helped the Cubs set atfive consecutive seasons. The team also records, becoming an award-winner League Baseball.

Prior to joining the Cubs, the Northern Virginia native was a member of the Hagerstown Suns in the South Atlantic League for two seasons, ascending to the role of Assistant General Manager. During his tenure, the Suns were tabbed by ESPN in 2002 and 2003 with a "Veeckie" for top promotions in Minor League Baseball. For his efforts, Papierniak was named the 2002 South Atlantic League "Sales Executive of the Year."

Bill spent the first four seasons of his minor league baseball career with the Carolina League's Lynchburg Hillcats as the club's Director of Group Sales and Promotions.

Papierniak graduated from James Madison University with a B.B.A in management. He and his wife Michelle live in Midlothian along with their son Trae (8) and two daughters Ainsley (5) and Adalyn (1).





Denlinger joined the Flying Squirrels in the role of Assistant General Manager in September of 2009. He was part of the initial team on the ground in Richmond that began the franchise from a single conference table at The Diamond. He was integral in the start-up of the franchise, overseeing all aspects of corporate sales, ticket programs and group sales. With his help, the Flying Squirrels shattered initial expectations for both corporate and ticket sales, leading the Eastern League in attendance during their inaugural season. His work also led the Flying Squirrels to become quickly ingrained througout Richmond's corporate culture.

2012 will mark Denlinger's 10th season in Minor League baseball, having previously spent time with the Daytona Cubs (Advanced-A - Florida State League) and the Delmarva Shorebirds (A - South Atlantic League).

The 32-year old graduated from Messiah College in 2003 with a degree in Sports Management. Following his graduation, he got his start in minor league baseball with the Reading Phillies (Double-A - Eastern League), then under the direction of current Flying Squirrels' Chief Executive Manager Chuck Domino. During his Ione season with Reading, he played a role in the R-Phils leading the league in attendance and establishing records for attendance and sales.

After his experience in Reading, Tom went to work for the Shorebirds. During his three seasons in Delmarva, he ascended through the groups and sponsorship departments while establishing new sales records in each. He then joined Flying Squirrels' General Manager Bill Papierniak in Daytona, rising to the role of Assistant General Manager, a position he held through the 2009 season. During his tenure in Daytona, the Cubs established new community initiatives, while shattering attendance and sponsorship records.

During his first two seasons in Richmond, Denlinger became active in the Richmond business community, frequently



speaking to business leaders and groups. His work in that area helped the Flying Squirrels become the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year for 2010.

Denlinger is a native of Paradise, PA, and an avid sports fan. He currently lives in Richmond and is involved with his church. Now fully recovered from knee surgery, he has returned to many rec-league athletic fields throughout the community.

Jon Laaser, 32, returns for a third season behind the microphone for all 142 Flying Squirrels games in 2011. He came to Richmond following a one-season stint as the lead broadcaster for the Montgomery Biscuits (Double-A - Tampa Bay Rays). He has been reunited in Richmond with Flying Squirrels' Vice President & COO Todd "Parney" Parnell, whom he worked with while calling games for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (Advanced-A - Atlanta Braves) in 2008 and the Altoona Curve (Double-A - Pittsburgh Pirates) in 2007. A native of Minneapolis, MN, he has also provided play-by-play for the Yakima Bears (A - Arizona Diamondbacks), St. Paul Saints (Independent) and St. Cloud River Bats (Summer Collegiate). During the offseason, the versatile broadcaster can also be heard calling the action for Virginia Commonwealth University Women's Basketball, and as a fill-in sports talk radio host on Sports Radio 910. Laaser has also served as the lead announcer for Charleston Southern University football and men's basketball, the Minnesota State High School Football/Basketball Championships and Hamline (MN) University football. His broadcasting career began in sports talk radio, with Clear Channel's KFAN in his native Minneapolis.

Anthony Oppermann Radio Broadcaster


Anthony Oppermann, 29, also returns for a third season in the Flying Squirrels' radio booth in 2012. He will continue to provide playby-play during Flying Squirrels' home games and select road games, as well as serving as host of the Flying Squirrels' pre and post-game shows. Additionally, Oppermann can be heard as the host of "The Weekend with Anthony Oppermann" Saturday mornings on Squirrels' Flagship station, Sports Radio 910. Prior to joing the Flying Squirrels, the experienced broadcaster occupied the role of "Voice of the R-Phils," as the lead broadcaster for the Reading Phillies (Double-A - Philadelphia Phillies) in 2009. A native of La Grange, TX, Oppermann spent two seasons (2007, '08) as the lead broadcaster for the Potomac Nationals (Advanced-A - Washington Nationals), based in Woodbridge, VA. His baseball resume also includes time spent with the Daytona Cubs (Advanced-A - Chicago Cubs) and Round Rock Express (Double-A - Houston Astros). Upon coming to Richmond in the Fall of 2009, he rejoined Flying Squirrels' CEM Chuck Domino, whom he worked with in Reading, as well as Flying Squirrels' General Manager Bill Papierniak, whom he worked with in Daytona.





After making a grand entrance into Richmond as the face of the Flying Squirrels in February, 2010, Nutzy has quickly become one of the most recognizable characters in the region. He participates in countless community events, and visits hundreds of schools each year. The rigors of his schedule were nearly too much even for the superhero, which is where his new friends have come in. As the franchise continued to grow its brand prior to their second season in the River City, they introduced Zinger the inflatable Acorn and Parker the Rally Pig. Each were introduced before the 2011 season with each name the result of a community-wide naming contest.

While Nutzy continues to keep the Diamond free of would-be-base-stealers, Zinger works to keep the energy up at the ballpark. Meanwhile, Parker, who enjoys the confines of three separate living pens on the Boulevard, appears upon the rare occurence that the Flying Squirrels are trailing in a home ballgame. The trio serve as the main Flying Squirrels' mascots, but are also joined by secondary characters; Flingo "the Flamingo," the Molly Maid Dancing Drag Queens, and the Racing Peanuts.

