# Media Information



## Credentials

All requests for credentials must be placed with the Wisconsin Sports Information Office in writing, at least one week in advance. All requests should be made on company letterhead. Upon receipt of applications, appropriate credentials are either mailed or available at the Sports Information Office or the Press Will-Call Window (Gate B of the Fieldhouse).

Credentials will be issued according to the following priority guidelines: 1) National publications and newspapers filing for the following day's publication. 2) All newspapers designated by the visiting sports information director. 3) Television and radio stations originating a live broadcast. 4) Television and radio stations covering for nightly news. 5) All other requests will be evaluated on a space-available basis, with preferences given to those who regularly cover Wisconsin basketball.

Spouses, dates, non-workers and children will not be allowed in the press area.

## Parking

A limited number of parking passes are available to working media. They will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Contact the Sports Information Office for further information.

## Radio

Each visiting radio station admitted for broadcast should contact the Sports Information Office at least one week prior to the game they wish to cover. Each radio station will be issued three tickets, which will be mailed upon receipt of necessary fees and signed contract. If tickets are not mailed, they may be picked up at the Sports Information Office, or on game day at the Press Will-Call Window. Radio facilities are located in the second balcony of the west side of the Fieldhouse.

## Photographers

Floor photo passes are limited to daily newspaper, wire service and television photographers. Photographers are



expected to display their credentials prominently at all times and must work from behind either baseline. No photographers will be permitted along the length of the floor. The University of Wisconsin follows NCAA and Big Ten guidelines regarding event photography.

## Press Row Services

Wisconsin's working facilities for the media are located on the west side of the Fieldhouse at the mezzanine level. Programs, media guides and game notes will be available on press row before each game. Halftime and final statistics will be furnished to all working locations. Soft drinks are available prior to the game, at halftime and following the game in the Reinke Room at the north end of the Fieldhouse.

## Telephones/Fax Machines

Telephone lines in the press area must be ordered at least one week in advance of the game(s) for which they are needed. Orders should be made through Wisconsin Bell (800/447-7738) during regular business hours. Several courtesy phones will be made available by the Wisconsin Sports Information Office.

Use of a facsimile machine may be arranged through the Sports Information Office prior to each game. There will be a charge of \$10 per game for this service.

## Player Interviews

The Wisconsin locker room will not be open to the media. Badger players will be available for interviews following all home games in the women's locker room, located in the southwest corner of the Fieldhouse on the lower level. Give the names of those players you wish to interview to Associate Sports Information Director John Estes prior to the end of the game. Players will be brought to the interview room after both coaches have been interviewed.

During the week, players will be available for interviews after practice. Practices are scheduled from 1:30-4 p.m. during the fall semester and from 4-6 p.m. during the winter semester. Please contact the Sports Information Office by noon to set up player interviews. No player interviews are granted the day of a game, until after the game.

Requests for collect-call telephone interviews may be made with John Estes at the Sports Information Office.


## Yoder Interviews

## Television Coverage

Badger basketball will be covered locally by WMTV-TV in 1991-92. WMTV sports director Mike Heller will call the play-by-play and former Badger head coach John Powless will provide color commentary. In addition to WMTV, Badger basketball can be seen on WXOW in LaCrosse, WSAU in Wausau, WGBA in Green Bay and WQOW in Eau Claire.

## Radio Coverage

Since 1989-90, exclusive coverage of Wisconsin basketball has been provided by WTMJ Radio (620 AM) in Milwaukee. WTMJ awarded the exclusive rights in Madison to WTSO Radio (1070 AM). WTSO sports director Matt Lepay calls the play-by-play, while veteran analyst Ron Blomberg handles the color commentary. WTMJ provides an exclusive state-wide network of more than 30 radio stations for all Badger games.

## The Steve Yoder TV Show

"The Steve Yoder Show" is in its second season with WMTV in Madison. Head coach Steve Yoder and WMTV sports director Mike Heller will keep a state-wide audience up-to-date during the 1991-92 season with Badger basketball happenings. The 30-minute program will feature insights, interviews, highlights and viewer questions. The program will be aired Sundays at 11 a.m. in Madison. The show will also air on WXOW in LaCrosse, WSAU in Wausau, WGBA in Green Bay and WQOW in Eau Claire. Check local listings for the times in those areas.

## The Steve Yoder Radio Show

Head coach Steve Yoder joins WTSO-AM sports director Matt Lepay for "The Steve Yoder Show" on the Badgers' radio network. The 60-minute show, which airs weekly during the season, will feature Yoder's analysis of the Badgers' season and include questions from the audience.




**Steve Malchow** is in his second year at Director of Sports Information at Wisconsin. He is in charge of publicity for all Badger men's sports programs.

Malchow, 30, worked from 1979-89 at the University of Iowa as a student, graduate and full-time assistant in the Hawkeye sports information office.

He is a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), which has honored more than 30 of his press guides for excellence. Malchow's 1985 football and basketball yearbooks were rated first and second in the nation, respectively.

**Julie Kluge** is in her second campaign as a full-time member of the UW Sports Information staff. She has worked for the Wisconsin athletic department since 1984.

# 1991-92 Outlook



*Sophomore Carlton McGee is the Badgers' top returning scorer from a year ago.*

Last year head coach Steve Yoder relied on four seniors as the Badgers posted a 15-15 record and advanced to the NIT for the second time in three seasons. In 1991-92, Yoder must count on seven newcomers and a group of eight returnees who started a combined 29 games to overcome the loss of five starters and six lettermen.

The five starters — Patrick Tompkins, Willie Simms, John Ellenson, Tim Locum and Larry Hisle — were the top five scorers in 1990-91 and accounted for 76 percent of the Badgers' points (1620 of 2123) and 70 percent of the team's rebounds (633 of 900) last year.

