

Lou DiBella currently serves as President & Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond. Over the past five years, that has included the creation of the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group, and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, CT. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and the Norwich Navigators that preceded them. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues presently between the Flying Squirrels and their parent-club, the San Francisco Giants.

Although he led baseball's return to Richmond, Di-Bella's name continues to be synonymous with world championship boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding II-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Pay Per View flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr., and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing. DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers; and establish a legacy of matchmaking excellence, both in an effort to improve the health of the boxing industry.

Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titleist Paulie Malignaggi and WBC Welterweight champion Andre Berto.


In January 2005, DBE launched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in Rocky Balboa. In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film Love Ranch, starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film The Fighter, starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo Gatti, while a fighter with DBE.

> DiBella was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, and attended Manhattan's prestigious Regis High School. He was a summa cum laude graduate of Tufts University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. A 1985 graduate of Harvard Law School. DiBella spent four years as an attorney with the prestigious law firm Sullivan & Cromwell. A tireless advocate

of boxing reform, DiBella has been a leader in the movement for federal regulation, uniform health and safety standards and a national boxing commission. He has lectured extensively on these subjects and has testified before Congress and numerous state and local bodies. In 1999, DiBella received the Thurman Munson Corporate Hero Award from the Association for the Help of Retarded Children for both his achievements at HBO and his charitable activities. Numerous civic organizations and retired boxer's associations have honored him, including Ring 8, Ring 34 and Latinos in Sports. DiBella resides in Huntington Bay, New York.









A 32-year veteran of the baseball business, Chuck Domino is currently the Chief Executive Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. He also holds the title of Senior Advisor with the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Triple-A, International League). He served as President of both the IronPigs and the Reading Phillies (Double-A, Eastern League) from 2006-2009. Domino's efforts have been greatly recognized with his 2010 induction into the Reading Baseball Hall of Fame. Following the 2010 season, Domino was also honored as the Éastern League's Executive of the Year, an award he had previously won four times while with the R-Phils. During their inaugural season in 2010, Domino led the Flying Squirrels to the overall and average attendance crowns in the Eastern League. The Squirrels regained their average attendance crown in 2013. The IronPigs claimed three consecutive overall minor league attendance titles under Domino's guidance (2010-2012).

2013: Led the Squirrels to their second Eastern League average attendance title. 2012: Led Lehigh Valley to their third consecutive overall minor league baseball attendance title ... Guided Richmond to their second overall Eastern League attendance crown in three years. 2010: Was named Eastern League Executive of the Year ... Led Richmond to overall and average attendance crown in EL ... Was inducted into the Reading (PA) Baseball Hall of Fame. 2008: Was inducted into the Berks County Business Hall of Fame by Junior Achievement in March ... R-Phils led the Eastern League in overall and average attendance (436,789/6,423). Oversaw the inaugural season for the IronPigs ...Lehigh Valley finished 5th in the International League in overall and average attendance (602,033/8,479). 2007: R-Phils led the Eastern League in overall and average attendance (466,385/6,663)...FirstEnergy Stadium became the first blank that has never been home to a Triple-A franchise to welcome it's 10 millionth fan all-time ...The R-Phils became the first EL. team to draw better than 450,000 fans in eight consecutive seasons ...Presented "Champion of Youth Award" by the Olivet Boys and Girls Club ...R-Phils were nominated for the Larry MacPhail Award given to the top promoter in the Minors. 2006: Named Eastern League Executive of the Year for the 4th time ... Led EL. in overall and average attendance (460,216/6,669) ...The R-Phils became the first EL. team to draw better than 450,000 fans in seven consecutive seasons ... Honored with the Extra Innings Award, presented at the Minor League Baseball Promotional Seminar to the team that demonstrates excellence in community service, for the opening of Gordon Hoodak Stadium at Lauer's Park... Franchise nominated for the Larry MacPhail Award given to the top promoter in the Minors ... Named President of both the Reading Phillies (AA) and the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (AAA). 2005: Led the Eastern League in attendance at 468,105 fans ... The city of Reading became the first E.L. city to surpass the 9-million mark in total attendance (5.9 million fans have come under Domino's watch) ... Broke ground on Gordon Hoodak Stadium at Lauer's Park. An \$850,000 downtown youth stadium built by Baseballtown Charities on the grounds of Lauer's Park Elementary School. The school is named for the former stadium which housed several professional teams from 1907-1941. The likes of Babe Ruth, "Shoeless" loe Jackson and others have played on site. 2004: Led the R-Phils to an Eastern League best and franchise record 7,138 fans per game ... Inducted into the Berks County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame ... Recipient of Boyscouts "Spirit of Scouting" Award. 2003: Named

Minor League Baseball Executive of the Year by Baseball America ... Guided the Reading Phillies franchise to the John H. Johnson President's Trophy. The President's Trophy is the highest honor presented by Minor League Baseball to one organization each year. The winner of the trophy is selected based on franchise stability, contributions to league stability, contributions to baseball in the community and promotion of the baseball industry ...Named Community Leader of the Year by the Arthritis Foundation. 2002: Guided Reading to a franchise record attendance of 486,570 fans. 2001: Named "Small Business of the Year" by the Berks County Chamber of Commerce. 2000: Led Reading Phillies to their second Bob Freitas Award, presented by Baseball America given annually to the best operation at each of Minor League Baseball's four classifications. Made Reading the first two time recipient of the award, having also won in 1991 ...Also named by Baseball America as the Bob Freitas Award recipients for the decade of the '90's ... Named "Executive of the Year" by the Middle Atlantic Major League Baseball Scouts Association. 1999: Earned club's second Larry MacPhail Promotional Trophy presented annually to the top promoter in Minor League Baseball. 1998: Named Minor League Baseball Executive of the Year by The Sporting News. 1997: Eastern League Executive of the Year. 1995: Named the General Manager you would want to run your franchise by Base-ball America in an article titled "Building the Perfect Beast" 1994: Recipients of the Larry MacPhail Promotional Trophy. 1991: Recipients of the Bob Freitas Award by Baseball America given annually to the best operation at each of Minor League baseball's four classifications. 1989: Eastern League Executive of the year ... Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. In that role, he oversees all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations

