MATCH PREVIEW

For the first time in NWSL history, the semifinal will feature the current Shield winner vs. the previous season's Shield winner as OL Reign travels to San Diego to face the Wave in the NWSL semifinals, marking the fifth time the two clubs will play each other in 2023. The Reign are unbeaten all-time against the Wave (6-0-2) and have won all four meetings in 2023, earning three shutouts in those games.

Despite facing San Diego four times in 2023 across all competitions, the Reign have not listed the same starting XI. The only player to start in all four games for OL Reign was forward Tziarra King.

Goalkeeper Claudia Dickey is coming off her seventh clean sheet in her first 10 starts across all NWSL competitions, with two occurring against the Wave during both meetings of the 2023 Challenge Cup.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- OL Reign has scored eight of its 10 playoff goals all-time after the 70th minute, with five of the goals occurring in the final 10 minutes of playing time.
- The Reign have earned four clean sheets against the Wave through eight games played all-time and have never allowed multiple goals in a single game against San Diego.
- Defender Emily Sonnett has tallied 989 total playoff minutes all-time and would become the third player in NWSL history to reach 1,000 playoff minutes with 11 more minutes played.
- Through the 2023 regular season and playoffs, OL Reign has five defenders with an assist, more than any other NWSL team.

MATCH STORYLINES

ANOTHER SEASON, ANOTHER SEMIFINAL

For the fifth consecutive season, OL Reign has reached the NWSL semifinals. Last year, both the Reign and San Diego Wave FC appeared in the semifinals on each side of the bracket with neither team reaching the Championship. With a win, OL Reign would appear in the Champiosnhip for the third time in club history and first time since 2015.

LAST TWO NWSL SHIELD WINNERS

This will be the first semifinal in league history that will feature the current Shield winner vs. the previous year's Shield winner. The Reign are tied for the most Shield wins in league history (2014, 2015, 2022) and will face San Diego, who just earned the Shield this season, the second-year club's first trophy.

LAST TWO WINNERS OF COACH OF THE YEAR

This semifinal matchup between head coach Laura Harvey and Wave FC head coach Casey Stoney will feature the two most recent NWSL Coach of the Year winners. Harvey holds the league record for most Coach of the Year selections (3), having won the award in 2014, 2015 and 2021. Harvey was also the first coach in NWSL history to receive back-to-back selections. Stoney earned her first Coach of the Year selection in 2022.



THREE LOCALS AND THREE GOALS

OL Reign has three players on the active roster from Washington - defender Sam Hiatt, midfielder Nikki Stanton and midfielder Olivia Van der Jagt. Across all NWSL competitions, all three of the club's locals have scored against San Diego. Van der Jagt has scored most recently among the three players, notching her first career goal against the Wave in the club's regular season home opener earlier this year on April 15. In the first-ever meeting between the two clubs, which was a Challenge Cup match, Hiatt and Stanton each scored to help the Reign win, 3-1, on April 14, 2022.

30 MINUTES OR LESS

In the 720 minutes played (eight games) against San Diego alltime, OL Reign has only trailed the Wave for 30 total minutes. Additionally, the Reign haven't trailed San Diego in the last 412 minutes played across all competitions.

SHUTOUT SAN DIEGO

This will be the ninth meeting between OL Reign and San Diego all-time. Of the first eight matchups, the Reign have earned four shutouts, with three coming in 2023. Goalkeeper Claudia Dickey is tied for the most clean sheets in the series, with two. On the other side, San Diego has never recorded a shutout against the Reign.



Dickey earned her third consecutive clean sheet and seventh of 2023 (across all competitions) in the club's quarterfinal win against Angel City FC. Dickey is the fifth goalkeeper all-time to earn a shutout in their NWSL playoff debut and the third youngest goalkeeper among the five.

A WAVE OF GOAL SCORERS

In the all-time series between the two clubs, OL Reign has 10 different players with at least one goal. Nine of the Reign's 10 players to score are on the active roster - five midfielders, two forwards and two defenders. Forward Bethany Balcer leads the series in scoring with four goals, notching three of them in 2023, including a brace on June 24.







COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH


LAURA HARVEY was named the head coach of OL Reign on July 15, 2021, after previously serving as the club's first-ever head coach for five consecutive seasons (2013-2017).

Established as the winningest head coach in NWSL history after defeating NJ/NY Gotham FC on August 14, 2022, Harvey has led the Reign to three NWSL Shields, which is also an all-time record among NWSL head coaches. Prior to the start of the 2023 season, Harvey holds an all-time NWSL record of 87 wins, 56 losses and 47 draws in the regular season.

Another addition to her list of records, Harvey holds the league record for the most NWSL Coach of the Year selections as a three-time winner (2014-2015, 2021). Harvey is also the first NWSL head coach to win the title on back-to-back occasions. The eighth-year Reign head coach has led the club to four appearances in the playoffs (2014-2015, 2021-2022) and two appearances in the NWSL Championship (2014-2015).

The Reign finished the 2022 regular season on a sevengame unbeaten streak, including three consecutive games on the road that all resulted in wins, which helped the Reign finish the season with a league-best 40 points. Harvey was named a finalist for NWSL Coach of the Year, her second-consecutive nomination. Throughout the 22game regular season, Harvey listed 21 different starting XIs as she balanced a busy and challenging schedule that featured up to a league-high nine players being called up for international duty on several occasions and an appearance in The Women's Cup. On August 20, 2022, OL Reign claimed the second-ever Women's Cup title after defeating Club América in the semifinals and Racing Louisville FC, the defending champions of the tournament, in the final, thanks to Harvey strategically utilizing the club's depth throughout the tournament.

Joining OL Reign midway through the 2021 season, Harvey managed the club to an eight-game unbeaten streak spanning from August 21 to October 16, allowing the Reign to host a playoff match for the first time since 2015. For all her work throughout the 2021 season, Harvey was named



the 2021 NWSL Coach of the Year.

Prior to re-joining the Reign and the NWSL, Harvey signed with U.S. Soccer as the Under-20 Women's National Team head coach in January 2020, where she led the U-20s through a seven-game unbeaten run at the 2020 Concacaf Women's U-20 Championship in the Dominican Republic to capture the title. Harvey also served as an assistant coach for the U.S Women's National Team during the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo.

On November 17, 2017, the Utah Royals, an NWSL expansion club, announced Harvey as the club's first-ever head coach, where she took on a new challenge and fulfilled the role for the inaugural season in 2018 and the following season in 2019. Harvey worked closely in Utah with Scott Parkinson, OL Reign's newest head assistant coach as of the 2023 season, where he served as an assistant coach under Harvey.

Before making the move to Utah, the three-time NWSL Coach of the Year was the Reign's first-ever head coach and led the club for five consecutive seasons (2013-2017). From 2013 to 2017, Harvey

finished with a regular season record of 51 wins, 33 losses and 26 draws with a .464 winning percentage over 110 regular-season games with the Reign. She led the club to consecutive NWSL Shields and NWSL Championship appearances in 2014 and 2015, becoming the first NWSL head coach to reach 100 matches coached, as well as the first to notch 50 wins.

Despite a difficult first season in 2013 for the club on the field, Harvey was building a culture of leadership, hard work, and positivity, which quickly began to show and translate to on-field success.

In 2014, the Reign finished with a league-high 54 points, which is currently the second-most points recorded in a single season and the biggest turnaround between seasons in NWSL history, as the club finished with 36 more points than they tallied in 2013. The immediate turnaround helped the club reach its first-ever NWSL Championship appearance and earned Harvey her first selection as NWSL Coach of the Year. The following season (2015), the club picked up where it left off by recording a league-high 43 points, winning back-to-back NWSL Shields and appearing in back-to-back NWSL Championships. Despite not making the NWSL playoffs in 2016 and 2017, the club finished fifth in the league in both seasons, falling short of the playoffs by one position.



