

Here is the best of luck to you as a student and an athlete! I look forward to getting to know you!




MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to members of the working media only. Working space at the media tables is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Please call in advance to allow phone lines to be assigned. There is no charge for parking.

Requests for credentials should be made either in writing or by phone to the Athletic Media Relations Office, Florida Atlantic University, 777 Glades Road, Boca Raton, FL 33431, (561) 297-3163.

Working members of the media are asked to present press credentials at the main entrance where they will be directed to seating.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Per NCAA guidelines, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot from designated areas only. Photographers must sit or kneel while shooting. To ensure proper lighting, strobe lights are recommended. Photographers are advised to consult with the FAU Athletic Media Relations Office at least three weeks prior to set-up.

MEDIA SERVICES

The media entrance to all FAU athletic events at FAU Arena is at the main entrance. It opens 60 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. The media room is located to the right of the main entrance. Programs, media guides and game notes are available prior to the game, and complete statistical packages are distributed in the media room and at courtside. Drinks, telephones and a fax are also available in the media room.

PHONE LINES

For opponents, there will be one courtesy line and a \$100 charge for additional lines. All requests for phone lines must be made at least one month in advance and should be directed to the Athletic Media Relations Office.

For interviews during the season with the coach, staff members or players, contact the media relations office. Mornings are the best times for interviews.

Practice times change and are open to the media if advance arrangements are made through the Athletic Media Relations Office. Please make arrangements at least one day prior to attending practice. Post-game interviews with the home and visiting coach will take place in the media room.

Before the end of the game, all media covering the game should make their requests for post-game player interviews with a member of the FAU Athletic Media Relations staff.

Then, with the coach's approval, they will be brought to the media room following the interview session with the coaches.

FILING REPORTS: PRINT MEDIA/PHOTOGRAPHERS

All members of the print media will have access to phone lines after the game to file reports.

PHONE INTERVIEWS

Contact the respective Athletic Media Relations personnel to arrange phone interviews with coaches or players. All interviews will be arranged according to players' class, study and practice schedules. Players will be asked to return all phone calls. The Athletic Media Relations Office will not release player telephone numbers.






Florida Atlantic University men's basketball begins two new eras in the 2006-07 season, with head coach Rex Walters in his first year at the helm of the Owls as they make the move to the Sun Belt Conference. Walters was promoted in April after one year as associate head coach and finds himself positioned well in hopes of contending for a conference title this season, his first as a head coach at any level.

Florida Atlantic returns five letterwinners from last season's 15-13 squad, a team that had the best Atlantic Sun record in program history at 14-6. FAU set program records in conference games for assists (17.2 apg), field goal percentage (50.0%) and three-point percentage (43.3%).

The Owls also broke three single-season marks for overall three-point shooting: total makes (216), makes per game (7.7) and percentage (39.9%). The 2005-06 squad led the A-Sun with an assist on 59.1% of its field goals.

while having a +19 assist-to-turnover margin on the season and eight games of 20 or more assists, both the best marks in more than a decade.

The five returning owls averaged between 4.3 and 16.1 points per game and accounted for 51.9% of the team's points in 2005-06. Leading the way among the returnees will be senior DeAndre Rice (Flint, MI) and sophomore Carlos Monroe (Philadelphia, PA).

In his first season at Florida Atlantic, Rice topped the team in scoring (16.1 ppg) and connected on 66 three-pointers, the fifth-best FAU total in a single season. The 6'3" guard shot 50.0% (46-of-92) from three-point range during his first 14 games as an Owl, including a stretch in which he went 14-of-20 in consecutive wins against Stetson, Gardner-Webb and Campbell in mid-January.

Monroe, a 6'8", 245-pound forward, proved to be a very important addition. In earning A-Sun All-Freshmen honors, he averaged 11.0 points and 4.6 rebounds in 17 games while shooting 54.5% from the field, second on the team.

Also back for his second season is senior Brent Crews, who was fourth in the A-Sun with a 1.66 assist-to-turnover ratio. A 6'3" guard, Crews ran the point for much of 2005-06, setting a school record with 5.4 assists per conference game and totaling 133 assists overall, the second-best figure in team history.

Sophomore Paul Graham, a 6'4" guard from Philadelphia, PA, was the team's top freshman with 188 points in 2005-06 and was fifth overall in

scoring at 7.0 points per game. His growth as a rookie became clear in the season's final eight games, when he recorded 25 assists to nine turnovers.

Junior Derrick Simmons (Lake Wales, FL) led the team in field goal percentage at 55.6% while averaging 4.3 points and 2.1 rebounds per game. A 6'6", 200-pound forward, Simmons leads the Owls with two years of Division I experience.

The five returnees will be joined by seven newcomers - three junior college transfers, two freshman transfers and three faces fresh from high school. The group has enough talent to allow Coach Walters to go 12 deep in his rotation.

The class is balanced, with three players 6'8" or taller, three point guards and three wings who can contribute in all areas. Such talent and depth will be important as the Owls challenge the Sun Belt Conference, which ranked 18th in the RPI in 2005-06, 11 spots higher than the Atlantic Sun, FAU's previous conference.

Florida Atlantic lost seven players in total from last season, including First Team All-Conference performer Rodney Webb, who averaged 15.5 points and 7.8 rebounds per game; Quinton Young, who shot a single-season record 46.9% from the three-point range; and starters Fred Marshall and Kevin Green.

THIS DATE IN FAU HISTORY

NOVEMBER 18, 1988 Florida Atlantic, at the Division II level, plays its first men's basketball game and defeats Palm Beach Atlantic, 111-62.

FEBRUARY 28, 1994 In the second to last game of its first season at the Division I level, Florida Atlantic upsets North Carolina State, 75-71, in Raleigh, NC.

DECEMBER 1, 1998 Florida Atlantic pulls off the biggest upset in school history when it defeats Oklahoma State, 83-81, in Stillwater, OK. The Cowboys enter the game undefeated, ranked in the top-10 and 87 straight non-conference wins at home. The clinching bucket comes with four seconds left when Gary Durant steals an inbounds pass and scores to break an 81-81 tie.