In their fourth season in Richmond, the Squirrels shattered their previous average attendance mark and claimed their second Eastern League average attendance crown. Under Parney's leadership, the Squirrels have placed in the top-three among Double-A franchises, and top-20 among all minor league clubs, in average attendance in each of their four seasons.

Following the 2013 season, Parney was awarded his second Eastern League Executive of the Year Award. He had previously been honored in 2004 while the General Manager of the Altoona Curve. It marked the second EL Award for the Squirrels' front office (Chuck Domino - 2010).

After leading the Flying Squirrels to the 2010 Eastern League attendance title, "Parney" and the Squirrels saw an increase in average attendance during the 2011 regular season and were easily the top-draw during the 2011 EL postseason. For his efforts, and due to the team's success on the field and off, "Parney" was honored by Baseball America following the season with their top minor league award. He was named 2011 Baseball America Minor League Executive of the Year. The Flying Squirrels now boast the distinction of having two recipients of the award in their front office, as Chuck Domino was also recognized with the award in 2003 while with the Reading Phillies. Parney followed up his award-winning season by guiding the franchise to their second overall Eastern League attendance crown in 2012.

With his leadership, the franchise completed a 1.5 million dollar renovation of The Diamond, where they opened Eastern League play in 2010. During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while smashing corporate and ticket sales expectations. With "Parney" at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance, welcoming 463,842 (6,626) fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded Logo of the Year for 2010 by Ballpark Digest.

Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond Business of the Year by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). "Parney" also currently serves the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation

Board of Trustees, as well as the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors. Due to his flamboyant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, "Parney" has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region

Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond, "Parney" served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes (Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). "Parney" held the title of President for both franchises.

2014 will mark Parnell's landmark 25th season in minor league baseball. In addition to his roles with both the State College and

Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve, a position he relinquished in December, 2008, after the sale of the franchise from Curve Baseball LP to the family of Robert F. Lozinak.

During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and added the

highest honor bestowed annually upon a Minor League Baseball club, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, in 2006. Altoona became only the 11th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less than three years

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 2001. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

The 45-year old graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He has two daughters, Lindsay (19) and Samantha (16).











Bill Papierniak enters his 17th season in professional baseball and serves as the General Manager of the Richmond Flying Squirrels. His leadership helped the Flying Squirrels build the franchise in little more than seven months, culminating in minor leauge merchandising records, an Eastern League attendance title and multiple community impact awards. He steered the franchise back to the Eastern League's second overall attendance crown in 2012 and their second average attendance title in 2013. Papierniak came to Richmond from the Daytona Cubs (Chicago Cubs - Florida State League), where he spent six seasons as General Manager.

Bill represents the Flying Squirrels on Minor League Baseball's licensing committee, helping to shape the overall direction of the organization.

Bill was tabbed as the "Executive of the Year" by the Florida State League following the 2009 season, his final campaign before joining the Flying Squirrels. Under his watchful eye, the Daytona Cubs franchise was recognized for a ground-breaking 2006 season and continued contribution to Minor League Baseball by being named the winner of Baseball America's 2006 Bob Freitas "Organization of the Year" Award for the Single-A level.

Over his six seasons with the Daytona Cubs, Papierniak helped the Cubs set attendance records at Jackie Robinson Park in five consecutive seasons. The team also shattered sponsorship and corporate sales records, becoming an award-winner and one of the most respected in Minor League Baseball.

Prior to joining the Cubs, the Northern Virginia native was a member of the Hagerstown Suns in the South Atlantic League for two seasons, ascending to the role of Assistant General Manager. During his tenure, the Suns were tabbed by ESPN in 2002 and 2003 with a

"Veeckie" for top promotions in Minor League Baseball. For his efforts, Papierniak was named the 2002 South Atlantic League "Sales Executive of the Year."

Bill spent the first four seasons of his minor league baseball career with the Carolina League's Lynchburg Hillcats as the club's Director of Group Sales and Promotions.

Papierniak graduated from James Madison University with a B.B.A in management. He and his wife Michelle live in Midlothian along with their son Trae (10) and two daughters Ainsley (8) and Adalyn (3).







FLYING SQUIRRELS ON THE AIR

The 2014 season of Flying Squirrels baseball can be heard locally on the radio on the flagship station for Flying Squirrels Baseball, Sports Radio 910 AM. Broadcasts will begin one half-hour before scheduled first pitch with "The Flying Squirrels Pregame Warmup" hosted by Jay Burnham. Game broadcasts will also include the half-hour "Flying Squirrels Postgame Wrap" hosted by Burnham. Flying Squirrels game broadcasts will also be heard world-wide online at SportsRadio910.com and on IHeart Radio and TuneIn.





