



THIS IS COUGAR BASKETBALL 2012-13 COUGAR BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

Coming off a program record thirdconsecutive season with an NCAA Tournament victory, BYU basketball enters the 2012-13 season with a deep and talented roster poised to challenge for the West Coast Conference title and make some noise in the postseason.

Despite entering last season with just three experienced players, Dave Rose led BYU to a sixth-consecutive season with 25-plus victories and a sixth-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament — both streaks are team records. Playing in the First Four in Dayton, Ohio, the Cougars set an NCAA Tournament

record by climbing out a 25-point hole to defeat Iona 78-72 and advance to the second round.

The Cougars return three starters from the 2011-12 squad including seniors Brandon Davies and Brock Zylstra and sophomore Matt Carlino. Sophomore Tyler Haws, who started 33 games in 2009-10, returns after serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Philippines. Rose also has five other players with starting experience and a talented recruiting class to help ease the burden of replacing All-WCC honoree Noah Hartsock and BYU's iron man Charles Abouo, mainstays in the Cougar lineup the past four seasons.



Davies is coming off one of the better seasons for a BYU big man in recent history as he averaged 15.2 points, 7.7 rebounds, 2.1 assists, 1.3 blocks and 1.5 steals while shooting .516 from the field. His season of averaging at least one of everything — only the third in BYU history — earned him All-WCC and second-team all-district honors. With another strong season he should receive consideration for WCC Player of the Year honors.

After Carlino sat out the first 10 games of last season due to NCAA transfer rules he emerged as BYU's starting point guard and averaged 12.2 points, 4.6 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.4 steals. Carlino scored a team season high 30 points at San Francisco, and in WCC games he was fourth in assists and third in assist/turnover ratio. The league's coaches named him All-WCC honorable mention and to the WCC All-Freshman Team.

Zylstra emerged last season as Rose's utility player with action at both guard and forward spots. He posted averages of 8.3 points, 4.3 boards, 1.9 assists and 1.2 steals while finishing the year as BYU's most reliable 3-point shooter, hitting 50 threes on 37.6 percent shooting.

Haws became a starter in the third game of the 2009-10 season and averaged 11.3 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.5 assists while shooting .498 from the field, .368 from three and .917 from the free throw line that season. His free throw percentage is the second-best single-season percentage in BYU history and Haws ended the season with 48-consecutive attempts without a miss, a BYU record. Haws earned third-team All-MWC honors.

OTHER RETURNEES

Sophomore Anson Winder and senior Craig Cusick add depth and experience to the guard line. Winder started 15 games last season and averaged 4.3 points, 1.6 rebounds and 1.7 assists. Cusick played in all 35 games, started three and averaged 3.1 points and 2.1 assists while shooting .379 from three.


Returning post players include sophomores Nate Austin and Josh Sharp. Austin averaged 4.1 points and 3.8 boards while shooting .542 from the field after returning from his two-year mission for the LDS Church just weeks before school started last fall. Sharp had also recently returned from a mission prior to last season and averaged 1.2 points and 1.4 rebounds.

NEWCOMERS

Several newcomers will look to add depth to the point guard and wing positions, including Cooper Ainge, Cory Calvert, Raul Delgado and Kyle Rose. Ainge, son of Danny Ainge and brother of Austin Ainge — both former Cougars — comes to BYU from Wellesley High in Wellesley, Mass., where he averaged 13.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and 4.0 assists.

Calvert was the 5A MVP in Colorado and led Chaparral High to the state title while averaging 22.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 5.1 assists. Delgado played the last two seasons at Western Nebraska Community College and will be a junior this upcoming season. He averaged 18.3 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game while shooting .485 from the field and .433 from three last season. Rose redshirted for the Cougars in 2009-10 prior to serving an LDS mission in Salt Lake City.

In the post Rose welcomes Agustin Ambrosino from Salt Lake Community College and will have the services of lan Harward, who redshirted at BYU last season. Ambrosino averaged 9.6 points and 5.3 rebounds while shooting .498 from the field, .438



from three and .778 from the free throw line as SLCC went 22-9. Harward averaged 14.0 points per game as a senior at Orem High School before serving an LDS mission in San Antonio.

MASTERMIND OF SUCCESS BYU'S MASTERMIND OF SUCCESS SEEKS A SEVENTH-CONSECUTIVE TRIP TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

ince becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 185-54 record, Rose has produced a seven-year resume that is nearly unmatched. In fact, among the 40-plus coaches who took over a program in 2005, Rose has the best winning percentage (.774) and the most wins (185). Among first-time head coaches in 2005, Rose is the only to achieve at least 20 wins in each of his first seven seasons. His 185 victories place him fourth for best career starts (through seven seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Mike Krzyzewski and Thad Matta. Rose currently holds the school record for career winning percentage (.774) and is second in career victories.

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6. 2008, by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments - both on

the court and in the community - have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008. Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award. given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is his basketball program consistently ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU basketball with Public Recognition awards for seven-straight seasons (2006 to 2012) for its high academic achievement. In fact, the Cougars are the only Division I program to earn public recognition and a bid to the NCAA Tournament every year from 2007 to 2012.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with fivestraight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls (2007 to 2011), six-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and six-straight 25-win seasons (2007 to 2012) - all three are program-record streaks. In his first season. Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9

NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first back-to-back outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009. Historically, the last time a BYU team garnered backto-back outright league crowns was in 1979 and 1980 when the Cougars touted one of their all-time greats in Danny Ainge, while the last time the Blue and White produced three-straight titles was from 1932 to 1934. In 2010, BYU set a then-program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the program's first tournament victory since 1993.

In 2010-11, Rose and the Cougars set numerous program records with 32 wins and an .865 winning percentage, a fourth conference title in five seasons and nine-straight weeks ranked in the top 10, including a No. 3 ranking in both the AP and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls. BYU's No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament tied the best seed earned by the Cougars. With wins over Wofford and Gonzaga in the second and third rounds of the tournament, BYU reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1981. The Cougars were ranked the entire season and were in the top 10 for a program record nine-straight weeks. Statistically, BYU finished fifth in the nation in winning percentage and scoring margin, seventh in scoring offense, 10th in free throw percentage, 15th in turnover margin, 16th in assist to turnover ratio, 17th in turnovers per game and 18th in three-point field goals per game. Rose also coached the nation's player of the year and NCAA Division I scoring leader Jimmer Fredette, who averaged 28.9 points per game.