Under Harvey's leadership, OL Reign has had at least one player named to the NWSL Best XI First Team in all seven seasons. Additionally, she helped her players earn a combined 32 NWSL Best XI First Team and Second Team selections among 15 different players. The NWSL winningest head coach also helped two players earn the title of NWSL Most Valuable Player: midfielder Kim Little in 2014 and midfielder Jess Fishlock in 2021. Harvey also coached defender Lu Barnes when she earned the award for NWSL Defender of the Year in 2016.

Harvey was born on May 15, 1980 and is originally from Bulkington, a village in Warwickshire, England. She attended George Eliot School in Nuneaton and played football for the Coventry City L.F.C. She began her coaching career after tearing her ACL while playing for Birmingham City L.F.C at twenty-two years old. Harvey holds a USSF A Coaching License and a UEFA A Coaching License. She earned her BA in Sports Studies at the University of Wolverhampton in 2001 and her BTEC (Business and Technology Education Council) National Diploma in Sport from Henley College in 1998.

HEAD ASSISTANT COACH

With 13 years of coaching experience in the United States, Parksinson was hired as the Head Assistant Coach of OL Reign on January 10, 2023. Prior to joining the Reign, Parkinson was tapped as Gotham FC's head coach, midway through the 2021 season, leading the team to the 2021 NWSL playoffs for the first time since 2013. In 2020, he made the move to the Chicago Red Stars, where he served as the team's assistant coach until August 2021. Parkinson had his first stint with head coach Laura Harvey for two seasons at the Utah Royals in 2018 and 2019, where he initially made his NWSL start as an assistant coach under Harvey. Together, the two helped guide the Royals to 19 wins in two years. Parkinson later served as the club's head coach through the 2020 NWSL Draft.

Prior to joining the NWSL, Parkinson served two years as the Head Women's Soccer Coach at Rogers State University. The Liverpool, England native recently earned his USSF Pro coaching license, in addition to holding USSF A and UEFA B licenses.



KATE NORTON SHE/HER

ASSISTANT COACH

Norton brings experience as the Director of Coaching for the U13-U19 Girls' Program at PacNW Soccer Club, as well as the Director of the Surf Development Academy program in San Diego.

Her coaching experience includes time with the University of Arizona women's soccer team and U18 and U20 U.S. Youth National Team as an assistant coach.

Norton holds a USSF A License and a USSF Youth National Coaching License.



LJUPCO "RAKI" KMETOVSKI HE/HIM

GOALKEEPER COACH

OL Reign goalkeeper coach Ljupco "Raki" Kmetovski also returns for his fifth season with the team. Coming off a successful 2022 season, Raki coached goalkeeper Phallon Tullis-Joyce, who started in all 22 regular season games and had the best goals allowed per game average (0.86) in the league. Tullis-Joyce finished the 2022 regular season tied for the most clean sheets with nine. Only one other time the Reign finished a season with more clean sheets (12, in 2018). Additionally, OL Reign finished first in the league in fewest goals allowed (19).

The Macedonian keeper coach holds a UEFA "A" License and a UEFA "Pro" goalkeeper license. He played professionally in Europe and has coached at the professional and international levels, previously serving as the Director of Goalkeeping for the Football Federation of Macedonia, where he was responsible for overseeing the goalkeeping coaches for the Macedonia National Team.

FOOTBALL FOR HER: Barnes dedicates her time to work closely with Football For Her, a nonprofit organization built to create a safe space for those who identify as female or nonbinary, offering mentorship and professional resources that may not otherwise be available. The organization educates, motivates and develops confidence on and off the field; helping youth participants reach their goals regardless of their economic standing. During this past offseason, Barnes spent time in California to help coach and mentor the youth at Football For Her, along with teammate Alana Cook.

COMMON GOAL: Barnes recently partnered with Common Goal, an organization that also works closely with Football For Her. The organization aims to inspire everyone in football to collaborate towards an equal and sustainable future for all. Members of Common Goal pledge a minimum of 1% of all revenues to progress in these goals. The organization has over 220 professional players and managers and 187 community organizations.

