KICKING OFF...

LAST TIME OUT: The Courage gave up a pair of first-half goals and could not climb out of the hole in a 2-1 loss at Orlando two Saturdays ago at Exploria Stadium. Manaka scored her first goal in league play on a beautiful assist from Emily Fox. Malia Berkely was shown a red card late in the match for DOGSO and will be suspended for this match.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Courage earned their seventh league trophy (3 NWSL Shields, 2 NWSL Championships, 2 Challenge Cups), breaking a tie with the Portland Thorns for most in league history. The championship was the ninth for goalkeeper **Katelyn Rowland**, the most by any individual player in league history.

PASSING GRADE: The Courage lead the NWSL in passing accuracy (82.1%), successful passes (7,959), and possession (59.23%). The Courage have seven of the top eight single-game possession totals and the top four (and six of the top seven) total successful passes, eclipsing the 500 mark five times this season. The Courage also rank second in the NWSL in both goals (27) and assists (21) for the year.

REIGNED IN: North Carolina is 9W-2L-3D in lifetime regular season meetings with OL Reign, including a 1-0 win at WakeMed Soccer Park earlier this season.

2023 NC COURAGE MATCH NOTES at OL REIGN | SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2023 – 8:00 p.m. ET (5 PT)

SEATTLE (Sept. 29, 2023) – The North Carolina Courage play their penultimate road match of the 2023 NWSL regular season as they visit OL Reign this Sunday, October 1, for an 8:00 p.m. ET (5 PT) kickoff at Lumen Field. The Courage look to remain in the top four in the league standings and earn a season sweep of the defending Shield winners.

The Courage, who had two extra matches added to their calendar with the UKG NWSL Challenge Cup semifinals and then final, fell to a well-rested Orlando side, 2-1, two Sundays ago at Exploria Stadium. Challenge Cup MVP, 19-year-old Manaka, scored her first regular season goal to spark the comeback attempt, but a late red card saw the Courage down a player and goal in the final minutes and they were unable to find an equalizer.

Center back Malia Berkely will be suspended for this week's match after a straight red card decision for denial of a goal scoring opportunity. It was the second red card shown to the Courage this season, both of which have come after the FIFA World Cup break.

The Courage control their own destiny for a playoff spot and home playoff fixture. They are also well within the running for a first-round bye – which is earned by the top two seeds – and pursuit of the NWSL Shield. The Courage are just four points behind league-leading Portland, but the standings are extremely compact across the board; the top ten teams are separated by just nine points and not a single team is mathematically eliminated from playoff positioning. With a myriad of possibilities, the Courage can focus only on the task at hand.

In addition to continuously leading the league in passing accuracy, possession and successful passes, the Courage have also risen to rank second in the NWSL in both team goals (27) and assists (21). The growth of the offense within a style that has also produced eight clean sheets in league play has the Courage confident they can go toe-to-toe with anyone in this league and, with a trophy already on the shelf, can compete for two more prizes in 2023.

OL Reign hopes some home cooking will help them continue to climb the standings late. They play back-to-back home fixtures before a trip to Chicago to end the season. The Reign have a pair of wins and a draw in their last three home matches, but those wins are the only two since the calendar turned to July. With a heavy travel schedule over the last two months, the defending Shield winners have done well to stay in striking distance.

One major storyline around the Reign is the retirement of USWNT and NWSL legend Megan Rapinoe, who is slated to play her final match against the Courage, barring a post-season meeting. The Courage will look get their first win in Seattle since 2018 and complete the season sweep. With the standings as tight as they are, every point will be critical over the final three weeks of the season.

NOTABLES CONTINUED

SUNNY AND 75: The Courage next regular season win will be the 75th in club history. Only three other clubs have hit this milestone.

CLEANING UP: The Courage lead the NWSL with eight clean sheets this season. Casey Murphy became the youngest player in league history, and fourth overall, to reach the 30 milestone (regular season only) earlier this season.

MINUTES STREAK: The Courage went 460 regular season minutes without conceding between the 8' on June 3 in Kansas City and the 18' on July 10 in Los Angeles. The streak is longest in the NWSL this season and ranks fifth all-time in league history.

TEENAGE DREAM: At 19 years and 43 days, **Manaka Matsukubo** became the youngest goalscorer in a competitive match in Courage history with a goal in the Challenge Cup Final. Manaka is the fifth different teenager to score in NWSL competitions in 2023, which is two more than any other season in NWSL history.

IRON WOMAN 2: Kaleigh Kurtz is the lone Courage player remaining on the Iron Woman list for the 2023 regular season. She was an iron woman for the Courage in 2022 as well and is one of four 2022 Iron Women to still be in the running in 2023.

HEAD COACH: SEAN NAHAS (28W-15D-20L ALL COMPS)



Nahas begins his second full season as head coach of the Courage in 2023, bringing nearly two decades of coaching experience to the sideline. Nahas led the Courage to the 2022 Challenge Cup championship in his first season at the helm and was a member of the coaching staff that led the team to their NWSL Championships in 2018 and 2019. He has valuable US National Team coaching experience, including assistant coaching positions with the U20 USWNT and U14 Youth National Team and serving as a US National Team Youth Scout. He has held several leadership positions with CASL (now NCFC Youth), including Director of Girls Classic Soccer, ECNL Director, and Director of CASL Player Development. As ECNL Director, he helped CASL reach its highest ranking in USYS of No.7 nationally in 2010-2011.

ASSISTANT COACH - NATHAN THACKERAY



Thackeray enters his sixth season on the Courage staff in 2023. He was a member of the 2018 and 2019 NWSL Championship coaching staff. started his coaching career in 2011 after playing with England's Bradford City from 2003-2006 and William Woods University from 2006-2010. He worked with Young Harris College in Georgia, and then became the Head of Goalkeeping at the Houston Dynamo Academy in 2012. Thackeray is a USSF licensed coach.

ASSISTANT COACH - EMMA THOMSON



Thomson begins her second season as a full-time assistant in 2023. She spent six prior years with George Mason University, while also coaching with FC Virginia in the DA. She holds a USSF A license and is also on staff with the NC Courage Girls Academy. She grew up playing in the FA Women's Premier league and represented England at youth levels. A two-time captain for Penn State women's soccer, Thomson helped the Nittany Lions to four NCAA Tournament appearances, collecting four Big Ten Championships and one Big Ten Tournament Championship.

ASSISTANT COACH - FABRICE GAUTRAT

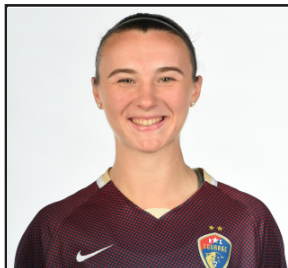
