1990-91 OUTLOOK



Willie Simms is the Badgers' top returning scorer.

A pair of 6-7 forwards—Carlton McGee and Louis Ely are a couple of first-year players challenging for frontcourt time. McGee is a redshirt freshman "who is going to have to play a lot for us this season," said Yoder. "He's quick and agile."

Ely was academically ineligible as a freshman and stayed in Madison over the summer to improve his strength and work on his game. "I was impressed with the commitmment Louis gave over the summer," said Yoder. "I expect some of his hard work to show off this season."

At the low post positions, senior Patrick Tompkins (6.6 ppg, 6.4 rpg) is the leading returnee. Tompkins, who hit a game-winning shot at the buzzer vs Minnesota on ESPN, is one of the strongest players in the Big Ten. The 6–6 Tompkins has good quickness and leaping ability for a 240 pounder. Effective around the basket, Tompkins was 10th in conference rebounding last season.

Senior forward John Ellenson averaged around two points a game in limited action. The 6-9

Ellenson is an excellent defensive player.

Another frontcourt player is 6–9 sophomore Damon Harrell, who played in just 19 games as a rookie. Freshman Grant Johnson, a seven footer, is much-improved big man after a redshirt season. Howard Moore (6–7, 195), a freshman from Chicago provides depth in the frontcourt.

The top returnee in the backcourt is senior sharp shooter Tim Locum (9.8 ppg, 4.8 rpg). The 6–5 Locum is the top returning three point shooter in the conference after hitting 47 percent of his attempts. "Tim can hit from anywhere on the court," said Yoder. "We're going to look to him for scoring punch from the perimeter this season."

Challenging for the starting point guard slot are junior Billy Douglass (2.8 ppg, 1.3 rpg) and sophomore Larry Hisle (4.5 ppg, 1.4 rpg).

Douglass is a heady player according to Yoder, want my lead guard to be a player who can think or the court," Yoder said. "Billy must recognize situations and respond correctly. He can do that."

As every new season begins, there is always optimism amongst coaches, players and staff members. With the start of the 1990–91 basketball season at the University of Wisconsin, ninth-year Coach Steve Yoder's optimism could very well become a reality.

"I feel good about the mix of this team," said Yoder. "We have five upperclassmen returning plus a solid cast of newcomers. When you have that situation, chances for success are very good."

The upperclassmen Yoder speaks of are seniors Tim Locum, Willie Simms, Patrick Tompkins and John Ellenson, and fourth-year junior Billy Douglass. Yoder will look to that quintet for experience and leadership on a team which includes seven first-year players.

Only one starter is gone from last year's 14–17 camapaign. But the player is Wisconsin's all-time career scoring leader Danny Jones. The 6–6 inside player averaged 17.7 points and 4.5 rebounds to earn second team all-Big Ten honors.


"It's always tough to replace a good player," said Yoder. "The challenge for this team is adjusting to play without Danny." Frequently, the Badgers set-up offense keyed around Jones last season. Yoder believes the Badgers may be more of a running threat in 1990–91 because of better athletic ability.

Small forward Willie Simms (13.3 ppg, 4.8 rpg) is the top returning scorer. Simms played 30 games a year ago and led the team with 97 assists. "Willie is as good as anyone going to the basket," said Yoder. Simms tied for the team lead in steals with 33.


Simms brings an added dimension to the squad as a point forward. "He is a great ball-handler," said Yoder, "and that gives us some different looks."

Hisle, at 6–5, can play three positions. The son of former major league baseball player Larry Hisle, Sr., needs to improve on his outside shooting.Junior Brian Good, a solid reserve, led the Big Ten in free throw shooting (90.5 percent) last year. Yoder likes his versatility in the backcourt because three first-year players—Jason Johnsen (6–3), Jay Peters (6–2) and freshman Kass Weaver (6–3)—provide depth at both guard positions.

Peters, a transfer from Ripon College, was his team's leading scorer as a freshman. "Weaver can be a big plus for us," said Yoder. "I want to be able to use him this season."

In the past, the Badgers have relied on their inside game. This season the Badgers look to run nore and use the perimeter game.

"We want to create things on the defensive end to get more opportunities on offense," said Yoder. "This year we should be more up-tempo and look for the 15–20 foot shot."

Yoder is counting on continued improvement from his young backcourt shooters. "Our perimeter players last season, with the exception of Locum, were inexperienced," said Yoder. "This year, those players have the self-confidence and experience to do a better job."

Another area of concern is the team's free throw shooting. The Badgers shot a disappointing 65 percent from the charity stripe in 1989–90. For a team that lost nine games by a total of 20 points and seven Big Ten games by 16 points, that is a horrifying stat for a head coach.

The key to any good running team is its defense.

Tim Locum will be looked toward to add scoring punch from the outside.

Last season the Badgers allowed 64.7 points per game to lead the Big Ten. "We're going to gamble more on defense," said Yoder, "but that will require the players to use better judgement. That style should lead to more opportunities at the offensive end."

The non-conference schedule is highlighted by road games at Oregon, SMU and Marquette and a home contest against Nebraska. The Badgers' Big Ten slate opens at home vs Minnesota on January 7.

"We have good chemistry on this team," said Yoder. "You need a strong group of seniors to win in the Big Ten, and we have that. If one of our newcomers can have an impact we could be very good."

