# Lou DiBella President & Managing General Partner

Lou DiBella currently serves as President & Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond. Over the past four years, that has included the creation of the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group, and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, CT. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and the Norwich Navigators that preceded them. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues presently between the Flying Squirrels and their parent-club, the San Francisco Giants.

Although he led baseball's return to Richmond, Di-Bella's name continues to be synonymous with world championship boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding II-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Pay Per View flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr., and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing. DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers; and establish a legacy of matchmaking excellence, both in an effort to improve the health of the boxing industry.

Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titlist Paulie Malignaggi and WBC Welterweight champion Andre Berto.

In January 2005, DBE Jaunched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in Rocky Balboa. In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film Love Ranch, starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film The Fighter, starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo

> attended Manhattan's prestigious Regis High School. He was a summa cum laude graduate of Tufts University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. A 1985 graduate of Harvard Law School, DiBella spent four years as an attorney with the prestigious law firm Sullivan & Cromwell. A tireless advocate of boxing reform, DiBella has been a leader in the movement for federal regulation, uniform health and safety standards and a national boxing commission. He has lectured extensively on these subjects and has testified before Congress and numerous state and local bodies. In 1999, DiBella received the Thurman Munson Corporate Hero Award from the Association for the Help of Retarded Children for both his achievements at HBO and his charitable activities. Numerous civic organizations and retired boxer's associations have honored him, including Ring 8, Ring 34 and Latinos in Sports. DiBella resides in Huntington Bay, New York.

## Chuck Domino **Chief Executive Manager**

A 31-year veteran of the baseball business, Chuck Domino is currently the Chief Executive Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. He also holds the title of President with the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Triple-A, International League). He served as President of both the IronPigs and the Reading Phillies (Double-A, Eastern League) from 2006-2009. Domino's efforts have been greatly recognized with his 2010 induction into the Reading Baseball Hall of Fame. Following the 2010 season, Domino was also honored as the Eastern League's Executive of the Year, an award he had previously won four times while with the R-Phils. During their inaugural season in 2010, Domino led the Flying Squirrels to the overall and average attendance crowns in the Eastern League. In each of the last three seasons, the IronPigs have claimed the overall Minor League Baseball attendance title.

# Todd "Parney" Parnell Vice President/COO

Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. In that role, he oversees all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations in Richmond.

After leading the Flying Squirrels to the 2010 Eastern League attendance title, "Parney" and the Squirrels saw an increase in average attendance during the 2011 regular season and were easily the top-draw during the 2011 EL postseason. For his efforts, and due to the team's success on the field and off, "Parney" was honored by Baseball America following the season with their top minor league award. He was named 2011 Baseball America Minor League Executive of the Year. The Flying Squirrels now boast the distinction of having two recipients of the award

recipients of the award in their front office, as Chuck Domino was also recognized with the award in 2003 while with the Reading Phillies. Parney followed up his award-winning season by guiding the franchise to their second overall Eastern League attendance crown in 2012.

With his leadership, the franchise completed a 1.5 million dollar renovation of The Diamond, where they opened Eastern League play in 2010. During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while smashing corporate and ticket sales expectations. With "Parney" at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average

both overall and average attendance, welcoming 463,842 (6,626) fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded Logo of the Year for 2010 by Ballpark Digest.

Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond Business of the Year by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). "Parney" also currently serves the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Board of Trustees, as well as the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors. Due to his flamboyant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, "Parney" has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region.

Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond,

"Parney" served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes (Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). "Parney" held the title of President for both franchises.

2013 will mark Parnell's 24th season in minor league baseball. In addition to his roles with both the State College and Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve, a position he relinquished in December, 2008, after the sale of the franchise from Curve Baseball LP to the family of Robert F. Lozinak.



During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and added the highest honor bestowed annually upon a Minor League Baseball club, the John H. Johnson President's

Trophy, in 2006. Altoona became only the 11th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less than three years.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 2001. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

The 45-year old graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He has two daughters, Lindsay (18) and Samantha (15).

## Bill Papierniak General Manager

Bill enters his 16th season in professional baseball and serves as the General Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. His leadership helped the Flying Squirrels build the franchise in little more than seven months, culminating in minor leauge merchandising records, an Eastern League attendance title and multiple community impact awards. He steered the franchise back to the Eastern League's overall attendance title in 2012 - a season in which the franchise also welcomed their one millionth fan. Papierniak came to Richmond from the Daytona Cubs (Chicago Cubs - Florida State League), where he spent six seasons as General Manager.

Bill was tabbed as the "Executive of the Year" by the Florida State League following the 2009 season, his final campaign before joining the Flying Squirrels. Under his watchful eye, the Daytona Cubs franchise was recognized for a ground-breaking 2006 season and continued contribution to Minor League Baseball by being named the winner of Baseball America's 2006 Bob Freitas "Organization of the Year" Award for the Single-A level.

Over his six seasons with the Daytona Cubs, Papierniak helped the Cubs set attendance records at Jackie Robinson Park in five consecutive seasons. The team also shattered sponsorship and corporate sales records, becoming an award-winner and one of the most respected in Minor League Baseball.

Prior to joining the Cubs, the Northern Virginia native was a member of the Hagerstown Suns in the South Atlantic League for two seasons, ascending to the role of Assistant General Manager. During his tenure, the Suns were tabbed by ESPN in 2002 and 2003 with a "Veeckie" for top promotions in Minor League Baseball. For his efforts, Papierniak was named the 2002 South Atlantic League "Sales Executive of the

Year."

Bill spent the first four seasons of his minor league baseball career with the Carolina League's Lynchburg Hillcats as the club's Director of Group Sales and Promotions.

Papierniak graduated from James Madison University with a B.B.A in management. He and his wife Michelle live in Midlothian along with their son Trae (9) and two daughters Ainsley (7) and Adalyn (2).

## Tom Denlinger Assistant General Manager

Denlinger joined the Flying Squirrels in the role of Assistant General Manager in September of 2009. He was part of the initial team on the ground in Richmond that started the franchise from a single conference table at The Diamond. He was integral in the start-up of the franchise, overseeing all aspects of corporate sales, ticket programs and group sales. With his help, the Flying Squirrels shattered initial expectations for both corporate and ticket sales, leading the Eastern League in attendance during their inaugural season. His work also led the Flying Squirrels to become quickly ingrained througout Richmond's corporate culture.

2013 will mark Denlinger's 11th season in Minor League baseball, having previously spent time with the Daytona Cubs (Advanced-A - Florida State League) and the Delmarva Shorebirds (A - South Atlantic League).