MARCH 1, 2002 Robert Williams, a sophomore, makes a free throw with six seconds left in the championship game of the Atlantic Sun Tournament to break a 75-75 tie. The Owls hold on and win 76-75 to claim the school's first A-Sun title. The win gives Florida Atlantic an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, the team's first such appearance.

MARCH 14, 2002 As a no. 15 seed in the Southeast Region, Florida Atlantic plays its first-ever NCAA Tournament game. Taking on Alabama, the Owls run off 15 straight points in the first half and lead at the break. The Crimson Tide holds off the Owls' upset bid with an 86-78 victory.

DECEMBER 3, 2002 Florida Atlantic defeats the University of Miami, 74-73, in overtime at FAU Arena. The victory is the first for FAU against the Hurricanes, snapping a 15-game winless streak.

FEBRUARY 26, 2004 Earnest Crumbley sets a trio of team records. He scores 39 points and connects on 11 three-pointers to set game records. He also becomes FAU's all-time leading scorer in the process. Crumbley, who played from 2000-04, still holds all three records.

FEBRUARY 26, 2005 In his final game as an Owl, Mike Bell scores 18 points to become the fifth player in team history to score 1,000 points. His career total of 1,001 points makes him just the second player in FAU history with 1,000 points and 500 rebounds (514).

APRIL 18, 2005 Matt Doherty, the 2001 Associated Press Coach of the Year, is named the fifth men's basketball head coach in Florida Atlantic's history. Rex Walters is named associate head coach shortly afterward on April 20, 2005.

APRIL 28, 2006 Rex Walters becomes the sixth men's basketball head coach at Florida Atlantic, earning a promotion from associate head coach after just one season.

Rex Walters was named the sixth head men's basketball coach at Florida Atlantic University on April 28, 2006. The promotion from associate head coach came after one season of working side-by-side with Matt Doherty in laying a foundation for college basketball in Boca Raton.

Walters joined the FAU staff on April 20, 2005. One year and eight days later, he became a head coach for the first time in his coaching career. He will lead an Owls' roster of 14 student-athletes—including 13 players recruited since his original hire date—into the program's first season in the Sun Belt Conference. He returns five regulars who averaged 4.3 points per game or more last season, including leading scorer DeAndre Rice (16.1 ppg) and A-Sun All-Freshmen honoree Carlos Monroe (11.0 ppg).

With Walters on the sidelines in 2005-06, Florida Atlantic closed its tenure in the Atlantic Sun Conference with a 15-13 record overall and the program's best conference record at 14-6. The 15 victories were a five-win improvement over 2004-05, when the Owls went 10-17 overall.

Prior to Florida Atlantic, Walters' first collegiate coaching job came at Valparaiso, a two-year stint as an assistant under Homer Drew. The 2003-04 Hornets were 18-13 overall and finished first in the Mid-Continent Conference with a record of 11-5.

The following season, Walters' second on the bench, Valparaiso went 15-16, earning third place in the MCC with a 10-6 mark. His coaching career began in 2002-03 in Overland Park, KS, where he served as an assistant coach for a Blue Valley Northwest High School team that reached the Kansas Class 6A State Tournament.



Walters' pedigree for coaching began as a player, receiving tutelage from some of the game's legendary coaches. Roy Williams at the University of Kansas and the NBA's Chuck Daly, Larry Brown and Pat Riley all mentored Walters during his years as a player.

He first made his name known in college, starring for two seasons at Kansas. In 68 starts under Williams, he averaged 15.6 points per game, leading the Jayhawks in scoring during both his junior and senior campaigns.



KU combined to go 56-12 overall in 1991-92 and 1992-93, winning back-to-back Big Eight titles and reaching the 1993 Final Four. Walters was named to the All-Big Eight team both seasons and won Big Eight Male Athlete of the Year as a senior in 1993.

As a junior, Walters averaged 16.0 points per game as the Jayhawks went 27-5. In his senior season, KU had a record of 29-7, with Walters scoring at a clip of 15.3 points per game.

Walters was an outstanding scorer from all areas of the

court at Kansas, shooting nearly 51% from the field, 42% from three-point range and 85% at the free throw line. His college career originally began at Northwestern University, where he earned honorable mention from the Big 10 in 1989-90 after leading the team in scoring (17.6 ppg), three-point shooting (47.3%), free throw shooting (79.4%) and assists (125) as a sophomore. It was during his senior season at Kansas that Walters made his first connection

with Doherty, who joined the team as an assistant coach. The two reunited again for Doherty's single season at FAU, opening the door for Walters' move to the top.

After graduating from Kansas in 1993 with a B.S. in education, Walters was taken by New Jersey as the 16th overall pick in the 1993 NBA Draft. He went on to play seven seasons in total with the Nets, Philadelphia 76ers and Miami Heat, averaging 4.6 points and 1.7 assists per game in 13.7 minutes.

Walters averaged a career-best 6.8 points per game for Philadelphia in 1996-97, and made 67 career starts in 335 games. His career assist-to-turnover ratio was nearly two-to-one.

He was New Jersey's top three-point shooter in 1994-95 (36.2%) and Philadelphia's top long-range marksman in 1996-97 (38.5%). A constant competitor who is always ready for the game, he averaged 12.8 points and 7.3 assists per game in eight starts for the 76ers to end the 1995-96 season.

Walters' professional career spanned nine seasons in total, ending in 2002 after playing internationally for two years and also winning an American Basketball Association title with the Kansas City Knights.

A native of Omaha, NE, Walters and his wife, Deanna, have four children: Addison (9), Drew (7), Riley (4) and Gunner (2).





Mike Balado came to Florida Atlantic University in the summer of 2005 as a coach with in-depth knowledge of junior college and South Florida prep basketball. After one season, he was the first assistant hired by first-year head coach Rex Walters.

Balado's background has paid significant dividends for FAU, with all eight newcomers for 2006-07 having a prior connection to Florida, including seven who have attended South Florida high schools and/or junior colleges. In addition, his ability to speak fluent Spanish makes him a valuable resource when recruiting internationally.