With that kind of mixture there is reason to believe Yoder's optimism can turn into reality.

Basketball Statistics—Final III

At courtside during Wisconsin basketball games is the Final III basketball statistics program. A valuable tool, the program has been in use since the 1986–87 season.

The system, which was purchased by the Badger Basketball Boosters and donated to the University, has proved invaluable for the coaches, sports information departments and the media.

Using light pens, and shot and information screens, statistics are "penned" in as the game progresses. The data collected is automatically computed for halftime and final box scores.

The system's forte is the analyses it performs. It provides in-depth coaching analyses such as player combination effectiveness, turnover analyses and shot analyses by distance and angle. Data, input via game film, provides opportunities to scout opponents and perform post-game analyses of away games.


During game time, Final III provides accumulation and analyses of data. Coaches, sports information staff and the media can access the system during game time.

The Final III system also provides complete player and team history files and formats this information into several forms, including direct telecommunication to news outlets. The system immediately updates single game, season and career statistics for the players and the team.


The only Big Ten school with such a sophisticated statistics program, Wisconsin has received recognition for its innovative approach to basketball.

Computers can't win basketball games, but the information processed by this valuable tool should help provide Badger teams with the state-of-the-art information they need for improvement and a winning edge.










Head Coach Steve Yoder



Wisconsin head coach Steve Yoder enters his 14th season of collegiate head coaching and his ninth at the helm of the Badgers.

Last season Yoder reached a coaching milestone while guiding the Badgers to a 14–17 record. With a 65–50 victory against Northwestern, Yoder became the fourth coach in Wisconsin history to win 100 games.

With a career record at Wisconsin of 100–132, Yoder is tied for third on the school's all-time coaching list with John Erickson who coached from 1960–68.

In 1988–89, Yoder led the Badgers to their first postseason appearance since the 1946–47 season. Posting a 17–11 record during the regular season, the Badgers played in the NIT where they went 1–1 giving them an 18–12 record for the season.

The 18 victories was the most since the national championship team of 1940–41 went 20–3. In fact, only one other team in school history has won that many games—the 1916 team that was 20–1.

For his efforts, Yoder was named Kodak District XI Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Other awards included Midwest Coach of the Year by Basketball Times and Sportsman of the Year by the Madison Pen & Mike Club. He was runner up in the Big Ten Coach of the Year voting.

Yoder has always been known for his tough, competitive teams wwithin the Big Ten. Following the historic 1988–89 season, others outside the conference began to take note as well.

"For the past several seasons, Wisconsin came close to turning the corner to become a winning team," said Dave Bones, a staff writer at the Basketball Times. "The heartbreaking losses of earlier years turned into victories. Yoder's fighting spirit and coaching savvy showed nice guys can and do win."

During his tenure in Madison, Yoder has coached some of the finest players ever to don the Badger uniform

Perhaps best known is Danny Jones, who ended his career last season as the school's all-time leading scorer. Rick Olson and Trent Jackson, another pair in the top five on the all-time scoring list, also played for Yoder. Mike Heineman ended his career as the all-time leader in assists.


Yoder came to Wisconsin in 1982 from Ball State where he compiled a five-year record of 77–62. He was named the Mid-American Coach of the Year in 1980–81 and 1981–82. His 1980–81 Ball State team shared the MAC title and gained an NCAA tournament berth by winning the conference's post-season tournament.

Yoder began his coaching career at Plymouth (Ind.) High School in 1967. During the next six seasons, Yoder's teams won three conference titles, three sectional crowns and a pair of regional titles. Two of his teams finished in the final top ten in the state rankings.


He was named Indiana's District I Coach of the Year in 1973 and then accepted a job as an assistant coach at Furman University. He returned to Indiana in 1975 as head coach at Mishawaka's Penn High School. In 1976, Yoder became an assistant coach at Ball State and a year later became the head coach at the school.

A native of Plymouth, Ind., Yoder is a 1958 graduate of Plymouth High School. He attended Illinois Wesleyan University on a basketball and baseball scholarship and earned his degree in 1962. He earned a master's degree from St. Francis College in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1970.






Yoder won his 100th game at Wisconsin last year.

Ray McCallum begins his seventh year at Wisconsin. His responsibilities include recruiting, scouting and coaching the perimeter players.


He came to Wisconsin after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Ball State during the 1983–84 season.

McCallum is the all-time leading scorer in Ball State history where he played for his current boss, Steve Yoder, for three seasons. A three-time first team all-Mid-American Conference selection, he earned the MAC's Most Valuable Player award his senior year. He played in the 1981 NCAA Tournament after the Cardinals won the MAC Tournament.

The 5–9 guard was awarded the 1983 Francis Pomeroy Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Award for the nation's outstanding collegiate basketball player under six feet.

McCallum was drafted in 1983 by the Indiana Pacers

The 29-year-old McCallum earned a bachelor's degree in industrial technology from Ball State in 1984. A native of Muncie, Ind., Ray and his wife, Wendy, are the parents of a daughter, Brittany Rae.



Johnny Williams

Johnny Williams begins his second season with the Badgers. His responsibilities include on-floor coaching, recruiting, scouting and coaching the inside players.

The 31-year-old Williams came to Wisconsin after serving as the head coach at Earlham College in Richmond, Ind., for four years. Prior to that, he was an assistant at Ball State for three seasons.

