





Head Coach: Roger Reid (Weber State '68) enters his 6th season as head coach, his 17th season overall at BYU; 114-48 (.704) record in 5 years as head coach

Assistant Coach: Tony Ingle (Huntingdon '76) was head coach at Alabama-Huntsville and Gordon College (NAIA), 6th year at BYU

Assistant Coach: Lynn Archibald (Fresno State '68) is in his1st year at BYU; was head coach at Idaho State and Utah; has been an assistant coach the last 5 years at Arizona State

Restricted-Earnings Coach: Russ Zaugg (Weber State '85) is in his1st year at BYU; has been the head coach at Springville (UT) High the past 3 years

Season Outlook

Coach Roger Reid enters his sixth season as positive and optimistic as ever-also as intense and concerned about effort and teamwork as when he took over.

"But we can't sit back," Reid cautions. "We've got to be ready to play each night."

On the plus side, the Cougars return four starters (Russell Larson, Kenneth Roberts, Shane Knight and Randy Reid) from a team which won 22 games and crushed Utah by 31 points in the Western Athletic Conference Tournament.

Throw in super sub Mark Durrant and guards Robbie Reid (who played in the Olympic Festival) and Craig Wilcox and there's a solid nucleus.

And then there's the influx of four talented redshirts--7-0, 285-pound Cory Reader, 6-10 Bret Jepsen, 6-9 Jeff Campbell and 6-8 Grant Berges.

"I like the redshirt situation as far as depth is concerned," says Reid. "But I don't know exactly where they'll fit in, who they can beat out or how much playing time they'll get."

Of that group, only Campbell has played any college basketball. He was a reserve in half the games during 1990-91 before a church mission and sitting out a year. Berges went on a mission after high school. Reader played briefly in the Australian League but hasn't played competitively in the past two years. Jepsen has only been away from games a year, but that was at the high school level.

Another player who has been away two years, 6-7 Justin Weidauer, played in only eight games in 1991-92.

At least there are enough front-line players, the Cougars likely will redshirt 6-8 Jay Thompson, who improved steadily last season in spite foul trouble.

The other starter lost was Kurt Christensen, only eighth on the scoring list but a hard worker as the point guard and tenacious on defense.

In his place, BYU will go to Robbie Reid, the team's top defensive player and a leader on the floor. He averaged 6.8 points off the bench in an impressive freshman season.

Randy Reid, who was the point guard as a freshman the year before, can play both guard spots and will see action at both since depth is a concern. The only other guard on scholarship is 6-5 Wilcox, who averaged 17.4 minutes and 5.5 points in making the transition from junior college and in bouncing back from knee surgery.

While all three are respectable three-point shooters, almost all eyes will be on the front line.

Heading the list is 6-11 Larson, all-region last year in averaging 19.9 points and 9.1 rebounds. His .571 shooting percentage ranks second on BYU's all-time list and he's finish high in most of the offensive categories.

"Russell needs to be self-motivated," says Coach Reid. "But he could be one of the best we've had."

Roberts, who wound up playing center at 6-8, made the transition from the mission in impressive fashion. He averaged 12.8 points, 6.0 rebounds and led the WAC in field goal percentage at 57.7.

Knight, a 6-10 leaper, enters his fourth year as an offensive weapon. "He's made progress defensively but needs to keep improving," Reid says.

Durrant is "one of the most solid I've coached in my 17 years here," according to Reid. "He's a winner who does all the intangibles in addition to being one the best passers we've had."

Reid was pleased with son Randy averaging 11.8 points, leading the WAC guards in shooting at 51.7 percent and topping the team in assists as a sophomore and says Robbie should be improved now that surgery to remove bone spurs on both ankles is out of the way.

"Robbie helped us in a lot of situations last year and should be better now that he has more confidence," says Coach Reid.

The eight returning players--along with Christensen, John Fish and Shawn Lindquist--played five games in August against excellent teams in Slovenia.

That experience should help with a "challenging" schedule which includes an opener with highly regarded Oklahoma State, road games with Utah State and Weber State, and the always-tough WAC.

Last season, the Cougars went into the final weekend with a chance for the WAC title but lost by two points to New Mexico in overtime and by a point to Texas-El Paso for third place--the first time BYU hasn't won the title or the league tournament under Coach Reid.