Jon Laaser, 34, returns for a fifth season at the microphone for all 142 Flying Squirrels games in 2014. In addition to serving as "The Voice of the Squirrels," the versatile broadcaster has taken on additional broadcast roles during his time in the RVA. He also currently serves as the primary television announcer for VCU men's basketball, and the lead radio announcer for VCU women's basketball. Additionally, he has joined Video I HD as a television announcer for regional college basketball broadcasts seen on MASN, Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and SNY. He also frequently contributes to and serves as a fill-in sports talk radio host for Sports Radio 910. Laaser is credited with the creation of the Flying Squirrels television show "Flying Squirrels Insider." Along with hosting the show, he also serves as head writer, graphic designer and producer. Laaser came to Richmond following a one-season stint as the lead broadcaster for the Montgomery Biscuits (Double-A - Tampa Bay Rays). He was reunited in Richmond with Flying Squirrels' Vice President & COO Todd "Parney" Parnell, whom he worked with while calling games for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (Advanced-A – Atlanta Braves) in 2008 and the Altoona Curve (Double-A – Pittsburgh Pirates) in 2007. A native of Minneapolis, MN, he has also provided play-by-play for the Yakima Bears (A – Arizona Diamondbacks), St. Paul Saints (Independent) and St. Cloud River Bats (Summer Collegiate). Laaser's broadcasting resume also includes the role of lead announcer for Charleston Southern University football and men's basketball, the Minnesota State High School Football/Basketball Championships and Hamline (MN) University football. His broadcasting career began in sports talk radio, with Clear Channel's KFAN in his native Minneapolis.



Jay Burnham, 32, returns for a second season in the Squirrels' broadcast booth in 2014. Prior to Richmond, he spent three seasons as Director of Broadcasting for the Trenton Thunder (Double-A New York Yankees). Burnham is entering his 12th season broadcasting minor league baseball, including stints with the Hagerstown Suns (A - San Francisco Giants), Pensacola Pelicans (Independent), Asheville Tourists (A-Coloroado Rockies) and Thunder. A native of Shelburne Falls, MA, Burnham was the recipient of the prestigious 2011 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year award issued by Ballpark Digest, a renowned industry publication. The Elon University graduate has called play-by-play for over 1,000 professional baseball games, including two All-Star contests, in over 30 different stadiums throughout his career. He is also the host and creator of "The Minor League Report," a weekly podcast covering minor league baseball across the country. Outside of baseball, Burnham has also joined VCU athletics, lending his distinctive voice to a variety of events, including both play-by-play and public address assignments. A craft beer afficionado, Burnham currently resides in Richmond with his wife Cheyenne.





Russ Morman rejoins the Squirrels after a three-season stint as the Hitting Coach at Triple-A Fresno, becoming the third Manager in franchise history (Andy Skeels, Dave Machemer). He was a member of the inaugural Richmond field staff, serving as the Hitting Coach on a staff led by Manager Andy Skeels. This past Fall, he was selected to manage the Scottsdale Scorpions - comprised of top prospects from five organizations - of the prestigious Arizona Fall League. 2014 will mark his fifth year in the Giants organization. Prior to his time with San Francisco, the Kansas City native spent seven seasons as an instructor in the Boston Red Sox system. The Giants weren't scared away by Agosta's diminutive stature during the 2012 draft, and felt they got a steal in the second round. When the Giants returned Arnold to Augusta (A) in 2012, it may have been seen as a demotion by some. Not to the Giants, who wanted Arnold to work with the star-studded group of young pitchers they had at the level. Bucardo had put himself on the Giants' radar at the beginning of the 2010 season, dominating the South Atlantic League while with the Augusta GreenJackets (A). So thin that former San Francisco Farm Director Fred Stanley was fond of saying "he could sleep in the barrel of a shotgun," his arm began to wear down at the conclusion of that 2010 season. He struggled after a promotion to San Jose (A+) at the tail-end of the year, and missed all of 2011 due to a shoulder injury. 2012 was also pretty much a wash. The Giants nabbed Ciriaco during the minor league phase of the 2007 Rule V draft from the San Diego Padres. Since that time, the versatile infielder has appeared at four different levels in the San Francisco system, including stints with Triple-A Fresno in 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2013. He has supplied much-needed depth at multiple positions, and due to that role has bounced fairly frequently from level to level throughout the system. In that role, he saw action in 48 games for the Flying Squirrels during their inaugural season in 2010, splitting his time between first base, second base, third base, shortstop and the outfield. The utility needs for the Giants placed Ciriaco in San Jose (A+) for the entirety of the 2011 season, but he returned to Richmond for 33 games in 2012 and another 25 in 2013. He can capably play each infield position and in a pinch has also spent time in the outfield. Assuming he retains his utility role in 2014, he could very well return to the River City at some point during the course of the season and potentially could play everyday at times throughout the year.