Williams was a three-year starter at Ball State where he played for Steve Yoder. A teammate of Badger coach Ray McCallum, Williams was a member of the school's 1980–81 team that shared the Mid-American Conference title with three other schools and gained an NCAA tournament berth by winning the conference's post-season tournament.

He captained Ball State's 1981–82 team which won the MAC championship with a 12–4 record before losing to Northern Illinois in the conference's post season tournament.

Williams earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Ball State in 1982 and his master's degree in physical education from Ball State in 1985.

Johnny and his wife, Damita, have a child, Nicholas, who was born in August, 1990.



Chuck Schramm

Chuck Schramm begins his second year with the Badgers. His responsibilities include on-floor coaching, scouting, directing the Badgers' summer camps and coaching the perimeter players. He also serves as the executive director of the Badger Basketball Booster Club.


The 32-year-old Schramm came to Wisconsir after serving as the head coach at Rockford (III.) College for two seasons. At Rockford, he became one of the most active camp motivational speakers in the Midwest.

Prior to that, he was an assistant at Gannon College in Erie, Penn. for two seasons beginning in 1985–86 when Gannon was ranked seventh in the country in Division II and played in the NCAA Division II tournament. A year later, Gannon made it to the NCAA Division II finals, losing the title game to Kentucky Wesleyan.

At Gannon, Schramm earned his master's degree in higher education counseling in 1987. He earned his bachelor of science degree from Northern Illinois in 1981 in physical education.

Schramm was a part-time assistant coach for Northern Illinois' only NCAA tournament team in 1981–82. He then coached high school basketball, baseball and golf for three years before returning to the college ranks.



BADGER STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING PROGRAM

New training system features constant movement, workouts mirror game conditions

A new training program tailored to game conditions is being used by the University of Wisconsin basket-

"Some coaches just have their kids run sprints and say they're in condition. What we're aiming at is a sport-specific program," said Chuck Schramm, an assistant basketball coach.

Schramm and John Dettman, the first-year basketball assistant strength coach who came to Wisconsin on Barry Alvarez' football training staff, assembled the program. The new workouts mix agility drills and sprints in a framework that mimics game conditions right down to TV timeouts.

'The players seem to like it because it makes sense to them. If you send them running cross country, they'll say, 'I didn't come here to be a cross country runner," Schramm said.

Schramm and Dettman broke down Big Ten game films and statistics and determined that there are three possession changes in an average 40second period.

Therefore, the conditioning calls for three fullcourt sprints every 40 seconds.

Between sprints, the players work on numerous agility drills that range from lateral movements to skipping. The movements change with each set of sprints.

The conditioning takes into account stoppages in the game for fouls, turnovers, and television timeouts.

Periodically, there is a 15- or 30-second pause representing a foul situation or an inbounds pass.

Since there is a TV timeout every 4 minutes in Big Ten games, the players are allowed to rest for 1 minute or 75 seconds every 4 minutes.

The game-specific conditioning was a concept applied to football during summer conditioning, said

Football players ran sprints of varying lengths corresponding to the number of plays in a game.

By the end of the summer, the players were sprinting the equivalent of five quarters of football.

"The bottom line is that if you want to do the best in preparing the athlete, you have to be as specific as possible with regard to game conditions," said Dettman.


The players have responded well to the new approach, said Dettman.

"They see some sense to the madness," he said. "There's reasoning behind it. When we call timeout, they even huddle as a team and encourage each other to do well on the next set of sprints.

Said Schramm: "Half of our agility drills focus on changing direction because we feel that is the most important motor skill in basketball. The ability to change direction allows you to deceive."

The conditioning program also involves weight lifting and plyometrics, drills aimed at improving leaping and bounding skills, said Dettman.

Plyometrics involves jumping on boxes of varying heights. Dettman said even Grant Johnson, a 7-foot 1-inch sophomore, is able to jump on the 46-inch

"There are some great leapers on this team," said Dettman.

Although National Collegiate Athletic Association rules bar players from using a basketball in training prior to the opening of basketball practice, the new conditioning program had players using 8-pound medicine balls during some drills, said Dettman.

The program also incorporates what Schramm calls "gut-check runs." Those involve a long-distance run followed by 15 minutes of running stairs in Camp Randall Stadium.

"We do a potpourri of things that tend to hurt: things to make them realize they can still perform when they're tired," Schramm said.


As the Badgers prepared for the 1990-91 campaign, it was evident that last spring's seven-week training session yielded impressive gains.

Dettman said during that period, the average bench press increased by 28.1 pounds and forward Carlton McGee boosted his bench press by 60

Dettman said the game-specific approach is new to basketball, which has traditionally relied on wind sprints and weight lifting.

"Generally, I'm not sure there has been much time spent on basketball conditioning as in football, and we're trying to change that," Dettman said.


The band has been prominently featured on all the major television networks as well as ESPN and three cable news networks.

The Record Book



92 Years of Wisconsin Basketball

Dec., 1898—Six years after the advent of the new sport of basketball, Bob Burdick, John Mapel, Carl Stillman, Paul Stover, and Captain Walter Hirschberg make up the first Wisconsin Badger basketball team. Dr. J.C. Elsom is the first UW coach.

