

The University of Wisconsin–Madison, one of the world's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students assembled February 5, 1849. Today, the UW-Madison includes 13 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, more than 43,000 students and 14,000 employees, nearly 4,000,000 volumes in 22 libraries, a \$750,000,000 budget, and research and development expenditures totalling \$185,000,000 (third largest in the U.S.).


Wisconsin has ranked among the top ten universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. More than 4,100 courses and 12,600 sections are offered. Majors are available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's, and 123 doctor's degree programs.


UW-Madison departments ranked among the top ten in the nation in the 1980s include Sociology (1st), German, Chemical Engineering and Geography (2nd), Statistics (4th), Plant Pathology, Molecular Biology and Biochemistry (5th), Spanish and Portuguese (6th), Zoology (7th), Political Science, Chemistry and Economics (8th), Mathematics (9th), and History (10th).


The UW's international activities extend the boundaries of the campus to all parts of the globe. The campus has about 3,600 foreign students from 125 countries, offers some 50 foreign languages for study, and has the largest overall number of international studies faculty and largest number of faculty of any university in East Asian, South and Southeast Asian, African and Latin American studies. Junior-year-abroad programs are offered for students going to Brazil, China, England, France, West Germany, Hungary, Israel, India, Italy, Spain, Sweden, Norway, Nepal, Thailand and Mexico and Quebec for summer study.

The UW's Center for Health Sciences is one of the Midwest's leading centers for patient care, education of physicians and other health professionals, research and public service. It includes the Medical,



A Madison native, his 1988 baseball brochure was judged "Best In The Nation" by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and by CoSIDA. He was elected as the third Vice-President of the NCBWA in 1989. His 1988 cross country brochure was also judged "Best In The Nation" by CoSIDA.

He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism from the University of Wisconsin–Madison in 1986. He earned a Masters degree in Educational Administration/ Sports Administration from the UW in 1988.

WISCONSIN FIELDHOUSE

The University of Wisconsin Fieldhouse is the home of the basketball Badgers. The UW Fieldhouse was a project of then Athletic Director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin in 1925. In 1930, it became a reality.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board after two previous attempts had failed.

The original layout included a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385,000.

The intercollegiate portion of the facility housed the men's and women's basketball teams and the wrestling squad. Its construction, completed in 1931, cost an approximately \$434,000.

The structure remains a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The field-house originally contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and room for indoor football and baseball training.

The football, track and field and baseball teams moved to the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center, "the Shell," upon its completion in 1956.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved \$718,000 for the renovation of the field-house. The project was aimed at improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be held in the building.

Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south and west sides of the court with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 11,886. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west side seats and the existing locker rooms were renovated.

A new lighting system was added in 1977 along with an improved sound system.

The UW Fieldhouse is also the site of the WIAA boys' and girls' state basketball tournaments, the WIAA state wrestling tournament, Big Ten Championship gymnastics' meets, live music concerts and numerous other events.







1989-90 Basketball Preview

Wisconsin basketball is on the rise.

The Badgers earned a reputation as a tenacious team on defense and a patient one on offense last season. They also earned the school's first post-season basketball tournament since 1947.

Wisconsin finished 18–12 and made its first-ever appearance in the National Invitational Tournament. The team's 18 victories were the most by a Wisconsin squad since the 1940–41 team won the NCAA title with a 20–3 mark. The Badgers narrowly missed an NCAA tournament bid as they tied for sixth in the conference.

Wisconsin returns nine letterwinners, including three starters. The Badgers also welcome five recruits who could also play key roles in giving Head Coach Steve Yoder back-to-back winning seasons.

"We have the ability to improve on last season's finish," said UW head coach Steve Yoder. "But the Big Ten continues to improve from top to bottom. It gets tougher each year to break into the first division."


Inside Game To Key Attack

The Badgers return all three frontcourt starters and two top reserves, including the top returning inside player in the Big Ten.


Leading the attack will be All-America candidate senior forward **DANNY JONES**. He is the leading returning scorer in the Big Ten (20.9 ppg) and ranks sixth in all-time UW scoring. A unanimous second-team All-Big Ten selection last season, Jones is a pre-season consensus all-Big Ten pick. He is also a tri-captain for the second year in a row.

Recognized as one of the best low-post players in the conference, Jones added an outside shot last season to his game. A three-year starter, he has shown improvement every season.

"Danny has proven to be one of our most consistent players," Yoder said. "But he'll have to take his game up another notch the way (Trent) Jackson

did last season. As one of the Big Ten's top returning players, Danny will be a marked man every game."