Then at the WAC, a semifinal upset by Hawai'i over New Mexico cost BYU an NCAA bid.

"This team has to be hungry," Reid says. "Last year's group united and the team came first. That's what we need again."

Roger Reid

114-48 (.704) 6th Season (Weber State '68) Best Time To Call Coach Reid: 11 a.m.

All Roger Reid has done in his first five years is average 23 victories per season, win three Western Athletic Conference titles and two WAC Tournaments.

He's taken BYU to four NCAA Tournaments and in last year's NIT, upset Arizona State, a team which had raced past the Cougars to open the season.

Last year's 22-10 mark came despite the absence of 7-6 Shawn Bradley, who was Reid's first recruit but played only one season before going on a church mission and then becoming the number-two selection in the 1993 NBA draft.

But time and victories have proven Reid will keep succeeding despite the name changes and players coming and going for missionary work.

Ironically, the only time in his first four years the Cougars didn't win the WAC under Reid was in 1990-91 with Bradley playing. And, even then, BYU was runner-up.

The energetic, ultra-positive former pro baseball player became the 11th head coach in BYU history in March, 1989.

His first season (1989-90), Reid won 21 games with a 6-7 center. He tied for the Western Athletic Conference title (21-9) with a team picked sixth. He was WAC Coach of the Year and District Coach of the Year by both the coaches and media.

His team set a school record for three-point shooting and was eighth in the nation in that category.

Home attendance averaged more than 19,000 to

watch a 15-0 season. Only an errant alleyoop pass kept the Cougars from upsetting Clemson at the NCAA Tournament.

The 1991 team featured Bradley, who was named to the nation's All-Freshman Team and set a frosh record for blocked shots



with 5.2. He was MVP of the WAC Tournament, which BYU won for the first time ever.

Coach Reid's team--picked fifth in the WAC--finished second and then defeated Virginia in the NCAA Tournament in going 21-13.

The third year BYU was 25-7, tying for the regular season title and winning the tournament again. The 1991-92 team went 25-9 and tied for the WAC crown.

Reid, a 1968 graduate of Weber State, arrived at BYU in 1978--when the Cougars were coming off five losing seasons. During his first year as an assistant BYU won the WAC championship. In his 11 seasons as an assistant, BYU averaged 20 wins a year and won four WAC titles.

The 47-year-old Reid also had been coordinating BYU's recruiting efforts since he joined the staff. He worked under Frank Arnold as a graduate assistant

for a few months and then was five seasons as an assistant coach.

In the six years with Ladell Andersen, Roger was responsible for BYU's defensive schemes as the assistant head coach.

He has served as chairman (1980-81) of the recruiting committee for the National Association of Basketball Coaches. In 1981, he helped give basketball clinics in Australia for three weeks.

Reid is on the Collegiate Committee of USA Basketball and is on the NABC Legislation Committee, serving as liaison between the board of directors and the WAC coaches.

Reid has been on the NABC committee to plan the national convention as well as on the Awards Committee.

Born Aug. 3, 1947, Reid was a star athlete at Springville (Utah) High, where he was student body vice-president and an all-state athlete. He was MVP in the annual North-South all-star baseball game.

Reid enrolled at BYU in 1964 and played freshman basketball and baseball. In order to pursue basketball, he transferred to Carbon College (now the College of Eastern Utah), where he was a standout in both sports. He was the team's MVP in baseball and named a Junior College All-American.

Reid moved to Weber State and was a member of the Big Sky Conference championship basketball team coached by Dick Motta. He also was all-conference in baseball two seasons.

From Weber State, he was drafted into professional baseball and spent four years as a shortstop with the Chicago White Sox and Atlanta Braves farm systems, advancing to AAA ball.

Reid began his coaching career in 1971 as the basketball and baseball coach at Payson (Utah) High.

His basketball record was 50-26 in three seasons and his baseball teams were 35-11.

In 1974, he moved to Clearfield (Utah) High and took the basketball team to the state tournament for the first time in five years and was 60-24.

Throughout his prep coaching career, Reid's teams were known as tough defensive squads, despite the fact that the tallest player was 6-4.