Jan. 21, 1899—Wisconsin plays its first game and is bested by the Milwaukee Normal Alumni, 25–15 in Milwaukee.

Mar. 4, 1899—The Badgers play their first home game. The Milwaukee Normal Alumni edge Wisconsin, 13–10, and the Badgers finish 0–3.

Feb. 15, 1900—Wisconsin defeats Wayland Academy, 25–15, for its first victory since the sport's inception.

Mar., **1902**—After completing a 10-game schedule—all on the road—the Badgers finish the year with a 7–3 mark, their first winning season.

Dec. 2, 1904—Emmett Angell coaches the Badgers for the first time and watches his team drub Sparta's Company C, 75–10. Christian Steinmetz scores 50 points in the game to set a pre-modern, single-game scoring record.

Jan., 1905—The Wisconsin basketball team makes its first road trip east. The Badgers finish the eastern swing of New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Ohio at 2-6.

Spring, 1905—Christian Steinmetz finishes the season with 462 points, setting a Wisconsin season scoring mark that would stand for 61 years. Steinmetz is later named the Badgers' first all-American.

Mar. 15, 1907—Wisconsin outscores Purdue, 37–10, to secure an 11–3 record record and a share of the Big Ten championship.

Mar. 16, 1912—First year coach Walter Meanwell's team drops Indiana, 32–21 to complete an undefeated season at 15–0. Wisconsin wins the Big Ten title outright and will win or share that distinction seven more times before Meanwell is through coaching in 1934.

Mar. 16, 1918—Despite dropping a 19–11 decision to Minnesota, first-year coach Guy Lowman's Badgers win the school's sixth Big Ten Championship in 12 years.


Fall, 1934—Harold "Bud" Foster, a former all-American player with the Badgers, takes over as their head coach. Foster will hold that position for 25 years, longer than any other basketball coach in the history of the school.

Spring, 1935—In his first year as head coach, Harold "Bud" Foster leads Wisconsin to the Big Ten title, posting a 15-5 record.

Mar. 29, 1941—The "Cinderella" Badgers, lower division Big Ten finishers only one year before, top Washington State, 39–34 in the championship game of the NCAA tournament. John Kotz is named MVP of the tourney. The Badgers' captain, Gene Englund, is the Big Ten MVP and receives all-American accolades.

Spring, 1942—For the second consecutive year, a Badger is named the conference MVP and all-American. Sharpshooting John Kotz earns those honors this season.

Mar., 1947—The 15–5 Big Ten Champion Badgers are invited to play in the NCAA Eastern regionals in New York's Madison Square Garden. Wisconsin takes third place in the East by squeaking past Navy, 50–49, after losing the opener, 70–56, to C.C.N.Y. The conference championship and NCAA tournament bid stand as the last in Badger history.



Danny Jones finished his career last year as the Badgers' all-time leading scorer.

Feb. 28, 1949—Junior Don Rehfeldt takes 37 shots in a 70–47 trouncing of lowa. The 37 shots stands as a Wisconsin single-game record to the present.

Spring, 1950—After being named the Big Ten's MVP, Don Rehfeldt becomes Wisconsin's last all-American to date. Rehfeldt finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,169 points.

Jan. 3, 1953—Center Paul Morrow, in a 50-46 topping of Purdue, pulls down 30 rebounds in the contest—an all-time Badger best.

Mar. 11, 1963—Senior Ken Siebel earns the team's MVP for the third straight year. This is the only time a Wisconsin player has earned that distinction three times.

Mar. 11, 1967—With 12 seconds remaining in the season finale, sophomore Chuck Nagle makes a lay-up to tie Christian Steinmetz for the team single season scoring record of 462, set in 1904–05. Nagle was fouled on the play, and makes the free throw to set a record of 463.

Mar. 2, 1968—Senior Joe Franklin pulls down a careerhigh 27 rebounds in a 104–84 victory over Purdue in his final game in the Fieldhouse. Franklin ends his collegiate career one week later having amassed 858 boards in his three seasons with the Badgers, giving him a school best average of 286 per year.

Spring, 1968—Only one year after Chuck Nagle broke a single season scoring record that stood for 62 years, senior Joe Franklin shatters the record, scoring 544 points in the 1967–68 season.

Spring, 1971—Senior co-captain Clarence Sherrod scores 570 points in his final season as a Badger to take Wisconsin all-time single season scoring honors.

Mar. 3, 1979—Facing eventual NCAA champion Michigan State in the regular season finale, Wisconsin's Wesley Matthews hits a shot from behind the half-court line as time expires to win, 83–81.

Dec. 30, 1979—In the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, HI, the Badgers connect on 32 of 43 field goal attempts (.744), setting a school record and defeating Army, 78–54.

Mar. 10, 1981—Claude Gregory scores 29 points and grabs 17 rebounds in his last game in the Cardinal and White. Gregory leaves Wisconsin as its all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,745 and 904, respectively.

Dec. 2, 1985—In a non-conference match-up with San Francisco State, senior Rick Olson makes 17 field goals en route to a 90–61 victory. Olson's 17 field goals tops the previous record of 16, set almost 27 years before by Bob Lit-

Mar. 9, 1986—Setting a school record by starting every game in his four-year career (112), Rick Olson guides Wisconsin past Northwestern, 70–68. Olson scores 26 points in the contest and misses becoming the Badgers' career scoring leader by only nine points. Olson does, however, set the record for points scored in a single season, finishing the 1985–86 campaign with 571 points.

