

THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

The University of Wisconsin, one of the world's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students assembled February 5, 1849. Today, the University of Wisconsin includes 13 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, more than 45,000 students and 14,000 employees, nearly 4,000,000 volumes in 22 libraries, a \$750,000,000 budget, and research and development expenditures totalling \$185,000,000 (third largest in the U.S.).

Wisconsin has ranked among the top ten universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. Combining the results of seven major ratings since 1925, Prof. David Webster of the University of Pennsylvania, writing for the June, 1983 Change magazine, ranked the University of Wisconsin fourth

The UW's international activities extend the boundaries of the campus to all parts of the globe. The campus has about 3,600 foreign students from 125 countries, offers some 50 foreign languages for study, and has the largest overall number of international studies faculty and largest number of faculty of any university in East Asian, South and Southeast Asian, African and Latin American studies. Junior year abroad programs are offered for students going to Brazil, China, England, France, West Germany, Hungary, Israel, India, Italy, Spain, Sweden, Norway, Nepal, Thailand and Mexico and Quebec for summer study.


The UW's Center for Health Sciences is one of the Midwest's leading centers for patient care, education of physicians and other health professionals, research and public service. It includes the Medical, Nursing, Pharmacy, and Allied Health Professions schools; UW Hospital and Clinics; State Laboratory of Hygiene; UW Health Service; and Wisconsin Clinical Cancer Center - one of 21 designated cancer centers in the country.

More than 400 campus organizations offer a wide variety of activities for Wisconsin students - including social, political, philosophic or religious, sports, honorary, ecological, philanthropic, drama and music groups plus fraternities and sororities. Film societies show 400 titles a year, and the intramural recreation program services some 35,000 students and staff at five indoor recreational facilities every month.

Freshly fallen snow highlites historic Agriculture Hall. in the nation - behind Harvard, California-Berkeley and Yale, and tied with the University of Chicago. More than 4,100 courses and 12,600 sections were offered in the fall of 1986. Majors were available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's, and 123 doctor's degree programs. UW departments ranked among the top

ten in the nation in the 1983 Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States include Sociology (1st), German, Chemical Engineering and Geography (2nd), Statistics (4th), Plant Pathology, Molecular Biology and Biochemistry (5th), Spanish and Portuguese (6th), Zoology (7th), Political Science, Chemistry and Economics (8th), Mathematics (9th), and History (10th).



1987-88 WISCONSIN BASKETBALL OUTLOOK ONLY THE STRONG SURVIVE



"The Big Ten is probably the toughest conference in the country and will be even stronger this season."

Surviving in the frozen tundra of the great white north might be easier than enduring a basketball conference that lives by two principles.

1 - No blood, no foul.

2 - Only the strong survive.

In a conference where Wolverines, Hawkeyes and Wildcats are ready to attack, the Wisconsin Badgers must be prepared for one of the most challenging 28game schedules in the country.

1986-87 RECORD: 14-17 Overall; 4-14 Big Ten (8th)

"The Big Ten is probably the toughest conference in the country and will be even stronger this season," said Wisconsin Head Coach Steve Yoder. "We think our team will be better than a year ago, but everyone in the conference has also improved."

Last season, the Badgers clawed their way through a demanding 31-game slate. That schedule included a stretch of four

games in ten days against teams ranked in the top ten in the country. The Badgers faced the sixth-toughest schedule in the country according to a survey prepared for Basketball Times.

The Big Ten placed five teams in the survey's top ten and all ten conference teams ranked in the top 36. Through it all, Wisconsin earned the respect of its opponents.

Yoder faces the challenge of replacing three starters and one key reserve from last season's rugged unit which posted a 14-17 mark.

The departure of Mike Heineman (288 points, 127 rebounds), Rod Ripley (182, 149), Shelton Smith, Jr. (356, 54) and J. J. Weber (469, 251), represents a loss of 59 percent of the scoring and 59 percent of the rebounding from last year's team.

Guards (2): Mike Heineman (6-3, 10.3, 4.5), Shelton Smith, Jr. (6-0, 11.5, 1.7) Despite the personnel losses, opponents can no longer think of the Badgers as easy prey. Yoder has earned the respect of his colleagues with his bench coaching and his ability to field tough, competitive teams.