From 2003 to 2005, Balado coached at Miami Dade College, where he helped lead the Sharks to consecutive winning seasons. Among his responsibilities were coordinating recruiting, scouting, travel and academic maturation. He also assisted with scheduling and budgeting.

In 2003-04, MDC posted a 17-13 record and then went 27-5 in 2004-05 on its way to winning the Southern Conference Championship. That 27-5 mark was the best in school history.

MDC was ranked among the top-three teams in the state throughout the 2004-05 campaign. Balado recruited four of MDC's 2004-05 all-conference selections, including the conference player of the year. Prior to MDC, Balado was an assistant coach at Nova Southeastern University for the 2002-03 season.

From 2000 to 2002, Balado was an assistant coach and health instructor at Miami Southridge High School. The 2000-01 team advanced to its first regional final and represented MSHS in the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) State Tournament. In 2001-02, Southridge won the district regular-season championship.

Balado's collegiate coaching experience began at Augusta (GA) State University, where he served as a graduate assistant from 1998 to 2000.

The native of Miami played collegiate basketball at St. Thomas University in Miami, where he was a two-year starter and captain and earned a bachelor's degree in Psychology in 1998. He received a master's of education in exercise and sport science from Augusta State in 2000.



Jeff Guin begins his first season as an assistant coach at Florida Atlantic University and was the first new staff member hired by first-year head coach Rex Walters. He will focus on recruiting in Florida and the Midwest and be responsible for scheduling.

Prior to joining the FAU staff in May 2006, Guin spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Western Illinois, where the 2004-05 team improved by eight wins over his rookie season. His primary duties at WIU were recruiting, individual instruction, scouting, team travel and academic advisor.

Guin served in an administrative role with the University of Illinois from 1997 to 2003, where he concentrated his efforts on scouting, tape exchange and directing the Illini summer basketball camps.

He helped Illinois to five NCAA Tournament appearances, three Big Ten titles (1998, 2001, 2002) and a Big Ten Tournament title in 2003. The Illini's five NCAA Tournament appearances included both Elite Eight and Sweet 16 berths.

Guin completed three degrees during his time at Florida - a

bachelor's degree in education in 1995, a master's in education in 1996 and a master's in sport management in 1997. Prior to attending Florida he played two years at Okaloosa-Walton Community College in Niceville, FL, where he earned Academic All-America NJCAA Region 8 honors in 1992 and 1993.

Moore served as an assistant coach at Redlands Community College in El Reno, OK, from 2004 to 2006. RCC led the nation in team grade-point average (3.43) and finished with a two-year combined record of 50-10.



FRANK T. BROGAN became the fifth president of Florida Atlantic University in March 2003. Previously, he was lieutenant governor of Florida, the state's commissioner of education, superintendent of schools in Martin County, Florida, and a principal, assistant principal, dean and fifth-grade teacher in Martin County public schools.

President Brogan and his twin brother, John, were born in Cincinnati, Ohio, the youngest of six children. The first member of his family to graduate from college, President Brogan received a bachelor's degree in education *magna cum laude* from the University of Cincinnati in 1976. Two years later, he moved to Florida to teach at Port Salerno Elementary School on the Treasure Coast. He continued his education at FAU earning a master's degree in education in 1981. In rapid succession, he

became dean of students at Indiantown Middle School, assistant principal and then principal at Murray Middle School, Martin County's elected superintendent of schools, Florida's commissioner of education (the youngest person ever to hold that office), and, in 1999, lieutenant governor on the Bush-Brogan ticket. He had just been elected to a second term as lieutenant governor when he decided to seek the presidency of his alma mater, FAU.

President Brogan has been a champion of public education all his life. He considers his most important achievement as commissioner of education to have been building greater accountability into Florida's public school system, and he is a strong advocate of accountability in higher education as well. His goals for FAU include supporting its continued growth as an important center of teaching, research and public service activities; increasing access to higher education across the University's seven-county service region; encouraging diversity in FAU's student body, faculty and staff; supporting world-class research initiatives; fostering close, mutually supportive relationships with the

communities the University serves; and making FAU an ever-stronger engine of economic development for South Florida.

In addition to championing education, President Brogan has served as a leader for other

important causes. During the past few years, he has become especially involved in the fight against cancer — a disease that claimed the life of his first wife, Mary. He has received a public service award from the Pioneers in Prostate Cancer.

President Brogan is married to Courtney S. Brogan, who has a law degree from Florida State University. They are the parents of Colby John Brogan, born in 2005.

President Brogan was named to the Sun Belt Conference Executive Committee as the at-large representative for 2006-07.



Lady," which was presented to the White House, and served as a visiting scholar at many universities and presidential sites. Dr. Watson serves on the boards of several presidential foundations and scholarly journals in addition to serving as editor of the journal *White House Studies*.

As a college student, he was a scholarship athlete, playing on the football and track & field teams at Virginia Tech, and has

been involved in athletics in one capacity or another as a faculty member throughout his career in academia.

Florida Atlantic Athletics



CRAIG ANGELOS was named Director of Athletics at Florida Atlantic University in July 2003, assuming oversight responsibility for the institution's 18-team intercollegiate athletic programs including 450 student-athletes.

When Angelos first arrived, he enthusiastically embraced his multi-faceted role and has since moved at a rapid pace to take the program to the next level, by working with President Brogan, FAU students and staff. His philosophy for running a successful intercollegiate athletic program is built on four fundamental principles: institutional control; academic excellence; fiscal integrity; and winning championships.

Since his arrival, he has been instrumental in Florida Atlantic's rise to Division I-A entrance into the Sun Belt Conference affiliation (one of the 11 I-A conferences) and has orchestrated both transitions. He initiated and chaired the University's brand identity campaign and saw it come to a conclusion with new marks in the spring of 2005. Along the way, a television contract was secured in 2004 that saw ESPN and Fox Sports become regulars at both home and away football contests including the 2005 home season opener, which aired nationally on ESPN2 and was hosted by Kurt Herbstreit and Mike Tirico, against Oklahoma State. The department also became the fourth university

within the state of Florida to have an all-sports apparel deal with Nike, Inc., joining Florida State, Florida and Miami. The 2005-2006 year was also a pinnacle year for FAU women's athletic teams with seven of the 10 sponsored sports advancing to postseason play. In all, FAU captured five conference women's championships and was one of just eight schools nationally to capture five or more women's championships.