Reid married Diane Gardner in 1966 and they have five children: Randy, 24, who has started two years for the Cougars; Robbie, 20, a sophomore on this year's team and a BYU baseball player; David, who died in 1980; Darren, 15; and Kelli, 13.

He has served as first counselor in a an LDS Church bishopric and also functioned on a stake high council.

In April, 1990, he had both hips replaced. It makes for a distinctive walk but hasn't diminished his intensity a bit.

Tony Ingle

Tony Ingle is BYU's veteran assistant who gave up a Division One head coaching job to help the Cougars to five postseason appearances.


Coach Ingle tells the story of hearing on the radio about good friend Roger Reid being appointed head coach. He rushed home to tell his wife, forgetting about his children, who were at an ice cream store.

The two had become friends in 1981, when the Cougars got to the championship game of the NCAA Regional in Atlanta.

"I've admired Roger Reid since day one," Ingle recalls. "He's the only reason I ever would have left the iob I had."

Ingle, 42, grew up in Dalton, Ga., graduating from North Whitfield High. At Dalton Junior College he was student body vice president, team captain and won

the



best hustle and free throw shooting awards. In two years his team went 61-10 and ranked as high as second and fifth in the NJCAA.

He was an assistant one year at Northwest Whitfield and was head coach a year at Southeast Whitfield. For seven seasons at Cherokee High in Canton, Ga., he was 107-47 and was the Atlanta Journal and Constitution AAAA Coach of the Year in 1982.

In three years (1985-88) as head coach at Gordon Junior College in Barnesville, Ga., his team were 60-33, scoring more than 100 points 23 times and going to the state playoffs each year.

After being named the Atlanta Tipoff Club JC Coach of the Year in 1988, he moved to Alabama-Huntsville. His 10-18 first-year record was the school's most wins in five years and eight of the losses were to nationally ranked Division II schools or Division I teams.

Ingle has directed dozens of basketball camps and worked at the BYU camp several times prior to becoming a Cougar coach.

Tony and his wife, Jeanne, were married in 1974. They have five children: Eliott (19) plays at Calhoun Junior College in Decateur, Ga.; Sunshine (16), Golden (13), Tony, Jr. (12) and Israel (10).

The children have performed basketball dribbling and ball-handling routines as the "little Nuggets" at halftime shows for a number of NBA games and have a half-hour video tape (Dribbling to Dreams) on basketball skills.

"We're lucky to have Tony," says Coach Reid. "It's hard to believe someone can be so humorous and yet so serious and knowledgeable about basketball."

Lynn Archibald

Lynn Archibald, who helped Arizona State to a school-record five straight postseason appearances, returns to the Beehive State as a fulltime assistant for the Cougars.


Archibald, who played at Utah State and coached at Utah, replaces Charles Bradley, who is now the head coach at Metro State in Denver.

"I want to have the most competent staff I can," says Coach Roger Reid. "We were fortunate to get Lynn. I've always been impressed with his work ethic and his outstanding recruiting ability. Plus, he's been a head coach and understands both roles. He brings outstanding experience in every aspect of basketball to BYU."

At Idaho State, he had a 69-68 record after being the youngest head coach in the NCAA. In six years at Utah he was 98-85, won a Western Athletic Conference title, received two NCAA bids and played in two National Invitational Tournaments.

"Arch is a class guy," said Arizona State Coach Bill Frieder. "He'd be a great addition to any program.





I'm sorry to see him make the change but I can understand it."

At ASU, Archibald directed much of his attention to directing the Sun Devils' up-tempo offense, which was among the school's best in points scored and in three-point shooting.

The 49-year-old Archibald arrived in time to go with the Cougars to Slovenia, where he saw some of Europe's best young players.

Archibald was born in Logan and lived in Oregon and California. He graduated from Torrance High. He played at Utah State his freshman year and El Camino Junior College his sophomore year.

He transferred to Fresno State, where he obtained a bachelor's degree in 1968.

The next year he was head coach at Sierra Vista High in Baldwin Park, Calif., and then head coach two years at Los Amigos High in Fountain Valley, Calif.

During the 1971-72 season Archibald was an assistant at Long Beach State and spent a year at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, where he obtained a master's degree.