"There's no way we can survive our schedule, night in and night out, if we don't come ready to play," Yoder said. "Especially when we begin our conference schedule, it's a matter of only the strong survive. In a conference with a reputation for physical basketball, we won't back down from anyone."

BACKCOURT: READY TO ATTACK

Wisconsin's strength in '87-88 will be its guard corps. With eight players on the team able to play a variety of backcourt positions, the Badgers are armed with many weapons to attack opponent's defenses.

Junior **TRENT JACKSON** (6-1/180/12.5 ppg/1.3 rpg) leads the perimeter attack as the Badgers' leading returning scorer. Jackson blossomed as an offensive threat during the 1987 Big Ten season and scored in double figures in the Badgers' final 14 Big Ten games (18.7 ppg). A threat to score from anywhere on the floor, he led the team and finished eighth in the Big Ten in conference only scoring with 16.4 ppg.

While Jackson is known for his scoring, he also has the defensive skills to match. Using his 180-pound frame, he is able to muscle opposing guards. He also has a 39-inch vertical leap and was second on the team in steals.

The leading candidate to replace Heineman as the team's floor general is junior **TOM MOLASKI** (6-6/200/3.0 ppg/2.5 apg/2.0 rpg). A co-captain this season, Molaski showed his toughness when he survived 53 minutes in last year's triple overtime loss to Indiana.

An aggressive player with cat-like quickness and leaping ability, **RODNEY TAPP** (6-0/2.3 ppg) will challenge for a starting role. Also a co-captain, Tapp is expected to provide leadership as the team's only senior.

Sophomore **SEAN FLEMING** (6-2/1.8 ppg) and 6-5 redshirt freshman **BYRON ROBINSON** will duel the upperclassmen for playing time. Fleming should contribute as a point guard after being slowed by injuries last season. Robinson has exhibited good defensive skills and will challenge for playing time in the backcourt and at the wing.

Freshmen BILLY DOUGLASS, a 6-4 point guard from Lake Forest, Illinois, TIM LOCUM, a 6-4 shooting guard from Flora, Illinois, and WILLIE SIMMS, Jr., a 6-5 swing man from Pontiac, Michigan, will contend for playing time. Locum is deadly

from three-point range. Simms has the versatility to contribute from either guard slot and the wing. Douglass adds depth at point guard. All three add quickness and provide Yoder with versatility and depth in the backcourt.

"Defensively, we have the potential to be much improved over last season," Yoder said. "But, our backcourt players will have to carry the offensive load early."



FRONTCOURT: YOUNG AND HUNGRY

Wisconsin's biggest challenge will be developing an inside game following the loss of Heineman, Ripley and Weber. The trio was responsible for the Badgers' reputation as a tough, hardnosed team the past three seasons.

The Badgers are young up front with returning letterwinners junior **DARIN SCHUBRING** (6-10/230/0.8 ppg/1.1 rpg), and sophomores **DANNY JONES** (6-6/240/8.2 ppg/3.2 rpg) and **KURT PORTMANN** (6-11/220/3.7 ppg/2.2 rpg.)the leading contenders for starting roles.

With the exception of Jones, the Badgers' inside players lack playing time. However, that shouldn't be a problem this season.

After seeing limited action behind J.J. Weber last season, Schubring is expected to succeed Weber as the Badgers' starting center. Schubring will be counted on to take charge inside and provide tough defense and rebounding. He started 12 games as a freshman during the season.

"We've been working hard to make this program a winner."

One of the Big Ten's top freshmen last season, Jones is the most experienced inside player on the squad. Jones possesses the physique and strength necessary for survival in conference play. He shot 55.8% from the field last year while averaging 8.2 points per game. He is expected to be an impact player in the Big Ten and is the team's leading returning rebounder.

Although he saw action in 29 games, Portmann was overshadowed by Jones last season. The team's tallest player, Portmann is the Badgers' leading returning shot blocker and will challenge for a starting role at forward. He was Wisconsin's "Mr. Basketball" as a prep senior and has competed against some of the best young basketball talent in the country. He improved his outside shooting during the summer and has the versatility to play on the wing.