Machemer returns to guide the Richmond Flying Squirrels for a second season in 2012. His first season at the helm in 2011 provided highlights both personally and for the franchise. He led the Flying Squirrels to a 76-66 record in 2011, and a wild-card berth in the playoffs. The Squirrels eventually swept the Harrisburg Senators in three games for the Western Division Championship before falling to New Hampshire in the Eastern League Championship Series. On September 2, 2011, Machemer recorded his 1,500th managerial victory when the Squirrels downed the Altoona Curve. He returns to Richmond for his 8th season in the Giants organization, the 5th he will spend at the helm of San Francisco's Double-A entrant. Prior to coming to Richmond, he spent two seasons as the manager of the Augusta GreenJackets (A - South Atlantic). In 2010, he led the Jackets to the best overall record in the SAL Southern Division, and second best overall mark in the league. However, his team failed to reach the postseason, having not claimed either the first or second half. In his first season in Augusta, he led the Jackets to the best overall record in the SAL (76-43), but also missed the playoffs due to not winning either half. Prior to Augusta, the veteran minor league manager spent one season leading the Arizona Rookie League Giants, posting a 36-20 record. He spent the previous three seasons (2005-07) guiding the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, in Connecticut. Known as the Norwich Navigators during his first season in 2005, and Connecticut Defenders in '06 and'07.

He has recorded 1,501 victories in a managerial career that began in 1985. 2012 will mark his 39th campaign in professional baseball, and 22nd as a manager. Prior to joining the Giants organization, he spent the previous three seasons in the Montreal Expos' chain, as skipper at Double-A Harrisburg (2003-04), and Clinton (A - Midwest)


in 2002. He was also a minor league manager or coordinator with Milwaukee Brewers (1985-91), Expos (1992-95) and Baltimore Orioles (1996-2002). Other managerial stops include Double-A Bowie (2001), Single-A Frederick (2000), Triple-A Rochester (1999), Single-A Delmarva (1998), Double-A El Paso (1996-97), Triple-A Denver (1989-90), Single-A Stockton (1987-88) and Rookie-level Beloit (1985). An infielder during his playing days, he appeared in 29 Major League games between the 1978 and 1979 seasons. He currently resides with his wife Marsha in Stevensville, MI.








Grimsley marks his 14th season in the Giants organization and third in Richmond in 2012. Grimsley has been the only pitching coach in franchise history. In 2011, he molded the top pitching staff in the Eastern League, as the Squirrels led the circuit with a combined 3.46 ERA. In 2010, his staff finished fourth in the Eastern League in ERA (3.71) and runs allowed (586). In 2009, he served as the pitching coach for the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, the Connecticut Defenders (Double-A - Eastern League), guiding the staff to the third lowest ERA in the league (3.53). He spent the four previous years (2005-08) as the pitching coach for the Augusta GreenJackets (A - South Atlantic League). In 2008, his staff posted the lowest ERA (2.95) in the Giants' chain, while staff-ace Madison Bumgarner was named the Most Outstanding Pitcher in minor league baseball. His hurlers boasted 18 staff shutouts in both 2006 and 2007. He spent one season (2004) as the pitching coach at Fresno (Triple-A - Pacific Coast League), and two (2002-03) with the Giants' Double-A affiliate in Norwich, CT. He spent one season (2001) as a roving organizational pitching instructor after beginning his association with the Giants in 1999 and spending two seasons as the pitching coach for Double-A Shreveport. Before joining the Giants, he also served as a coach in the Seattle Mariners, Atlanta Braves, Baltimore Orioles and Philadelphia Phillies organizations.

As a left-handed pitcher, he spent 11 Major League seasons with the Cincinnati Reds (1971-73), Baltimore Orioles (1974-77, '82), Montreal Expos (1978-80) and Cleveland Indians (1980). After being named to the Baseball Digest 1971 All-Star Rookie Team, he went on to pitch in three (3) League Championship Series (1972, 1973 and 1974), as well as the World Series in 1972 and All-Star Game in 1978. He tossed a two-hitter in game four of the 1972 NLCS (vs. Pittsburgh Pirates) and went on to claim a pair of victories in that season's World Series (vs. Oakland Athletics). After signing with the Expos as a free agent in 1978, he became the first 20-game winner in franchise history (1978) and was named the Expos' Player of the Year in the same season. He recorded double-digit win totals in eight of his 11 seasons, and finished his career with a record of 124-99 with an ERA of 3.81 in 345 appearances. He currently resides in Owings Mill, MD.



Enters his third season with the Giants' organization, having spent his first in 2010 as the hitting coach for the Triple-A Fresno Grizzlies and second as the hitting coach for the Flying Squirrels. The Squirrels finished 12th in the Eastern League in team-batting average in 2011 (.247), while playing at the pitcher-friendly Diamond. In 2010, the Grizzlies finished 4th in the Pacific Coast League with a collective .283 team batting average. Joyce also oversaw the final development of Buster Posey, who hit .347 in 47 games, before he ascended to the Major Leagues and claimed National League Rookie of the Year honors. Prior to joining the Giants, he spent eight seasons (2002-09) with the Toronto Blue Jays. He spent 2009 as the hitting coach with the Blue Jays' Triple-A entrant, the Las Vegas 51's. When he joined Richmond in 2011 it marked a return to the Eastern League for Joyce, having also served as a hitting coach with the New Hampshire Fisher Cats for two seasons in 2007-08. He was also a manager in the Blue Jays' system at the Single-A level from 2004-06. Before his stint with Toronto, Joyce worked for both the Adirondack Lumberjackets (2001) and the Catskill Cougars (2000) of the independent Northern League. From 1994 to 1999, he served in a variety of roles for the Florida Marlins; Bullpen Coach (Portland - AA - 1994-95), Hitting Coach (Portland - AA - 1996), Hitting Coach (Utica - SS-A - 1997), and Manager (Utica - SS-A - 1998-99). As a pitcher, he saw action over five different seasons with Toronto (1991), Oakland (1992-94), and Minnesota (1995).