When you have tremendous upside, you get a lot of opportunities to succeed. The Giants have given the 28-year old Cordier another one entering 2014, signing him to a Major League contract which lured him away from a number of additional offers. Originally a second round draft pick of the Kansas City Royals back in 2004, the hard-throwing right-hander has struggled to stay healthy throughout his career, which will now include time with four organizations. He has missed two full seasons due to injury (Knee, Elbow), and has endured many more minor stints on the disabled list. 21. He is also rated as the #33 overall prospect in minor league baseball. He was raw when the Giants drafted him in 2010, having spent most of his high school career as a first baseman. Which is one of the reasons the excitement surrounding Crick intensified after his first full season - spent with Augusta (A). After Visa issues cost the 24-year old the 2012 season, injuries kept him off the mound again for the majority of 2013. Without much of a recent track-record, De Paula was a 40-man roster casualty of the San Diego Padres following last season. The Giants swooped in and claimed him off waivers, seeing the same potential that had prompted the Padres to add him to the 40-man roster before he had ever pitched above the A-ball level. He was a starter in the San Diego system, but the Giants feel his low to mid-90s fastball and secondary stuff play better out of the bullpen. He pitched well enough early in the Cactus League that he drew the attention of Giants' manager Bruce Bochy and much of the San Francisco media. The Giants' bullpen is a tough nut to crack, and odds are long that the Dominican-native will earn a spot in San Francisco at the outset of the season. That leaves Fresno (AAA) and Richmond (AA) as options for further seasoning, and the fact that the lefty has only limited experience at the Double-A level would seem to indicate he'll be a Squirrel early in the year.

After not connecting on a home run during an abbreviated first professional season, Delfino erupted in the productivity department in 2013. Spending his first full season as a pro in Augusta (A), he led the GreenJackets in hits (129), doubles (25), home runs (13) and RBI (76). His average (.270) wasn't staggering, but the 23-year old was recognized as a South Atlantic League Mid-season All-Star. Dominguez bounced back from a subpar 2012 season in a big way in 2013. He returned to Fresno (AAA) and led the Grizzlies in hits (137), while also transitioning back to the infield. As the Louisville Cardinal returned to full health, his power stroke also returned, with Dominguez finishing the season with 15 HRs. He also shifted across the infield at times to play first base, and showed the ability to handle himself at the position. Johnson, a lanky, hard-throwing right-hander impressed in his first full-season in 2013, spending the entire year with Augusta (A). He is billed as an upper-90s pitcher, who touched the vaunted 100 MPH reading on a few occasions last year. He has continued to impress in the Cactus League prior to the year, showing better command of a "frisbee slider," and his secondary stuff in general. Some in the Giants' organization feel the St. Edwards University-product is capable of getting big league hitters out when he is on right now. However, the problem for the 6th rounder, as it is for many hard-throwing young hurlers, is consistency. He fanned 71 in 52.1 innings for the GreenJackets last year, but also walked 30. Entering the 2014 campaign, Johnson is a dark-horse candidate to join the Flying Squirrels' bullpen. Odds are, he will open in San Jose (A+), potentially as the Giants closer. But, guys with an arm like the 23-year old tend to move quickly and early success could lead to a quick promotion to the River City.

Jurica was somewhat of a surprise pick for the Giants when he was chosen out of Kansas State University in the 3rd round of the 2010 draft. A surprise due to the fact that San Francisco already had two high-profile shortstops amongst their top-prospects in Ehire Adrianza and Brandon Crawford, and had taken another - Joe Panik - with their first round pick that year. Despite solid campaigns to open his professional career, Jurica continued to lag behind Adrianza and Panik on the depth chart. He had certainly done enough in 2012 to earn a promotion to Richmond to open last year. The problem was that Adrianza and Panik were ticketed to form the middle of the infield. A 31st-round draft selection of the Giants in 2011, McCormick got off to a phenomenal start to his professional career. At his first post - Salem-Keizer (A-) - the lefty made 23 appearances and posted a razor-thin ERA of 1.19. The Giants were impressed enough that they jumped the 26-year old a level and stationed him in San Jose (A+) to open the 2012 season. He responded by turning in a league-high 61 appearances out of Andy Skeels' bullpen. He held left-handed batters to an average of .177 and appeared for less than an inning in more than half of his outings. It was a typical resume for a left-handed specialist, and it would appear that he replicated that usage when he placed second in the Eastern League with 58 appearances in 2013. However, that wasn't necessarily the case. Due to a shortage of options in the Richmond bullpen, McCormick and fellow side-armer Edwin Quirarte were used outside of the specialist role for which they were intended. A product of the University of Southern California, Oropesa was challenged by the Giants after they drafted him in the 3rd round of the 2011 draft. He spent his first professional season at San Jose (A+), bypassing the lower levels of the minor leagues. It was a similar approach to the one employed by the Giants with Roger Kieschnick in 2010. The 24-year old didn't disappoint from a power or production standpoint, belting 16 home runs and driving in 98 runs. There was some concern over his 150 strikeouts however. Osich slipped to the 6th round of the 2011 draft after having Tommy John surgery during his Junior year at Oregon State. San Francisco saw early-round potential in the left-hander however, and spent \$450,000 on him to make sure he was a Giant. The Giants were aggressive with their second round pick from the 2010 draft, placing him at the Advanced-A level to make his professional debut in 2011. The initial returns were solid if not spectacular, but certainly not alarming. The UVA Cavalier led the team in strikeouts, but also paced the club in walks. When the 25-year old stayed behind in San Jose rather than move up to Richmond to open 2012, it seemed the Giants were trying to give him a confidence boost before he made the jump to Double-A. He got off to a horrific start to the year however, and wound up spending the entire year in the California League. Payne was lightly regarded coming out of Georgia Southern in 2011 and the Giants were able to grab him in the 35th round. He enjoyed tremendous success in his first two professional seasons, eclipsing .300 in each. That included batting .309 during his first full professional season, spent with Augusta (A). He also stole a whopping 53 bases that year and was caught just three times. The Giants continued to challenge the 24-year old with a promotion to San Jose (A+), and the level finally caught up to him. His average dropped to .229 in 73 games and San Francisco eventually sent him back to Augusta to finish the year. The 23year old has the prototypical makeup of a lead-off hitter, but doesn't translate his elite speed into outstanding defense in the outfield. Continued success last year would have probably set up Payne to make his Double-A debut this year. That

may still happen, but it won't come until later in the season, and the late-round pick will have to enjoy attention-grabbing success to earn the opportunity.

