


# Badger Basketball Has New Look

There's a 'new look' awaiting University of Wisconsin basketball fans as Coach John Erickson and his new staff prepare for their first year heading up the school's basketball program.

The ever-optimistic Erickson has high hopes for a successful first year, and all loyal Badger basketball fans share his hopes that he can lead Wisconsin out of the basketball wilderness. Seven lettermen return from the 1958-59 team that won just three of twenty-two games, and finished last in the Big Ten for the second year in a row, with a 1-13 record. In fact, over the past five seasons the Badgers have won just sixteen games in seventy Big Ten encounters and not since the 1953-54 season has a Wisconsin team finished in the first division.

Lettermen returning include team Captain Bob Barneson, Eau Claire, a 6-3 senior, the team's leading scorer a year ago with 259 in 21 games, and the leading rebounder from his forward position. Two other veteran forwards return, Fred Clow, Rockford, Ill., a 6-4 senior, and Jim Biggs, Chicago, Illinois, a 6-2½ junior, who blazed the nets in the latter portion of the 1958-59 schedule, recording 30, 29, 24, and 22 points against Northwestern, Iowa, Purdue, and Michigan State in single game efforts that surpassed the accomplishments of any other Wisconsin sophomore in history.

Bob Rosin, a 6-7½ junior from Mauston who saw enough action to win a major "W" last year is the tallest man on the squad, and much of the Badgers' hopes ride with his improved play in the coming season. Rosin scored 51 points last year playing in fourteen games though seeing limited action.

Three lettermen guards return, headed by Bob Serbiak, a 6-1 Milwaukee senior, and Rick Murray, a 6-2 Three Lakes senior. Serbiak was a consistent scorer in the final four games of last season, gathering his season high of 14 points in the final game against Indiana. Murray was a good scorer at times, scoring 27 points the night Wisconsin upset Purdue for their lone Big Ten win, and he finished the year with 118 points in 17 games. The other veteran in the backcourt is 6-3½ Dick Dutrisac, Wausau junior, who scored 34 points in eleven games, seeing limited action due to an injured back.

One other letterman may be available, following Wisconsin's Rose Bowl trip, and that is Dale Hackbart, who joined the squad for the second semester last year, and added rebounding strength to the Badgers' board play. He was the leading scorer as Wisconsin lost to Minnesota at Madison last February 69-50, with 11 points.

Newcomers hold the key to any sustained success the Badgers hope to attain, and the most promising men in practice to date have been sophomores Marty Gharrity, a 6-2 all-state guard from Shawano (he holds the Wisconsin State basketball tournament record of most points in one game at 44); Jack Ulwell, another all-state guard from Appleton, who stands 5-11½; Bob Powers, a 6-1½ guard from Madison East High School; Bill Nelson, another guard who hails from Manitowoc, and stands 5-10, and Dick Box, an Illinois guard all-stater, who played on the 1957 Heroin, Ill. team that won the state crown. Box weighs 140, and is 5-11.

While there is a wealth of guards, the sophomore talent at forward and center is lacking, with only Tom Hughbanks, a 6-5 Green Bay East graduate, Jack Kotter, a 6-7, 186 Mount Vernon, Illinois product

and John Zwakman, a 6-2½ Superior Central boy appearing capable of breaking in and helping the Badgers at these positions. Hughbanks appears to be the best Wisconsin rebounder.

Erickson believes that Dave VanderMeulen, a 6-4½ junior and Madison East graduate who was on last year's squad and saw little action, has matured to a varsity berth, and he may be the surprise of the 1959-60 season. Dave was a hard driving guard in high school, and seems to have regained that spark in drills thus far.

Erickson's plan of attack revolves around a 'controlled' fast break, and he realizes that his squad's definite lack of height may be a big factor in the outcome of most games on the 1959-60 schedule. He feels, however, that his current squad has good potential, and that once they master the fine points of a 'running' game, the Badgers will be a formidable aggregation.

His plan of attack may consist, at this writing, of a 2-3 offense, meaning two men (the best rebounders on the squad) under the basket, and three men out, preferably the three men that can move the ball and score the baskets at a high shooting percentage.

All in all, the basketball outlook for Wisconsin is hopeful, and it should be an interesting season. Erickson and his assistants, John Orr and Ron Nord, face a big task ahead; they feel they can accomplish much in this first year of rebuilding.

(The Badgers suffered the loss of forward Jim Biggs for first semester action on November 30 when he underwent an hernia operation at University Hospitals).

**JACK ULWELLING**—6-0—175—19-year-old soph from Appleton, Wis.—Was All-State choice at guard while playing in the State Tournament—One of the outstanding prospects on the current squad—fast, excellent shot and playmaker—has potential to be best back court prospect since Ab Nicholas—should be heard from this year.

**BOB POWERS**—Madison East product, where he led East to State Championship in 1958—Was All-State, and voted most valuable player in Big Eight in senior year—6-2—175—19 years old and a sophomore—very promising as a guard on the frosh squad.

**BILL NELSON**—smallest man on the squad at 5-10— from Manitowoc, Wis., where he led team to the consolation championship in the State Tourney — was elected to the All-State third team as well as winning All-Conference honors in the Fox River Valley Conference—overcomes his size handicap by being very quick—has a good shot and should see action.

**MARTY GHARRITY** — Holder of State Tournament

record for points scored in single game (44) and entire tournament (81)—Hails from Shawano and was elected to the All-State teams in junior and senior years—Played on squads that won the tourney in his sophomore and junior years—finished 3rd in senior year—Excellent shot but needs work on defense—will probably see a lot of action as a guard.

**JOHN ZWAKMAN**—6-3—200—19-year-old soph from Superior, Wis.—standout for Superior squad in 1958 State Tournament—is a fine shot and does good job off the boards—maybe a little slow, but should come around.