Joyce attended the University of Southern Maine, earning a BA in History and Education. He played in the 1985 NAIA College World Series before spending four seasons as an assistant coach at University of Southern Maine as well as coaching in the 1989 NCAA NAIA Division III World Series. He was elected to the University of Southern Maine Hall of Fame in 1998, and was elected into the State of Maine Baseball Hall of Fame in 2001. He currently resides in Portland, ME with wife Janet, son, Tommy and daughter, Jill.

For the second consecutive season, Baseball America touts Adrianza as the top-defensive infielder in the San Francisco system. He also checks in as the #9 rated prospect in the chain (#5 in 2011). Healthy heading into spring training, he was invited to his third consecutive big league camp. Had things gone smoothly for him in 2011, he could have made a midseason ascension to Richmond, and potentially would have been pushing another defensive standout, Brandon Crawford. However, he tore a ligament in his thumb at the end of spring training, and didn't get out of extended spring until May. He split the remainder of the season between Augusta (A-) and San Jose (A+), finding his stride at the plate with the Giants in the second half of the season. The glove has never been the question for the 22-year old, who dazzles defensively in all areas. He is expected to assume the post that was meant to be his at the outset of last season, as the everyday shortstop for the Flying Squirrels. And all eyes will be on how he handles the bat in the pitcher-friendly Eastern League.

Brown carries the distinction of being the top-rated prospect in the Giants' system by Baseball America. It is not a label he shies from, proclaiming that the pressure he feels is internal, rather than from the enormous expections that have piled up externally. He certainly did nothing to temper those expections with a monster first full-professional season in 2011. He spent the entire year in San Jose (A+), compiling a franchise-record and league-best 188 hits. He also topped the circuit in triples (13), and was among the league-leaders in a handful of other categories. The Giants chose not to push him along to Double-A, electing to allow him to gain confidence from his success. WESTERN DWS ON GRAMPS 2011: Season in Review

The Flying Squirrels enjoyed a tremendous level of success during their inaugural season in 2010, everywhere with the exception of the field. A team that been ushered into Richmond with comparisons to the "Great 8" of the Richmond Braves had slumped badly in the second half of the season, eventually placing fifth in the Eastern League's Western Division at a record of 68-73.

In 2011, the franchise set out to enhance their off-field presence, while the San Francisco Giants worked on fielding a winner at the Double-A level for the fans that had led the Eastern League in attendance the year prior.

While the front office introduced new mascots, Zinger "The Inflatable Acorn," and Parker the Rally Pig (the franchise's first living mascot), the Giants announced that veteran skipper Dave Machemer would take over the reigns in Richmond, replacing 2010 manager Andy Skeels. Machemer would be joined by new Hitting Coach Ken Joyce and new Strength & Conditioning Coach Garrett Sherrill. Ross Grimsley returned as Pitching Coach, as did Athletic Trainer Eric Ortega.

Charlie Culberson headlined the group of new Squirrels' prospects, and didn't disappoint in the month of April, batting .290. The rest of the team was unable to follow his lead however, and collectively the Squirrels got off to a tough start at the plate batting just .222 over the first month. Richmond posted a record of 10-12 in April, but offered signs of things to come as the pitching staff recorded a cumulative 2.90 ERA to keep the team competitive while the bats attempted to warm with the weather.

The starting pitching rotation at the beginning of the season boasted three young guns and two returnees from 2010, as LHP Eric Surkamp, LHP Ryan Verdugo and RHP Justin Fitzgerald advanced to Double-A for the first time and were joined by RHP Daryl Maday and LHP Clayton Tanner. Surkamp showed flashes of the makeup that would eventually take him to San Francisco later in the year when he posted a 2.22 ERA over his first four starts with 30 strikeouts in just 20.1 innings pitched. His big-time curveball was a story, but so was his lack of run support and 0-2 record. As good as Surkamp was however, Fitzgerald was better. The California-native opened the year with a sizzling four-start stretch in which he recorded a paltry 1.45 ERA. Verdugo was right on his heels, working to a mark of 1.69 over his first four starts.

The 2011 Squirrels continued to struggle offensively as the season headed towards the summer, following with a 14-15 record in May. The bats continued to lag well behind the arms, as the team only slightly improved their dismal April with a collective .228 batting average in May. SS Nick Noonan joined the club from extended spring training and led the offensive attack with 17 RBIs.

As the offense continued to sputter, the Squirrels continued to lean heavily on their pitching staff. They responded in a big way, besting their output from April by recording a 2.76 staff ERA. Not to be outdone in the season's second month, Surkamp came on with a vengeance and enjoyed one of the finest months in all the minor leagues in May. The lefty from Cincinnati made six starts and sported a minuscule 0.89 ERA. Despite a continuing lack of run support, he was able to collect his first three wins at the Double-A level. A veteran-laden bullpen was also getting the job done for Grimsley. RHPs Osiris Matos and Ronnie Ray combined to make 16 appearances in the month without allowing an earned run. RHP Dan Otero pitched in 10 more outings and allowed just a lone earned run.

The pitching dominance continued as the season meandered towards the midway point, and the offense was about to receive the jolt it was looking for. Richmond added two impact bats during the month, as 3B Chris Dominguez joined the club from Advanced-A San Jose and the Giants signed former Cleveland Indians' prospect Wes Hodges to a minor league deal. Hodges and Dominguez combined to shore up the corners of the infield and more importantly, the middle of the lineup. Dominguez hit 314 in his first 13 Double-A games and drove in 17 runs. He was awarded the first ever Eastern League weekly offensive award when he was name Hitter of the Week (6/20-27). However, the real offensive story of June was the emergence of OF Roger Kieschnick. Kieschnick had led the California League in RBIs in 2009, but had been slowed by back trouble since. He found his groove in June, hitting .319 for the period with five home runs and 22 RBIs. The pitching staff once again was superb (3.10) and the wins began to pile up for the Squirrels. At months end, Richmond had gone 17-9 to pull their record five games over .500 at 41-36. They had also placed themselves in playoff contention, sitting in second place, four games behind the division-leading Harrisburg Senators.

