

**From Indiana Toll Road (I-90) Westbound:** Take I-90 to Exit 17 (US-12/US-20/Dunes Highway). Continue West on Dunes Highway. Stadium will be on left.

**From Indiana Toll Road (I-90) Eastbound:** Take I-90 to exit at Broadway Ave. Turn right on Broadway Ave. Drive two stoplights to 5th Ave. Take left on 5th Ave. Stadium will be on left.

**From I-65:** North to end of highway at US-12/US-20/Dunes Highway. Turn left on US-12/US-20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

**From I-80/I-94:** Take I-80/I-94 to I-65 North all the way to end of highway at US-12/US-20/Dunes Highway. Turn left on US-12/US-20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

#### Public Transportation

**Train (Chicago-South Bend):** The South Shore Line runs daily form downtown Chicago to South Bend, Ind., with a convenient stop just outside U.S. Steel Yard. Just take any South Shore Line Train to the Gary Metro Center spot and walk one block east on 4th Avenue to the front gate!

**Bus:** The Gary Public Transportation Corporation has buses running throughout Northwest Indiana, including stops in Merrillville and Crown Point. Convenient stops are available just outside U.S. Steel Yard.

#### <u>Parking</u>

Parking at The Steel Yard is FREE year-round and available within comfortable walking distance of the front gate! The RailCats main general admission lot is located next to the Diamond Club just to the east of The Steel Yard. The lot can be accessed from either direction by turning onto Virginia Street off 4th and 5th Avenues. Parking is also available to the east and west of the stadium off 4th and 5th Avenues and just south of the ballpark. The RailCats V.I.P. lot for Season Ticket holders is located on the Stadium Plaza Drive adjacent to The Steel Yard and is only accessible with a V.I.P. parking pass.

## MEDIA POLICIES

The Gary SouthShore RailCats Media Relations Department is responsible for addressing all media inquiries and facilitating media access to information including interview requests, authorizing credentials, and ensuring a professional work environment for all media representatives visiting U.S. Steel Yard.

#### Credentials

The Gary SouthShore RailCats offer both full-season and single-game credentials for covering the team during the 2019 season. All credential requests must be made at least 24 hours in advance of a game that would be covered. Credentialed media will be admitted to the field prior to the game and will receive food and beverage. The RailCats reserve the right to refuse or revoke credentials at any time.

#### **Press Box**

The press box is located on the suite level directly behind home plate. It is open four hours before each scheduled game and will close 60 minutes after the conclusion of the game. Updated rosters, lineups, statistics, game notes, and press releases will be made available prior to each game. There are no assigned seats in the working area of the press box aside from the scoreboard operator and official scorer positions.

A secure wireless internet and phone access will be available to all media members working in the press box. The U.S. Steel Yard press box is a working environment, and, as such, there is to be absolutely no cheering or profanity at any time. Any such behavior will result in immediate revocation of credential privileges. The Gary SouthShore RailCats promote a family-frinedly atmosphere but do ask those in attendance to be mindful that the press box is a professional working area and should be treated as such at all times.

Seeking autographs from RailCats personnel or other celebrities while possessing a RailCats Media Credential is prohibited and strictly enforced. The consumption of alcohol is also strictly prohibited while in possession of a RailCats Media Credential.

#### **Interview Requests**

All interview requests for players, coaches, and front office members must be made 24 hours in advance. Players and coaches will be made available for interviews prior to and after each game. No day of game requests for pre-game interviews will be honored.

Players and coaches are subject to availability upon request to the Gary SouthShore RailCats media relations staff. All interview requests can be made through Director of Broadcasting and Media Ryan Zimmerman via email, phone, or in person.


#### Still Photographers and Videographers

Still photographers have access to photography throughout the stadium, provided it does not interfere with the game or a fan's view. Camera wells located at the far ends of the first and third base dugouts can be utilized by still photographers during game action.

Videographers are allowed to set up for shooting behind home plate on the main course or within the camera wells in each dugout. There is absolutely no photography or recording of video inside the team clubhouses.






Ryan Zimmerman joins the RailCats in 2022 as the Director of Broadcasting and Media Relations.







Lamarr Rogers enters his first season as the manager of the Gary SouthShore RailCats. He is the first new manager since 2005 and the fourth manager in team history. He is the team's first African-American manager since Garry Templeton in 2003-04 and the first in the American Association since Vince Moore managed the Shreveport-Bossier Captains in 2011. He is also the third African-American manager across the four MLB Partner Leagues.

Rogers began his managerial career with the Houston Astros organization. In 2015, he was named the manager of the Greenville Astros, the team's rookie league affiliate. He helped guide them to the Appalachian League Championship that season and won the league's Co-Manager of the Year Award. Rogers managed the following season with the Tri-City ValleyCats, the organization's short-season affiliate.