Also returning as starters are senior center KURT PORTMANN and junior forward WILLIE SIMMS.

For the Badgers to be a factor in the conference race, Portmann must be more of an impact player. He has the versatility to handle the ball against the press and shoot from the outside. Portmann, a team tri-captain, is also one of the team's best defensive players.

Simms could be one of the Big Ten's best-kept secrets. The 6–6 swing man is one of the team's most talented players. He was the Badgers' best rebounder on the offensive boards during the Big Ten season. He also proved to be a crowd favorite with his enthusiasm on and off the court.

"If we are to continue to improve, we must have good seasons out of Portmann and Simms," Yoder said. "They're both ready to be impact players in the Big Ten. If they reach that level, that could vault us into the Big Ten's first division."

Junior forwards **PATRICK TOMPKINS** and **JOHN ELLENSON** will push for playing time. The pair help make the Badgers' inside game the strongest its been in Yoder's seven seasons at Wisconsin.

Tompkins was limited to 12 games a year ago after being academically ineligible for the second semester. A powerful force on the offensive boards, he earned First Bank Classic all-tournament honors. His return to the starting lineup could move Simms to the backcourt. Ellenson played in nine games after sitting out the first semester due to NCAA transfer rules. He has the range to hit the three-pointer and strengthens the Badgers' rebounding and defense.

"We have the versatility and depth inside to compete in the Big Ten," Yoder added. "We should have some very competitive practice sessions."

Backcourt Young and Hungry

To duplicate last season's heroics, Yoder must replace starting guards Trent Jackson and Tom Molaski. The pair quarterbacked the best defense in the conference (68.4 ppg) last season. Molaski led the team in assists, while Jackson led in steals and was second in scoring.

"It's tough to replace players who have been an important part of the program the past four years," Yoder said. "But it's up to the returning players to find a way to get the job done."

Tri-captain **TIM LOCUM** will contend for a starting role at shooting guard after providing instant offense off the bench the past two seasons. One of the Big Ten's top marksmen, Locum shot 49% from three-point range. He was also third on the team in scoring and fourth in minutes played despite only starting six games.

Junior **BILLY DOUGLASS** could emerge as the Badgers' starting point guard this season. The 6–5 Douglass has been hampered by injuries the past two seasons. He showed the ability to run the offense during last season's stretch run.

Senior **BYRON ROBINSON** and sophomore **BRIAN GOOD** will battle Locum and Douglass for playing time at guard. Simms began last season as the starter at point guard. If Tompkins returns to the starting lineup, Simms could emerge as the starter at the point.


Newcomers To Contribute

LARRY HISLE, Jr., Wisconsin's prep "Player of the Year," will challenge Locum for time at shooting guard. Hisle averaged 29 points a game as a senior. **JASON JOHNSEN** was a finalist for Minnesota's Mr. Basketball award. He could challenge for playing time at either guard position.


"The players already in the program are the ones expected to produce," Yoder said. "No matter how highly touted they might be, freshmen aren't expected to have an impact that returning players should have."

The Badgers depth at forward and center will determine the amount of playing time their three inside recruits earn this season. The talented trio are excellent students in the classroom and will get an education during practice sessions this season on the court as well.

Forward **CARLTON McGEE** averaged 20 points and 15 rebounds per game his senior year and is a two-time state prep high jump champion. **DAMON HARRELL** is projected as a power forward. He averaged 22 points and seven rebounds as a senior and earned 1989 AAU All-America honors. **GRANT JOHNSON** averaged 10 points and seven rebounds but only 16 minutes per game for a prep powerhouse. He has the ability to be a strong inside scorer and defender.

Badgers Ready For Challenge

Wisconsin's last appearance in an NCAA tournament was 1947. That streak could end this season. But the Badgers must continue to play the team defense that was a key to last season's success. They allowed only 64.7 points per game a year ago to finish 12th in the nation.

"Our defense set the tone last season," Yoder said. "But despite the loss of Jackson and (Darin) Schubring, we have the ability to be even better."

The Badgers' success on the court made UW basketball tickets a hot commodity. Led by the popular Badger Bleacher Creatures, attendance increased 21% for the Badgers' nine Big Ten games and 16% overall. The increase helped turn the UW Fieldhouse into an intimidating place to play. The Badgers responded with 14 victories in 17 home games.

Three of those victories were against teams ranked in the nation's top eight. Wisconsin defeated 5th-ranked and eventual NCAA champion Michigan, 8th-ranked Iowa, and 5th-ranked Illinois in the Badgers' den. The victory over final four team Illinois snapped a 16-game losing streak to the Illini.