Junior **POLLIS ROBERTSON** (6-7, 210) and redshirt sophomore **ROB WILLEY** (6-9, 220) are ready to contribute this season. "We need help from Robertson and Willey to improve our inside scoring and rebounding," Yoder said.

Freshman PATRICK TOMPKINS, Jr. is expected to make his presence felt. At 6-6 and 230 pounds, opponents could find Tompkins a force to be reckoned with. A strong rebounder and inside defensive player, he should contribute immediately.



OUTLOOK: BADGERS WILL DEFEND THEIR TURF

The Badgers made opponents battle for every victory when they played in Madison last season. Wisconsin impressed a national television audience with its tenacious play in a triple-overtime defeat to eventual national champion Indiana.

"We've been working hard to make this program a winner," Yoder emphasized. "We're not there yet, but this team could be a key part of the foundation. We have to start winning the close games. But in the Big Ten, no one gets weaker."


Last year's team was competitive and showed that it's not the size of the man in the fight that matters. But the size of the fight in the man.

ALL. ADE' SPONBERG



A new era of University of Wisconsin athletics began last summer as the school welcomed a new athletic director.

A.L. "Ade" Sponberg was named as the UW's new athletic director on May 15, 1987, succeeding Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch, who enjoyed 18 successful years at the helm before announcing his retirement.

The 50-year-old Sponberg, who assumed his duties at Wisconsin on July 1, has nearly 20 years' experience as a collegiate athletic director, including a most recent tenure at North Dakota State University from 1973-87. In addition to his AD's position, Sponberg also held the rank of professor and chaired the Division of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics.

The athletic program at NDSU was very successful under his leadership as athletic director. From 1982-85, North Dakota State was the all-sports champion of the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The school's football team won NCAA Division II national championships in 1983, 1985 and 1986, and the men's and women's basketball teams as well as the women's volleyball team all reached the NCAA Division II playoffs in recent years.

Among the football coaches Sponberg hired while athletic director at North Dakota State were Jim Wacker, now head coach at Texas Christian University, and of course, new Badger head coach Don Morton.

Prior to his period of service at NDSU, he was athletic director at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota from 1968-73.

Sponberg has also been heavily involved in NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) governance and policymaking. At the time of his hiring at Wisconsin, he was a member of the NCAA Council, and was NCAA Division II vicepresident and an NCAA Administrative Committee member from 1984-86. Since 1976, Ade has served on nine other NCAA committees, dealing with such issues as recruiting, legislation and interpretation, television and eligibility.

Ade's academic background is impressive as well. He earned a Ph.D. in Physical Education and Athletic Administration from the University of Michigan in 1968, received a master's degree in Physical Education from Mankato State University in 1963, and earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Gustavus Adolphus College in 1958.


For those athletes who do request assistance, Diane, Alan and Mary offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Floor passes are limited to daily newspaper, wire service, and television photographers. Photographers may work from either the north, south or west ends of the court.

PARKING

A limited number of parking passes for Lots 18 and 19 are available to the working press only. Available passes will be issued as requested.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Media representatives may interview Wisconsin players following all home games in the Fieldhouse's Reinke Room located in the north end of the building, following interviews with both coaches. Give the names of the players you wish to interview to a member of the UW Sports News staff

Players will also be available for interviews following practices only. Practice begins at 1:30 pm daily and finishes at approximately 4:00 pm.

Doug and his wife, Caroline, were married in July of 1987. She is the Director of Sales at the Radisson Inn.


DENNIS SEMRAU


He began his coaching career at Glen Ellyn, Illinois, Junior High School and in 1965 took an assistant's position at Plymouth, Indiana.

three conference titles, three sectional crowns, a pair of regional titles, and two finishes among the top ten teams in state rankings over a six year period.



BRAD McNULTY Assistant Coach



ROD ZENTNER Assistant Coach



Mike is Wisconsin's all-time leader in career assists, amassing 388 assists in his four years as a Badger. He holds school records for most career assists in Big Ten play with 248 and most assists overall in a single season with 137 assists during the 1986-87 season. Mike also holds the third and fifth best single-season marks with 111 assists during the 1984-85 season and 100 assists during the 1985-86 season, respectively.