It was on to Nevada-Las Vegas for three seasons and to Southern California for one. He was head coach at Idaho State for five years (1978-82), an assistant at Utah in 1983 and then head coach.

He and his wife, Anne, have three children: Damon (22) is a junior on the Boise State basketball team; Lee Anne (20) is a student at BYU; and Beau (17) is a senior at Timpview. Last year, Beau played for the Arizona 5-A champion, Corona del Sol.

Cougar Assistants

The restricted-earnings coach is **Russ Zaugg**, who played ball for Roger Reid at Clearfield High.

With no scouting visits allowed this year, Russ will be heavily involved in analyzing video tapes to prepare reports on opposing teams.

A native of West Point, Utah, Zaugg played two years of junior varsity ball at Utah State

and served a church mission in La Paz, Bolivia.

He graduated from Weber State in 1985 with a degree in physical education and a minor in Spanish. His master's degree was from Utah State in English (1992).

For six years he was the tennis coach and an assistant football and basketball coach at Davis High in Kaysville. The past three years he was the head basketball coach at Springville High.

Zaugg replaces Jeff Reinert, now the head coach at Utah Valley State College.

He married Dawn McEntire and they have a daughter and two sons.

Head trainer **George Curtis** will be working with the men's basketball program this season.

The former athlete at Southern Utah, is a native of Kansas City and served as the trainer at Santa Ana College in California 13 years. Brigham Young University



Brigham Young University is a private, churchsponsored institution which has earned an admirable reputation for successfully blending scholarly learning with moral and spiritual education.

BYU began modestly in 1875 as Brigham Young Academy with 29 elementary school students. It is now a full accredited, internationally recognized university with a day-time enrollment of more than 27,000, the nation's largest private university.

The campus is located 45 miles south of Salt Lake City, in Provo, Utah, a city of 92,000 in a valley of 300,000 people. It is situated 4,560 feet above sea level at the western base of the Wasatch Mountains, part of the Rocky Mountain Range.

The valley offers a beautiful setting, with 11,750foot Mount Timpanogos on the northeast and 23-milelong Utah Lake on the west.

In addition to Utah and Hawai'i campuses, BYU maintains Study Abroad programs in China, Russia, Austria, England, France, Italy, Spain, Egypt, Morocco, Japan, Guatemala, Chile and at the BYU Center in Israel.

Although 98 percent of the student body belongs to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, admission is open to those of any race, color, creed or national origin, provided they meet the university's academic requirements and their conduct conforms to the standards of the LDS Church.

Non-Mormons come from more than 25 other denominations and about 25 percent of the student body is married. Students come from every state (30 percent from Utah) and more than 70 countries. More than 8,000 students are bilingual, having learned a foreign language while serving a mission for the Church in another country.

A new museum of art opened this year and a science building is under construction. The Harris Fine Arts Center features five theaters, nine pipe organs, a National Public Radio station and a Public Broadcasting Service television studio.

Highly respected programs include the J. Reuben Clark Law School, the Marriott School of Management, the Ezra Taft Benson Institute (helping solve the world's food problems), the Lee Library with more than two million volumes, and the computeraided design and manufacturing programs.

Academic excellence is increasingly evident as students and faculty show their competence. Almost three-quarters of the 1,300 full-time faculty hold doctoral degrees and the university is accredited by more than 100 educational, business, professional and government organizations.

Admission standards continue to rise as competition increases. The average ACT composite score for entering BYU freshmen is 27 and the average grade point for new students is 3.7.

To fill the 14 semester hours of religion required, students can take courses ranging the history of the LDS Church to comparative world religions. Four credit hours are spent in studying the Book of Mormon, regarded as scripture along with the Bible.

The 631-acre campus is a superb facility which is unusually clean and well-kept.

Academic accomplishments and physical facilities aside, many people point to the character of the students and faculty and their commitment to traditional values as the school's most important attributes.

Each student signs a Code of Honor, promising to abstain from alcohol, tobacco, tea and coffee and to be honest and chaste--all in accord with the tenets of the sponsoring church.

BYU became a university on Oct. 23, 1903. After two downtown locations, work began on the current campus in 1909.

Campus Leaders

President Rex E. Lee



Rex E. Lee, a former Solicitor General of the United States, has been BYU's president since 1989.