Rojas, a 24-year old, spent the first six seasons of his career in the New York Mets' system. The Giants snagged him in the minor league phase of the 2011 Rule 5 draft and placed him at Advanced-A San Jose to start the 2012 season. Just six appearances in, Rojas received a 50-game suspension for testing positive for metabolites of Stanozolol - a banned substance. He also had injury issues, and the combination basically derailed his season. He got back on the mound in 2013, also spent in San Jose, and turned in mixed results. He made 49 appearances out of the Giants' bullpen and compiled an ERA of 4.86. However, there were times that the Domincan-native flashed signs of the pitcher that the Giants had seen something in. The Giants settled on Stratton with their 21st overall pick in the 2012 draft after the St. Louis Cardinals had snapped up Michael Wacha with the 19th selection. The Mississippi State Bulldog then opened his professional career with short-season Salem-Keizer. He pitched well, but had his season shortened by a concussion that he sustained when he was struck by a line drive during batting practice. That limited experience may have helped in the decision to have the 23-year old start his first full-season with Augusta (A) rather than San Jose (A+) last year. The fact that the San Jose staff was loaded didn't help his chances of a higher placement. He wound up spending the entire season with the GreenJackets, posting a 9-3 record and 3.27 ERA. It was a solid showing, but Stratton certainly didn't blow the league away. The reason for that was not the caliber of his stuff, but the lack of consistency of it. The sky is the limit for the right-hander, and 2014 undoubtedly will be a huge year for him. Tomlinson was a gold-glove shortstop while in college at Texas Tech, and the Giants bolstered their already plentiful stock of prospect middle infielders when they selected him in the 12th round of the 2011 draft. When Ricky Oropesa struggled in Richmond, the Giants swapped the pair and Villalona made his Double-A debut. He didn't dominate the level by any means, batting .235, but he also wasn't overmatched. It would stand to reason that Villalona will return to Richmond to open the year, with the hope that he can advance to

Weathers, 28, was the 8th overall selection in the 2007 draft by the Colorado Rockies. Prior to his selection he had been the hard-throwing closer for the Vanderbilt Commodores. season in 2013. He led San Jose (A+) in nearly ever pertinent offensive category, including walks, which showed his more disciplined approach at the plate. A hulking figure, power to all fields is still his most impressive tool though, and he led the San Francisco system in home runs a year ago (25). Once considered the finest pitching prospect in the state of North Carolina by Baseball America, labrum surgery in college set him on his current course as a corner outfielder. Some might dismiss his numbers from the California League last season, citing the struggles of other Giants' prospects who have faltered upon arriving in Richmond. However, Giants' instructors rave about his makeup and claim that the Wake Forest-product will be more ready to handle the Eastern League than any of the other big names that came before him. He will be the Flying Squirrels starting right fielder on opening day, but more importantly he will serve as the anchor in the middle of the Richmond batting order and the Squirrels ability to score runs will rest squarely on his broad shoulders.



The fourth installment of Flying Squirrels baseball explored a vast array of emotions that only the National Pastime can provide. Excitement rippled in the River City in early January when the Giants announced veteran manager Dave Machemer would return to lead the Squirrels for his third consecutive season. Mach, along with former MLB All-Star Will Clark and the Giants 2012 World Series trophy arrived in Richmond on January 31st for the third annual Hot Stove Banquet hosted at the Seigel Center. The highly-attended event was once again a huge success, with the proceeds donated to the Paul Keyes Memorial Scholarship Fund. Anticipation for the year mounted as Spring Training came to a close and the buzz around the prospective roster was finalized. For the first time in franchise history, the Squirrels were loaded with a slew of young, offensive-minded prospects, led by third baseman Adam Duvall, second baseman Joe Panik and Virginia-native Jarrett Parker. The Giants complimented this prospect trio with reliable veteran players such as Mark Minicozzi and Javier Herrera. This combination of prospect-potential and proven statesman, led to the most productive offense in team history. Unfortunately, the 2013 Squirrels fell short of the playoffs, and finished in disarray with a 70-72 record.

The range of emotions began early and often in 2013. A sold out crowd arrived at The Diamond early for the Opening Day festivities, however the damp, dreary April 4th evening disappointed as the Squirrels and Rock Cats game was delayed and ultimately suspended in the fourth inning due to rain. History ensued the following day with the franchise's first no-hitter, a seven inning affair authored by newcomer Jack Snodgrass. The lefty Snodgrass worked six scoreless innings in his Double-A debut before being relieved by long-time Squirrels ambassador Daryl Maday. Veteran Maday concluded the momentous evening with a strikeout and sent The Diamond crowd into a roar.

The auspicious Squirrels beginnings soon faded as Richmond was battered during their first road trip, a four game series in Trenton that ended with a 15-1 drubbing at the newly-named Arm & Hammer Park. It was injury to insult in the 15-1 defeat as the Squirrels lost their slugging third baseman, the reigning Eastern League player of the week, Adam Duvall due to a thumb injury. Duvall was off to a torrid start, hitting .378 with two home runs and ten RBIs in his first 11 games. Infielder Mark Minicozzi filled in for Duvall at third base and forced himself into Machemer's everyday lineup for the rest of the season. Richmond managed to stay afloat following the injury as Snodgrass became a household Eastern League name and led the circuit in a variety of pitching categories after his first four outings. Snodgrass and fellow Lefty Ryan Bradley along with returning staff members Justin Fitzgerald, Craig Westcott and Chris Gloor comprised the founding rotation of what would eventually become an unstable pitching staff.

