# COVERING THE BADGERS

## PRESS ROW:

Wisconsin's working facilities for press-radio-television are located on the west side of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

## WORKING TICKETS:

All Requests for Press Row tickets must be placed with the Sports Information Office. Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pick-up at the Press Will Call window at Gate 2. Working press tickets contain assigned seat locations. Telecopier service will be available to members of the working press by the appropriate servicing organizations.

## RADIO:

Each station admitted for broadcasting will be issued three tickets. Radio facilities are located in the second balcony of the west side. Tickets are mailed upon acceptance. If tickets are not mailed, they may be picked up in advance at the Sports Information Office, or from the Press Will Call window.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS:

Floor passes are limited to daily newspaper, wire service, and television photographers. Photographers may work from either the north or south ends and the west side of the court.

## PARKING:

A limited number of parking passes for Lots 18 and 19 are available to working people only. They will be issued as requested.

## PLAYER INTERVIEWS:

Media representatives may interview Wisconsin players in the Reinke Room after each game in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse following interviews of both coaches.

Give the names of players you wish to interview to Coach Yoder when he has completed his post-game interview. Players will be available for interviews on Monday afternoon, or on the day following a game (except Sundays) from 2:15 to 2:45 p.m. in the Reinke Room.

All interviews are to be completed by 2:45 p.m. Practice starts at 2:45 p.m. each day and ends at 5:15 p.m.

## COACHES INTERVIEWS:

Steve Yoder will meet with media representatives following each game after a short cooling off period in the Reinke Room of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

Best time to talk with Coach Yoder is from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon in his office, or by telephone. He will be available for TV interview prior to practice from 2:15 to 2:30 p.m. in the Fieldhouse. Please conduct the interview near the Reinke Room.

Please call the Sports Information Office (608-262-1811) in advance and we'll assist you in obtaining your interviews with Coach Yoder and the players.

**Jim Mott** is a Madison native and has B.A. degrees in Zoology and Journalism from the University of Wisconsin. As an undergraduate, he served as Wisconsin's basketball team manager for four years, earning a major "W" award for his work.

**Jim** is a past president of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the Madison Pen and Mike Club. He was named to

the CoSIDA Hall of Fame in 1979.

He and his wife **Dorothy** are the parents of three sons — **William**, 23, **David**, 20, and **Eric**, 18.

**Bob Leu** joined Wisconsin's Athletic Department staff as Radio-TV Director in September, 1973 from WHA-TV where he had served as producer-director and director of sports.

He and his wife **Janis** are parents of daughters **Dawn**, 26, **Amie**, 23 and son **Adam**, 14.

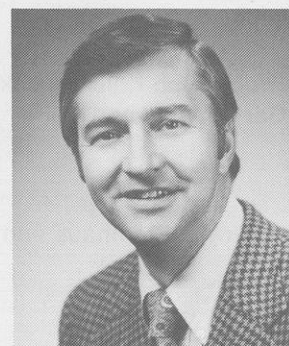
**Bob** is a past president of the Madison Pen and Mike Club.