In Angelos' first three years at FAU, the Owls have captured 10 conference titles and FAU has represented the university in postseason competition 15 times. Three individuals earned All-America status while two earned Academic All-America honors. The department's commitment to a holistic approach to student-athlete excellence shows with more than 35% of the student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 G.P.A. and with the National Consortium for Academics and Sports honoring FAU as an Academics and Sports Outreach and Community Service Program Honor Roll member in 2005. This was made possible in part due to the recent creation of a Champs/Lifeskills program that assists the student-athletes development in the areas of academic and athletic excellence, personal and career development and community service.

Perhaps, most significantly, under Angelos' leadership the department has been able to develop a balanced budget plan that culminated with a balanced budget for the first time since the inception of the football program, which will subsequently create the long-term stability of the athletic programs.

Along with balancing the budget, has come a complete renovation of fundraising measures that have resulted this past year of an increase in major gifts of 400%, an Owl Club fund increase of 130% and an increase in special event

revenue of 150%. Angelos' efforts to market the teams, build a fan base and showcase the University on national television have greatly enhanced the overall image of the athletics program. In 2004, football ticket sales rose 30%, attendance was improved by 130% and student attendance rose 906% despite not playing a home game until six games into the schedule. During the 2005 season, he was instrumental in the department selling the most single game tickets in the history of the young football program that allowed the Owls to meet the requirements for becoming a full fledged I-A member.

Angelos has also had the opportunity to hire two new basketball coaches the first came to a conclusion in early April of 2005 with the hiring of Matt Doherty, which emphasized Angelos' commitment to the overall growth of the department. In just one season, men's basketball revenues tripled and attendance more than doubled. That foundation, laid by both Angelos and Doherty will be continued in 2006-2007 by former associate head coach and newly hired head coach Rex Walters who took over the program after the departure of Doherty to SMU.

Almost immediately after his arrival at FAU, Angelos initiated a master plan and review of all athletic facilities. The plan has already begun to be implemented within the recent ground breaking for a state of the art track and field complex and major renovation of the basketball arena. Perhaps the gem of the projects includes exploring the feasibility of building an on-campus football and basketball venue that would solidify the athletic department's position among top-tier institutions. His proposed plan not only includes the "Carrier Dome Like" facility, but more importantly, the entire University

would benefit by his vision of developing an innovation village that would create much needed additional student housing, retail establishments, additional parking, and a hotel and conference center that would all combine with a multi-use dome stadium to make FAU a leader in the country and take FAU to extraordinary heights

Prior to coming to FAU, he was the Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer at Indiana University since January 2002. While there, he supervised many aspects of the athletic department including the football program and was instrumental in negotiating a Nike contract for 23 of its 24 sports. Previously, he was at the University of Miami (FL) for eight years, serving in a variety of positions but mostly in the number two-spot under athletics director Paul Dee. Prior to arriving on campus, he spent three years at the NCAA as a legislative assistant interpreting rules and regulations of the association. He is now entering his 16th year as an administrator in intercollegiate athletics.

A graduate of the Creighton University School of Law in Omaha, NE, Angelos worked for a short time in a mid-size litigation firm in Los Angeles, CA. However, he ultimately decided to combine his legal background and his love for athletics and gravitated towards a career in intercollegiate athletics. During his undergraduate years at Brigham Young University in Provo, UT, Angelos was the starting first baseman on the varsity squad. He later played for one year in the Italian professional baseball league in Udine, Italy.

The 44-year old Angelos and his wife, Kristin, have been married for 21 years and keep busy with their six children, Alayna (17), Alexis (14), Abigail (11), Austin (9), Aaron (6), and Alivia (3).

Athletic Review



BASEBALL... finished their final season in the Atlantic Sun Conference (A-Sun) and found themselves without five starters for the majority of the season. The team battled throughout the year ending with the season's first three-game sweep of a conference opponent and earning a no. 4 seed in the

A-Sun Tournament. The program saw its fourth former player reach the major leagues as Tommy Murphy debuted with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim.



MEN'S BASKETBALL... ended the season with the best conference record in program history (14-6) and claimed third place in the A-Sun. The Owls, who led the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio, averaged an assist on nearly 60% of their field goals and shot a conference-best 39.9% from three-point range. Rex Walters, who played for seven seasons in the NBA, was promoted to head coach in April.



WOMEN'S BASKETBALL... had tremendous success, winning the A-Sun Championship and receiving a berth to the NCAA Division I Tournament for the first time. The team's 16-4 A-Sun record was the best ever for the Owls, who also had their first 20-win season at the Division I level. First Team All-Conference selection Shontavia Williams set FAU's career scoring mark with 1,466 points.





CHEER TEAM...is a regular at home and away football games, men's and women's basketball games and is a constant at community events. The squad has found a balance between spirit, competition and education. The team finished second in 2001 and 2003 at the NCA competition and owns a national pairs championship.


CROSS COUNTRY...saw the women's team capture fifth place in the A-Sun Championship, led by All-Freshmen runner Elodie Mouthan. Three Owls finished in the top 21 for the women, with three competing in the NCAA Regional. Earl Barlow paced the men's squad to a 10th-place finish at the conference meet, taking 43rd individually.

DANCE...has garnered national recognition at FAU. The dance team, which performs at football and basketball games as well as pep rallies and charitable events, placed second in the nation in 2005 at the National Dance Association competition.

FOOTBALL...faced a tough schedule. Florida Atlantic played Kansas, Oklahoma State, Minnesota and Louisville, one of the nation's most difficult non-conference schedules. The Owls posted a 2-5 Sun Belt record in their first full season of conference play. Willie Hughley, one of 10 letterwinners lost from the squad, was signed by the Cleveland Browns as a free agent and former quarterback Jared Allen ('04) led the Amsterdam Admirals to NFL Europe's World Bowl.