Mar. 8, 1987—Mike Heineman scores 20 points, grabs seven rebounds and hands out nine assists in his final game as a Badger. Heineman ends his career as Wisconsin's all-time leader in assists in all games (388) and in Big Ten play only (248).

Aug. 21, 1988—Danny Jones scores 53 points to lead the UW to a 120–118 victory over Taby of Sodertalje, Sweden's national champion. The Badgers ended their two-week tour of Denmark, Finland and Norway with an 8–0 record.

Mar. 15, 1989—Badgers make first-ever appearance in the National Invitational Tournament and defeat New Orleans, 63–61. It was Wisconsin's first appearance in post-season play since 1947.

Mar. 20, 1989—Danny Jones scores 24 points in the season finale against St. Louis. His total of 611 points established a UW single-season scoring record.

Jan. 22, **1990**—Patrick Tompkins makes a last second slam dunk to defeat Minnesota 77-75 on an ESPN game.

Feb. 15, 1990—Danny Jones breaks the all-time UW scoring record of 1745 points with the first basket of the game against Ohio State. Jones went on to score a total of 1,854 points in his four year career.

THE 1940-41 WISCONSIN BADGERS—NCAA CHAMPIONS

THE GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

Not since 1918 had the University of Wisconsin campus seen a basketball team take the undisputed Big Ten Championship.

When the Badgers won the Big ten title with a 42–32 victory over Minnesota, it climaxed a dramatic uphill climb. The previous season Wisconsin had finished a distant ninth (3–9) in the conference standings and had an overall record of 5–15. The 1939–40 season, head coach Harold "Bud" Foster noted, had been a year during which he had the players, but not the chemistry. Similar ingredients were there in 1940–41 and this time the coach mixed them like a master chemist, coming up with an explosive combination.

The starting five of Captain Gene Englund at center, John Kotz and Charlie Epperson at forwards and Ted Strain and Fred Rehm at guards "fit together very nicely and was a good machine," Foster remembers. "We had a good frontline defense and big men who played well in the corners. Englund was a strong rebounder and a man who could block out well and intimidate."

His assistant coach Fred Wegner recalls, "It was not really a physically impressive team by today's standards, but a team that used each other's talents well. They just put emphasis on their patterns, played according to plan and things fell together. They didn't throw the ball away much or make many errors. They had a good strong defense and good defensive rebounding."

It doesn't seem like 50 seasons have passed since Coach Foster's finest team overcame a chilly start at Minneapolis—a 44–27 defeat—to roar down the stretch with 12 consecutive victories, 11 in the Big Ten, to win the conference title. The Badgers then outlasted Dartmouth, Pittsburgh and Washington Stae to win the national championship.

The 1941 basketball team was the first in the school's history to score over 1,000 points (1,004 in 23 games) and they established a conference scoring record of 536 points—an average of 44.7 points per game

The 1941 Badgers along with the 1916 team are the only two teams ever to win 20 games in a season—20-1 in 1916—and both won Big Ten titles with 11-1 records.

In their march to the Big Ten and NCAA Championships, the Badgers had to play Indiana, defending Big Ten and NCAA Champions, at Bloomington in the next to last game of the regular season. Foster recalls, "They were expected to repeat in the Big Ten and when we beat them on their home floor we knew we had a championship-caliber team. That really put us in great mental condition."

Gene Englund pointed out, "I really think the turning point of the season was the overtime game with Purdue. That's what turned the whole thing around for us as far as giving us the confidence we needed.

Kotz' three-point play in the waning moments of regulation sent the Purdue game into overtime with the teams tied at 38. Baskets by Englund, Kotz and

Alwin in the first two minutes of the extra period sparked the Badgers to a hard fought home court victory.

Wisconsin hosted the NCAA Eastern Regional—drawing 12,500 and 14,000 respectively—in defeating Dartmouth 51–50 and Pittsburgh 36–30 for the right to advance to the NCAA finals at Kansas City.

Englund, who was named the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player for 1941, and Kotz set the scoring pace against Dartmouth with 18 and 15 points respectively as the Badgers rallied time and again to earn the victory.

The Badgers earned a trip to Kansas City by defeating a stubborn Pittsburgh team 36–30 in the regional finals. Wisconsin rallied from a 23–18 deficit early in the second half to run off 10 consecutive points—six by Kotz—to assume a 28–23 lead, then increased the margin to 36–26 before the Panthers tallied two consolation baskets in the final moments of play.

It was on to Kansas City to meet Washington State.

Coach Foster had the foresight to scout the Cougars as he dispatched assistant coach Wegner to watch the finals of the Western playoffs between Washington State and Arkansas.

Wagner saw Paul Lindeman, a 6-7 center, tally 14 points as the Cougars dealt the heavily favored Arkansas team a 64-53 setback. Wegner observed, "We did a little rigging. We double-teamed him. We had a guy behind him so he couldn't get on the boards and a guy dropping in front of him so he couldn't get any passes." The men who did the dou-

ble-teaming were Englund and Kotz, who dropped off to front the big man, virtually shutting him off from his teammates. He finished the game with three points—all on free throws.

Wegner added, "We didn't go against any opponent blindly. I mean our team depended on it, because our players really believed in our game plans."