A complete player for the Badgers, Mike's competitive drive and attitude helped Wisconsin earn a reputation as a tough, physical team the past four seasons.

He was a three-year starter at Conners-ville High School. In 1983, Mike averaged 15 points and seven assists per game as he led his team to the Indiana state basket-ball championship. Mike is currently completing work on his degree in Communication Arts. His eventual goal is a head coaching job in basketball.


THE STRENGTH PROGRAM

At the University of Wisconsin, the "physical fitness" of student-athletes is of primary concern.

Under the direction of Ray Moran, the UW strength program has made great strides and earned recognition as one of the best in the Big Ten.

"First and foremost, our goal here is to make better athletes - through an individual's recognition of his full potential," said Moran. "And naturally, within this program, we hope to help in the prevention of injury.


"But," he points out, "our primary purpose is not to prevent injuries. It is to develop better athletes."



Sophomore forward Danny Jones works out on one of the five pieces of modern Kelser equipment also included in the UW weight-training room.


Strength training at Wisconsin consists of several year-round programs. For basketball, for instance, the strength program would include a pre-season training program, an in-season conditioning program, as well as a summer program. The basketball team normally uses the strength training facility two hours per day, two days per week.

Each sport that utilizes the weight room is fully supervised by either Moran or one of his assistants. Moran's staff will analyze

weight lifting. It also includes agility and flexibility development.

Open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm six days per week, Camp Randall's 4,000 square foot Wisconsin weight room contains some of the finest training equipment on the market today. Moran points to 38,000 pounds of free weight, 21 olympic bars, 21 free-weight stations, seven squat stations (of which four are electric squat racks), ten bench press stations, four wall-pully cable stations, five pieces of Keiser equipment (based on pneumatic pressure and used especially for high-speed training), and three full set dumbbells (5-100 pounds, in five-pound increments).


It's a good set-up, but the best is yet to come. With the opening of Wisconsin's new Dave McClain indoor practice facility set for the fall of 1988, comes a new, state-of-the-art computerized weight training room that will consist of some 7,000 square feet.

Along with all new training equipment, will be a separate computer room for evaluating athletes, a maintenance room, strength training offices, and a glass-enclosed conference area with seating for ten to 15 people.

The Badgers' all-time leader in assists will also be remembered as a player who always came ready to play. Heineman helped the Badgers earn a reputation as a tough and physical team the past four seasons. He will serve as the graduate assistant for the University of Wisconsin basketball team this season.

Mike is Wisconsin's all-time leader in career assists, amassing 388 assists in his four years as a Badger. He also holds school records for most career assists in Big Ten play with 248 and most assists overall in a single season with 137 assists during the 1986-87 season. Mike also holds the third and fifth best single-season marks with 111 assists during the 1984-85 season and 100 assists during the 1985-86 season, respectively.

An intense player, Mike was a major influence on the Badgers' fortunes the past four seasons. He was a key contributor to the Badgers' 40 wins over the past three years, the most by Badger teams since Harold "Bud" Foster's squads posted 41 wins in a three-year period from 1947-48 through 1949-50.





A complete player for the Badgers, Mike's competitive drive and attitude was an influence on his teammates and earned him the respect of fans, opponents and coaches alike. He ended his collegiate career with a typical Heineman performance — 20 points, seven rebounds and nine assists — against nationally-ranked lowa. Mike also played 50 minutes and scored 20 points in Wisconsin's triple overtime loss to Indiana last season. He set career-highs with 11 assists against Northwestern in 1985 and 12 rebounds at Indiana last season. He is also fifth on Wisconsin's all-time list in steals with 92.

He was a three-year starter at Connersville High School. In 1983, Mike averaged 15 points and seven assists per game as he led his team to the Indiana state basketball championship.

Nicknamed "the dog," Mike is currently finishing work on his degree in Communication Arts. His eventual goal is a head coaching job in basketball.