"Our fans responded to our hard work last season," Yoder said. "With their help, we turned the

Fieldhouse into a home court pit."

A Big Ten first division finish and a bid to the NCAA tournament are within the Badgers' reach. But first, Wisconsin must be able to win consistently on the road.

"Until we prove that we can win on the road, we'll be a second division team," Yoder said. "We have the ability, now we need to just do it."

HEAD COACH STEVE YODER

Behind UW head coach Steve Yoder, Wisconsin basketball came out of the shadows and into the limelight during the 1988–89 season. Victories over ranked opponents and a packed UW Fieldhouse became the rule rather than the exception.

During the 1988–89 season, Yoder led the Badgers to their first appearance in a post-season tournament in 42 years. Wisconsin posted a 1–1 mark in two games in the National Invitational Tournament and ended its season with an 18–12 record.

The Badgers' 18 victories were the most by a Wisconsin squad since the 1940–41 team won the NCAA title with a 20–3 mark. Only one other Wisconsin basketball team has ever won more than 18 games in a season—the 1916 team that posted a 20–1 record.

For his efforts, Yoder earned Kodak District XI "Coach of the Year" honors for Division I by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). He was one of 15 Division I coaches to be honored.

He earned other post-season honors including Basketball Times Midwest "Coach of the Year," Madison (Wis.) Pen & Mike "Sportsman of the Year" and Big Ten Conference runner-up "Coach of the Year."

For University of Wisconsin Badger basketball fans, the 1988–89 season was one to remember. It included victories over three teams that were ranked in the nation's top eight when they met the Badgers in the UW Fieldhouse - 71–68 over 5th-ranked Michigan, 65–54 over 8th-ranked lowa and 72–52 over 5th-ranked Illinois. The victory over Illinois snapped a 16-game losing streak to the Fighting Illini.

Now in his eighth season at Wisconsin, Yoder is respected among Big Ten coaches for his bench coaching and his ability to field tough, competitive teams. During the 1988–89 season, others outside of the Big Ten began to take notice. Staff writer Dave Bones praised the coach's efforts in the June 1 issue of *Basketball Times*.

"For the past several seasons, Wisconsin came

close to turning the corner to become a winning team," Bones said. "The heartbreaking losses of earlier years turned into victories this year. Yoder's fighting spirit and coaching savvy showed that nice guys can and do win."

Yoder took over the helm at Wisconsin in 1982. He came to Madison from Ball State University where he compiled a five-year record of 77–62. He was named the Mid-American Conference "Coachof-the-Year" for both the 1980–81 and 1981–82 seasons. The 1980–81 Ball State team shared the MAC title and gained an NCAA tournament berth by winning the conference's post-season tournament.

A native of Plymouth, Indiana, Yoder attended Illinois Wesleyan University on a basketball and baseball scholarship and earned his degree in 1962. He

earned a master's degree from St. Francis College in Fort Wayne, Indiana in 1970.

Yoder became head coach at Plymouth High School in 1967 and proceeded to guide the school to three conference titles, three sectional crowns, a pair of regional titles, and two finishes among the top ten teams in state rankings over a six year period.


Steve was named Indiana's District I "Coach-ofthe-Year" in 1973 and then accepted a job as assistant coach at Furman University. He returned to Indiana in 1975 as head coach at Mishawaka's Penn High School.


In 1976, Yoder became assistant basketball coach at Ball State and a year later became head coach at the school.



Assistant Coach



Dr. A.L. 'Ade' Sponberg



A new era of University of Wisconsin athletics began in 1987 as the school welcomed Athletic Director A.L. "Ade" Sponberg.

Sponberg was named the UW's athletic director on May 15, 1987 and now marks his third year at the helm of the Wisconsin athletic program in 1989–90. He officially succeeded Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch, who served 18 years in that position, on July 1, 1987.

In just two short years, Sponberg has made a positive impact on the Wisconsin athletic scene. He has been instrumental in instituting a comprehensive marketing program for the athletic department and has made the "business" side of the program a top priority. He was a key figure in the addition of the Dave McClain Athletic Facility to the department's athletic facilities. He also was a catalyst in securing the 1993 NCAA Ice Hockey Championships for the city of Milwaukee this past May.

The 52-year-old has nearly 22 years of experience as a collegiate athletic director, including a tenure at North Dakota State University from 1973–87. In addition to his AD's position at NDSU, Sponberg also held the rank of professor and chaired the Division of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics.