M.A.D. TRAVEL KIT: Make A Difference (MAD) Travel Kits was created by Barnes as a continuation of her sustainability efforts in the NWSL. All kits are exclusively stocked by companies that have a proven track record of sustainable production and aim to promote the use of responsibly-sourced goods. During the 2020 NWSL Challenge Cup, Lauren extensively tracked her own carbon footprint in the league's "bubble" and developed the idea for a way to spread sustainable practices throughout the league as a whole. These travel kits were put together to achieve the goal of making sustainable practice more accessible to the average athlete.

OCEAN RECOVERY GROUP: Ocean Recovery Group (ORG) is working to solve the planet's ocean-bound-plastic crisis in the Western Hemisphere. This past offseason, Barnes traveled overseas to the Dominican Republic to recover plastics for the global supply chain. On this trip in December 2022, the group, which included the Players for the Planet organization and 175 volunteers, collected over 2.5 tons of marine debris from Playa Montesinos and Fuerto San Gil.

PLAYERS FOR THE PLANET: Barnes is also an ambassador for the nonprofit organization Players for the Planet, focusing on the importance of reuse and repurpose. The organization is filled with professional athletes who are striving to make a difference by eliminating plastic, creating recycling initiatives, and prioritizing conservation efforts.

BEHIND THE NUMBER: The significance behind wearing No. 3 is because that was Allen Iverson's number.


HONORS

NWSL DEFENDER OF THE YEAR: Selected as the NWSL Defender of the Year in 2016, becoming the first player in Reign history to win the award and the second player in league history. Barnes started in all 20 matches and helped the team set a league record for most consecutive shutouts (5).

BEST XI AND SECOND XI: Barnes has been named to the NWSL Best XI and Second XI for a combined four times, earning Best XI honors in 2015 and 2016 and Second XI honors in 2014 and 2019.

played for the Elk Grove Pride club team, located south of Sacramento...Named Parade and National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-American as a junior and senior...Named to McDonald's All-American Girls High School Soccer West Team in 2004...Played for the under-14 Northern California state Olympic Development Program (ODP) team in 1999, as well as the regional ODP team in 2002...Played for the United States Under-16 National Team in 2002...Played at the United States Youth Soccer Association International Tournament in Houston in 2003... From 2003 to 2005, Rapinoe played for the United States Under-19 team, scoring nine goals in 21 appearances.

OFF THE FIELD

THE WORLD'S BEST: In 2019, Rapinoe won the Ballon d'Or Fémenin, an annual award to recognize the best footballer in the world, becoming the first-ever NWSL player to win the award. That year, Rapinoe won the 2019 FIFA World Cup with the USWNT, scoring the opening goal in the final. The forward appeared in five of the seven games played in the World Cup and finished tied for first in total goals (six). Rapinoe was also named The Best FIFA Women's Player 2019.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL OF FREEDOM: On July 7, 2022, Rapinoe received the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor. The two-time World Cup champion was one of 17 recipients to earn the honor, becoming the first soccer player to receive the award and one of just six female athletes or coaches.




TIMES WOMEN OF THE YEAR: On March 3, Rapinoe was named one of TIME's Women of the Year for 2023 for her role as a trailblazer for the equal pay movement in the women's soccer world. In September 2022, the historic collective bargaining agreement was signed by the USWNT and in January 2023, the U.S. Congress passed the Equal Pay for Team USA Act.

BREAKING BARRIERS: Throughout Rapinoe's professional career, she has used her platform to break barriers set within the society, including racism in sport, sexuality in sport and the fight for equal pay. Most recently, Rapinoe dedicated her TIME 'Woman of the Year' honor to the transgender community, urging people to look at what transgender people have created for the world.

HONORS

BEST XI AND SECOND XI: Rapinoe is tied for third-most combined NWSL Best XI (2018) and Second XI (2013, 2015, 2017, 2019, 2022) selections all-time, being selected in six of the league's 10 seasons of play.
