### NEED TO KNOWS

- This weekend the Otters open thier 28th season of Frontier League baseball. That is most seasons for any franchise in league history.
- The Otters started the season at Bosse Field for the 20th time. On opening day Jomar Reyes and Jeffrey Baez led Evansvile with two hits apiece.
- Evansville won thier first game of the season Saturday night behind Zach Smith's seven strikeouts in six innings without allowing an earned run. Jake Polancic earned his first career save.
- The Otters welcomed over 120,000 fans through the gates of Bosse Field during the 2022 season. This was the sixth highest mark in the Frontier League.
- Evansville returns 6 of 12 batters on this year's opening day roster. Dakota Phillips is the top returner bringing his 2022 team leading 316 BA back to Bosse Field.
- Last season's Frontier League reliever of the year Logan Sawyer led the league in saves with 22. He was part of a pitching staff with the 2nd best ERA in the Frontier League.
- The Otters combined for 100 team home runs in 2022, a new team single-season record.

### LAST GAME OUT RECAP

Evansville, Ind. – The Evansville Otters earned their first victory of the season 3-2 over the Washington Wild Things on Saturday night.

Otters' pitcher Zach Smith keyed the win with six terrific innings on the mound. His seven strikeouts marked his Frontier League career high. The second year Otter allowed just two unearned runs both coming in the first inning while limiting the Wild Things to three hits.

Jeffrey Baez hit a go-ahead two run home run over the left field wall to give the Otters the lead in the bottom of the first. Dakota Phillips preceded Baez with an RBI double to score the first run of the inning.

Jake Polancic moved into his new Otters role as a closer with a gutsy five out save. He struck out a Wild Things batter with the tying run at third in the ninth to seal the victory. The Otters pitching staff did not allow a run after the first inning.

2,004 fans watched Evansville's win at Bosse Field and enjoyed post game fireworks.

Opening weekend concludes against Washington with a series rubber match on Sunday afternoon. First pitch is slated for 12:35 PM CT from Bosse Field. Tickets are available for purchase by visiting evansvilleotters.com. Sunday is a dog days of summer game with discounted hot dogs and fans are encouraged to bring their dogs.

The game will be televised on FloSports with audio-only coverage available for free on the Evansville Otters YouTube page.

The Evansville Otters are the 2006 and 2016 Frontier League champions.

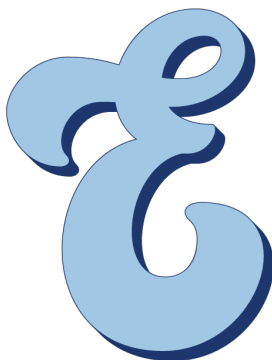

# COACHING STAFF



## ANDY McCAULEY MANAGER 14TH SEASON

Andy McCauley has been the Otters' manager since 2010. He increased his managerial records and honors history in 2022, setting first in franchise history in regular season wins (583) and games managed (1,122). McCauley's overall win total stands at 590. McCauley has led Evansville to six postseason appearances, including the 2016 Frontier League championship season. He was the 2021 and 2014 Roger Hanners Award winner for the Frontier League Manager of the Year, and in 2014, he guided Evansville to the playoffs that season for the first time since 2006. McCauley accepted the manager's position on July 6th, 2010. In 50 games that year, he led the Otters to a 19-31 record but revamped the franchise. The Otters had a slower start in 2011 but with McCauley's leadership, were able to finish the second half of the season above .500. The Otters had 45 wins in 2012, and 51 victories in 2013 (the team's first winning season since 2005). In 2014, Evansville won 57 games and after a 48-48 season in 2015, the Otters finished with 55 regular season wins in 2016. McCauley guided the Otters to a postseason appearance with 52 wins in 2017, 51 wins in 2018 and a franchise tying record of 57 wins in 2019 and the franchise's first Frontier League division title since 1999. The Otters followed that up with another 57-win season in 2021. McCauley has managed in the Frontier League before. In 1998, he became the skipper for the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. The next season, McCauley managed the London Werewolves, another Frontier League team, to a 54-30 record and a league championship. McCauley has also had success in the Northern league from 2002-09 with the Quebec Capitales, Schaumburg Flyers and Kansas City T-Bones. It was with Kansas City that he also won another league championship in 2008. McCauley is a 1991 graduate of Mansfield (Pa.) University.