The athletic program at NDSU enjoyed a highly successful period under Sponberg's leadership. From 1982–85, North Dakota State was the all-sports champion of the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the school's football team won NCAA Division II national championships in 1983, 1985 and 1986, and the men's and women's basketball teams as well as the women's volleyball team all reached the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Prior to his period of service at NDSU, Ade was athletic director at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota from 1968–73.

He has also been heavily involved in NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) governance

and policymaking throughout his distinguished career as an athletic administrator. At the time of his hiring at Wisconsin, Ade was a member of the NCAA Council, and was NCAA Division II vice-president. He also served as an NCAA Administrative Committee member from 1984–86. Since 1976, Ade has served on nine other NCAA committees, dealing with such issues as recruiting, legislation and interpretation, television and eligibility.

Ade's academic background is impressive as well. He earned a Ph.D. in Physical Education and Athletic Administration from the University of Michigan in 1968, earned a master's degree in Physical Education from Mankato State University in 1963, and earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Gustavus Adolphus College in 1958.

Ade and his wife, Donna, have two children—Steve, 31, and Kari, 29.

Joel Maturi

Associate Athletic Director Men's Basketball & Ice Hockey Facilities and Events

Joel Maturi was named assistant athletic director for facilities and events for the University of Wisconsin–Madison Athletic Department in December of 1986. He assumed his duties in March of 1987.

Maturi, 44, is a 1967 graduate of Notre Dame where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science. The Chisholm, Minnesota native completed credits for his Master of Arts degree in Teaching from the UW–Madison in 1972 and earned his Master's degree from UW–Platteville in 1985 in Educational Professional Development.

He began his professional career at Madison's Edgewood High School in 1968 in the Social Studies Department. Wisconsin Academic Staff

"The goal of our staff is to provide an atmosphere in which each young man or woman can develop fully—as a person, as a student and as an athlete."

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Wisconsin athletes must be given to the counseling system available to the student athletes.

Three full-time staff members—Assistant Athletic Director Dr. Diane Johnson and counselors Alan Zussman and Mary Weaver-Klees—conduct the Wisconsin Student Affairs program offered to the nearly 1,000 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Alan and Diane have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin and a permanent line of communication with all University departments.

For those athletes who do request assistance, Diane, Alan and Mary offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be

degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The counseling staff takes a

personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, personal or academic.

Wisconsin Basketball Statistics—Final III

At courtside during all University of Wisconsin basketball games is a valuable tool which has aided the development of the men's program. The FINAL III basketball statistics program has been in use since the 1986–87 season. The system—which was purchased by the Badger Basketball Boosters and donated to the University—has proved invaluable for the coaches, sports information departments and the media.

Using light pens, and shot and information screens, statistics are "penned" in as the game progresses. The data collected—shots made and missed, rebounds, turnovers, assists, steals, fouls, etc.—is automatically computed for halftime and final box scores.

But the system's forte is in the analyses it performs. It provides in-depth coaching analyses such as player combination effectiveness, turnover analyses and shot analyses by distance and angle. Input via game film also provides opportunities to scout prospective opponents and perform post-game analyses of away games.

During game time, Final III provides accumulation and analyses of data. Coaches, sports information staff and the media can access the system during game time.

The Final III system also provides complete player and team history files and formats this information into several forms, including direct telecommunication to news outlets. The system immediately updates single game, season and career statistics for the players and the team.

Two other functions have also been a welcome addition to the basketball program—a coaching analysis of offensive and defensive plays, and a pro-





gram to input opponents' information from game films to produce scouting reports.

As the only Big Ten school with such a sophisticated statistics program, the University of Wisconsin has received recognition for its innovative approach to the sport of basketball.

Computers can't win basketball games, but the information processed by this valuable tool should help provide Badger teams with the state-of-the-art information they need for improvement and a winning edge.

The Wisconsin Strength Program

At the University of Wisconsin–Madison, the "physical fitness" of student-athletes is of primary concern.

Under the guidance of Jim Hyne and Steve Mryland, the UW strength program is recognized as one of the most successful and complete in the Big Ten.


"We use input from the coaching staff, basketball trainer and strength coach to build a complete conditioning and weight training program," Hyne said. "As a group we discuss what the basketball program needs to become more successful. We then structure a program for the entire team that still has the flexibility to be specialized to an individual player's needs."

Strength training at Wisconsin consists of several year-round programs. In basketball, the strength program includes a pre-season conditioning and weight training program, an in-season maintenance program, as well as spring and summer programs. The basketball team normally uses the strength training facility two hours per day, three days per week.

Each sport that utilizes the weight room is fully supervised by Hyne and his staff. They will analyze and chart an individual athlete's week-by-week progress, as well as plan individual and team conditioning programs for the school's men's and women's sports. Strength training at the University of Wisconsin means more than just weight lifting. It also includes agility and flexibility development.