Tompkins averaged 14.1 points per game and led the Big Ten in rebounding (8.8) and field goal percentage (.636), the latter of which established a Wisconsin school record. He became Wisconsin's first first-team all-Big Ten performer since Cory Blackwell in 1984. Simms averaged 21.6 points during the Badgers' final five games to finish with a team-high 14.5 scoring average. He became

Wisconsin's 21st 1,000-point scorer, concluding his career with 1,015 points.

The other seniors, Locum and Ellenson, enjoyed solid seasons, averaging 11.0 and 6.7 points per game, respectively. Hisle, a sophomore who posted an 8.7 scoring average, transferred to Dayton after the season. The final loss was freshman guard Kass Weaver, who transferred to Richmond after seeing limited action last season.

## Returnees

Heading the list of returnees in 1991-92 is 6-7 sophomore forward Carlton McGee. He averaged 5.0 points and 1.7 rebounds in 26 contests last year and is the top returning scorer from last year's team. A sprained ankle just before the conference opener slowed his season somewhat, but he finished strong, scoring 18 points in the two NIT games. McGee is expected to hold down the starting power forward spot.

Junior center Damon Harrell, an academic all-Big Ten selection who averaged 1.0 points and 1.4 rebounds in 23 games last year, will vie for the starting center spot. The 6-9, 220-pounder will be counted on for physical play in the middle and to pick up the rebounding slack left by the departure of Tompkins, Simms and Ellenson.

The other frontcourt returnees are junior forward Louis Ely and sophomore center Grant Johnson. Ely, 6-7, registered 20 blocked shots in limited action last year. He gained nearly 20 pounds during the off-season and will be looked to for added rebounding and inside defense this year. The 7-0, 240-pound Johnson, an academic all-Big Ten honoree, adds height in the middle.


The backcourt is the Badgers' deepest and most experienced area as a trio of seniors — Brian Good, Jay Peters and Billy Douglass — return. Good averaged 4.3 points per game in 1991 and shot 44.9 percent from three-point range. Peters, a fifth-year senior, settled into the backup point guard slot last season, averaged 3.0 points and 1.8 assists per game and often sparked the team with his defensive play off the

bench. Douglass, another fifth-year senior, started 13 games at point guard a year ago and averaged 2.1 points per game. This season he should benefit by a return to his natural wing position. Sophomore Jason Johnsen, who played sparingly last year, will also vie for time.

## Newcomers

Wisconsin's success this season will depend largely upon the abilities of newcomers and recruits. Leading the group of new faces is 5-11 sophomore guard Tracy Webster, perhaps the first true point guard to don the Cardinal and White since Wes Matthews in the early 1980s. A product of Thornton Township High School and a two-time all-state selection in Illinois, Webster sat out last season due to Proposition 48 guidelines. He averaged 18.1 points and 14 assists per game as a senior and was rated as one of the top five point guards in the country following his prep career.

Other newcomers who will contribute include a pair of transfers — 6-6 guard Jay Schell and 6-10 center Jeff Petersen. Schell, a fifth-year senior whose father was a Badger co-captain in 1969,




has one year of eligibility remaining following his transfer from Bradley, where he was a three-year letterwinner for the Braves. The Stevens Point, Wis., native will challenge for the shooting guard position vacated by Locum.

Petersen, who played one year at Marshall University, was an honorable mention McDonald's all-America candidate as a prep in Mequon, Wis., and will battle for the starting center spot. Another Badger who will see his first game action in more than a year is redshirt freshman Howard Moore, an honorable mention all-Chicago selection at Taft High as a senior.

The freshman class of Brian Kelley, Michael Finley and Andy Kilbride makes up what is arguably the best class ever recruited at Wisconsin. The trio, all of whom were McDonald's all-America nominees, was ranked 22nd in the nation by *Hoop Scoop* magazine and 11th (among classes of three or fewer recruits) by *Bob Gibbons All-Star Sports Report*.

Kelley, a 6-7, 245-pound small forward from Decatur, Ga., averaged 23 points and 10 rebounds per game as a senior and was the DeKalb AAA Player of the Year. Rated the No. 54 prospect in

the country by *Hoop Scoop*, Kelley is expected to challenge for a starting forward spot.

Finley, a 6-6 swingman from Maywood, Ill., is an early favorite to win a spot in the starting lineup, either at the shooting guard or small forward spot. He helped lead his Proviso East team to a 32-1 record and the Class AA state championship as a senior and earned honorable mention all-America recognition from *Street & Smith's*.

Kilbride, a native of Kankakee, Ill., is an outside sharpshooter who hit a school record 204 three-point field goals as a prep, including a state record 10 three-pointers in one game.

### Yoder Quotes

"The success of this team is going to depend on its ability to play defense. I think we'll find ways to score even as a

young team. If we can become a good defensive team, then we should have a decent year.

"I think we have above-average quickness, above-average strength and above-average size, but I'm not sure how good a defensive and rebounding team we are right now. Rebounding has been a problem for us and we want to do a better job in that area. We now have some guys who can get off the floor, so we should be able to get more second and third chances than we have in the past.

"A strong work ethic is one thing that coaches are always impressed with, no matter what kind of team they have, and this team has worked extremely hard since the first day of conditioning. I think they realize this is a highly competitive conference year in and year out and that without great effort there's no chance to win."



# Head Coach Steve Yoder



The best three-year record in over 70 years, a steady increase in attendance to its highest mark in almost 40 years and two post-season appearances (only the third and fourth in school history) can be attributed to one man — Wisconsin head coach Steve Yoder. He is in his 10th year at Wisconsin and his 15th season as a collegiate head coach.