Actually, when the Badgers arrived in Kansas City, they were cast in the role of underdogs.

Observers felt the Badgers lacked the manpower and the ability to reach the heights acheived by Indiana the previous year. Many were concerned that Wisconsin could not match the Cougar rugged stretch which had come into play in handing Arkansas their lone defeat in the western final.

After early sparring, the Badgers took a 19–17 lead late in the first half and never gave it up. Leading 34–32 with three minutes to play, the Badgers wrapped up the verdict on a field goal by Kotz, a free throw by Ted Strain and a basket by Bob Alwin.

Kirk Gebert, a 5–11 guard, took advantage of the Badgers' emphasis on stopping Lindeman, and shooting almost at will from the outside, tallied 21 points for game honors. His scoring kept the Cougars always within striking distance of the Badgers.

One writer summed up the game as follows, "With Washington State it was run and shoot, shoot, shoot. With Wisconsin, it was pass, pass, pass and shoot."

Kotz was named the tournament's "Outstanding Player" as he supported Englund's 13 points with a dozen of his own.

Fred Wegner recalls, "There were our players walking down the middle of the street back to our hotel after the game carrying the four-foot high championship trophy. I remember one of the guys saying, 'Let's enjoy this because it'll be a long time before it happens again.' You know, he was right."

1940-41 Game Highlights

Ripon (W 39-20)—The Midwest Conference Champions tallied only three baskets.

Marquette (W 38-32)—The Hilltoppers used two men to guard Englund. John Kotz led the Wisconsin scoring with eight points. Englund and Bob Alwin had seven points each.

Notre Dame (W 44-43)-The Badgers led at halftime 22-20 and limited the Irish to three field goals in the first half. Kotz took the game scoring honors with 12, while Englund and Ed Riska of the Irish tallied 11 points each.

Pittsburgh (L 34-36)—Ed Stralowski's 19 points and Pitt held off a surging Wisconsin rally-the Badgers were down by eight points midway through the second half-to hand the Badgers their first defeat. Bob Alwin was the leading Wisconsin scorer with 12 points.

Marquette (L 30-40)—The Milwaukee Auditorium was not kind to the Badgers as captain Bill Komenich of the Golden Avalanche scored 17 points. It was a close first half, but the winners penetrated the Wisconsin defense at will in the second half. Englund with 12 and Ted Strain with eight points paced the Badgers.

Princeton (W 52-40)-Fred Rehm made his first appearance in the Badger starting lineup and Wisconsin's speed and finesse was too much for the Tigers uncanny accuracy from the outside.

Nebraska (W 46-31)—The Badgers capitalized on their height advantage and Englund and Kotz with 13 and 12 points, respectively, were deadly from short range. The Badgers held a 27-13 halftime lead.


Minnesota (L 27-44)-The Badgers went scoreless from the floor in the second half as the Gophers broke away from a 21-19 halftime margin to score an easy win. Coach Foster noted, "it was just one of those nights." It would be the last game the Badgers would lose all season.

Iowa (W 49-35)-The Badgers passed, shot and fairly swept the unbeaten Hawkeyes off the floor in gaining their first conference win. Englund's 18 points was his Big Ten best for the season.

Purdue (W 48-42 OT)—The Badgers rallied fiercely behind Bob Alwin and Charlie Epperson to tie the game at 33 after being down nine points. Kotz tallied five points in the remaining time for a 38-38 tie at the end of regulation. A pair of baskets by Ted Strain put the finishing touches on a 10-point Wisconsin surge in overtime.

Michigan (W 40-30)—Gene Englund's 11 points paced the offense, and his defensive play limited Michigan's Jim Mandler, the league's second leading scorer, to three points as the Badgers won their first road appearance since the Minnesota "debacle."

Chicago (W 44-37)-Englund's 17 points enabled the Badgers to take charge early and to withstand the challenge of an inspired Chicago team which went winless in conference play.

Ohio State (W 46-31)—The Badgers led 16-15 at halftime before outhustling and outscoring the unbeaten Buckeyes 30-16 in the second half in a perfect demonstration of the Wisconsin style of basketball. Englund's 16 points led the way and Ray Lenheiser added eight.

Butler (W 59-55)—Gene Englund's career-high 27 points enabled the Badgers to outduel a talented Bulldog team that stayed close all the way.


Northwestern (W 48-46 OT)—Another road test and the Badgers overcame a nine-point second half deficit to tie the game at the end of regulation time and win in overtime. Kotz led the scoring with 16 points while Englund was right behind with 15.

Illinois (W 46-30)—The Badgers got off to an early lead and the outcome was never in doubt against the Illini. Kotz and Englund set the scoring pace with 11 points each, but it was a team conquest as everyone made a significant contribution

Purdue (W 43-42)—The Badgers ended the Boilermakers title hopes with a one point verdict that featured the scoring of Englund (17) and Kotz (15). Don Blemker of Purdue was awarded a pair of free throws at game's end which could have tied the score if both were made, but he missed the first attempt and Wisconsin had gained its fourth road victory of the season.

Chicago (W 65-25)—Sixteen Wisconsin players broke into the scoring column with Englund leading the way with 17 points. It was the Badgers' ninth consecutive victory. Joe Stampf pace the losers with 13 points and went on to win the league scoring title 166-162 over Englund.