The 33-year old graduated from Messiah College in 2003 with a degree in Sports Management. Following his graduation, he got his start in minor league baseball with the Reading Phillies (Double-A - Eastern League), then under the direction of current Flying Squirrels' Chief Executive Manager Chuck Domino. During his Ione season with Reading, he played a role in the R-Phils leading the league in attendance and establishing records for attendance and sales.

After his experience in Reading, Tom went to work for the Shorebirds. During his three seasons in Delmarva, he ascended through the groups and sponsorship departments while establishing new sales records in each. He then joined Flying Squirrels' General Manager Bill Papierniak in Daytona, rising to the role of Assistant General Manager, a position he held through the 2009 season. During his tenure in Daytona, the Cubs established new community initiatives, while shattering attendance and sponsorship records.

During his first three seasons in Richmond, Denlinger has become active in the Richmond business community, frequent-



ly speaking to business leaders and groups. His work in that area helped the Flying Squirrels become the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year for 2010.

Denlinger is a native of Paradise, PA, and an avid sports fan. He currently lives in Richmond and is involved with his church. Now fully recovered from knee surgery, he has returned to many rec-league athletic fields throughout the community.

## Jon Laaser Radio Broadcaster

Jon Laaser, 33, returns for a fourth season behind the microphone for all 142 Flying Squirrels games in 2013. He came to Richmond following a one-season stint as the lead broadcaster for the Montgomery Biscuits (Double-A - Tampa Bay Rays). He has been reunited in Richmond with Flying Squirrels' Vice President & COO Todd "Parney" Parnell, whom he worked with while calling games for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (Advanced-A - Atlanta Braves) in 2008 and the Altoona Curve (Double-A - Pittsburgh Pirates) in 2007. A native of Minneapolis, MN, he has also provided play-by-play for the Yakima Bears (A - Arizona Diamondbacks), St. Paul Saints (Independent) and St. Cloud River Bats (Summer Collegiate). During the offseason, the versatile broadcaster has also served as a television and radio announcer for Virginia Commonwealth University Men's and Women's Basketball. He also frequently contributes to and serves as a fill-in sports talk radio host for Sports Radio 910. Laaser has also occupied the role of lead announcer for Charleston Southern University football and men's basketball, the Minnesota State High School Football/Basketball Championships and Hamline (MN) University football. His broadcasting career began in sports talk radio, with Clear Channel's KFAN in his native Minneapolis.

lay Burnham, 31, joins the Flying Squirrels' broadcast team after spending the past three seasons as Director of Broadcasting for the Trenton Thunder (Double-A New York Yankees). Burnham is entering his 11th season broadcasting minor league baseball, including stints with the Hagerstown Suns (A - San Francisco Giants), Pensacola Pelicans (Independent), Asheville Tourists (A-Coloroado Rockies) and Thunder. A native of Shelburne Falls, MA, Burnham was the recipient of the prestigious 2011 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year award issued by Ballpark Digest, a renowned industry publication. The Elon University graduate has called play-by-play for over 1,000 professional baseball games, including two All-Star contests, in over 30 different stadiums throughout his career. He is also the host and creator of "The Minor League Report," a weekly podcast covering minor league baseball across the country. He currently resides in Richmond with his wife Cheyenne.





Meanwhile, Parker, who enjoys the confines of three separate living pens on the Boulevard, appears upon the rare occurrence that the Flying Squirrels are trailing in a home ballgame. The trio serve as the main Flying Squirrels' mascots, but are also joined by secondary characters; Flingo "the Flamingo," the Molly Maid Dancing Drag Queens, the Racing Peanuts, a victory Viking and Pirate.

Dave Machemer returns to guide the Richmond Flying Squirrels for a third season in 2013. In his two seasons, he has led the Squirrels to an overall record of 146-137. His first season at the helm in 2011 provided highlights both personally and for the franchise. He led the Flying Squirrels to a 76-66 record and a wild-card berth in the playoffs. The Squirrels eventually swept the Harrisburg Senators in three games for the Western Division Championship before falling to New Hampshire in the Eastern League Championship Series. On September 2, 2011, Machemer recorded his 1,500th managerial victory when the Squirrels downed the Altoona Curve. He returns to Richmond for his 9th season in the Giants organization, the 6th he will spend at the helm of San Francisco's Double-A entrant.

He has recorded 1,571 victories in a managerial career that began in 1985. 2013 will mark his 40th campaign in professional baseball, and 23rd as a manager. Prior to joining the Giants organization, he spent the previous three seasons in the Montreal Expos' chain, as skipper at Double-A Harrisburg (2003-04), and Clinton (A - Midwest) in 2002. He was also a minor league manager or coordinator with Milwaukee Brewers (1985-91), Expos (1992-95) and Baltimore Orioles (1996-2002). Other managerial stops include Double-A Bowie (2001), Single-A Frederick (2000), Triple-A Rochester (1999), Single-A Delmarva (1998), Double-A El Paso (1996-97), Triple-A Denver (1989-90), Single-A Stockton (1987-88) and Rookie-level Beloit (1985). An infielder during his playing days, he appeared in 29 Major League games between the 1978 and 1979 seasons. He currently resides with his wife Marcia in Stevensville, Ml.

Grimsley marks his 15th season in the Giants organization and fourth in Richmond in 2013. 2013 also marks Grimsley's 30th season as an instructor and his 44th overall in professional baseball. Grimsley has been the only pitching coach in franchise history. His three staffs in Richmond have never finished lower than 4th in staff ERA, including a second place finish in 2012. Grimsley's hurlers also accomplished something never done before in the Eastern League, as RHP Chris Heston and LHP Mike Kickham swept starting pitching nods on the league's post-season All-Star team. Heston was also named as Eastern League Pitcher of the Year. The pitching staff, which led the EL in staff ERA was also the driving force behind Richmond's run to the ELCS in 2011. In 2009, he served as the pitching coach for the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, the Connecticut Defenders (Double-A - Eastern League), guiding the staff to the third-lowest ERA in the league (3.53). He spent the four previous years (2005-08) as the pitching coach for the Augusta Green|ackets (A - South Atlantic League). Before joining the Giants, he also served as a coach in the Seattle Mariners, Atlanta Braves, Baltimore Orioles and Philadelphia Phillies organizations.