In guiding the Badgers to a 15-15 mark last season, Yoder became the third-winningest coach in Wisconsin history. He trails only Harold "Bud" Foster, who led UW to its only national championship in 1941, and Walter Meanwell, who coached for 20 years in the 1910s, '20s and '30s. Yoder, who has posted a 115-147 mark in his nine seasons at Wisconsin, needs just eight victories to reach the 200-win plateau for his career, having tallied a 192-209 record in 14 seasons.

The highlight of the 1990-91 season came when the Badgers earned their second NIT appearance in three years. As in 1989, when Wisconsin made the post-season for the first time in 42 years, Yoder's troops won their first post-season game. A loss to eventual NIT champion Stanford ended the Badgers' successful season.

Yoder's career at Wisconsin can be best viewed over the last three seasons, during which time his teams have posted a 47-44 record. That mark is the best three-year record at Wisconsin since 1916-18, when the Badgers went 49-7. Over the last three campaigns the Badgers have tallied 20 Big Ten victories, the highest total since 1967-69, when UW also won 20 league games.

When Yoder arrived in Madison in 1982-83, the average home attendance had dipped to nearly 5,000 in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse. During his first six seasons, attendance hovered between 7,500 and 8,000. In the last three seasons, however, attendance has been around or over the 10,000 mark for the first time since the late 1960s. Over the last two seasons, attendance has averaged more than 10,000 for the first time since the 1952 and 1953 seasons. For Big Ten games only, Yoder's Badgers drew an average of 10,884 per contest in 1991, the

highest figure since 1954. UW's crowd of 11,924 against Indiana last year was the highest single-game mark since 1979.

There is reason to think fans will continue to flow into the Fieldhouse this season, as Yoder has assembled what is arguably the best recruiting class in school history. The trio of Brian Kelley, Michael Finley and Andy Kilbride was ranked 11th in the country (of classes of three or fewer recruits) by *Bob Gibbons All-Star Sports Report* and 22nd in the nation by *Hoop Scoop*.

Recognition for Yoder's hard work and successes came this past summer when he was chosen by the Big Ten to lead a team of conference all-stars on a two-week trip through Sweden, Finland and Denmark. It was the first time in almost 20 years that a team of Big Ten all-stars had gone on a foreign tour. Yoder's club, which included Badgers Carlton McGee and Tracy Webster, posted a 7-2 record on the Scandinavian tour, including wins in its last seven games.

Yoder's most successful season with the Badgers came during the 1988-89 season when he guided his squad to a regular-season mark of 17-11 and advanced to the NIT. It was the first time since 1946-47 that a Wisconsin team had





appeared in post-season play and the first time since 1980 a winning record had been seen by Wisconsin fans.

The Badgers went 1-1 in the NIT, giving them a final record of 18-12 and the most victories since the national championship team of 1940-41 posted a 20-3 mark. In fact, only one other team in school history won that many games — the 1916 squad that went 20-1.

For his accomplishments, Yoder was named Kodak District XI Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Other awards included Midwest Coach of the Year by *Basketball Times* and Sportsman of the Year by the Madison Pen & Mike Club. He was runner-up in the Big Ten Coach of the Year balloting.

In his nine seasons at Wisconsin, Yoder has coached some of the finest players ever to don the Cardinal and White. Patrick Tompkins was a first-team all-Big Ten performer last season and became the first Badger player to earn first-team accolades since Cory Blackwell in 1984. Danny Jones concluded his career in 1990 as Wisconsin's all-time leading scorer, and Mike Heineman, who graduated in 1987, ended his career as the Badgers' all-time assist leader. Rick Olson and Trent Jackson, who rank in the top five in career scoring, also played for Yoder.

Yoder came to Madison from Ball State University, where he compiled a five-year mark of 77-62 during the 1978-82 seasons. He led the Cardinals to an NCAA berth in 1981 after winning the Mid-American Conference's post-season tournament. He was named MAC Coach

of the Year in 1980-81 and 1981-82 after the Cardinals won conference championships.

The cornerstone of those Cardinal teams was current Badger assistant coach Ray McCallum, who was voted Ball State's Player of the Decade last season. Another of Yoder's players, Johnny Williams — also a Badger assistant coach — made the honorable mention list on Ball State's All-Decade team.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Ball State, Yoder served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Cardinals. Prior to his stint at Ball State he served for three years (1973-75) as an assistant coach at Furman, where he helped lead the Paladins to back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1974 and 1975.

Yoder began his coaching career in 1967 at his prep alma mater — Plymouth High School in Plymouth, Ind. During the next six seasons, Yoder's teams registered a 106-35 mark and earned three conference championships, three sectional crowns and two regional titles. Two of his teams finished in the top ten in state rankings and he was named Coach of the Year in Indiana's District 1 in 1973.

Yoder has served on several advisory boards, including Nike, Rawlings, Reebok, Converse and MacGregor. He has spoken at clinics around the country, as well as the Syrian Basketball Federation in 1981 and the Japanese Basketball Federation in 1983.

A native of Plymouth, Ind., Yoder attended Illinois Wesleyan on a basketball and baseball scholarship and earned his bachelor's degree in 1962. He earned a master's degree from St. Francis College in Fort Wayne, Ind., in 1970.



# Assistant Coaches



**Ray McCallum**

Ray McCallum is in his eighth year with the Wisconsin basketball program. His responsibilities include recruiting, scouting and coaching the Badgers' perimeter players.

McCallum was an integral factor in helping the Badgers sign this season's recruiting class, which ranks as one of the best in Wisconsin history. The class has been ranked 11th in the country (for classes of three or less recruits) by *Bob Gibbons All-Star Sports Report* and 22nd in the country overall by *Hoop Scoop*. Besides his recruiting duties, McCallum is Yoder's top assistant. This summer he served as an assistant to Yoder on the Big Ten All-Star tour of Scandinavia.

