FIRST TEAM UPDATES

CFC DOMINATES EASTERN FOE ON THE ROAD SATURDAY NIGHT

Chattanooga FC turned on the style with a 5-1 win over Flower City Union at Rochester Community Sports Complex. Hat-trick hero Markus Naglestad rose to the occasion as the Boys in Blue earned a second road win in a row to avenge the previous meeting between the two sides.

Chattanooga FC had a two week break before this match following a 2-1 win in a successful visit to the Maryland Bobcats. Flower City Union also notched a 2-1 win over Maryland last weekend for its first home win of the season.

Franky Martinez returned to the start-

ing lineup, coming back after recovering from surgery to repair a fracture in his arm.

Flower City Union head coach Colton Bly made just one change to his starting eleven, resting forward Canas-Jarquin to start Lukas Fernandes, the lone goal scorer in FCU's visit to Finley Stadium last month.

Chattanooga FC wasted no time in taking control of the game. Flower City learned from Maryland's mistakes, leav-

ing little space behind the defense in a low, defensive block. Chattanooga was forced to play a skillful game between the lines of the Flower City defense, and the Boys in Blue were up for the task.

Chattanooga's biggest win of the season saw many more impressive individual performances. Franky Martinez played comfortably on his return from injury, pairing well with Colin Stripling to form a solid centerback pairing. Taylor Gray, Brett Jones, and the midfield three of Alex McGrath, Ian Cerro, and Chris Bermudez all contributed to the electric attacking display. Fullbacks Travis Ward and Tate Robertson put in a solid shift to nip Flower City's attack in the bud while adding to the attacking threat on the wings. Overall, this may have been the team's best performance of the year.

Chattanooga FC has made matches more inclusive and accessible for neurodivergent supporters. The club has made available a matchday checklist, which outlines a supporter's night - from getting to the stadium to the end of the match - to mitigate the unknown.

Changes to routine can be difficult for people who are neurodiverse, particularly if this change is an overwhelming sensory occasion, such as a soccer match. By mapping out the night ahead, the checklist establishes a routine. This checklist can help reduce anxiety, who otherwise might find the loud noises, sights, and even new smells, from things like food stalls, unnerving. We call the list a blueprint for the night, as it covers all angles, such as getting to the game, where you sit, and how the game goes. The checklist can make the difference between a neurodivergent person going to a match or avoiding such nights out.

Chattanooga FC believes it is the responsibility of the club that neurodivergent persons are not seen as others, but as simply people in the community. They're our sisters and brothers, and they are supporters!

Friends Of The Troops is a 501c3 nonprofit organization that was founded to support, encourage, and honor Veterans and members of the United States Armed Forces in times of need. Their mission is to support troops and Veterans who, for any reason, slip through the cracks of other organizations. They send cards and care packages to deployed troops serving overseas, and they send cards and other items of support to stateside troops, Veterans and their families as needed. They also provide food, household, and hygiene items and toys for children throughout the year and at the Holidays.

Mission of Friends of the Troops They are headquartered in Chattanooga,

Tennessee, and they have a volunteer network that spans over 30 states nationwide. They have sent tens of thousands of cards and care packages to those who have little to no family support or need extra encouragement. During the 2020 COVID-19 Pandemic, they sent care packages and other support to the Navy Nurses aboard the USNS Mercy hospital ship and to those deployed to work in NYC hospitals. Thanks to their generous donors and corporate partners, they were able to donate pallets of much-needed disinfectants, hand sanitizers, and PPE including over 28,000 surgical masks to facilities serving many Veterans. They recently supported a unit out of Cleveland, Tennessee during their overseas deploy-

ment and also supported soldiers with the 10th

Mountain Division out of Fort Drum, New York and troops with the 82nd Airborne out of Fort Bragg. They currently support deployed troops in Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Djibouti, Somalia, South Korea, Italy, Japan, and aboard Navy ships at sea.