He currently chairs a special NCAA committee, which includes former Chief Justice Warren Burger, to review rules enforcement and the infractions process.

He has argued 57 cases before the U.S. Supreme

Court in his private appellate practice and while a partner in the Washington, D.C., law firm of Sidley & Austin.

Lee, 59, is a 1960 graduate of BYU and earned a juris doctorate from the University of Chicago in 1963. He also holds five honorary Doctor of Law degrees and has served as law clerk to Justice Byron R. White of the U.S. Supreme Court.

He was born in Los Angeles on Feb. 27, 1935, to Rex E. and Mabel Whiting Lee. His father died before Pres. Lee was born and his mother married Wilford J. Shumway and moved to St. Johns, Arizona.

Lee was the first Eagle Scout in the town and later served a church mission in Mexico from 1955-58.

He is married to the former Janet Griffin and they are the parents of seven children and have six grandchildren.

Pres. Lee was the founding dean of the J. Reuben Clark Law School at BYU from 1971-75 and worked in the Department of Justice two years before being Solicitor General four years.

He has been the holder of the George Sutherland Chair of Law at BYU since returning in 1985.

Dr. R. J. Snow Advancement Vice President

Dr. R.J. Snow is in his fifth year as a BYU vice president after being mission president in South Africa for three years.

He was born in St. George, Utah, and attended elementary school there before moving to Washington, D.C. He returned to attend Dixie College, obtaining an associate degree in 1957.



After a church mission in France, he obtained bachelor's (1962) and master's degrees (1964) from the University of Utah.

Dr. Snow completed another master's degree and a doctoral degree (1967) at Northwestern and did post-doctoral work at Oregon and Harvard.

He taught political science at UC-Santa Barbara from 1967-73 and from 1973-84 taught at Utah, where he also was Director of the Hinckley Institute of Politics and then Vice President of University Relations and Student Affairs.

He was in private business three years before going to South Africa. Dr. Snow has been active in a variety of civic organizations and community service groups, including board member of the Utah Symphony, LDS Hospital, Salt Lake and Provo United Way, and the Provo-Orem Chamber of Commerce.


He is married to the former Marilyn Melville and they are the parents of four children, including two BYU students, and have a grandchild.

Dr. Clayne Jensen Athletic Director

Dr. Clayne Jensen is in his second year as athletic director and fourth as associate vice president over men's and women's athletics.

He was the NCAA Faculty Representative from 1976-1993 and Dean of the College of Physical Education from 1973-91.

He was a member of the WAC Council 17 years, serving on a



number of committees and was on the High Country Athletic Conference Council eight years. Dr. Jensen was a member of the NCAA Governing Council from 1985-89 and has been active in national and international Olympic programs for 20 years.

A native of Gunnison, Utah, Jensen obtained bachelor's (1952) and master's degrees (1956) from the University of Utah and a doctorate (1963) from Indiana.

From 1953-55, he was a captain in the U.S. Marine Corps and coached two All-Marine championship track teams. He taught at Utah State from 1956-64.

Dr. Jensen has held the academic rank of full professor for 26 years and taught a variety of courses.

A prolific author of text books, he is married to the former Elouise Henrie and they have four sons----including three former BYU football players.

Athletic Personnel

Pete Witbeck, Associate AD

Alan "Pete" Witbeck has been involved with BYU 45 years.

Witbeck, a native of Raymond, Alberta, Canada, came to BYU in 1949 as a long distance runner on the track team. He acquired bachelor's (1952) and master's (1954) degrees before joining the P.E. staff in 1955.



Witbeck was coach of the freshman basketball team from 1958-64. During that time, his teams posted a 62-9 record, losing only three times in the last three years Witbeck was coach.

The 1963-64 Kittens were undefeated and ranked first in the nation among freshmen teams. That group went on to win the NIT title in 1966. Witbeck was given the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has contributed most to amateur athletics in the state.

As a member of that NIT championship team, he was inducted into BYU's Hall of Fame in 1980. He also is a member of the Raymond Sports Hall of Fame (1990) and the Utah Old Time Athletes Hall of Fame (1994).

Witbeck joined the varsity staff in 1964 as Stan Watts' top assistant. During Witbeck's tenure, teams won five Western Athletic Conference championships in eight years and were nationally ranked.