McCallum, a former Ball State standout, played three seasons for his current boss, Steve Yoder. McCallum, who last year was voted Ball State's Player of the Decade, earned first-team all-conference honors three times and helped lead the Cardinals to a pair of conference titles.


He played in the 1981 NCAA tournament following Ball State's victory in the Mid-American Conference tournament, was named the MAC's Most Valuable Player as a senior and concluded his collegiate career as the all-time leading scorer in school and conference history.

The 5-9 guard also received the 1983 Francis Pomeroy Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Award as the nation's outstanding collegiate basketball player under six feet. McCallum, who was

drafted by the Indiana Pacers, received his degree in industrial technology in 1984 and then served as a graduate assistant coach at Ball State for one season before joining Yoder at Wisconsin.

A native of Muncie, Ind., McCallum played on back-to-back state championship teams at Muncie Central in 1978 and '79.

The 30-year old McCallum and his wife, Wendy, have a two-year-old daughter, Brittany Rae, and an infant son, Ray Jr. This summer, McCallum teamed with fellow UW assistant coach Johnny Williams and others to win the three-on-three championship at the Badger State Games.



**Johnny Williams**

Johnny Williams begins his third season at Wisconsin working for his former coach, Steve Yoder. Williams' duties include recruiting and working with the Badgers' inside players.

The 32-year old Williams was instrumental in helping Patrick Tompkins become Wisconsin's first first-team all-Big Ten performer in seven years last season. To Williams' credit, Tompkins became the first player since 1983 (Kevin Willis, Michigan State) to lead the conference in rebounding and field goal percentage in all games. Tompkins left Wisconsin as the school's all-time leading field goal shooter and the 11th leading rebounder.

Williams came to Wisconsin from Earlham College in Richmond, Ind.,

where he served as the head coach for four seasons. Prior to that appointment, he was an assistant at Ball State for three seasons.

The former Ball State Cardinal was a three-year starter for Yoder. A teammate of Badger assistant coach Ray McCallum, Williams was a member of BSU's 1981 NCAA tournament team that tied for the conference title and won the Mid-American Conference's post-season tournament. The following season, he captained the Cardinals to a conference title.

For his accomplishments, Williams was named to the honorable mention squad of Ball State's All-Decade team for the '80s.

Williams earned bachelor's (1982) and master's (1985) degrees in physical education from Ball State.

He and his wife, Damita, have one son, Nicholas (1). Williams teamed up with Badger assistant Ray McCallum and others to win the three-on-three championship at the Badger State Games this summer.



**Chuck Schramm**

Chuck Schramm enters his third season as a member of the Badger coaching staff. Besides his coaching duties, Schramm serves as UW's head scout, directs the Badger summer camps and is the executive director of the Badger Basketball Booster Club.

Schramm came to Wisconsin after serving for two seasons as the head coach

at Rockford College in Illinois. While at Rockford, he became one of the most active camp motivational speakers in the Midwest. Basketball Trainer



Strength & Conditioning


John Dettman, 31, serves as the strength and conditioning coach for the Wisconsin basketball program.

# Season in Review



## Four Senior Starters Bid Farewell in 1990-91

**I**t was a chilly evening on March 18, 1991. Around 9:30 p.m., the loud hum of the scoreboard buzzer pierced the air of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

The final horn marked the end of Wisconsin's season. The Badgers had lost to Stanford, 80-72, in the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. At that same moment, the basketball careers of four popular Wisconsin seniors came to an end.


Patrick Tompkins, the Badgers' 6-6 center, culminated his collegiate career by leading the Badgers and the Big Ten in rebounding (8.3) and field goal percentage (.636), the latter of which set a school record. Tompkins, whose rim-bending dunks frequently sparked Fieldhouse crowds, averaged 14.1 points per game and earned first-team all-Big Ten accolades. He became the first Badger since Cory Blackwell in 1984 to be named to the team.

Also finishing his farewell tour was Willie Simms, who paced the Badgers with a 14.5 scoring average and became Wisconsin's 21st 1,000-point scorer (1,015). Always enthusiastic, Simms was the Badgers' top defender and led the team in steals his last two seasons.

Tim Locum, the Badgers' three-point specialist, pitched in 11.0 points per game as a senior and scored 1,077 points in his career. He connected on a school-record 227 three-pointers in his career.

Finally, the surprising career of John Ellenson came to an end with that final buzzer. The 6-9 forward averaged just two points per game as a junior, but came alive for the Badgers in his final campaign. He finished third on the team with 33 three-pointers and hounded opponents with a relentless defensive game.

The senior-dominated Badger team finished 15-15 overall and 8-10 in the Big

Ten Conference. Steve Yoder's squad contended for a first-division finish in the conference until the final game, but wound up in seventh place.

The farewell tour for the Badger veterans began on a high note, with a heart-stopping overtime victory at Oregon in the season opener. Guard Jay Peters nailed a three-pointer at the buzzer to give Wisconsin a 72-70 win.

Victories over San Francisco State at home and Southern Methodist on the road put the Badgers at 3-0 as they traveled to the Bradley Center in Milwaukee to face state rival Marquette.

Before a crowd of more than 16,000, the Warriors handed Wisconsin its first blemish of the season by winning 69-58. The game started a mini-slide for the Cardinal and White, as they lost the next three games.

However, Wisconsin was able to regain its momentum and win three straight before its Big Ten opener against rival Minnesota. Before a national ESPN television audience, the Badgers topped

the Golden Gophers 72-62.