Despite the loss of Fredette and BYU's all-time steals leader Jackson Emery, Rose kept the Cougars rolling in 2011-12. With a 26-9 overall record and a 12-4 record in West Coast Conference play, BYU extended its streak of 25-win seasons to six, a program record. Rose also led the Cougars to a program-record sixth-straight NCAA Tournament bid where BYU overcame a 25-point deficit to defeat Iona in the first round. The comeback set the record for the biggest comeback in NCAA Tournament history. It also marked a program record as the Cougars won in the NCAA Tournament for a third-straight season. Post players Noah Hartsock and Brandon Davies led the way for BYU and earned All-WCC honors.

As the only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons,

Rose was named the MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season. Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and an NCAA Tournament berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com after turning a picked-to-finish-last 9-21 team into a 20-9 winner and NIT qualifier. After the record-setting 2010-11 season, Rose earned his third conference honor by being named co-coach of the year. He was also the USBWA District VIII co-coach of the year and a finalist for Naismith national coach of the year honors. Rose is one of two BYU head coaches to win 20 games in each of his first six seasons and the only one to do so after taking over a team that won fewer than 13 games the prior season.


Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's

head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure.

Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in 10 of the past 11 seasons, including seven NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country. Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Rivals.com recognized Rose in 2004 as one of the top-25 college basketball recruiters.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 12 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar

in Rose's 13 years in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman in 2010 and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss. With 29 years of coaching experience - including 17 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels - Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West

Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie. Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition - Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout. com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummard (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, second-team Basketball Times, AP Honorable Mention and Lute Olson All-America team; 2011 first-team AP, NABC, John R. Wooden, Sporting News, USBWA) - and four players who have been selected in the NBA Draft - Travis Hansen (2003), Araujo (2004). Plaisted (2008) and Fredette (2011). Fredette also earned numerous player of the year honors in 2011, including Naismith, AP, Oscar Robertson and Sporting News.

Before his promotion to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and

Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George. Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous Phi Slamma Jamma team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runnerup after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team allleague in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and seven grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College. An important component in Rose's success is the unwavering support and encouragement of his wonderful family. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as she is currently serving as an honorary chairperson for the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. She previously served as the vice chairperson for the foundation. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner, who was a member of the BYU men's basketball team from 2004-06. His son Garrett returned in August 2005 from a two-year mission in Little Rock, Ark., and married his wife Brooke in November 2006. Rose's daughter Taylor attends Provo



High School and plays volleyball for the Bulldogs.

Rose and the team annually pro-

vide service for the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation to comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Rose and his wife Cheryl currently serve as honorary chairmen for the foundation. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the state of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005. She previously served as the Vice Chairperson for the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation

At the 2012 Final Four, Rose was named a member of the National Coaches vs. Cancer Council that includes Mike Krzyzewski (Duke), Roy Williams (North Carolina), Jim Boeheim (Syracuse) and Mike Brey (Notre Dame). He and Cheryl are currently assisting with the Hope Lodge, a facility that will be constructed in Salt Lake City to house families of cancer patients.

The fight against cancer became more personal for the family when

Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Rose has since been given a clean bill of health. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award in 2010.

- By winning a share of the MWC regular season title in 2010-11, Rose has the most titles in league history (four) and is the only coach to have two outright regular season titles.

- The BYU coaching staff has playing experience in NCAA Final Fours, including a National Championship.



Tom Holmoe was named Director of Athletics at Brigham Young University on March 1, 2005. He oversees a nationally recognized program with 21 intercollegiate sports, involving more than 600 student-athletes and a 150-person staff.

A former Cougar defensive back from 1978-82, Holmoe returned to BYU in July 2001 as Associate Athletics Director for Development. As part of his responsibilities, he supervised the Cougar Club, served as the department's liaison with the LDS Foundation, served on the BYU Alumni Association Board of Directors and worked on the capital campaign to raise funds for the University's new athletic facilities. Holmoe currently serves on the BCS Athletics Directors Advisory Committee.

A native of La Crescenta, Calif., Holmoe came to BYU on a football scholarship in 1978. He became a starter as a sophomore and went on to earn first-team All-WAC honors as a senior in 1982. Holmoe was selected in the fourth round of the 1983 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. Over a seven-year NFL career, he played on three Super Bowl championship teams with the 49ers. After retiring from professional football, Holmoe returned to BYU to serve as a graduate assistant under LaVell Edwards from 1990-91. He then accepted an offer from Bill Walsh to become the Stanford secondary coach in 1992, where he remained for two seasons. In 1994, he returned to the 49ers as defensive backfield coach for two seasons, where he earned a fourth Super Bowl ring. Two years later Holmoe joined the University of California staff as defensive coordinator and later became the head coach from 1997-2001.

Holmoe graduated from BYU with a degree in zoology in 1983 and received a master's degree from BYU in athletic administration in 1995. He and his wife, Lori, have four children: Shannon Packard, Danny, Erik, and Lauren.


DISTINGUISHED FACULTY

Faculty members hold advanced degrees from universities around the world. Their achievements are compelling and wide-ranging as they pursue consequential research work that is making a real difference. Faculty members are regularly called upon to head national and international professional organizations and to consult with corporate and governmental entities. Above all, these high-principled men and women share an unmatched devotion to bringing the best possible education to their students.

BYU's campus is in Provo, Utah, a city of 124,496 located 45 miles south of Salt Lake City. Provo sits 4,560 feet above sea level and rests between 23-mile-long Utah Lake and the towering peaks of the Wasatch Mountains. The 560-acre campus has 284 total buildings; 78 for seadomics, 61 for equipicity strips and 145 for housing.

PREPARATION FOR THE FUTURE

A strong curriculum delivered by outstanding faculty is key to the academic excellence of BYU graduates. From business management to nursing, from the humanities to engineering, the University's 11 colleges -- supported by comprehensive offerings from religious education -- continue to be internationally recognized for the quality of their education and the professional preparation they provide. In addition to the challenging course work and hands-on research, numerous programs offer academic and service outreach opportunities. Study abroad centers, distance-learning courses and worldwide performing arts tours are a few of the offerings that enrich BYU's academic experience.





BYU'S HOMECOURT IS ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST BASKETBALL ARENAS

BYU's 21.000-seat basketball arena is truly a hoop heaven. There is no place quite like it in college basketball. Over the past 41 years, the Marriott Center has been home to the thrills and cheers of BYU basketball. With a history full of game-winning shots, conference championships and some of the nation's top attendance marks, the Marriott Center's 21.000 seats have allowed BYU fans to see plenty of excitement since the facility's opening game on Dec. 3, 1971.