A valuable member of the Badgers' squad the past four seasons, Rod Ripley showed steady improvement throughout his career. He combined intelligence with a will to succeed that enabled him to get the most out of his athletic abilities.

Rod ended his collegiate career with a solid 1986-87 season. He finished second on the team in rebounding, including grabbing a season-high 11 boards against Eastern Illinois and the University of Illinois. A tenacious defensive player, he held the University of California's leading scorer to one field goal attempt in the second half of the Badgers' 66-63 victory.

He played in all 31 games last season, including 23 starts. Able to contribute in clutch situations, he launched a crucial three-point field goal in a nationally-televised game against Indiana. Rod's 21-footer with nine seconds remaining in the second overtime tied the game at 79 before the eventual national champion Hoosiers won in triple overtime.





Rod received many academic awards during his undergraduate career. A 1985-86 GTE-CoSIDA Honorable Mention Academic All-American, he was a member of the 1985-86 and 1986-87 District 5 Academic All-America first teams. He was a 1987 Athletic Board Scholar after posting the highest grade point average on the UW basketball team. He also earned Academic All-Big Ten first team honors three times.

Rod graduated in May of 1987 with a degree in accounting from the University of Wisconsin School of Business. His combination of academic and athletic excellence was recognized by the NCAA when he received a 1987 NCAA Post Graduate Scholarship.

Ripley posted a career-high 22 points vs. Marquette (11/30/85) and grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds vs. Miami (12/7/85) and vs. Indiana (2/6/86). An excellent inside passer, he handed out a career-high eight assists vs Hawaii (12/27/86).

During the 1985-86 season he led the team in rebounding with an 8.7 per game average. He completed a stellar prep career in 1983 and earned first team all-state honors at Pulaski High School.




Forward, 6-7, 230 Wales, WI (Kettle Moraine)

Weber capped his career at Wisconsin as the team's "Most Valuable Player" of the 1986-87 season. He earned United Press International All-Big Ten second-team and Associated Press All-Big Ten honorable mention honors. Weber also received the University of Wisconsin's Men's Big Ten Medal for proficiency in athletics and scholarship.

A third-round selection by the Milwaukee Bucks in the 1987 draft, J.J. is pursuing a career in professional basketball. He has one semester remaining in pursuit of a degree in Agricultural Economics.

In 1986-87, Weber became the dominating player the Badgers were looking for as he led Wisconsin in scoring, rebounding, blocked shots, steals, field goals made, field goals attempted, field goal shooting percentage, free throws made and free throws attempted. A tough rebounder and a physical player in the paint, Weber proved he could score, too. He scored 30 points against Northwestern, which was a career-high for any basketball game he's ever played in.





Although he was a marked man last season, Weber was second on the team and 11th in the Big Ten in conference scoring. He was second in the Big Ten in field goal accuracy and third in blocked shots. Against some of the best players in the country, J.J. was also fifth in the conference in rebounding and sixth in free throw accuracy.

A durable player, Weber started all 31 games and scored in double figures 25 times during the 1986-87 season. He earned his way into the UW record books as the school's single-season leader in games played and started (31) and in field goal accuracy (.562).

Weber completed his career with 1,021 points (17th place on the UW all-time list) and 592 rebounds (9th). He is the school's career leader in field goal percentage in all games (.527) and in Big Ten play only (.512). He was named to the 1986 Rainbow Classic All-Tournament team where he led the Badgers to a second-place finish.

Weber also tied a personal-best with 14 rebounds against Ohio State (2/11/87) and South Florida.

In 1985-86, Weber was an Associated Press All Big Ten honorable mention selection. He was the Badgers' top front-court scorer and second-leading rebounder. He also led the team in blocked shots. In 1984-85, Weber led the Badgers in rebounding and also dished out a career-high eight assists against Morgan State.

The Milwaukee Sentinel's "Player of the Year" in 1983, He earned first team all-state honors from Associated Press and United Press International as a high school senior.



THE DANE COUNTY COLISEUM



This season marks the first appearance of the University of Wisconsin basketball team at the Coliseum. The home of the hockey Badgers, the Coliseum is one of college hockey's finest facilities and the site of NCAA attendance records for 17 consecutive seasons.

