"I am really pleased to be joining Vancouver, to have the opportunity to settle here and experience playing professional soccer in Canada," said Bakare. "I want to show what I can do and share my experience and leadership with the team. I am excited to put my head down and get to work for the club."

The 20-year-old centre-back, who stands at six-foot-one, has considerable experience for his age. Bakare's stops in English professional soccer to date include with then League Two side Morecambe FC, where he signed with the club's under-18 squad in August 2018 and remained until October 2020, and with Cardiff City F.C., where he captained the Bluebird's under-23 side on numerous occasions during more than a year with the club from 2021 to 2022.

Bakare has also spent time with Cheshunt F.C. in the sixth tier of English soccer, Macclesfield FC in England's Northern Premier League Division One West and National League North side Kettering Town.

Bitar, 24, joins Vancouver after taking the Canadian soccer pathway from U SPORTS to the Canadian Premier League, as a two-time first-round pick in the annual CPL-U SPORTS Draft. The 2022 season, his first full year as a professional, saw Bitar make 22 appearances for FC Edmonton, recording five goals and an assist after signing with the club last March.

The native of Ottawa, Ont. starred for his former side even as he navigated a position change that saw him drop back into the midfield from his more traditional role as a striker. Bitar was named to the Canadian Premier League's Gatorade Team of the Week four times over the course of the 2022 season and earned the title of Player of the Week in Week 9.

"I am looking forward to building on my growth as a professional in 2022 with Vancouver this coming season," said Bitar. "I learned a lot during my first full season as a professional and believe I can contribute even more to my new team as Vancouver takes the pitch for its first season this year."

Before going pro, Bitar starred up front for the Carleton University Ravens from 2017 to 2021. The two-time U SPORTS All-Canadian was named the Ontario University Athletics East MVP and was honoured with the Lou Bilek Award as the U SPORTS men's soccer Rookie of the Year in 2017. He remains second on the school's all-time scoring list, with 40 goals.

Bitar made his Canadian Premier League debut for Cavalry FC during the 2019 season, after he was selected with the first overall pick in the 2018 CPL-U SPORTS Draft. Bitar returned to Carleton in the fall of 2019. He was once again selected by Cavalry with the sixth overall pick in the 2019 CPL-U SPORTS draft but did not join the club for The Island Games in 2020.

"Gabriel is a powerful presence with the ball at his feet," said Afshin Ghotbi, Head Coach, Vancouver FC. "He has an ability to create chances for himself through his strong dribbling and shooting skills. His movement off the ball also makes him a threat any time he is on the pitch."

Bitar earned experience abroad in 2021 when he trialed with then-reigning Lebanese Premier League and Lebanese FA Cup champion Al Ansar FC, scoring two goals in two matches for the club.

At the international level, Bitar, whose parents were both born in Beirut, Lebanon, debuted for the Lebanese men's national team in December 2022. He previously participated in the Canadian youth program when he took part in an identification camp for Canada's Men's Under-20 National Team in 2015.

Chung, 24, most recently represented Toronto FC, where he signed ahead of the 2022 Major League Soccer season after a successful preseason trial. He made eight MLS appearances for the Reds, starting five matches and logging 451 minutes. Chung was also part of the Toronto squad that won the postponed 2020 Canadian Championship final last year.

Prior to joining Toronto, Chung spent three seasons at Pacific FC. He was the first player to be signed by the club in late 2018 as a 20-year-old, and he went on to become the third player to sign in MLS out of the CPL, following Toronto's Lukas MacNaughton and Joel Waterman of CF Montréal. At the time of his move to Toronto, Chung had logged more minutes than any other Pacific player in the club's short history.

Chung made 63 total appearances for the Tridents between 2019 and 2021, playing a key role in the club's run to the Canadian Championship semi-finals and its first CPL title in 2021. He consistently rated among the League's elite defenders in defensive actions and duels won, while contributing to Pacific's attack with his overlapping runs and crisp passing.

Chung will now look to bring his skills as a two-way fullback, who predominantly plays on the right but can also slot in on the left, to the other side of the League's new west coast rivalry.

"It is important to build a competitive team right from the start," said Chung. "There are a lot of young guys on the squad who are hungry, and others who have experience that will be key to immediate success. Being a new team is not an excuse. Winning the League in 2021 has only made me hungrier to do it again, and I want to bring Vancouver to the playoffs and win it all. I think we have a group that can push for that."

Internationally, Chung has represented his country at several youth levels, including at the 2017 Concacaf U-20 Championship. In 2015, he was named Canada Soccer's U-17 Male Player of the Year, an award won the following two years by Chung's then-Whitecaps teammate Alphonso Davies. Most recently, Chung was named to the provisional roster for the 2020 Concacaf Men's Olympic Qualifying Championship in February 2020 and on the revised list in February 2021, following the postponement due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Crawford, 19, joins Vancouver out of Michigan State University, where he played NCAA Division I collegiate soccer in 2022. The teenage standout represented the Spartans in 16 games, starting 12 of those matches and adding an assist. His 1,152 minutes were the most logged by any freshman in Michigan's squad that season.