The effect of Hodges and Dominguez's addition to the lineup was felt in full-force in July as the Squirrels began nipping at the Senators heels. The team posted its finest offensive month of the season (.275), led by Hodges. The Indians' cast-off was sensational in the month, pacing the team with a .365 average. He added six home runs and 16 RBIs. Kieschnick also remained a big part of the mix, blasting five more home runs and piling on 15 RBIs. The third big bat during the period belonged to Johnny Monell, who began to flourish with protection in the lineup. Monell batted .290 for the month, and added 13 walks to finish July with a .402 on-base percentage. The Squirrels were charging, and with 19 more wins

sat just a half-game out of the division lead.

The Squirrels were feeling the effects of success on the hill however. During the month of June they had lost Otero, Ray and LHP Justin Dowdy to Triple-A Fresno. Matos had also gone down with a shoulder injury. They had welcomed flame-throwing RHP Heath Hembree into the fold, but had largely pieced it together as a staff in July. Matters weren't helped when the Giants shipped RHP Henry Sosa and RHP Jason Stoffel to the Houston Astros in a July trade. The Squirrels staff-ERA ballooned to 4.46 during July, but the club maintained their overall ERA lead due to their brilliance at

In August, the Squirrels came back to earth, dropping 16 games. The offense and pitching were equal parts to blame, as Hodges and the offense slowed while the pitching staff fought through struggles of their own. There were bright spots however, as seldomly used utility-man Skyler Stromsmoe got an opportunity to play every day and got hot. The Canadian ably took over at shortstop for Sharlon Schoop and hit .329 for the month. The Squirrels had also welcomed another exciting prospect, as Francisco Peguero arrived with a flurry of production. Peguero was sensational in August, batting .377 and knocking in 18 runs.

The Squirrels were engaged in a three-team race for two postseason spots with Harrisburg pacing the division, and Richmond and Bowie forming the chase-pack. It didn't turn into much of a chase, as Bowie replicated the Squirrels' 13-16 record during the month of August. Richmond maintained its slim wild-card lead as the regular season roared down the back-stretch. As depleted as the pitching staff had become, things got worse in August. Surkamp was promoted to San Francisco to make his Major League debut, while Maday was promoted back to Triple-A Fresno. Tanner, who had been removed from the Giants' 40-man roster, opted to sign with the Cincinnati Reds. Making the news of Tanner's departure worse was the fact that the move was made on a day he was meant to start. Needing reinforcements, the Giants promoted three pitchers who had never pitched above the low-A level. RHPs Justin Shumer, Drew Bowlin and Austin Fleet arrived for the stretch-run.

The Squirrels were flattened in their final regular-season home game of the year, 8-0, by the New Britain Rock Cats and hit the road for their final series of the season holding a half-game edge on Bowie for the wild-card spot in the West.

Richmond managed an 8-4 win in game one with the Curve as Maday returned from Fresno to make an emergency start. Meanwhile, Machemer was eyeing history as well as a playoff spot. In game two of the series, the Squirrels were forced to go 14 innings to claim a 6-3 victory. It marked the 1,500th managerial win of Machemer's career and put the Squirrels a win way from a date with the Harrisburg Senators in the postseason. The win did not come the next night, as Richmond's bats went silent and they fell in 11 innings, 1-0. Bowie meanwhile won their penultimate contest of the year to remain a half-game back. It had been determined that the Baysox would lose a game rained out earlier in the season, and would play a game less than Richmond. Simply put, trailing by a half-game, Bowie needed a win and a Flying Squirrels' loss to overtake Richmond. The win they got, downing Erie 3-2 at Prince George's Stadium.

As for the loss by Richmond, that wouldn't come. A win would, and in as dramatic fashion as you could dream up. With heavy rains forecast for Blair County Ballpark in Altoona, PA, neither team was optimistic that baseball would be played on Labor Day. However, the game was able to begin, and the Squirrels sent mystery left-hander Jason Stevenson to the mound to make the start. Stevenson had only recently joined the Squirrels, and in fact had been out of baseball for almost six years before being signed by the Giants late in the season. But, he boasted a pitch that baffled the Curve, a seldomly seen screwball. He worked seven masterful innings, and waited for the Squirrels' bats to come alive. Only a setominy see screwbair. He worked sever image, and water for the 3 quirters base to come after. Only one did, but it was enough. In the top of the 8th inning, as storm clouds gathered, Hodges sent a low-flying liner over the right-field wall for a 2-1 lead. Rain had already begun and it intensified as Hodges rounded the bases. He had barely cleared home plate when the grounds crew finished putting the tarp on the field. They weren't in time, and BCB was rendered unplayable. Although the home team hadn't batted in the bottom of the 8th inning, the Squirrels were declared the winner due to a rarely envoked MLB rule. Champagne flew in the visitors clubhouse as Richmond learned they were heading to the playoffs.

After their celebration, the team headed directly to Harrisburg, PA to open the Western Division Championship Series against the Senators. They wouldn't get the chance to play in Harrisburg as a tropical storm sent the Susquahanna River over its banks and flooded Metro Bank Park. The Squirrels holed up in a hotel for three days, but were eventually told the series would shift to Richmond and be played entirely at The Diamond.

The Squirrels seized the home-field advantage and made quick work of the Senators in a three-game sweep. Maday turned in seven scoreless innings to claim game 1 in a 6-0 shutout win for the Squirrels. Richmond roared back to claim game two in 11 innings, and finished off the sweep with a gem from Fitzgerald in game three.