Wisconsin's 1987-88 men's basketball schedule features 15 home games, including three at the Dane County Coliseum. The Coliseum games are scheduled for Tuesday, December 1 against Northern Illinois; Sunday, January 3 against Washington State; and Sunday, February 28 against Minnesota.

With theater-style seating for 8,644, the Coliseum is the second largest collegiate ice facility in the nation. The Coliseum capacity for basketball is 9,100. When the ice stays in — as it will for the January 3 game — it is covered by fiberboard with the basketball floor on top.

The facility includes dressing room facilities and a modern training room which includes a whirlpool and all the various modalities and exercise equipment for treatment and rehabilitation of injuries. The Badgers also make use of a fully-equipped weight room inside the Coliseum.

WORKING PRESS

Visiting media should enter the Coliseum through the Press/Player's Entrance at the North end of the building.

PARKING

Parking is limited at the Dane County Coliseum and media should pay at time of entry into the Coliseum's parking lots. Price is \$2.50 per vehicle.

THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN FIELDHOUSE



The Wisconsin Fieldhouse was a project of then Athletic Director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin in 1925 and it became a reality in 1930.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board, after two previous attempts had failed; one of those having passed the legislature only to be vetoed by Governor Zimmerman.

The original layout had contemplated a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385.000.

This intercollegiate portion is represented in the present facility that houses both the basketball teams and wrestling squad. Its actual cost was somewhat more than the estimated totaling \$434,000 with construction completed in September of 1931.

The structure would be a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The fieldhouse contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and room for indoor football and baseball training.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved \$718,000 for the renovation of the fieldhouse. The project was aimed mainly to improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be presented in the building. Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south, and west sides of the court with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 12,204. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west side seats and the existing locker rooms were renovated. A new lighting system


was added in 1977, and a new sound system has just been completed to make the Wisconsin Fieldhouse one of the best facilities of its kind in the Big Ten.





Dec. 1898 — Six years after the advent of the new sport of basketball, five young men who learned to play the sport at the Milwaukee Y.M.C.A. form a team at Wisconsin. Bob Burdick, John Mapel, Carl Stillman, Paul Stover, and Captain Walter Hirschberg make up the first Wisconsin Badger basketball team. Dr. J.C. Elsom is the first UW coach.

Jan. 21, 1899 — Wisconsin plays its first game ever and is bested by the Milwaukee Normal Alumni, 25-15 in Milwaukee.

Mar. 4, 1899 — The Badgers play their first home game, again against the Milwaukee Normal Alumni. This time Wisconsin plays much better, but is edged 13-10. The innagural season record is 0-3.

Feb. 15, 1900 — A 25-15 defeat of Wayland Academy gives Wisconsin its first victory since the sports' inception.

Mar. 1902 — After completing a 10-game schedule — all on the road — the Badgers finish the year with a 7-3 mark, their first winning season.

Dec. 2, 1904 — Emmett Angell coaches the Badgers for the first time and watches his team drub Sparta's Company C, 75-10. Christian Steinmetz scores 50 points in the game to set a pre-modern single game scoring record.

Jan. 1905 — The Wisconsin basketball team makes its first road trip east. The Badgers finish the eastern swing of New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Ohio at 2-6.

Spring, 1905 — Christian Steinmetz finishes the season with 462 points, setting a Wisconsin single season scoring mark that would stand for 61 years. Steinmetz is later named the Badgers' first all-American.

Mar. 15, 1907 — Wisconsin outscores Purdue, 37-10 to secure an 11-3 record and a share of the Big Ten championship.

Mar. 16, 1912 — First year coach Walter Meanwell's team drops Indiana, 32-21 to complete an undefeated season at 15-0. Wisconsin wins the Big Ten title outright and will win or share that distinction seven more times before Meanwell is through coaching in 1934.

Mar. 16, 1918 — Despite dropping a 19-11 decision to Minnesota, first-year coach Guy Lowman's Badgers win the school's sixth Big Ten Championship in 12 years.


Fall, 1934 — Harold "Bud" Foster, a former all-American player with the Badgers, takes over as their head coach. Foster will hold that position for 25 years, longer than any other basketball coach in the history of the school.