Prior to committing to Michigan, Crawford played in the Columbus Crew academy. He was named Academy Player of the Year in November 2021 as a 17-year-old, earning praise from the Major League Soccer club for his play on the field with the Under-18/Under-19 Academy Team, as well as for his volunteer work with the Crew Academy's Pre-Academy Program.

His contract with Vancouver is his first as a professional player.

"I am thrilled to begin my professional career with Vancouver," said Crawford. "I look forward to building relationships with my teammates, the club staff and the community and to learn what is required to make an impact on the field in the Canadian Premier League."

Crawford was born in Burlington, Ont. but grew up in Lutz, Fla. He attended a United States Soccer Federation Youth National Team Identification Center in the spring of 2021, and more recently represented the Canadian Men's Under-20 National Team in two games against Costa Rica in April 2022.

Gyimah, 19, will lean on his experience from the English game as he begins his first season in the CPL. The teenage native of London, England, who also played for Ghana as a youth international, previously represented storied club Sunderland A.F.C. at the under-23 level, where he scored one goal in 10 games. Gyimah has also appeared for Peterborough United and Slough Town F.C. in the English soccer system.

"I am ready to officially get underway with Vancouver FC," said Gyimah. "I am grateful for the chance Vancouver is taking on me and I am eager to get going for the team."

The opportunity with Vancouver marks Gyimah's first time playing professionally overseas, and he is expected to bring his pace, his direct, attacking style of play and his leadership to the right side of Head Coach Afshin Ghotbi's squad.



Henry, 18, is an up-and-coming Canadian central midfielder who most recently represented the CF Montreal academy, scoring five goals in 15 Première ligue de soccer du Québec games in 2023. A touted young talent, Henry has previously trialed with France-based teams FC Loriente, AJ Auxerre and Stade Malherbe Caen.

The native of Montreal, who can also play as a centre-back, was 14 years old when he made his debut in the Canadian youth program in 2019, representing Canada at the 2019 Concacaf Boys' Under-15 Championship. He more recently donned the maple leaf when he was selected to the Canadian team that competed at the 2022 Concacaf Men's Under-20 Championship. Henry made two appearances as a substitute during that competition, scoring against St. Kitts and Nevis with a tricky backheel.

"I look forward to the opportunity to compete for first-team action in Vancouver's first season," said Henry. "I am grateful to the club and to the League for giving me a place to continue to develop on home soil."



Hundal 23, joins Vancouver after mostly recently representing Inter Miami CF II in MLS Next Pro in 2022, where he scored six goals in 21 games, including 15 starts, and added another three assists.

A season earlier, Hundal starred for Inter Miami CF's now-defunct USL League One side, Fort Lauderdale CF, leading the team with 11 goals. That mark tied him for fourth in the league and helped him earn a spot on the USL League One All-League Second Team. Hundal was also a finalist for the USL League One Young Player of the Year award following that breakout season.

Hundal previously represented Valour FC during The Island Games in 2020, making six appearances for the club.

"I am looking forward to returning to the Canadian Premier League and taking full advantage of this opportunity with Vancouver FC," said Hundal. "I have grown a lot as a player over the past two seasons and I am excited to put those skills to work to make an impact for this team in this league."

The native of Brampton, Ont. signed his first professional contract with Toronto FC II in 2016, graduating to the squad after two years in the club's academy. He spent parts of four seasons with the team, earning nods on the USL's 20 under 20 list, which honoured the top 20 standouts under the age of 20 in the USL Championship and USL League One, in 2016 and 2017. A loan stint in 2019 also saw Hundal represent the Ottawa Fury in the USL Championship.

On the international stage, Hundal was named to the Canadian team at the 2017 Concacaf Men's Under-20 Championship. He has made eight total appearances for Canada's men's youth teams.

Irving, 29, began playing soccer at the age of four, advancing through the local youth system with Marpole SC in South Vancouver. He represented the Vancouver Selects for two seasons and spent six years in the Vancouver Whitecaps academy before a collegiate career at the University of Kentucky.

Now a three-year veteran of the Canadian Premier League, Irving began his professional career with the Rio Grande Valley Toros in the United Soccer League. He returned to Canada to represent the Ottawa Fury in the USL in 2016, spending three seasons in the nation's capital through 2019. Irving was back on the West Coast by February 2020, when he signed with Pacific FC ahead of the CPL's second season.


The local shot stopper led all CPL goalkeepers with 249 recoveries and 856 passes in 2022. He tied with Atlético Ottawa's Nathan Ingham for the most punches by a CPL goalkeeper last season and finished second among league netminders with 68 saves. The performance earned Irving a nomination for the CPL's annual Golden Glove award, his second finalist nod in three years.