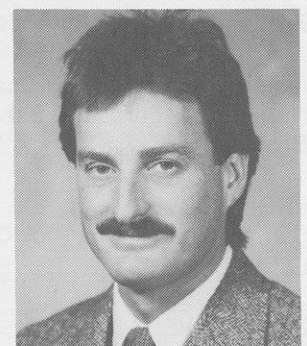

# 1985-86 WISCONSIN BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

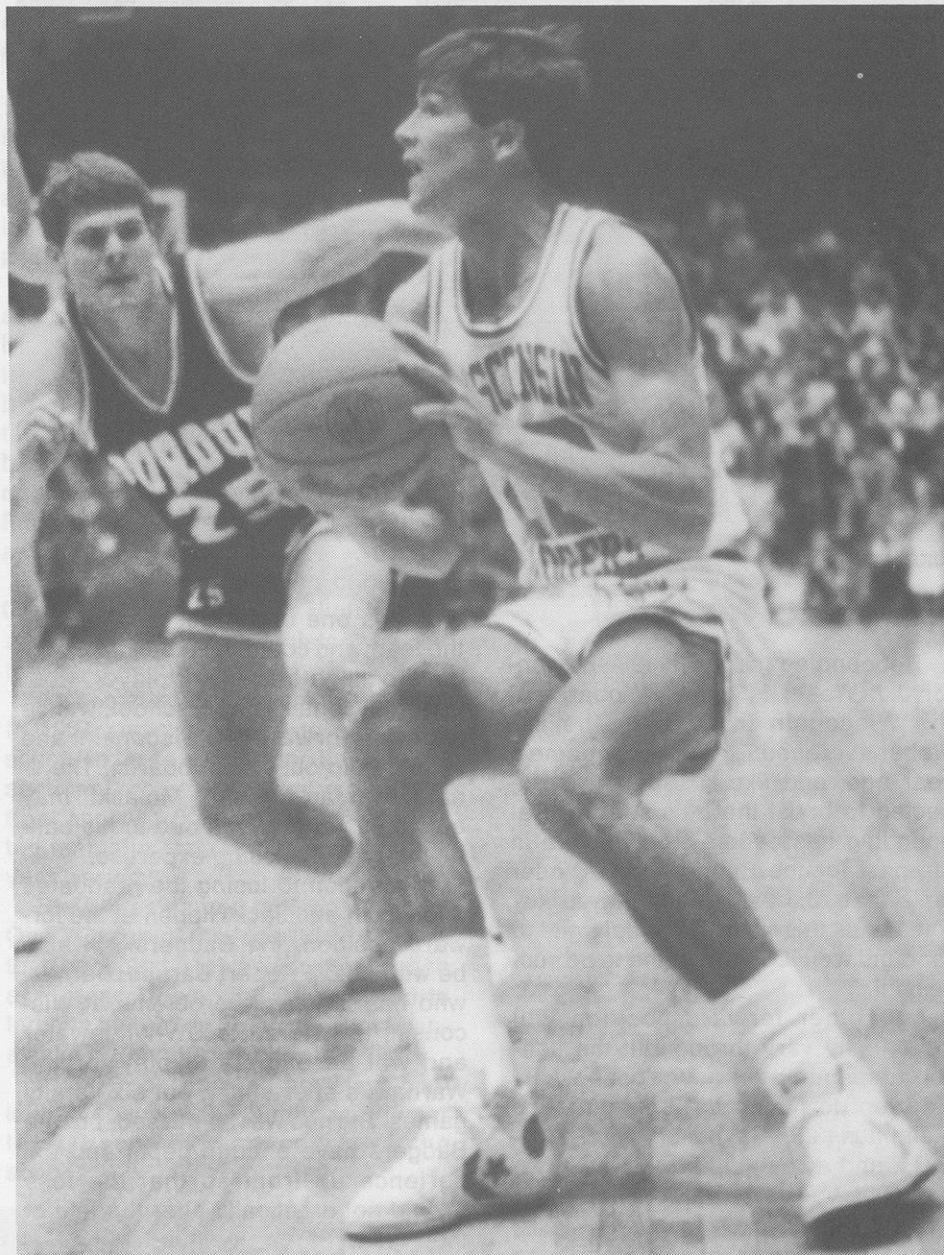
## OVERVIEW

Fourth-year coach Steve Yoder has a problem this season with his 1985-86 Badgers. The problem, however, is one that most coaches would love to have. You see, Yoder has such depth and versatility in his players that he just doesn't know who to give the starting honors to. Wisconsin had its best finish under Yoder last year at an even 14-14, and with the personnel the Badgers have back for the 1985-86 campaign, they look to improve on that in the upcoming season. Yoder says of his squad, "We have a lot of hungry young men on this team . . . guys that really want to play and win." With that determined attitude dominant over its team members, Wisconsin should prove to move upwards in the Big Ten standings from its ninth-place finish a year ago.

## GUARDS

Senior Rick Olson will lead the Badger scoring attack from the backcourt this season. The 6-1 Madison native was second on the team last year behind a graduated Scott Roth with a 16.7 ppg average, and could very well improve on that as he has in every other year at Wisconsin. A four-year starter at guard, Olson received honorable mention accolades in 1985 and is a legitimate candidate for more prestigious honors this year. As opponents around the conference will attest, when Olson gets hot, he is virtually impossible to shut down.

Joining Olson at the guard spot is junior Mike Heineman. At 6-3, Heineman led the team in assists (111) and steals (33), was second in rebounding (4.7), and was fourth in scoring (7.2). Heineman is an extremely aggressive player and good rebounder, thus may be used to match up on opponents' frontcourt players if Yoder opts to go with more than two guards. Mike's scoring punch has been overshadowed in the past by more prolific Badger scorers, but this could be the year that he starts filling the hoop more. "Mike is a good outside shooter,"