"The key to our program is the backing of the coaching staff," Hyne said. "The coaches realize that our aim isn't to build a team of weightlifters. We want a team of basketball players who can be the best that they can be in regards to jumping ability, strength, speed, quickness and stamina."

Open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm five days per




week, Camp Randall's 4,000 square-foot Wisconsin weight room contains some of the finest training equipment on the market today. Hyne points to 38,000 pounds of free weight, 21 olympic bars, 21 free-weight stations, seven squat stations (of which four are electric squat racks), 10 bench press stations, four wall-pully cable stations, five pieces of Keiser equipment (based on pneumatic pressure and used especially for high-speed training), and two full set dumbbells (5–100 pounds, in five-pound increments).

In addition to the weight room in Camp Randall, the basketball team has a weight room in the UW Fieldhouse available for use during practice sessions. And the Dave McClain Athletic Facility houses a 7,000 square-foot state-of-the-art, computerized weight room.

Along with all new training equipment is a separate computer room for evaluating athletes, a maintenance room, strength training offices, and a glassenclosed conference area with seating for 10 to 15 people.







Leckrone, in his 21st year at Wisconsin, created the Varsity band when he came to the University in 1969. He has seen it grow from just 27 members that first year to more than 200 today.

Although band members attend basketball games on a volunteer basis, there is always a large and enthusiastic group present. A typical Saturday would find the band performing at a basketball game

in the afternoon and a hockey game that same night.

The band is well-known for its diverse and unusual repetoire. In addition to such traditional favorites as "On Wisconsin" and "If You Want To Be A Badger," the band also fires up the crowd with more recent hits like "Dance Little Bird," "Tequila" and of course, "You've Said It All."


The combination of music and mayhem have made the Varsity band extremely popular with Wisconsin students, alumni and sports fans. The band has performed at six NCAA Hockey Championships, always receiving complimentary and enthusiastic reactions from writers, broadcasters and fans alike. The band has been prominently featured on all the

major television networks as well as ESPN and three cable news networks.

Besides playing at athletic events, this versatile group of musicians give various concerts around the state during the Spring semester.

The culmination to the year is the annual Spring concert in the UW Fieldhouse. Each April, sell-out crowds of more than 9,500 come to take part in the fun and excitement that typify a Varsity band performance. The concert has become so popular that it is televised throughout the state.

From its humble beginnings, the Varsity band has become one of the most popular sought after performing organizations in the state.




Following his introduction to the UW Varsity band, ESPN's Dick Vitale poses during Bucky's Bleacher Creature promotion.

1988-89 Season

IN REVIEW



IT WAS A YEAR TO REMEMBER

BADGER REVIEW

It was suspenseful.

It was exciting.

It was a year Badger fans will not soon forget. It was the year Coach Steve Yoder's cagers posted an 18–12 record and earned a post-season tournament berth for the first time since 1947.

Wisconsin's "dynamic duo" of senior guard **TRENT JACKSON** and junior forward **DANNY JONES** keyed a patient attack on offense. The pair also led a team defense that ranked first in the Big Ten and 12th in the nation.

The Badgers got an early jump on the season with an 8–0 mark on a two-week summer tour of Denmark, Finland and Sweden.

Wisconsin defeated Taby, the Swedish national champion team, 120–118, in its final game as Jones scored 53 points. The Badgers rallied from a 12-point deficit in the final four minutes.

The 1988–89 Badgers proceeded to go 8–2 in non-league play and captured the First Bank Classic title. Wisconsin defeated Marquette in the champion-ship game, and Jones earned tournament "Most Valuable Player" honors. The Badgers later defeated Marquette, 61–50, to complete the season sweep over the Warriors.

Badgers make their mark in conference play

Wisconsin opened its Big Ten season by defeating Minnesota, 75–67, in the UW Fieldhouse. The Badgers trailed, 53–39, with 11:00 to play. But the team forged a, 36–14, comeback to give fans a preview of coming attractions.

Road defeats followed at Ohio State and Illinois, and when the Badgers returned home they lost games to Indiana in overtime and to Purdue.

But when things looked bleak, the Badgers rebounded to win six of their next eight conference games and boost their chances not only of a first division Big Ten finish but also an NCAA tournament hid.

The fans fell in love with the comeback Badgers as witnessed by a total attendance of 161,810 for the 17 home games. That included crowds of more than 11,000 for six Big Ten games. The fans responded to Wisconsin's tenacious defense and opportunistic offense by turning the UW Fieldhouse into a pit for opposing teams. The Badgers posted a 14–3 record at home, including a 7–2 mark in Big Ten play.