As the weather warmed in Richmond, so too did the promising Squirrels offense. Minicozzi scorched the opposition at the plate and earned the Eastern League Player of the Month Award for May. The 30 year-old Minicozzi suddenly rejuvenated his career with one of the hottest stretches imaginable. Minicozzi batted .427 with five home runs and 25 RBIs in May while the younger talent began to mesh around him in the middle of the lineup. Additionally, Machemer shuffled struggling outfielder Jarrett Parker to the top of the order with resounding success. Parker began to fulfill his second round status potential. On May 26th at Peoples Natural Gas Field in Altoona, Parker homered twice in the same inning. He collected a franchise-record seven RBIs in the contest and homered a combined five times during the four game series. Parker finished the season with 18 homers, a Squirrels single-season record.

The year reached its zenith in early June, as the Squirrels returned to the Diamond for a crucial threegame showdown against the division-leading Erie SeaWolves. Richmond won the first two games of

the series in front of consecutive sellout crowds and the Squirrels were poised for a series sweep with Chris Gloor on the mound. Gloor was sharp and was supported by Mark Minicozzi's game-tying tworun homer in the sixth inning. The Diamond was dripping with tension as the two teams headed into extra innings. Erie scratched across a run in the top of the tenth inning to regain a 4-3 lead. Richmond needed a spark, and received one from the struggling slugger Ricky Oropesa in the form of a game-tying solo homerun to right field. Two batters later, with the bases empty and two outs, Jarrett Parker slowly strolled to the batter's box. Parker delivered an inspiring and unforgettable home run to right-center field, launching the Squirrels into a first place tie in the Western Division.

The season somehow spiraled out of control soon after the iconic Parker home run. Richmond attempted to stay afloat following multiple pitching promotions to Triple-A Fresno. The Giants finally afforded rotation mainstay Justin Fitzgerald an opportunity at the next level. Fitzgerald was never fully replaced in the rotation and he was joined in Fresno by fan-favorite Daryl Maday and hard-throwing veteran right hander Fabio Castillo. With the bullpen depleted, the rotation slowed as well, despite a solid 1-2 punch from Snodgrass and Chris Gloor. Woes also felled the offense as slugger Ricky Oropesa struggled and was eventually sent down to San Jose. The team lost a franchise-record seven consecutive games in June while falling to 11-17 in the month.

Richmond pitching had never struggled like this. The Squirrels, usually known as one of the best staffs in the Eastern League, featured an abysmal 5.44 ERA in July. Injuries played a significant role in the team's scuffles as All-Star catcher Andrew Susac missed significant playing time due to finger and shoulder issues. The pitching staff had trouble finding a consistent rotation of starters and struggled to throw strikes. Despite the mid-season doldrums, the Squirrels proudly sent seven players to the Eastern League All-Star game in New Britain, with outfielder Javier Herrera taking home All-Star MVP honors. Herrera along with Susac, 2B Joe Panik, INF Mark Minicozzi, RHP Edwin Quirarte, LHP Jack Snodgrass and LHP Phil McCormick received All-Star recognition. The month of July also featured the franchise's first MLB rehab assignment. On July 30th RHP Ryan Vogelsong arrived in Richmond and the tone and tenure of the season was suddenly trending upwards once again.

A broken hand in May led to Vogelsong missing significant time in the Giants rotation. The well-traveled righty was attempting to work his way back to the Majors while San Francisco happened to make an East Coast trip to Philadelphia and Tampa Bay. The unique set of circumstances allowed Vogelsong to suit up for Richmond and on July 30th he earned the win in his debut with five shutout innings over Portland. Vogelsong steadied a tilting ship and the Squirrels managed to rattle off 15 wins in 17 games. A trip to the playoffs was once again a realistic outcome heading into the dog days of August.

The cresting wave left behind by Vogelsong and his Major League presence reached its high-water mark on August 16th with a win over Bowie. The Squirrels were suddenly 60-65, one game out of first place and seemingly gaining steam. The arrival of three young pitching prospects, LHP Edwin Escobar, LHP Josh Osich and RHP Cody Hall, bolstered a tired staff mid-season. The trio arrived in Richmond in early July and quickly solidified themselves as mainstays by mid-August. Hard-throwers Hall and Osich were able to spell All-Star relievers McCormick and Quirarte and allowed Dave Machemer to more efficiently utilize his bullpen. The sidearm duo of McCormick and Quirarte appeared in 58 and 56 games respectively, setting the top two records for most games in one season.

The arduous journey of 142 games mounted as the season came to a close. All-Star catcher Andrew Susac was still out with injury and eventually the Giants shut him down for the year at the end of July. The team sputtered, unable to finish close games, and faded out of contention. Heading into a crucial series against Reading, the Squirrels lost three late inning leads in heart-breaking fashion to seal their fate. The Squirrels were not destined for the postseason.

Disappointment in the season's end was soon transformed into a reflection of a positive year both on and off the field. The core group of Giants prospects had proven their worth at the Double-A level. Veterans Javier Herrera and Mark Minicozzi resurrected their once promising careers and the Squirrels led at the box office in the Eastern League once again. The front office announced a franchise-best six sell out games during the 2013 campaign and once again over 434,000 fans were entertained with life-long memories.