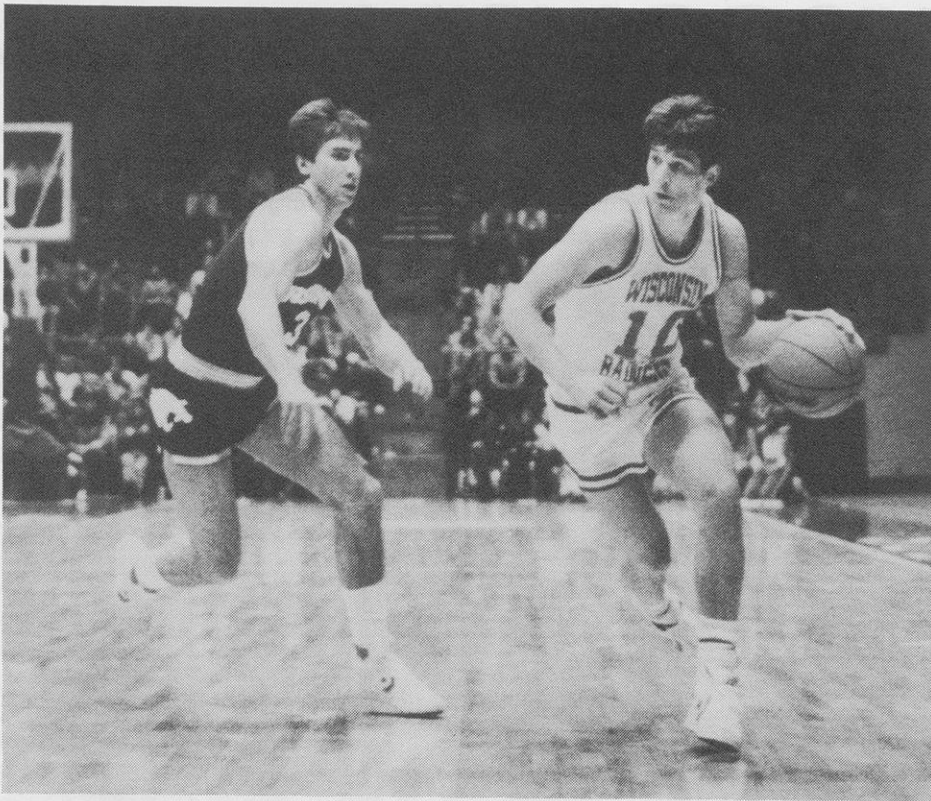

states Yoder, "and will definitely be looked at to contribute more in the offense this season."

Recipient of the 1985 Ed Schmitz Freshman Achievement Award, Shelton Smith comes off an impressive rookie season and should find himself with even more court time this year. According to Yoder, the 6-0 sophomore will be hard to keep out of the starting line-up. "He's really com-

ing on, and certainly showed a lot of poise as a freshman. Shelton will be a good ballplayer for us." Newcomer Trent Jackson, a prep standout at Bolingbrook, IL High School, also has a good shot at seeing substantial playing time in the backcourt. Jackson is a solid 6-1, 185-pound freshman who, as Yoder puts it, "is not going to be intimidated on the court and is on all counts ready to play."





MIKE HEINEMAN

#### FORWARD

Rebounding leader in 1984-85, junior J.J. Weber is back to spearhead the Wisconsin front line. The 6-7 Weber averaged 7.4 points per game a year ago, and like Heineman, is expected to boost that this season. Rebounding has been a trouble area in the past for the Badgers, thus Yoder feels that "J.J. will really play a key role for us this year. He simply has to rebound well if we are going to be successful."

The other forward position will most likely vary throughout the season, depending on how Yoder wants his team to match up. Senior Gregg Steinhaus (3.5, 1.9), a 6-8 shooting forward, and a vastly improved junior in Rod Ripley (6-7, 2.7, 2.5) should contend for that spot. Steinhaus is a pure shooter and will be used primarily as a zone-breaker. Ripley, on the other hand, is a physical defensive ace as he proved last year, most notably against Iowa's Greg Stokes. "Rip" can be used as a center on defense and has made positive strides in his offensive play, both in shooting and in passing.

Three freshman newcomers in 6-9 Rob Willey (Neenah), 6-7 Pollis Robertson (Wayne, MI - Memorial), and 6-6 Tom Molaski (Grafton), could also find themselves bidding for action.

Willey is one of the best athletes on the team and could develop into a very good college basketball player. Robertson, a center in high school, will be a power forward at Wisconsin and should help out on the boards. The final freshman forward, Molaski, may also be used at guard due to his ball-handling and passing expertise.

In addition to losing the graduated Scott Roth and Jack Hippen at the forward position, the Badgers will also be without 6-8 Robert Barnes. Barnes, who had academic problems at Wisconsin, transferred to UW-Whitewater and will be eligible to play for the Warhawks after sitting out six varsity games. Barnes will be missed, but the Badgers have enough depth and experience up front so that the loss should not drastically alter the fate of their team.

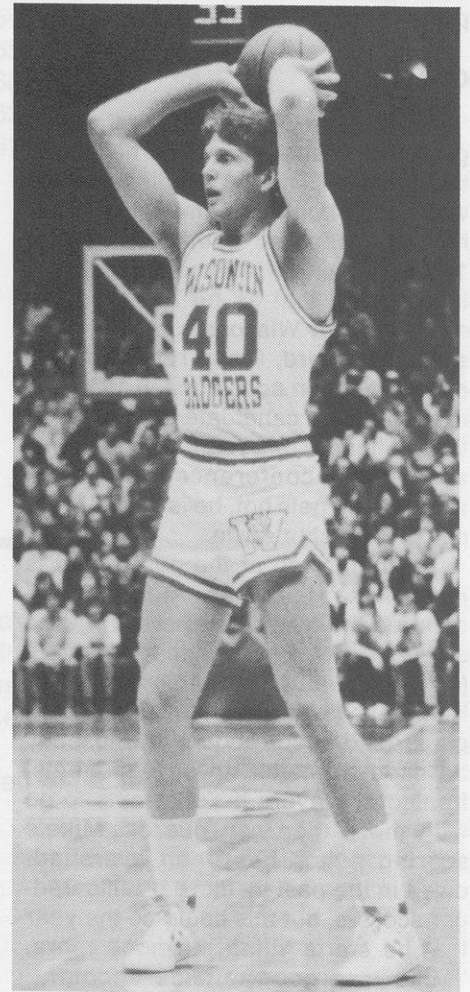
#### CENTER

The Badgers have only two players on the roster listed as playing the post, senior Jay Laszewski and freshman Darin Schubring (Baraboo). Like the guard and forward situation, Yoder may choose to use both or neither of the big men in the line-up, dependent upon opponents' offenses and defenses. Laszewski was plagued by mononucleosis last season, reducing his playing time and thus his statistics.