MEN'S GOLF...saw Mike McMillan earn A-Sun All-Freshmen Team honors after finishing 19th in the 2006 A-Sun Championship. The Owls took seventh as a team in the conference and look forward to 2007, losing just one senior among its top five players. The season was also highlighted by a third-place finish at the NSU Spring Classic.



WOMEN'S GOLF... took third place in the A-Sun Conference Tournament behind the efforts of Praewnapa Phol-Uaypom, the A-Sun Freshman of the Year. Phol-Uaypom took third individually, shooting a tournament-best 70 in the final round. Head coach Joan Joyce returns four of her top five players for 2007.



MEN'S SOCCER... claimed fourth place in the A-Sun Conference and reached the semifinals in the A-Sun Championship. Junior forward Andrew Helm was the no. 1 overall pick in the Major League Soccer (MLS) Supplemental Draft in January. In February, the Owls found a new home, joining the Atlantic Soccer Conference for the 2006 season. The conference champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

WOMEN'S SOCCER...dominated the A-Sun Conference, outscoring its opponents 35-2 during a 9-0-1 conference season and leading the NCAA with a .792 shutout percentage in 21 overall games. The Owls were 16-4-1 on the season and earned the program's first berth into the NCAA Tournament. The team had its sixth-consecutive winning season and placed six players on First Team All-Conference, including Susanna Lehtinen as Player of the Year. Head coach Brian Dooley was recognized as A-Sun Coach of the Year.

SOFTBALL...returned to the top of the A-Sun Conference, winning its ninth conference title in the last 10 years. Taking advantage of their seventh NCAA Tournament berth, the Owls reached the regional final for the first time. FAU finished second in the A-Sun during the regular season, going 15-5, and went 35-25 overall, the 11th consecutive season with 35 or more wins.



SWIMMING AND DIVING...women's team earned the University's first Sun Belt Conference championship. Junior Ellie Weberg captured two All-American honors, finishing fourth in both the 100 and 200 breaststrokes. Sophomore Kevin Bartell took 12th in the 100 breaststroke at the NCAA Championships, while the men finished third at the Sun Belt Championships.

MEN'S TENNIS...experienced a transitional season under the direction of first-year head coach David Komie. The Owls turned the corner, landing a top-20 recruiting class scheduled to begin play in 2006-07. Komie's 2006 squad battled teams like Miami, Wisconsin and Tennessee, among others, and shut out Jacksonville 6-0 in regular season A-Sun Conference play.

WOMEN'S TENNIS...won five-consecutive matches in March and earned victories over Toledo, Syracuse, Army and Brown during the season. Sophomore Claudia Kecht was named to the A-Sun Second Team and Danielle Simone was recognized on the All-Freshmen Team all under the direction of head coach Mary Dailey.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD... took second place at the A-Sun Conference Indoor Championship and third place at the A-Sun outdoor meet. Freshman Krystena Castro won the indoor shot put and outdoor discus titles. Raynell Hagberg took two individual indoor titles while junior Yanique Booth won the 60-meter hurdles indoor. Booth, Castro and the 4x400 relay team all qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Regional. In May the Owls broke ground on a new outdoor varsity track.



VOLLEYBALL...went a perfect 9-0 in the A-Sun Conference and finished an all-time best 29-3 overall, taking the A-Sun tournament and the program's third berth to the NCAA Tournament. Senior Kelly Paiva was named A-Sun Player of the Year and earned both All-Region and All-America honors. Head coach Jody Brown was recognized as A-Sun Coach of the Year.

MELISSA DAWSON became Florida Atlantic Associate Athletic Director and Senior Woman Administrator June 1, 2001. She is the University's first person to hold the SWA position, in a full-time capacity, demonstrating the University's commitment to the growth and development of women's sports.

Since coming to Florida Atlantic, Dawson placed her finger prints on the quality of game operations, worked to improve facilities and consolidated

both the training rooms and the equipment room to encompass the needs of the entire athletic department. She supervises several teams, and monitors student-athlete welfare for the entire department.

Dawson came to FAU from Florida State University. While the title of SWA is new for her, the inner workings of college athletics is not. The Inverness, FL native held various positions at FSU during her 12-year tenure, all of which are an asset as FAU continues to strive towards success.

She was hired in 1990 as an equipment manager for the Seminoles and was promoted in 1991 to an Administrative Assistant position. In that role,

Dawson worked directly with women's volleyball, basketball and softball. She graduated in April of 1992, from Florida State, with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education.

The following Fall, Dawson's title, but not home, changed once again to Assistant Home Event Manager, a position that provided her the opportunity to coordinate all invitationals, conference championship and NCAA tournaments hosted by FSU.

She was promoted again in August of 1993 to Assistant Director of Athletic Facilities and Operations, a position she held until her departure from FSU for FAU. As FSU's Assistant Director of Facilities, Dawson directly

supervised the daily operations of volleyball, soccer and softball and assisted in the daily game operations for tennis and swimming. She also served as the manager of eight athletic facilities, the liaison between FSU and Nike and supervised an equipment staff of five, all while earning a Master of Science in Athletic Administration in April of 1996. She has served as the tournament director or assistant tournament director for ACC Championships, NCAA Regional Championships and the 1996 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championship.



ED HAYWARD came to FAU in March of 1996 with the daunting task of establishing a strong compliance office while preparing and guiding the University through the NCAA Self-Study.

Hayward was rewarded in the winter of 1999 with a promotion to Associate AD at which time he assumed the

responsibility of overseeing several sports. Hayward came to FAU after serving as Florida International University's Compliance Retention and Academic Support Athletic Coordinator from January 1992 to February 1996.

He has been a road race coordinator for the Miami

Runners Club and has served on the board of directors. Hayward also volunteers for Boys Town of Florida, Miami division, and was a football coach for the North Miami Parks' Recreation Department.

growing and managing a competitive budget for 18 sports along with numerous department support areas. He also assisted with the development of a comprehensive business plan for the department which included a balanced three-year model forecast.

Langejans joined the Owls after spending 20 years in various roles at Northern Arizona University. At NAU, he started as a graduate assistant football coach, moved into the areas of athletic ticketing and event management before his role in business operations, which began in 1990.