Spring, 1935 — In his first year as head coach, Harold "Bud" Foster leads Wisconsin to the Big Ten title, posting a 15-5 record.

Mar. 29, 1941 — The "Cinderella" Badgers, lower division Big Ten finishers only one year before, top Washington State, 39-34 in the championship game of the NCAA

tournament. John Kotz is named MVP of the tourney. The Badgers' captain, Gene Englund, is the Big Ten MVP and receives all-American accolades.

Spring, 1942 — For the second consecutive year a Badger is named the conference MVP and all-American. Sharp-shooting John Kotz earns those honors this season.

Mar., 1947 — The 15-5 Big Ten Champion Badgers are invited to play in the NCAA Eastern regionals in New York's Madison Square Garden. Wisconsin takes third place in the East by squeaking past Navy, 50-49 after losing the opener, 70-56 to C.C.N.Y. The conference championship and NCAA tournament bid stand as the last in Badger history.

Feb. 28, 1949 — Junior Don Rehfeldt takes 37 shots in a 70-47 trouncing of Iowa. The 37 shots stands as a Wisconsin single game record to the present.

Spring, 1950 — After being named the Big Ten's MVP, Don Rehfeldt becomes Wisconsin's last all-American to date. Rehfeldt finishes his career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1169 points.

Jan. 3, 1953 — Center Paul Morrow, in a 50-46 topping of Purdue, pulls down 30 rebounds in the contest — an all-time Badger best.

Mar. 11, 1963 — At the 40th annual Gyro Club banquet, senior Ken Siebel is named the team's MVP for the third straight year. This is the ony time a Wisconsin player has earned that distinction three times.

Mar. 11, 1967 — With 12 seconds remaining in the last game of the year, sophomore Chuck Nagle makes a lay-up to tie Christian Steinmetz for the team single season scoring reecord of 462, set in 1904-


05. Nagle was fouled on the play, and makes the free throw to set a new record of 463.

Mar. 2, 1968 — Senior Joe Franklin pulls down a career-high 27 rebounds in a 104-84 victory over Purdue in his final game in the Fieldhouse. Franklin ends his collegiate career one week later having amassed 858 boards in his three seasons with the Badgers, giving him a school best average of 286 per year.

Spring, 1968 — Only one year after Chuck Nagle broke a single season scoring record that stood for 62 years, senior Joe Franklin shatters the record, scoring 544 points in the 1967-68 season.

Spring, 1971 — Senior co-captain Clarence Sherrod scores 570 points in his final season as a Badger to take Wisconsin all-time single season scoring honors.

Mar. 3, 1979 — Facing eventual NCAA champion Michigan State in the regular season finale, Wisconsin's Wesley Matthews hits a shot from behind the half-court line as time expires to win, 83-81.

Dec. 30, 1979 — In the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, HI, the Badgers connect on 32 of 43 field goal attempts (.744), setting a school record and defeating Army, 78-54.

Mar. 10, 1981 — Claude Gregory scores 29 points and grabs 17 rebounds in his last game in the Cardinal and White. Gregory leaves Wisconsin as its all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1745 and 904, respectively.

Dec. 2, 1985 — In a non-conference matchup with San Francisco State, senior Rick Olson makes 17 field goals en route to a 90-61 victory. Olson's 17 made field goals tops the previous record of 16, set almost 27 years before by Bob Litzow.

Mar. 9, 1986 — Setting a school record by starting every game in a four-year career (112), Rick Olson guides Wisconsin past Northwestern, 70-68. Olson scores 26 points in the contest and misses becoming the Badger's career scoring leader by only ten points. Olson does, however, set the record for points scored in a single season, finishing the 1985-86 campaign with 571 points.

Mar. 8, 1987 — Mike Heineman scores 20 points, grabs seven rebounds and hands out nine assists in his final game as a Badger. Heineman ends his career as Wisconsin's all-time leader in assists in all games (388) and in Big Ten play only (248).



University Theater, School of Music, and the Dance Division offer a wide range of performances throughout the year. Facilities include the Ronald E.