However, Jay has a good shooting touch, and with three years of Big Ten experience behind him, "Las" is expected to contribute much more this year. The incoming Schubring is built bigger than Laszewski at 6-9, 225 pounds and could very well challenge him for playing time. Wisconsin has not gotten much scoring from the middle in recent years, but the Badger coaching staff sincerely believes that Schubring is capable of changing that trend in the near future.

#### WRAP UP

With all the different looks and possibilities this Badger team is capable of, this might well be Coach Yoder's finest year at Wisconsin. The Badgers have improved upon their conference record in each of Yoder's three years at the helm, and considering all the depth and versatility this team possesses, one can expect a continuation of that in 1986. A blend of three seniors, three juniors, one sophomore, and five freshmen make up a Wisconsin basketball team destined to succeed in 1985-86.

# HEAD COACH STEVE YODER



Steve Yoder was named Wisconsin's 10th head basketball coach in mid-April of 1982. Since taking the helm at Wisconsin, Yoder has compiled a 30-54 record, and has improved upon his conference record in each of his three years with the Badgers. Under his guidance in 1984-85, Wisconsin ended the year at 14-14, its best finish in five years.

He came to Madison from Ball State University where he had compiled a five year record of 77-62 as head coach and was named the Mid-American Conference "Coach-of-the-Year" for both the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons. The 1980-81 Ball State team shared the MAC title with three other schools and gained an NCAA tourna-

ment berth by winning the conference's post-season tournament.

Ball State compiled an overall 17-11 record during the 1981-82 season, including a 12-4 conference record that gave them the MAC championship. The Cardinals lost to Northern Illinois 79-75 in overtime in the MAC post-season tournament title game.

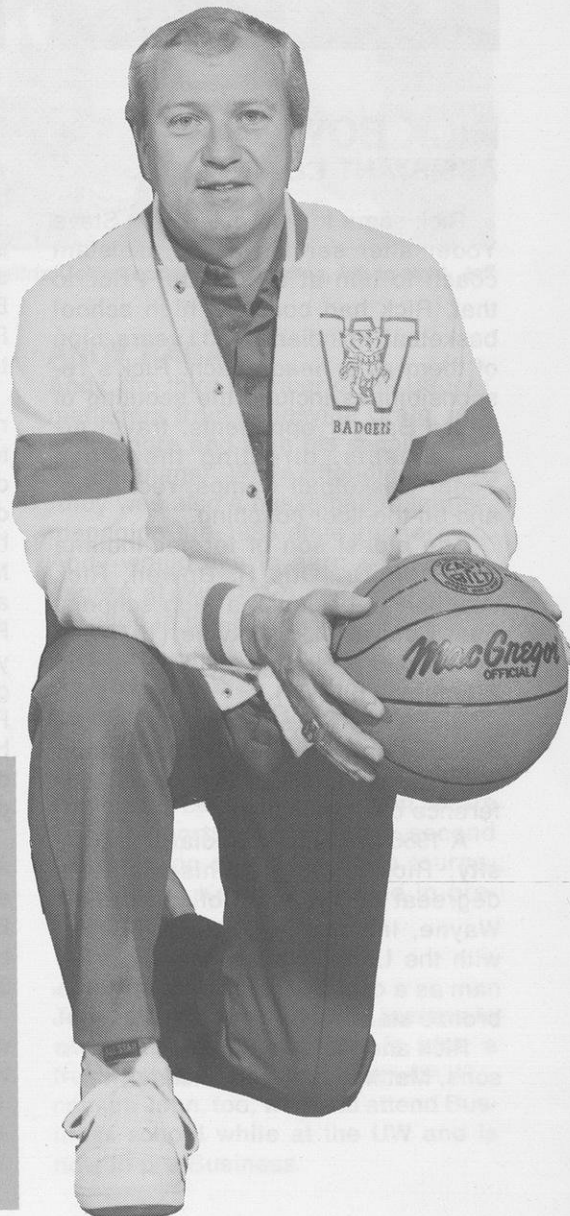
Steve is a native of Plymouth, Indiana and a 1958 graduate of Plymouth High School. He attended Illinois Wesleyan University on a basketball and baseball scholarship, winning four letters in baseball and two in basketball before graduating in 1962. He received his master's degree from St. Francis College in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1970.

He began his coaching career at Glen Ellyn, Illinois, Junior High School and in 1965 took an assistant's position at Plymouth, Indiana.

He became head coach at Plymouth in 1967 and proceeded to guide the school to three conference titles, three sectional crowns, a pair of regional titles, and two finishes among the top ten teams in state rankings over a six year period.

Steve was named Indiana's District One "Coach-of-the-Year" in 1973 and then accepted a job as assistant coach at Furman University. He returned to Indiana in 1975 as head coach at Mishawaka's Penn High School.

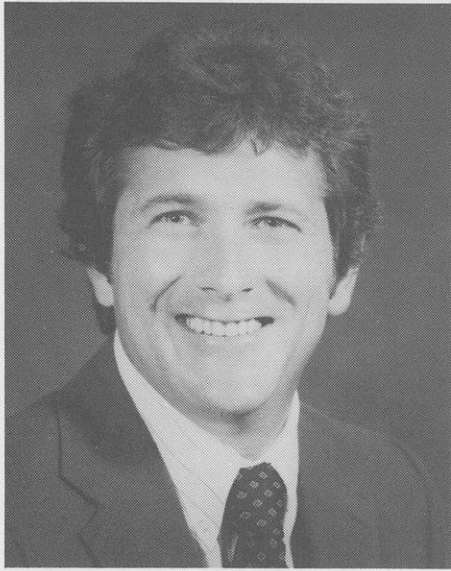
In 1976, he became assistant basketball coach at Ball State and a year later became head coach at the school.