The Marriott Center is named for successful Utah businessman J. Willard Marriott and is one of the largest oncampus arena's in the country. The building covers three acres and encloses eight million cubic feet.

The BYU men's basketball team has a .793 winning percentage in the Marriott Center over its 41 years. The Cougars have gone 179-19 in the Marriott Center over the past 13 years, boasting the nation's longest home victory streak

from 2000 to 2003 (44 games) and from 2005 to 2008 (a program-record 53

Some great games have been played in the Marriott Center, including Danny Ainge and company's 19-point shellacking of No. 7 Utah in 1981 before the Cougars' run to the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament. In 2002, BYU put on an incredible run to erase a 21-point second-half deficit and defeat Utah 63-61. helping preserve a perfect 16-0 home record. The Cougars played their 500th game in the Marriott Center on Feb. 22. 2006, against league-leader San Diego State, putting together a thrilling 59-point second-half performance on the way to a

In 2010 — with BYU donning pink-trimmed uniforms and pink shoes to show support in the battle against cancer - Jimmer Fredette put on a show in front of a sellout crowd, scoring 36 points in an 82-69 victory over Utah. Fredette's 36

points are the most scored by a Cougar against the Utes in the history of the rivalry. In 2011, No. 9 BYU defeated No. 4 San Diego State behind Jimmer Fredette's heroic 43-point effort.

BYU has ranked in the top 25 nationally in paid attendance every year but four since the Marriott Center opened. The Cougars have led the nation three years, finished second four times and been among the top five attendance leaders 19 times over the past 41 years. In 2010-11, BYU finished sixth in the nation in attendance and posted eight sellouts.

In 1972, 1977, 1979 and 1982, BYU hosted NCAA Regionals. The 1988 Western Athletic Conference Tournament was also held in the Marriott Center. In addition to the fans it draws for basketball, capacity crowds have filled the arena for devotionals, commencement exercises. concerts and pageants.

BYU has consistently ranked among the national attendance leaders, averaging 16,738 fans per game in the 41-year history of the Marriott Center. The Cougars averaged 18,714 fans in 2010-11 to rank sixth nationally, including eight sellouts. BYU outdrew the regular season conference champions of 30 of the nation's 31 conferences as well as every program in the Big 10, the Big 12 and Pac 10 and all but one ACC school, East teams

The Cougars have gone 179-19 at home over the past 13 years. BYU had a school record 53-game winning streak that started in 2005 and ended with the loss to nationally ranked Wake Forest in 2009. The Cougars set the program the Marriott Center on Feb. 20, 2008, their 45th-straight home win. BYU's last home loss before the record-setting streak from Feb 19, 2000 to Jan 16, 2003. was in the 2005-06 season opener against Loyola Marymount. The streak included 29 straight over nonconference foes. The Cougars were 13-3 at home last season, 13-1 at home in 2010-11, 15-1 at home in 2009-10, 14-2 at home win over Utah State on Jan. 2, 1999. in 2008-09 and won 16 home games

the previous season and 17 in 2006-07 after going 14-1 at home in 2005-06. BYU is 474-123 (.794) all-time in the Marriott Center, and Cougar head record with their 67-59 win over Utah in coach Dave Rose is 102-8. Prior to the 53-game home win streak, BYU's longest homecourt victory streak was 44 games

BYU also owned one of the country's longest nonconference home winning streaks all but two SEC teams and all but two Big opponents and 24 consecutive over MWC from 1999 to 2005, defeating 40 straight non-league opponents in the Marriott Center. The streak began with a 61-59

Since the Marriott Center opened 41 years ago. Cougar fans have watched BYU compile a 474-123 record, a .794 winning percentage.

> The Marriott Center covers three acres and encloses eight million cubic feet. The roof, which is the size of two football fields placed side-by-side, is 10 stories high and is held together by 50,000 bolts. The fourmillion pound roof was constructed first at ground level, then raised 38 feet. There are seven locker rooms, a President's room, two reception rooms, press and interview rooms, men's and women's team rooms and a training room.

> During the summer of 2012, the lower-bowl bench seating on the north side of the arena was replaced with prime chair seating. The entire lower bowl is now chair seating. In addition, a new sound system was installed in the arena and the men's and women's basketball locker rooms were renovated.

Improvements to the exterior and interior took place in 2007, including glass exterior walls and new lighting. In 2006 the original suspended floor, installed in 1971, was replaced with a Connor Uniforce floor and seismic upgrades took place. Fittingly, the last game played on the original floor featured the jersey retirement of Cougar great Kresimir Cosic, who played in BYU's first game in the Marriott Center, An additional floor upgrade was installed in 2007.

"The Marriott Center is one of the top five places to play in the country, not just because of its size, but because its facilities are fantastic," said former UTEP head coach Don Haskins, the subject of the 2006 film Glory Road. "If there is a better arena, I haven't seen it."

WINNING: A BYU TRADITION

BYU has one of the nation's richest basketball traditions. In fact, 85 of the Cougars' 110 seasons on the hardwoods have been winning campaigns. Since putting its first team on the floor in 1903, BYU has amassed a 1666-1014 record to rank No. 15 all-time among NCAA Division I programs in total victories. The Cougars also boast a .622 winning percentage, ranking 32nd.

But it's not just the sum of victories that has made BYU one of the nation's top hoop programs. Along the way, BYU has claimed 29 conference championships and received 37 postseason invites, including 27 NCAA Tournament appearances. The Cougars won two NIT titles (1951 and 1966) back when the NIT was considered the premier national tournament. BYU players also boast 120 all-conference and 80 All-America citations along with 45 NBA draft selections.

BYU has won conference championships in four different leagues. The first six came from the Rocky Mountain Conference and continued as BYU won five as a member of the Skyline Conference. During the Cougars' membership in the Western Athletic Conference, BYU teams won 12 conference championships. Tack on six Mountain West


Conference titles in the league's first 12 seasons, and BYU has won one-fourth of all possible conference championships.

BYU's basketball legacy is filled with many unique achievements. In 1981, the Cougars advanced to the Elite Eight when All-American Danny Ainge made what is still considered one of the NCAA Tournament's most amazing plays. Trailing Notre Dame 50-49 with eight seconds remaining, Ainge took the ball coast-to-coast, dribbling through all five Irish defenders, before lofting the gamewinning finger roll just over the reach of Orlando Woolridge. Ainge received the Wooden Award and Eastman Trophy in 1981 as the nation's top player.