In their second season, the Flying Squirrels would play for an Eastern League championship, meeting the New Hampshire Fisher Cats in the Eastern League Championship Series. Richmond won a wild game I in Manchester, NH when Stromsmoe sent a 9th inning home run that carried the Squirrels to a, 10-9, triumph. Unfortunately it would be their last victory of the series and the season. The Squirrels had run out of gas, and an extremely talented Fisher Cats club took the next three games in the series to claim the title. They celebrated that championship after a game 4 win at The Diamond. Monell had nothing to hang his head about, having batted a robust .478 in the postseason.

The 2011 season was a fine encore both off the field and on it for the Flying Squirrels. On the field, the team had made an improbable run to the ELCS and boasted the league's top pitching staff. Off the field, the Flying Squirrels continued to grow their presence in Richmond, welcoming 6,679 fans per game to The Diamond.

Following the season, Squirrels' Vice President & COO Todd "Parney" Parnell was named as Baseball America's Minor League Executive of the Year. The award generally is a representation of a team's overall success, and 2011 was certainly that in Richmond.



opponent for the Flying Squirrels. The two teams met 25 teams during the regular season with the Baysox holding a one-sided edge in the season-series. The Baysox posted a 16-9 record vs. the Flying Squirrels during the year, and were particularly unkind to Richmond at Prince George's Stadium. The Squirrels won just three of the 13 meetings between the two clubs in Bowie, and dropped each of the four series contested in Maryland. Included was a three-game sweep for the Baysox (4/29 -5/1). That series featured the longest game in Flying Squirrels' franchise history, an 18-inning, 3-2, defeat on April 30th. All told, the Orioles' Double-A entrant outscored Richmond 104-84 on the season. However, the Flying Squirrels got the last laugh, holding off the Baysox for the final playoff spot in the Western Division on the final day of the regular season. Richmond earned their first postseason berth by a half-game. The margin was due to a Bowie rainout at Trenton earlier in the season.

Following the 2008 International League season, baseball was packed into boxes and moved away from the city of Richmond, VA. After repeated failed attempts to secure a new ballpark in Richmond, the Richmond Braves, who had called the city home for over forty years, headed to new digs in Gwinnett, GA. The Richmond community made last-ditch efforts to save the team, but to no avail. An announcement made before the 2008 season regarding the team's impending move, turned the season into a "lame-duck" experience and a final fan's farewell.

In a baseball-rich community, the absence of the game weighed heavily on hearts during the summer of 2009. However, near the end of that summer, rumors started swirling regarding baseball's return to the River City. A few weeks after the 2009 season concluded, the once dormant Diamond housed a press conference to announce that baseball would indeed be back, beginning in 2010.

As the residents of Richmond prepared for that 2009 season without baseball, the San Francisco Giants' Double-A Franchise, the Connecticut Defenders, were preparing for their 2009 season in Norwich, CT. Prior to the season and unbeknownst to baseball fans in Richmond, the Eastern League had targeted the city for the relocation of an Eastern League franchise. Although not announced, speculation ran rampant that the franchise would be the Defenders. Although the Defenders posted a memorable season on the field, rolling to the Northern Division Championship and a berth in the Eastern League Championship Series, lagging attendance and visibility of the franchise eventually led to their selection as the team that would move to Richmond.

On September 23, 2009, the Eastern League held a press conference to announce that the Defenders were relocating from Norwich, CT to Richmond, VA for the 2010 season. It was also announced that The Diamond would be the home of the new team for the first two seasons, with three option years mutually agreed upon by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority and the newly-minted team operating under the name of Navigators Baseball LP. Lou DiBella, President & Managing General Partner of Navigators Baseball LP, would head up the ownership team that would bring baseball back. That ownership group vowed wholesale improvements to the condition of The Diamond, beginning with replacing bench-seating in the entire lower bowl, discarding the old aluminum benches and outfitting the ballpark with 3,200 brand-new fold-down seats with cup holders.

The "Baseball is Back" press conference was also used to introduce the management team on the ground in Richmond for the new team. Chuck Domino, a longtime presence in the Eastern League as President of the Reading Phillies, would serve as Chief Executive Manager. Along with building the R-Phils into one of the most successful franchises in minor league baseball, Domino had overseen the creation of the Lehigh Valley Iron Pigs – Triple-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies – in 2008. Joining Domino would be Vice President & Chief Operating Officer Todd "Parney" Parnell and General Manager Bill Papierniak.

Fans were involved in the process from the very beginning as the team announced an on-line "Name the Team" contest in conjunction with The Richmond Times-Dispatch that would begin in late September. Fans were offered the chance to submit their suggestions for the team's new name. More than 6,000 entries were received before the team's front office narrowed the field to five finalists. It was announced in early October that the finalists would include the Flatheads, the Flying Squirrels, the Hambones, the Rhinos and the Rock Hoppers. Darren Rovell from CNBC got in on the fun and ran an additional contest to add a wild-card entrant from submissions across the country. More than 9,000 submissions flooded CNBC before Hush Puppies was chosen as the sixth finalist. Hambones was eventually dropped from consideration, and the final five remained.

On October 15, 2009, the Flying Squirrels were born at a press conference held at The Richmond Times-Dispatch building in downtown Richmond. With confetti flying, "Parney" raised the arm of Kyle Nelson and his wife Donna, representing their son Brad Mead at the press conference. Mead had submitted the name Flying Squirrels, and was awarded season tickets for life by the newly-minted team. Plan B. Branding was on hand at the press conference to outline their plans for logo creation and brand implementation, getting right to work on the identity of the now identified Flying Squirrels.