ASSISTANT COACH

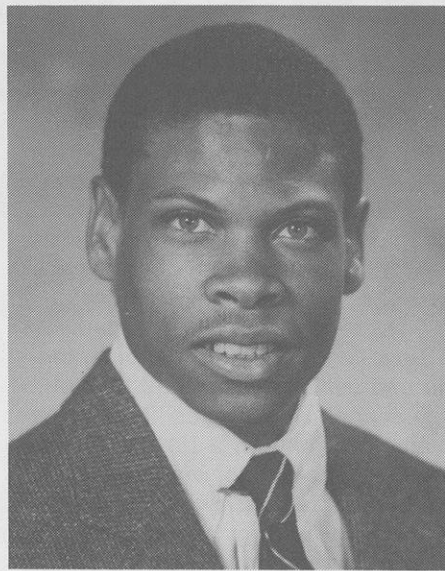

Rick and his wife Sandra have two sons, Matthew, 14, and Michael, 11.



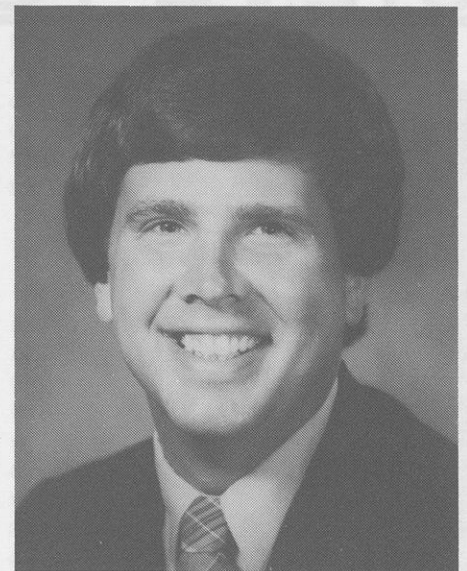
**RAY McCALLUM**

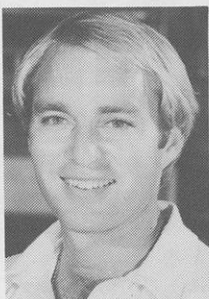

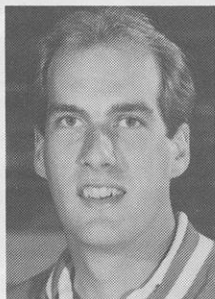

# ATHLETIC DIRECTOR ELROY HIRSCH



ELROY HIRSCH

**Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch** is in his 17th year—longest tenure in the school's history—as Wisconsin's Director of Athletics and he's the guiding force behind one of the finest athletic programs for men and women in the United States today.

Wisconsin's men's and women's athletic programs have consistently ranked in the Big Ten's first division during his tenure over the past 15 years.

The Wausau native came back to Wisconsin — where he gained collegiate fame as a star sophomore running back in leading the Badgers to a No. 3 ranking during the 1942 football season — from the Los Angeles Rams on February 28, 1969.

His original appointment as athletic director — slated to end in 1979 — was first extended in 1974 by the school's athletic board through June 30, 1984, and again in April, 1979 through June 30, 1988 by Chancellor Irving Shain upon recommendation of the Athletic Board.

**His career has been one of success.**

Wisconsin fans, especially the older generation, remember him as a triple threat halfback on **Harry Stuhl-**

**dreher's** 1942 football team that won eight games, lost only to Iowa, and tied Notre Dame.

**Hirsch's** play as a 19-year-old sophomore on Wisconsin's 1942 football team carried the Badgers to the brink of the national championship. The Wausau native rushed for 766 yards on 141 carries — his best was 174 yards on 22 attempts vs. Missouri — and his overall contribution added 226 yards passing, 390 yards on receptions and runbacks of punts, kickoffs, and interceptions plus nine touchdowns, five by rushing and four by passing.

He played at Michigan in 1943, as a Marine trainee, and he not only played football, but also basketball, track and baseball. He won his "M" in each sport, the only athlete ever to accomplish such a feat at Michigan.

He had a successful professional football career, first as a halfback with the Chicago Rockets of the post-war All-American Conference, and later with the Los Angeles Rams for nine seasons as one of the all-time great ends.

It was at Los Angeles that "**Crazylegs**" was to attain new heights in his career. The Rams, in transition to the modern passing game, often split him wide as a receiver and finally moved him permanently to end — establishing him as the first flanker.

**Hirsch** was one of the athletes — like **Otto Graham** and **Sam Huff** and **Gino Marchetti** — who brought special talents to the sport in the 1950's as it changed from two-way players to offensive and defensive specialists under free substitution.

In 1951, **Hirsch** displayed all his talents as he put together one of the finest seasons in National Football League history. He gained 1,495 yards on receptions, an all-time record approached only by **Bobby Mitchell** of the Washington Redskins (1,436 yards in 1963) and **Hirsch** had only twelve games to set the record, not 14 like **Mitchell!**

That same season **Hirsch** caught 17 touchdown passes to tie the league

record set by **Don Hutson** of the Packers in 1942. He also caught at least one touchdown pass through 11 consecutive games over the 1950 and 1951 seasons.