In 2011, All-American Jimmer Fredette led the Cougars to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the Notre Dame game in 1981. Fredette led the nation in scoring in 2010-11 with a 28.9 ppg average and earned every major Player of the Year honor, including the Naismith, Wooden and Oscar Robertson awards. Simply known as "The Jimmer" throughout the nation, Fredette gained national fame with prolific scoring outbursts, which included 15 30-point games, four 40-point games and one 52-point explosion versus New Mexico in the Mountain

West Conference tournament.

Legendary coach Stan Watts, who guided BYU to its NIT titles, was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1986, while All-American center Kresimir Cosic became BYU's second Hall member in 1996. Turning down the opportunity to play in the NBA, Cosic returned home to Yugoslavia to pursue his passion to better-develop basketball in Europe. He earned one gold and two silver medals while playing on four Olympic teams and was the longtime coach of the Yugoslavian National Team, mentoring many future NBA players. He ended his playing career as the all-time Croatian scoring leader.







Before Cosic's arrival in Provo, the Cougars already held the distinction of being the first U.S. program to include an international player on its roster in Finland's Timo Lampen in 1958-59. BYU also boasts two of the nation's longest-standing rivalries, having first played

was home to the Cougars from 1951-1971, with 20 different all-conference players, including seven All-Americans, starring for BYU during that era. Many capacity crowds crammed inside the Fieldhouse to see Cougar basketball. With BYU's winning tradition, the then 10,000-seat arena grew too small for the increasing interest. In 1971, the Marriott Center was built, giving BYU what is still to this day one of the most intimidating arenas in college basketball.

Since opening the 21,000-seat Marriott Center, the Cougars have been among the nation's annual attendance leaders with 19 top-5 rankings, three times finishing No. 1. BYU has not disappointed its faithful, winning 79 percent of its games in the Marriott Center, including a school record 53-game home victory streak that started in 2005 and ended in 2008.

In recent history, the highest ranking a Cougar team has received in the media polls was the 1987-88 team. At one point the team was 17-0 and climbed as high as No. 2 and No. 3 in the rankings.



Conference titles. During that time, BYU was also one of just 14 teams to have a player drafted in both the 2003 and 2004 NBA Drafts as Travis Hansen was selected in the second round in 2003 and Rafael Araujo was the No. 8 overall pick in 2004. In his seven years guiding the Cougars, Dave Rose has led BYU to its first strings of six-straight NCAA Tournament bids, five-straight seasons with appearances in the national rankings and six-straight 25 win seasons. He also led the Cougars to three-straight conference titles from 2007 to 2009, the first such streak since 1932 to 1934.



Utah State in 1906 and Utah in 1909.

The first radio broadcast in the intermountain area took place on Feb. 17, 1940, when BYU hosted Utah State in the Old Ladies Gymnasium in Provo. BYU broke a ban on broadcasting college sports due to the clamor from fans that only 500 people could fit into the gym. Arch Madsen called the game on KOVO radio in Provo with station manager David Walker providing analysis. Home games have also been played in Springville, the old BY Academy and even on the University of Utah's home court.

BYU created a new home on campus with the construction of the George Albert Smith Fieldhouse. The Smith Fieldhouse Had the victory streak not been snapped by a single-game cross-country trip to UAB in Birmingham, the Cougars could have easily found themselves in the No. 1 spot as the top-rated Arizona Wildcats had lost and left the door open for the Cougars to be the only undefeated team in college basketball.

Over the years, 17 coaches have guided the Cougars, 16 with winning records. Current BYU head coach Dave Rose took the helm in 2005-06 after spending eight years as an assistant under former head coach Steve Cleveland. Rose was an instrumental part of helping the Cougars restore their tradition with NCAA appearances in eight of the last 11 seasons while winning six Mountain West



COUGARS IN CONFERENCE

BYU basketball boasts a remarkable record of conference success during its history. After earning its 28th regular-season conference championship in 2009, the Cougars moved into a tie for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season league titles won (see list below). Including conference tournaments, BYU has claimed a conference championship trophy (regular season or tournament) during 29 seasons. The Cougars won the 1991 WAC Tournament after a second-place regular-season finish. Other conference tournament titles in 1992 (WAC) and 2001 (MWC) have followed up regular-season rings, as was the case with conference playoff wins in 1924 and 1933 in the Rocky Mountain Conference. BYU won six Rocky Mountain Conference titles in 20 years, earned five Skyline championships in 24 years, recorded 12 WAC crowns in 37 years and garnered MWC honors in five of the league's first 11 seasons. BYU won the in-state title against rivals Utah and Utah State during 10 of the 12 years before the Cougars first joined a conference in 1918.

BYU CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS (29 TITLES)

1921-22

BYU won its second title in the Western Division with a 3-1 conference record, beating out rivals from the University of Utah.

1923-24

A 7-1 conference record gave the Cougars their third Western Division title. They met the Eastern Division winner, Colorado College, in the first playoff series in a decade. BYU won the series 2-1 and was crowned the undisputed Rocky Mountain Conference Champion.

1924-25

BYU repeated its championship run and once again won the Western Division title, finishing 6-2 in conference and 11-6 overall. The title was the third in four years for the Cougars. BYU once again met Colorado College in the Conference Championship Series but was swept in Colorado Springs.

1931-32

Led by sophomore Elwood Romney, a first-team all-conference selection, BYU tied with Utah for the West title and then defeated the Utes in a one-game playoff, earning the chance to meet Wyoming in the Conference Championship Series. Despite an 8-4 conference finish, the Cougars were swept by the Cowboys.

1932-33

For the second straight season, the Western Division ended in a tie between BYU and Utah. After going 9-3 in conference and 18-7 overall, the Cougars once again defeated the Utes and met Wyoming in the Championship Series. This time, BYU emerged victorious, winning 2-1 and thus winning the Conference Championship for the first time since 1924

1933-34

The Cougars finished the season 9-3 in conference and 18-11 overall to win the Western Division title for the third year in a row. BYU once again met Wyoming in the Championship playoff series, but the Cougars were defeated 2-1.

1942-43

After switching to the Skyline Conference in 1937, the 1942-43 Cougars won their first Skyline Conference Western Division title. A 7-1 conference record earned the team the opportunity to play Wyoming in the Championship Series. However, despite the efforts of first-team all-conference selection Brady Walker, the Cougars lost to Wyoming in three straight games.

1947-48

As the conference consolidated into one division, the Cougars finished 8-2 and took first place. Joe Nelson and Randy Clark were both named first-team all-conference players. Nelson led the Skyline Conference in scoring, racking up 203 points in conference play and averaging 20.3 points per game.