Meanwhile, renovations going on behind the scenes at The Diamond were substantial. In the lower bowl, seats were being unbolted and removed to make way for 3,200 new seats. The old restaurant along the first baseline was being reinvented as an expansive merchandise store, the suites were being gutted and outfitted with new windows, seats and furniture and the concession stands were being emptied and prepared for new state-of-the-art equipment. A new picnic area was being created along the third baseline, while a kid's zone began to take shape outside of the new store.

In late November, the Squirrels moved another step forward and announced a two-year media partnership with Clear Channel Broadcasting. Sports Radio 910 AM would be Richmond's flagship radio station, carrying all 142 regular season games. It was also announced that the Squirrels' broadcast team would consist of Jon Laaser and Anthony Oppermann.

December 1, 2009 was the day everyone had been waiting for A press conference was held at Holiday Inn I-64 West End to unveil the team's new logo and the official colors of Radiant Red, Squirrels Silver, and traditional Black. The Flying Squirrels' identity continued to come together as four logos were unveiled: a primary logo featuring a flying squirrel in mid-flight, a secondary acorn logo adorned with an "R", a Richmond word mark secondary logo, and a Flying Squirrels word mark secondary logo.

Following the logo unveiling, the Flying Squirrels also celebrated a soft grand opening of the team store at The Diamond, one of Minor League Baseball's largest merchandise stores. At the store, fans could shop amongst a vast array of Flying Squirrels' apparel and memorabilia, as well as have the opportunity to order the merchandise online. Coupled with the excitement surrounding the new team, the holiday shopping rush turned Flying Squirrels' merchandise into a hot-commodity. Minor league records were broken as inventory flew off the shelves, prompting rushed re-stocking and furious efforts from the team's front office to make sure a rapidly-growing fan base got their hands on the new-look merchandise before the holidays. The massive response to merchandise also proved an asset to the community, as the Flying Squirrels partnered with numerous area charities for the first-ever "Season of Giving." Each charitable partner received 10% of the daily sales for a select day during the holiday shopping season, culminating in a \$15,000 donation from the team.

The vision of baseball returning to Richmond became clearer on January 5th, 2010, as the Flying Squirrels held a press conference at Home Team Grille to announce the inaugural field staff as assigned by the San Francisco Giants. The first manager, or "head nut" as he cracked upon his introduction, would be Andy Skeels. Ascending to a managerial role at the Double-A level for the first time, Skeels would bring a winning pedigree to Richmond having claimed titles with the San Jose Giants (Advanced-A, California League) in 2009 and the Augusta GreenJackets (A, South Atlantic League) in 2008. He was joined at the podium by pitching coach Ross Grimsley and hitting coach Russ Morman. Eric Ortega, who was not in attendance, was announced as the team's first Athletic Trainer.

The fans were given yet another opportunity to take ownership of the team with a contest running on-line through The Richmond Times Dispatch in late December to name the mascot. Nearly 4,000 submissions were received, and on February 11th, the new face of the franchise, "Nutzy" was introduced at a press conference at The Byrd Theatre.

At the same press conference, the Flying Squirrels uniforms were revealed during a "Uniform Fashion Show." Lane Casadonte from CBS-6 TV, Chip Tarkenton from ABC-8 TV, Wes McElroy from Sports Radio 910 and Greg Burton from ESPN Radio 950 served as celebrity models for the fashion show. With the introduction, the Flying Squirrels image was complete.

The Inaugural version of the Richmond Flying Squirrels hit town on April 5th, 2010, flying from the Giants' Spring Training Complex in Scottsdale, AZ to Norfolk, VA. The team was chartered via bus from Norfolk directly to The Diamond, where they immediately took occupancy of the newly renovated home clubhouse. Their arrival, much like the departure of the team that had formerly inhabited the same clubhouse, happened in the middle of the night under the cover of darkness.

The first Flying Squirrels Media Day took place on April 6th, 2010, as players and staff took turns fielding questions from the local media, tried on the newly-minted Flying Squirrels uniforms and posed for head shots. That same evening, the team met the community that would support it for the first time, taking part in the "Meet the Team" event at the Richmond Marriott Downtown. Approximately 200 well-wishers were on hand to welcome the team to Richmond, as they were introduced for the first time.

On Thursday, April 8th at 8:30 am, the Flying Squirrels departed via charter bus for the franchise's first game. It took place at Bowie's Prince George's Stadium in Bowie, MD. Ominously, the game was suspended in the fifth inning due to heavy rain showers in the area. Richmond right-hander Mike MacDonald took the ball and made the first start in franchise history. CF Darren Ford looked at the first pitch in a Flying Squirrels' uniform, which was hurled by Bowie left-hander Zach Britton. The Squirrels' inaugural game was completed the following evening, with the Squirrels falling, 6-4. However, their first win followed quickly behind, as Richmond blanked Bowie, 2-0 in the seven-inning contest that followed for their first victory. Left-hander Clayton Tanner earned the first victory for Richmond.

It was the only win the Squirrels would notch on a season-opening seven-game road swing, as they dropped the final two games to the Baysox and were swept in three games by the Altoona Curve. The Squirrels limped home at a mark of 1-6.

The slow start did little to diminish the enthusiasm surrounding baseball's return to the River City, and The Diamond was abuzz well before the scheduled 7:05 pm first pitch on Thursday, April 15th. A sellout crowd of 9,560 ushered the game back in, as Squirrels' right-hander Daryl Maday and the Richmond bullpen combined to blank the Reading Phillies. Richmond earned a 3-0 shutout win in their first game at The Diamond. However, the night was marked by the pageantry that surrounded the evening, including Richmond Mayor Dwight Jones and Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell were among the luminaries on hand to throw out ceremonial first pitches.

The sellout crowd was a sign of things to come, as the Flying Squirrels immediately became a local sensation. They welcomed eight more capacity crowds on their way to knocking off longtime Eastern League champ Reading for the league's attendance crown. 463,842 fans made their way to The Diamond during the 2010 season, earning the Squirrels the overall attendance crown in the Eastern League, as well as the highest average attendance (6,626).