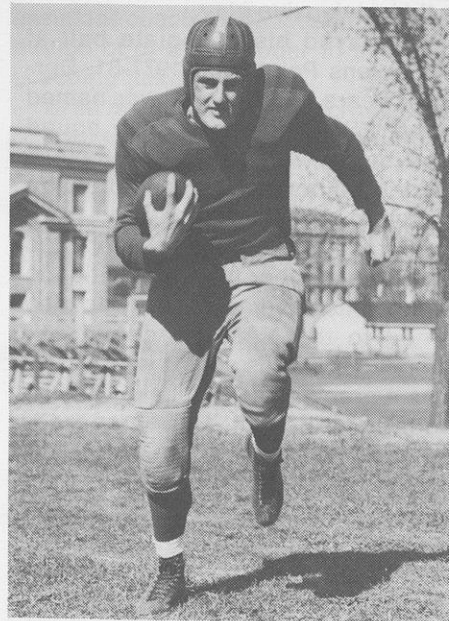
**Elroy** compiled a total of 343 passes caught for 6,299 yards and 53 touchdowns during his career with the Rams before retiring from NFL play following the 1957 season.

He was a successful executive with the Rams, first as general manager of the team, and later assistant to the president of the team, a job he relinquished to accept the job as Wisconsin athletic director.

He's been named to the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame (1965), to professional football's Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio (1968), to the National Football Hall of Fame in New York (1974), and to the Madison Sports Hall of Fame (1977).

He's also a member of the all-time NFL All-Star team for his play as end and flanker during his nine year career with the Los Angeles Rams.

**Elroy and his wife, Ruth**, are the parents of son **Win Stephen**, Los Angeles, and daughter **Patricia Caroline**, a recent University of Wisconsin graduate.

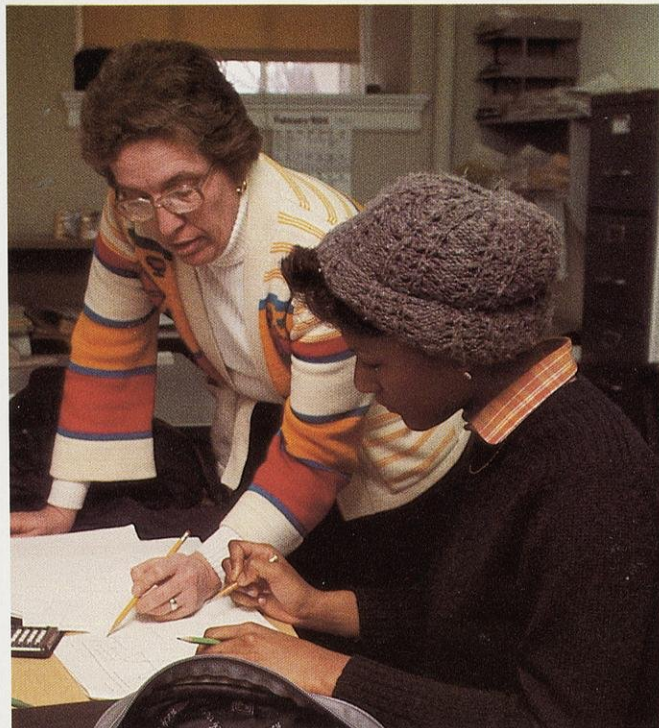


The prestige of the faculty also contributes heavily to the reputation. Three UW faculty members have won Nobel Prizes, the last being cancer researcher Howard Temin in 1975; and seven former students or faculty members went on to win Nobels after leaving the University. The University of Wisconsin also is home to more "most-cited" scientists than any campus other than Stanford or Harvard, according to a national study.

But the most quantifiable evidence of academic reputation comes from national opinion surveys, where the University of Wisconsin consistently ranks near the top.

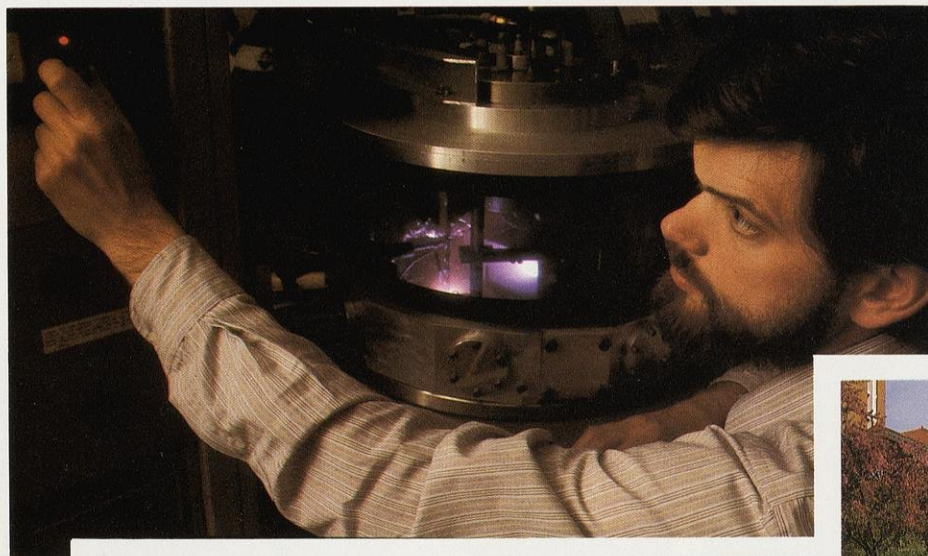
The most comprehensive survey of graduate education in the United States — the "Assessment of Research Doctorate Programs in the United States" (1982) — polled 5,000 faculty members and rated 228 universities in a 1982 study. That survey listed the University of Wisconsin as the eighth best graduate school in the nation. Those rated ahead of the UW included California-Berkeley, and private institutions Stanford, Harvard, Yale, MIT, Princeton and the University of Chicago.