1949-50

After winning the conference preseason trophy, the Cougars finished 14-6 in conference and had their first 20-win season, going 22-12. BYU was led by a talented trio consisting of Joe Nelson, Roland Minson and Mel Hutchins, each averaging over 10 points per game. All three players earned NCAA honors at season's end.

950-51

The Cougars repeated as Skyline Conference Champions and won their third title in four years with a 15-5 record in conference and an amazing 28-9 record overall. Once again led by Roland Minson and Mel Hutchins, the Cougars were ranked as high as third nationally and went on to win the NIT. They also set a school record with a 91-point offensive showcase against Denver.

1956-57

The Cougars won their last Skyline Conference Championship in this season, finishing 11-3 in conference and 19-9 overall. Led by Tom Steinke and John Benson, who each averaged almost 20 points per game, BYU went on to finish third in the NCAA West Regionals.

1964-65

The 1964-65 team won the first WAC Championship for BYU and first conference title since 1957. The team finished the season with a 21-7 mark and was ranked sixth nationally in the final wire service poll of the season. BYU finished second to Miami (Fla.) in scoring offense. John Fairchild was named WAC Player of the Year and led the team with 21.5 points a game.

1966-67

The Cougars surprised many by winning a share of the WAC title and finishing 14-10. There were no real standouts on the team as eight players won game-high honors during the season. BYU remained undefeated for the second straight year at home.

1968-69

BYU finished the season at 17-12 and

had been picked in the preseason polls to finish third or lower. They won a firstround berth in the NCAA Tournament but lost to New Mexico State. Remarkably, six players ended the season with scoring averages in double figures.

1970-71

The Cougars finished 18-11 to grab the WAC title. They lost to eventual NCAA Champion UCLA in the NCAA Regionals. The team was led by Bernie Fryer, who averaged 19.2 points, and Steve Kelly, who scored 17.9 points per game.

1971-72

The 1971-72 season was Coach Stan Watts' final year and one of the most exciting in Cougar history. The team finished with a 21-5 record and made it to the NCAA Tournament.

1978-79

One of the most exciting aspects of the 1978-79 season was the expectation that Cougar success would carry over into the next year. The Cougars were 20-8 and were led by Danny Ainge with 18.4 points per game. Ainge moved into the top 10 in BYU scoring history after just two seasons. The Cougars made it to the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

1979-80

A record of 24-5 was the best yet for a BYU team. The Cougars had been ranked as high as No. 6 by sports writers. All the starters from the previous year returned to help defend the WAC title. Danny Ainge once again led the team with 19.1 points per game and moved into first place on the BYU all-time scoring list. The team had four future NBA players; Ainge, Devin Durrant, Fred Roberts and Greg Kite.

1982-83

Although the 1982-83 team finished in a three-way tie for the WAC championship, it was the first time in the previous five years that the Cougars did not advance to postseason play. The team's record was 15-14. Devin Durrant led BYU in scoring with 22.8 points per game. Greg Kite led the team in rebounding with 8.8 per game.

1987-88

In the 70-year history of BYU basketball, only the 1950-51 team had more victories than the 1987-88 team, and no team had a better winning percentage. The Cougars finished 26-6, winning 17 games in a row to start the year, a BYU basketball record. The team was led by All-American Michael Smith who

averaged 21.2 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.

1989-90

The Cougars went 21-9 and exceeded all expectations by winning the WAC title. The team was projected to finish sixth. They went on to lose a heart-breaker in the NCAA East Regional to Clemson 49-47. It was Roger Reid's first year as head coach. Marty Haws led the team in scoring with 18.5 points and 4.1 assists per game. Andy Toolson averaged 18.3 points per game.

1990-91 (Tournament)

With a 21-13 record, BYU finished in second place during the regular season in the WAC but went on to win the WAC Tournament and then advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Freshman Shawn Bradley led the nation in blocked shots with 177 and averaged 14.8 points a game. Steve Schreiner scored 14.2 points per game.

1991-92

Few thought at the beginning of the season that BYU would finish the season 25-7 and win the WAC. The Cougars went on to defeat UTEP in dramatic fashion at the WAC Tournament thanks to a 54-foot buzzer-beater by Kevin Nixon. The Cougars ran into Shaq and LSU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to end the season. Gary Trost led the team in scoring with 14.2 points per game.

1992-93

The Cougars posted a 25-9 record, including 15-1 in the WAC, which tied the conference record for most wins. Nick Sanderson set a school record for 3-point attempts in a season with 209. Russell Larson set a new school record in field-goal percentage at .631. Gary Trost led the team in scoring for the second straight year with 15.2 points per game. BYU lost to Kansas in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

2000-0

BYU finished 24-9 while earning its first conference tournament title since 1992, its first regular-season championship since 1993 and its first NCAA bid since 1995. The Cougars went 10-4 in Mountain West Conference play to earn a three-way share of the title with Utah and Wyoming. BYU won the MWC Tournament and earned the automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with wins over Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. BYU, the 12th seed, lost its first round NCAA game at Cox Arena in San Diego to No. 5-seed Cincinnati.

2002-03

BYU claimed a share of the Mountain West Conference regular-season title and an NCAA bid for the second time in three years. Playing among the nation's toughest schedules, including 11 different conferences on its non-league slate, the Cougars finished the year 23-9 overall and earned their 26th conference title. going 11-3 in MWC games along with Utah, BYU Coach Steve Cleveland was named the MWC Coach of the Year, and senior guard Travis Hansen was one of two consensus first-team All-MWC players and the MWC's Co-Defensive Player of the Year. The Cougars had the MWC's top defense and also won the preseason Paradise Jam title in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. Hansen led the team in scoring (16.8) and blocks (20) and was second in assists (2.4) and rebounds

2006-07 BYLI's second season under head coach

Dave Rose not only improved upon his impressive inaugural campaign but also proved to be one of the best seasons a Cougar team has ever achieved in the program's 105-year history. After becoming the second-most improved team in the nation in Rose's first season at BYU, the Cougars responded in his second year with a 25-9 resume that included the program's first outright league championship since 1988, its first national top-25 ranking since 1993, its first season sweep over rival Utah since 1994 and its first NCAA Tournament invitation since 2004, including its highest seed since 1995. On the record books at BYU, only two teams (1951 -- 28 wins: 1988 -- 26 wins) won more games in a season than the 25 victories achieved by the Cougars in 2006-07. BYU defeated three nationally ranked teams in the process and earned a national ranking (No. 24) in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll, something a Cougar team hadn't done since 1988

2007-08

The Dave Rose-guided Cougars went 27-8 to win the second-most games in school history while becoming the first outright back-to-back Mountain West Conference Champions in league history. The team also achieved BYU's first consecutive appearances in the Top 25 polls since the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons and earned the program's first victory over a top-6 ranked team since 1965 with its triumph over Rick Pitino's sixth-rated Louisville Cardinals. The Cougars won the MWC regular-season title by two games over UNLV with an MWC-record 14-2 resume to finish the regular season with a school-record 25

regular-season victories. The consecutive outright league titles were the first for BYU since Danny Ainge played for the Cougars in 1978-79 and 1979-80. The conference crown was also BYU's 27th overall to rank the Cougars ninth all-time among all Division I programs.