PLAYOFF REVIEW: AZL Giants: The only affiliate to claim a league title, the AZL Giants were nearly unbeatable from the beginning of the season. They torched the league to the tune of a 41-14 record and rolled throught the two games in the playoffs, winning both by a combined score of 9-1. That included a shutout of the AZL Dodgers (4-0) in the championship game.

Salem Keizer: The Volcanoes - once a dominant force in the Northwest League - reclaimed their spot atop the South division in 2013, winning both halves of the season. They also posted the best overall record in the league. However, their post-season trip was a short one as they were knocked out by wild-card entrant Boise in the divisional round.

Augusta: Bolstered by a phenomenal pitching staff, the GreenJackets posted the top overall record in the 14-team South Atlantic League. They gained post-season entry by boat-racing the Southern Division in the second half. They finished the half 20 games over .500 (44-24) and sailed to the second half title by eight games. Their pitching faltered in the Southern Division Series however, and the Jackets gave up 15 runs to Savannah in two games to get swept in the best-of-three round.

San Jose: Armed with a prospect-laden pitching staff, Andy Skeels and the Giants claimed the first half race by four games and were post-season assured. They lost some of those arms to Richmond in the second half, but still managed to record the best overall record in the 10-team Cal Leagué. They bested Visalia in a thrilling five-game Division Final, but ran out of gas in the Championship Series and got swept in three games by the Inland Empire Sixty Sixers.

THE DIAMOND - STADIUM FACTS

The Diamond serves as the home venue for Flying Squirrels baseball as they represent the San Francisco Giants in the Eastern League of Professional Baseball Clubs. The facility was previously the home of the Richmond Braves (Triple-A - International League) from 1985-2008. Following the 2008 season, the Richmond Braves relocated to Gwinett, GA, becoming the Gwinnett Braves beginning in the 2009 season. Although Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) continued to play their home games at The Diamond during the 2009 season, the ballpark was void of professional baseball for the first time since its construction. The ballpark continues to be operated by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority (RMA). Upon their inception, the Flying Squirrels and the RMA signed a two-year lease agreement (2010-2011) with three club option years. Prior to the 2010 season, The Flying Squirrels committed more than two million dollars to renovate The Diamond. Included in those renovations was the replacement of aluminumbleachers in the lower bowl of the ballpark with 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats (pictured below). The top II rows of the upper bowl were also eliminated to create room for banner signage that allows the overall look of the park to become more cohesive and lowers capacity to a more intimate 9,560. The Flying Squirrels continued to enhance and refurbish their home park prior to the 2011 season, investing another \$250,000 into the park. Included in the upgrades were; converting the existing line-scoreboard to an LED display (Time Technologies), construction of a Speed of Pitch display in right-center field (Daktronics), converting existing clock in right field to an LED display, creation of party decks behind home plate and the "Cupid Section" down the right-field line, and the refurbishing of the "batter's eye" in center field. Although they continue to strive towards building a new facility, the Squirrels recognized the need to replace the playing surface at The Diamond to create a suitable competitive environment for Giants's and Eastern League prospects. To that aim, \$100,000 was invested in installing a new drainage system and infield surface prior to the 2013 season.



At the center of a more than two-million dollar renovation of The Diamond, was the installation of 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats that replaced aluminum-bench style seating in the lower-bowl that had been in place since the ballpark opened in 1985. The project to replace the entire lower-bowl of seats began in November, 2009 and was completed in February, 2010.

The Diamond - 2012 Renovations

Starting on November 15, 2012, King Construction started excavation of a \$100,000 field renovation. Nine inches of soil was excavated on the infield grass and foul territories totaling 25,000 square feet. Flat panel drainage was installed under three inches of gravel and six inches of sand root zone - both gravel and sand were laser-graded to specific measurements with precision equipment. New sod was laid on December 5th and the project was completed on December 8th.







FLYING SQUIRRELS' ATENDANCE HISTORY

The Flying Squirrels have had tremendous success at the gate since their inception in 2010. Among the highlights, the Flying Squirrels have ranked; among the top-2 in the Eastern League each season, ranked among the top-3 in all of Double-A baseball each season, ranked in the top-20 in all of affiliated minor league baseball in each season. To provide context, the Flying Squirrels have drawn 443,945 more fans over their first four seasons than the Gwinnett Braves (AAA) have over the same time period. The Squirrels have averaged at least 1,500 more fans per game than Gwinnett in each of their first four seasons, and nearly 2,000 more in both 2010 and 2013. During their inaugural season at The Diamond, the Flying Squirrels drew 174,272 more fans to the ballpark than the R-Braves did in their final season in 2008 (289,570).

During the 2012 season, the Flying Squirrels welcomed their one millionth fan to The Diamond. The club has drawn a total of 1,784,133 fans to the ballpark in their four years of existence.

MEDICAL GLOSSARY

Abscess: an infection, which produces pus; can be result of blister, callus, penetrating wound or laceration.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): a primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint: A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-Inflammatory: any agent, which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Anteriogram: a film demonstrating arteries after injection of dye.

Arthrogram: x-ray technique for joints using air and/ or dye injected into the affected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff.

Arthroscope: an instrument used to visualize the interior of a joint cavity.

Arthroscopy: a surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an Arthroscope. An arthroscope has be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Atrophy: to shrivel or shrink from disuse, as in muscular atrophy.