### COACHING STAFF

#### #3 Bobby Segal, Hitting Coach (8th Season)

Bobby Segal, who has been involved with college and/or professional baseball every year since 2003, is in his eighth season as hitting coach for the Evansville Otters and eighth campaign as part of an independent league field staff. Segal previously spent nine spring seasons and four summer campaigns coaching all levels of college baseball. Prior to 2023, Segal had helped 19 teams to a 852-505 (.628) overall record. His six professional clubs had posted a 343-262 (.567) record, while his 13 college squads registered a 509-243 (.677) mark. Segal has seen 19 of his 20 teams tally a winning record, while all ten of his summer clubs finished in the top two of their respective divisions. Segal has helped six of his independent league teams to postseason berths. Evansville captured the 2016 Frontier League championship and advanced to the playoffs each of the following three seasons. The Gary (Ind.) SouthShore RailCats claimed the 2013 American Association title when Segal was their hitting and third base coach. With Segal in the dugout, the Otters have turned in regular season records of 57-39 (.594), 57-39 (.594), 51-45 (.531), 52-44 (.542) and 55-40 (.579). He was named the Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year following the 2017 season in Evansville. In Segal's lone campaign in Northwest Indiana, the RailCats finished regular season action 58-41 (.611). In six previous seasons as an independent-league instructor, Segal has seen 20 players move up to teams affiliated with Major League Baseball organizations. Segal saw 94 players advance from junior college to four-year institutions. The figure includes 66 Division I players, with many of the nation's top conferences represented. In addition, 74 of his college players went on to sign professional contracts. Before arriving in Evansville, Segal logged time with five regular season collegiate programs in five different states. Seven of his nine teams enjoyed national rankings, while six earned berths in national postseason tournaments. Segal served as the top assistant, recruiting coordinator, hitting coach and third base coach at Wabash Valley College (Ill.) from 2013-16. The 36-year-old was the recruiting coordinator and hitting coach at Tarleton State University (Texas) in 2012. He worked with infielders, hitters and coached first base at Iowa Western College in 2011. The Indianapolis native worked with catchers, hitters and coached first base at Butler University in 2010. He spent the 2008 and 2009 campaigns as a graduate assistant at Union College (Ky.). Prior to joining the Otters, Segal also spent four summers mentoring players in collegiate wood-bat leagues. He managed the 2014 and 2015 Terre Haute (Ind.) Rex after serving as the hitting coach and catching instructor for the same organization in 2012. He started 2010 as the top assistant for the North Adams (Mass.) SteepleCats and finished the summer managing the club. A catcher at Indiana University from 2003-06, Segal was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He earned a bachelor's degree in sport management from IU in 2006 and master's degree in health and physical education from Union in 2009. Segal is married to the former Rachel Harvey. The couple has two sons, Asher and Jacob, and one daughter, Lillian.

#### #26 Max Peterson, Pitching Coach, (10th Season)

San Diego native Max Peterson is in his tenth season as the team's pitching coach. Peterson is a five-year veteran of minor league baseball and is a former 18th round pick of the Oakland Athletics. He pitched three years in the A's organization and another two with the Chicago White Sox. He also has Frontier League playing experience, saving 12 games for the Southern Illinois Miners in 2012. In 2014, his first professional season as a coach, Peterson piloted Evansville to the playoffs for the first time since 2006 and a 3.30 earned run average, which was lowest in the Frontier League. The Otters yielded a league-low 46 home runs and accumulated a league-high 788 strikeouts. During the 2016 championship season, the Otters finished with a team ERA of 3.97 and 721 strikeouts. In 2019, Peterson was given the Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year Award. Peterson's guidance led eight Otters' pitchers to being signed to MLB affiliated organizations. Peterson also led the Otters' pitching staff to a franchise single season record of 868 strikeouts, which led the Frontier League. The franchise's last record-setting mark was 832 in 2017.

#### #25 Billy Easley, Assistant Coach (3rd Season)

Billy Easley is entering his third season with the Otters, primarily working with the catchers. He had been an assistant coach at NAIA Oklahoma City University for seven seasons. While at OCU, Easley helped coach two All-Americans and three professional catchers. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Radio/Television/Video from the University of the Ozarks and a Master's degree in positive coaching from the University of Missouri.

#### Phil Britton, Assistant Coach (12th Season)

Phil Britton has been an Otters catcher and spring training instructor since 2012. The Olney, Ill. native played for the Otters in 2011, hitting .262 with two home runs and 15 RBIs. Britton played professional baseball for seven seasons including five with the Atlanta Braves' organization and two years with the Baltimore Orioles. He played as high as Class AAA with Norfolk of the Orioles' organization in 2010.

#### Rob Watson, Assistant Coach (14th Season)

Rob Watson guided the pitching staff in Evansville during the 2010 season and has assisted since 2011. Watson played his college baseball at Oklahoma State before being drafted in the 17th round of the 2002 MLB Draft. Watson had a six-year playing career (2002-08) including two full seasons under manager Andy McCauley with the Schaumburg Flyers (2006) and Kansas City T-Bones (2007). With Kansas City, Watson arguably had his best season, hitting .343 and being named to the All-Independent League second team. The following year, he hit .344 while with the T-Bones before joining the Phillies' organization. Watson also coached with Penn State during the 2005 season.

#### Rick Korte, Bench Coach (1st Season)

Korte, who now resides in Schaumburg, Illinois, is the former CEO, President and Managing Director of HEIDENHAIN Holding. In this capacity, he managed 9 separate companies, all serving the motion control technology industry. In his time at HEIDENHAIN, Korte oversaw 500 hundred employees and hundreds of millions of dollars in turnover. Since retiring in 2020, Korte now spends his time as a professional speaker and mentor, talking about the importance of integrity, accountability and character building. As a member of the Otters coaching staff, Korte will serve as a character coach, helping players and coaches set personal goals and become better men, both on and off the baseball field. Another part of Korte's role will be to assist players and coaches who want professional advice when preparing to enter the workforce, whether that be for a job in the offseason or for their post-playing careers.