2008-09

By capturing a share of the 2009 MWC regular season title, BYU became the first program in league history to win three-straight titles — a feat accomplished only one other time in program history, from 1932 to 1934. Heading into the final three games of the regular season BYU trailed league leader Utah by two games in the standings. The Cougars knocked off rival Utah at home before winning at Wyoming to pull into a tie for first. BYU downed Air Force in a hard-fought battle at home in the finale to claim a share of the title. At 25-8 the Cougars won at least 25 games for the third-straight season and appeared in the polls for a third-straight year for the first time since 1979-80, 1980-81 and 1981-82. With a 12-4 league mark BYU increased its all-time lead to 99 MWC wins and Dave Rose added to his total of 51 — third all-time in the MWC. Rose is the league's all-time leader in winning percentage (.797).

2010-11

Led by the National Player of Year in Jimmer Fredette and BYU's all-time steals leader Jackson Emery, the Cougars set numerous program records while capturing a share of the MWC regular season title. With an overall record of 32-5, BYU set team records for wins, winning percentage (.864) and wins away from home (19 total, 10 road and nine neutral). Fredette led the nation in scoring at 28.9 points per game and set the BYU single game (52 points vs. New Mexico), single season (1,068 points) and career (2,599 points) scoring records while Emery set the season (101) and career (249) steals records. BYU was ranked in the top 25 throughout the season and enjoyed nineconsecutive weeks ranked in the top 10. The Cougars swept San Diego State (ranked No. 4 and No. 6 at the time of the matchups) in the regular season to secure a share of the league title with a 14-2 mark. The Cougars earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1981

Having rebuilt a BYU basketball program that had a 1-25 record prior to his arrival, Cleveland achieved a conference title in his fourth season and guided BYU to five consecutive postseason tournaments. Coming off his second conference championship in 2003, Cleveland was named the MWC Coach of the Year after his team finished 23-9 and earned an NCAA Tournament berth. With its invitation in 2004, BYU competed

in three NCAA Tournaments under Cleveland (2001, 2003, 2004). In 2000-01, BYU finished 24-9 while earning its first conference tournament title since 1992, its first regular-season championship since 1993 and its first NCAA bid since 1995. In 2001-02, Cleveland's team upset No. 13 Stanford, and during 2003-04 the Cougars upset then No. 25 Oklahoma State, who went on to win the Big 12 title and advance to the NCAA Final Four. He left BYU ranked fourth all-time in coaching victories and second all-time in Marriott Center wins. He is currently the head coach at Fresno State.

Dave Rose has guided BYU to six-straight 25-win seasons and six-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both program records. Rose coached last season's team to 26 victories and a win in the NCAA Tournament for a third-straight year. In 2010-11 he led BYU to a program record 32 wins and a trip to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1981. With a 185-54 record, Rose has produced a sevenyear resume that is nearly unmatched. In fact,

among the 40-plus coaches who took over a program in 2005, Rose has the best winning percentage (.774) and the most wins (185). His 185 victories place him fourth for best career starts (through seven seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Roy Williams, Larry Brown and Thad Matta. Rose is a three-time MWC Coach of the Year and two-time USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year. He is also second all-time at BYU in career victories and first in career winning percentage

COUGARS EARN NATIONAL TITLES IN 1951 AND 1966

In 1951, the Cougars defeated Dayton in the championship game of the National Invitational Tournament. After the win. BYU accepted an invitation to the NCAA Tournament. which at the time was not vet recognized as the decisive tournament for the country's best team As the nation's




champions, the Cougars finished 28-9 with the most wins in BYU basketball history. Not only is it impressive that BYU won the national title and so many games, but it is even more amazing that they did so without a home court. With the Smith Fieldhouse under construction, BYU split its "home games" between Springville High's gymnasium and the University of Utah. Head coach Stan Watts guided the Cougars to the national title in only his second year at the helm. Watts had the help of Mel Hutchins, who became the first Cougar to be named a first-team All-American and went on to win Rookie of the Year in the NBA in the 1952-53

In 1966, the Cougars finished as a 20-game winner with their final game against NYU in the championship game of the National Invitational Tournament. Playing in a packed Madison Square Garden, the No. 1-ranked Cougars outplayed NYU, leading 48-43 at halftime and never looking back. With star Dick Nemelka on the bench with four fouls, the Cougars turned to junior center Craig Raymond and junior forward Gary Hill, Hill and Raymond, non-starters going into the tournament, led the high-scoring Cougar offense with 21 points

each. Steve Kramer added 20 points to become the third Cougar with 20 or more points and the fifth Cougar to score in double digits. The win over the Violets marked the second NIT championship for both BYU and head coach Stan Watts. The season was the highest scoring in Cougar history. BYU averaged 95.5 points per game while hitting 50 percent of its shots. In the NIT final the Cougars shot 59 percent while handling NYU. Former coach of the Boston Celtics, Red Auerbach,



commented on BYU at the championship, saying, "BYU simply overpowered them. They (the Cougars) outplayed them all over the court "



DANNY AINGE JERSEY RETIREMENT 2003

With a capacity crowd of 22,702 on hand, Danny Ainge was honored on March 8, 2003, by being the first-ever BYU basketball player to have his jersey retired in the 100-year history of the program. His No. 22 jersey will forever hang from the rafters of the Marriott Center.

"It's just a great honor," Ainge said. "BYU was the greatest time of my life. It's just great to be a part of BYU basketball. I don't know why mine is the first to go up. There were a lot of great players before me. Hopefully this is just the start."

Then-BYU president Merrill J. Bateman said, "The standard has been set very high. We hope there will be more." Ainge's jersey, not his number, was retired, which means future players may still have the option to wear No. 22.