Indiana (W 38-30)—The Badgers invaded Hoosierland as the underdogs and handled the defending Big Ten and national champions with ease and finesse that baffled the home crowd. Englund (12) and Kotz (11) combined for 23 points as the Badgers took an early lead—20-12—at halftime and never looked back. It was Indiana's first defeat after 28 consecutive home victories.

Minnesota (W 42-32)—The Badgers avenged their only defeat of the conference seasopn before the largest crowd (14,000) to see the Badgers play in the Fieldhouse. Englund led the scoring with 13 points and Kotz, Epperson and Strain all chipped in with eight points. The win was Wisconsin's sixth in a row at home for the season.

NCAA EASTERN REGIONAL

Dartmouth (W 51-50)—In a battle of champions, the Badgers prevailed over the Ivy League (18-4) champions with rally after rally. Dartmouth led 24-22 at halftime, and held the advantage most of the second half until a burst of five points put the Badgers ahead 47-44 and they never lost the lead. A basket by Englund (16 points) and two free throws by Kotz (15) gave Wisconsin a 51-46 lead with a minute to play. Gus Broberg's 20 points for the losers paced the game's scoring.


Pittsburgh (W 36-30)—The Badgers won the game the hard way-the way they had all season by coming from behind in the second half, knotting the score, forging into the lead midway in the period and winning going away. Kotz (12) and Englund (11) paced the scoring.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Washington State (W 39-34)—The Badgers led at halftime 21-17 despite 11 points by the Cougars (13-3 in league play, 20-6 overall) Kirk Gebert who took the game honors with 21 points. Wisconsin broke away from a 24-24 tie early in the second half 🥌 to take a 30-24 lead and the outcome was never in doubt. Englund (13) and Kotz (12) set the scoring pace and Kotz was named the tournament's most valuable player.





University of Wisconsin–Madison



Wisconsin Chancellor

Dr. Donna E. Shalala



Dr. Donna E. Shalala is the first woman to lead the University of Wisconsin–Madison. She assumed her position of Chancellor and Professor of Political Science and Educational Policy Studies in January, 1988

One of Shalala's major goals has been rededicating the institution to the "Wisconsin Idea"—confirming a commitment to public service and social welfare, as well as an awareness that the borders of the university extend to the borders of the state and beyond.

Dedication to public service has been a trademark of Shalala's career. She spent two years in the Peace Corps, teaching English and working in community development. While a professor at Columbia University, Shalala served as a Director and Treasurer of the Municipal Assistance Corporation for the City of New York, the agency set up to help solve New York City's fiscal crisis.

Shalala earned her bachelor's degree from Western College for Women in Oxford, Ohio in 1962 and her doctoral degree from Syracuse in 1970. She has received 14 honorary degrees, and has been elected to the National Academy of Education and National Academy of Public Administration.

THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MADISON

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, one of the world's largest institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students assembled February 5, 1849. Today the university ranks as the fourth largest in the nation with 43,695 students, 11 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, 14,000 employees, five million volumes in 44 libraries and a \$1 billion budget. The university's national ranking of third in research and development expenditures supports its reputation as a world-class research institution.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. In what may be the most extensive survey ever done on graduate level education—the five volume Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States—Wisconsin finished eighth in the nation, tied with Michigan and UCLA.

More than 4,100 courses and 12,600 sections are offered at the UW. Majors are available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's and 123 doctor's and professional degree programs.

Some of the UW's departments ranked among the top ten in the nation in recent years include Sociology, Mathematics, Chemical Engineering, Economics, Political Science, Zoology, Geography, Statistics, History, Plant Pathlogy, Molecular Biology, Biochemistry, Spanish and German.




Much of the university's international academic reputation stems from the quality of its faculty. UW faculty or alumni have been awarded 11 Nobel Prizes, with Professor Howard Temin receiving the most recent prize in 1975 for his study of retroviruses.

The UW's Center for Health Sciences is one of the Midwest's leading centers for patient care, research and public service and education of physicians and other health professionals. It includes the professional schools of Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy; UW Hospitals and Clinics; the State Laboratory of Hygiene, UW Health Service; and the Wiscorsin Clinical Cancer Center—one of 21 designated cancer centers in the country.

The Elvehjem Museum of Art, the second largest art museum in the state, houses the university's collection of more than 10,000 paintings, prints, drawings, sculpture and decorative arts dating from 2300 B.C. to the present, and maintains an active schedule of temporary exhibits.

Athletic Director Pat Richter



Pat Richter ushered in a new era in University of Wisconsin athletics when he accepted the position of Athletic director on December 15, 1989.

"This has been the only university in my life," he said at his initital press conference. "Good things nappened to me here. Now I hope I can make it hapen for others."

One of the most distinguished athletes in UW history, Richter is committed to a proud Wisconsin the classroom and on the playing field.

"That commitment is to provide the student-athetes with a rewarding experience," Richter explained. You don't want them to leave here and say it's been four years and now I'm gone. When I left here 26 years ago, this was something that went with me for the rest of my life.

"This is a tremendous opportunity for me," he added. "It's exciting to be a part of a program that is going in the right direction. We intend to build the Visconsin athletic program to the level of excellence of the rest of the university."