As a left-handed pitcher, he spent 11 Major League seasons with the Cincinnati Reds (1971-73), Baltimore Orioles (1974-77, '82), Montreal Expos (1978-80) and Cleveland Indians (1980). The Giants got more questions than answers when totaling up the 2012 season for Adrianza. He was every bit the defensive standout that he was touted to be, however he struggled mightily with the bat, raising questions as to whether he can compete offensively against top-line pitching. Heading into 2013, the 23-year old once again is tagged by Baseball America as the top defensive infielder among Giants' prospects. However, hitting .220 in his first go-around in the Eastern League in 2012 has dropped his prospect stock to some degree. He enters the season as the #24 prospect in BA's top-30 rankings for San Francisco farmhands. He will more than likely open 2013 back in Richmond, once again playing shortstop everyday for the Flying Squirrels. Arnold has made a steady progression through the Giants' system since San Francisco selected him in the 26th round of the 2010 draft. Although he began 2012 with San Jose (A+), the presence of Andrew Susac didn't allow much time behind the plate for the 25-year old. 2012 was another banner year for the Bochy baseball family. Bruce guided the Giants to their second World Series title in the last three seasons, while Brett continued to climb the organizational ladder with an exceptional campaign in Richmond. For the second consecutive season - in his second full-season - Brett limited the opposition to a paltry .161 average. He did it while serving most of the season as the Squirrels' closer. Although his final numbers for the year were very strong, upon further inspection they were even better. The hard-throwing Bowlin was one of the arms that the Giants sent to Richmond (AA) from Augusta (A) during the tail-end of the 2011 season. While Bowlin had never appeared above the low-A level, he acclimated himself nicely in three regular season appearances as the Squirrels dramatically advanced to the post-season on the final day of the season. Bowlin was also tabbed for the post-season roster and made one appearance during the Eastern League Championship Series. Despite his brief success in 2011, the Giants put Bowlin back on his previous developmental track in 2012, and he spent the entire season with San Jose (A+). He posted a solid if not sensational season for the Giants and manager Andy Skeels, one that could put him in line for a promotion back to Richmond to open 2013. Standing in the way of that scenario is a fairly extensive list of arms with more experience at the Double and Triple-A levels. 

Dunning was a standout as a collegiate shortstop for Indiana, and the Giants selected him as such in the 33rd round of the 2009 draft. Duvall was feeling weak and lethargic during spring training last season, and couldn't figure out why. Eventually, he was diagnosed as a diabetic. The Giants signed Marte as a 19-year old out of his native Dominican Republic in 2007 and then watched as he made a dazzling pro debut in the Dominican Summer League. Marte showcased pure stuff, which prompted San Francisco to bring him to the States to make his domestic debut the next year (2008). However, it didn't work out that way as he got off to a horrific start to the year, batting .191 in the month of April. His average stayed under .200 until May 26th and only a surge in June saved his first half. All told, the numbers were comparable to 2011, but the fact that his strikeout rate increased was alarming. It is nearly unheard of for a prospect to spend three consecutive years at the same level, and most expect the Giants to advance Parker to Richmond to get a fresh start with the Squirrels in his home state in 2013. But regardless of where it starts, it will be a make-or-break season for him in terms of the Giants future plans.

After struggling in his first taste of Advanced-A in 2011, Valdez turned a corner after being demoted back to the South Atlantic League (A). rels - returned to Richmond at the outset of the 2012 season. He went on to spend the entire season in the RVA and tied for the team lead (Justin Fitzgerald) in starts with 28. On the surface it would appear that it was a smooth season for Westcott in terms of injury, but that certainly wasn't the case. He dealt with lingering back pain for most of the year, and pitched through it, never missing a turn in the rotation and turning in a career-high 165 innings. His results were mixed, as the 27-year old struggled in the first and last months of the season. However in between he was arguably the Squirrels most reliable starter, posting ERAs of 3.11, 3.52 and 3.26 in the months of June, July and August respectively. The Louisiana-bred righty also excelled at the plate, batting .327 with a pair of home runs. In some systems, Westcott would probably get a shot at Triple-A to open 2013, but in the Giants' organization it takes an exemplary campaign to move on. Therefore, a return to the Richmond rotation seems likely.

## 2012: IN REVIEW



In 2011, the Flying Squirrels proved they weren't going to fall victim to a sophomore slump, besting their efforts from the Inaugural season in 2010, both on the field and off. A smoother running operation off the field and a continual effort to innovate promtionally had led to an increase at the gate in 2011. Meanwhile, veteran skipper Dave Machemer had guided the club to their first postseason berth and their first appearance in the Eastern League Championship Series.

Therefore, the bar was high for 2012 as the Squirrels broke camp for their third season in the River City. Optimism was also high, as it was learned that the top-two prospects in the San Francisco Giants' system would open the season in Richmond. OF Gary Brown and C Tommy Joseph were rated as the #1 and #2 prospects by Baseball America in San Francisco's minor league chain. They were also expected to anchor a young Squirrels' lineup built around prospects. In the previous two seasons, the Squirrels had never featured a prospect ranked higher than 4th on BA's list of top-30 prospects.

Machemer returned to lead the club for a second season and was rejoined by Pitching Coach Ross Grimsley and Hitting Coach Ken Joyce. The talk out of spring training in Scottsdale, AZ, was that the Squirrels would have a plug-and-play lineup that should score runs in bunches. Richmond would also welcome SS Ehire Adrianza and 2B Ryan Cavan to the fold along with holdovers Chris Dominguez and Wes Hodges. Both stalwarts from the 2011 club that advanced to the ELCS. Postseason MVP Johnny Monell was also back, as was 2011 centerfielder Juan Perez. Veteran free agent signee Daniel Mayora was also expected to provide protection in the lineup for the younger hitters.

On the hill, the Squirrels had led the league in ERA in 2011. They had no reason to believe they couldn't replicate that feat in 2012, with the return of RHP Justin Fitzgerald and RHP Daryl Maday. The "Mystery Man" from the 2011 postseason had been identified as screw ball-firing lefty Jason Stevenson and he would also join the starting rotation along with two hurlers (RHP Chris Heston, RHP Craig Westcott) that had led the California League in ERA and wins respectively.

As is generally the case, the young prospects in the Richmond order found the offensive-going tough while transitioning to the pitcher-friendly Eastern League. Brown, who had torched the California League the year prior, struggled out of the gate in April, batting .227. Joseph, battling a shoulder injury out of spring training was primarily limited to a DH role and logged just five games behind the plate. The third highly-touted Squirrels' prospect, Adrianza, also struggled, batting

Meanwhile, two of the Squirrels primary starting pitchers were struggling mightily. Westcott had an ERA of 5.54 after five starts while Stevenson (6.92) had an ERA of nearly seven through his first five. Despite their struggles, the Squirrels managed a record of 12-12 in April, and also watched the emergence of their new staff-ace.