The ceremony, which took place during halftime of BYU's game against Colorado State, started with a video clip of Ainge's famous coast-to-coast, last-second basket to heat Notre Dame in the 1981 NCAA Tournament. Then-men's athletics director Val Hale shared some of Ainge's accomplishments, which include being named college basketball player of the year in 1981 playing professional baseball with the Toronto Blue Javs and winning two basketball championships with the Boston Celtics.

One of Ainge's former teammates, Scott Runia, said they used to call Ainge "clout" because he brought the team clout. They called him "clutch" because he made the play when it counted. They called him "smooth" because Danny won the heart of Michelle Toolson, Ainge's wife. But most importantly, they called him a friend

Known for his feisty, hard-nosed playing style, Danny Ainge has become one of the most famous athletes to

During his four-year career as a Cougar, Ainge was a Consensus All-American, a two-time first-team Academic All-American, the WAC Player of the Year and a four-time All-WAC selection. He set an NCAA record with 112 consecutive games scoring in double digits and broke the BYU and WAC all-time scoring records with 2.467 points.

As a senior in 1981, Ainge led BYU to the 1981 Eastern Regionals. He concluded his senior season by winning the Eastman Award as well as the John

Wooden Award — given annually to the top collegiate basketball player in the nation.

Ainge beat out Isiah Thomas (Indiana), Sam Bowie (Kentucky), Mark Aguirre (DePaul), Ralph Sampson (Virginia) and Steve Johnson (Oregon State) to win the Wooden Award. In doing so, he became the fifth winner of the award, joining Marques Johnson, Larry Bird, Phil Ford and Darrell Griffith,

As a two-sport star, Ainge was drafted by both the Toronto Blue Jays for baseball and the Boston Celtics (31st pick) for basketball. After playing four seasons with the Blue Jays, he chose to pursue an NBA career. Ainge was a member of the Celtics' 1984 and 1986 Championship teams and played in six NBA finals with three different teams (Boston, Portland and Phoenix). He also played for the Sacramento Kings. He became only the third player in NBA history to make 1,000 3-point field goals, finishing his 14-year career with 1,002

Ainge played in 193 NBA playoff games, which was second all-time (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, 237) when he retired. He is currently tied for seventh all-time with Karl Malone and ahead of Magic Johnson, Robert Parrish. John Havlicek and Bill Russell to name a few.

After retiring in 1995, Ainge was an NBA basketball television analyst for Turner Broadcasting for one year before the Phoenix Suns brought him back to the organization as an assistant head coach. Just eight games into the season, he was promoted to head coach and guided his club to a 40-34 record after the team started the season 0-8. He spent the next two-plus seasons as head coach of the Suns and compiled a 136-90 (.602) record before stepping down on December 13, 1999. He then returned for three more seasons with Turner Broadcasting before returning to the Boston Celtics in May 2003 as the Executive Director of Basketball Operations. He was named the 2008 NBA Executive of the Year following the Celtics' Championship season.

His oldest son Austin played on the BYU basketball team from 2003-07 and another son Cooper is a freshman on the 2012-13 squad. Ainge was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame in May 2000 and honored with the prestigious NCAA Silver Anniversary Award in January 2006.

his name became a verb, a noun and an adjective. Known as 'The Jimmer', the one-name star capped his record-setting career by earning national player of the year honors and leading the Cougars to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1981.

The Glens Falls, N.Y., native was the nation's leading scorer at 28.9 points per game in 2010-11. The All-American became a fixture on ESPN's SportsCenter and in national publications throughout the season as his point totals, deep threes and incredible shot-making ability captured the nation's attention. The national media exposure included features in Sports Illustrated and USA Today, back-to-back Sports Illustrated Covers and appearing as a guest on SportsCenter, PTI and the CBS Final


All the attention came as a result of Fredette's stellar play on the court and humble demeanor in leading the Cougars to a program-record 32 victories, the Mountain West Conference regular season title and BYU's most successful NCAA Tournament run since 1981. Some of his memorable performances along the way included 39 points at UNLV, 47 at Utah, 43 against No. 3 San Diego State at home and a BYUrecord 52 points against New Mexico in the MWC Tournament.

Jimmer Fredette took BYU and college basketball by storm his senior year, as For all of his efforts, Fredette was honored at the highest levels in college basketball as he was named the consensus national player of the year. Fredette was awarded the Wooden Award, the Naismith Trophy, the Oscar Robertson Trophy and numerous other player of the year awards while also being named the Male College Athlete of the Year at the ESPYs and the unanimous selection for MWC Player of the Year

> Fredette concluded his career as BYU's all-time leading scorer with 2,599 points He also set the BYU single-season soring record with 1,068 points in 2010-11. His 28.9 points per game in 2010-11 are also a Cougar record and Fredette also rewrote nearly every MWC single-game, season and career scoring records

> In four years at BYU, Fredette helped the Cougars capture three MWC titles and advance to the NCAA Tournament four times. He also led BYU to its best four-year run in program history as the Cougars won 114 games.

> Following his record-setting senior season, Fredette was drafted No. 10 in the 2011 NBA Draft by the Milwaukee Bucks and then traded to the Sacramento Kings



Whether it was leading the fastbreak, dribbling between his legs or shooting a sky-hook, Cosic's enthusiasm and on-court antics endeared him to almost everyone who saw him play.

During his career at BYU, Cosic used his versatile inside-outside game to lead the Cougars in scoring (23.3) and rebounding (13.0) as a junior and again as a senior (20.2 points per game). His unselfish attitude helped him lead his team in assists.

He ranks second on BYU's all-time rebounding list with 919, an average of 11.6 per game, and fourth all-time with a 19.1 career scoring average while recording a BYU-record 47 double-doubles. He was a three-time first-team All-WAC selection and an All-American his junior and senior years. He likely would have been a four-year all-conference award winner but freshmen at that time were not allowed to play on varsity. Behind the play of Cosic, the Cougars won two WAC titles and reached the NCAA Regional Tournament in 1971 and 1972.

Upon graduation, Cosic became very much involved with basketball throughout Europe. He had offers to play in the NBA from the Boston Celtics and Los Angeles Lakers but he chose to return home and play for the Yugoslavian National Team for \$250 a week. Cosic played on four Olympic teams with his native land, winning a gold medal in 1980 and two silver medals in 1968 and 1976. He ended his career as his countries all-time scoring leader and went on to coach the Yugoslavian national team for many years.

His national and international accomplishments led to his induction into the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., on May 6, 1996, making Cosic the first BYU player and second Cougar along with former coach Stan Watts to receive the prestigious honor. He is also a member of the Utah Basketball Hall of Fame, inducted in 2001.

