LAST GAME (6/22/23)

QUÉBEC, CANADA - The Tri-City ValleyCats (20-16) were defeated for the second time this season in extras as the Québec Capitales (18-17) won 6-5 on Thursday at Stade Canac in 10 innings. Tyler Blum had a walk-off walk to provide the Capitales with the rubber match of the three-game set. Québec got on the board in the first inning. Marc-Antoine Lebreux greeted Rafi Vazquez with a triple. Kyle Crowl brought in Lebreux with an RBI single to give the Capitales a 1-0 lead. Québec tacked on two more runs in the second. Sam Abbott led off with a walk, and Bryan Leaf advanced him to third with a double. Emile Boies plated two with a single to pull the Capitales ahead, 3-0.

Tri-City responded in the fourth. Zach Biermann and Jakob Goldfarb worked back-to-back two-out walks against Steven Fuentes. Cito Culver trimmed the deficit to 3-1 with an RBI single. The ValleyCats took its first lead of the game in the fifth. Ian Walters doubled, and Pavin Parks walked before Carson McCusker mashed a three-run tater. His 13th homer of the season put Tri-City on top, 4-3. Biermann added an insurance run with a solo homer in the sixth to give the ValleyCats a 5-3 advantage. It was Biermann's seventh blast of the year.

Fuentes received a no-decision. He tossed six frames, allowing five runs on nine hits, walking three, and striking out four.

Québec retaliated in the bottom of the sixth. T.J. White walked, and went to second on a wild pitch. Justin Gideon picked up a single, which moved White to third. Coleman Huntley came in for Vazquez, and issued an RBI single to Abbott. Blum followed with a walk to load the bases. Boies had an RBI walk before Huntley buckled down, striking out Lebreux to keep the game tied, 5-5.

Vazquez was also handed a no-decision. He pitched 5.1 innings, yielding five runs on six hits, walking two, and striking out six. Both teams had their chances to end the matchup in nine innings of play. Tri-City had a runner on second on three separate occasions in the eighth. Aaron Altheri laced a single off Tanner Jesson-Dalton, but tried to stretch it into a double, and was thrown out at second on a 9-6 putout. Goldfarb then walked, stole second, but was picked off. Afterward, Biermann walked, advanced to second on a wild pitch, but was left stranded in scoring position. The Capitales had a chance to strike in the bottom of the ninth. Boies hit a one-out double off Reynin Guduan. Lebreux reached on an error from Parks, who on the very next play started a 6-4-3 double play to send the game to extras.

Although McCusker started the tenth with a groundout to send the "ghost runner" in Parks to third, the ValleyCats were retired in order. Meanwhile, in the bottom of the tenth, Brac Warren retired White on a groundout before falling behind in the count 3-0, and intentionally walking Profar. Elijah Brown pinch-ran for Profar. Brown, and the "free runner" on second in Crowl each moved up ninety feet on a passed ball. Gideon struck out, and Abbott, who has been a hot hitter in this series, was also intentionally walked. Warren's first three pitchers to Blum were outside of the zone, but he battled back to a 3-2 count. Blum fouled off the next two pitches before taking ball four to bring in Crowl with a walk-off walk.

Frank Moscattello (4-1) earned the win. He threw two shutout frames, striking out one. Warren (0-2) received the loss. He went 0.2 innings, yielding an unearned run on no hits, walking three (two intentionally), and striking out one.

HEAD TO HEAD: The ValleyCats won the season series last year over the Titans, and outscored them 61-38.

CUP O' JOE: RHP Shawn Dubin made his MLB debut for the Houston Astros against the New York Mets at Citi Field on June 19. He made a spot start and lasted three innings for the Astros. Dubin was selected by Houston in 13th round of the 2018 Draft out of Georgetown College and signed for \$1,000. He made his professional debut for the ValleyCats in 2018. Dubin is a New York native that is from Allegany and he also played college ball at SUNY Buffalo.

THESE CATS ARE PRETTY GOOD: JD Davis ('14) smashed his 10th homer, a pinch-hit 441-foot grand slam dead center at Dodger Stadium on Saturday as the San Francisco Giants defeated their rivals 15-0.