Following two road losses, the Badgers knocked off Iowa 91-79 at the Fieldhouse. The next game was possibly the toughest loss of the year.

On its home court, Wisconsin dropped a 69-68 overtime contest to Michigan. The Badgers led by as many as 16 points in the game and had a chance to win it in the overtime period when Larry Hisle was awarded two free throws with no time left on the clock. He missed both of them and the Wolverines escaped with the win.

Wisconsin rebounded by knocking off Northwestern in Evanston and demolishing Purdue 66-44 in Madison. That victory over Purdue snapped a 26-game losing streak at the hands of the Boilermakers. Two more losses after the Purdue game set the stage for perhaps the biggest win of the year.

Led by Tompkins, who connected on seven of 12 field goals and eight of 11 free throws, the Badgers posted an 84-78 double-overtime victory over 25th-ranked Michigan State. Hisle hit seven-of-eight free throws in overtime to help spark the Badgers.

After a 73-71 loss to eventual Big Ten co-champion Ohio State in the Fieldhouse, the Badgers traveled to Iowa City. Brian Good hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to give the Badgers their fifth straight win over the Hawkeyes, 56-55. The win, which was the 1,000th in school history, evened the Badgers' conference record at 6-6.

Wisconsin posted a 2-4 mark in its final six games. For the second time in three years, the Badgers earned a berth in the NIT.

An enthusiastic crowd watched Wisconsin nip Bowling Green State 87-79 in overtime during the first-round game at the Fieldhouse. But the Stanford Cardinal — eventual NIT champions — proved to be too much in the second-round game.





# Chancellor Donna Shalala



**D**r. Donna E. Shalala, the first woman to lead a Big Ten University, has been the chancellor at UW-Madison since 1988.

As the leader of the nation's fifth largest university and the largest public research institution, Dr. Shalala has demonstrated a dynamic and energetic approach to dealing with issues in education.

During her tenure at Wisconsin, Dr. Shalala has launched efforts to strengthen undergraduate education; to be more competitive in recruiting and retaining top faculty, staff and students; to upgrade research facilities; to increase opportunities for women and members of minority groups on campus; and to strengthen the university's research program.

Dr. Shalala has garnered high

national visibility during the past year. She was named one of the top five managers in higher education by *Business Week* and was tagged one of the 50 most powerful women in the United States by *Ladies Home Journal*.

In the athletic environment, Dr. Shalala has been a leader in restructuring the UW Athletic Department. She also serves on the Knight Commission, a national panel that is charting reform in intercollegiate athletics.

Prior to her arrival at Wisconsin, Dr. Shalala served for seven years as president of Hunter College. She served on the faculty at Columbia University and as Assistant Secretary for Policy Development and Research of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development during the Carter administration.

She is a member of the National Academy of Public Administration and the National Academy of Education and has received more than a dozen honorary degrees.

Public service has been a hallmark of her career. She spent two years in the Peace Corps. She is vice chair of the Children's Defense Fund, a trustee of the Committee for Economic Development, a member of the board of directors of Spelman College, the Brookings Institution, the American Ditchley Foundation, the Institute for International Economics and the Spencer Foundation.

Chancellor Shalala earned her bachelor's degree from Western College for Women (Oxford, Ohio) in 1962 and her doctoral degree from Syracuse University in 1970.



The University of Wisconsin has maintained a long tradition of excellence, as reflected in its place on the Top Ten lists in every objective national faculty reputational survey since 1910. One recent survey rated 68 different undergraduate programs at Wisconsin among the Top Ten in the nation.

# Athletic Director Pat Richter



**P**at Richter, a name synonymous with success in Madison and at the University of Wisconsin, is in his second season as Athletic Director of his alma mater.

Named to his position on Dec. 15, 1989, Richter is in charge of one of the nation's most successful collegiate athletic programs. He directs a program which has 20 sports, nearly 1,000 athletes, more than 160 employees and a large physical plant.

Since Richter's takeover, the Wisconsin Athletic Department has made giant strides. Richter first lured Barry Alvarez from Notre Dame to head the football program. Richter oversaw an improvement in facilities boosting UW's ranking to among the nation's best. He also helped regain program support from every corner of the state.

In his opening year on the job, Richter saw both the hockey team and crew win national championships and track star Suzy Favor capture the Broderick Cup, an award given to the nation's top female athlete. Clearly, UW athletics are on the upswing and Richter is the driving force.

As a 6-6, 230-pound student-athlete at Wisconsin, Richter excelled in football, basketball and baseball. He earned three varsity letters in each and is the last nine-time letterwinner in school history.

He earned all-America (1961, '62), academic all-America (1962) and all-Big Ten (1961, '62) honors in football as an end and helped lead the Badgers to the 1962 Big Ten championship and a berth in the memorable 1963 Rose Bowl game against USC. In that contest he set a Rose Bowl record with 11 pass receptions for 163 yards. He led the Big Ten in pass receiving in 1961 and 1962 and ranks third on Wisconsin's career receiving list with 110 catches for 1,710 yards and 14 touchdowns.

After his senior football season, he was the recipient of Wisconsin's 1963 Big Ten Medal of Honor (for proficiency in scholarship and athletics), received the Knute Rockne Memorial Award as the country's top lineman from the Washington Touchdown Club and was selected to play in both the *Chicago Tribune* All-Star and Hula Bowl postseason games.

As an outfielder for the Badger baseball team, he earned first-team all-Big Ten recognition in 1963, owned a career batting average of .353 and led the Badgers in hits, home runs and RBI three consecutive seasons.

Richter earned his bachelor's degree in landscape architecture in 1964 and was interested in becoming a golf course architect.