In September of 1992, Cosic was appointed as deputy ambassador for Croatia to the United States. He and his family lived in Washington D.C where he performed his diplomatic duties in the same excellent manner in which he played basketball.

On May 25, 1995, Cosic lost his battle against the toughest opponent of his career – cancer. During his 46 years on earth, Cosic became one of the most influential and well-known of all European basketball players. He left behind the legacy and credit of being the individual that first introduced the American game of basketball to Europe.

During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic while discussing the quality of international players playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played at BYU, was really the first great international player to play college basketball in the United States."

Cosic played in BYU's first game on the Marriott Center floor in 1971. His No. 11 jersey was retired by BYU on Mar. 4, 2006 in a halftime ceremony with 20,732 fans in attendance, which was also the last time the original Marriott Center floor was used before being replaced during the summer of 2006.

"It's very impressive that Kreso is not forgotten here," said Cosic's wife Ljerka, through her daughter Ana, at the retirement ceremony. "Kreso never forgot Provo. He loved his Croatia and always spoke of it as the most beautiful place on Earth, but Provo forever remained his second home. Provo and BYU marked his life forever."









STAN WATTS

BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

When considering the most influential individuals in BYU basketball history, Stan Watts has to be placed at the top of the list. During his 23 years at the helm of the Cougar basketball program, Watts led his teams to two NIT National

Championships (1951, 1966) and oversaw the construction of the George Albert Smith Fieldhouse and the Marriott Center.

His nationally recognized accomplishments led to his induction into the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., on March 6, 1986, making him the first Cougar to receive the prestigious honor. Watts finished his career after the 1971-72 season with an overall record of 371-254 (.594).

He was a member of the NCAA's Rules Committee, served as president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and chaired the U.S. Olympic Basketball Committee in 1976. Watts also served six years as BYU's athletic director and spent time on the Cougar football and baseball coaching staffs.

Even more impressive than his remarkable accomplishments as a coach is his impeccable character as a human being. He is respected by coaches, fans and players alike for his conduct both on and off the court

"His won-loss record speaks very well for the kind of coach he was," said former player Harold Christensen, who played for Watts on the 1951 championship team. "His reputation among his fellow coaches suggests how much they respected him. He still has that and is still honored in the community in which he coached."

Always a fighter, Watts overcame a rare form of cancer in 1971—only the fourth-known case of this type of cancer in medical history. Despite the fact that the other three individuals died, Watts refused to give up. After 14-hours of surgery and a two-month stay in the hospital, Watts returned to coach his team to a WAC Championship the following year.

Known for his fast-break style of offense, Watts remained an avid




Cougar fan. He once said, "It has always been our contention that the average basketball fan likes to see fast-scoring, speedy, exciting basketball."

By looking around the Marriott Center during a Cougar game, there are hints that Watts has been there. The glass-encased exhibit in the halls outside the arena pays tribute to one of the greatest coaches and individuals ever to grace the sidelines of a BYU athletic contest — as do the two NIT Championship banners and the WAC title banners from 1965, 1967, 1969, 1971 and 1972.

"The greatest tribute I can pay to Stan Watts," said retired Senior Associate Athletic Director Pete Witbeck, who was BYU's NCAA compliance officer and former assistant to Watts for many years, "is he's truly a man of God. He's always been a gentleman and great man. You don't see that very often."

Watts passed away April 6, 2000, at the age of 88.

2011-12 SEASON IN REVIEW



2011-12 SEASON REVIEW

Playing in its first season in the West Coast Conference, the BYU men's basketball team finished third in the league and made its sixthstraight NCAA tournament appearance.

BYU basketball experienced several firsts during the 2011-12 season while also achieving benchmarks that have come to define the program under Dave Rose.

The 2011-12 season was BYU's first as a member of the West Coast Conference after having competed in the Mountain West Conference since it was created in 1999. It was also the Cougars' first time going to the NCAA Tournament's First Four in Dayton, Ohio. There BYU set an NCAA Tournament record by overcoming a 25-point deficit to defeat Iona 78-72 and advance for a third-straight year, also a team record.

The Cougars finished the season at 26-9 overall and 12-4 in the WCC. The win totals gave BYU 25-plus victories for the sixth-straight season and 12 conference wins for the seventh-straight.

Those streaks, along with the Cougars earning its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament bid and seventh-straight postseason bid, are BYU-record streaks.

The Cougars attained these high levels of success despite losing the greatest backcourt in program history, including 2011 National Player of the Year Jimmer Fredette and BYU's all-time



steals leader Jackson Emery. As Rose has done throughout his tenure as head coach, he looked for new leaders and playmakers and found them in big men Noah Hartsock, a senior, and junior Brandon Davies.

Hartsock was a model of consistency, scoring in double figures in the first 19 games of the season and 31 of 34 games played.

He led the team in scoring (16.8 ppg), shooting percentage (.565), free throw percentage (.842) and blocked shots (55) while adding 5.0 boards per game. He earned a spot on the All-WCC Team and was named all-district by the NABC, USBWA and the Basketball Times.

Davies became a dominant presence in the post, averaging 15.2 points and a team-best 7.7 rebounds while adding 51 steals and 47 blocks.

He became only the second Cougar in school history to average at least one of everything (points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals) in a single season. Davies totaled nine double-doubles on the year and joined Hartsock on the AII-WCC Team and was named second-team all-district by the NABC.

Another leader for the Cougars was Charles Abouo.

The senior wing started all 35 games and concluded his career as BYU's ironman, setting the program records for games played in and consecutive games played at 141 and wins played in at 113. He averaged 11.0 points and 6.2 rehounds

Several players with little on-court experi-



ence stepped up to lead the guard line.

After spending the past two seasons as a backup, junior Brock Zylstra started 28 games and averaged 8.3 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.9 assists. His versatility proved to be a great asset as he played every position but center.

After a season as a practice player in 2010-11, junior Craig Cusick played in all 35 games, started three and averaged 3.1 points and 2.1 assists.

Freshmen Matt Carlino and Anson Winder also made a big impact on the Cougar backcourt.

After sitting out the first 10 games due to NCAA transfer rules, Carlino started 24 games at the point and averaged 12.2 points and 4.6 assists. He was named All-WCC Honorable Mention and earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

Winder, a redshirt, gave Rose valuable minutes at the point and shooting guard positions. He started 15 games and averaged 4.3 points and totaled 35 steals.

Nate Austin, another freshman, made a big impact for BYU in the post as he averaged 4.1 points and 3.8 boards.


First-year wing Damarcus Harrison averaged 3.2 points and had his best game against lona with a career-best 12 points.