He has been the right hand to the athletic director since 1972. Some of his responsibilities include overseeing athlete eligibility, game management and serving as liaison between BYU, the NCAA and the WAC. He also has authored a book on racquetball.

He is married to the former Kathy Pickering. They have three children and three grandchildren.

Mike King, Asst. AD-Finance



Mike King has been the Cougars' business manager 15 years and became an assistant AD in 1989. He had been controller and director of financial services at BYU-Hawaii prior to moving to Provo.

King was athletic business manager at Idaho State from

1974-78 and managed the ISU Minidome from 1970-74.

He received a B.A. degree at Idaho State in 1970. Mike, an LDS bishop at BYU, is married to the former Jeannette Bertoch, and they have four children.

Val Hale, Asst. AD-Public Relations

Val Hale is in his sixth year as assistant athletic director for media and public relations. He has the responsibility of overseeing the Sports Information operation and coordinating public relations, marketing and promotional efforts.

Cougar Club

BYU's Cougar Club has grown into one of the nation's most prestigious and effective booster organizations. Its membership of more than 4,000 makes it twice as large as any other WAC booster group.

Some of the Cougar Club services include funding recruiting trips, sponsoring the spring football game and pre-season basketball game and honoring present and past athletes at an annual banquet and with an Athletic Hall of Fame.

Other assistance includes providing tutorial help, purchasing special non-budgeted equipment, providing post eligibility scholarships, and sponsoring satellite broadcasts and television replays.

Cougar Club members donate annually to the BYU athletic program. In return, contributors receive passes for parking, football and basketball yearbooks, monthly newsletters and other benefits.

The executive director since 1975 has been Dale McCann, a business management graduate of BYU (1966). He attended West High in Salt Lake City and worked for General Dynamics and at Signetics prior to his current job. He is married to the former Andrea Schmidt and they have 10 children.

KSL Radio

For more than 43 years, BYU fans have been following Cougar athletics via 50,000-watt KSL Radio (1160 AM), located in Salt Lake City.

The "Voice" of the Cougars is play-by-play man Paul James, a veteran broadcaster with 44 years' experience. An Ogden High and Utah graduate, James began radio work in 1950.

For six years, he broadcast Utah basketball and football games before joining the staff at KSL Radio and Television in July of 1965. This is his 30th season doing BYU games.

Paul Ruffner, BYU's center from 1968-70, provides the color commentary. He was second team All-WAC in 1969. The next season he had 37 points and 18 rebounds in a game against Georgia.

KSL-TV

KSL Television, the CBS affiliate in Salt Lake City, has televised a number of BYU basketball games.

Craig Bolerjack, a graduate of the University of Kansas, provides play-by-play for the fans.

The sports director is Doug Miller.

KBYU-TV

The tradition continues between KBYU and Cougar basketball. Some away games are carried live and home games are shown at 10:30 p.m. by Channel 11.

The play-by-play announcer is veteran Jay Monsen, BYU's electronic media coordinator for the athletic department, and commentary is provided by former BYU All-American Tom Steinke, now the athletic director at Westminster College.

Monsen graduated from BYU in 1957 and began a radio career at KSUB in Cedar City. He was at KSL in Salt Lake City prior to coming to BYU in 1972. He is in his 23rd year announcing BYU sports.

An experienced sports crew and state-of-the-art equipment have enabled KBYU to develop a reputation for outstanding coverage of football, basketball and other major "remote" events in the western U.S.

KBYU has won numerous awards for its sports productions and is frequently employed by ESPN, TBS, Prime Ticket, the Utah Jazz Network, USA Network, SportsChannel and local affiliates.

KBYU owns and operates a fully-equipped, 48-foot production truck, designed by experienced professionals for demanding standards.

Traveling with an expert of full-time engineers and technicians, the KBYU truck has a full complement of on-board audio and video equipment with state-of-the-art cameras, long lenses, one-inch and 3/4-inch tape machines, video monitoring, special effects and Chyron graphics.

Blue & White Network

Basketball is being added to football telecasts, which already are syndicated to television viewers in 50 states, including more than 40 million households.