COACHES SECTION

PETE INCAVIGLIA, FIELD MANAGER

Pete Incaviglia, a native of Argyle, Texas (a half hour north of Fort Worth) returns to lead the ValleyCats for his third season. As the skipper of the 'Cats over the last two seasons, Incaviglia has amassed a 102-86 record. In his second season at the helm of the ValleyCats, Incaviglia became the third manager in team history to eclipse the 100-win mark, joining Ed Romero and Gregg Langbehn. The infamous power hitter who was named the NCAA Player of the Century with a .464 batting average, 48 HR, and 143 RBI in 78 games with Oklahoma State during the 1985 season and mashed 100 homers in 213 collegiate games. His 100 career homers at the college level, as well as his HR, RBI, 285 total bases, and 1.140 SLG are all NCAA records from that 1985 season. He coached Tri-City hitters to a Frontier League-leading 162 home runs, and a .288 team batting average, the third best in the league in 2022. Before his coaching career, he played for the Rangers, Tigers, Astros, Phillies, Orioles, and Yankees over a 12-year MLB career spanning from 1986-1998. Overall, he batted .246 and mashed 206 homers in the big leagues while racking up 655 RBIs in nearly 1,300 games played. Incaviglia was selected by the Expos in the 1985 draft and asked to go straight to the Majors. The Expos did not want this, so was traded to the Rangers, and began his professional career in the Majors during the 1986 season. For about 30 years there was the Pete Incaviglia rule where teams could not trade a drafted player unless he's been on the team for one calendar year. This rule lasted until 2015 and from then on drafted players can be traded the day after the conclusion of the World Series... per a 1986 article by The Sun Sentinel written by Andy Cohen, he impressed the Rangers after smoking a ball to the outfield on a day with 20 mph wind through the left field wall with an inch thick of plywood. At Oklahoma State, pitchers were afraid of him since he cranked a ball through the screen. He also played the 1995 season with the Chiba Notte Mariners of the NPB (Japan's baseball league)... per a Ken Rosenthal article in 1997 with The Baltimore Sun, his legacy had humble beginnings, and battled asthma as a kid where he would need to go to the hospital and get a shot of adrenalin after playing sports. However, weight lifting at the age of 10 helped improve his stamina during an era where pumping iron was frowned upon. He would have 3 a.m. emergency room visits at the hospital and an allergic reaction to fish at age four nearly killed him... he has over 35 years of professional baseball experience, Pete Incaviglia enters his third season at the helm of the Tri-City ValleyCats. Since 2001, Incaviglia has held a variety of coaching and managing positions within professional baseball. This includes championships as a Field Manager in the Atlantic League (2018) and American Association (2015, 2011). His coaching experience also includes time as the hitting coach for the Erie SeaWolves (the Detroit Tigers Double-A affiliate) from 2004-2006. Incaviglia's most recent tenure was with the Sugar Land Skeeters, formerly of the Atlantic League. After serving as the team's Field Manager since November of 2017, he became the Director of Baseball Operations for the Constellation League in Sugar Land, Texas... famous managers such as Johnny Podres, Jim Leyland, and HOF Sparky Anderson believed in Incaviglia's managerial capability... in a 2018 interview with SportsRadio 98.9 FM, Incaviglia Compares American Association to Double-A, and the Atlantic League to Triple-A. Was on the 1993 Phillies, knew the team was special in Spring Training, lot of blue collar men with a lot to prove. Lots of loose cannons led by Darren Daulton, Larry Bowl, John Vukovich, and Jim Fregosi that had a loose clubhouse. Had the Phils won game six, Incaviglia believes they would have won the championship. Had more memories of his time with the Phillies, than with any other team in his career. When Incaviglia was traded to the 1996 Orioles because Fregosi wanted to give him a chance on another contender and do right by him... On the Z104.5 podcast in 2007, Incaviglia talked about how OSU and his coach, Gary Ward, gave him the recipe for success to excel at the Major League level. Ward was adamant about the art of a baseball swing, taught hitters how to have a plan before they need an at bat, nobody was going to out prepare or outperform Ward during the game. Him and Coach Ward speak often. Wore OSU shirts all throughout his MLB career. Thought about being a coach at OSU in the past... born on 4/2/1964 (59).

BROOKS CAREY, PITCHING COACH

Brooks Carey joins the ValleyCats after spending the past 4 seasons as the New Jersey Jackals Field Manager. Over the course of his time at the helm of the Jackals, Carey captured a 2019 Can-Am League championship, and became the franchise's second-winningest manager of all-time, with 182 wins. Prior to joining the Jackals, Carey was the skipper of the Normal CornBelts, a former member of the Frontier League, from 2013-17. Carey led the franchise to their first-ever winning season, and in amassed a record of 248-230. Prior to his time as a manager, Carey served as the Pitching Coach for the Sussex Skyhawks (2008 & 2009), the Normal CornBelts (2010 & 2011), and the Evansville Otters (2012). Before pursuing coaching in the world of professional baseball, Carey led Key West High School, his alma mater, to a 1998 Florida state title. Carey, a starting pitcher drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 10th round of the 1978 MLB Draft out of Florida State University, reached Triple-A in both the Baltimore Orioles and Cincinnati Reds organizations. Over the course of his five-year professional playing career, Carey tallied a 3.75 ERA in 683.2 innings pitched... born on 3/8/55 (67)