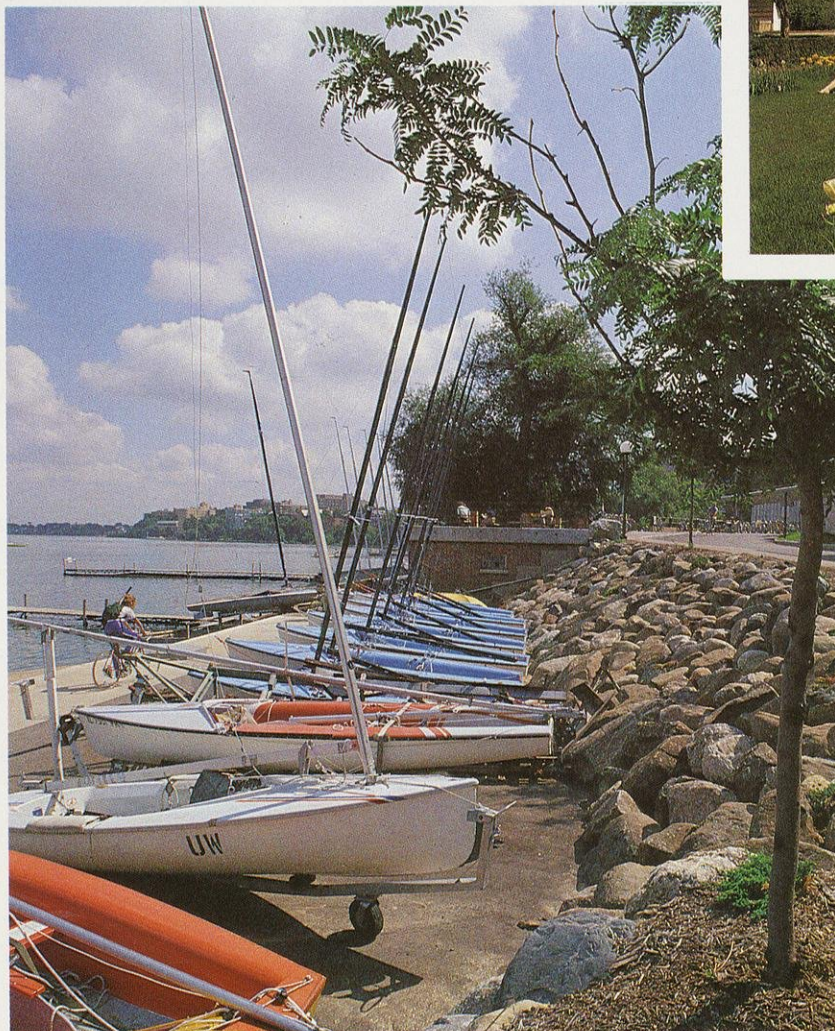


Wisconsin's undergraduate teaching also is highly regarded. The national Gourman Report, published in 1983, ranked 49 University of Wisconsin departments among the country's top ten for undergraduates. In addition, the latest figures compiled by the National Science Foundation put the UW third among all U.S. universities in total funding spent for research and development. The UW's expenditures in those areas totalled \$158 million for fiscal year 1982, behind only John Hopkins and MIT.

Some 4,000 different courses are offered at Wisconsin. Majors are available in more than 149 bachelor's, 188 master's and 121 doctor's degrees programs. A few of Wisconsin's recent rankings included first in Dairy Science, seconds in education, microbiology, zoology, agriculture and physical education, fourth in foreign languages and sociology, fifth in history, sixth in chemistry, seventh in mathematics, and eighth in engineering and political science.



The University of Wisconsin has its own nuclear reactor, one of the finest textile collections in the country, a building in which nearly every conceivable environmental condition can be simulated, a collection of more than 1,700 United Artists Corporation movies from 1919-51, produces its own dairy products (including 75 flavors of ice cream), and a mastodon skeleton.