Prior to joining the Astros organization, Rogers spent 14 seasons in the American Association with the St. Paul Saints. There, he held various roles including assistant coach, hitting coach, first base coach, and third base coach. In 2004, the Saints batted .285 as a team en route to the Northern League Championship.

As a player, the Colorado Rockies drafted Rogers in the 42nd round of the 1992 Major League Baseball Draft after a three-year collegiate career at Long Beach State University. He played four seasons in the Rockies organization, advancing as high as Double-A, before getting selected in by the Detroit Tigers in the 1995 Rule 5 Draft. He then spent two seasons with the St. Paul Saints in 1997 and 1998 before finishing his career with a Major League Spring Training stint with the Arizona Diamondbacks.





Michael Cruz brings a formidable power bat to The Steel Yard for his first season with the Gary SouthShore RailCats. This is his first season on an MLB Partner League roster following six seasons in affiliated baseball.

Cruz, 26, played one season at Bethune-Cookman University after stellar stints at Puerto Rico Baseball Academy and Clarendon College. A high school All-American, he arrived at Bethune-Cookman following All-Western Junior College Athletic Conference and Baseball I All-American Second Team selections as a freshman in 2014. As a Wildcat, Cruz batted .325 with 16 home runs, 41 runs batted in, 65 hits, 50 runs, 38 bases on balls, a .461 on-base percentage, a .605 slugging percentage, and a .995 fielding percentage. In addition to receiving All-Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference First Team honors, he also led Bethune-Cookman to the 2016 MEAC Tournament Championship and an appearance in the Division I NCAA National Tournament.

On the heels of his junior season, the Chicago Cubs selected Cruz in the 7th round of the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft. Over the next two seasons, he rose through the team's farm system and made it to the High-A Myrtle Beach Pelicans just two years later. His 2018 season was his finest as a Cubs farmhand as he recorded 12 home runs, 48 RBI, 73 hits, 25 doubles, and 26 walks.

That offseason, Cruz joined the Angels organization, where he got assigned to the High-A Inland Empire 66ers. After impressing at that level, he earned a promotion to the Double-A Rocket City Trash Pandas in 2021. Earlier this year, Cruz made the Triple-A Salt Lake Bees Opening Day roster and roped an RBI double against the Tacoma Rainiers on April 7th.

A top arm in the American Association, Trevor Lubking makes his way back to Gary for his third season as a RailCat. He emerged as the team's workhorse in 2021 as he posted a 5-9 record, 117 strikeouts, and two complete games over 19 appearances, 18 starts, and 117.0 innings pitched. His eight-inning, 12 strikeout performance against the Sioux Falls Canaries on June 25th won him that week's American Association Pitcher of the Week Award.

The Tampa Bay Rays selected Lubking in the 14th round of the 2014 Major League Baseball Draft from Division III Pacific Lutheran University, where he dominated for four years. He immediately got assigned to the team's Appalachian League affiliate, the Princeton Rays, and put up excellent numbers. In 12 appearances, including 10 starts, he went 2-4 with a 3.51 ERA, 1.11 WHIP, and 43:10 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Lubking spent one more season in affiliated baseball with the AZL Brewers in 2015 before elbow issues sidelined him for two years.


In 2018, Lubking made his return to professional baseball as a member of the Gateway Grizzlies in the Frontier League. Over his 71 games played, he led the squad in both home runs (6), runs batted in (46), and tied for first in doubles (16) while finishing second in runs (40), third in hits (75), third in at-bats (267), fourth in batting average (.281), and fifth in walks (26).


The RailCats signed Walraven after he wrapped up a decorated college career at Division II University of New Haven. Over his five years as a Charger, he hit .326 with nine home runs, 77 RBI, 205 hits, 121 runs, 39 doubles, 93 walks, and 39 stolen bases. Walraven racked up personal awards every season as well, including the Northeast-10 Co-Rookie of the Year award in 2014 and the NEIBA All-Star Game MVP in 2018. He also made the Northeast-10 All-Rookie Team and All-Conference Third Team in 2014, All-Conference First Team in 2017, and All-Conference Second Team, Northeast-10 All-Tournament Team, and NCBWA All-East Region Honorable Mention Team in 2018. In addition, Walraven led New Haven to the 2017 Northeast-10 Conference Tournament Championship in 2017 and NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances in 2017 and 2018, making the East Region All-Tournament Team in 2018 as well.

Upon his arrival on the South Shore, Walraven immediately became a fan favorite due to his instant impact. In his first season as a pro in 2019, he batted .300 and registered 6 home runs, 31 RBI, 10 doubles, 35 walks, 35 runs, and six stolen bases. His home run total in 2019 placed second on the ball club, and his batting average placed third. When the RailCats decided not to compete in the 2020 American Association season due to COVID-19, the Winnipeg Goldeyes selected Walraven in the league's Dispersal Draft, and he joined the team's pod in Fargo.