In that capacity, the Northern Arizona graduate was responsible for the fiscal affairs of the athletic department, which included all sports camp activity. As he developed into his role, Langejans was afforded additional responsibilities, which included event management, football scheduling and travel. During his last two years at NAU, he also oversaw the day-to-day operations of football, men's basketball, and the men's and women's cross country and track and field teams. He has served as the tournament manager for a number of

conference post-season events and also served a member of the NCAA Division I men's tennis national committee of which he was the national chair during the 2004 season.

A former 20-year high school sports official, he earned his degree in recreational leadership with an emphasis in business administration in 1984.

TERRY MOHAJIR was named Florida Atlantic University's Associate Athletics Director for Development in December 2004.

Since coming to Florida Atlantic he has been heavily involved in creating a comprehensive fundraising program with a focus on major gifts, annual fund and special events. Since Mohajir arrived, the department has enhanced the major gift program 400 percent, and has increased Owl Club giving 130 percent. In

addition, the special events revenues have increased 150 percent. He also coordinates all fundraising efforts for the proposed 170 million dollars' worth of facilities expansions.

Mohajir joined the staff after serving in a similar role at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. His last appointment at UMKC saw him serve as the assistant athletics director for external relations, a position he held from 1997 to 2004.

As the assistant athletics director for external relations at UMKC, Mohajir oversaw all marketing and promotions, sports information, fundraising, radio and TV contracts, corporate sales, tickets and event operations.

While at UMKC, Mohajir was responsible for a 450 percent

increase in the educational athletics endowment. He oversaw an 80 percent increase in sponsorships and an 89 percent upswing in the athletics fund donor base. There was also a 33 percent increase in ticket revenue under his direction. One of his more visible accomplishments was leading the fundraising and construction efforts for a new training room and strength and conditioning center.

Mohajir organized the bid and successfully pitched to the conference presidents to host the Mid-Continent Conference men's and women's basketball championship tournaments in 2003 and 2004. He directed and hosted an exempt, eight-team Thanksgiving basketball tournament. He also organized UMKC's effort to land the 2005 NCAA Women's Basketball Midwest Regional. Additionally, Mohajir

oversaw the operations of the Hospital Hill Run and the 2002, 2003 and 2004 USA Track and Field Association men's half-marathon national championships.

Prior to working at UMKC, Mohajir was a football ticket sales and promotions account executive for the University of Kansas from 1996-97 and was an assistant offensive line and gameday special team's football coach for the Jayhawks from 1993-96. Mohajir graduated from Arkansas State with a major in sports management and a minor in marketing in 1993 where he was a starter on the football team. 

FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY is committed to each student-athlete as a total person. Participation in athletics is important, but it represents only one aspect of a student-athlete's college experience. Student-athletes at Florida Atlantic University have the opportunity to participate in one of the top athletic programs in the country. More importantly, they have the opportunity to earn a degree from an outstanding academic institution, one that will provide them with the necessary skills and experiences to find success and fulfillment well beyond college.

The University's commitment to the student-athlete is a dual one. Participation in the athletic arena is not viewed as an obstacle to the attainment of one's educational goals, rather it is seen as a complementary activity. Each supports the other. Athletic excellence is stressed,

but academic achievement is never compromised.

The University realizes that student-athletes are required to commit a large percentage of their personal time to University-sponsored athletic activities. For this reason, the University recognizes the need for a support program for its intercollegiate athletes. The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence is designed to assist all student-athletes in achieving their educational goals.

Academic counselors work collaboratively with faculty and campus advising centers to ensure that student-athletes are taking the appropriate classes and making progress toward their degrees. Counselors also work with students on a variety of learning enhancement activities, including study skills and time management strategies. In addition to individualized counseling, a comprehensive

tutorial program is also available to student-athletes through the Academic Center. Tutors come highly recommended by faculty and they are generally available to work with students in all subject areas.

The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence also coordinates community outreach and "life skills" activities for FAU student-athletes. FAU takes considerable pride in the accomplishments

CHAMPS/Life Skills Program



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence offers a variety of personal development programming for student-athletes. In recent years, FAU's personal development programming has been conducted

through a series of workshops designed to help students not only make a successful transition to college life, but also to prepare them for success beyond FAU once they graduate. Recent workshops have focused on time management, study skills, drug and alcohol awareness, gambling, financial planning, sport psychology, and health and wellness topics.

FAU's Life Skills program also includes sections of the First Year Experience course (SLS 1501) that are specifically designed for freshmen student-athletes. These classes are required for all freshmen student-athletes. While the curriculum for these classes will follow the traditional SLS model that is currently in place



at FAU, certain topics (e.g., time management, freshmen transitional issues, drug and alcohol education, communicating with the media, etc.) are taught in a manner that will help meet the unique needs of the student-athlete population. Students'

involvement with this class has had a positive impact on their academic performance and helps them build a strong connection to the FAU community.



STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL (SAAC)

Each athletic team at FAU has at least two representatives on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC), a leadership and service organization that exists for the betterment of the student-athlete experience. SAAC meetings provide students with a vehicle to express any concerns they may have with existing practices and to offer suggestions for improvements in the future. The SAAC also organizes a wide variety of community outreach activities each semester. This past year was particularly productive for the SAAC as they organized a holiday party for

and donated gifts to a community of underprivileged youth and held a National Student-Athlete Day event that exposed a group of children to the life of a college student-athlete.



CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Student-Athlete Center for Academic Excellence strives to provide its student-athletes with opportunities for career exploration, development, and job placement. The center achieves these goals by offering the student-athletes a variety of programs to prepare them for their future careers. These programs include mock interview days, workshops on interviewing skills, networking, and dressing for success, and resume and cover letter information sessions. This past year, the SACAE also developed several programs to help with job placement. The center developed a Job Bank to assist students with finding summer jobs and internships.



MENTORING PROGRAM

The SACAE also initiated a Student-Athlete Mentor Program. This program is designed to match FAU student-athletes with business people in the greater South Florida community with similar fields of interest.