Heston had been spectacular in April, sporting an ERA of just 1.21 through his first five starts - permitting just four earned runs in the month. In the bullpen, a familiar name was prepping to take over as the team's closer. RHP Brett Bochy, the son of Giants' manager Bruce Bochy had entered the season as a curiosity, but after the first month had emerged as a relief weapon. He had not allowed a run on just five hits through his first eight outings, allowing an average

Machemer and company exited April optimistic, and as the manager recited repeatedly, he saw tremendous potential once the younger players found their footing. It didn't happen in May, as the Squirrels' offense limped through the second month of the season. One of the veteran protectors in the lineup - Hodges - was lost with a quad injury. It would cost him nearly the entire season. Brown improved slightly over April, but still managed an average of just .258. Joseph had a fine month (.303), but suffered a concussion during the month and was limited to just 18 games. The rest of the offense floundered, as both Adrianza (.147) and Cavan (.188) posted averages under .200. Dominguez was only slightly better (.202). The end result was a 13-17 record for the month that left the Squirrels four games under .500 and 8.5 games behind division-leading Akron.

However, there was one extremely bright spot for the Squirrels in May, and that was Heston. The Floridian made five starts in the month and didn't surrender an earned run until his final start. In 35 innings, he allowed just 26 hits while striking out 34. He surrended an average of just .208 and boasted a WHIP of 0.97. Adding to the Squirrels frustrations at the conclusion of the month was Heston's snub by the Eastern League. The league awarded Player of the Month honors to Portland's Bryce Brentz, in the process overlooking a historic stretch on the hill for the Richmond righty.

June 11th stands as a defining moment for both the Squirrels and Brown. After struggling for the majority of the first half, Brown sought out Squirrels' hitting coach Ken Joyce on an off day for the team. After resisting swing changes during the season's first two months, Brown and Joyce spent the day reconstructing the top-prospects' swing. The results were immediate for Brown, as he embarked on a torrid stretch at the plate. On June 12th, Brown began a franchise-record 36-game on-base streak that included a pair of 12 game hit-streaks. He hit safely in 24-of-25 games, including 18 multi-

hit games during the stretch (.427).

Around Brown, the Squirrels also saw a number of key personnel changes. A struggling Dominguez was given a change-of-scenery promotion to Fresno (AAA), as was Stevenson. Hodges continued to linger on the DL after aggravating his quad. In their place came a pair of Giants' free agent signees. Mark Minicozzi, a former Giants' minor leaguer, rejoined the organization after a stint in independent ball. Russ Mitchell, who had been in the big leagues with the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2D1, also was inked by the Giants. Both joined the club in June, and both helped fill the team's voids at first base and left field.

On the mound, Heston came back to the pack to some degree in June. His ERA for the month jumped to 4.40 after allowing allowing just a lone earned run in May. However, June saw the emergence of another prospect arm. Lefty Mike Kickham had skipped a level out of spring training to join the Squirrels, and his eagerness to prove himself had been evident as he led the league in walks through May. In June, a relaxed Kickham posted a 1.84 ERA in five starts. That included the finest outing of his career on June 2nd, when he two-hit the Erie SeaWolves over a seven-inning complete game victory.

Through the upheaval, the Squirrels continued to struggle to string together wins. They close June with a record of 12-15 for the month, seven games under .500 for the year, and 12 games out of the division lead. They also dropped eight of their final nine games in the month.

In one of those games, the Squirrels were literally blown away. A signature moment for the franchise occured on June 25th, while the Squirrels were hosting the New Britain Rock Cats. In the eighth inning of an afternoon affair at The Diamond, strong winds and rain began buffeting the ballpark. Soon, a tornadic-wind sent spectators and players scurrying for cover. When the weather subsided and the players reemerged there was a noticeable piece of the ballpark missing. The strong winds had blown down the left field wall at The Diamond, leaving a tangled mess for staffers to reconstruct while the team embarked on their lengthiest road trip of the summer.

July was easily the finest month of the season of the Squirrels as they pulled themselves back into wild-card contenton with an 18-11 month. Leading the charge at the plate were Brown and Perez. Perez began what turned into the finest half of baseball in Squirrels' franchise history by batting .303. Brown continued his red-hot ways from June with a month for the record books. He hit .355 in the month, posting 44 hits. He grabbed the league-lead in hits while the Squirrels pulled themselves back to .500 for the year. Joining the hit parade were Mayora (.340), Nick Liles (.329) and Minicozzi (.305). Unbekownst to him, Joseph was preparing to say goodbye to the Giants while he hit .288 in the month with 21 RBIs. All told, the Squirrels team batting average jumped to .290 for the month, easily the loftiest total of the season.

Heston was sidelined for the majority of July with a blister issue, but the rest of the staff was there to pick him up. Kickham continued his roll with a 2.82 ERA in the month, and Westcott found his form (3.26). But it was Fitzgerald and rotation-newcomer Chris Gloor that stole the show. Fitzgerald, who was slotted as the staff-ace at the beginning of the season, finally found that form. He went 4-1 in July with a paltry ERA of 1.66. Gloor nipped at his heels, also making six starts and registering an ERA of 1.78.

The surge allowed the Squirrels a chance at returning to the postseason for the second straight season. The Akron Aeros had all but locked up the Western Division title, but the wild-card was shaping up into a race between the Squirrels and the Bowie Baysox. Richmond had dramatically upended the Baysox on the season's final day in 2011 to gain entry to the playoffs. Bowie had slumped the year prior however, and that wouldn't be the case in 2012.

On July 31st, the Squirrels were dealt the blow that in hindsight may have ended their playoff chances. The Giants went looking for a big bat to fuel what would ultimately turn into their second World Series title in three years. They targeted OF Hunter Pence of the Philadelphia Phillies. They landed him, but the price in return was Joseph. The Squirrels 21-year old leader was gone, and with him the nucleus of the clubhouse.

Led by the three-headed monster of Fitzgerald (1.59), Heston (1.66) and Kickham (2.72), the Squirrels remained competitive in the season's final full month. But the offense couldn't keep up their strong performance from July. Which was not the fault of Perez or Monell. Perez stormed towards team MVP honors by batting .365 in August with 15 RBIs. Monell subbed for Joseph and found his stroke - which had been missing most of the year. He batted .341 in August and knocked in 14 runs. But Brown slumped, and fell off by more than 100 points from July to August. He managed an average of just .247 in August. Without the spark at the top of the lineup, Richmond could muster a record of just 15-14. That wouldn't be enough to hold down Bowie, who streaked towards the wild-card spot in the west with a sizzling month of 21-9.