Giant Killers

The Badgers' resurgence began on January 21 when they hosted eventual national champion Michigan, then ranked fifth in the nation, at the UW Fieldhouse.

Down by 10 points in the first half, Wisconsin went into the locker room tied at 35. Michigan held a 66–61 lead with 4:47 to play when the Badgers made their move. Wisconsin scored five straight points to tie the score at 66 with 3:16 to play. After Michigan took a 68–66 lead with 1:57 left, Jones went to work. He scored on a jumper to tie the

game. Jackson's free throw with 30 seconds left gave Wisconsin a 69–68 lead. **TIM LOCUM** then iced the game with a pair of free throws with four seconds left.

Three weeks later, the Badgers punched out eighth-ranked lowa, 65–54, in the UW Fieldhouse. Jackson led the Badgers' scoring parade with 24 points. Jones chipped in with 15, while Locum and **TOM MOLASKI** added 13 each. Wisconsin took a 36–27 lead at halftime and closed down lowa's inside attack in the second half.

Jackson and Jones keyed a perimeter defense that caused 24 lowa turnovers and along with center **KURT PORTMANN** helped hold the Hawkeyes' inside players to a combined 5 of 18 shooting.

One week later, the Badgers dismantled fifth-ranked Illinois, 72–52, and ended a 16-game losing streak to the Fighting Illini. Wisconsin used its aggressive defense to take a 32–18 halftime lead. Jackson's 27 points and sterling defensive play earned him Big Ten "Player-of-the-Week" honors. Jones added 17 points, while Locum scored 12.

Four of Wisconsin's final five games were on the road and proved to be the stumbling block that kept the Badgers out of the NCAA tournament. Wisconsin did defeat Ohio State, 77–65, at the UW Fieldhouse in the Badgers' home season finale. The team finished with an 18–12 record and tied for sixth with an 8–10 mark in Big Ten play.

The Badgers 65-60 loss at Purdue brought one bright spot in the play of **WILLIE SIMMS**. The 6-foot-6 forward sliced through the Boilermaker defense to score a career-high 27 points and keep the Badgers in the game until the final buzzer.

Time for post-season play

Although the NCAA bypassed the Badgers, Wiscon-

sin was chosen to play in the 52nd National Invitational Tournament (NIT). The Badgers opened the tournament against New Orleans in the friendly confines of the UW Fieldhouse.

The teams were tied at 27 at halftime, but the Badgers took an 11-point lead, 53–42, with 7:05 to play. A Jones' field goal gave Wisconsin a 59–52 lead with 3:59 to play. A pair of free throws by both Locum and Jackson in the final 38 seconds preserved the victory.

A crowd of 11,845 jammed into the Fieldhouse to see the Badgers take a 28–16 halftime lead against their second-round opponent, St. Louis University. But the second half belonged to the Billikens as they exploded for 57 points and took a 73–68 verdict from the Badgers. St. Louis went on to lose to St. John's in the NIT championship game.


Record-setting season

The Badgers' 18 victories were the most by a Wisconsin squad since the 1940–41 team won the NCAA title with a 20–3 mark. Only one other Wisconsin basketball team has ever won more than 18 games in a season.

For his efforts, coach Yoder was named Kodak District XI "Coach of the Year" for Division I by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). He was also named Midwest "Coach of the Year" by Basketball Times and was the Big Ten Conference runner-up "Coach of the Year".

The "dynamic duo" of Jackson and Jones earned second team All-Big Ten honors. Jones also earned Associated Press honorable mention All-America honors.

Not only did the Badgers give their fans a year worth remembering, but they also planted the seeds of excitement for the 1989–90 season.

1988-89 seniors close out careers in style

Wisconsin's success last season didn't happen by accident. It began with the leadership of five seniors who refused to end their careers on a losing note. The high school class of '85 made an impact on Wisconsin basketball that won't soon be forgotten.

Trent Jackson, Tom Molaski, **POLLIS ROBERT-SON, DARIN SCHUBRING** and **ROB WILLEY.**Against all odds, the group remained intact to deliver a post-season tournament bid. They brought back excitement to a program that many thought was dead. They also helped to make a Badger basketball ticket, one of the hottest items in town.

Jackson finished his career as the school's all-time leader in steals and third in scoring. He battled back from injuries and a lack of confidence his sophomore year to score in double figures in 69 of his final 72 games. Trent's leadership on and off the court was instrumental in the team's success. He turned in the finest performance of his career in the Badgers' 72–52 victory over Illinois in the UW Fieldhouse.