Following his collegiate career, he was a first-round draft choice of the Washington Redskins and played as both an end and a punter from 1963-71. He caught three touchdown passes from Sonny Jurgensen in the Redskins' 1968 season opener against the Chicago Bears. In 1969 he played under legendary coach Vince Lombardi, later recalling it as "perhaps my greatest learning experience in terms of how to look at the realities of life itself."

Richter earned his law degree from Wisconsin in 1971 and retired from professional football in September of that year.


Richter spent the next six months with a Madison law firm, then went to work for Oscar Mayer Corporation, where he held positions at offices in Madison, Nashville and Rye Brook and White Plains, N.Y. Most recently he

served as Vice President of Personnel at the company's head office in Madison.

Among his achievements, Richter was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for post-college achievements in 1988. He is a member of the Wisconsin State Athletic and Madison Sports Halls of Fame, the NFL Player and Alumni Associations and the American Bar Association.

Richter is a regular contributor to many charitable organizations, including the UW Children's Hospital and the Four Lakes Boy Scouts.

Richter and his wife, Renee, have four children: Scott, Brad, Barry and Tim. Barry is a member of the Badger hockey team.

# Wisconsin Fieldhouse



The Wisconsin Fieldhouse has been the home of the Badgers since 1930. The building was a project of former athletic director George Little when he arrived at Wisconsin-Madison in 1925.

In 1927, Little proposed to the athletic council and regents the plan under which the fieldhouse was to be constructed. This proposal met the approval of the board after two previous attempts had failed.

The original layout included a \$650,000 building to house both an indoor training facility for intercollegiate teams and the required program of physical education. The portion to be used for intercollegiate athletics was estimated at \$385,000.

The intercollegiate section of the facility housed the men's and women's basketball teams and the wrestling squad. Its construction, completed in 1931, cost approximately \$434,000.

The structure remains a part of Camp Randall Stadium, standing on the south end of the field, with concrete stands built against its north wall. The fieldhouse originally contained a basketball floor with a seating capacity of 12,000, a complete track facility, and room for indoor football and baseball training.

The football, track and field and baseball teams moved to the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center, better known as "the Shell," upon its completion in 1956.

In April of 1976, the state Building Commission approved \$718,000 for the renovation of the fieldhouse. The project was aimed at improving the seating facility and allowing for other activities to be held in the building.

Permanent bleachers were added to the north, south and west sides of the court, with portable seats and a stage area on the east side. This effort brought the seating capacity to 11,886. New locker rooms and a training facility were constructed under the west stands and the existing locker rooms were renovated.

A new lighting system was added in 1977, along with an improved sound system. A state-of-the-art scoreboard was installed prior to the 1991-92 season.

In addition to serving as the home for the UW wrestling, volleyball and men's and women's basketball teams, the fieldhouse is the site of the WIAA boys' and girls' state basketball tournaments, the WIAA state wrestling tournament, concerts and numerous other events.




## A World-Class University

The University of Wisconsin–Madison, one of the world's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students assembled February 5, 1849. Today, the UW–Madison ranks as the nation's fourth largest university with 43,695 students, 11 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, 14,000 employees, over 5 million volumes in 28 libraries, and a \$1 billion budget. The University's national ranking of fifth in research and development expenditures supports its reputation as a world-class research institution.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. In what may be the most extensive survey done on graduate level education—the five-volume *Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States*—Wisconsin finished eighth in the nation, tied with Michigan and UCLA.

More than 4,100 courses and 12,600 sections are offered at UW–Madison. Majors are available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's, and 123 doctor's and pro-

fessional degree programs.


Some of the UW's departments ranked among the top ten nationally in recent years include sociology, mathematics, chemical engineering, economics, political science, zoology, geography, statistics, history, plant pathology, molecular biology, biochemistry, Spanish, and German.

Much of the University's international academic reputation stems from the quality of its faculty. UW–Madison faculty or alumni have been awarded 11 Nobel Prizes, with Professor Howard Temin receiving the most recent prize in 1975 for his study of retroviruses.

The UW's Center for Health Sciences is one of the Midwest's leading centers for patient care, research and public service, and education of physicians and other health professionals. It includes the professional schools of medicine, nursing, and pharmacy; UW Hospital and Clinics; the State Laboratory of Hygiene; UW Health Service; and the Wisconsin Clinical Cancer Center—one of 21 designated cancer centers in the country.

The Elvehjem Museum of Art, the second largest art museum in the state, houses the University's collection of more than 10,000 paintings, prints, drawings, sculpture, and decorative arts dating from 2300 B.C., and maintains an active schedule of temporary exhibits.





## A Scenic Campus




Located between Lakes Mendota and Monona, amid rolling hills and wooded areas, Madison is one of the nation's most beautiful campuses.

The city was designed so the University and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of the academic and political life of Wisconsin.

Two major films, including the 1986 summer hit *Back To School* starring Rodney Dangerfield, have been shot on the picturesque UW campus.

Tree-lined Bascom Hill, which features a bronze statue of Abraham Lincoln, is one of the University's most famous landmarks. Others include North Hall (the first building on campus), Van Hise (the UW's tallest building at 19 stories), Library Mall, with its clock tower and fountain, and Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula complete with hiking and biking trails—one of the most romantic spots on campus.

A favorite area for UW students to congregate is the Memorial Union and its lakeside terrace. Here students can study or socialize against a backdrop of sailboats, canoes, sailboards, kayaks and swimmers, while enjoying the sunshine and cool breezes from Lake Mendota.




## The Student Body

Over 43,000 students populate the 900-acre UW campus, including more than 9,500 graduate students in numerous fields.

Although a UW Board of Regents policy limits undergraduate enrollment from outside the state to 25 percent, the University still maintains one of the nation's most diverse student bodies.