The network began in 1989 in partnership with the Air Force Academy. Owned and operated by KBYU in Provo, the Blue & White Sports Network includes cable systems and stations from Hawaii to Maine.

The Blue & White Sports Network is one of the largest university-owned syndication networks in the country.

Bonneville LDS Radio Network

The Bonneville International LDS Radio Network broadcasts KSL Radio's coverage of BYU football and basketball to all of North America, including Canada and parts of Central America.

The signal is broadcast via satellite (Satcom C1 Transponder 6 Audio 5.58) and by subcarrier radio in 10 U.S. cities.

It also is carried by TCI cable in Salt Lake County and by Dimension cable in Orange County, Calif. For more information, call (801) 575-7663.

Marriott Center

With a seating capacity of 22,700, the Marriott Center is one of the nation's largest on-campus basketball facilities.

Kentucky's Rupp Arena is a 23,000-seat facility, but is owned by the city of Lexington and located off the campus. Two other arenas--at Tennessee and North Carolina--also are in the 23,000-seat range.

In the past BYU has been one of the best drawing teams in America. Since the Marriott Center opened in 1971, more than six million fans have watched BYU basketball games. The BYU single-season record for average attendance is 22,506--set during the 1980-81 season.

Last season, BYU ranked sixth nationally in paid attendance behind Syracuse, Kentucky, North Carolina, Arkansas and Louisville,

A new addition to the Marriott Center last season was an eight-sided 26-foot wide by 16-foot high scoreboard which features four large video walls designed to show live game action and instant replays. In addition, the scoreboard has four fully animated matrix boards.

The video screens are made up of 16 video cubes containing a projector and operated by a processor which creates a large number of special-effect capabilities.

In addition to men's and women's basketball games, the video display board is used for devotionals, forums, firesides and selected other activities in the Marriott Center.

The Marriott Center also has a lighting system capable of providing 250-foot candles of illumination.

Named after the nationally known businessman who was the major contributor, the J. Willard Marriott Center houses crowds for basketball, commencement exercises, concerts, pageants, devotionals and many other activities.


In 1972, 1977, 1979 and 1982, the Marriott Center served ashost for the NCAA Far West Regional playoffs. It also has been used many times for state high school tournaments.

Physically, the building covers three acres. The outside dimensions are 280 by 340, or the equivalent of two football fields placed side by side. The roof covers 130,000 square feet and encloses eight million cubic feet. From the playing floor to the top of the roof, the height is nearly 10 stories.

There are 10,100 chair seats in the building with the balance being bleacher seats. About 40 percent of the seats are below the concourse.

Besides six locker rooms, the Marriott Center houses coaches' offices and the special events staff. It also serves as ticket headquarters for major campus events and includes a hospitality room, player's lounge, training room, weight room, video room and a Cougar Club room.

Hoop History

A look back at the humble beginning of BYU basketball reveals a completely different set of events than exist today. For instance, in those days, the Cougars played their home games on the third floor of the Training School building on lower campus.

Seating capacity in that gym was about 700. For the "big" games, fans would perch themselves in windows, on ladders and on top of lockers along the wall.

E.L. Roberts was coach of the Cougars from 1918-20 and was followed by Alvin Twitchell, who coached until 1925. Roberts again took the reins of the Cougar program for the 1926-27 season and helped champion the change that would eliminate a jump after every basket.

In 1928, BYU moved its home games to the Women's Gym on University Avenue, where the seating capacity was nearly double that of the other facility. Provo's local radio station (KOVO) carried one of the first-ever broadcasts of a basketball game. Two-handed push shots were in vogue. And BYU landed its first All-American, Elwood Romney.

Some of the coaches who handled the Cougar program during the "Women's Gym" era were G. Ott Romney (1928-35), Edwin R. Kimball (1936, 1939-41), Fred "Buck" Dixon and Floyd Millet (1942-49).

An unforgettable chapter in the chronicle of BYU basketball was written between 1946 and 1950, when the Cougars played their home games on the floor of the Springville High School gymnasium. Seating capacity in that gym was listed at 1,200, although officials discovered it could actually hold 1,700 with some scrunching together.

Despite the handicaps, the Springville Gym was the site for some outstanding basketball. Some of the players who displayed their skills in the old gym were Joe Nelson, Mel Hutchins, Roland Minson; Utah's Arnie Ferrin and Vern Gardner; Denver's Vince Boryla; and Utah State's Ladell Andersen, just to mention a few.