On the field, the Squirrels stumbled to a 5th place finish in the newly-formed Western Division, posting a record of 68-73.

Off the field, they smashed minor league merchandise records, introduced an entirely new brand of entertainment to baseball fans in Richmond and earned recognition for their year-long effort to aid causes throughout the community.

Following the season, Domino was named the Eastern League's Executive of the Year. Additionally, the team was honored as the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year and Richmond Magazine's Best Sports Franchise. Ballpark Digest honored the Squirrels new look with their Logo of the Year Award and Style Weekly annointed the Squirrels "Richmonders of the Year."

Despite the accolades, in his post-season synopsis, Parnell stated that "2010 will be the worst season the Flying Squirrels ever have."

In the short-term, Parnell's proclamation proved to be prophetic on the field, where the Squirrels

welcomed a new manager in 2011. Veteran skipper Dave Machemer was tabbed to guide the Squirrels in their second season.

Buoyed by the league's top pitching staff, Machemer led the Squirrels to their first franchise post-season berth, as Richmond went down to the final day of the 2011 season battling with the Bowie Baysox for the Wild-Card spot in the Western Division. On a rainy day in Altoona, PA, on September 5th, Wes Hodges belted a solo-home run in the eighth inning to give the Squirrels a 2-I lead. The low-flying liner just eclipsed the right-field wall of Altoona's Blair County Ballpark, and arrived just ahead of a ferocious rainstorm that rendered the ballpark unplayable. Due to the fact that it was the last day of the season, the Squirrels were awarded the win on a seldomly-envoked rule. The win proved the difference, as Richmond held off the Baysox by a half-game for the wild-card spot.

Another act of nature would again benefit the Squirrels heading into the playoffs for the first time, as Tropical Storm Lee ravaged the East Coast, causing massive flooding in Harrisburg, PA. The flood rendered the home ballpark of the Harrisburg Senators, Metro Bank Park, unplayable, forcing the Eastern League to move the entire Western Divisional Series to The Diamond. The Squirrels capitalized in the ballpark where they boasted the best home record in the league during the

regular season, trouncing the Senators in a three-game sweep that catapulted them to the Eastern League Championship Series.

Richmond was denied their first Eastern League title in four games by the prospect-laden New Hampshire Fisher Cats. The Squirrels took the first game of the best-of-five series in Manchester, but fell in the next three, including the two games they hosted at home.

Off the field, the Squirrels enjoyed a sensational follow-up campaign to their inaugural season. Although Reading reclaimed the Eastern League attendance crown with the help of a renovated FirstEnergy Stadium, the Squirrels increased their average attendance from 6,626 fans per game in 2010 to 6,679 fans per game in 2011. They also drew the largest crowds of the four teams competing in the Eastern League playoffs.

As a result of the continued efforts of the franchise, Parnell was awarded Baseball America's highest minor league honor following the season. BA named Parnell as the Minor League Executive of the Year for 2011. It marked the first time he had been bestowed with the honor, and allowed him to join his friend Domino, who had garnered the award in 2003 while with Reading.



THE DIAMOND - STADIUM FACTS

The Diamond serves as the home venue for Flying Squirrels baseball as they represent the San Francisco Giants in the Eastern League of Professional Baseball Clubs. The facility was previously the home of the Richmond Braves (Triple-A - International League) from 1985-2008. Following the 2008 season, the Richmond Braves relocated to Gwinett, GA, becoming the Gwinnett Braves beginning in the 2009 season. Although Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) continued to play their home games at The Diamond during the 2009 season, the ballpark was void of professional baseball for the first time since its construction. The ballpark continues to be operated by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority (RMA). Upon their inception, the Flying Squirrels and the RMA signed a two-year lease agreement (2010-2011) with three club option years. The 2012 season will mark the first club option season under the current agreement. Prior to the 2010 season, The Flying Squirrels committed more than two million dollars to renovate The Diamond. Included in those renovations was the replacement of aluminum-bleachers in the lower bowl of the ballpark with 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats (pictured below). The top 11 rows of the upper bowl were also eliminated to create room for banner signage that allows the overall look of the park to become more cohesive and lowers capacity to a more intimate 9,560. The Flying Squirrels continued to enhance and refurbish their home park prior to the 2011 season, investing another \$250,000 into the park. Included in the upgrades were; converting the existing line-scoreboard to an LED display (Time Technologies), construction of a Speed of Pitch display in right-center field (Daktronics), converting existing clock in right field to an LED display, creation of party decks behind home plate and the "Cupid Section" down the right-field line, and the refurbishing of the "batter's eye" in center field.



At the center of a more than two-million dollar renovation of The Diamond, was the installation of 3,164 state-of-the-art folddown seats that replaced aluminum-bench style seating in the lower-bowl that had been in place since the ballpark opened in 1985. The project to replace the entire lower-bowl of seats began in November, 2009 and was completed in February, 2010.

FLYING SQUIRRELS ATTENDANCE HISTORY

The Flying Squirrels have had tremendous success at the gate since their inception in 2010. Among the highlights, the Flying Squirrels have ranked; among the top-2 in the Eastern League each season, ranked among the top-3 in all of Double-A baseball each season, ranked in the top-20 in all of affiliated minor league baseball in each season. To provide context, the Flying Squirrels have drawn 222,557 more fans over their first two seasons than the Gwinnett Braves (AAA) have over the same time period. The Squirrels have averaged at least 1,500 more fans per game than Gwinnett in each of their first two seasons, and nearly 2,000 more in 2010. During their inaugural season at The Diamond, the Flying Squirrels drew 174,272 more fans to the ballpark than the R-Braves did in their final season in 2008 (289,570).

MEDICAL GLOSSARY

Abscess: an infection, which produces pus; can be result of blister, callus, penetrating wound or laceration.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): a primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint: A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-Inflammatory: any agent, which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Anteriogram: a film demonstrating arteries after injection of dye.

