MATCH PREVIEW

San Diego Wave FC (6-4-2, 20 points) are returning home for their second straight home match as they prepare to take on OL Reign (6-4-2, 20 points) this Saturday, June 24, at Snapdragon Stadium. The match will air on Paramount+ with kickoff slated for 7:00 p.m. PT.

San Diego has yet to record a win against Seattle as their all-time record versus OL Reign is 0-2-1 (W-L-D). The Wave and OL Reign met twice last season, as Seattle took the first match 1-0 at their home field. In their second meeting, the two clubs split the points with a 1-1 draw, while goalkeeper Kailen Sheridan became her the third goalkeeper in NWSL history to record an assist in this meeting. In the 2023 regular season, the club's faced off on April 15, where the match was deadlock into the final seconds when Seattle secured all three points with a 1-0 victory.

Most recently, OL Reign is coming off of a scoreless draw on Saturday against the Houston Dash. The Reign are also sitting just ahead of the Wave in the NWSL standings as both teams have a record of 6-4-2 with 20 points but the OL Reign is ahead by goal differential.

San Diego is coming off their first loss in five games as they faced their Southern California rivals, Angel City, on Saturday at Snapdragon Stadium. Defender Kristen McNabb put the Wave on the board first in the 57th minute to score her first goal of the season but ultimately San Diego fell 2-1.

Saturday's match against the Reign will mark the Wave's annual Pride match, presented by Queen Yasmine Injury Law. In addition, the match marks the sendoff game for San Diego's international players heading to the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. Currently, there are three San Diego players that will represent their respective countries - Naomi Girma (USA), Sofia Jakobsson (Sweden), and Alex Morgan (USA).

SEND OFF TO THE WORLD CUP

On Wednesday, the USWNT announced the World Cup roster in Australia and New Zealand this summer. Defender Naomi Girma and forward Alex Morgan will be representing the USA from the Wave. The call-up marks Girma's first-ever World Cup, while Morgan will be donning the red, white and blue for the fourth time at a World Cup. The United States is in Group E, along with Vietnam, Netherlands and Portugal.

Last Tuesday, June 15, Sweden Women's National Team announced their roster for the World Cup that included Wave midfielder Sofia Jakobsson. Jakobsson, who has 144 caps and 23 goals for her country, will be appearing in her fourth World Cup.

Additional players are expected to be added to their countries World Cup roster.

SAN DIEGO WAVE'S ANNUAL PRIDE NIGHT

The club's annual Pride Night, presented by Queen Yasmine Injury Law, is the theme for tonight's match. Women's Basketball Home of Fame member Cheryl Miller will be the Wavemaker of the match. In addition, Wave players will also wear Pride-themed jerseys, with numbers that are a unique design for each digit in celebration of diversity.

The club has partnered with San Diego Pride for an exclusive ticket pack that includes a ticket to the match and a LFGSD bucket hat, with \$5 of each purchase being donated back to the nonprofit.

Throughout the month of June, the Wave staff, community team and first-team will continue to reflect on, educate around and advance the club's efforts toward promoting inclusivity in the organization. The Wave's Neighborhood Tour, that took place on Thursday, was set in the Hillcrest community. As part of the tour, the Wave visited the Center, one of the largest and most vibrant LGBTQ+ community centers in the nation.

ALEX MORGAN IS MAKING WAVES

Alex Morgan notched her 25th regular season assist in NWSL play on Saturday against Angel City. She assisted Kristen McNabb in the 57th minute which registered McNabb's first goal of the 2023 regular season. Morgan's 25th assist goes along with her 58 career goals and she is the player with the most amount of assists (3) for the Wave this season.

Morgan is the third player in league history with 50+ goals and 25+ assists in regular season play, joining Jessica McDonald (54 goals, 30 assists) and Lynn Williams (63 goals, 26 assists).

HEAD COACH



COACHING CAREER: 2022: Named NWSL Coach of the Year after leading San Diego to a 3rd place finish (10-6-6) as the first-ever NWSL expansion team to reach the playoffs. Stoney is the second woman to win the NWSL's top coaching award. Led the Wave to one of the top-ranked defenses during the regular season, allowing just 21 goals in 22 matches, and outscoring opponents 32-20...2018-2021: Served as Manager of Manchester United Women, with 52 wins in 77 matches. Led the team to a 2018-19 Football Association Women's Championship title and secured promotion to the FA Women's Super League in her first season with the club...2009: Served as player-manager with Chelsea Ladies after the resignation of Steve Jones.

INTERNATIONAL CAREER: 2000-2017: Made 130 appearances from England's National Team and served as team captain... 2017: Semifinal appearance UEFA Women's Euro... 2005, 2009, 2011, 2015: English World Cup Team... 2012: Played for Great Britain in the London Olympics.

BIOGRAPHY

Casey was named head coach of San Diego Wave Fútbol Club, the 12th and newest franchise of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL), on July 14, 2021. After leading the Wave to a third-place finish and a postseason run in the inaugural season, Stoney was named 2022 NWSL Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Wave FC and the NWSL, Stoney served as Manager of Manchester United Women. There she led Manchester United to 52 wins in 77 competitive matches and secured promotion with the 2018-19 Football Association Women's Championship title in her inaugural season with the club. The team finished 4th in the 2019-20 and 2020-21 campaigns in the FA WSL, coming within a single point of qualifying for the Champions League in her last year with the club.

As a player, Stoney is the former captain of England, earning 130 international caps between 2000-2017, leading the team to a semifinal appearance at UEFA Women's Euro 2017 and playing in three World Cups ('07, '11, '15). Additionally, she played for Great Britain at the 2012 London Olympics helping them reach the quarterfinals. Stoney began her club career at 12 years old with Chelsea Ladies before moving to Arsenal Ladies in 1999.

Stoney joined Charlton Athletic Ladies in 2002 captaining the team and leading them to their first FA Women's Cup final. In July 2007, Stoney re-signed with Chelsea and served as player-manager for a portion of the 2009 season, giving her a taste of what was to come. In 2010 she signed with FA WSL club Lincoln, before returning to Arsenal in 2014. Stoney finished her illustrious 19-year professional career at Liverpool from 2016-2018.

Stoney prides herself on a coaching style that empowers players to be decision makers, and intimately understands the pressure and emotion of playing at the highest level. Determined to provide support for her team both on and off the pitch, Stoney strives to create a high-performance environment that fosters the open communication and supportive relationships.