Mentors become off-campus advisors to students, able to introduce students who are well schooled in theory to the real and practical world of business. The program is also a fine opportunity for students to make friends in the business community and receive advice and help from very successful people.

Florida Atlantic University's Athletic Compliance Office functions within the realm of the University's compliance structure, coordinating, monitoring and verifying compliance and meeting all NCAA requirements. FAU is committed and compelled to the principle of institutional control in the operation of its athletics department in a way that is constant within the rules and regulations of the NCAA and the University.

The Athletics Compliance Office commitment is to maintain control of its athletics program through responsible administrators, faculty and institutional bodies; to educate coaches, staff, student-athletes and other individuals involved with the athletics program of their institutional responsibilities under the rules; to develop operating systems within the athletics department and the University that provide guidance in how to work within the rules; and to discover and report any violations of the rules that occur. Each individual involved in intercollegiate athletics is obligated to maintain competency in

knowledge of the rules; to act within his or her realm of responsibility in full compliance with the governing legislation; and to report any violation of NCAA, conference and/or institutional rules of which he or she is aware.

As the University strives for excellence on and off the field of competition, the highest regard for ethical conduct must also be sought. In order for the athletic department to exist, outside participation is required and must be emphasized. However, any inappropriate activity outside the rules and regulations of the NCAA could jeopardize the student-athlete's eligibility to compete athletically. Everyone involved inside or outside the University must do his or her part in order to foster an environment that is supportive of the NCAA operating principle of competitive equity. Each person has a role and responsibility and has accountability when it comes to compliance of NCAA rules and regulations.

FIVE RULES OF ATHLETIC COMPLIANCE

- 1 Only coaches and athletic department staff members are permitted to be involved in the recruiting process. Alumni, friends and "other representatives of athletic interest" who are not employed by the University are not permitted to contact a prospect (or members of the prospect's family) by letter, telephone or in-person (on or off campus) for the purpose of soliciting their participation in the athletic program. FAU faculty members are permitted to have contact with the prospects, but only while on the campus.
- 2 A prospect remains a prospect even after he or she signs a Letter of Intent or financial aid agreement to attend the University. The prospect does not lose his/her prospect status until the start of classes at FAU or the beginning of official team practice prior to the start of classes.
- 3 The prohibition of contact with a prospect is intended to relate to unavoidable incidental contacts with a prospect by representatives of a member institution's athletics interest. It is understood that such a contact is not prearranged by the athletics representative or an athletic department staff member; is not made for the purpose of recruitment of the prospect; and involves only normal civility. For example, if you meet a high school student or junior college student-athlete, you can talk with them about anything except FAU athletics. If you are attending a public function and find yourself talking to the parents of a prospect, you can talk about anything that doesn't relate to the athletic department.
- 4 If a student-athlete accepts any benefits or special consideration based on his or her status as an athlete or because of athletic skill, the student-athlete will lose all eligibility for intercollegiate athletic participation. Do not do anything for prospective or enrolled student-athletes without specific authorization from the FAU Athletic Compliance Office.
- 5 Representatives of athletic interest are reminded that NCAA rules regarding enrolled student-athletes remain in effect throughout the entire year, including summer breaks. When student-athletes complete their final season of eligibility, they must abide by NCAA rules until the end of that academic year and/or until they are no longer receiving athletically related financial aid.




Dr. Westerdahl completed his fellowship with the Cleveland Clinic Foundation and his family practice residency with the Florida Hospital in Orlando, FL.

THE TOM OXLEY ATHLETIC CENTER

Tom Oxley, a local businessman, an FAU alum, and an avid polo enthusiast, stepped forward with a donation that allowed the athletic center to become a reality. The 54,000-square-foot, state-of-art facility houses the football locker room, training room, weight room, meeting rooms and coaches' offices. But, it doesn't stop there. The Oxley Center also opens its doors to individual locker rooms for women's track, soccer, softball and volleyball, as well as the respective coaches' offices. The Athletics Director and administrative staff also call the Oxley Center home. All FAU students are privileged to use the computer study lab and classrooms. The facility overlooks the baseball "B" field, the soccer game field, the softball stadium, the Boca Raton airport, and two football practice fields.



TENNIS COURTS

The men's tennis team, which ended the 2001 regular season with a No. 50 national ranking, an Atlantic Sun Championship, the first in a FAU men's sport, and its second-consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament, makes use of two tennis facilities. The newly renovated FAU courts complete the athletic complex, with six lighted courts nestled between the baseball stadium, behind the aquatics area and next to the soccer game field. The men's and women's tennis teams call Patch Reef Park home, a facility that houses 17 lighted tennis courts and locker rooms for both teams. It is also a practice or tune-up facility for professional tennis players training for one of the many South Florida tour events.

A University-wide ceremony was held to break ground on a new track. Expected completion is Spring 2007.

BASEBALL STADIUM


FAU's baseball team, ranked as high as no. 8 nationally in 1999, is afforded the opportunity to practice on two full-dimension fields. Field "B" was the original home field for baseball, but with growing fan support, a new field was constructed in 1991. Plans are being considered for a new stadium. The stadium field, which features AAA baseball lighting, is known as the best playing surface in South Florida and recently received an endorsement from Cal Ripken. FAU fans enjoy the beach/picnic atmosphere along both foul lines where beach chairs, coolers and grills are a staple.

FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELDS

Two full-sized practice fields are flanked by the Tom Oxley Athletic Center, and are used 12 months of the year. Room is available to add a astro-play surface.



The completion of what is now called the "Game Field" – better known to the women's soccer team as "Heaven" – concluded the 10-year development of five on-campus soccer fields, in conjunction with the Greater Boca Raton Beach Tax District. FAU hosted the Atlantic Sun Conference Women's Soccer Championship in 2000 and 2003. The University has also served as practice site for several international teams, Team USA and the women's soccer professional combines.



AQUATIC CENTER

The swim team moved just yards away from its 25-yard pool to an Olympic-size meter pool. The meter pool has hosted the Independent Collegiate Conference Swim Meet and has served as the winter training facility for hundreds of collegiate swimmers, as well as the training site for FAU's men's and women's swim teams. The change to a meter pool was vital for the program to continue to attract Olympic swimmers to the teams. The pool also features a diving well for one and three meter events. The dive team also uses the Coral Springs Aquatic Center for platform practice and competition.