Arthrogram: x-ray technique for joints using air and/ or dye injected into the affected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff.

Arthroscope: an instrument used to visualize the interior of a joint cavity.

Arthroscopy: a surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an Arthroscope. An arthroscope he procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Atrophy: to shrivel or shrink from disuse, as in muscular atrophy.

Baker's Cyst: localized swelling of a bursa sac in the posterior knee as a result of fluid that has escaped from the knee capsule. A Baker's cyst indicates that there is trauma inside the knee joint that leads to excessive fluid production.

Bone Scan: an imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury sight takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Bursa: a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where friction is likely to occur, then minimizes the friction; for example between a tendon and a bone.

Capsule: an enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize that joint.

CAT Scan: use of a computer to produce a cross sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Cellulitis: inflammation of cellular of connective tissue

Cervical Vertebrae: group of seven vertebrae located

Collateral Ligament: on either side of and acting as a radius of movement, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and wrist.

Concussion: jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: an injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object

Degenerative Joint Disease: changes in the joint surfaces as a result of repetitive trauma.

Deltoid Ligament: ligament that connects the tibia to bones of the medical aspect of the foot and is primarily responsible for stability of the ankle on the medial side. Is sprained less frequently than other ankle ligaments.

Deltoid Muscle: muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc, Intervertebral: a flat, rounded plate between

each of vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fiber ring, which surrounds a soft-gel like interior. It functions as a cushion and shock absorber for the spinal column.

Dislocation: complete displacement of joint surfaces

Eccymosis: bleeding into the surface tissue below the skin, resulting in a "black and blue" effect.

Effusion: accumulation of fluid in various spaces in the body. Commonly, the knee has an effusion after an injury.

Electromyogram (EMG): test to determine nerve function

Epicondylitis: inflammation in the elbow due to overuse

Fracture: breach in continuity of bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, green-stick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: a mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or confused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

Grade Two Injury: a moderate injury in which musculoskeletal tissue has been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

Grade Three Injury: a severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totatally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function.

Hematoma: tumor-like mass produced by an accumulation of coagulated blood in a cavity.

Inflammation: the body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: an edge, rim or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

Ligament: band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and menitosu injuries.

Meniscus: crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee, medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers.

Metatarsals: five long bones of the foot, running from the ankle to the toes.

Patella Tendinitis: inflammation of the patellar ligament; also know as "jumpers knee."

Patellofemoral Joint: articulation of the kneecap and femur. Inflammation of this joint can occur through: I) acute injury to the patella, 2) overuse from excessive running particularly if there is an associated knee weakness, 3) frontic wear and tear of the knee, 4) as a result of poor foot mechanics. Patellofemoral irritation can lead to hondromalancia, which in its most chronic condition, could require surgery.

Plica: fold of tissue in the joint capsule and a common result of knee injury.

(lacktriangle)

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): a primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Reconstruction: surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingment Syndrome: a microtraum or oversue injury caused by stress, and the four stages are: 1) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff. 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation: 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than one cm and 4) a complete tear of one cm or more.

Scapula: shoulder blade.

Sciatica: irritation of the sciatic nerve resulting in pain or tingling running down the inside of the leg.

Sciatic Nerve: major nerve that carries impulses for muscular action and sensations between the low back and thigh and lower leg; it is the longest nerve in the body.

Shin Splint: a catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor and cannot be defined otherwise.

Spondylolisthesis: forward displacement of one verterbrae over another below it due to a developmental defect in the vertebrae.

Sprain: injury resulting from a stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Strain: injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: a hair-line type break in a bone caused by overuse.

Stress x-ray: a continual x-ray taken when a portion of the body is stressed to its maximum in order to determine joint stability. This is a test utilized in some ankle injuries.

Sublaxation: partial dislocation of a joint. The term usually implies that the joint can return to its normal position without formal reduction.

Tarsals: a group of seven bones of the foot consisting of the calcaneus, talus, cuboid and three cuneiform bones

Tendinitis: inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: tissue that connects muscle to bone

Tomograph: a special type of x-ray apparatus that demonstrates an organ or tissue at a particular depth.

Transverse Process: small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebra that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Triangular Cartilage: a connective tissue characterized by its nonvascularity and firm consistency; located on the little finger side of the wrist.

Ulnar Nerve: nerve in the elbow commonly irritated by excessive throwing.

Wrist: the junction between the two forearm bones (radius and ulna) and the eight wrist bones (trapezium, capitate, hamate, pisiform, trequetral, lunate and scaphoid).



GENERAL INFO



SEASON CREDENTIALS: Season credentials for the 2012 season will only be issued to legitimate news gathering organizations that cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. The Flying Squirrels will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (804-359-1373) or as an email attachment to Jon Laaser at jon.laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be made via email to Jon Laaser at jon. laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com. Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the media will call window.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP: The Flying Squirrels will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily Credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will also honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writer's Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: During games, photographers must work out of the photography wells adjacent to both dugouts. Special requests should be directed to Jon Laaser, Director of Broadcasting, or Anthony Oppermann, Director of Media, at least 24 hours in advance of game.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES: In accordance with the regulations designated by the San Francisco Giants and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will be open to credentialed media from 3 1/2 hours prior to game time until 45 minutes prior to game time. Following the game, clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department. There will be no clubhouse access during rain delays or between games of a doubleheader.

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines under any circumstance. Media in violation of this policy are subject to credential revocation. Media must leave the field and dugout areas no later than 45 minutes prior to the game time.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to those organizations that cover the team the most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements, please contact the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to those dates.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admittance to lot. Media is not permitted to park in ballpark tunnel (Under Stadium) at anytime.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Flying Squirrels players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or feature story should contact the Flying Squirrels no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availabity, as the Flying Squirrels respect the players and coaches wishes in all matters. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start. No exceptions.