Students hail from every county in the state and every state in the nation, as well as from approximately 125 foreign countries. UW-Madison ranks fourth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment.

A greater effort is also being made to recruit and retain minority students. In 1990, African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and other minority



groups accounted for 6.86 percent of the student body, an increase from 5 percent ten years ago.

The University's diversity is also evident in the more than 500 student groups. Organizations ranging from political action groups and student newspapers to recreational clubs, fraternities and sororities allow students to extend their collegiate life beyond the classroom. Film societies show 400 titles a year, and the intramural recreation program services some 35,000 students and staff at five indoor recreational facilities every month.




## The Community

With a diverse population of 191,000, the Madison community offers an endearing quality of life for full-time residents and students. One recent survey rated 49 undergraduate programs at the UW-Madison among the top ten in the nation. The university has also ranked third for the last several years in research funding among the nation's universities.

In data taken from the 1983 *Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States*, Wisconsin tied for eighth in reputation for scholarly quality and second on the basis of faculty publications.





## UW-Madison Sets the Pace;

□ with the oldest Scandinavian studies (1875), psychology (1888), agricultural economics (1909) and genetics (1910) departments in the United States □ in discovering Vitamins A and B □ with the oldest radio station in the nation—WHA—which began broadcasting in 1917 □ by establishing the country's first graduate program in public utilities, within the School of Business (1929) □ with the development of Moh's Micrographic Surgery Technique, a process named for UW Medical School emeritus professor of surgery Dr. Frederick Mohs to remove external cancers, such as mouth, lip and skin cancer □ as the Memorial Union became the first public university union to serve beer in 1933 □ in finding in 1937 that niacin supplementation prevents pellagra, a deadly disease that killed 5,000 people a year □ with the nation's first department of wildlife management in 1939 □ in the synthesizing of genes. Biochemistry professor Har Gobind Khorana synthesizes the first gene, for which he later receives the Nobel Prize in 1968 □ in finding which wavelength of ultraviolet light produces skin cancer □ in discovering the anti-cancer drug, fluorouracil □ as Elizabeth and James Miller, UW Medical School professor of oncology and professor emeritus of oncology, were the first to identify characteristics among chemicals that cause cancer

□ with the Orbiting Astronomical Observatory, the world's first true observatory in space □ in revolutionizing brain surgery, as Dr. Manucher Javid, UW Medical School professor of surgery, became the first neurosurgeon to use a solution from the age-old compound area during brain surgery on a human □ in developing tests for phenylketonuria (PKU), a congenital disease of children □ as UW-Madison researchers describe the atomic structure of a common cold virus □ in developing new techniques to measure bone tissue loss, known as osteoporosis □ with the Biotron, a research building that can control environmental conditions for experimental purposes □ with bone marrow transplants. Using techniques developed at UW-Madison, the first bone marrow transplant in the U.S. is done at UW Hospital. Today, more than 10,000 transplants are performed yearly, giving new hope to patients with leukemia and immune deficiency diseases □ in finding evidence linking cancer in laboratory animals with saccharine and cyclamates □ in finding that the anti-estrogen drug tamoxifen can prevent breast cancer from recurring in certain women who have had cancer previously □ as UW Hospital and Clinics develop the nation's first Mobile Critical Care Unit, which duplicates facilities of a hospital intensive care unit and laboratories □ with the first and only medical physics department in the nation to exist within a

medical school □ with the establishment of the Center for Dairy Research, the nation's first such center to be established at a university □ in organ preservation breakthroughs. In 1987, Dr. Folkert Belzer used a cold storage preservation solution to preserve dog livers up to 36 hours and dog pancreases up to 72 hours. Clinical use of this new solution decreases the need for emergency transplantation, increases the number of livers and pancreases available to people who need transplants, and improves organ sharing among transplant centers.



## UW Traditions



### Bucky Badger

Although badgers in various forms had been the UW-Madison mascot for decades, the version that is currently known as "Bucky" was first drawn in 1940 by professional illustrator Art Evans. In 1949, a pep rally contest was held to determine the best name for Madison's mascot. The name Buckingham U. Badger arose at the drawing and credit was given to a randomly selected sorority. The name is said by some to have originated in a line from "On Wisconsin" that exhorts the UW football team to "buck right through that line."

### Band Caps

When one of the Badger teams wins a game, the members of the band turn their hats around and wear them backwards. According to UW Band Director Michael Leckrone, the practice started in the 1920s to symbolize the band looking back at their victory in the days when they marched out with the departing crowd.





## Graduating Law Students

The custom originated at Harvard and came to the UW–Madison in 1910.

## Halloween

In 1979, the Wisconsin Student Association began sponsoring what for years had been a spontaneous event—the annual Halloween State Street costume party. The party grew in size and fame each year as costumed revelers filled the eight blocks between the Capitol and the Mall. In 1988, WSA sponsored its first non-alcoholic indoor party at the fieldhouse.


## “On, Wisconsin”

The tune was composed in 1909 by William Purdy of Chicago, with words written by UW alumnus Carl Beck, who rewrote them in 1951. The song was an instant hit at the UW–Madison campus and soon spread throughout the world, being very popular with military bands. Some 2,500 schools and colleges have adopted the music and changed the words to suit their needs. The copyright to “On Wisconsin” is currently owned by Michael Jackson, who purchased the music a few years ago from former Beatle Paul McCartney.

## “Varsity”

The traditional arm-waving at the end of the song “Varsity” was the 1934 brainchild of then-UW band leader Ray Dvorak. He came up with the idea after witnessing University of Pennsylvania students wave their caps after losing a game. Dvorak later instructed UW students to wave as a salute to UW President Glenn Frank.