Molaski finished his career ranked second in UW assist totals. His vocal leadership during practice and games pushed the Badgers to a new level. Mo's pair of three-pointers in Wisconsin's victory over Northwestern may have saved the season.

Physical defensive play and solid rebounding efforts made Darin Schubring a crowd favorite. Schubring refused to be pushed around and earned the team respect from the Big Ten's inside players.

The Badgers' most enthusiastic and positive force on the team was Pollis Robertson. Although his career didn't progress the way he wanted it to, he never stopped working. His enjoyment of the game helped him continually push his teammates in practice and support them from the bench during the games.

The most progress was made by Rob Willey, one of the team's hardest workers. Although his playing time lagged at various stages of his UW career, he never quit during practice or the games. An all-academic award-winner, Rob graduated last May.

Every one of the seniors will graduate. Every one is a winner. It was a class to be remembered.





91 YEARS OF WISCONSIN BASKETBALL

Dec., **1898** - Six years after the advent of the new sport of basketball, Bob Burdick, John Mapel, Carl Stillman, Paul Stover, and Captain Walter Hirschberg make up the first Wisconsin Badger basketball team. Dr. J.C. Elsom is the first LIW coach.

Jan. 21, 1899 - Wisconsin plays its first game and is bested by the Milwaukee Normal Alumni, 25–15 in Milwaukee.

Mar. 4, 1899 - The Badgers play their first home game. The Milwaukee Normal Alumni edge Wisconsin, 13–10, and the Badgers finish 0–3.

Feb. 15, 1900 - Wisconsin defeats Wayland Academy, 25–15, for its first victory since the sport's inception.

Mar., **1902** - After completing a 10-game schedule—all on the road—the Badgers finish the year with a 7–3 mark, their first winning season.

Dec. 2, 1904 - Emmett Angell coaches the Badgers for the first time and watches his team drub Sparta's Company C, 75–10. Christian Steinmetz scores 50 points in the game to set a pre-modern, single-game scoring record.

Jan., 1905 - The Wisconsin basketball team makes its first road trip east. The Badgers finish the eastern swing of New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Ohio at 2–6.

Spring, 1905 - Christian Steinmetz finishes the season with 462 points, setting a Wisconsin season scoring mark that would stand for 61 years. Steinmetz is later named the Badgers' first all-American.

Mar. 15, 1907 - Wisconsin outscores Purdue, 37–10, to secure an 11–3 record record and a share of the Big Ten championship.

Mar. 16, 1912 - First year coach Walter Meanwell's team drops Indiana, 32–21 to complete an undefeated season at 15–0. Wisconsin wins the Big Ten title outright and will win or share that distinction seven more times before Meanwell is through coaching in 1934.

Mar. 16, 1918 - Despite dropping a 19–11 decision to Minnesota, first-year coach Guy Lowman's Badgers win the school's sixth Big Ten Championship in 12 years.

Fall, **1934** - Harold "Bud" Foster, a former all-American player with the Badgers, takes over as their head coach. Foster will hold that position for 25 years, longer than any other basketball coach in the history of the school.

Spring, 1935 - In his first year as head coach, Harold "Bud" Foster leads Wisconsin to the Big Ten title, posting a 15–5 record.

Mar. 29, 1941 - The "Cinderella" Badgers, lower division Big Ten finishers only one year before, top Washington State, 39–34 in the championship game of the NCAA tournament. John Kotz is named MVP of the tourney. The Badgers' captain, Gene Englund, is the Big Ten MVP and receives all-American accolades.

Spring, 1942 - For the second consecutive year, a Badger is named the conference MVP and all-American. Sharpshooting John Kotz earns those honors this season.

Mar., 1947 - The 15–5 Big Ten Champion Badgers are invited to play in the NCAA Eastern regionals in New York's Madison Square Garden. Wisconsin takes third place in the East by squeaking past Navy, 50–49, after losing the opener, 70–56, to C.C.N.Y. The conference championship and NCAA tournament bid stand as the last in Badger history.


Feb. 28, 1949 - Junior Don Rehfeldt takes 37 shots in a 70–47 trouncing of lowa. The 37 shots stands as a Wisconsin single-game record to the present.

Spring, 1950 - After being named the Big Ten's MVP, Don Rehfeldt becomes Wisconsin's last all-American to date. Rehfeldt finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,169 points.

Jan. 3, 1953 - Center Paul Morrow, in a 50-46 topping of Purdue, pulls down 30 rebounds in the contest—an all-time Badger best.