THOMAS INCAVIGLIA, THIRD BASE AND BENCH COACH

The nephew of manager Pete Incaviglia, Thomas Incaviglia enters his third season as the Third Base and Bench Coach for the Tri-City ValleyCats. Incaviglia played professionally for the Grand Prairie AirHogs of the American Association for two seasons, and played collegiately at Oklahoma State, Texas, and Cal State Monterey Bay, winning a NCAA Division I National Championship with the Longhorns. His father, Tony played alongside Ozzie Smith in college Cal Poly. Thomas has spent the offseason gaining managerial experience in the California Winter League, the Official Winter League of the Frontier League... From a 2004 article written by John Hersey in the Oklahoman. Thomas ran around the Rangers locker room, had a catch with Lenny Dykstra before the game once. He wanted to go wherever his uncle went which is one of the reasons why he played at Oklahoma State University. He doesn't shy away from having the same namesake and thinks it's pretty fun to be related to his uncle. Pete gave Thomas advice and believed in him when he was nearly redshirted as a freshman at OSU... born on 9/5/84 (38).

Altherr was a six-year Major Leaguer, he played with Philadelphia from 2014-2018, and split the 2019 season between the Phillies, San Francisco Giants, and the New York Mets. He was drafted by the Phillies in the ninth round (287th pick overall) of the 2009 draft out of Agua Fria High School (the same high school that football Hall of Famer Randall McDaniel went to) in Avondale, Arizona for \$150,000. Altherr received a scholarship to play baseball at Arizona State and even had some offers to play basketball elsewhere at the D1 level. A couple career highlights include hitting an inside-the-park grand slam against the Rays in his rookie season in 2013, which is the first time a Major Leaguer accomplished that feat since October 3, 1999 by Randy Winn for the then-Tampa Bay Devil Rays. Altherr is the only player to hit a grand slam off Clayton Kershaw. The latter came on September 18, 2017. Incidentally, 2017 was Altherr's best year and slashed .272/.340/.516/.856, setting career-highs in games (107), homers (19), and RBI (65). He was pushed for playing time with Nick Williams in 2018 after Rhys Hoskins was sent to the outfield following the signing of Carlos Santana in 2018. Then, in 2019 the Phillies signed Andrew McCutchen and Bryce Harper, and Altherr was later DFA'd by Philadelphia the same year. He only had one at bat with the Giants, who held on to him for a week and the Mets, who barely started him in 2019. He was later DFA'd by both of those teams...career MLB stats: 359 G, .219/.307/.401/.708, 37 HR, 150 RBI, 110/332 K, 21/31 SB...Altherr played in the Korean Baseball Organization in 2020 and 2021 with the NC Dinos, winning the 2020 KBO championship and taking home more than \$2.3 million according to MLB Trade Rumors...KBO stats: 279 G, .275/.355/.528/.882, 63 HR, 192 RBI, 42/50 SB, 103 BB/305 K. Per a May 2023 Times Union article from Mark Singelais, Altherr was able to enjoy his time with his wife Samantha and their newborn child, Isaiah, born in April 2022, in their home in Scottsdale, Arizona. Altherr wanted to play last year, but didn't find the right place to play. He wants to play again in affiliated ball, so that's why he didn't return to South Korea for a third year. Altherr played for the German national baseball team last year and in 2012 during the WBC Qualifiers. Germany's team fell to the Canada in this year's WBCQ...Altherr was born in Landstuhl, Germany on January 14, 1991 (32) and spent his first six months of his life living in Germany before spending most of his childhood moving frequently, but spending the majority of his time in Kansas and Arizona...His mother, Michelle, is from Baltimore, and was stationed as a member of the United States Air Force, while his father, Frank, was a former professional soccer player for FC Kaiserslautern in Germany...he played against Cito Culver when he was coming up through the Minors.