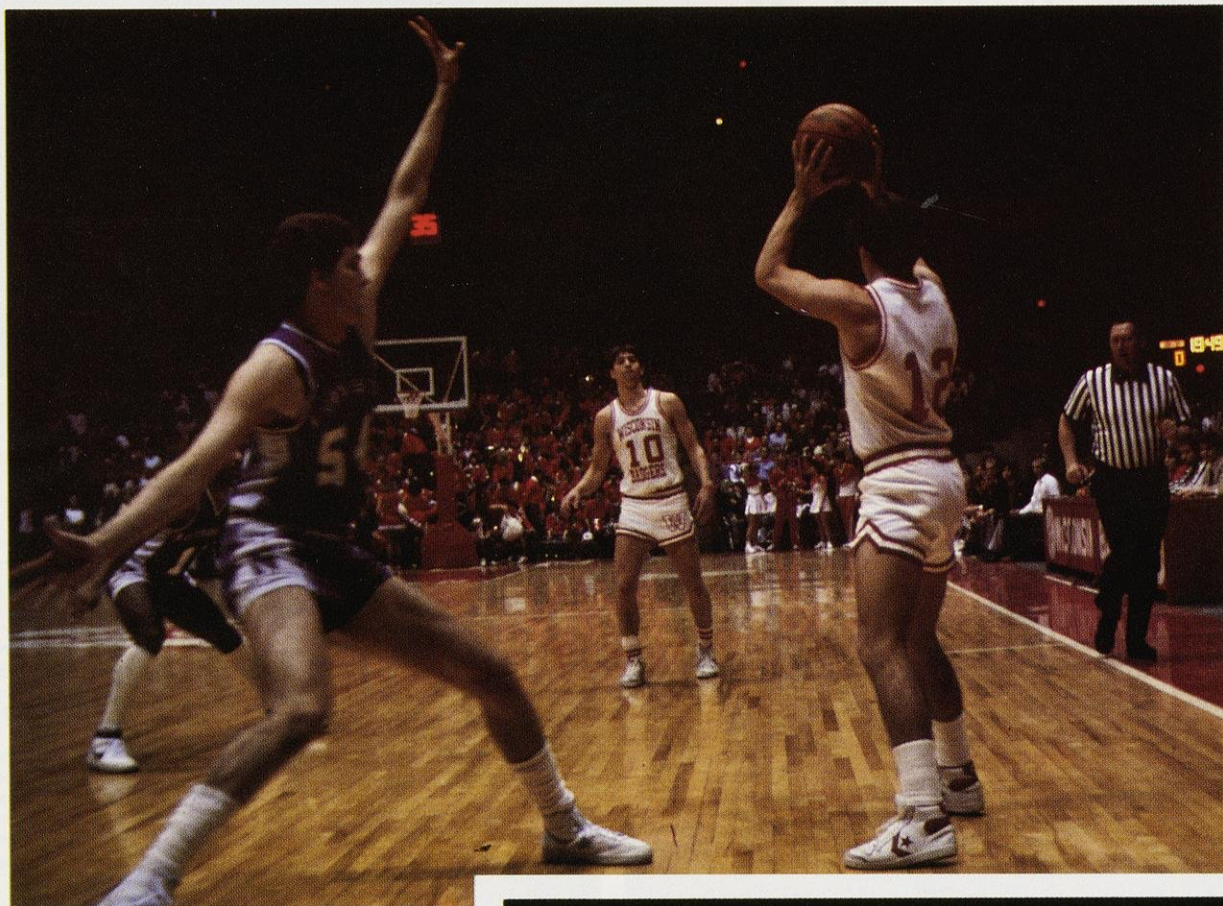

## ILLINI OUTLOOK

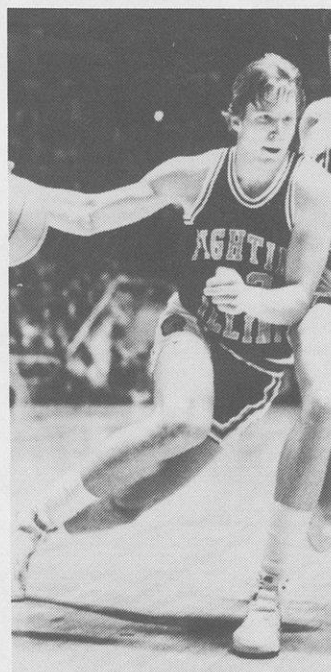

# THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN FIELDHOUSE



The Wisconsin Fieldhouse was a project of then Athletic Director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin in 1925 and it became a reality in 1930.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board, after two previous attempts had failed; one of those having passed the legislature only to be vetoed by Governor Zimmerman.

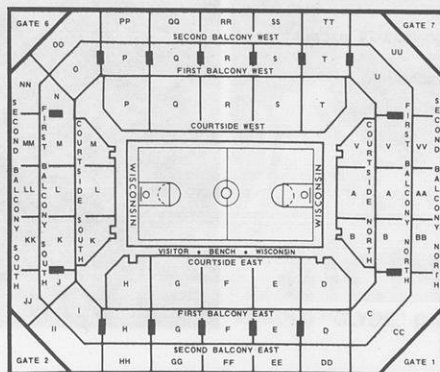
The original layout had contemplated a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385,000.

This intercollegiate portion is represented in the present facility that houses both the basketball teams and wrestling squad. Its actual cost was somewhat more than the estimated totaling \$434,000 with construction completed in September of 1931.

The structure would be a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The fieldhouse contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and

room for indoor football and baseball training.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved the \$718,000 for the renovation of the fieldhouse. The project was aimed mainly to improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be presented in the building. Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south, and west sides of the court with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 12,204. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west side seats and the existing locker rooms were renovated. A new lighting system was added in 1977, and a new sound system has just been completed to make the Wisconsin Fieldhouse one of the best facilities of its kind in the Big Ten.