Mar. 11, 1963 - Senior Ken Siebel earns the team's MVP for the third straight year. This is the only time a Wisconsin player has earned that distinction three times.

Mar. 11, 1967 - With 12 seconds remaining in the season finale, sophomore Chuck Nagle makes a lay-up to tie Christian Steinmetz for the team single season scoring record of 462, set in 1904–05. Nagle was fouled on the play, and makes the free throw to set a record of 463.

Mar. 10, 1981 - Claude Gregory scores 29 points and grabs 17 rebounds in his last game in the Cardinal and White. Gregory leaves Wisconsin as its all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,745 and 904, respectively.

Dec. 2, 1985 - In a non-conference match-up with San Francisco State, senior Rick Olson makes 17 field goals en route to a 90–61 victory. Olson's 17 field goals tops the previous record of 16, set almost 27 years before by Bob Litzow.

Mar. 9, 1986 - Setting a school record by starting every game in his four-year career (112), Rick Olson guides Wisconsin past Northwestern, 70–68. Olson scores 26 points in the contest and misses becoming the Badgers' career scoring leader by only nine points. Olson does, however, set the record for points scored in a single season, finishing the 1985–86 campaign with 571 points.

Mar. 8, 1987 - Mike Heineman scores 20 points, grabs seven rebounds and hands out nine assists in his final

Mar. 2, 1968 - Senior Joe Franklin pulls down a careerhigh 27 rebounds in a 104–84 victory over Purdue in his final game in the Fieldhouse. Franklin ends his collegiate career one week later having amassed 858 boards in his three seasons with the Badgers, giving him a school best average of 286 per year.

Spring, 1968 - Only one year after Chuck Nagle broke a single season scoring record that stood for 62 years, senior Joe Franklin shatters the record, scoring 544 points in the 1967–68 season.

Spring, 1971 - Senior co-captain Clarence Sherrod scores 570 points in his final season as a Badger to take Wisconsin all-time single season scoring honors.

Mar. 3, 1979 - Facing eventual NCAA champion Michigan State in the regular season finale, Wisconsin's Wesley Matthews hits a shot from behind the half-court line as time expires to win, 83–81.

Dec. 30, 1979 - In the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, HI, the Badgers connect on 32 of 43 field goal attempts (.744), setting a school record and defeating Army, 78–54.



Aug. 21, 1988 - Danny Jones scores 53 points to lead the UW to a 120–118 victory over Taby of Sodertalje, Sweden's national champion. The Badgers ended their two-week tour of Denmark, Finland and Norway with an 8–0 record.

Mar. 15, 1989 - Badgers make first-ever appearance in the National Invitational Tournament and defeat New Orleans, 63–61. It was Wisconsin's first appearance in post-season play since 1947.

Mar. 20, 1989 - Danny Jones scores 24 points in the season finale against St. Louis. His total of 611 points established a UW single-season scoring record.

Nursing, Pharmacy, and Allied Health Professions Schools; UW Hospital and Clinics; State Laboratory of Hygiene; UW Health Service; and Wisconsin Clinical Cancer Center—one of 21 designated cancer centers in the country.

More than 400 campus organizations offer a wide variety of activities for Wisconsin students—including social, political, philosophic or religious, sports, honorary, ecological, philanthropic, drama and music groups, plus fraternities and sororities. Film societies show 400 titles a year, and the intramural recreation program services some 35,000 students and staff at five indoor recreational facilities every month.

The University's complete intercollegiate athletic program includes men's competition in football, basketball, ice hockey, track and field, soccer, swimming, tennis, rowing, wrestling, baseball, cross country, golf, gymnastics and fencing.

The Wisconsin Union has been providing a variety of services and an extensive program of social, cultural, and recreational events for students. Memorial Union, on the shores of Lake Mendota, is a cen-

ter of activity for some 18,000 people every day. Another 10,000 enter Union South, and more than 11,000 meals are served daily in the Wisconsin Union's 11 restaurants and delis.

The Elvehjem Museum of Art, the second largest art museum in the state, houses the University's collection of more than 10,000 paintings, prints, drawings, sculpture, and decorative arts dating from 2300 B.C. to the present, and maintains an active schedule of temporary exhibits.


University Theatre, School of Music, and the Dance Division offer a wide range of performances throughout the year. Facilities include the Ronald E. Mitchell and Gilbert Hemsley Theaters in Vilas Communication Hall, Mills Concert Hall, Morphy Recital Hall, and the Eastman Organ Recital Hall. The Wisconsin Union Theater, with 1,300 seats, hosts visiting concert artists, orchestras, professional theater and dance companies, conferences, lectures and films.