"Pat Richter is one of Wisconsin's greatest sports leroes, a UW Law School graduate, a successful husinessman with strong leadership qualities and a man of complete integrity," commented UW-Madison hancellor Donna E. Shalala. "He is a wonderful role model for all of our student-athletes."

A 48-year-old native of Madison, Richter has been on a cross-country whirlwind of speaking ngagements, promotional events, booster outings, appearances at civic functions and administrative meetings during his first year at the helm. He is in constant demand, and is a shining symbol of the pnewed enthusiasm surrounding UW Athletics.

One of Richter's first assignments as athletic director was to hire the best football coach he could find. He accomplished that impressively with the naming of highly-touted Barry Alvarez in January, 1990.

His first year at the helm has witnessed an NCAA ice hockey championship, the running exploits of all-America and NCAA champion Suzy Favor and trip to London, England and the Henley Regatta for he Badgers' national championship varsity crew team.

Clearly, Wisconsin Athletics are on the upswing. And with Pat Richter at the controls, the decade of the 1990's promises great things for Badger sports fans everywhere.

As a 6–6, 230-pound student athlete at Wisconsin, Richter excelled in football, basketball and baseball. He earned three varsity letters in each, and still stands as the school's last nine-time letterwinner. He achieved all-America (1961, 1962), academic all-America (1962), and all-Big Ten (1961, 1962) honors in football as an end, helping the Badgers to the 1962 Big Ten championship and a berth in the memorable 1963 Rose Bowl game vs USC—a game in which he set the current Rose Bowl record of 11 pass receptions for 163 yards. Richter led the Big Ten in pass receiving in both 1961 and 1962 and ranks third on the school's career receiving list with 110 catches for 1,710 yards and 14 touchdowns. After his senior football season, he was the recipient

of the UW's 1963 Big Ten Medal of Honor (for proficiency in scholarship and athletics), received the Knute Rockne Memorial Award as the country's top lineman from the Washington Touchdown Club and was selected to play in both the *Chicago Tribune* All-Star and Hula Bowl postseason games.

As an outfielder for the Wisconsin baseball team, he earned first team all-Big Ten honors in 1963, owned a career batting average of .353 and led the Badgers in hits, home runs and RBI three consecutive years. In one game during the 1962 season, he hit two home runs against eventual NCAA champion Michigan, including a two-run blast with two out in the final inning. Richter, in fact, once said that he thought baseball might have been his best sport. And somewhat ironically, he originally went to the UW on a basketball scholarship.

Richter earned his Bachelor of Science degree in

landscape architecture from in 1964 and was interested in becoming a golf course architect.

Following his collegiate career, he was a first round draft choice of the Washington Redskins and played as both an end and a punter from 1963–71. He caught three touchdown passes from Sonny Jurgensen in their 1968 season opener against the Chicago Bears. In 1969, he played under legendary coach Vince Lombardi, later recalling it as "perhaps my greatest learning experience in terms of how to look at the realities of life itself."

Richter earned his law degree from Wisconsin in 1971 and retired from professional football in September of that year.

Richter spent the next six months with a Madison law firm, then went to work with Oscar Mayer Foods Corporation until returning to the UW campus as athletic director last December. With Oscar Mayer, he held positions at offices in Madison, Nashville, and Rye Brook and White Plains, New York. Most recently, he served as Vice-President, Personnel at the company's head office in Madison.

In January of 1988, he was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for his post-college achievements. In November of 1988 he was inducted into the Wisconsin State Athletic Hall of Fame. He is a member of the American Bar Association, the NFL Player and Alumni Associations and the Madison Sports Hall of Fame. He assists in fund-raising for local children's charities and the UW Children's Hospital, and works with the Four Lakes Boy Scouts.



Associate Athletic Director


Alan Fish begins his first year as administrative officer with the UW Athletic Department after being named interim finance officer in March, 1989.

Former NFL kicker Jim Bakken is in his first year in the UW Athletic Department as an associate athletic director in charge of external relations.

Bakken spent 17 years with the then St. Louis Cardinals as a placekicker. He is currently the fifth leading scorer in NFL history with 1,380 points. He kicked seven field goals in one game against Pittsburgh in 1967 to set an NFL record that still stands today, though it was tied in 1989. He was a four-time Pro Bowl selection during his career.

From 1984–88, he served as the athletic director at St. Louis University. Prior to that, he worked at Sports Network Inc., a radio syndication company in St. Louis.

Wisconsin Fieldhouse





The Wisconsin Fieldhouse is the home of the Badgers. The building was a project of then athletic director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin in 1925. In 1930, it became a reality.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board after two previous attempts had failed.

The original layout included a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385,000.

The intercollegiate portion of the facility housed the men's and women's basketball teams and the wrestling squad. Its construction, completed in 1931, cost approximately \$434,000.

The structure remains a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The field-house originally contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and room for indoor football and baseball training.

The football, track and field and baseball teams moved to the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center, "the Shell," upon its completion in 1956.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved \$718,000 for the renovation of the field-nouse. The project was aimed at improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be held in the building.

Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south and west sides of the court with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 11,886. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west side seats and the existing locker rooms were renovated.

A new lighting system was added in 1977 along with an improved sound system.

The UW Fieldhouse is the site of the WIAA boys' and girls' state basketball tournaments, the WIAA state wrestling tournament, Big Ten Championship gymnastics' meets, live music concerts and numerous other events.