Bagnieski was selected 12th overall in this year's Frontier League draft...he played with the Lake Country DockHounds in the American Association last season. The DockHounds were originally supposed to join the Northwoods League in 2021, but COVID-19 halted their construction of a new stadium, so they pivoted and joined the AA. Lake Country's management is run by the likes of Tom Kelenic (Jared Kelenic's father), and Sonny Bando (Sal Bando's son. Sal was a 4x All-Star and 3x World Series champion for the Kansas City/Oakland A's, and also played on the Milwaukee Brewers)...2022 stats: 9 G, .421 (8/19), 1 XBH (1 3B), 3 RBI, 8 R, 7 BB/7 K, 2/3 SB...Bagnieski was with the Birmingham-Bloomfield Beavers in the United Shore Professional Baseball League in 2021. The Beavers are located in Utica, Michigan, and were founded by New York settlers from Utica, NY, who decided to name their founding of the city after their hometown. 2021 stats: 24 G, .346/.480/.474/.954, 7 XBH (1 HR), 9 RBI, 18 R, 19 BB/12 K, 10/12 SB. He was described by DockHounds manager Jim Bennett as being a sparkplug at the top of the lineup for the Beavers." Bagnieski played at Radford University in 2021; the Highlanders play in the D1 Big South Conference. He was at Florida Southwestern State College (JUCO program located in Fort Myers) from 2019-2020; the Buccaneers are in the Suncoast Conference. Bagnieski spent a year redshirting at State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota (another JUCO program) in 2018; the Manatees are a D1 JUCO program in the Florida College System Activities Association...he originally committed to Chicago State University for the 2019 season, but did not play for them. The CSU baseball program was shutdown for good in June 2020, and was announced first on Twitter after a month of protests from the baseball team. According to Baseball America, CSU baseball team was replaced with men's soccer to "...help the department cut costs and improve its competitiveness...from Green Bay, Wisconsin, and was born on 1/31/1997 (26).

Biermann was acquired by Evansville to complete a previous trade. He earned 2022 West Division All-Star honors for the Otters and was the last player in the FL to have a three-homer game which came on June 15, 2022 at Schaumburg at Wintrust Field...2022 stats with Evansville: 89 G, .280/.377/.518/.895, 17 HR, 54 RBI, 66 R, 39 BB/90 K, 14 HBP (T-7th in the league, Joliet's Brylie Ware had an eye-popping 38 HBPs), 6/6 SB...played for Tri-City both in Indy ball in 2021 and in Low-A in 2019. He was also traded from the ValleyCats to the Otters prior to the 2022 season...2021 stats with the ValleyCats: 38 G, .312/.375/.451/.826, 3 HR, 14 RBI, 22 R, 9 BB/29 K, 1/3 SB...reached as high as Double-A Corpus Christi in the Astros organization before being released in 2021. He was taken by Houston in the 23rd round (706th overall) for \$1,000 in the 2019 MLB Amateur Draft out of Coastal Carolina University in Conway, SC. The Chanticleers (pronounced Shon-ti-cleer) are in the D1 Sun Belt conference. The mascot name is apparently the moniker of a fierce rooster from The Canterbury Tales, a selection of stories from the 14th-15th century, which popularized English vernacular into English literature. The new mascot name was brought up by a bunch of Coastal Carolina students along with their English professor/basketball coach Cal F. Maddux in the 1960s...MiLB stats in 2019 and 2021: 56 G, .202/.317/.366/.683, 6 HR, 24 RBI, 25 BB/50 K, 2/4 SB...played at Polk State College from 2016-17; the Eagles are a D1 JUCO team in the Florida State College Activities Association. Polk State College is located in Winter Haven, FL (which is an hour east of Tampa) prior to transferring to Coastal Carolina University; he was with the Chanticleers from the 2018-19 seasons...born in West Bend, Wis...born on 6/2/97 (26)...went to high school in West Bend, the same district as three-year MLB pitcher Willie Mueller and the actor who played the Duke in the movie "Major League" went to high school.

Broughton signed a minor league contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates on 10/24/22, and was listed as a third baseman, but was released on 3/31/23...he played with the Ogden Raptors during the last two seasons in the PBL after not playing professional baseball since 2019...2021-22 hitting stats: 180 G, .393/.442/.615/1.057, 27 HR, 150 RBI, 207 R, 66 BB/111 K, 42/54 SB...2021 pitching stats: 10 G (2 GS), 1-2, 21.1 IP, 9.28 ERA, 16 K/8 BB...Broughton was selected by the Kansas City Royals as a pitcher in the 25th round (739th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft out of Valdosta State University. The Blazers are a DII program out of Valdosta, Georgia. He signed for \$5,000 with the Royals despite only throwing 12 innings in college and about 13 innings in high school. His only season in the Royals organization came in 2019 when he played for their rookie ball affiliate...2019 stats: 5 G (0 GS), 0-0, 5.2 IP, 9.53 ERA (6 ER), 5 K/1 BB...prior to his senior season at VSU, in 2018 he played at Elon University; the Phoenix are a D1 program that is in the Colonial Athletic Association and are located in Elon, North Carolina.