John-Wentworth, 21, most recently represented Simcoe County Rovers in League1 Ontario's Men's Premier Division, where he logged 1140 minutes over the course of the 2022 regular season and competed in the first two playoff matches in club history. John-Wentworth scored one goal for Rovers in 2022 and was named to the League1 Ontario Team of the Week in Week 14.

He possesses the versatility to play all over the field, including as a left-back, at wingback or in midfield.

Prior to his time with Simcoe County, John-Wentworth represented Vaughan Azzurri in Leaguel Ontario in 2021. He played collegiate soccer with Durham College in Oshawa, Ont. in 2019-2020, one of the most successful seasons in program history that culminated in the program's first Canadian Collegiate Athletic Association national championship banner.

John-Wentworth later transferred to Murray State College in Tishomingo, Oklahoma, where he represented the Aggies in National Junior College Athletic Association Division 1 play in his sophomore season in 2021. He was named first team all-region that May, after scoring six goals and adding five assists.

Kane, 19, joins Vancouver FC on a transfer from York United, after signing with the Nine Stripes last December. A highly rated young attacker, Kane will look to continue his development as a member of Vancouver FC.

The teenage attacker was born in Mbaké, Senegal but grew up in Montréal, Que. after a move overseas at the age of nine. His Canadian soccer playing days began at FS Salaberry in Montréal, and Kane later moved on to the Club de Foot Montréal academy. It was during his time in the academy that Kane represented Canada at the 2019 FIFA U-17 World Cup, where he featured in all three of the team's matches.

Last year, Kane was named to Canada's provisional roster ahead of the Concacaf Men's Under-20 championship.

Kane made 11 appearances in all competitions for York United last year as an 18-year-old, accumulating 291 league minutes and featuring in two Canadian Championship matches. He provided an assist in York's Canadian Championship defeat to Vancouver Whitecaps, setting up an exciting end to what was a closely contested do-or-die match.

A mid-year loan to FC Edmonton saw Kane spend the remainder of the 2022 Canadian Premier League season in Alberta, where he logged 77 minutes over seven appearances.

By adding Kane to the roster, Vancouver FC has now signed three players to its growing squad. Kane joins midfielder Elliot Simmons and goalkeeper Callum Irving as the first three player signings in club history.



Kwak, 22, becomes the second Korean-born player to play in the CPL, after midfielder Son Yong-Chan represented FC Edmonton in 2019 and 2020.

He made a stop in Croatia as a 19-year-old with HNK Gorica, before returning to the United States and the NISA.





The native of Toronto, 22, brings a mix of youth and experience to head coach Afshin Ghotbi's squad. A product of Toronto FC's academy system, Romeo most recently represented Valour FC in the Canadian Premier League, spending part of the 2021 season with Valour on loan from Toronto before joining the CPL club on contract in 2022.



In signing Sandoval to a 2023 contract, Vancouver head coach Afshin Ghotbi has landed a key playmaker for a team looking to make an impression in its first season in the League. Sandoval, who stands at five-foot-five, is a versatile attacking midfielder who can play on either the left or right side of the field.

The 27-year-old native of Guadalajara, Mexico has made 119 appearances in Mexico's top division, Liga MX, at such storied clubs as Santos Laguna, FC Juárez, Club Deportivo Guadalajara (Chivas) and Mazatlán FC.

Sandoval made his Liga MX debut as a 20-year-old in July 2016, after years in the Mexican youth system. Sandoval spent the 2021 season on loan from Chivas with Mazatlán FC, his most recent action in Liga MX play. He has seven Liga MX goals and 16 assists over seven seasons in Mexico's top division.

Prior to signing with Vancouver, Sandoval spent the 2022 season on loan from Chivas with Wellington Phoenix in the Australian A-League, his first taste of action outside of Mexican football. He made 20 appearances for the club, scoring six goals and adding five assists. He was most recently on trial with Mexican side Tepatitlán F.C. before landing in the Lower Mainland.

Sandoval has also previously represented the Mexican National Team at the under-18 level.

Simmons, 25, becomes the second player to sign with Vancouver, joining goalkeeper Callum Irving on the team roster. Like Irving, Simmons joins the club with considerable experience in the league, having previously represented both Halifax Wanderers and Cavalry FC, and figures to be another anchoring part of head coach Afshin Ghotbi's side.

The central midfielder was born in Luton, England and emigrated to Stittsville, Ontario at the age of five. He played youth soccer with Goulbourn Soccer Club and the Ottawa Fury before returning overseas to join the Milton Keynes Dons academy in his native England, and later moving on to Málaga CF's academy in Spain.

Simmons' signed his first professional contract with Swedish side Dalkurd FF in 2017, and played professionally in Finland before returning to Canada to join the Canadian Premier League ahead of its inaugural season in 2019.

Simmons has since accumulated 82 appearances between the Wanderers, where he spent the 2019 season, and Cavalry, where he played the past three years. 
FORGE HISTORY