The Squirrels played out the string in September, finishing the season at The Diamond with a record of 70-71. Despite the lack of playoff baseball, there were still plenty of highlights for the club. Heston (2.24) won the league's ERA title and was named as the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Year. It was the first postseason award for a Flying Squirrel. Heston was also named as the right-handed starting pitcher on the league's postseason All-Star team. Kickham was named as the left-handed starter to the squad giving the Squirrels an unprecedented sweep of the pitching spots. Heston was also named as Richmond's Pitcher of the Year. Lost for much of the season in the hype surrounding Brown and Joseph, Perez had quietly put up the finest offensive season in franchise history. He was named as the team's Most Valuable Player after batting .302 with 53 RBIs. He became the first Squirrel to bat more than .300 during a season.

In a season in which attendance dipped throughout minor league baseball due to extroardinary heat in the summer months, the Squirrels more than held their own. The team reclaimed the EL's overall attendance crown, welcoming 438,002 fans to the ballpark, easily surpasssing a million fans to the ballpark in their first three seasons in Richmond.

Ultimately, it was a solid if not spectacular third season for the Flying Squirrels. A season entered into with plenty of fanfare, had fizzled to some degree through the summer months. However, the goal remained entertainment in the stands and development on it, and the club could cite successes in both areas. The team had launched the first human cannonball in minor league history while also potentially launching the careers of some of the game's future stars. All of which leaves the team eager to build upon 2012 when the gates open again on April 4th, 2013.

#### BASEBALL IS BACK!

Following the 2008 International League season, baseball was packed into boxes and moved away from the city of Richmond, VA. After repeated failed attempts to secure a new ballpark in Richmond, the Richmond Braves, who had called the city home for over forty years, headed to new digs in Gwinnett, GA. The Richmond community made last-ditch efforts to save the team, but to no avail. An announcement made before the 2008 season regarding the team's impending move, turned the season into a "lame-duck" experience and a final fan's farewell.

In a baseball-rich community, the absence of the game weighed heavily on hearts during the summer of 2009. However, near the end of that summer, rumors started swirling regarding baseball's return to the River City. A few weeks after the 2009 season concluded, the once dormant Diamond housed a press conference to announce that baseball would indeed be back, beginning in 2010.

As the residents of Richmond prepared for that 2009 season without baseball, the San Francisco Giants' Double-A Franchise, the Connecticut Defenders, were preparing for their 2009 season in Norwich, CT. Prior to the season and unbeknownst to baseball fans in Richmond, the Eastern League had targeted the city for the relocation of an Eastern League franchise. Although not announced, speculation ran rampant that the franchise would be the Defenders. Although the Defenders posted a memorable season on the field, rolling to the Northern Division Championship and a berth in the Eastern League Championship Series, lagging attendance and visibility of the franchise eventually led to their selection as the team that would move to Richmond.

On September 23, 2009, the Eastern League held a press conference to announce that the Defenders were relocating from Norwich, CT to Richmond, VA for the 2010 season. It was also announced that The Diamond would be the home of the new team for the first two seasons, with three option years mutually agreed upon by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority and the newly-minted team operating under the name of Navigators Baseball LP. Lou DiBella, President & Managing General Partner of Navigators Baseball LP, would head up the ownership team that would bring baseball back. That ownership group vowed wholesale improvements to the condition of The Diamond, beginning with replacing bench-seating in the entire lower bowl, discarding the old aluminum benches and outfitting the ballpark with 3,200 brand-new fold-down seats with cup holders.

The "Baseball is Back" press conference was also used to introduce the management team on the ground in Richmond for the new team. Chuck Domino, a longtime presence in the Eastern League as President of the Reading Phillies, would serve as Chief Executive Manager. Along with building the R-Phils into one of the most successful franchises in minor league baseball, Domino had overseen the creation of the Lehigh Valley Iron Pigs - Triple-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies - in 2008. Joining Domino would be Vice President & Chief Operating Officer Todd "Parney" Parnell and General Manager Bill Papierniak.

Fans were involved in the process from the very beginning as the team announced an on-line "Name the Team" contest in conjunction with The Richmond Times-Dispatch that would begin in late September. Fans were offered the chance to submit their suggestions for the team's new name. More than 6,000 entries were received before the team's front office narrowed the field to five finalists. It was announced in early October that the finalists would include the Flatheads, the Flying Squirrels, the Hambones, the Rhinos and the Rock Hoppers. Darren Rovell from CNBC got in on the fun and ran an additional contest to add a wild-card entrant from submissions across the country. More than 9,000 submissions flooded CNBC before Hush Puppies was chosen as the sixth finalist. Hambones was eventually dropped from consideration, and the final five remained.

On October 15, 2009, the Flying Squirrels were born at a press conference held at The Richmond Times-Dispatch building in downtown Richmond. With confetti flying, "Parney" raised the arm of Kyle Nelson and his wife Donna, representing their son Brad Mead at the press conference. Mead had submitted the name Flying Squirrels, and was awarded season tickets for life by the newly-minted team. Plan B. Branding was on hand at the press conference to outline their plans for logo creation and brand implementation, getting right to work on the identity of the now identified Flying Squirrels.

Meanwhile, renovations going on behind the scenes at The Diamond were substantial. In the lower bowl, seats were being unbolted and removed to make way for 3,200 new seats. The old restaurant along the first baseline was being reinvented as an expansive merchandise store, the suites were being gutted and outfitted with new windows, seats and furniture and the concession stands were being emptied and prepared for new state-of-the-art equipment. A new picnic area was being created along the third baseline, while a kid's zone began to take shape outside of the new store.

In late November, the Squirrels moved another step forward and announced a two-year media partnership with Clear Channel Broadcasting. Sports Radio 910 AM would be Richmond's flagship radio station, carrying all 142 regular season games. It was also announced that the Squirrels' broadcast team would consist of Jon Laaser and Anthony Oppermann.

December 1, 2009 was the day everyone had been waiting for. A press conference was held at Holiday Inn I-64 West End to unveil the team's new logo and the official colors of Radiant Red, Squirrels Silver, and traditional Black. The Flying Squirrels' identity continued to come together as four logos were unveiled: a primary logo featuring a flying squirrel in mid-flight, a secondary acorn logo adorned with an "R", a Richmond word mark secondary logo, and a Flying Squirrels word mark secondary logo.