## Camp Randall

During the Civil War, Camp Randall was used as both a training ground, the state’s largest Army staging point, and a



## Abraham Lincoln Statue

Unveiled in 1909 as a gift of the sculptor Adolph Weinman, the statue is the only replica of one he had previously erected in Hodgenville, Kentucky—Lincoln’s birthplace. However, the inscription attributes the gift to Madisonian Thomas Brittingham, who had paid for the casting of the statue and its pedestal.

Lincoln is considered a patron of the

hospital and stockade for confederate prisoners. Today it is owned by the university and is the home of intercollegiate athletic and recreational facilities, a small park, and the Memorial Arch, completed in 1912.

### **Bascom Hall**

Bascom Hall was constructed in stages to become the large building it is today. Bascom was originally called University Hall and later Main Hall. In 1920 it was renamed for John Bascom, president from 1874 to 1887. The architecture is of the classic Italian High Renaissance (Federal classic), Wren-modified. The building's original ornate dome was destroyed by fire in 1916. Bascom Hall houses the UW-Madison's main administrative offices including the Chancellor's office, Dean of Students office and Graduate School. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as part of the Bascom Hill Historic District.




### **Memorial Library**

Dedicated to those who died in our nation's wars, Memorial Library is the main research library. Along with the catalog for the holdings for campus libraries, Memorial houses the Mills Music Library, the official archives of the university, and an extensive rare books collection.



### **Memorial Union**

Memorial Union has been called the "living room of the campus." With additions added steadily over the last half century, the Union now includes several dining rooms, theaters, study halls and game rooms, as well as the lakeside terrace. In 1933, Memorial Union became the first public university union in the country to sell beer.



### **North and South Halls**

North Hall was the first building erected by the University (1851), serving as a dormitory for male students. Later it was converted into a classroom and office space. In 1966, North Hall became a National Historic Landmark. It now houses the political science department.

South Hall has had a wide variety of uses, including housing the old Department of Agriculture and the Hygienic Laboratory. Now it houses the dean and administrative staff of the College of Letters and Science.

### **Red Gym**

Built in the Norman style in 1894, with Romanesque arches and heavy turrets, the Red Gym was originally intended as an armory and a gymnasium for men's physical education. A fire during the Vietnam protest era closed the gym for a few months in 1970. The building was included in the Bascom Hill Historic District in 1974. The report of a campus committee studying renovation in 1989 called the gym "a gateway building to the campus because of its central location and its historic architecture—a friendly and welcoming place for visitors, prospective students and their parents, and primarily undergraduates from all our academic schools and colleges."

### **Van Hise Hall**


Built in 1967, at 19 stories, Van Hise is the tallest building on campus. The 17th floor houses the administration of the University of Wisconsin System. Van Hise Hall is to the UW System what Bascom Hall is to UW-Madison. Several foreign language departments make their homes here, and classrooms are located in the lower five floors.



## Scholarships

UW-Madison is proud to offer to its prospective student-athletes one of the most comprehensive athletic scholarship programs in the nation. As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year basis, renewable yearly if scholastic and athletic commitment are maintained.

Full and partial scholarships are available in all varsity sports with the exception of rowing, which does not grant scholarships. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board in addition to tuition and fees. Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the student-athletes.



# Wisconsin Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from some of the finest sports facilities found anywhere in the country. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its women athletes.

The basketball and volleyball teams practice and compete in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse, which seats 12,204. The Fieldhouse features four remodeled locker rooms and a modern athletic training area. Other recent additions include a new lighting system and new sound system.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage in their ability to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the United States. In 1984, the Nielsen Tennis Stadium was ranked by the USTA as the number one indoor tennis facility. It seats 1,500 spectators and is valued at over \$8 million. It features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, and one squash doubles court. The stadium, located close to the lakeshore dormitories, is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

Wisconsin's track teams benefit from practicing and competing during the indoor season in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center. Located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, the "Shell" contains a 220-yard Mondo rubber track, throwing and jumping areas in the infield, and a seating capacity of 2,500.

During the outdoor season, Wisconsin track and cross country athletes will be able to use the 400-meter, Mondo rubber outdoor track, located on the west side of campus, once construction is completed in 1993. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, dedicated in honor of the former Wisconsin head men's track and cross country coach, was the site of the 1986 Men's and Women's Big Ten Outdoor Track Championships. Planning and fund-raising are underway for the next phase of construction: the addition of permanent spectator seating with press box and locker room facilities.

The swimming and diving teams have the luxury of two pools for practice and competition—the Natatorium adjacent to Unit II, and the new Unit III facility, or SERF. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with an automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter



Opened in 1988, the McClain Athletic Facility offers indoor practice facilities for football, soccer and track and field. A 90-yard artificial turf practice area is contained in the 76,380 square foot main floor.

Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The recently completed SERF facility features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

Outdoor facilities at Wisconsin include soccer fields near the University Hospital. The crew boat house, situated on Lake Mendota, provides the Badger crews with a modern facility, including an indoor rowing tank for year-round practice. Construction was recently com-

pleted on an additional shell storage area, and other construction plans include a second indoor rowing tank and additional locker room space.

Our teams also have access to several other facilities on campus. The McClain Athletic Facility offers an indoor practice facility for football, soccer and track, as well as lockers for both the men's and women's track teams. The Natatorium and SERF feature numerous multipurpose gyms, weight rooms, run-

ning tracks, and other athletic facilities for practice and competition.

Other facilities that are an integral part of the athletic program are the co-educational weight training and sports medicine rooms in Camp Randall Stadium. The modern weight training area features Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in a spacious, carpeted room. Two full-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes.

The care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a six-person staff of N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. They are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and two certified graduate assistants as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff may use training rooms in the Stadium, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.