Baker's Cyst: localized swelling of a bursa sac in the posterior knee as a result of fluid that has escaped from the knee capsule. A Baker's cyst indicates that there is trauma inside the knee joint that leads to excessive fluid production.

Bone Scan: an imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury sight takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Bursa: a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where friction is likely to occur, then minimizes the friction; for example between a tendon and a bone.

Capsule: an enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize that joint.

CAT Scan: use of a computer to produce a cross sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Cellulitis: inflammation of cellular of connective tissue

Cervical Vertebrae: group of seven vertebrae located in the neck

Collateral Ligament: on either side of and acting as a radius of movement, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and wrist.

Concussion: jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: an injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object

Degenerative Joint Disease: changes in the joint surfaces as a result of repetitive trauma.

Deltoid Ligament: ligament that connects the tibia to bones of the medical aspect of the foot and is primarily responsible for stability of the ankle on the medial side. Is sprained less frequently than other ankle ligaments.

Deltoid Muscle: muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc, Intervertebral: a flat, rounded plate between

each of vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fiber ring, which surrounds a soft-gel like interior. It functions as a cushion and shock absorber for the spinal column.

Dislocation: complete displacement of joint surfaces

Eccymosis: bleeding into the surface tissue below the skin, resulting in a "black and blue" effect.

Effusion: accumulation of fluid in various spaces in

the body. Commonly, the knee has an effusion after an injury.

Electromyogram (EMG): test to determine nerve function

Epicondylitis: inflammation in the elbow due to overuse

Fracture: breach in continuity of bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, green-stick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: a mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or confused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

Grade Two Injury: a moderate injury in which musculoskeletal tissue has been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

Grade Three Injury: a severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totatally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function

Hematoma: tumor-like mass produced by an accumulation of coagulated blood in a cavity.

Inflammation: the body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: an edge, rim or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

Ligament: band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and meniscus injuries.

Meniscus: crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee, medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers.

Metatarsals: five long bones of the foot, running from the ankle to the toes.

Patella Tendinitis: inflammation of the patellar ligament; also know as "jumpers knee."

Patellofemoral Joint: articulation of the kneecap and femur. Inflammation of this joint can occur through: I) acute injury to the patella, 2) oversuse from excessive running particularly if there is an associated knee weakness, 3) chronic wear and tear of the knee, 4) as a result of poor foot mechanics. Patellofemoral irritation can lead to hondromalancia, which in its most chronic condition, could require surgery.

Plica: fold of tissue in the joint capsule and a common result of knee injury.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): a primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Reconstruction: surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingment Syndrome: a microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress, and the four stages are: 1) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff; 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation; 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than one cm and 4) a complete tear of one cm or more.

Scapula: shoulder blade.

Sciatica: irritation of the sciatic nerve resulting in pain or tingling running down the inside of the leg.

Sciatic Nerve: major nerve that carries impulses for muscular action and sensations between the low back and thigh and lower leg; it is the longest nerve in the body.

Shin Splint: a catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor and cannot be defined otherwise.

Spondylolisthesis: forward displacement of one verterbrae over another below it due to a developmental defect in the vertebrae.

Sprain: injury resulting from a stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Strain: injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: a hair-line type break in a bone caused by overuse.

Stress x-ray: a continual x-ray taken when a portion of the body is stressed to its maximum in order to determine joint stability. This is a test utilized in some analya injuries

Sublaxation: partial dislocation of a joint. The term usually implies that the joint can return to its normal position without formal reduction.

Tarsals: a group of seven bones of the foot consisting of the calcaneus, talus, cuboid and three cuneiform

Tendinitis: inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: tissue that connects muscle to bone.

Tomograph: a special type of x-ray apparatus that demonstrates an organ or tissue at a particular depth.

Transverse Process: small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebra that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Triangular Cartilage: a connective tissue characterized by its nonvascularity and firm consistency; located on the little finger side of the wrist.

Ulnar Nerve: nerve in the elbow commonly irritated by excessive throwing.

Wrist: the junction between the two forearm bones (radius and ulna) and the eight wrist bones (trapezium, capitate, hamate, pisiform, trequetral, lunate and scaphoid).

SEASON CREDENTIALS: Season credentials for the 2014 season will only be issued to legitimate news gathering organizations that cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. The Flying Squirrels will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (804-359-1373) or as an email attachment to Jon Laaser at jon.laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be made via email to Jon Lasser at jon. laaser@squirrelsbaseball.com. Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the media will call window.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP: The Flying Squirrels will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily Credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will also honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writer's Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: During games, photographers must work out of the photography wells adjacent to both dugouts. Special requests should be directed to Jon Laaser, Director of Broadcasting, or Jay Burnham, Manager of Media Relations, at least 24 hours in advance of game.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES: In accordance with the regulations designated by the San Francisco Giants and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will be open to credentialed media from 3 1/2 hours prior to game time until 45 minutes prior to game time. Following the game, clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department. There will be no clubhouse access during rain delays or between games of a doubleheader.

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines under any circumstance. Media in violation of this policy are subject to credential revocation. Media must leave the field and dugout areas no later than 45 minutes prior to the game time.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to those organizations that cover the team the most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements, please contact the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to those dates.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admittance to lot. Media is not permitted to park in ballpark tunnel (under The Diamond) at anytime.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Flying Squirrels players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or feature story should contact the Flying Squirrels no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availabity, as the Flying Squirrels respect the players and coaches wishes in all matters. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start. No exceptions.