**ROBERT SLAVIK**—6-5—197—20-year-old soph from Stevens Point, Wis.—All-Wisconsin Valley selection in basketball but also won letter in football and tennis—very promising as a frosh—good rebounder—better than average shot.

**TOM HUGHBANKS**—6-5—210—Green Bay, Wis.—Tom's a sophomore that should do a lot of playing for the Badgers this year—was an All-State selection in basketball in 1958 as well as being named to the All-Conference squads in '57 and '58—very fine rebounder—good shot—exceptional speed for his size.

**JACK KOTTER**—one of the biggest men on the squad at 6-7—soph from Mt. Vernon, Ill.—All-Southern Illinois in 1958—hampered somewhat because of weight (only 186) but is tough rebounder nonetheless—good shot and with experience could turn into real fine pivot man.

## John Erickson—Head Coach

Wisconsin's basketball squad will go into the 1959-60 season with a new head coach for the first time in 26 years, as John Erickson, former Little All-American selection from Beloit College, takes over the reins in an attempt to start the Badgers on a climb toward the national ranking they once knew.

John's a native of Rockford, Ill. where he prepped at East High before entering Beloit College where he became the first player in Beloit's history to score over 1,000 points in a career. Before graduating in 1949 he was selected to the All-Conference teams for three consecutive seasons and was team captain in his junior and senior years. His Little All-American recognition was won in his senior year.

After graduation he moved to Stevens Point, Wisconsin where his teams won 39 games against only 7 defeats in two seasons. His 1951-52 squad came to the State Tournament and was defeated in the Championship finals. In the 1952-53 season he coached at Beloit High School, winning 14 games and losing 11. His team made the State Tournament, being eliminated by the eventual champion, Menasha, in the first round.

Two years of Army service followed the Beloit High School job, and upon returning from the service in 1955 he took over the head coaching spot at Lake Forest, Illinois, College. His overall record for three seasons at Lake Forest was 37 wins against 35 defeats.

In April of 1958 he was appointed assistant coach under Bud Foster at the University of Wisconsin. After Foster resigned at the completion of the 1958-59 season Erickson was named Head Coach.

The new head man is 31 years old, married and has one daughter.

## Ron Nord—Assistant Coach

Ron Nord returns to his Alma Mater to assist John Erickson in the 1959-60 campaign. Nord is a 1950 graduate of the University of Wisconsin where he lettered in basketball as a guard under Bud Foster and also won a major "W" on the baseball squad.

Coach Nord is from Minneapolis, Minn., where he played his prep ball at Minneapolis South High School. In high school he was All-City in football, basketball and baseball.

He entered the United States Air Force during World War II, where he played basketball and baseball in addition to his regular duties of working on the Atom Bomb Project.

His career coaching record to date is 115 wins against only 66 defeats. He started his coaching days at Beaver Dam, Wis. where his teams won 26 while losing 12 starts. After Beaver Dam he moved to Oshkosh in the tough Fox River Valley Conference where his teams won 89 and lost 54.

At Oshkosh his teams won the Valley Crown in 1954-55 and 1955-56. He brought his 1954 squad to the State Tournament where they were eliminated by the eventual champion, Stevens Point, in the semifinal round.

## John Orr—Assistant Coach

John Orr comes to Wisconsin to assist his old teammate at Beloit College, Head Coach John Erickson, after a sensational career as a player and high school coach.

The 6-3, 30 year old Orr starred at Beloit College in 1946-49 where he was elected to the All-Conference squad for three years and the NAIB All-American first team in both 1947 and '48. Previous to his stint at Beloit he played football and basketball at the University of Illinois in 1944-45 where he garnered a second team berth on the All-Conference football team as well as honorable mention on the All-Conference basketball squad.

His college career was interrupted in 1945-46 with a hitch in the service, where he coached and played on the Mare Island, Calif. squad which won 19 and lost 5.

After his graduation from Beloit in 1949 he played with the Peoria Caterpillars in the National AAU tournament and also spent the 1949-50 season playing professional basketball with the St. Louis Bombers and the Waterloo Hawks of the old National Basketball Association.

He started his high school coaching days at Milton Union High in Milton, Wis. At Milton his team won 15 against 7 losses. In 1951 he moved to Dubuque Senior High in Dubuque, Iowa where his teams posted a 103-71 mark from 1951-59. In addition to basketball he coached football as a head coach from 1957-58. His teams compiled a 9-6-1 record.

## Badgers in Helms Hall of Fame

University of Wisconsin basketball coaches and players continue to be honored by being named to the Helms Hall College Basketball Hall of Fame during recent years.

William Chandler, captain of Wisconsin's 1917-18 team which won the Big Ten title, and long-time coach of Marquette University basketball teams, was named during the past autumn to the Helms Hall College Basketball Hall of Fame, raising to six the number of former Wisconsin players and coaches now enshrined in the Hall of Fame.

Previously, Christian Steinmetz, all-time Wisconsin high scorer for one season of play with 462 points in 1904-05, and captain of that team, was named to the Hall of Fame in 1957, while George Levis, Big Ten scoring leader in 1915 and 1916, and co-captain of the 1917 Wisconsin team, was named to the Hall of Fame in 1958.

Wisconsin is represented among the coaches by two of the greatest of all-time, Dr. Walter E. Meanwell, and Harold E. 'Bud' Foster. Both were named in 1958. Meanwell coached at Wisconsin from 1911-12 through 1916-17 seasons, then returned following World War I to guide the Badgers through the 1920-21 to 1933-34 seasons.

Another Wisconsin basketball player of the first Meanwell era, Harold Olsen, co-captain with Levis of the 1917 team, is also enshrined in the Hall of Fame in the coaches' section.