Following the logo unveiling, the Flying Squirrels also celebrated a soft grand opening of the team store at The Diamond, one of Minor League Baseball's largest merchandise stores. At the store, fans could shop amongst a vast array of Flying Squirrels' apparel and memorabilia, as well as have the opportunity to order the merchandise online. Coupled with the excitement surrounding the new team, the holiday shopping rush turned Flying Squirrels' merchandise into a hot-commodity. Minor league records were broken as inventory flew off the shelves, prompting rushed re-stocking and furious efforts from the team's front office to make sure a rapidly-growing fan base got their hands on the new-look merchandise before the holidays. The massive response to merchandise also proved an asset to the community, as the Flying Squirrels partnered with numerous area charities for the first-ever "Season of Giving." Each charitable partner received 10% of the daily sales for a select day during the holiday shopping season, culminating in a \$15,000 donation from the team.

The vision of baseball returning to Richmond became clearer on January 5th, 2010, as the Flying Squirrels held a press conference at Home Team Grille to announce the inaugural field staff as assigned by the San Francisco Giants. The first manager, or "head nut" as he cracked upon his introduction, would be Andy Skeels. Ascending to a managerial role at the Double-A level for the first time, Skeels would bring a winning pedigree to Richmond having claimed titles with the San Jose Giants (Advanced-A, California League) in 2009 and the Augusta GreenJackets (A, South Atlantic League) in 2008. He was joined at the podium by pitching coach Ross Grimsley and hitting coach Russ Morman. Eric Ortega, who was not in attendance, was announced as the team's first Athletic Trainer.

The fans were given yet another opportunity to take ownership of the team with a contest running on-line through The Richmond Times Dispatch in late December to name the mascot. Nearly 4,000 submissions were received, and on February 11th, the new face of the franchise, "Nutzy" was introduced at a press conference at The Byrd Theatre.

At the same press conference, the Flying Squirrels uniforms were revealed during a "Uniform Fashion Show." Lane Casadonte from CBS-6 TV, Chip Tarkenton from ABC-8 TV, Wes McElroy from Sports Radio 910 and Greg Burton from ESPN Radio 950 served as celebrity models for the fashion show. With the introduction, the Flying Squirrels image was complete.

The Inaugural version of the Richmond Flying Squirrels hit town on April 5th, 2010, flying from the Giants' Spring Training Complex in Scottsdale, AZ to Norfolk, VA. The team was chartered via bus from Norfolk directly to The Diamond, where they immediately took occupancy of the newly renovated home clubhouse. Their arrival, much like the departure of the team that had formerly inhabited the same clubhouse, happened in the middle of the night under the cover of darkness.

The first Flying Squirrels Media Day took place on April 6th, 2010, as players and staff took turns fielding questions from the local media, tried on the newly-minted Flying Squirrels uniforms and posed for head shots. That same evening, the team met the community that would support it for the first time, taking part in the "Meet the Team" event at the Richmond Marriott Downtown. Approximately 200 well-wishers were on hand to welcome the team to Richmond, as they were introduced for the first time.

On Thursday, April 8th at 8:30 am, the Flying Squirrels departed via charter bus for the franchise's first game. It took place at Bowie's Prince George's Stadium in Bowie, MD. Ominously, the game was suspended in the fifth inning due to heavy rain showers in the area. Richmond right-hander Mike MacDonald took the ball and made the first start in franchise history. CF Darren Ford looked at the first pitch in a Flying Squirrels' uniform, which was hurled by Bowie left-hander Zach Britton. The Squirrels' inaugural game was completed the following evening, with the Squirrels falling, 6-4. However, their first win followed quickly behind, as Richmond blanked Bowie, 2-0 in the seven-inning contest that followed for their first victory. Left-hander Clayton Tanner earned the first victory for Richmond.

It was the only win the Squirrels would notch on a season-opening seven-game road swing, as they dropped the final two games to the Baysox and were swept in three games by the Altoona Curve. The Squirrels limped home at a mark of 1-6.

The slow start did little to diminish the enthusiasm surrounding baseball's return to the River City, and The Diamond was abuzz well before the scheduled 7:05 pm first pitch on Thursday, April 15th. A sellout crowd of 9,560 ushered the game back in, as Squirrels' right-hander Daryl Maday and the Richmond bullpen combined to blank the Reading Phillies. Richmond earned a 3-0 shutout win in their first game at The Diamond. However, the night was marked by the pageantry that surrounded the evening, including Richmond Mayor Dwight Jones and Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell were among the luminaries on hand to throw out ceremonial first pitches.

The sellout crowd was a sign of things to come, as the Flying Squirrels immediately became a local sensation. They welcomed eight more capacity crowds on their way to knocking off longtime Eastern League champ Reading for the league's attendance crown. 463,842 fans made their way to The Diamond during the 2010 season, earning the Squirrels the overall attendance crown in the Eastern League, as well as the highest average attendance (6,626).

On the field, the Squirrels stumbled to a 5th place finish in the newly-formed Western Division, posting a record of 68-73.

Off the field, they smashed minor league merchandise records, introduced an entirely new brand of entertainment to baseball fans in Richmond and earned recognition for their year-long effort to aid causes throughout the community.

Following the season, Domino was named the Eastern League's Executive of the Year. Additionally, the team was honored as the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce's Business of the Year and Richmond Magazine's Best Sports Franchise. Ballpark Digest honored the Squirrels new look with their Logo of the Year Award and Style Weekly annointed the Squirrels "Richmonders of the Year."

Despite the accolades, in his post-season synopsis, Parnell stated that "2010 will be the worst season the Flying Squirrels ever have."

In the short-term, Parnell's proclamation proved to be prophetic on the field, where the Squirrels





welcomed a new manager in 2011. Veteran skipper Dave Machemer was tabbed to guide the Squirrels in their second season.

Buoyed by the league's top pitching staff, Machemer led the Squirrels to their first franchise post-season berth, as Richmond went down to the final day of the 2011 season battling with the Bowie Baysox for the Wild-Card spot in the Western Division. On a rainy day in Altoona, PA, on September 5th, Wes Hodges belted a solo-home run in the eighth inning to give the Squirrels a 2-1 lead. The low-flying liner just eclipsed the right-field wall of Altoona's Blair County Ballpark, and arrived just ahead of a ferocious rainstorm that rendered the ballpark unplayable. Due to the fact that it was the last day of the season, the Squirrels were awarded the win on a seldomly-envoked rule. The win proved the difference, as Richmond held off the Baysox by a half-game for the wild-card spot.

Another act of nature would again benefit the Squirrels heading into the playoffs for the first time, as Tropical Storm Lee ravaged the East Coast, causing massive flooding in Harrisburg, PA. The flood rendered the home ballpark of the Harrisburg Senators, Metro Bank Park, unplayable, forcing the Eastern League to move the entire Western Divisional Series to The Diamond. The Squirrels capitalized in the ballpark where they boasted the best home record in the league during the regular season, trouncing the Senators in a three-game sweep that catapulted them to the Eastern League Championship Series.