FAU ARENA

The FAU Arena opened its doors to women's basketball in 1984; men's basketball and women's volleyball were added in 1988. The facility seats 5,000 for games and houses locker rooms for two varsity teams.



SOFTBALL STADIUM

Through the assistance of FAU football, Hooters, Inc. and the State of Florida Title IX fund, the Lady Owls can continue their success in one of the best softball facilities in the country. FAU, which just captured its seventh-consecutive championship and its fifth-consecutive regional appearance, plays on a palm tree-lined field complete with stadium, concession, press box and covered batting cage.

This is the **SUN BELT CONFERENCE.**®

The Sun Belt Conference is one of only 11 NCAA conferences to participate in Division I-A football and enters its 31st season in 2006-2007 with a proud history of athletic and academic success.

The conference sponsors 10 women's sports - basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball; and nine men's sports - baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, swimming and diving, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field.

Each of the 19 sports has seen numerous team and individual accomplishments, and 11 Sun Belt Conference schools are currently graduating its student athletes at a rate higher than their school's student body. All Sun Belt schools are committed to excellence in the 21st century, and facility upgrades and expansion are occurring on virtually every campus.

Because of its status as a member of the Division I-A football coalition, the Sun Belt Conference has a permanent seat on the NCAA's 16-

member Board of Directors. As a result, the conference has a crucial voice on some of the most pressing issues in college athletics and will always have a role in the implementation of any future NCAA legislation and guidelines.

The conference continues to utilize television to grow and promote the league. Adding volleyball and baseball to the conference's television package resulted in more national and regional television exposure for the league in 2005-2006 than at any time in its history, while ESPN televised the conference's men's basketball championship game for the 26th straight season in 2006.

The Sun Belt Conference has partnered with XOS Technologies, Inc. to deliver a full-service, customized, public and premium web site to provide fans with a broad range of real-time information and content about the conference's athletic teams.

The Sun Belt was the only conference in the nation in 2005-06 to provide video highlights and features on its web site from each of the

league's respective championships. This technology enables anyone in the world with internet access to view the conference's championship events, and fans in five different countries viewed the 2005 soccer championships.

Prominent Sun Belt alumni include United States Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice (Denver), NFL Hall of Fame football player "Mean" Joe Greene (North Texas), Arizona Diamondbacks All-Star baseball player Luis Gonzalez (South Alabama), former member of the United States Senate and House of Representatives John Breaux (Louisiana-Lafayette), country music superstar Tim McGraw (Louisiana-Monroe), and actor Andy Garcia (Florida International).

The conference's first 30 years have also produced numerous individual national champions along with Olympic track medalists including Earl Bell, Tom Hill and Al Joyner (Arkansas State), Hollis Conway (Louisiana-Lafayette), and Tayna Lawrence (Florida International).

Old Dominion's Anne Donovan received the Naismith Trophy recognizing the nation's top women's basketball player in 1983, helped the United States win the Olympic gold medal in 1984, and helped the Lady Monarchs capture the national championship in 1985 (one of eight women's Final 4 appearances by Sun Belt schools: Old Dominion - 1983, 1985; Western Kentucky - 1985, 1986, 1992; Louisiana Tech - 1994, 1998, 1999).

Sun Belt teams have also participated in the men's NCAA Final 4 (UNC-Charlotte in 1977), the College World Series (Louisiana-Lafayette in 2000), the Women's College World Series (Louisiana-Lafayette in 1993, 1995, 1996, 2003), and had 10 players selected in the first round of the NBA Draft.

The Sun Belt Conference is led by Commissioner Wright Waters, who is in his eighth full year as commissioner. He was named the conference's fourth commissioner in December of 1998 following the tenures of Vic Bubas (1976-1990), Jim Lessig (1990-1991), and Craig Thompson (1991-1998). The league's annual all sports champion is awarded the Vic Bubas Cup, named after the conference's first commissioner.

The conference office has been headquartered in downtown New Orleans since 2000, after moving from suburban Metairie, La., where it had been based since 1991. Prior to moving to the "Big Easy," the league was based in Tampa, Fla., from 1977-1991. The original conference office was located in Charlotte, N.C., from 1976-77.

Owls complete last season in the A-Sun with four women's titles.

Florida Atlantic has claimed four Atlantic Sun Conference women's titles in 2005-06 and has accumulated 219 points to capture the A-Sun Sherman Day Trophy, awarded annually to the conference member that excels in all women's sports.

"This has been an exceptional year for Florida Atlantic's women's teams," Athletic Director Craig Angelos said. "You strive each season to see as many teams as possible reach postseason. With seven of the now 10 teams advancing to the playoffs we believe we have a strong foundation for next season and our next challenges."

FAU has knocked on the door with a second place finish in 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05 and grabs the trophy in its final season of Atlantic Sun Conference membership.

In total, FAU captured five women's conference tournament championships in 2005-06: soccer, volleyball, basketball, swimming and softball. The five championships are a school record for championships won. The Owls were one of eight universities nationwide to have captured five or more women's conference championships in 2005-06.

The season-ending accomplishment comes on the heels of the NCAA notification that FAU was one of just 19 schools to unconditionally complete the NCAA certification process.

The Owls will make a full transition to the Sun Belt Conference in 2006-07 with the exception of men's soccer which will compete in the Atlantic Soccer Conference. Seventeen teams will compete in the Sun Belt: men's and women's cross country, football, women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's swimming, women's swimming, which captured the Sun Belt Title in 2006, women's indoor track, baseball, softball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's tennis, and women's outdoor track.

- **Volleyball posted the nation's ninth best win-loss percentage (.906 with a 29-3 record) and advanced to its third NCAA Tournament.**
- **Softball earned its ninth A-Sun Tournament Championship and made its seventh NCAA appearance.**
- **Women's soccer and basketball made their first NCAA tournament appearances since 1993-94.**
- **Florida Atlantic University men's and women's teams have won a total of 29 Atlantic titles.**