In 1950, the Cougars had to go searching for a temporary home while the George Albert Smith Fieldhouse was under construction. Utah graciously offered its home floor-the 6,000-seat Einer Nielsen Fieldhouse.

Non-league games were played in the Springville Gym that year, but once Skyline Conference action began, all games were played 45 miles away.

As transients, the Cougars didn't suffer much. They split with the Utes and captured the conference championship. They also went on to win the National Invitational Tournament in New York City.

That was only the second year for Coach Stan Watts, a man who molded BYU's program into one of the nation's finest. Coach Watts was inducted into the Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., in 1986.

At long last, BYU's team moved into the 10,200-seat Smith Fieldhouse in December of 1951. Coach Watts coached every one of the 246 games played in the Fieldhouse over the next 20 years. Large crowds enjoyed

some of the finest basketball teams in the country during that era, including another NIT title in 1966.

The demand for more seats prompted school officials to begin planning construction of the 23,000-seat Marriott Center which, at the time, was the largest on-campus basketball arena in the nation. It opened officially in December of 1971 with a sellout crowd. The average attendance that year was more than 21,000.

This will be the 24th season in the Marriott Center, praised by visiting teams and media as being the cleanest they've been in. Many can't believe it has been in use more than two decades.

Since the opening of the Marriott Center, five coaches have been at the helm. Stan Watts retired in 1972 after winning 431 games. He was followed by Glenn Potter (1972-75), Frank Arnold (1976-83), Ladell Andersen (1984-89) and Roger Reid.





Western Athletic Conference

Things have changed this year in the Western Athletic Conference with a new commissioner and six new members getting ready for the 1996-97 season. Plus the basketball tournament is going back to a campus arena (New Mexico) after two years at a neutral site (the Delta Center in Salt Lake).

The 10-member league already is the most geographically diverse in the country, spreading from the 7,000-foot heights of Laramie, Wyo., to the sea-level sprawls of Hawaii and San Diego.

In two years, the WAC will include competition with San Jose State, Nevada-Las Vegas, Tulsa, Rice, Texas Christian and Southern Methodist.

The WAC traditionally ranks in the top conferences in the nation in per-capita attendance at basketball games. Last year, BYU ranked sixth nationally in pergame attendance, New Mexico was eighth and Utah 25th.

Founded July 1, 1962, the charter members included Arizona, Arizona State, Brigham Young, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming. In September, 1967, Colorado State and Texas-El Paso were added to make the WAC an eight-team league.

A major change occurred in July, 1978, when Arizona and Arizona State left for the Pac-10. But, on the same day, San Diego State made its official entry into the conference. Hawai'i became the eighth member the following year; the Air Force Academy entered in 1980; and Fresno State in 1992.

The WAC is led by Commissioner Karl Benson, who took over in the summer of 1994 from Joe Kearney. The former graduate student and assistant baseball coach at Utah has worked at the NCAA and been been commissioner of the Mid-American Conference four years.

Margie McDonald, director of the High Country Athletic Conference until it became part of the WAC in 1991, is deputy commissioner. Jeff Hurd serves as associate commissioner while Dee Anne Menzies and Jim Trego are assistant commissioners.

Dan Willis is associate director of communications and Vicki Boillot is assistant director in that area.

Bobby Dibler is in his second season as supervisor of basketball officials. Dibler, a 1965 graduate of Texas-El Paso, succeeds Guy Gibbs, who retired following the 1993 season, his 10th since taking over from Irv Brown in 1983.

Dibler was a junior college All-American in Amarillo before playing at UTEP. He has officiated in six conferences and in 15 consecutive NCAA Tournaments. Dibler worked the championship games in 1982 and 1985.

The WAC is located at 14 West Dry Creek Circle, Littleton, Colorado 80120. It has been in the Denver area since the conference's beginning, with the exception of a two-year stay in Phoenix from 1964-66. The telephone number for the WAC office is (303) 795-1962.

- 9. Fighting rule now includes coaches and team personnel.



Press passes will be issued on an individual game basis and requests must be received in the Sports Information Office no later than three days before the game.