Richmond was denied their first Eastern League title in four games by the prospect-laden New Hampshire Fisher Cats. The Squirrels took the first game of the best-of-five series in Manchester, but fell in the next three, including the two games they hosted at home.

Off the field, the Squirrels enjoyed a sensational follow-up campaign to their inaugural season. Although Reading reclaimed the Eastern League attendance crown with the help of a renovated FirstEnergy Stadium, the Squirrels increased their average attendance from 6,626 fans per game in 2010 to 6,679 fans per game in 2011. They also drew the largest crowds of the four teams competing in the Eastern League playoffs.

As a result of the continued efforts of the franchise, Parnell was awarded Baseball America's highest minor league honor following the season. BA named Parnell as the Minor League Executive of the Year for 2011. It marked the first time he had been bestowed with the honor, and allowed him to join his friend Domino, who had garnered the award in 2003 while with Reading.

Machemer and his staff returned to guide the Flying Squirrels in 2012, and the result was once again a pitching-dominated outfit. Although the team failed to return to the post-season, they boasted two of the top starting pitchers in the Eastern League. Right-hander Chris Heston and Left-hander Mike Kickham swept the starting spots on the post-season all-star team, while Heston was named as the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Year. The honor was the first yearly award for a Flying Squirrel in franchise history.

Despite boasting the top-two prospects (Gary Brown, Tommy Joseph) in the Giants' system entering the season, the Squirrels struggled on the field to a record of 70-71. Joseph was traded to the Phillies at the trading deadline in exchange for Hunter Pence, who helped catapult the Giants to their second World Series title in three years.

Brown had an up-and-down season in Richmond, and it was Juan Perez who stole the show in the Squirrels' outfield. Perez became the first Squirrel to hit over .300 for a full season, claiming team MVP honors by batting .302.

Off the field, Richmond reclaimed the overall Eastern League attendance crown from the Reading Phillies. They also welcomed their one millionth fan to The Diamond since baseball's return in 2010.

Machemer and staff will return for a third go-around in Richmond in 2013, as the Squirrels will open their fourth season in the Eastern League at The Diamond.



### 2012 GIANTS' SYSTEM BREAKDOWN

**COMPOSITE RECORD BREAKDOWN:** The Giants dropped to 11th in overall organization standings, but continued to play winning baseball as a whole despite trades thinning the organizational prospects for the third consecutive season. However, that didn't translate into postseason appearances, as only the San Jose Giants (A+) advanced to the playoffs among the Giants seven minor league affiliates. Fresno (AAA) rebounded to a record over .500, but the Flying Squirrels couldn't replicate their 2011 run to the playoffs, and neither could the Augusta GreenJackets (A).

#### **PLAYOFF REVIEW:**

San Jose: Consistency turned into a detriment for former Flying Squirrels' skipper Andy Skeels and the 2012 San Jose Giants. Although San Jose finished with the best overall record in the California League's North Division (75-65), the Giants failed to claim either half. They finished in second place in both halves, three games off the pace of Bakersfield in the first half and two games behind Modesto in the second half. San Jose did claim the wild-card in the division, and squared off with the Modesto Nuts in the California League's Mini-Series. The Giants claimed game one, but fell in each of the next two to drop the best-of-three series. It ended a shorter post-season than the Giants had grown accustomed to over the last handful of years.

### THE DIAMOND - STADIUM FACTS

The Diamond serves as the home venue for Flying Squirrels baseball as they represent the San Francisco Giants in the Eastern League of Professional Baseball Clubs. The facility was previously the home of the Richmond Braves (Triple-A - International League) from 1985-2008. Following the 2008 season, the Richmond Braves relocated to Gwinett, GA, becoming the Gwinnett Braves beginning in the 2009 season. Although Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) continued to play their home games at The Diamond during the 2009 season, the ballpark was void of professional baseball for the first time since its construction. The ballpark continues to be operated by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority (RMA). Upon their inception, the Flying Squirrels and the RMA signed a two-year lease agreement (2010-2011) with three club option years. Prior to the 2010 season, The Flying Squirrels committed more than two million dollars to renovate The Diamond. Included in those renovations was the replacement of aluminumbleachers in the lower bowl of the ballpark with 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats (pictured below). The top II rows of the upper bowl were also eliminated to create room for banner signage that allows the overall look of the park to become more cohesive and lowers capacity to a more intimate 9,560. The Flying Squirrels continued to enhance and refurbish their home park prior to the 2011 season, investing another \$250,000 into the park. Included in the upgrades were, converting the existing line-scoreboard to an LED display (Time Technologies), construction of a Speed of Pitch display in right-center field (Daktronics), converting existing clock in right field to an LED display, creation of party decks behind home plate and the "Cupid Section" down the right-field line, and the refurbishing of the "batter's eye" in center field. Although they continue to strive towards building a new facility, the Squirrels recognized the need to replace the playing surface at The Diamond to create a suitable competitive environment for Giants's and Eastern League prospects. To that aim, \$100,000 was invested in installing a new drainage system and infield surface prior to the 2013 season.



At the center of a more than two-million dollar renovation of The Diamond, was the installation of 3,164 state-of-the-art folddown seats that replaced aluminum-bench style seating in the lower-bowl that had been in place since the ballpark opened in 1985. The project to replace the entire lower-bowl of seats began in November, 2009 and was completed in February, 2010.

#### The Diamond - 2012 Renovations

Starting on November 15, 2012, King Construction started excavation of a \$100,000 field renovation. Nine inches of soil was excavated on the infield grass and foul territories totaling 25,000 square feet. Flat panel drain-age was installed under three inches of gravel and six inches of sand root zone - both gravel and sand were laser-graded to specific measurements with precision equipment. New sod was laid on December 5th and the project was completed on December 8th.

### FLYING SQUIRRELS' ATENDANCE HISTORY

The Flying Squirrels have had tremendous success at the gate since their inception in 2010. Among the highlights, the Flying Squirrels have ranked; among the top-2 in the Eastern League each season, ranked among the top-3 in all of Double-A baseball each season, ranked in the top-20 in all of affiliated minor league baseball in each season. To provide context, the Flying Squirrels have drawn 332,975 more fans over their first three seasons than the Gwinnett Braves (AAA) have over the same time period. The Squirrels have averaged at least 1,500 more fans per game than Gwinnett in each of their first three seasons, and nearly 2,000 more in 2010. During their inaugural season at The Diamond, the Flying Squirrels drew 174,272 more fans to the ballpark than the R-Braves did in their final season in 2008 (289,570).

During the 2012 season, the Flying Squirrels welcomed their one millionth fan to The Diamond. The club has drawn a total of 1,349,364 fans to the ballpark in their three years of existence.

### MEDICAL GLOSSARY

Abscess: an infection, which produces pus; can be result of blister, callus, penetrating wound or laceration.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): a primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of applications.

Anti-Inflammatory: any agent, which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Anteriogram: a film demonstrating arteries after injection of dye.

Arthrogram: x-ray technique for joints using air and/ or dye injected into the affected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff.

**Arthroscope:** an instrument used to visualize the interior of a joint cavity.

Arthroscopy: a surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an Arthroscope. An arthroscope in procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

**Atrophy:** to shrivel or shrink from disuse, as in muscular atrophy.

Baker's Cyst: localized swelling of a bursa sac in the posterior knee as a result of fluid that has escaped from the knee capsule. A Baker's cyst indicates that there is trauma inside the knee joint that leads to excessive fluid production

Bone Scan: an imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury sight takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of

**Bursa:** a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where friction is likely to occur, then minimizes the friction; for example between a tendon and a bone.

Capsule: an enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize that joint.

**CAT Scan:** use of a computer to produce a cross sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Cellulitis: inflammation of cellular of connective tissue

**Cervical Vertebrae:** group of seven vertebrae located in the neck.

Collateral Ligament: on either side of and acting as a radius of movement, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and wrist

Concussion: jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

**Contusion:** an injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object

**Degenerative Joint Disease:** changes in the joint surfaces as a result of repetitive trauma.

**Deltoid Ligament:** ligament that connects the tibia to bones of the medical aspect of the foot and is primarily responsible for stability of the ankle on the medial side. Is sprained less frequently than other ankle ligaments.

**Deltoid Muscle:** muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc, Intervertebral: a flat, rounded plate between

each of vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fiber ring, which surrounds a soft-gel like interior. It functions as a cushion and shock absorber for the spinal column.

Dislocation: complete displacement of joint surfaces

Eccymosis: bleeding into the surface tissue below the skin, resulting in a "black and blue" effect.

**Effusion:** accumulation of fluid in various spaces in the body. Commonly, the knee has an effusion after an injury.

Electromyogram (EMG): test to determine nerve function

**Epicondylitis:** inflammation in the elbow due to overuse

Fracture: breach in continuity of bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, green-stick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: a mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or confused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

**Grade Two Injury:** a moderate injury in which musculoskeletal tissue has been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

**Grade Three Injury:** a severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totatally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function.

**Hematoma:** tumor-like mass produced by an accumulation of coagulated blood in a cavity.

**Inflammation:** the body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: an edge, rim or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

**Ligament:** band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and meniscus injuries.

Meniscus: crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee, medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers.

Metatarsals: five long bones of the foot, running from the ankle to the toes.

Patella Tendinitis: inflammation of the patellar ligament; also know as "jumpers knee."

Patellofemoral Joint: articulation of the kneecap and femur. Inflammation of this joint can occur through: 1) acute injury to the patella. 2) overuse from excessive running particularly if there is an associated knee weakness. 3) froncil wear and tear of the knee, 4) as a result of poor foot mechanics. Patellofemoral irritation can lead to hondromalancia, which in its most chronic condition, could require surgery.

**Plica:** fold of tissue in the joint capsule and a common result of knee injury.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): a primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

**Reconstruction:** surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingment Syndrome: a microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress, and the four stages are: 1) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff; 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation; 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than one cm and 4) a complete tear of one cm or more.

Scapula: shoulder blade.

**Sciatica:** irritation of the sciatic nerve resulting in pain or tingling running down the inside of the leg.

Sciatic Nerve: major nerve that carries impulses for muscular action and sensations between the low back and thigh and lower leg; it is the longest nerve in the body.

**Shin Splint:** a catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor and cannot be defined otherwise.

**Spondylolisthesis:** forward displacement of one verterbrae over another below it due to a developmental defect in the vertebrae.

**Sprain:** injury resulting from a stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

**Strain:** injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: a hair-line type break in a bone caused by overuse.

Stress x-ray: a continual x-ray taken when a portion of the body is stressed to its maximum in order to determine joint stability. This is a test utilized in some ankle injuries.

**Sublaxation:** partial dislocation of a joint. The term usually implies that the joint can return to its normal position without formal reduction.

Tarsals: a group of seven bones of the foot consisting of the calcaneus, talus, cuboid and three cuneiform

**Tendinitis:** inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: tissue that connects muscle to bone.

**Tomograph:** a special type of x-ray apparatus that demonstrates an organ or tissue at a particular depth.

Transverse Process: small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebra that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

**Triangular Cartilage:** a connective tissue characterized by its nonvascularity and firm consistency; located on the little finger side of the wrist.

**Ulnar Nerve:** nerve in the elbow commonly irritated by excessive throwing.

Wrist: the junction between the two forearm bones (radius and ulna) and the eight wrist bones (trapezium, capitate, hamate, pisiform, trequetral, lunate and scaphoid)

### FLYING SQUIRRELS MEDIA POLICIES

SEASON CREDENTIALS: Season credentials for the 2013 season will only be issued to legitimate news gathering organizations that cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. The Flying Squirrels will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (804-359-1373) or as an email attachment to Jon Laaser at jon.laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be made via email to Jon Laaser at jon. laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com. Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the media will call window.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP: The Flying Squirrels will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily Credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will also honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writer's Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** During games, photographers must work out of the photography wells adjacent to both dugouts. Special requests should be directed to Jon Laaser, Director of Broadcasting, or Jay Burnham, Manager of Media Relations, at least 24 hours in advance of game.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES: In accordance with the regulations designated by the San Francisco Giants and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will be open to credentialed media from 3 1/2 hours prior to game time until 45 minutes prior to game time. Following the game, clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department. There will be no clubhouse access during rain delays or between games of a doubleheader.

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines under any circumstance. Media in violation of this policy are subject to credential revocation. Media must leave the field and dugout areas no later than 45 minutes prior to the game time.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to those organizations that cover the team the most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements, please contact the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to those dates.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admittance to lot. Media is not permitted to park in ballpark tunnel (Under Stadium) at anytime.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Flying Squirrels players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or feature story should contact the Flying Squirrels no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availabity, as the Flying Squirrels respect the players and coaches wishes in all matters. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start. No exceptions.
